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2 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Good afternoon. This
3 Hearing will be called to order. This is
4 a Public Hearing of Street Service Committee.
5 My name is Councilman Squilla. We are ready to
6 get started.

7 Will the Clerk please read the title of the
8 first Bill.

9 THE CLERK: Bill No. 120211, an Ordinance
10 authorizing the revision of lines and grade on a
11 portion of the City Plan No. 269 by striking
12 from the City Plan and vacating the
13 southwesterly footway area of East Service
14 Drive, all under certain terms and conditions.

15 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Is there any witnesses
16 here to testify?

17 Please approach the table. Give your name
18 and state it for the record.

19 MR. MORELLI: Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman
20 and Members of the Committee. My name is Frank
21 Morelli, Survey Bureau Manager for the
22 Department of Streets. And the Department of
23 Streets would like to offer the following
24 testimony on Bill No. 120211.

1 This is not an administration ordinance,
2 but an ordinance requested by Mr. Don Gusic, PE
3 of Pennoni Associates, Incorporated.

4 The purpose of this ordinance is to
5 authorize the striking from the City Plan and
6 vacating a portion of the footway area of East
7 Service Drive and Health Sciences Drive and
8 reserving and placing on the City Plan for
9 rights of way for public, pedestrian and utility
10 purposes within the areas being stricken and the
11 establishment of the curb lay-by along the
12 southwesterly side of the East Service Drive.

13 The abutting owner, Children's Hospital of
14 Philadelphia is constructing an Ambulatory Care
15 Center building and is proposing to install
16 vaults under the sidewalk at this location to
17 store fuel oil for emergency generators. In
18 order to provide that fuel oil vaults will not
19 be within the public right of way. The affected
20 sidewalk areas will be stricken and vacated, and
21 pedestrian access reserved as an easement.

22 This action will also create a curb lay-by
23 lane along the East Service Drive to be used for
24 patient drop off and loading. This ordinance is

1 supported by the Department of Streets and is
2 recommended to your committee for favorable
3 action.

4 MS. CHIU: Okay. Good afternoon, Chairman
5 Squilla and Members of Streets and Services
6 Committee. I am Sarah Chiu, City Planner with
7 the City Planning Commission. I am here to
8 testify on Bill No. 120211, which Council Member
9 Blackwell introduced on March 5, 2012.

10 The purpose of this Bill No. 120211 is to
11 convey a portion of East Service and Health
12 Services Drive to the Children's Hospital of
13 Philadelphia in order to accommodate existing
14 underground oil vaults. The city will reserve a
15 permanent right of way for pedestrian access and
16 public utilities.

17 At its meeting of April 17, 2012, the City
18 Planning Commission recommended that bill no.
19 120211 be approved.

20 This concludes my testimony. I appreciate
21 opportunity to testify before you today, and be
22 pleased to answer questions you may have.

23 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Are there any
24 questions?

1 Seeing no question, is there any other
2 testimony on this Bill?

3 MR. MARTIN: Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman.
4 William Martin, Fox Rothschild Law Firm
5 Philadelphia. I represent Children's Hospital.
6 And I want to indicate to you that Joe Kiernan,
7 the Director of Facility Planning Design and
8 Project Management is here with us. He
9 submitted testimony in advance.

10 We are also joined by Don Gusic of Pennoni
11 who is the consulting engineer on the project,
12 and as indicated, requested the ordinance.

13 In the interest of time, if you would like,
14 Mr. Kiernan either to testify or to read his
15 testimony into the record, he's happy to do so;
16 or he's available to answer any questions you
17 may have.

18 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: We have the testimony
19 read into the record. I think that's fine.

20 MR. MARTIN: Thank you.

21 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Is there any
22 questions? Okay. Thank you.

23 Is there any other testimony for this Bill?
24 Seeing none, Mr. McMonagle, do you want to read

1 the next bill, please.

2 THE CLERK: Bill No. 120249, an Ordinance
3 authorizing The Children's Hospital of
4 Philadelphia, located at 34th and Civic Center
5 Boulevard, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to
6 construct, own and maintain various
7 encroachments within the City right-of-way on
8 East Service Drive between Civic Center
9 Boulevard and Health Services Drive, on Civic
10 Center Boulevard between East Service Drive and
11 on West Service Drive, and on West Service Drive
12 between Civic Center Boulevard and Health
13 Sciences Drive, under certain terms and
14 conditions.

15 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Good afternoon.
16 Please state your name for the record and your
17 testimony proceed please.

18 MS. BRISBON: Good afternoon, Chairman
19 Squilla and Members of the Streets and Services
20 Committee. My name is Michelle Brisbon. And
21 I'm a staff engineer with the Department of
22 Streets. And I'm here to offer testimony on
23 Bill No. 120249.

24 This Bill authorizes The Children's

1 Hospital of Philadelphia to construct, own and
2 maintain various encroachments within the City
3 right-of-way as indicated in Bill No. 120249.
4 The Streets Department has no objections to the
5 these proposed encroachments and supports the
6 passage of this Bill.

7 Thank you for your time. This concludes my
8 testimony, and I'm pleased to answer any
9 questions you may have.

10 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you.

11 MS. CHIU: Good afternoon, Chairman Squilla
12 and Members of Streets and Services Committee.
13 I am Sarah Chiu, City Planner with the
14 Philadelphia City Planning Commission. I'm here
15 to testify on Bill No. 120249, which
16 Councilmember Blackwell introduced On March 29,
17 2012.

18 The purpose of the Bill is to -- the
19 purpose of Bill No. 120249 is to allow The
20 Children's Hospital of Philadelphia to construct
21 and maintain various encroachments including
22 canopy, bike racks, planters, tie backs for
23 retaining walls and bollards.

24 At its meeting of April 17, 2012, the City

1 Planning Commission recommended that Bill No.
2 120249 be approved.

3 This conclude's my testimony. I appreciate
4 the opportunity to testify before you today and
5 be pleased to answer questions you may have.

6 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Any questions from the
7 Committee?

8 Seeing none. We have any other person
9 willing to testify? Please come up, state your
10 name and proceed with your testimony.

11 MR. MARTIN: William Martin, Counsel for
12 Children's Hospital.

13 Again, we have the representatives here to
14 answer any questions. When I was here
15 previously, I was remiss in not thanking
16 Councilwoman Blackwell and her staff for their
17 assistance and also Ms. Brisbon and other staff
18 of the Streets Department for their assistance
19 on both of these ordinances.

20 Thank you.

21 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you. Seeing no
22 questions, is there any other witnesses for this
23 Bill?

24 Seeing none, Mr. McMonagle, would you like

1 to read the next bill, please.

2 THE CLERK: Bill No. 120051, an Ordinance
3 authorizing the revision of lines and grades on
4 a portion of City Plan No. 308 by striking from
5 the City Plan and vacating Spruce Street from
6 Twenty-Fifth Street to the Pierhead and Bulkhead
7 Line of the Schuylkill River, and striking from
8 the City Plan and vacating Twenty-Sixth Street
9 from Spruce Street to Delancey Place, and
10 placing on the City Plan rights-of-way for sewer
11 and draining purposes and water main purposes
12 within the lines of the said streets being
13 stricken and incorporating the vacated areas of
14 said streets under the jurisdiction of the
15 Department of Parks and Recreation.

16 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Please state your
17 name.

18 MR. MORELLI: Good after -- good afternoon,
19 Mr. chairman and Members of the Committee. My
20 name is Frank Morelli, Survey Bureau Manager of
21 the Department of Streets. And the Department
22 of Streets would like to offer the following
23 testimony on Bill No. 120051.

24 This is an Administration Ordinance

1 requested by the Streets Department. The
2 purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize the
3 striking from the City Plan and vacating of
4 Spruce Street from 25th Street to Schuylkill --
5 to the Schuylkill River and 26th Street from
6 Spruce Street to Delancey Place and placing on
7 the City Plan rights-of-way for sewer drainage
8 and water main purposes within the lines of the
9 streets being stricken.

10 The streets proposed to be stricken and
11 vacated are not improved and not open to the
12 public -- to public traffic and extend to city
13 owned property maintained by the Department of
14 Parks and Recreation. This action is part of
15 the project to enhance access to the Schuylkill
16 River Park. The beds of the streets being
17 vacated will be retained by the City as Park
18 property.

19 This ordinance is supported by the
20 Department of Streets, and is recommended to
21 your committee for favorable action.

22 MS. CHIU: Good afternoon, Chairman Squilla
23 and Members of Streets and Services Committee.
24 I'm Sarah Chiu, City Planner with the

1 Philadelphia City Planning Commission. I'm here
2 to testify on Bill No. 120051 which Councilman
3 Johnson introduced on February 2, 2012.

4 Bill No. 120051 would strike and vacate
5 Spruce Street from 25th Street to the Pierhead
6 Line and Bulkhead Line of Schuylkill River and
7 to strike and vacate 26th Street from Spruce
8 Street to Delancey Place and reserve as utility
9 right-of-way. Both of the streets in the above
10 subject bill do not physically exist. The
11 purpose of the Bill No. 120051 is to enhance
12 access to Schuylkill Bank Park.

13 On December 14, 2012, the City Planning
14 Commission had approved property Bill No. 100777
15 accepting an aerial easement in the vicinity of
16 26th Street and Spruce Street in order to
17 provide pedestrian bridge access to Schuylkill
18 Bank Park. Therefore, at this meeting of
19 February 22, 2012, the City Planning Commission
20 recommended that Bill No. 120051 be approved as
21 an item in Court with the previous policy.

22 This concludes my testimony. I appreciate
23 the opportunity to testify before you today.
24 And would be pleased to answer any questions you

1 may have.

2 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Seeing no questions,
3 is there anybody else to testify on this Bill?

4 Seeing none, Mr. McMonagle, would you like
5 to read the next bill please.

6 THE CLERK: Bill No. 120168, an Ordinance
7 authorizing the plotting upon City Plan No. 321
8 of a right-of-way for sewer and drainage
9 purposes and water main purposes within the
10 lines of Delaware Avenue from Pennypack Street
11 to a point approximately 456 feet southwesterly
12 therefrom.

13 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Please proceed.

14 MR. MORELLI: The Department of Streets
15 would like to offer the following testimony on
16 Bill No. 120168.

17 This is an Administration Ordinance
18 requested by Public Property. The purpose of
19 this Ordinance is to authorize the plotting upon
20 City Plan for the right-of-way for sewer and
21 drainage purposes and water main purposes within
22 the lines of Delaware Avenue from Pennypack
23 Street to a point approximately 456 feet
24 southwesterly, therefrom.

1 This portion of Delaware Avenue is not
2 improved and not open to the public traffic and
3 has been authorized to be stricken from the City
4 Plan pursuant to an Ordinance Bill No. 110611
5 approved November 14, 2011.

6 The Department of Public Property is
7 currently preparing plans to renovate the
8 facilities of the Police and Fire Academies
9 which occupy city owned property in this area.
10 And the Water Department has requested the
11 plotting of this right-of-way to ensure access
12 to its underground facilities and to prevent
13 encroachments in the proposed right-of-way.

14 This Ordinance is supported by the
15 Department of Streets, and is recommended to
16 your committee for favorable action.

17 MS. CHIU: I am Sarah Chiu, City Planner
18 with the Philadelphia City Planning Commission.
19 I am here to testify on Bill No. 120168 which
20 Councilmember Henon introduced on March 8, 2012.

21 The purpose of Bill No. 120168 is to plot
22 utility right-of-way for water, sewer and
23 drainage purposes within the lines of Delaware
24 Avenue, which was stricken from City Plan

1 pursuant to an Ordinance Bill No. 110611, which
2 was signed into law by -- on November 14, 2011.
3 The Water Department has requested that a
4 right-of-way be placed on the City Plan to
5 satisfy technical requirements.

6 At this meeting of April 17, 2012, the City
7 Planning Commission recommended that Bill No.
8 120168 be approved as an item in accord with
9 previous policy.

10 So, this concludes my testimony. I
11 appreciate opportunity to testify before you
12 today. And will be pleased to answer questions
13 you may have.

14 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: No questions. Is
15 there anybody else here to testify on this Bill?

16 Seeing none, Mr. McMonagle, please read the
17 next bill.

18 THE CLERK: Bill No. 120178, an Ordinance
19 authorizing the revision of lines of grades on a
20 portion of City Plan No. 177 by striking from
21 the City Plan Tulpehocken Street from Ardleigh
22 Street to Crittenden Street, under certain terms
23 and conditions.

24 MR. MORELLI: The Department of Streets

1 would like to offer the following testimony
2 on --

3 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Please state your name
4 for each Bill, thank you.

5 MR. MORELLI: Good afternoon. My name is
6 Frank -- Mr. Chairman and Members of the
7 Committee, my name is Frank Morelli, Survey
8 Bureau Manager with the Department of Streets.
9 And the Department of Streets would like to
10 offer the following testimony on Bill No.
11 120178.

12 This is not an Administration Ordinance,
13 but an ordinance requested by Christopher E.
14 Cummings, Esquire of Stradley, Ronon, Stevens
15 and Young, LLP. The purpose of this Ordinance
16 is to authorize the striking from the City Plan
17 of Tulpehocken Street from Ardleigh Street to
18 Crittenden Street. This portion of Tulpehocken
19 Street is not improved and not legally open to
20 public traffic. And the City is not desirous of
21 constructing a street at this location.

22 This action is related to the relocation of
23 the Green Tree School to property abutting
24 Tulpehocken Street and will allow the school to

1 utilize a portion of the street stricken for
2 additional yard area. This ordinance is
3 supported by the Department of Streets and
4 recommended to your committee for favorable
5 action.

6 MS. CHIU: Good afternoon, Chairman Squilla
7 and Members of Streets and Services Committee.
8 I'm Sarah Chiu, City Planner with the
9 Philadelphia City Planning Commission. I'm here
10 to testify on Bill No. 120178, which
11 Councilmember Bass introduced on March 8, 2012.

12 The purpose of Bill No. 120178 is to strike
13 Tulpehocken Street from Ardleigh to Crittenden
14 Street to allow the Green Tree School to develop
15 passive recreational space behind its new school
16 facility. At this meeting of April 17, 2012,
17 the City Planning Commission recommended that
18 Bill No. 120178 be approved.

19 This concludes my testimony. I appreciate
20 opportunity to testify before you today and will
21 be pleased to answer questions you may have.

22 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: No questions. Anyone
23 else here to testify on this Bill?

24 Seeing none, Mr. McMonagle, please read on.

1 THE CLERK: Bill No. 120277, an Ordinance
2 authorizing the striking from City Plan No. 42-S
3 and abandonment of a right-of-way reserved for
4 drainage purposes, water main purposes and
5 public utility purposes which extends from the
6 southerly terminus of Galloway Street, south of
7 Packer Avenue, southwardly to Pattison Avenue,
8 under certain terms and conditions.

9 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Please proceed.

10 MR. MORELLI: Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman
11 and Members of the Committee. My name is Frank
12 Morelli, Survey Bureau Manager of the Department
13 of Streets. And the Department of Streets would
14 like to offer the following testimony on Bill
15 No. 120277.

16 This is not an Administration Ordinance,
17 but an Ordinance requested by Mr. Thomas Dalfo
18 of the Philadelphia Industrial Development
19 Corporation. The purpose of this Ordinance is
20 to authorize the striking from the City Plan and
21 abandonment of a right-of-way reserved for
22 drainage purposes, water main purposes and
23 public utility purposes which extends from the
24 southerly terminus of Galloway Street south of

1 Packer Avenue, southwardly to Pattison Avenue.

2 The utilities within this right-of-way are
3 no longer essential and will be either abandoned
4 or relocated. This action will facilitate plans
5 for the construction of a large warehouse
6 facility at this location and is part of the
7 redevelopment of the Food Distribution Center.

8 This ordinance is supported by the
9 Department of Streets and is recommended to your
10 committee for favorable action.

11 MS. CHIU: Good afternoon, Chairman Squilla
12 and Members of the Streets and Services
13 committee. I am Sarah Chiu, City Planner with
14 the Philadelphia City Planning Commission. I am
15 here to testify on Bill No. 120277, which
16 Councilman Johnson introduced on April 12, 2012.

17 Bill No. 120277 would strike an abandonment
18 right-of-way for water drainage and other public
19 utilities within the lines of the former
20 Galloway Street from Packer Avenue to Pattison
21 Avenue. The purpose of Bill No. 120277 is to
22 support the redevelopment of Food Distribution
23 Center.

24 The City Planning Commission is scheduled

1 to hear this bill at the meeting of May 15,
2 2012. The staff recommendation for this bill is
3 to be proved.

4 This concludes my testimony. I appreciate
5 opportunity to testify before you today, and be
6 pleased to answer questions you may have.

7 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Seeing no question, is
8 there anyone else here to testify on the Bill?

9 Please state your name for the record and
10 proceed with your testimony.

11 MR. YOUNG: Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman
12 and Members of the Committee. My name is Thomas
13 Dalfo. I'm here to represent the Philadelphia
14 Industrial Development Corporation and the Food
15 Distribution Center. I am here to testify in
16 support of Bill No. 120277.

17 This Bill authorizes the striking and
18 abandonment of an existing draining right-of-way
19 in the bed of former Galloway Street located
20 between Packer and Pattison Avenues on the site
21 of the former Food Distribution Center.

22 The 300,00 square foot produce terminal was
23 vacated August of 2011 and relocated to a more
24 modern facility on Essington Avenue. PIDC and

1 the City intend to redevelop the entire block
2 for commercial industrial use. The right-of-way
3 is no longer needed to manage storm water and
4 capacity can be handled by the sewers in Large
5 Street and Third Street.

6 Additionally, modern industrial uses
7 require larger floor plates. And redevelopment
8 of the site will require expanding the
9 right-of-way. I ask that the Committee consider
10 this bill favorably. Thank you for the
11 opportunity to testify.

12 If you have any questions, I will be more
13 than happy to answer them.

14 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Seeing no questions,
15 is there anyone else here to testify on this
16 Bill?

17 Seeing none, Mr. McMonagle, please read the
18 next bill.

19 THE CLERK: Bill No. 120221, an Ordinance
20 amending Section 9-213 of The Philadelphia Code
21 entitled "Farmers' Markets" by adding a
22 permissible location, the sidewalk of the west
23 curb lane of the west side of the 1400 block of
24 Ridge Avenue from Fairmount Avenue to North 15th

1 Street, all under certain terms and conditions.

2 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Please proceed. State
3 your name for the record.

4 MR. YOUNG: Good afternoon, Councilman
5 Squilla and Members of the Committee. I am John
6 Young for the Department of Licenses and
7 Inspections.

8 Today I am here to provide testimony on
9 Bill 120212, which if enacted will amend Section
10 9-213 Farmers' Markets by adding a permissible
11 location on the sidewalk and west curb lane of
12 the west side of the 1400 block of Ridge Avenue
13 from Fairmount Avenue to North 5th Street.

14 The Department of Licenses and Inspections
15 offers no objection to the enactment of this
16 Bill. Thank you for the opportunity to provide
17 the Department's testimony on Bill 120212. I
18 will be happy to answer any questions at this
19 time.

20 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: All right. The Chair
21 recognizes Councilman Greenlee.

22 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank you,
23 Mr. Chairman. I have no questions. But I just
24 want to state on the record, first, at the

1 meeting, I will be putting in an amendment that
2 doesn't affect the bill at all, just clears up
3 some wording.

4 But I just wanted to go on record since I'm
5 very familiar with this site. There are
6 representatives here from the Francisville
7 Community Development Corporation who has been
8 working very hard on this issue. I know this is
9 sort of a dream of theirs to get this Farmers
10 Market going. I think it will add to the area.
11 That area is being developed.

12 And the idea is to put an entity that will
13 serve the whole community there. And I think it
14 will be extremely valuable addition to this area
15 and to the Francisville Community. Thank you.

16 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Any other questions?
17 Seeing no other questions, anybody else to
18 testify here on this ordinance?

19 Seeing none, Mr. McMonagle, could you read
20 the next bill.

21 THE CLERK: Bill No. 120300, an Ordinance
22 amending Section 9-213 of The Philadelphia Code,
23 entitled "Farmers' Markets" by removing as a
24 permissible location the sidewalk of the east

1 side of South Broad Street between Porter and
2 Ritner Streets and by adding the sidewalk on the
3 east side of South Broad Street between Snyder
4 and Jackson Streets as a permissible location,
5 all under certain terms and conditions.

6 MR. YOUNG: Good afternoon, Councilman
7 Squilla and Members of the Committee. I am John
8 Young for the Department of Licenses and
9 Inspections.

10 Today I am here to provide testimony on
11 Bill No. 120300, which if enacted will amend
12 Section 9-213 Farmers Markets by providing or,
13 excuse me, by removing as permissible location
14 the sidewalk of the east side of South Broad
15 Street between Porter and Ritner Streets and by
16 adding the sidewalk on the east side of South
17 Broad Street between Snyder and Jackson Streets
18 as a permissible location.

19 The Department of Licenses and Inspections
20 offers no objection to the enactment of this
21 Bill. Thank you for the opportunity to provide
22 the Department's testimony on Bill No. 120300.

23 I will be happy to answer any questions at
24 this time.

1 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Seeing no questions,
2 is there anybody else here to testify on this
3 Bill?

4 Seeing none, that would conclude the public
5 Hearing of the Committee Streets and Services.
6 We will now go into a Public Meeting.

7 For the record, here we have Councilwoman
8 Quinones-Sanchez, Councilman Greenlee,
9 Councilman Oh and myself, Councilman Squilla.

10 The Chair recognizes Councilmember Greenlee
11 for a motion on the amendment to a Bill.

12 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Mr. Chairman, I move
13 the adoption of the amendment to Bill No.
14 120212.

15 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Second.

16 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: All in favor?

17 (Ayes.)

18 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: It has been moved and
19 properly seconded the amendment to the Bill No.
20 120212 has been adopted.

21 All those in favor.

22 (Ayes.)

23 All those opposed?

24 (No response.)

1 The motion carries. And the Amendment to
2 the Bill No. 120212 has been adopted.

3 All right. Like to make -- Councilman
4 Greenlee, make a motion to move the Bill as
5 amended.

6 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank you, Mr.
7 Chairman. I move that Bill No. 120212 as
8 amended be reported out of this Committee with a
9 favorable recommendation. And move further that
10 the Rules of Council be suspended to allow for
11 first reading at our next session of Council.

12 COUNCILMAN OH: Second.

13 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Bill has been moved
14 and properly second. Bill No. 120212 has been
15 adopted.

16 All those in favor.

17 (Ayes)

18 All those opposed.

19 (No response.)

20 The motion carries and the bill has been
21 amended.

22 Chair likes to recognize Councilman
23 Greenlee.

24 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank you,

1 Mr. Chairman. I move that the following bills
2 be reported out of Committee with a favorable
3 recommendation. And that the Rules of Council
4 be suspended to allow for first reading at our
5 next session of Council. Bills No. 120051,
6 120168, 120178, 120211, 120249, 120277 and
7 120300.

8 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Second.

9 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Move the bills have
10 been moved and properly seconded.

11 All those in favor.

12 (Ayes.)
