13 This is indeed the day that the
14 Lord has made, and despite all trials and
15 tribulations facing our city, we will
16 rejoice and be glad in it. Give thanks
17 to the Lord, for he is good and his
18 faithful love endures forever.

19 Dear Heavenly Father, the
20 creator and sustainer of all things,
21 thank you for your many blessings. Thank
22 you for the ability to be involved in
23 life-changing work. Thank you for the
24 ability to spread love, joy, peace,
25 goodness, and faithfulness to those we

3 opportunity to gather in this place to
4 carry out the tasks assigned to each

11 work collaboratively with one another, to

15 history of this legislation.

17 that a longtime teacher of Meredith and
18 Jackson School was diagnosed with
19 mesothelioma, which pretty much believed
20 came from her providing education to
21 young people at those schools. At that
22 time, we worked on this bill and
23 introduced the legislation -- was about
24 to introduce the legislation, but the
25 School District said, give us some time

2 as we try to address asbestos in our
3 schools.

4 So giving them the benefit of
5 the doubt, I held back on the
6 legislation, thinking that asbestos would
7 be remediated over a period of time and
8 be done quickly, especially as we went
9 into the pandemic when we know the
10 schools were closed and was under the
11 impression I was receiving that they were
12 working very hard to address those
13 issues. Although they made some
14 improvement, much more work needs to be
15 done in reference to asbestos.

16 And then as we came back into
17 our Council session in 2021 and prior to
18 that as the schools are reopening and my
19 son was going back to school, like a
20 number of other children around the City
21 of Philadelphia, we learned that the
22 asbestos issue was still a very
23 significant problem in our schools.

24 We all saw the issues that many
25 of us participated in the press

2 conferences at Masterman and also SLA
3 Beeber where parents, teachers, other
4 School District employees and children
5 were very concerned to be in our schools.

6 So working with the Health
7 Department, we've been able to make
8 amendments to this legislation to require
9 that before a special certificate of
10 occupancy can be issued for an education
11 building in the City of Philadelphia, the
12 Health Department must inspect in
13 reference to asbestos, and this follows
14 the legislation that Councilmember
15 Squilla and us as a body supported
16 dealing with lead. It also brings
17 together an advisory committee to provide
18 guidance to the Managing Director's
19 Office about issues and concerns
20 regarding the safety and the building
21 conditions of our schools.

22 So this was a collaborative
23 approach and process where we worked with
24 both Philadelphia Federation of Teachers,
25 the Pennsylvania Chapter of American

2 Federation of Teachers, as well as SEIU,
3 our school administrators, CASA Local
4 502, Philadelphia Home and School
5 Council, and the Philadelphia School
6 Advisory Council, as well as other
7 parents and concerned individuals around

9 of asbestos in our schools.

10 My hope is with the new
11 Superintendent, Dr. Tony Watlington,
12 we'll have a new approach as we work
13 through these issues and do all that we
14 can to remove asbestos from our schools
15 to make sure that everyone who works, who
16 is educated, who comes into our schools
17 are doing it in a safe environment and
18 place going forward.

13 I have two items to talk about.
14 One is a wonderful item and one is a
15 terrible item. I'll start with the
16 terrible item.

17 It almost goes unnoticed as a
18 sign of the times here in Philadelphia
19 that on May 14th in Buffalo, a person
20 drove 200 miles to put on a live stream
21 the murder of ten people and the shooting
22 of three others, 11 African American.
23 This person specifically drove to this
24 Black neighborhood to shoot people in the
25 parking lot and in the supermarket.

2 It's a very sick and tragic
3 sign of what is going on, but even worse,
4 that we have so many murders in our city
5 that it's almost uneventful, and it
6 should not be.

7 I just want to express our
8 thoughts and prayers for those survivors,
9 condolences to the families, the
10 communities. It's devastating and
11 particularly for those who have not
12 experienced the levels of violence that
13 some of us have in this nation,
14 particularly here in our city.

15 The other event that I want to
16 mention, which is the exact opposite and
17 part of the solution to these problems,
18 is that here in Philadelphia today, Black
19 Enterprise is holding its 11th Annual
20 Entrepreneurial Summit, Entrepreneurs
21 Summit, and I had the pleasure and the
22 honor, along with Councilmembers Cindy
23 Bass and Derek Green, to present our
24 Council resolution this morning to the
25 President and CEO, Earl "Butch" Graves,

2 Jr., a wonderful event. They started in
3 Philadelphia. They're back here in
4 Philadelphia.

5 Entrepreneurism, owning
6 businesses, having the ability to put
7 your personality and to direct in your
8 way what you want to do in life is one of
9 the wonderful things that I believe will
10 not only help our communities turn around
11 the problem we have but address a lot of
12 the ills, such as gun violence, murder,
13 and a lack of just respect for human
14 life.

15 I think that, you know, we all
16 celebrate the BE Entrepreneurs Summit,
17 and I know many of us are going to go
18 over there throughout the event, and I
19 want to congratulate them and just tell
20 them how much we appreciate them here in
21 our City of Philadelphia.

22 Thank you, Council President.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

24 Thank you, Councilman.

25 On behalf of the majority, the

3 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you,
4 Council President.

5 First of all, I want to echo
6 the sentiments of my colleague as it
7 relates to some of the concerns dealing
8 with the shooting this past week. It's
9 an extremely sad situation that captured
10 the heart of a lot of people across the
11 country, across the world really. There
12 was multiple shootings over the weekend,
13 and really sad situation.

14 But this week in Philadelphia,
15 we had, along the Commonwealth of
16 Pennsylvania, we had a primary election,
17 and the voter turnout for that election
18 hovered around 20 percent. We're still
19 counting some mail-in ballots and looking
20 at the numbers, but the concern that only
21 20 percent of the registered voters here
22 in the City of Philadelphia came out to
23 vote this week when we have contested
24 elections, important elections to me is
25 alarming.

2 We have an important general
3 election next year. We have an important
4 race -- I'm sorry; important general
5 election in November. We have important
6 elections next year, and of course in
7 2024, we vote for President.

8 So one of the things that I've
9 been fighting for is more investment in
10 the Commissioners Office. The Mayor
11 allocated \$22 million in his budget
12 proposal when the Commissioners asked for
13 27, but we all know that it would take
14 \$36 million to fairly fund an election in
15 the way that we've seen in 2020 where
16 people came out to vote in record
17 numbers.

18 So I am concerned about the
19 voter turnout. I do think that we all
20 need to own some of this on our own where
21 we're going to push and promote the
22 election this November, but I also think
23 that we need to do a better job of
24 allocating funds to the Commissioners
25 Office.

2 So I just want to raise
3 awareness to the letter that we sent out
4 to the Administration as well as to our
5 state partners asking for more money and
6 more funding to fund a fair election.

7 The last thing I'm going to
8 say, you know, yesterday I spent a lot of
9 time -- Tuesday I spent a lot of time on
10 the polling place, and I remember coming
11 across one woman who really touched my
12 heart. I watched a lot of seniors
13 walking to the polling places with canes
14 and, you know, do everything they can to
15 vote, but one woman in specific, you
16 know, she was upset at us on the City
17 Council side, so she caught my attention,
18 right?

19 You know, what's going on?
20 Talk to me. Tell me how you're feeling.
21 And before she got a chance to talk to
22 me, she needed to sit down, because her
23 legs were giving out and she was tired.
24 So, you know, I was, can I walk you to
25 your car? Can I help you out?

2 The conversation immediately
3 shifted, and I got an opportunity to talk
4 to the woman for about 20 minutes, and
5 she is -- you know, almost had me in
6 tears, because she was asking me when do
7 I come up for election next year -- and I
8 said next year, and she said, well, I
9 might not be here to vote for you.

10 So I'm like, well, what's
11 wrong? What's going on? And she
12 explained to me, you know, what she had
13 been going through, and I'm not going to
14 put her business out there, but she
15 talked about her terminal illness, and in
16 the midst of, you know, talking about her
17 terminal illness, she still found a way
18 to come out and vote, right? Like
19 literally facing death, might not be here
20 to vote in November, but still wanted to
21 come out and vote.

22 A little mad at us, right, and
23 that's part of the job. That's what we
24 signed up for. And I still don't know
25 why, but, you know, it really -- I will

2 never forget that woman. I'll never
3 forget the fact that in the midst of
4 facing death, she felt like it was her
5 obligation to come out and vote, while so
6 many of us have the choice and the time
7 and choose not to do so for a lot of
8 reasons.

9 So I know I'm going to do my
10 part to try to raise awareness for this
11 November's election, but I will never
12 forget her, and I'm hoping that her story
13 inspires somebody else to participate in
14 an election where they might not
15 necessarily want to come out and vote.

16 I'll also close out with
17 something similar to what Councilman
18 Johnson says all the time when he starts
19 our hearings -- I mean, starts our
20 Council hearings, praying for those who
21 have been victims of gun violence. We've
22 had some tragic, tragic, tragic deaths in
23 the City of Philadelphia over the last
24 couple weeks, some young people, innocent
25 victims being caught in the crossfire of

2 gun violence, and I just want to echo my
3 colleague Councilman Johnson, who always
4 offers prayers and condolence to the
5 folks that we're losing in this city, and
6 I look forward to continuing to work with
7 my colleagues to be able to address this

9 Sorry for being longwinded,
10 folks, but thank you, Council President.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Thank you, Councilman. Sad, compelling,
13 but encouraging message that you just
14 gave us about that lady. It's real, you
15 know. So thank you. Thank you,
16 Councilman.

17 The Chair recognizes Councilman
18 Green.

19 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Thank you,
20 Council President.

21 Thank you, Councilmember
22 Thomas, for your comments. Definitely
23 was good to hear. Appreciated that
24 perspective. It reminds us of the work
25 that we need to do every day.

4 President of Democratic Municipal
5 Officials, I had a chance to talk with
6 Buffalo Mayor Byron Brown and just offer

9 in trying to lead his city dealing with
10 that horrific situation that happened in
11 Buffalo when we're dealing with all the
12 issues of the pandemic and economic
13 development and all the challenges that
14 we're dealing with and add to that a mass
15 shooting targeting African Americans in
16 his city.

17 So definitely thank you,
18 Councilmember Oh, for raising that point
19 this morning.

20 I also want to thank
21 Councilmember Oh for allowing me to
22 participate with him in the presentation
23 for the Black Enterprise resolution. As
24 someone who grew up reading Black
25 Enterprise in my household, it was a real

3 that resolution, along with Councilmember
4 Cindy Bass. So I wanted to thank you,

10 I remind people that my office is hosting
11 a blood drive today with the American Red
12 Cross, and this is a blood drive to

14 cell anemia disease. I know

23 you, Councilman.

24 The Chair recognizes Councilman
25 Johnson.

2 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
3 Council President.

4 Just a couple brief remarks.
5 First, I want to congratulate -- now
6 she's the former CEO of the Philadelphia
7 International Airport. That's Chellie
8 Cameron, who has now transitioned over to
9 the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of
10 Commerce, where she will be the CEO.

11 Chellie worked at the Airport
12 over the last 11 years as the CEO, and we
13 had a good working relationship as it
14 relates to moving the Philadelphia
15 International Airport forward. So I just
16 want to congratulate her and wish her the
17 best in her new position in terms of her
18 career.

19 Also, Council President and
20 colleagues, similar to Councilman Isaiah
21 Thomas, on E Day, I was out and about and
22 I'd like to say smelling my district and
23 talking to the residents and moving all
24 throughout the Second Councilmanic
25 District and just talking to the voters,

and two key issues that was very resilient and consistent in talking to my constituents were, one, making sure that we keep the pulse of addressing the senseless gun violence that is continuously taking over our city, making sure that we're providing positive outlets for our young people so they don't pick up guns during this upcoming summer, and making sure as the weather breaks we're doing everything that we can do possible to keep our residents safe.

And so I will be, as we're moving forward, making sure I'm engaging with our Philadelphia Police Commissioner, Danielle Outlaw; our District Attorney, Larry Krasner; our new School Superintendent who will be joining us here in the City of Philadelphia, as well as Probation, Parole, and our court system just to make sure that we have a comprehensive strategy and approach around this issue. And we'll be reaching out to my colleagues also for support

2 particularly around this particular
3 issue, because we don't want to have
4 another summer on a trajectory where
5 we're going to surpass 600 homicides in
6 the City of Philadelphia.

7 A good note is that we're
8 slightly under when it comes to homicides
9 this year, at least nine percent less
10 homicides this year than we had last
11 year, but we're up in shootings. So we
12 have a lot more individuals who are
13 getting shot, and that hasn't even taken
14 in consideration those individuals who
15 are paralyzed, those individuals who are
16 maimed as a result of the shootings, but
17 also the shell shock that has an impact
18 on the community in which we live in.

19 And the second key issue,
20 Council President and colleagues, is the
21 issue of property assessments and the
22 taxes that are going to have a
23 significant impact on those individuals
24 in neighborhoods that have seen property
25 values significantly increase. And so as

we move forward, just making sure in this budgetary process that we're doing all the things possible to give the level of tax relief to our residents, engaging them and making sure that they're participating in first-level reviews and making sure that they're taking advantage of all the tax relief measures that are available that we offer here in the City of Philadelphia, and also us not turning a blind eye on paying attention to the eviction crisis that is also surely going to take place when we see these property values increase.

When the landlord property values increase and the taxes increase, he's going to pass that cost down to the tenant, and if the tenant can't afford their rent, those will also be individuals who will be left homeless trying to figure out a way where they will actually lay their head to sleep.

So those two key themes were very, very consistent on Election Day

2 going all throughout the Second
3 Councilmanic District, and I will make
4 sure that those key issues I will be
5 addressing with my colleagues here in the
6 City of Philadelphia. I just wanted to
7 put that out there just for the record.

8 My staff just wants me to
9 clarify that although Chellie hasn't
10 resigned just yet, she still put out
11 information she will be moving along to a
12 new position with the Chamber of
13 Commerce. So I just want to clarify that
14 she will still be working with us until
15 June 24th, but nevertheless, that's just
16 a month away, which means there will be
17 new leadership at the Philadelphia
18 International Airport.

19 So as always, it's good to see
20 everyone.

21 Thank you, Council President,
22 for your time.

25 I hate to keep making little

2 comments after the speeches. I know I'm
3 not supposed to talk, but you referenced
4 Election Day, and I got to tell you, on
5 Election Day standing at 30th and Oxford
6 with my Chief of Staff, Curtis Wilkerson,
7 2 o'clock in the afternoon, approximately
8 30 shots rang out. Must have been no
9 more than a block or two away.

10 The thing that concerned me,
11 that the people just continued to walk
12 and talk and it was like nothing
13 happened, right? And the gentleman said,
14 Darrell, that happens every day. And
15 that's what you're dealing with. You
16 know, it's just so frequent, it's just
17 sad and scary.

18 So I concur, Councilman, we got
19 to do something different.

20 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: And it
21 shouldn't be normal.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
23 Yeah. You know, it's just ridiculous.

24 Thank you, Councilman.

3 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
4 Mr. President.

5 I want to echo my colleagues'
6 comments about last Tuesday, Election
7 Day. I first want to start with former
8 City Commissioner Anthony Clark passed
9 away. He was a public servant. He was a
10 proud North Philadelphian, and he fought
11 for our democracy.

12 During my travels on Election
13 Day, I saw a lot of my colleagues in
14 different parts of the City, but what I
15 noticed was the fact that the resources
16 we need to keep and dedicate to the City
17 Commissioners Office is the blue line,
18 red line, the line of our democracy.

19 Most of our machine operators,
20 inspection posts that we have inside the
21 polling place, we're finding a hard time
22 filling those positions. Without those
23 machine operators and judges of election,
24 there is no polling place.

25 In some parts of Philadelphia,

2 the boxes, the election boxes that are
3 supposed to be delivered to the
4 respective polling places, weren't picked
5 up.

6 A lot of our workers are
7 getting up in age. We have to train,
8 recruit, and educate younger people to be
9 a part of the democratic and republican
10 parties so that we can have proper
11 elections run in Philadelphia.

12 I just know that as we move
13 towards the midterms, November, we have
14 to solve these problems or fingers will
15 be pointed at us, blaming us for things
16 that may not even exist.

17 So we have to do our part to
18 make sure the machinery of our democracy
19 is well oiled and well staffed.

20 Thank you, Mr. President.

3 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Thank you,
4 Council President, and I just want a
5 quick comment.

6 Last night I had an opportunity
7 to do a ride-along in your district, I
8 believe, Council President, 22nd
9 District, and met with the captain and
10 several people there, and they're doing a
11 really good job. The captain has that
12 program. I know that we, through you, I
13 think we've supported that, Guns Down,
14 Gloves Up. Great program with young kids
15 out there teaching boxing and different
16 skills. It's great.

17 But I was in the, I guess, the
18 front seat of the police car from 6:00 to
19 10:00 last night and actually witnessed
20 seven different shootings. Five of them
21 were on Bouvier Street, and when we got
22 there, the police were actually chasing
23 the shooters in the car, and we stopped
24 and got out, saw what was going on.

25 It's just heartbreaking to see

2 this, and most of these things, I
3 believe, are totally around drugs.
4 That's really where a lot of this is
5 coming from, drug-related crimes. We
6 really need to work with not just our
7 local partners that I know are doing as
8 much as we can, but we have to engage
9 some of these federal partners to help us
10 with this drug situation.

11 But I will say the Police
12 Department, from my observation, did an
13 incredibly great job. They were really
14 professional. Saw many police officers
15 out there just doing really good work.
16 So I just wanted to commend them and just
17 share that experience. It was sad to
18 see.

19 Thank you.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Yeah. Yeah. Councilman, I heard last
22 night you went on a ride-along. I was
23 praying for you that you stayed safe.

24 With that, the Chair recognizes
25 Councilman Jones for a motion to adjourn.
