14 join us as we attend to the legislative affairs of
15 our City. We invite you to come again.

16 The Chair recognizes Councilwoman Clark
17 for the purpose of introducing a special visitor to
18 our City and Council today.

19 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: Thank you, Madam
20 President. It is with great pleasure that I ask my
21 colleagues to join me in welcoming Mr. Boubacar
22 Messaoud, an anti-slavery activist for Mauritania,
23 Africa. He's accompanied by Ms. Deborah Sanders of
24 the Corporation of American Friends Service. At
25 this time I ask both Mr. Messaoud and Ms. Sanders to

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: We extend an
5 especially warm welcome to you. Thank you so much
6 for joining us.

7 This morning Council is recognizing Mr.
8 Tom Baker. I invite Councilman Kenney and to come
9 and make this presentation.

10 Will Mr. Baker and those accompanying
11 him please approach the podium?

12 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Madam President, due
13 to the fact that sheet metal workers union hall is
14 Local 19 is located at 1301 South Christopher
15 Columbus Boulevard, we've asked Councilmember
16 DiCicco to also accompany us at the dais.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Mr. Kenney.

18 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you, Madam
19 President. This is a resolution recognizing and
20 commending Tom Baker on capturing first place honors
21 in the Sheet Metal Workers National Apprentice
22 Contest.

23 Whereas, Tom Baker is a second year
24 apprentice from Local 19 of the Sheet Metal Workers
25 Union located at 1301 South Christopher Columbus

2 Boulevard.

3 And, whereas, Tom, is one of the
4 approximately 12,000 apprentices and sheet metal
5 locals throughout the United States and Canada who
6 are provided with an opportunity to represent their
7 local unions in this national contest.

8 And, whereas, Tom earned the right to
9 represent Local 19 in one of the regional contests
10 after winning a local competition.

11 Whereas, 12 regions comprised the
12 International Training Institute for sheet metal and
13 air-conditioning industry and Tom won the regional
14 title and qualified for the national competition in
15 Seattle, Washington.

16 COUNCILMAN DI CICC0: Whereas, all 12
17 contestants took part in a written examination, a
18 drafting project, and a sheet metal fabrication
19 project. After all the scores were tallied, Tom
20 emerged as the highest scorer and was declared
21 national champion.

22 And, whereas, in the 28-year history of
23 the National Apprentice Contest which will be held
24 in Philadelphia in the year 2,000, this was the
25 first time that a member of Local 19 had placed

2 first.

3 Whereas, Tom's accomplish not only
4 brings honor to himself, but also to Local 19 and
5 the instructors of Local 19's training center who
6 played major roles in aiding Tom in developing his
7 award-winning project.

8 Therefore, be it

9 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Be it resolved by
10 the Council of the City of Philadelphia that we
11 recognize and commend Tom Baker on capturing first
12 place honors in the sheet metal workers national
13 apprentice contest.

14 And resolve that an engrossed copy of
15 the resolution be presented to Tom as evidence of
16 the sincere sentiments and recognition of this
17 legislative body.

18 We'd all like to say congratulations on
19 his fine honor.

20 (Applause.)

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
22 recognizes Mr. Baker for remarks.

23 MR. BAKER: I'd like to thank every
24 member of Local 19. It's through their commitment
25 and hard work that this education was made possible.

2 I've learned a lot in these few years and look
3 forward to learning much more. And I'd like to
4 thank everyone who has supported me in this quest.
5 Thank you.

6 (Applause.)

7 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Madam President,
8 with your permission, I'd like to introduce Mr. Tom
9 Kelly who is the president and business manager for
10 Local 19 in Philadelphia.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERA: The Chair
12 recognizes Mr. Kelly.

13 MR. KELLY: Thank you, Councilman, and
14 Council President Verna and Councilman DiCicco for
15 your reading of our resolution this morning and to
16 all the Council Members that allowed us to come
17 before you.

18 As we stated earlier, this contest has
19 been held regionally for many years, but the
20 national contest began 29 years ago. We have three
21 divisions in Local 19, one in Central Pennsylvania,
22 one in Philadelphia, and one in Delaware. In order
23 to compete in the contest, you first must win the
24 contest in Philadelphia. And then it goes on to a
25 regional order which comprised of all local unions

2 from North Jersey through to Virginia. And Tom won
3 that and then went on to Seattle, Washington, to
4 place number 1.

5 I just want to say because of the
6 historic value of the City of Philadelphia and
7 millennium coming next year, this contest was always
8 held in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Two years ago it
9 moved around the country, and we will be honored
10 here in Philadelphia by having the contest next
11 year.

12 A special note to Tom. Our trade is not
13 only based on somebody getting a piece of metal and
14 fabricated it and making something of it, the whole
15 theory of our trade is based on trigonometry, and he
16 placed number 1 in all the contests that were put
17 before him and faced all of his challenges. I just
18 think it's really important that he's recognized for
19 what he's done.

20 Tom was a former non-union sheet metal
21 worker who was disenchanted with his employer, came
22 to Local 19, applied for the apprenticeship program,
23 and the rest is history. And he has competed very
24 well. The fact of the matter is, though, at a union
25 meeting when he has a minute to study, he studies.

1 COMMUNICATIONS

2 He came to the school at night when everybody else
3 was gone and he studied and prepared on his own so
4 he met the challenges that came before him in
5 Seattle, Washington, and all the glory here this
6 morning belongs to Tom Baker. And I just want to
7 thank you for all the opportunity for being here.
8 Thank you.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The Chair
21 recognizes Councilman Nutter.

22 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Madam President, I
23 think at that time I would like to request in this
24 special order of business consideration of
25 Resolution No. 990066.

1 SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Clerk will
3 please read the title of the resolution.

4 CHIEF CLERK HAUSER: A Resolution
5 proposing an amendment to the Educational supplement
6 to the Philadelphia Home Rule Charter relating to
7 the method of selection and term of office of
8 members of the Board of Education, including
9 provisions relating the Educational Nominating
10 Panel, and providing for the submission of the
11 amendment to the electors of Philadelphia.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
13 recognizes Councilman Nutter for the purpose of a
14 motion for the adoption of Resolution No. 990066,
15 which is the companion resolution to Bill No.
16 990056.

17 Councilman Cohen, did you want to be
18 recognized?

19 COUNCILMAN COHEN: What I wanted to say
20 is applicable to both the resolution and the
21 ordinance. And I can speak at whichever time the
22 President desired. I would like to speak.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Councilman
24 Nutter.

25 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Madam President, I

2 haven't moved the adoption of the resolution yet.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Will you
4 please move for the adoption?

5 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Absolutely. Madam
6 President, I move the adoption of the resolution.
7 (Properly seconded.)

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
9 recognizes Councilman Cohen who wants to be heard.

10 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Yes, I am speaking in
11 opposition both to the resolution and to the
12 companion ordinance which is 990056 and is on the
13 Calendar today. This involves a proposal to place
14 on the November ballot amendments to the Educational
15 Home Rule Supplement that will change the way in
16 which board members are selected to the School
17 District. In my judgment the proposed Amendment,
18 despite the fine intentions of Councilman Nutter,
19 would nonetheless concentrate a great deal more
20 power in the Office of the Mayor. And
21 simultaneously, if the Mayor gets more power, it
22 means there's less power in the citizenry and in the
23 Council and in all groups that deal with the School
24 Board, and I oppose that and I believe that the
25 people of Philadelphia oppose that.

1 SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS

2 At the present time, the Mayor does not
3 have the same authority with the School District
4 that he has in other boards and commissions that he
5 appoints. When a member of the Gas Commission did
6 not do want what the Mayor wanted him to do with
7 respect to a proposed appointment, the Mayor just
8 fired the board member. When a historical committee
9 voted against the Mayor's recommendation for what
10 ought to happen to the front of a house on 17th
11 Street and the person supported by the Mayor wanted
12 to use it for a garage, the member voted against it,
13 that was the end of the member's membership on that
14 board. Because if the mayor can, as this Amendment
15 would do, terminate the board membership of any
16 member of the board at any time and for whatever
17 reason or no reason at all, the members, of course,
18 lose their independence. They serve at the will of
19 the Mayor. It gives the Mayor total control, and I
20 think that's bad and it takes away rights from
21 people.

22 Over the years community groups and home
23 and school associations and the citizens generally
24 have learned that they can be bound to public
25 meetings at a School Board and speak to people who

1 SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS

2 have the right to make a decision based on their
3 independent conclusions and who are not threatened
4 with the termination of their office-holding if they
5 happen to vote differently from the way in which the
6 Mayor wanted them to vote. That independence and
7 that freedom will be lost if this Amendment takes
8 place.

9 Also, we're in the period of an election
10 coming up this fall. I think it's also wrong to
11 detract from the attention of the mayoral race and
12 at the same time to hand out in advance to the next
13 Mayor, and we don't know who that will be, total
14 power, particularly when the two major candidates
15 both have taken positions on different subjects
16 which raise serious question as to whether either of
17 them really supports fully the concept of public
18 education. One candidate supports school vouchers.
19 There's a body of thought that indicates that the
20 use of school vouchers under the circumstances that
21 that candidate supports them is inconsistent with
22 support for public school education. The other
23 candidate has a view with respect to rights of
24 certain citizens, believing that gay and lesbian
25 citizens don't deserve the same rights as other

1 SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS

2 citizens. And many in this City believe that that's
3 not a view that ought to be held by somebody charged
4 with the responsibility for the public school
5 system.

6 It just seems to me to be a wrong bill
7 and a wrong time; and therefore, I'm going to be
8 voting against this bill and this resolution and
9 urging my colleagues to vote against it.

10 I think amendment to the Home Rule
11 Charter, the school amendments are wrong. The last
12 time it was tried in 1994, and this is apropos to
13 finding copies of the editorials of the Inquirer and
14 the Daily News on my desk. When City Council
15 decided in 1994 to try to get through very signify
16 amendments changing the delicate balance that exists
17 in the Home Rule Charter, the Daily News editorially
18 and the Inquirer editorially supported those
19 amendments, so did the Mayor, so did the President
20 of City Council, so did City Council by an
21 overwhelming vote. When it went to the voters by a
22 7 to 1 vote, an unbelievable margin in any election,
23 by a 7 to 1 vote the voters said, no, we want to
24 retain the powers we have. We don't think it's wise
25 to put it in the hands of the Mayor. I predict the

2 same kind of result will occur if this is passed.

3 But I think we ought not to be faced at this time,
4 and I'm urging my colleagues to vote no and I shall
5 be voting no on both the bill and the resolution.

6 Thank you, Madam President.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The Chair
8 recognizes Councilwoman Tasco.

9 COUNCILWOMAN Tasco: Thank you, Madam
10 President. I will not repeat all the comments that
11 my colleague Councilman Cohen has made. I have
12 pretty much agreed with him on those accounts,
13 having just had the occasion to have a
14 commission member booted from the Gas Commission
15 because he did not vote the way the Mayor asked him
16 to vote, and the same thing happened with the City
17 Planning Commission.

18 I believe there should be some changes.
19 I'm not sure whether any of this will make it
20 possible for John or Jane to read better, but I do
21 not believe that concentrating all this power in the
22 Mayor's hand is going to make them read better or
23 compute better in the end. So I will be voting no
24 on this bill.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank you.

4 President. I'll be very brief. First, certainly to
5 my two colleagues who have spoken, they know that I
6 deeply respect their views and their concerns. They
7 have shared with me on a previous occasion. This is
8 a resolution to adopt the Educational Rule
9 Supplement that I believe I've tried to address and
10 the other co-sponsors have tried to address the many
11 concerns that a wide variety of groups and
12 organizations and our citizens have expressed. But
13 I think more important than anything else, at least
14 for my involvement in this, is I do believe that
15 many Philadelphians and certainly who have children
16 in public schools do want someone to be fully
17 accountable and have a clear line of accountability
18 for public education here in Philadelphia. And I
19 think that, actually, my colleagues who spoke
20 earlier would probably agree even with that
21 particular statement. I respect their views as it
22 relates to the bill.

23 Ultimately, we know that even if the
24 bill is passed today, the ultimate test is what the
25 voters say on election day. And I would only

2 encourage my colleagues to at least allow this
3 provision to go to the voters. Let them have their
4 say as we've had an opportunity to discuss these
5 matters for sometime. So I would like to encourage
6 all of my colleagues to at least support the measure
7 to allow the voters to have the opportunity to
8 express their view and their will and have their say
9 about what they want to happen in public education
10 in Philadelphia.

11 Thank you, Madam President.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair

15 you know, I have always been a strong supporter of
16 the Educational Supplement, believing that it should

21 who is Mayor; it is to the position of Mayor that
22 oppose concentrating additional power.

23 The Educational Supplement grew out of a
24 desire on the part of its framers to de-politicize
25 education to the greatest degree possible. It seems

2 to me that this re-concentrates the power and goes
3 in the opposite direction. And for that reason,
4 I'll be voting against it.

5 There are things about the proposed
6 change that I very much do like, but the fact that
7 it is a re-concentration of power causes me great

9 victims. And I just wanted to applaud the work that
10 they did, and I appreciate all they have done.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: And we all
12 appreciate what you have done, Councilwoman. Thank
13 you.

14 (Applause.)

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: I want to
16 thank you all for your cooperation. I know it's
17 been a long stressful day and I want to thank all of
18 you, not only for today, but what we have been able
19 to accomplish in the last six months.

20 I wish you all a very healthy, safe
21 summer. Enjoy it. And I'm sure pan alike them to.

22 At this time the Chair recognizes
23 Councilwoman Clark.

24 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: Madam President, it
25 is with a great deal of pleasure that I adjourn this
