2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: I note that  
3 the hour has come and that a quorum of this Council  
4 is present. The Council will come to order.  
5 Members will take their seats. Visitors will retire  
6 to seats outside the rails.

7 To give our invocation this morning, the  
8 Chair welcomes Reverend Stephen Avenger who is the  
9 pastor of the Greater St. Matthews Baptist church.  
10 He is here as a guest of Councilwoman Clark.  
11 Members and guests will please rise.

12 REVEREND AVENGER: Dearly wise God and  
13 creator of all mankind, we bless you and we honor  
14 you for this occasion. We pray, oh, God, over this  
15 body who have assembled to make decisions concerning  
16 the citizenry of this city. We pray, God, that you  
17 will allow wisdom and courage to reign. Bless each

24 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: Madam President,  
25 there have been no requests of leaves of absence on

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The Chair  
4 thanks the Councilwoman.

5 The Chair recognizes Councilman Rizzo.

6 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: Madam President, I  
7 understand that Councilman Longstreth has asked for  
8 leave of absence, but not through me, so I assume  
9 he's not going to be here.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: It is my  
11 understanding that a leave of absence is being  
12 requested for Councilman Longstreth.

13 - - -

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The Chair will  
15 dispense with the regular order of business to  
16 recognize the guests and visitors joining us in  
17 Chambers this morning. On behalf of all Members of  
18 City Council, I welcome you to our Council Session  
19 this morning. We appreciate your taking the time to  
20 join us as we attend to the legislative affairs of  
21 the City. We invite you to come again.

22 This morning Council is honoring Ms.  
23 Sharon Pinkenson. I invite Councilman Kenney to  
24 come and make this presentation. Will Ms. Pinkenson  
25 and those accompanying her please come forward and

2 join Councilman Kenney at the podium.

3 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you, Madam  
4 President. Good morning, everyone. This is a  
5 resolution honoring Sharon Pinkenson. The Council  
6 of the City of Philadelphia is pleased and proud to  
7 honor Sharon Pinkenson, Executive Director of the  
8 Greater Philadelphia Film Office; and,;

9 Whereas, Sharon Pinkenson is a life-long  
10 resident of Philadelphia and a graduate of the  
11 Philadelphia High School for Girls and Temple  
12 University;

13 Whereas, Sharon Pinkenson was appointed  
14 by Mayor Rendell in 1992 when he first took office o  
15 the position of director of the Philadelphia Film  
16 Office; and.

17 Whereas, under her direction, the office  
18 grew and began to encompass a regional approach and  
19 changes named to the Greater Philadelphia Film  
20 Office which now includes the counties of Bucks,  
21 Chester, Delaware, and Montgomery;

22 Whereas, Sharon Pinkenson became the  
23 executive director of the Greater Philadelphia Film  
24 Office, a position she holds to this day; and,

25 Whereas, through her efforts more than

2 12 major films or parts of films were shot here in  
3 Philadelphia, including the Age of Innocence,  
4 Philadelphia, Two Bits, Twelve Monkeys, Up Close and  
5 Personal, Wide Awake, Maximum Risk, Fallen, Beloved,  
6 and recently-released top grossing number one film,  
7 The Sixth Sense; and,

8               Whereas, through the opening of such  
9 films as Philadelphia, Beloved, Wide Awake, and The  
10 Sixth Sense, more than \$250,000 is raised for local  
11 charities; and,

12              Whereas, through her efforts,  
13 Philadelphia hosted the only worldwide premiere of  
14 the movie The Sixth Sense, which generated much  
15 national and worldwide exposure for Philadelphia as  
16 an film center; and,

17              Whereas, the economic impact of the  
18 Philadelphia region by the efforts of Sharon  
19 Pinkenson in the Greater Philadelphia Film Office  
20 has increased from \$21 million in 1992 to over \$180  
21 million in 1999; and,

22              Whereas, through her efforts the movie  
23 companies have recruited 40 percent of their  
24 production crews from Philadelphia in 1997 and over  
25 60 percent of their crews in 1998; and,

2 Whereas, through Sharon Pinkenson's  
3 efforts, the old Philadelphia Civic Center was  
4 converted into a television and movie sound stage  
5 facility, the largest one of its kind in the east  
6 attracting movie and television projects to  
7 Philadelphia that would never have considered the  
8 city before;

9 Whereas, Sharon Pinkenson, in addition  
10 of her duties as director of the Greater  
11 Philadelphia Film Office serves on the boards of  
12 Temple University School of Communications and  
13 Theater, Drexel University's Nesbit College of  
14 Design, the Art Institute of Philadelphia, the  
15 American Music Theater Festival, Philadelphia 2000,  
16 Friends of Rittenhouse Square, and the Mayor's  
17 Hospitality Cabinet;

18 Therefore, with great honor and  
19 pleasure, Council of the City of Philadelphia and  
20 all its Members extend sincere congratulatory wishes  
21 and deep appreciation to Sharon Pinkenson, Execute  
22 Director of the Greater Philadelphia Film Office,  
23 for her outstanding accomplishments and the  
24 commitment to the City of Philadelphia.

25 And I just want to say that when you sit

2 in movie theater and watch something that was filmed  
3 in Philadelphia, especially a movie like the Sixth  
4 Sense, and you're able to sit there and pick out --  
5 I could pick out on Ridge Avenue over on the bus  
6 ride that the young man was taking to that funeral.  
7 I could see my school, St. Joseph's Prep, which I  
8 graduated from. And to be able to see neighborhoods  
9 in Philadelphia and institutions and buildings of  
10 Philadelphia is very exciting. And I would urge  
11 Mayor Street to consider keeping this office intact  
12 and giving it more support because I think it really  
13 does make Philadelphia world-renown, and I thank her  
14 for her efforts. Thank you.

15 (Applause.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The Chair  
17 recognizes Ms. Pinkenson for remarks.

18 MS. PINKENSON: Thank you, Council  
19 President Verna and Councilman Kenney and to all of  
20 my dear friends in City Council. I am just thrilled  
21 to be here to represent the good work of the Greater  
22 Philadelphia Film Office, and I did not take this  
23 honor by myself. With me today are some wonderful  
24 members of my staff, and I want you to know that it  
25 is not possible, would not be possible to do all our

2 work without this staff which I think you should  
3 note that given the economic impact, we have very  
4 few people. You might note that also in the eight  
5 years that we have been operating this office, we've  
6 spent less than three million dollars for what we  
7 will have achieved approximately \$210 million  
8 economic impact.

9 (Applause.)

10 MS. PINKENSON: My only regret is that  
11 we are not a for-profit business.

12 (Laughter.)

13 MS. PINKENSON: So I thank you. I also  
14 thank Councilman Kenney for his recommendation that  
15 Mayor-elect Street continue to support the Film  
16 Office because, clearly, we are a group that has a  
17 mission. We have a lot of new work to do. We have  
18 a wonderful future here in this industry in  
19 Philadelphia. It's going to grow enormously. And I  
20 thank all of my friends in City Council without  
21 whose support, we would never have been able to  
22 achieve some of these very complicated filming  
23 challenges in each of your districts. So I thank  
24 you. I look forward to many more years of working  
25 with you. Thanks.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Council will  
4 be at ease.

5 (Council at ease.)

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Our second  
7 presentation this morning honors Mr. Acel Moore. I  
8 invite Councilman Nutter to come and make this  
9 presentation. Will Mr. Moore and those accompanying  
10 him please come forward.

11 (Applause.)

12 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Commending Mr. Acel  
13 Moore for his many achievements during his  
14 journalism career and congratulating him as this  
15 year's John S. Knight Gold Medal recipient.

16 Whereas, in the career spanning 37 years  
17 at the Philadelphia Inquirer, Acel Moore has risen  
18 through the ranks from copy boy to reporter to  
19 associate editor; and,

20 Whereas, in 1977 Acel Moore became one  
21 of the first African-Americans to win the Pulitzer  
22 Prize; and,

23 Whereas, throughout his career, Mr.  
24 Moore has promoted diversity in newsrooms throughout  
25 the industry and has been an active mentor

2 introducing young people to careers in journalism;  
3 and,

4 Whereas, in 1975 he was the founder of  
5 the National Association of Black Journalists; and,

6 Whereas, Mr. Moore was the first  
7 director of the Knight-Ritter scholarship award, he  
8 developed one of the first high school journalism  
9 workshops in the country, and he started the first  
10 internship in the industry for minority copy editors  
11 introducing young people to the production side of  
12 the business; and,

13 Whereas, the Annual James K. Batton  
14 Excellence Award competition is designed to  
15 recognize and celebrate the successes of the  
16 Knight-Ritter people; and,

17 Whereas, this year's top prize, John S.  
18 Knight gold medal will be awarded to Mr. Acel Moore;  
19 and,

20 Whereas, when Mr. Tony Ritter, Chairman  
21 and CEO of Knight-Ritter, recently announced the  
22 awards recipients, he stated that Acel Moore, quote,  
23 is passionate, accomplished, insightful and  
24 energetic. He makes a different. His impact  
25 readers and on the industry has been profound.

2 Now, therefore, resolved by the Council  
3 of the City of Philadelphia that we hereby commend  
4 Mr. Moore for his many accomplishments during his  
5 journalism career and that we extend our  
6 congratulations to him as this year's John S. Knight  
7 gold medal recipient.

8 Resolved further that an engrossed copy  
9 of this resolution be presented to Mr. Moore as a  
10 symbol of this legislative body's gratitude for his  
11 many accomplishments and contributions to the  
12 journalism industry.

13 Signed by Council President Verna,  
14 introduced by Councilman Nutter, and cosponsored by  
15 all Members of City Council.

16 (Applause.)

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair  
18 recognizes Mr. Moore for remarks.

19 MR. MOORE: Madam President, thank you.  
20 Councilman Nutter, thank you. I am profoundly  
21 honored by this recognition, and I would like to say  
22 to the Members of City Council that behind me are  
23 some of the most important decision-makers at this  
24 newspaper. You now have an opportunity to get them  
25 all together in one room. But I mention that

2 because these individuals have supported me and have  
3 been with me, some of them, a couple of them, from  
4 the beginning who are behind me this evening -- this  
5 afternoon -- this morning. I covered it all.  
6 Today.

7 (Laughter.)

8 MR. MOORE: I'm a little nervous. I  
9 shouldn't be, but I am. As a native Philadelphian,  
10 I'd like to give thanks to a lot of people who have  
11 inspired me in my work over the years. Many of the  
12 people, a few of them are right in this room sitting  
13 and are Councilmembers. I go back -- I was only 10  
14 years old, but I did start 37 years ago. Charles  
15 Boswer who join me, I remember him when I was a  
16 young reporter. And he was an inspiration to me  
17 because of his position at City Hall and being a  
18 Deputy Mayor and I've asked him to join those who  
19 are behind me today.

20 Being a native Philadelphian, my  
21 parents, my mother who passed in 1980 obviously is  
22 not here, but my father, he's here with me in  
23 spirit. He's 87 and is still independently living;  
24 it was difficult for him to come here this morning.  
25 I give thanks to him as well, and both of them for

2 the inspiration they've given me.

3 You know, I tell a story all the time  
4 when I go around the country, and I've worked with  
5 young people particularly in dozens of cities around  
6 this country, and I tell the story about  
7 Philadelphia. And Madam President, you know I'm  
8 from South Philadelphia, and I tell people that  
9 there are only two kinds of people in the world,  
10 those who are from South Philadelphia and those who  
11 wish they were. I'm only kidding.

12 (Laughter.)

13 MR. MOORE: But thank you. I have  
14 nothing more to say. I'm deeply honored, profoundly  
15 honored, and I want to give thanks to all of my  
16 colleagues at the Inquirer who are here with me  
17 today and whose support that I shall always cherish.  
18 Thank you all.

19 (Applause.)

20 MR. MOORE: And so I can go home without  
21 any -- and I did this when I received the gold  
22 medal, but the one person who daily inspires me and  
23 presents love every day is my wife Linda who in her  
24 own right is a fine outstanding journalist, and I  
25 always thank her for her support.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Council will

5 (Council at ease.)

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Councilwoman  
7 Clark, will you please approach the podium?

8 (Councilwoman Clark approaches podium.)

9 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: Attention. I'm  
10 boss today.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: This morning  
12 it's my pleasure to congratulate someone who is very  
13 young, but nonetheless has been a member of this  
14 Councilmanic Body for a very long time. Would  
15 Councilman Cohen please come forward, and I see that  
16 Mrs. Cohen is in the audience, would she come  
17 forward also.

18 I am absolutely delighted today to  
19 present a citation congratulating Councilman David  
20 Cohen on his 85th birthday.

21 (Applause.)

22 Whereas, Councilman David Cohen has  
23 served with distinction in City Council since 1980  
24 as Councilman-at-Large and from 1968 to 1971 as  
25 District 8 Councilman. After which he resigned to

3 Whereas, Councilman Cohen is called the  
4 conscience of the City for his compassionate  
5 advocacy for social and economic justice; and,

6 Whereas, Councilman Cohen and his lovely

8 Representative Mark Cohen, Assistant District  
9 Attorney Dennis P. Cohen, Sherry J. Cohen, an  
10 attorney; and Judy Cohen Hyman, a writer; and 4  
11 beautiful grandchildren; and

12 Whereas, Councilman Cohen's willingness  
13 to stand up and speak out for those in need despite  
14 the odds and his tireless energy have brought him in  
15 second for the Council-at-Large in the general  
16 election.

17 Therefore, the Council of the City of  
18 Philadelphia extends our warmest congratulations to  
19 Councilman David Cohen on his 85th birthday and

7 supplemental ordinance to the general gas work  
8 revenue bond ordinance 1998, 1998 general ordinance  
9 authorizing the director of finance on behalf of the  
10 City to enter into a qualified swap agreement as  
11 defined in the 1998 general ordinance with respect  
12 to the City's gas works revenue bonds.

13 An ordinance amending the ordinance  
14 approved November 8, 1967, Bill No. 2809 entitled an  
15 ordinance to authorize the director of finance to  
16 establish a revolving fund in the police department  
17 and authorizing transfer in appropriations therefore  
18 by expanding the purposes for which such revolving  
19 fund may be used authorizing the director of finance  
20 to increase the size of such revolving fund and  
21 authorizing transfers and appropriations for fiscal  
22 year 2000 within the general fund.

23 And an ordinance authorizing real estate  
24 transactions necessary to permit the City of  
25 Philadelphia to acquire property needed for the use

## 1 COMMUNICATIONS

2 by the Philadelphia International Airport, in  
3 particular authorizing the Director of Commerce and  
4 the Commissioner of Public Property to acquire by  
5 amicable negotiation or by condemnation fee simple  
6 title to certain parcels of property owned by the  
7 Redevelopment Authority of the City of Philadelphia  
8 New Eastwick Corporation.

9 And an ordinance authorizing the Health  
10 Commission on behalf of the City of Philadelphia to  
11 enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth of  
12 Pennsylvania acting through the Department of Public  
13 Welfare for the City to manage the Health Choices  
14 Behavioral health program under which behavioral  
15 health services will be provided to Philadelphia  
16 residents who are eligible for medical assistance,  
17 all under certain terms and conditions.
