13 of Philadelphia of an amendment to the educational

15 which would establish a process which would
16 authorize the privatization of the administration,
17 operation, and the management of the School
18 District, as approved by resolution of the City
19 Council, fixing a date of a special election for
20 such purpose proscribed in the form of a ballot
21 question to be voted on, and authorizing the
22 appropriate officers to publish notice, and to make
23 arrangements for the special election.
