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COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good morning, everyone. We're going to get started. We have established a quorum. All the guests and visitors will retire behind the rail. We'll get started now. Thank you very much.

To give our invocation this morning, the Chair recognizes Sister Elise Betz of the Sisters of St. Francis of Philadelphia. She is here today as the guest of Councilman O'Brien.

I would ask all members and guests to please rise.

(Councilmembers and guests rise.)

SISTER BETZ: Good morning, everyone, and thank you to the Councilman for the invitation to come to pray with you. When I got the invitation, I tried to think if I were one of you Councilpersons, what would I want to say, and that's where I'm coming from. I hope it's what you'd like to say too.

Before I begin, let's just take

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2 a minute to remember the loving presence
3 that surrounds all of us at this very
4 moment.

5 (Brief pause.)

6 SISTER BETZ: And let's
7 remember the people at home first, that
8 God would bless them today, because
9 they've helped us to be here to be able
10 to do this job that we're trying to do.
11 So we want them to have a happy, holy,
12 pleasant day.

13 And next I wanted you to
14 consider words that mean a whole lot to
15 me. They are the words of our mother
16 Frances Bachman who founded my community.
17 At the time that she said them, she was a
18 married woman who was pregnant, whose
19 husband was killed in an accident. She
20 was pregnant with her fourth child, so
21 she had a lot of faith, and her words
22 were: No risk, no gain.

23 So our prayer:

24 We ask for the courage to risk
25 speaking the truth as we know it. We ask

2 for the courage to risk listening to
3 another who has an opinion different from
4 ours. We ask for the courage to risk
5 changing our minds if we gain new
6 insights. We ask for the courage to risk
7 going the extra mile to bring about
8 consensus.

9 We ask that we be respectful
10 and patient with one another, as we hope
11 the others will be with us. And,
12 finally, we need to remind ourselves that
13 our imperfect efforts will be fruitful if
14 our greatest desire is to bring about
15 peace and prosperity to the people of our
16 city, and remember that this loving
17 presence is always with us.

18 Amen.

19 (Amen.)

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Thank you very much, Sister, for those
22 inspiring words.

23 Council will be at ease.

24 (Council at ease.)

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

2 Thank you very much. The next order of
3 business is the approval of the Journal
4 of the meeting of Thursday, October 8th,
5 2015, and the Chair recognizes Councilman
6 Greenlee.

7 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
8 you, Mr. President. I move that the
9 Journal of the meeting of Thursday,
10 October 8th, 2015 be approved.

11 (Duly seconded.)

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
13 Thank you. It has been moved and
14 properly seconded that the Journal of the
15 meeting of Thursday, October 8th, 2015
16 stands approved.

17 All in favor say aye.

18 (Aye.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
20 Those opposed?

21 (No response.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
23 ayes have it, and the Journal is
24 approved.

25 The next order of business is

2 requests for leaves of absence, and the
3 Chair recognizes Councilman Jones.

4 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
5 Mr. President. On behalf of the
6 majority, there are no requests today.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
8 Chair thanks the gentleman.

9 The Chair now recognizes
10 Councilman O'Neill.

11 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,
12 Mr. President. There are no requests for
13 leave of absence on behalf of the
14 republicans, but I would like to mention
15 Councilman Oh has left the Chambers
16 temporarily, but he will be back.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
18 Thank you.

19 At this time, I would like to
20 dispense with the regular order of
21 business and I would like to welcome and
22 I would like to thank everyone who has
23 taken time out of their busy day to come
24 down to witness their government in
25 action. We truly appreciate the fact

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2 that you feel enough about us that you
3 come down and see democracy in action.
4 So I really appreciate you coming down
5 today, and we hope you really enjoy this,
6 so much so that you come back again.

7 At this time, the Chair would
8 like to recognize Councilwoman Reynolds
9 Brown, who will present a resolution on
10 my behalf recognizing the Fair Trade
11 Philadelphia. Would Yoko Barnes and
12 those accompanying her please join the
13 Councilwoman at the podium.

14 (Councilmembers and guests
15 approached podium.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
17 joining Councilwoman Brown, we have
18 Councilman William Greenlee and we also
19 have Councilwoman Blackwell and
20 Councilwoman Quinones-Sanchez and
21 Councilman Jones.

22 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Thank you,
23 Mr. President, and thank you also for an
24 opportunity to represent you on your
25 behalf for this resolution given, as you

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2 well know, my growing interest in the
3 environment and sustainability, as
4 there's a lot to learn about it. And
5 this morning we are recognizing and
6 commending Fair Trade Philadelphia for
7 its commitment to economic equality for
8 workers and sustainable production
9 practices for the environment.

10 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Whereas,
11 the Fair Trade Philadelphia is a group of
12 citizens who have come together to
13 promote Fair Trade in the City of
14 Philadelphia; and

15 Whereas, Fair Trade is a market
16 based economic system through which
17 workers, artisans and farmers are paid a
18 living wage for their work and producers
19 and farmers use environmentally
20 sustainable production and farming
21 practices; and

22 COUNCILMAN JONES: Whereas,
23 Fair Trade is an approach to business and
24 to development based on dialogue,
25 transparency and respect for those

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2 seeking to create greater equity in the
3 international trade system; and

4 Whereas, Fair Trade supports
5 farmers and craftspersons who are
6 socially and economically marginalized.
7 Those producers lack economic opportunity
8 and often face steep hurdles in finding
9 markets and customers for their goods;
10 and

11 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas,
12 at the core of the Fair Trade model is a
13 direct, cooperative and in-depth
14 relationship between buyers and sellers
15 that keeps all the principles of Fair
16 Trade at the forefront; and

17 Whereas, fairly traded
18 clothing, coffee, tea, food, furniture,
19 housewares, jewelry and many other
20 products are available from Fair Trade
21 organizations located here and abroad;
22 and

23 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:
24 Whereas, Fairly Traded goods result in:
25 stronger communities, financial resources

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2 for nutrition and healthcare costs,
3 empowerment of the poor - especially
4 women and protection of the environment;
5 and

6 Whereas, a "Fair Trade City,"
7 quote/unquote, is one that encourages the
8 purchase of Fair Trade certified products
9 by City agencies, City contractors and
10 publicizes its Fair Trade policy through
11 the media and City websites; now,
12 therefore

13 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Be it
14 resolved, that the Philadelphia City
15 Council, hereby recognizes and commends
16 the Fair Trade Philadelphia for its
17 efforts to increase consumer awareness
18 and commitment to poor farming
19 communities and artisans around the world
20 and further encourages the Office of
21 Sustainability and the Department of
22 Procurement to support and practice the
23 policies of Fair Trade and to promote
24 Fair Trade practices among local
25 businesses and organizations.

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2 Now, therefore, be it resolved,
3 that an engrossed copy of this resolution
4 will be presented to the representatives
5 here of Fair Trade Philadelphia as a
6 sincere sentiment of City Council's
7 legislative body.

8 This was introduced by our
9 President, Darrell Clarke, and supported
10 of course by all members of the
11 Philadelphia City Council. Let's salute
12 Fair Trade Philadelphia.

13 (Applause.)

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

15 Thank you.

16 The Chair recognizes Ms. Barnes
17 for remarks.

18 MS. BARNES: Thank you.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20 You're welcome.

21 MS. BARNES: Dear Council
22 President, Councilpersons, and friends,
23 today it is a good day for Kareem. When
24 this picture was taken two years ago,
25 Kareem was 9. He was working in a gold

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2 mine in Burkina Faso. He was asked of
3 his dreams. He said, I want to make
4 money by working hard so that I no longer
5 have to do this anymore. But as we all
6 know, no matter how hard he works, he
7 would not be able to get out of the mine,
8 unless the rest of us work just as hard
9 to bring positive changes to the system
10 that forces millions of students like
11 Kareem to work in mines, banana fields,
12 cocoa plantations, garden factories, and
13 places even worse, often under
14 horrendous, hazardous conditions. But
15 thanks to citizens of Philadelphia and
16 you, City Council, Philadelphia is now
17 joining a global movement of more than
18 2,000 towns and promising to do our part
19 to promote fair trade.

20 What is fair trade? If it is a
21 fair trade-certified product, workers and
22 farmers earn fair wages under safe
23 conditions and no child labor through
24 environmentally sustainable practices,
25 and also workers themselves make a

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2 decision on how the money should be spent
3 on healthcare, on schools, to improve
4 their lives and fight the root causes of
5 poverty.

6 Philadelphia has a tradition of
7 making history on fairness. In 19th
8 century, Quakers made fair prices, and in
9 1980s, the first fair trade-certified
10 party was served in the United States at
11 Judy Wicks White Dog Cafe in West
12 Philadelphia. And recently Philadelphia
13 has made remarkable progress in greening
14 the City with bike paths, bike rentals,
15 beautiful walkable parks, and we all
16 citizens benefit from cleaner air, and
17 this impact goes far beyond the City
18 limits. And so consumers, now we know we
19 are not in the dark. We can make a
20 difference, and Philadelphia today earned
21 the distinction of making our city the
22 second largest fair trade city in the
23 U.S. after Chicago. So now --

24 (Applause.)

25 MS. BARNES: So please look at

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2 the faces in the podium who are
3 passionate about fair trade in the
4 region, and especially Media,
5 Pennsylvania, the first American --
6 America's first fair trade town. People,
7 please either raise your hand or
8 something so that we can recognize you in
9 2006 --

10 (Applause.)

11 MS. BARNES: -- that when
12 hardly anyone knew the word "fair trade"
13 or what it meant. And fortunately for
14 us, Fair Trade Philadelphia, they took us
15 under their wings. So absolutely without
16 them, we would not be standing here
17 today.

18 Thank you.

19 (Applause.)

20 MS. BARNES: Now, our group,
21 the Fair Trade Philadelphia, I wish I
22 could tell all the stories of the people
23 behind me, but I can't. Brian, a father
24 of two, who can make the impossible
25 possible, and now he's a Fair Trade

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2 Fellow, Mid-Atlantic Fellow. So he works
3 beyond the City limit.

4 And Pavna, who has seen women's
5 fair trade property back in India, her
6 homeland. She's a talented artist who
7 uses her talent for our cause, and she is
8 an expectant mother.

9 And I myself, a retired
10 teacher, a grandmother of three.

11 So thank you, City Council, for
12 your openness in recognizing us and in
13 giving us the permanent platform where
14 citizens can come and work with
15 procurement offices to bring concrete
16 changes that will benefit people in the
17 City and beyond. And today is a very
18 good day for, first, Kareem but also for
19 Philadelphia.

20 Thank you.

21 (Applause.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Thank you.

24 Council will be at ease.

25 (Council at ease.)

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3 Thank you very much.

4 At this time, the Chair
5 recognizes Councilwoman Tasco, who will
6 present a resolution acknowledging Marion
7 Johnson. Would Ms. Johnson and those
8 accompanying her please join the
9 Councilwoman at the podium.

10 (Councilmember and guests
11 approached podium.)

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
13 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell.

14 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
15 you. While they're coming forward, let
16 me acknowledge that Lois Fernandez,
17 founder of Odunde, is here, and we have
18 to recognize such a great woman to our
19 Philadelphia --

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
21 Absolutely.

22 (Applause.)

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

24 Thank you, Councilwoman.

25 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Good

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2 morning, everyone. Today is a very sad
3 day for all of us in City Council as well
4 as all of the residents of the 9th
5 Councilmanic District. Twenty-eight
6 years ago when I was recruited to be a
7 candidate to run for City Council, I was
8 introduced to a young woman who was a
9 committee person in the 49th Ward, and
10 even though her ward leader was also a
11 candidate for the 9th Councilmanic
12 District, she chose to work with me to
13 achieve the goal to become Councilwoman
14 from the 9th District.

15 We rang every doorbell in the
16 49th Ward. She had me in the rain, the
17 snow or whatever. I couldn't say no to a
18 Saturday.

19 She has been a staunch
20 supporter of her community. She has been
21 a real friend to me. She tried to leave
22 before and I threatened her. I said, You
23 can't go anywhere. But we're now sort of
24 transitioning out together, she just a
25 few months before me.

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2 But I wanted to bring her in
3 and say thank you, Marion Johnson, for
4 all the 27 years you've given to the 9th
5 Councilmanic District and the City of
6 Philadelphia.

7 She is joined here this morning
8 by her family. They have been -- they
9 are extraordinary. I have not known a
10 family so tight and so together. They
11 celebrate everybody's birthday. They go
12 on trips. It's a model family, and
13 Marion Johnson is the core. She keeps
14 them all together. And I'm so proud that
15 she has become the zoning czar in the
16 City of Philadelphia. Everybody knows
17 that. Let's give her a big round of
18 applause.

19 (Applause.)

20 COUNCILWOMAN TASC0: So when I
21 hired her, I said, You're going to be in
22 charge of zoning.

23 She says, Zoning? I don't know
24 anything about zoning.

25 But she became the expert, and

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2 she challenged the lawyers toe to toe
3 before the Zoning Board, and she gained
4 the respect of those individuals who went
5 before the Zoning Board to challenge
6 issues in my district, in the 9th
7 District.

8 And so I'm proud, Marion
9 Johnson, that we're today to say thank
10 you for the service you've given to this
11 city and also for the service you've
12 given in protecting the citizens in the
13 9th Councilmanic District. They love
14 you.

15 She goes on site visits. She
16 takes the staff with her, Eric with her.
17 And she just knows when she goes before
18 the Zoning Board, she's well aware of
19 what's happening with an issue before the
20 Zoning Board.

21 So we thank you for your
22 loyalty and your diligence, your
23 expertise and just for being a wonderful
24 person.

25 (Applause.)

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2 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Whereas,
3 for over twenty seven years, since the
4 day Marian B. Tasco became the
5 Councilwoman from the Ninth Councilmanic
6 District, Marion Johnson has been her
7 Zoning Specialist as well as Legislative
8 Aide; and

9 Whereas, in that position, Ms.
10 Johnson served as the trusted advisor to
11 and representative of Councilwoman Tasco,
12 meeting with constituents, visiting
13 sites, and attending meetings, doing her
14 homework before letters to and
15 appearances before the Zoning Board of
16 Adjustment, and overall providing fair,
17 informed, and diligent input on zoning
18 applications by engaging citizens,
19 community organizations, neighbors,
20 members and staff of the Zoning Board of
21 Adjustment and the City Planning
22 Commission, in addition to other
23 stakeholders in a process of open
24 conversation and consensus-building;

25 Whereas, after decades working

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2 under the previous, antiquated zoning
3 code, Mrs. Johnson lent her vast land use
4 and community experience as an appointee
5 to the Zoning Code Commission, helping to
6 craft the new Code, written through a
7 compromise by representatives from all
8 parties interested in the process, and
9 meant to accommodate modern needs and
10 uses, thus leaving a lasting mark on the
11 City and its zoning processes;

12 Whereas, Ms. Johnson has
13 contributed to her community in
14 additional ways, including as the
15 Executive Committeeperson of the 49th
16 Democratic Ward, president of the
17 Concerned Citizens of Logan, a member of
18 Barrett Recreation Center Advisory
19 Council, and block leader, responsible
20 for organizing clean-up days and block
21 parties in her neighborhood; and

22 Whereas, Ms. Johnson is an
23 active and committed member of True Faith
24 Missionary Baptist Church, where she
25 serves as one of the Mothers of the

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2 Church, and from which she ministers to
3 friends and neighbors in Logan and
4 beyond; and

5 Whereas, Ms. Johnson is proud
6 of the many accomplishments of her
7 family, which includes her five
8 daughters, eight grandchildren, and seven
9 of great-grandchildren. And now,
10 therefore, be it

11 Resolved, by the Council of the
12 City of Philadelphia, that we recognize
13 and acknowledge Marion Johnson for her
14 contributions as Zoning Specialist for
15 Councilwoman Marian Tasco, and for her
16 lifelong public service in the Ninth
17 Councilmanic District and to the City of
18 Philadelphia on the occasion of her
19 retirement.

20 Further resolved, that an
21 engrossed copy of this resolution be
22 presented to Marion Johnson, as an
23 expression of the sincere sentiments of
24 this legislative body.

25 And may I add, one person is

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2 missing, and that was one of her
3 daughters, Brenda, who passed away some
4 years ago, but was a tireless worker
5 right along with her mother.

6 So, Marion, thank you for being
7 a good parent, good grandparent, good
8 great-grandparent, and also great citizen
9 of the City of Philadelphia. Thank you.

10 (Standing ovation.)

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Thank you. Thank you, Ms. Johnson.

13 The Chair recognizes
14 Ms. Johnson for remarks.

15 And thank you so much for your
16 years of service.

17 MS. JOHNSON: Good morning to
18 everyone.

19 (Good morning.)

20 MS. JOHNSON: And thank you,
21 President, for allowing me to take a few
22 moments to speak. I'll be very brief.
23 My family is here and they usually give
24 me this sign. I don't want that to
25 happen today.

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2 But first and foremost, I want
3 to say that I thank God for my presence
4 here today and I thank God for allowing
5 me to arrive at this date. I don't know
6 how much longer it will be, but at least
7 I'm here and I'm standing here 82 years
8 of age.

9 (Applause.)

10 MS. JOHNSON: And so I thank
11 God for giving me my strength and in
12 giving me a beautiful family. And I'm
13 the queen of my family, and that's what
14 keeps me going. But I do want to just
15 point out a few facts.

16 One is that when I did join the
17 staff of Councilwoman Marian Tasco, she
18 being a task master, as I think most of
19 you all know now from knowing her, she
20 gave you an assignment and she didn't
21 spend two or three hours for you having a
22 training session at that point and
23 knowing what you were expected to go out
24 and do. You could come and ask a few
25 questions, but it wasn't an ongoing

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2 thing. And so I picked that up right
3 away and I decided and said to myself,
4 You're going to be a Zoning Specialist
5 when you leave this office.

6 And so I do feel very honored
7 to say that I've been able to work for
8 Councilwoman Marian Tasco all these years
9 and work with her, because we did become
10 family. And also the same thing with my
11 staff. It's not just me as an
12 individual. We are a team, and that's
13 how I've been effective to service the
14 constituents, because it took a whole
15 team of us, not just Marion Johnson.

16 But I do say that one thing I
17 also am extremely happy about is the fact
18 that I had the opportunity to be exposed
19 to being assigned to be the zoning staff
20 person in the Councilwoman's office,
21 because it then tuned me in to knowing
22 what zoning was all about, that it alerts
23 you that you must pay attention when you
24 see those signs, because that's a way for
25 you having input in something that's

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2 being proposed that may change your
3 quality of life. It may impact on it
4 even in a negative way or a positive way.
5 So it also educated me while I did my
6 job, and I must say that I love doing
7 zoning. I enjoy my job, and some people
8 have questioned me as to why aren't you
9 off taking trips? I don't have to take
10 trips. I trip at home a lot with my
11 family, and I love it. I enjoy my
12 family. I could not have achieved any of
13 these accolades that you all are giving
14 me today if I had not had the tight
15 family, and they're sitting out there.

16 And, President, I'm going to
17 end it real soon. But I want to give
18 them their full credit, because I have a
19 family and I feel like I'm rich. I don't
20 have Cadillacs, I don't have mansions and
21 all of that, but I do have a beautiful
22 family who loves me, and I'm the queen in
23 my home. I had --

24 (Applause.)

25 MS. JOHNSON: I birthed five

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2 daughters. I raised them the
3 old-fashioned way like my mom raised me.
4 I didn't have any boys, but you know
5 what, I have two wonderful son-in-laws
6 and I feel like I birthed two wonderful
7 sons. So I have no reason that I should
8 stand here today and not give thanks to
9 God, first and foremost, and to my family
10 and to my co-workers and to the
11 Councilwoman, who has put her confidence
12 in me, and I made every effort not to let
13 her down.

14 And in closing so that I'm not
15 in trouble with my pastor, Pastor Herb
16 Lusk, II, who is the pastor of Greater
17 Exodus Baptist Church at Broad and
18 Fairmount Avenue, and I love that church.
19 I belong there. We're like family there.
20 That's really where my membership is.
21 However, because True Faith Missionary
22 Baptist Church is in the community and
23 they always respond to us when we need a
24 place to bring the community together, I
25 work hand in hand with them.

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2 So I'm extra proud to say that
3 I have not only one church to go to, but
4 I have two. So I don't want to be in hot
5 water with my pastor when I get back to
6 church. All right?

7 So I thank you all for taking
8 the time out to be here today, and I
9 certainly have digested all of the words
10 that you have put out here today about
11 me, and I promise that I will continue to
12 try to live up to it. I won't just be at
13 the end of doing zoning, because zoning
14 is the ongoing process. So I just thank
15 Councilwoman for allowing me to have the
16 opportunity to get the kind of training
17 that I needed to have.

18 Thank you, Councilwoman.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20 Thank you.

21 (Applause.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Council will be at ease.

24 And I'd ask the Councilmembers
25 after the picture with Ms. Johnson, if

2 they could please stay up. We have one
3 more picture we need to take. Thank you.

4 (Council at ease.)

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

6 Thank you. If Councilmembers can please
7 remain standing. One more little quick
8 presentation.

9 Councilman Jones.

10 COUNCILMAN JONES: As we take
11 the picture, I wanted to take a second to
12 recognize a 14-year-old Philadelphian.
13 This Philadelphian, with five minutes
14 notice, was given the charge to represent
15 our city, his school, which happens to be
16 Central, and was given the task of
17 singing a presentation to Pope Francis.
18 When he did so with only five minutes
19 notice, he stunned the world, and Mark
20 Wahlberg called his voice a voice of an
21 angel.

22 I want to present to some and
23 reacquaint to others young Bobby Hill and
24 welcome him to City Council.

25 (Applause.)

2 COUNCILMAN JONES: Furthermore,
3 for the record, please know that his
4 goals -- he's on his way to New York
5 after this. His goal is to play at The
6 Met, to be on Broadway, but when I asked
7 him to sing before members of City
8 Council, after stunning the Pope, he was
9 slightly intimidated.

10 So welcome him once again to
11 our Chamber.

12 (Applause.)

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 So I'd like to thank you,
