2 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Good
3 afternoon, everyone. This is the
4 Committee on Transportation and Public
5 Utilities. It's Thursday, February 16,
6 2023.

7 I understand that the state law
8 currently requires that the following

12 health emergency, City Council
13 Committees are currently meeting
14 remotely. We are using Microsoft Teams

21 News, Inquirer and Legal Intelligencer

24 Will the Clerk please call the
25 roll to take attendance. Members that

9 THE CLERK: Councilmember
10 Phillips.

11 (No response.)

12 THE CLERK: Councilmember
13 Vaughn.

14 COUNCILWOMAN VAUGHN: Present.

15 THE CLERK: Vice-Chair Squilla.

16 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: (Muted).

17 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: He can be
18 listed as present. Mark, you're on
19 mute.

20 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Sorry
21 about that. Good afternoon Council
22 Pres -- Mr. Chairman and colleagues.
23 I'm present.

24 THE CLERK: Chair Johnson.

25 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Present.

1 THE CLERK: And then
2 Councilmember Phillips was present. We
3 do need him for the quorum.

4 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Okay.
5 I'll give him a text real quick.

6 THE CLERK: I'm not sure.
7 Maybe he lost connection.

8 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Okay. I
9 just sent him a text. He said -- he
10 said he's logged in. He said he's in
11 the waiting room. Let me see, the link
12 should be on his calendar.

13 THE CLERK: He had been in the
14 meeting.

15 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: I just
16 told him to check the link that's on
17 the calendar.

18 COUNCIL SUPPORT: Mr. Chair,
19 we're working with him via phone to get
20 him connected to the hearing.

21 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you.

22 COUNCIL SUPPORT: You're
23 welcome.

24 COUNCILMAN PHILLIPS: All
25 right. I'm in.

2 afternoon.

3 COUNCILMAN PHILLIPS: Good
4 afternoon, everyone.

5 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Eliza, can
6 you just acknowledge Anthony Phillips
7 for the record.

8 THE CLERK: Yes, Councilmember
9 Phillips.

10 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you
11 very much. A quorum of the Committee
12 is present and this hearing is now
13 called to order. This is the public
14 hearing of the Committee on
15 Transportation and Public Utilities
16 regarding Bill No. 220810.

17 Will the Clerk please read the
18 title of the bill.

19 THE CLERK: Bill 220810,
20 authorizing the Procurement
21 Commissioner to enter into agreement to
22 purchase electricity, natural gas and
23 motor fuel for use by the City and City
24 facilities and vehicles including
25 agreements that obligate payment for

1 delivery of such energy supplies in
2 future fiscal years, all under certain
3 terms and conditions.

4 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Before we
5 begin to hear testimony for the
6 witnesses we have for today, everyone
7 who has been invited to the meeting to
8 testify should be aware that this
9 public hearing is being recorded.

10 Because the hearing is public,
11 participants and viewers have no
12 reasonable expectation of privacy. By
13 continuing to be in the meeting, you
14 are consenting to being recorded.

15 Additionally, prior to
16 recognizing Members for the questions
17 or comments they have for witnesses, I
18 will note for the record at this time
19 that we will use the chat feature
20 available in Microsoft Teams to allow
21 Members to signify that they wish to be
22 recognized. In order to comply with
23 the Sunshine Act, the chat feature must
24 only be used for this purpose.

25 Would the Clerk please call the

2 THE CLERK: Dominic McGraw.

3 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON:

4 Mr. McGraw, just state your name for
5 the record, your title and please
6 begin.

7 MR. MCGRAW: Good afternoon,
8 Chair Johnson and members of the
9 Committee. My name is Dominic McGraw.
10 I serve as City Energy Manager for the
11 City of Philadelphia in the Office of
12 Sustainability's Energy Office. I'm
13 here in support of Bill No. 220810
14 sponsored by Councilmember Gilmore
15 Richardson, which authorizes the
16 purchase of electricity, natural gas
17 and vehicle fuel for City -- for its
18 facilities to be delivered through
19 Fiscal Year 2026.

20 In 2010, Council authorized the
21 City to make electricity purchases for
22 Fiscal Year 2011 through Fiscal Year
23 2014. In 2012, Council extended that
24 authorization to Fiscal Year 2015 and
25 has continued granting additional

1 authorization in subsequent years.

2 Mayor Nutter issued Executive
3 Order No. 610 creating an Electricity
4 Supply Advisory Committee. The City
5 Council Committee Chairs for
6 Transportation and Utilities, Public
7 Works and the Environment or their
8 representatives serve on the Committee.
9 The Electricity Supply Advisory
10 Committee reviewed the electricity
11 purchasing strategy and has been kept
12 abreast of the purchases.

13 The City's Energy Office
14 oversees as the primary -- or serves as
15 the primary manager for the procurement
16 of electricity, natural gas and vehicle
17 fuel for the General, Aviation and
18 Water Funds. The Office's energy
19 procurement work is guided by the
20 City's Municipality Master Plan and
21 through conversations with the City's
22 Finance Department, Water Department
23 and the Philadelphia International
24 Airport.

25 The Energy Office strives for

1 the City's energy procurement to be low
2 cost, provide budget certainty and to
3 have transparent pricing and to do so
4 by increasingly using clean and
5 renewable energy. City government's
6 electricity costs are significant and
7 costs for all City funds, General Fund,
8 Aviation Fund and Water Fund averaged
9 to about 50 million over the previous
10 three fiscal years.

11 The cost to the General Fund
12 including street lighting and signals
13 for Fiscal Year 2022 was approximately
14 27.2 million. The electricity supply
15 portion of the total bill is about
16 two-thirds of the total electricity
17 cost. The City has successfully
18 managed supply costs by purchasing in
19 the wholesale electricity market and
20 staggering purchases to limit the risk
21 of paying a premium for electricity --

22 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON:

23 Mr. McGraw?

24 MR. MCGRAW: Yes?

25 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Can you

1 hold on for one second?

2 MR. McGRAW: Sure.

3 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON:

4 Everyone -- if you're not speaking, can
5 everyone put their phone on mute,
6 please. Go ahead, sir.

7 MR. McGRAW: Thank you.

8 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: So that's
9 you. You have a humming noise in the
10 background, static. But go ahead.

11 MR. McGRAW: Sorry about that.
12 This bill will authorize the City to
13 make agreement for delivery of
14 electricity in Fiscal Year 2026 through
15 a state regulated license service
16 provider. The City's licensed service
17 provider was selected through a
18 competitive process and in making
19 purchases in the regional electricity
20 marketplace.

21 In addition to electricity
22 purchases, the City purchases natural
23 gas and vehicle fuel from the
24 competitive market for its largest
25 buildings and accounts. The City's

1 interruptible natural gas accounts are
2 those that can switch from natural gas
3 to alternative fuel whenever
4 Philadelphia Gas Works, PGW, announces
5 a temporary curtailment of gas service.

6 The largest City buildings have
7 accounts that qualify for access to the
8 competitive market for natural gas
9 supply. PGW is impartial to the City's
10 approach to procurement, as it is
11 primarily compensated for delivery and
12 distribution services of natural gas
13 now for its supply.

14 City governments competitively
15 purchase natural gas supply are
16 significant and the cost for all City
17 funds, General Fund, Aviation Fund and
18 Water Fund were approximately 4.2
19 million in Fiscal Year 2022. The cost
20 to the General Fund for Fiscal Year
21 2022 was approximately \$1,000,085.

22 The City government's vehicle
23 fuel costs are significant and the cost
24 for all City funds, General Fund,
25 Aviation Fund and Water Fund were

1 approximately 17.6 million in Fiscal
2 Year 2022. The cost of the General
3 Fund for Fiscal Year 2022 was \$14.5
4 million. For motor fuel, the City make
5 staggered purchases in the wholesale
6 motor fuel market, providing the City
7 with budget stability.

8 This bill would authorize the
9 City to make agreements for delivery of
10 natural gas and vehicle fuel through
11 Fiscal Year 2026 with state and
12 federally licensed providers. The
13 current providers were selected through
14 a competitive bid process and act as
15 the City's agents in making purchases
16 in the electricity market or energy
17 market, building on a strong
18 relationship with the Philadelphia
19 Energy Authority or PEA.

20 The ordinance includes a
21 provision that requires the
22 Administration to inform a designated
23 representative of the PEA of the City's
24 intent to make purchases and consider
25 the timely advice provided by the PEA

1 on purchases.

2 In closing, I anticipate that
3 this procurement approach will continue
4 to lower the City's electricity,
5 natural gas and motor fuel bills while
6 protecting the City from potential
7 escalation in energy prices over the
8 next several years. This bill will
9 help to contribute to competitive
10 prices and budget certainty for the
11 City's utilities. Thank you for the
12 opportunity to testify today and I'm
13 happy to answer any questions you may
14 have.

15 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you.
16 Any questions or comments from members
17 of the Committee including the sponsor?

18 (No response.)

19 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Hearing
20 none, we will now conclude this hearing
21 and go into a public meeting. I want
22 to thank all the panelists and
23 witnesses for your participation today.
24 We value your input. I now invite the
25 witnesses and the panelists to

14 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: The Chair
15 notes for the record that Councilwoman
16 Sharon Vaughn seconds the motion.

17 It has been moved and properly
18 seconded that Bill No. 220810 be
19 reported from this Committee with a
20 favorable recommendation and further
21 move that the rules of Council be
22 suspended to permit first reading of
23 this bill at the next session.

24 All those in favor of the
25 motion will signify by saying aye.
