2 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you
3 and good morning. I understand that
4 state law currently requires that the
5 following announcement be made at the
6 beginning of every remote public hearing
7 as follows: Due to the current public
8 health emergency, City Council
9 Committees are currently meeting
10 remotely. We are using Microsoft Teams
11 to make these remote hearings possible.

12 Instructions for how the public
13 may view and offer public testimony at
14 public hearings of Council Committees
15 are included in the public hearing
16 notices that are being published in the
17 Daily News, Inquirer and Legal
18 Intelligencer prior to the hearings and
19 can be also found on phlcouncil.com. I
20 now note that the hour has come.

21 And I ask the Clerk, will you
22 please call the roll to take attendance.
23 Members that are in attendance will
24 please indicate that you are present
25 when your name is called. Also, please

1 say a few brief words when responding so
2 that your image will be displayed online
3 or on the screen when you speak.

4 Madam Clerk.

5 THE CLERK: Councilmember
6 Henon.

7 COUNCILMAN HENON: Good
8 morning, Madam Chair and colleagues.

9 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Morning.

10 THE CLERK: Councilmember Oh.

11 COUNCILMAN OH: Good morning,
12 Madam Chair. Good morning, colleagues.

13 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
14 morning.

15 THE CLERK: Councilmember Gym.
16 Councilmember Green.

17 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Good
18 morning, Madam Chair, colleagues. And
19 happy belated birthday.

20 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.
21 Good morning. And I appreciate those
22 birthday wishes. Thank you.

23 THE CLERK: Councilmember
24 Thomas.

25 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good

1 morning, Madam Chair. Good morning,
2 colleagues. Happy to be here this
3 morning.

4 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
5 morning.

6 THE CLERK: Councilmember
7 Brooks.

8 COUNCILWOMAN BROOKS: Good
9 morning, Madam Chair. Good morning,
10 colleagues.

11 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
12 morning.

13 THE CLERK: And, Madam Chair
14 Bass.

15 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
16 morning. Okay. So thank you, Madam
17 Clerk. A quorum of the Committee is
18 present and the hearing is now called to
19 order.

20 This is the public hearing of
21 the Committee on Public Health and Human
22 Services regarding Bill No. 200115.
23 Resolution No. 200153 is being held at
24 the request of the sponsor and will not
25 be heard today.

1 Clerk, will you please read the
2 title of the bill being considered
3 today.

4 THE CLERK: Bill No. 200115, an
5 Ordinance amending Section 10-602 of the
6 Philadelphia Code, entitled "Smoking,"
7 to prohibit establishments that are
8 excepted from the indoor smoking
9 prohibition from permitting minors to
10 enter, and to require health
11 informational signs; and amending
12 Section 10-614, entitled "Electronic
13 Smoking Devices," to prohibit
14 establishments that are excepted from
15 the indoor e-cigarette use prohibition
16 from permitting minors to enter, and to
17 require health informational signs; all
18 under certain terms and conditions.

19 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Before we
20 begin to hear testimony from the
21 witnesses who we have for today,
22 everyone who has been invited to the
23 meeting to testify should be aware that
24 this public hearing is being recorded.
25 Because the hearing is public,

1 participants and viewers have no
2 reasonable expectation of privacy. By
3 continuing in the meeting, you are
4 consenting to being recorded.

5 Additionally, prior to
6 recognizing Members for the questions or
7 comments they have for witnesses, I will
8 note for the record at this time that we
9 will use the chat feature available in
10 Microsoft Teams to allow Members to
11 signify that they wish to be recognized.
12 In order to comply with the Sunshine
13 Act, the chat feature must only be used
14 for that purpose.

15 Madam Clerk, will you please
16 call the first panel or witness to
17 testify.

18 And before we actually call
19 that witness to testify, I did want to
20 invite the sponsor of the bill to make
21 comments.

22 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,
23 Madam Chair. I think it's best that we
24 hear from the Administration and our
25 Health Commissioner. It's my belief

1 that it just furthers the commitment of
2 our leadership in the City of
3 Philadelphia when it comes to health and
4 safety in the prohibition of smoking in
5 front of minors in certain venues and
6 its commitment to health in our City, so
7 thank you.

8 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Well, thank
9 you, Councilman. And I could not agree
10 with you more that the health of our
11 young people is paramount and the City
12 has made a commitment to that. And I
13 think that this bill is something that
14 will be of great use to our City and to
15 the young people in our City and to the
16 long-term health effects that they are
17 facing.

18 So without further ado, Madam
19 Clerk, will you please call the first
20 witness to testify.

21 THE CLERK: Health Commissioner
22 Dr. Thomas Farley from the Department of
23 Public Health.

24 DR. FARLEY: Good morning. Can
25 you hear me?

1 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: We can hear
2 you well. Good morning.

3 DR. FARLEY: Good morning. All
4 right. Good morning, Chairmember Bass
5 and members of the Public Health and
6 Human Services Committee. I'm
7 Dr. Thomas Farley, Health Commissioner
8 for the City of Philadelphia. Thank you
9 for allowing me to testify on Bill No.
10 200115, which if enacted would prohibit
11 establishments with exemptions from the
12 City's restriction of indoor smoking and
13 indoor electronic smoking device use for
14 permitting minors to enter and would
15 require signs to that effect.

16 For those establishments where
17 hookah smoking takes place, the bill
18 would also require the posting of
19 information about the health risks of
20 hookah use. Thanks to Chair
21 Councilmember Bass and Henon for
22 sponsoring this bill.

23 Under City and state laws,
24 almost all restaurants and bars in
25 Philadelphia are smoke-free, which

1 protect workers and customers in these
2 establishments from the serious dangers
3 of secondhand smoke. Some restaurants
4 and bars have exemptions, though. While
5 few of the remaining bars in the City
6 that permit smoking allow children
7 inside, dozens of establishments that
8 serve hookah have no such rule. That
9 means that families with children may
10 have no idea entering the restaurant
11 that they are inadvertently exposing
12 their children to secondhand smoke,
13 relying on the commonsense belief that
14 such exposure is no longer permitted in
15 places where children go.

16 By barring minors from entering
17 establishments where smoking takes
18 place, we protect their lungs from
19 secondhand smoke. In addition, the bill
20 would require signs clarifying that
21 minors are not allowed to enter the
22 premises of any establishments that
23 allows onsite use of tobacco products or
24 electronic smoking devices due to the
25 health risks of secondhand smoke and

1 vape products.

2 Smoking hookah produces very
3 dangerous harmful air pollutants. PM
4 2.5, which is a form of harmful fine
5 particulate matter that is associated
6 with heart and lung disease including
7 lung cancer, can be even more highly
8 concentrated in hookah bars than in bars
9 where cigarette smoking is permitted.
10 Even in bars who claim to use only
11 tobacco and nicotine-free herbal hookah,
12 nicotine has been found in the product,
13 nicotine has been found in the air and
14 PM 2.5 levels are elevated.

15 Hookah is unique among tobacco
16 products in that it does not require
17 required health warnings like those on
18 cigarettes and other tobacco packaging.
19 These warnings serve an important
20 purpose. Consumers are up to three
21 times more likely to recognize the risks
22 to their health if they're warned about
23 it on product packaging. The lack of
24 warnings has serious consequences.

25 Many hookah users, including up

1 to 70 percent of college students who
2 have used hookah, believe that because
3 smoke passes through water, it is less
4 risky than cigarette smoke. It is not.
5 A typical hookah smoking session exposes
6 a person to twice the nicotine and over
7 20 times the tar of smoking a single
8 cigarette. Because there are no warning
9 signs, these people are exposed to
10 serious health risks they do not
11 understand.

12 This bill would require hookah
13 bars to post warning signs at each
14 entrance and on menus and menu boards
15 about the health risks of hookah
16 smoking. These signs should deter many
17 people who mistakenly believe that
18 hookah is safe or safer than cigarettes
19 from smoking hookah.

20 Finally, I want to note that as
21 long as these exemptions exist to the
22 smoke-free air law, employees in these
23 bars will be exposed to an increased
24 risk of cancer and heart disease from
25 secondhand smoke. Often these employees

1 do not have the freedom to find
2 employment in safer establishments.
3 Accordingly, the Philadelphia Department
4 of Health also continues to recommend
5 repeal of the specialty tobacco
6 establishment exemption. Thank you for
7 the opportunity to testify on this bill.
8 I will be happy to answer any questions.

9 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you,
10 Commissioner. Thank you so much for
11 your testimony and for your continued
12 commitment to the safety and education
13 around smoking and awareness of the City
14 of Philadelphia. Thank you so much.

15 I want to recognize Councilman
16 Henon.

17 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,
18 Madam Chair.

19 Commissioner, I want to thank
20 you for continuing with this effort to
21 make sure that Philadelphians are
22 recreating safe and living in a safe
23 city, especially when it comes to
24 minors, furthering the requirements of
25 posting in establishments in our City

1 and explaining the various levels of
2 tobacco use when it comes to citizens
3 and visitors of our City.

4 And it's not just cigarettes.
5 It's vaping. It's e-cigarettes. It's
6 Juuling, and hookah as you described.
7 It is targeted from a marketing
8 perspective industry that has a ripple
9 effect negatively on people, so thank
10 you for that.

11 And I urge the Committee to
12 consider this and pass it through with
13 no issues because it certainly goes in
14 line with what our Chairperson has been
15 doing of our Health Committee and other
16 members of Council and the mission of
17 our Health Department.

18 So, Dr. Farley, I want to thank
19 you for that and thank you for your
20 persistence. And I would be remiss not
21 to take the opportunity to say thank you
22 for leading us through this COVID crisis
23 that we've had in our City.

24 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Yes.

25 COUNCILMAN HENON: You've done

1 an incredible job, and I want to say
2 thank you for myself and the residents
3 of the 6th District.

4 DR. FARLEY: Thank you,
5 Councilmember.

6 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.
7 Are there any additional requests or any
8 additional comments from members of
9 Council?

10 (No response.)

11 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Okay.
12 Seeing none, Madam Clerk, are there any
13 other witnesses to testify?

14 THE CLERK: There are no
15 further witnesses today.

16 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Okay. All
17 right. And there being no further
18 comments from members of the Committee
19 and no other witnesses to testify, I'll
20 ask if there is anyone else present in
21 this hearing whose name we have failed
22 to call that wishes to offer testimony
23 on this bill being considered today?

24 (No response.)

25 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Hearing

1 none, I want to thank the panel,
2 Commissioner Farley for being the
3 witness and for your participation
4 today. We thank you and we value your
5 opinions.

6 And I now invite all panels and
7 witnesses, any panels and witnesses, to
8 please disconnect from the meeting
9 before we go into our public meeting.

10 We will now pause the proceedings
11 briefly as our participants leave the
12 hearing.

13 (Brief recess.)

14 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: And this
15 concludes the public hearing of the
16 Committee and we will go into the public
17 meeting to consider the action to be
18 taken on this bill before this Committee
19 today.

20 Madam Clerk, can we please call
21 the roll again to take attendance.
22 Members that are in attendance will
23 please indicate that you are present
24 when your name is called and also say a
25 few words briefly so that your image

1 will be displayed on screen when you
2 speak.

3 Madam Clerk.

4 THE CLERK: Councilmember
5 Henon.

6 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,
7 Madam Chair. I'm present.

8 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.

9 THE CLERK: Councilmember Oh.

10 COUNCILMAN OH: Good morning.
11 I'm present.

11 Bill No. 200115. A copy of the
12 amendment has been circulated to all
13 members of the Committee. I move that
14 the amendment to Bill No. 200115 be
15 approved.

16 COUNCILMAN OH: Second.

17 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.
18 It's been seconded by Councilman David
19 Oh. I just want to note for the record
20 that it has been moved and properly
21 seconded the amendment to Bill No.
22 200115 be approved.

23 All of those in favor of the
24 motion will signify by saying aye.

25 (Aye.)

1 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Any

2 opposed?

3 (No response.)

4 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: No. Okay.

5 The ayes have it. The motion carries.

6 And the amendment to Bill No. 200115 has

7 been approved. And we will now report

8 this bill as amended 200115.

9 I want to recognize Councilman

10 Henon for a motion on Bill No. 200115 as

11 amended.

12 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,

13 Madam Chair.

14 I move that Bill No. 200115 as

15 amended be reported from this Committee

16 with a favorable recommendation and

17 further move that the rules of Council

18 be suspended to permit the first reading

19 of this bill at our next session of

20 Council.

21 COUNCILMAN OH: Second.

22 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Okay. And

23 for the record, I want to note that

24 Councilman David Oh seconded the motion.

25 And it's been moved and properly

1 seconded that Bill No. 200115 as amended
2 be reported from this Committee with a
3 favorable recommendation and further
4 move that the rules of Council be
5 suspended to permit first reading of
6 this bill at the next session of
7 Council.

8 All of those in favor of this
9 motion will signify by saying aye.

10 (Aye.)

11 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Does anyone
12 oppose?

13 (No response.)

14 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: No. Okay.
15 The ayes have it and the motion carries.

16 And this concludes the business
17 before this Committee on Public Health
18 and Human Services. I want to thank
19 everyone for their attendance today and
20 thank you to the bill sponsor. Thank
21 you, Councilman Henon.
