12 herewith as disapproved.

13 And I respectfully request and
14 submit for the consideration of your
15 honorable body a resolution appointing
16 Angela Val to the Board of Directors of
17 the Center City District, all under
18 certain terms and conditions.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
20 Thank you very much, Mr. Decker.

21 That concludes our messages
22 from the Mayor and any other
23 communications, and our next order of
24 business is the introduction of bills and
25 resolutions.

8 current remote environment, this

10 opportunity for public comment. And I
11 want to thank you all in advance so much
12 for your cooperation.

22 appropriate revenues from such payments

24 Development - Division of Housing and
25 Community Development, in order to

10 goals, including monitoring and
11 enforcement."

17 Philadelphia Code, entitled "Travel and
18 Hospitality Worker Recall and Retention,"
19 to require that certain laid-off
20 employees in certain hospitality and
21 travel-related industries are offered job
22 positions as they become available."

4 Councilwoman Gym, did you want
5 to be recognized?

6 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Yes. Thank
7 you very much, Council President. I
8 appreciate it. First of all, I want to
9 just acknowledge how important this work
10 is. Councilmember Johnson, Councilmember
11 Thomas, and a broad majority of City
12 Council have come together to introduce
13 an economic justice package for
14 Philadelphia's hospitality, tourism, and
15 airport workers.

16 This is a city where one in two
17 Philadelphians have lost a job or seen a
18 decline in income, and we know that
19 economic recovery and the health of our
20 City relies on black, brown, and
21 immigrant workers in our communities and
22 neighborhoods returning to work as soon
23 as businesses open. Black workers
24 matter.

25 This is a Council that knows

2 how much that means. We've put teeth to
3 it. We've established a formal
4 Department of Labor. We've expanded paid
5 sick leave. We've constantly supported
6 the right for collective bargaining.
7 We've passed national models to expand
8 and protect labor rights. This is a
9 Council that not only recognizes that
10 black workers matter, it proves it every
11 day.

12 So today we will be standing
13 alongside Philadelphia workers, who are
14 the economic engines of our city. There
15 are no hotels, there are no stadiums, and
16 there's not a Philadelphia International
17 Airport without the hard work of these
18 folks.

19 When Coronavirus hit, they were
20 also among the millions of Pennsylvanians
21 who were the first to find themselves
22 without work, applying for unemployment,
23 and relying on our nation's forsooth and
24 safety net often for the very first time.

25 I want to say that this bill is

2 going to go through a robust public
3 process, as it always does. There will
4 be everybody at the table. We'll be
5 forming out conversations with industry
6 as well as Councilmembers and our labor
7 leaders and advocates as well. So we
8 expect to do that. Look forward to
9 seeing this process through, though.

10 So thank you, Council
11 President.

14 Philadelphia, the Committee on Public
15 Health and Human Services, to which was
16 referred Bill No. 200392, entitled "An
17 ordinance amending Section 10-403 of The
18 Philadelphia Code, entitled 'Prohibited
19 Conduct,' by prohibiting the use of
20 consumer fireworks and providing certain
21 penalties," respectfully reports it has
22 considered and amended the same and
23 returns the attached bill to Council with
24 a favorable recommendation.

2 That concludes our reports from

5 I note that the bill just
6 reported from committee with suspension
7 of the rules has been deemed to have had
8 a first reading and this bill will be
9 placed on our Second Reading and Final
10 Passage Calendar at our next session of
11 Council.

12 As there are no additional
13 bills on the First Reading Calendar, the
14 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Parker for
15 the purpose of calling up resolutions and
16 bills on the Second Reading and Final
17 Passage Calendar.

18 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
19 you, Mr. President. The following
20 resolutions and bills are being called up
21 from the Second Reading and Final Passage
22 Calendars today. They are Nos. 200531,
23 200547, 200548, 200549, 200349, 200374,
24 and 200424. All other bills and
25 resolutions are being held.

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3 Thank you very much, Councilwoman.

4 Before we proceed with the
5 consideration of those bills, we will --
6 before we proceed with the consideration
7 of the bills, we will have our public
8 comment session. We're going to take a
9 ten-minute recess to give our technology
10 professionals some time to connect the
11 speakers that we have for today's
12 meeting.

13 COUNCILMAN OH: Council
14 President, during this time I'd just like
15 to be recorded as being present. I was
16 attending to other Council business.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
18 Councilman, we knew you were here doing
19 something good somewhere, so we actually
20 already penciled you in as being here.

21 COUNCILMAN OH: One or the
22 other, Council President.

23 Thank you.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

25 Thank you, Councilman.

2 (Pause.)

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

4 Thank you. Now that everyone is
5 connected to the meeting and before
6 considering the resolutions and bills we
7 have before us today, we will consider
8 public comment, and it will go as
9 follows:

10 The public comment must concern
11 matters of the Second Reading and Final
12 Passage Calendars for possible action at
13 a session of Council. A speaker on any
14 of these matters must sign up in order to
15 testify. You must call 215-686-3406 by
16 5:00 p.m. the day before the session to
17 sign up for public comment.

18 When you call, we will take
19 your name, phone number, the number of
20 the legislative item you are commenting
21 on, and whether you are in support or
22 against the legislation and add your name
23 to the list. We will then telephone each
24 person on the list during the Council
25 session and invite them to our remote

3 Today we will have a timeframe
4 of three minutes for your testimony.
5 Please, for the record, in the event that
6 we have a significant amount of
7 individuals testifying on legislation, we
8 reserve the right to limit testimony to
9 same subject matter, but I think we're
10 going to be okay today in terms of the
11 number of people testifying, so we'll get
12 the full three minutes.

13 I must tell you, once your
14 allotted time has passed, you will be
15 asked to conclude your remarks, and
16 shortly thereafter, you will be muted and
17 disconnected from the remote meeting.

18 So please be aware that the
19 public meeting is being recorded.
20 Because the public meeting is public,
21 participants and viewers have no
22 reasonable expectation of privacy. So by
23 continuing to be in the meeting, you are
24 consenting to being recorded.

25 I will now ask the Chief Clerk

4 CHIEF CLERK: Jeannine
5 Lisitski, commenting on 200548.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Are
7 you connected? Ms. Lisitski?

8 MS. LISITSKI: Yes. Good
9 morning. This is Jeannine Lisitski. I'm
10 the Executive Director and President for
11 Women Against Abuse, and I'm honored to
12 be with you here today even if it's just
13 over the phone.

14 On behalf of Women Against
15 Abuse and our sister agencies and the
16 survivors of domestic violence we serve,
17 I want to thank Councilman Green as well
18 as Councilmembers Gilmore Richardson,
19 Squilla, Jones, O'Neill, Domb, Parker,
20 Thomas, and Bass and all of City Council
21 for recognizing October as Domestic
22 Violence Awareness Month in Philadelphia.

23 When Philadelphians got the
24 call to stay at home this March, most of
25 us were fortunate enough to receive that

2 message in the way that it was intended,
3 as a necessary measure for health and
4 safety, but for victims of domestic
5 violence, a stay-at-home order meant
6 something different. It meant being
7 trapped in a home with their abusive
8 partner, isolated from friends and
9 relatives and other support networks. It
10 meant fear and it meant danger.

11 While services for people
12 experiencing domestic violence have
13 remained open throughout the pandemic,
14 fewer victims are reaching out for help.
15 Agencies like ours are doing everything
16 we can to reach victims who are trapped
17 in their home, but we fear that many in
18 our community are experiencing increased
19 violence, with little hope for reprieve.

20 We know that we will likely not
21 see the true impact of the pandemic on
22 survivors until the pandemic comes to an
23 end, and at that point, for some, it will
24 be too late.

25 This is a pretty grim picture,

2 which I don't say to scare you, but only
3 to fix us on reality and then lead us to
4 action.

5 Domestic Violence Awareness
6 Month is a time for reflection. What are
7 you doing to support people experiencing
8 violence in our community during the
9 pandemic?

10 In 2020, the same old
11 strategies will fall short, but in this
12 City of Brotherly Love, there are a
13 number of new opportunities to reach
14 members who may be suffering, thanks to
15 you in part. A few distribution sites
16 may be the only time a survivor is able
17 to leave their home this week. Does your
18 team have resources there?

19 A virtual learning access
20 center might be the only chance a Philly
21 student witnessing violence in their home
22 has to talk to an adult. Are you ready
23 for that conversation?

24 I just want to remind you that
25 survivors need you, City Council, as

3 when you're designing policies,
4 advocating in your community, and writing

11 proclaiming October as Domestic Violence
12 Awareness Month in Philadelphia, and I
13 urge you to make it count this year more
14 than ever.

20 Partnerships. They are an organization
21 that have partnered with the Philadelphia
22 Autism Project to create the Community
23 Autism Peer Specialist Program. This is
24 a very unique program, something that
25 once again puts Philadelphia on the map,

3 adults who are on the autism spectrum to
4 earn a living and get a job and mentor

10 spectrum.

11 So I want to thank Mental
12 Health Partnerships for bringing this to
13 my attention and making sure that we
14 recognize Global Peer Supports
15 Celebration Day for today, October 17th.

16 Although that is a great
17 celebration, it's always good when we can
18 honor and lift up and celebrate
19 achievements for people doing great
20 things in our city, but it's also an
21 opportunity when we do celebrations we
22 also celebrate the lives of outstanding
23 individuals that have done great work in
24 our city.

25 And so 2020 has been a very

2 challenging year in so many ways, both
3 from a health crisis and economic issues,
4 and so Monday evening I received a call
5 late Monday night regarding someone who
6 has been an outstanding advocate for
7 black businesses in the City of

9 back in the early '90s as we were part of
10 a couple different organizations, and we
11 used to have the Philadelphia Black
12 Professionals holiday party, and a number
13 of different organizations like the Urban
14 League Young Professionals, Urban Bankers
15 Association, a number of groups came
16 together to do that holiday party on a
17 regular basis. And as that event started
18 to wane, Earl took the mantle and
19 continued to promote that.

20 And in addition, when my wife
21 and I had our retail store, I remember
22 Earl coming to our grand opening and
23 always coming at least once a week with
24 his newspaper. And you cannot count of
25 any event, any type of activity to

2 support entrepreneurship, especially in
3 the African American community, that Earl
4 Harvey was not there to celebrate and
5 promote that work in our community.

6 Every Friday at 4:00 p.m., he
7 hosted a call to really help black
8 contractors and to help those who are

10 businesses in our city.

11 So 2020 has been a year like no
12 other, and we lost another outstanding
13 individual. He graduated from Central
14 High School, Class 231, but he is someone
15 that will be deeply missed. I will miss
16 his jovial and his energy and his
17 enthusiasm. Any time you saw him or
18 talked to him, either on the phone or in
19 person, even on a Zoom call, he was
20 always in great spirits, always
21 promoting, and really kind of the pied
22 piper of black business in the City of
23 Philadelphia.

18 and to losing their jobs, but it's
19 something that we need to hear, because
20 it helps dictate how we legislate and
21 what we need to do in this tough time to
22 ensure that we're doing our best and
23 putting our best foot forward to try to
24 improve the quality of life for all
25 citizens of Philadelphia, but

2 specifically for those that are in need
3 the most.

4 I also want to just take a
5 moment to recognize Central Softball Team
6 for being our champion of the week. I'm
7 going to try to stay consistent with
8 that. This positivity is really
9 important. We want young people and
10 those who mentor our young people to
11 recognize that we appreciate you and the
12 work is needed.

13 Just for a minute to go back to
14 the Disadvantaged Communities Task Force,
15 today we're going to be launching the
16 resource hubs, and the resource hubs are
17 a direct initiative under the
18 Disadvantaged Communities Task Force,
19 because there's been this consistent
20 narrative of our teenagers not having
21 anything to do.

22 I know that when there's
23 something negative going on, just in my
24 short time in the body, it's easy for us
25 to spread that information. Here we have

2 something positive where we're trying to
3 look to address the issue of gun
4 violence. We have everything for young
5 people, from mentor services to academic
6 supports, to physical activity, to even
7 them being able to find a job, and
8 unfortunately we're not seeing the
9 traction that we hoped, we thought we
10 would see as it relates to providing
11 opportunity and resources to young
12 people.

13 So we have been doing a good
14 job of getting the support of the people
15 who have been a part of this
16 Disadvantaged Communities Task Force
17 calls, but it would be great if we have
18 more support from people who tell us
19 these issues and these issues that exist,
20 help us be a part of the solutions as
21 well too.

22 And while we know the resource
23 hubs won't solve the gun violence issue,
24 this is just one of many steps that we
25 need to take to move in the direction of

2 rectifying what we see as a huge problem.

3 I also wanted to take a moment
4 to thank my colleagues for passing the
5 eviction resolution into law today. I do
6 want to just challenge our First Judicial
7 District and our First Judicial courts as
8 well as our state legislators, who I've
9 already been working with, to try to
10 address this issue of evictions in the
11 City of Philadelphia. This was a problem
12 before the pandemic, and it's yet another
13 issue that has gotten worse.

14 Last, but not least, I would
15 like to thank my colleagues
16 Councilmembers Johnson and Gym for the
17 great work as it relates to the black
18 workers bill. Us as a Council body, we
19 will continue to do everything in our
20 power to let folks know that we are here
21 to fight for them.

22 Thank you, Council President.
23 Thank you, colleagues. And, again, happy
24 Thursday, everybody. Looking forward to
25 seeing you later today at the resource

2 hubs.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

4 Thank you. Thank you, Councilman.

5 Appreciate that. Keep up that awesome,
6 awesome work.

7 That appears to conclude our
8 speeches. So with that -- Councilman
9 Jones, you didn't come up on my radar.
10 The Chair recognizes Councilman Jones.

11 Councilman, you're muted.

12 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
13 Mr. President.

14 To members Thomas and Gilmore
15 Richardson, when you're ready to listen,
16 then you're ready to lead. A part of
17 this job is just people don't need you
18 always to know every answer to every
19 question, but when you listen and they
20 know they are heard, then they know they
21 are well represented. And so kudos to
22 you for having that patience to listen to
23 the public, who we're here to serve.

24 I just want to quickly say that
25 on Saturday, we are doing an event called

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2 Be Woke.Vote. It is a non-partisan event
3 at 52nd and Jefferson in the Shop Rite
4 and Lowe's plaza. We will be doing
5 drivethrough giveaways of food. We will
6 be doing swag bags. We will have local
7 artists. We will have prizes. We will
8 have surprise guests, all at the shopping
9 center just to encourage us and remind us
10 that we have 18 days left until the most
11 important election in our lifetime. No
12 matter who you're voting for, this is
13 non-partisan, but I guarantee you it is
14 the most important election.

15 When you hear some of the
16 narratives and rhetoric that are going on
17 around this election, we have a
18 responsibility to participate. If you
19 are for something, if you are advocating
20 something, if something matters to you,
21 vote about it. It's enough said, said
22 and done. We got 18 days. Let's do it.

23 I want you to also know that
24 when people start talking about whether
25 or not they are going to leave as a

2 result of the outcome of an election,
3 you'd better listen to them. And we need
4 to be vigilant and making sure and
5 supporting the election process in the
6 City of Philadelphia.

7 Commissioner Deeley,
8 Commissioner Sabir have a hell of a job.
9 Any time you are a focus of the
10 presidential debate, we need, they need,
11 all of us need to roll up our sleeves and
12 help.

13 The City of Philadelphia needs
14 volunteers to do things like work on the
15 polls. They need volunteers to make sure
16 that there are rovers to make sure
17 machine problems get reported quickly.
18 This is not a game. Literally our lives
19 hang in the balance and the quality
20 thereof.

21 So I hope you can join us
22 between 12:00 and 4:00 tomorrow out at
23 the shopping center, 53rd Street. It's
24 always a party.

25 And on a final note, Earl

2 Harvey was cooler than the other side of
3 the pillow. When he showed up at the
4 party, you knew it was a party. He was a
5 man about town, social debonair,
6 reporter, held a whole bunch of titles,
7 and all of them had the prefects of cool.

8 Thank you, Mr. President.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

10 Thank you, Councilman. Cooler than the
11 other side of the pillow. That's
12 awesome.

13 The Chair recognizes Councilman
14 Johnson.

15 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
16 Council President. Just in wrapping up,
17 I just wanted to acknowledge the work
18 that Isaiah Thomas is doing around these
19 resource hubs. As we address this issue
20 of gun violence here in the City of
21 Philadelphia, I learned as a young man
22 from my grandmother that idle time is the
23 devil's workshop. And so I commend him
24 for creating an outlet for our young
25 people to get involved in something

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2 that's positive, and hopefully in the
3 future, it can be a program that can be
4 taken to scale.

5 I remember working under
6 Senator Anthony Hardy Williams and it was
7 John Street who was the Mayor. We had a
8 significant number of homicides and
9 shootings taking place in the City of
10 Philadelphia. They came out to my
11 community, said what do y'all want to
12 see? They said, meet me here at 6
13 o'clock in the morning on Saturday, and
14 everybody showed up in the neighborhood,
15 and the idea was to create a curfew
16 center. And it was a very effective and
17 efficient curfew center based upon
18 politics that was dismantled, but
19 nevertheless, it was very effective and
20 efficient. And, most importantly,
21 communities stepped up and volunteered to
22 make sure the curfew center moved
23 forward.

24 And so his resource hub for me
25 is in the same spirit. I know we need to

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2 think outside the box as we tackle this
3 issue. And that resource hub that he did
4 on his own terms of creating
5 public-private partnerships is something
6 I believe should be duplicated all across
7 the City of Philadelphia, with support
8 from the Chamber of Commerce, with
9 support from our local colleges, with
10 support from our local healthcare
11 institutions.

12 And so I want to personally
13 endorse his project. I'm going to work
14 with his team and get one in South
15 Philadelphia, but I think it's something
16 that should be taken to scale. Hopefully
17 it should be in everybody's district,
18 especially if you're dealing with issues
19 of crime and violence.

20 And so, young man, you keep up
21 the good work. It is refreshing and it's
22 inspiring, because we have to make sure
23 that we're doing everything possible to
24 keep our young people involved in things
25 that are positive, and when they're not,

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2 we can't let COVID-19 be an excuse. If
3 they're not involved in something that's
4 positive, they will do like I did when I
5 was a young man, Imma get involved in
6 whatever I can get involved to enjoy
7 myself, rather that be good or bad. So
8 that's indicative of the environment that
9 we're in.

10 So, young man, you keep up the
11 good work, Isaiah Thomas, and I fully
12 endorse your resource hubs, and hopefully
13 it can go to scale across the City of
14 Philadelphia.

15 Thank you very much, Council
16 President, for the time.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 Thank you, Councilman Johnson.

19 I believe Councilman Thomas
20 wanted to be recognized one more time.

21 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Yes. Thank
22 you, colleagues, and I'm sorry for this,
23 but real quick, I'm being told I did not
24 give the information for the resource
25 hub. So if people want to sign up for

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2 the resource hubs, they can just e-mail
3 us at resource.hubbs, two B's and an S,
4 @phila.gov, resource.hubbs@phila.gov.

5 Thank you, Council President.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

7 Thank you, Councilman. Keep up that
8 awesome work.

9 The Chair now recognizes
10 Councilman Jones for a motion to adjourn.

11 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
12 Mr. President. I move that Council stand
13 adjourned until Thursday, October 22nd,
14 2020 at 10:00 a.m.

15 (Duly seconded.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17 Thank you. It has been moved and
18 seconded that Council stand adjourned
19 until Thursday, October 22nd, 2020 at
20 10:00 a.m.

21 All those in favor indicate by
22 saying aye.
