10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The Chair
11 thanks the Councilwoman.

12 The Chair recognizes Councilman
13 O'Neill.

14 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Madam President,
15 on behalf of the Republicans, there are no
16 requests for leaves of absence.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank you
18 very much.

19 - - -

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The Chair
21 will dispense with the regular order of business
22 to recognize the guests and visitors joining us in
23 chambers this morning.

24 On behalf of all Members of City
25 Council, I welcome you to our Council session this

2 morning. We appreciate your taking the time to
3 join us as we attend to the legislative affairs of
4 our city. We invite you to come again.

5 Our first presentation today honors
6 Miss Sondra Horrocks. The Chair recognizes
7 Councilwoman Tasco to come to make this
8 presentation.

9 (Councilmembers Tasco and Clark and
10 honoree come forward.)

11 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Joining me is
12 Councilwoman Augusta Clarke, who is a member of
13 the Board of the Philadelphia Museum of Art.

14 I am very pleased this morning to stand
15 here and present this resolution to a longtime
16 friend. Our days go back together at the
17 Philadelphia Museum of Art. And this resolution
18 is honoring Sondra A. Horrocks.

19 Whereas, in her 35 years of service to
20 the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the museum has
21 succeeded in every aspect of its operations, which
22 involved Miss Horrocks' careful and creative
23 oversight; and

24 Whereas, Sondra Horrocks, favored
25 daughter of the Mayfair section of this city,

2 graduated from Temple University and began her
3 career at the museum in 1964 as a member of the
4 registrar's office -- with Tasco. That's not in
5 the resolution, but I had to add that. After a
6 stint in the development department, she joined
7 the public relations staff in 1968 and was named
8 department head just after one year later;
9 and. . .

10 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: . . . Whereas Miss
11 Horrocks' years with the museum was studded with
12 gems of accomplishment and frequent fireworks of
13 success, she initiated the Wednesday Night
14 Program, which has repeatedly been voted as "Best
15 for Date" by Philadelphia Magazine in 1997, the
16 Group Sales Program, also begun by Sondra, reached
17 \$1 million in sales; and

18 Whereas, although Miss Horrocks has
19 been manager of the marketing and public relations
20 division of the museum since '69, in 1994, her
21 responsibilities were broadened and she was named
22 vice president. Soon she was supervising a
23 \$4 million food service operation, managing a
24 budget in excess of \$1.5 million, developing a
25 Website, handling special exhibits, and in every

2 way, making the museum a better place for us
3 Philadelphians and for people all over the; world
4 and. . .

5 COUNCILWOMAN TASC0: . . . Whereas,
6 despite all of these accomplishments and the
7 awards and tributes that go with them, Miss
8 Horrocks will tell us that the moment of highest
9 excitement for her came when the museum surpassed
10 the 1 million visitors mark for the first time
11 ever in 1997, the triumph was partly the draw of
12 Cezanne, partly a more people-friendly
13 environment, and partly increased tourism, but
14 everyone in the arts community knows that Sondra
15 Horrocks played a major role in the museum's
16 reaching this terrific milestone;

17 Now, therefore, resolved by the Council
18 of the City of Philadelphia, we hereby honor and
19 commend Sondra A. Horrocks. We recognize her
20 enormous contributions to our city, at the museum,
21 and we know that as director of marketing and
22 communications for the Regional Performing Arts
23 Center, she will reach even greater heights;

24 Resolved that an engrossed copy of this
25 resolution be presented to Sondra A. Horrocks as

3 admiration of this legislative body.

11 wonderful service to the museum and to this city.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
14 recognizes Miss Horrocks for remarks.

15 MS. HORROCKS: Thank you very, very
16 much. This is a terrific honor.

17 When I started at the museum in 1964,
18 Marian was the assistant registrar at the museum,
19 and she took me under her wing and showed me the
20 ropes -- and a few pinochle tricks during
21 lunchtime. And I'm forever grateful for what
22 Marian did for me in setting me on the course of
23 my career at the museum.

24 And I've also been very lucky to have
25 Councilwoman Clark as a museum trustee for a

2 number of years now, and she's given us tremendous
3 guidance in many, many ways.

4 I'm deeply, deeply honored, and thank
5 you so much.

6 (Applause.).

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Council will
8 be at ease.

9 (Council stands at ease.)

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Our second
11 presentation today recognizes Commissioner Michael
12 DiBerardinis.

13 To make this presentation, the Chair
14 invites Councilman DiCicco.

15 Will Commissioner DiBerardinis and
16 those with him please come forward.

17 (Councilman DiCicco and Commissioner
18 DiBerardinis come forward.)

19 COUNCILMAN DiCicco: Thank you, Madam
20 President.

21 I invite up to the podium at this time
22 Councilmember Clark and Councilmember Cohen, who
23 are the cosponsors of this resolution.

24 (Councilmembers Clark and Cohen and
25 Commissioner DiBerardinis' staff members come

3 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Good morning. We
4 have a resolution today honoring Michael
5 DiBerardinis:

6 Whereas, Michael DiBerardinis was
7 appointed Recreation Commissioner by Mayor Rendell
8 in January 1992, having previously served as a
9 chief of staff to Congressman Foglietta; and

10 Whereas, as the recreation
11 commissioner, he oversaw a \$45 million annual
12 budget, with 550 full-time employees and 160
13 staffed facilities, including 159 recreation
14 centers, 83 swimming pools, 90 parks, 5
15 older-adult centers, and Veterans Stadium;
16 and. . .

17 COUNCILMAN COHEN: . . . Whereas
18 Michael DiBerardinis came from the ranks of
19 community activist, and although he changed his
20 focus, his spirit of active advocacy never
21 waivered. He spearheaded a citywide effort to
22 reduce handgun violence and provide safe havens
23 and safe activities for children; and

24 Whereas, Michael DiBerardinis has been
25 credited with making the Recreation Department

2 more responsive, cleaning up recreation centers,
3 developing programs, and opening swimming pools,
4 under his stewardship all 83 City pools have been
5 fully operational and open to the City's youth for
6 the first time in many years; and. . .

7 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: . . . Whereas, he
8 is a person of extraordinary leadership and
9 team-building capabilities, he refused to be bound
10 by governmental bureaucracy and he pushed the
11 envelope and developed creative approaches to
12 urban problems. Michael D. has worked tirelessly
13 to make this city a better, safer, more
14 compassionate, and more athletic place for all of
15 us, and he has succeeded.

16 Now, therefore, resolved by the Council
17 of the City of Philadelphia that we hereby honor
18 and commend Michael DiBerardinis and we thank him
19 for his fine work on behalf of all of our
20 citizens. We wish him continued success in his
21 new role as vice president for programs at the
22 William Penn Foundation.

23 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Be it further
24 resolved that an engrossed copy of this resolution
25 be presented to Michael DiBerardinis as evidence

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
10 recognizes Commissioner DiBerardinis for remarks.

11 COMMISSIONER DIBERARDINIS: Thank you,
12 Council President. This is a great and wonderful
13 honor for me to be here in front of this body,
14 many of who I consider -- all of you who I
15 consider my friend.

16 Back in the '70s, when I was down here
17 testifying and protesting and raising a little bit
18 of fuss, I always loved this room. I love this
19 room, and I think I loved it for two reasons. The
20 first reason is, I think it's one of the most
21 beautiful rooms in the City of Philadelphia. And
22 the second reason I love it is because of the
23 important work that goes on in this room every
24 time this body sit down.

25 And I've always dreamed of being in

2 this room in a formal way -- witness my failed
3 attempt to be here in 1991, when I ran for
4 Council.

5 (Laughter.)

6 COMMISSIONER DIBERARDINIS: But,
7 nonetheless, I will tell you that my eight years
8 in government, working with this group of people,
9 I've come to appreciate the difficult task you
10 have in meeting the needs of the varied folks in
11 your district, and at the same time, doing what's
12 best for this city. That's an incredible
13 challenge and an incredible responsibility that I
14 think this body does so, so well. And for me to
15 be a part of that and for my staff, who have come
16 very close to you, all has been one of the great,
17 great surprises and wonders of my eight years of
18 service.

19 So I want to thank each one of you for
20 your support of the department, but that's really
21 support for the kids and the neighborhoods and the
22 institutions that serve our neighborhoods in this
23 city. And I will never forget the time that I
24 have spent with you and will always, always
25 cherish the wonderful support you have given to me

11 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Madam President, I

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The clerk
16 will please read the title of the resolution.

17 MS. RAFFERTY: A resolution urging area
18 colleges and universities to ensure that the
19 apparel that they purchase and hold out for sale
20 to students and alumni is not produced under
21 sweatshop conditions.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
23 recognizes Councilman Cohen.

24 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Madam President, I
25 move the adoption of resolution.

1 INTRO. - BILLS, RESOLUTIONS

2 (Duly seconded.)

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: It has been
4 moved and properly seconded that the resolution be
5 adopted.

6 All in favor will signify --

7 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Madam President, may
8 I be heard?

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Please.

10 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Several years ago,
11 all Americans were shocked to learn that Nike
12 shoes, that people thought were signs of greatness
13 for young people to wear, it was a symbol that
14 you've made it, were produced in foreign companies
15 under slave labor conditions. We don't call it
16 slave labor; we call them sweatshops in the United
17 States. Exploited mostly were women and
18 children. Eighty percent of the workers were paid
19 very low wages, as low as a nickel an hour and
20 were working many, many hours through the day.

21 It brought waves of protest throughout
22 the United States. And at that time, a group of
23 college students began working with labor
24 organizations, with religious organizations to
25 seek to put an end to the United States'

2 participation in such activities, because it
3 turned out that American corporations were
4 employing workers overseas to produce the Nike
5 goods under sweatshop conditions.

6 Much to their consternation, the
7 college students learned throughout the United
8 States that many of their own institutions were
9 employing the same foreign workers, under the same
10 sweatshop conditions to produce college clothes
11 that alumni wore, students wore, proudly
12 displaying their support for the universities.

13 That started a movement that took
14 religious organizations, labor organizations,
15 community organizations of all kinds and promoted
16 a tremendous movement. And the leaders of that
17 movement were college students, who showed that
18 they understood the immortality of those
19 practices, and they were determined to put an end
20 to it.

21 And very proudly, most of the
22 universities in the Philadelphia area developed
23 groups of students in support. They are here
24 today. They are very active throughout the United
25 States, wanting to make sure that their colleges

2 and their universities don't participate in
3 sweatshop conditions. In fact, support
4 organizations and materials I've distributed show
5 that they've all formed an organization called
6 "Workers' Rights Consortiums." They're trying to
7 get the universities to support the activity
8 against sweatshop conditions so that workers can
9 be employed at decent wages, without harassment,
10 treated with a sense of dignity, and a living
11 wage.

12 I urge all of my colleagues to, in
13 addition to having sponsored this resolution, to
14 vote unanimously in support of it.

15 Thank you, Madam President.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank you.
