BILL 140904 - An ordinance amending various sections of Title 9, entitled "Regulation of Businesses, Trades and Professions," and Title 10, entitled "Regulation of Individual Conduct and Activity," of The Philadelphia Code, to provide for suspension of their effectiveness pending State authorizing legislation...

BILL 150001 - An ordinance amending Chapter 17-2100 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled "Conflicts Counsel Contracts," by requiring that certain contracts dealing with the provision of services for indigent legal defense may only be made when permitted by ordinance where the contractor is the Defender Association of Philadelphia, the Support Center for Child Advocates, or Community Legal Services...

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2 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: This is
3 the Committee on Law and Government. We
4 have a quorum with Councilman Goode,
5 Councilman O'Brien, and Councilman
6 Neilson.

7 Ms. Marconi, will you please
8 read the title of the first bill before
9 us today.

10 THE CLERK: Bill No. 140904, an
11 ordinance amending various sections of
12 Title 9, entitled "Regulation of
13 Businesses, Trades and Professions," and
14 Title 10, entitled "Regulation of
15 Individual Conduct and Activity," of The
16 Philadelphia Code, to provide for
17 suspension of their effectiveness pending
18 State authorizing legislation; and
19 amending Section 18-819, entitled "State
20 of Emergency," to delete certain
21 language; all under certain terms and
22 conditions.

23 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Our first
24 witness is?

25 THE CLERK: Richie Feder.

4 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Good
5 afternoon, Mr. Feder.

6 MR. FEDER: Good afternoon,
7 Chairman Greenlee. Thanks for inviting
8 me to speak. I believe the Committee has
9 copies of my testimony, so if it's okay
10 with the Committee, I would just
11 summarize.

12 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: We always
13 like that. Just put your name on the
14 record.

15 MR. FEDER: Richie Feder. I'm
16 the Chief Deputy City Solicitor for the
17 Appeals and Legislation Unit in the City
18 Law Department.

19 As this Committee is probably
20 aware, the NRA is running around the
21 state filing lawsuits against
22 municipalities for various ordinances
23 relating to firearms. They're doing this
24 pursuant to state legislation that was
25 recently enacted that purports to expand

2 the standing of parties to bring such
3 lawsuits. We have a lawsuit pending in
4 the Commonwealth Court to challenge the
5 constitutionality of that state
6 legislation, and we feel pretty good that
7 we're going to win that case and that the
8 NRA will ultimately not have standing to
9 bring these lawsuits.

10 However, we can never be sure
11 that we're going to succeed on such an
12 endeavor, and so the legislation you have
13 before you would, I believe, put the City
14 in a much better position to defend some
15 very important legislation that this
16 Council has passed over the past few
17 years concerning firearms.

18 The reality is, the state has a
19 statute which prohibits the City from
20 regulating the possession or ownership or
21 use of firearms, the preemption
22 provisions, which has caused us all kinds
23 of problems. We have a number of very
24 important bills which we believe we can
25 successfully defend in court against an

2 inevitable challenge, most notably the
3 requirement that people report their lost
4 or stolen firearms to the police within
5 48 hours.

6 We have also a whole series of
7 ordinances on the books, most of which
8 date back prior to any of the Committee
9 members' service on the Council, which if
10 they remain on the books will make it
11 more difficult for us to defend the
12 current -- the lawsuits -- the NRA has
13 already filed one lawsuit and we would
14 anticipate further lawsuits if the
15 legislation in the state is allowed to
16 expand the standing.

17 So we would -- the Law
18 Department is recommending that the
19 Council suspend the effectiveness of
20 various ordinances relating to firearms
21 so that they don't create an unnecessary
22 distraction when we're defending some of
23 the very important work that this Council
24 has done.

25 Having said that, I would like

2 to make one modification to my testimony
3 and perhaps an amendment to the bill
4 itself. On further reflection -- I
5 worked closely with Council President
6 Clarke's office in preparing this bill,
7 but on further reflection, we've
8 recommended in Section 2 of the bill, the
9 very last page, to repeal -- in its
10 current form, the bill would repeal the
11 Mayor's authority in a state of emergency
12 to prohibit this possession of firearms
13 on the streets. On reflection, I'm not
14 prepared to say that in a true emergency
15 the City of Philadelphia and the Mayor
16 shouldn't have that power if, God forbid,
17 it were needed. And so I have
18 distributed to the Committee a proposed
19 amendment where we would delete Section 2
20 of the bill and not repeal that. And
21 even though the NRA has in fact included
22 in its current lawsuit a challenge to
23 that provision, I'm very proud to be able
24 to defend that on behalf of the City.

25 That concludes my testimony.

2 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: All I'll
3 say is sometimes some people are hard to
4 understand, sir. Not you. And that
5 amendment will be offered in the meeting.
6 So we have it and we'll be offering it.

7 MR. FEDER: Thank you,
8 Mr. Chairman.

9 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Any
10 questions for Mr. Feder?

11 (No response.)

12 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Seeing
13 none, thank you very much. Thank you for
14 all the work you're doing on this very
15 important issue.

16 MR. FEDER: You guys do the
17 work. I'm just trying to do my best to
18 defend it.

19 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Well, you
20 back us up.

21 MR. FEDER: I think it's
22 important work.

23 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
24 you.

25 THE CLERK: Shira Goodman.

4 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Good
5 afternoon.

6 MS. GOODMAN: Good afternoon.

7 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Please
8 identify yourself and proceed.

9 MS. GOODMAN: My name is Shira
10 Goodman. I'm the Executive Director of
11 CeaseFirePA. Thank you for having me
12 here today. We wanted to thank
13 Philadelphia for standing strong and
14 bringing the challenge to Act 192, which
15 gives the standing to the NRA and other
16 groups to sue our cities. We're very
17 proud to be working with Mr. Feder and
18 the Solicitor's Office on that lawsuit
19 and are very proud that Philadelphia will
20 be defending many of its ordinances. So
21 we thank you for the work you did in
22 passing them and the Solicitor's Office
23 for defending them.

24 We knew, of course, that
25 Philadelphia would be a target, as usual,

2 leading the way in trying to protect its
3 community and stay strong here. And so
4 the effort today is to make that case
5 even stronger, and we support that.

6 The one amendment that we would
7 ask you to consider is, there is a
8 provision that is in fact being
9 challenged by the NRA that does give
10 Philadelphia police broader authority to
11 take -- to ban possession of guns by
12 people who have an active Protection from
13 Abuse Order. We know that that is being
14 challenged under the current lawsuit, but
15 we would urge Council to think about
16 that. That is not something that
17 protects the rights of law-abiding gun
18 owners. Including that in their
19 complaint, the NRA has made clear that
20 this suit is not about the Second
21 Amendment or the rights of law-abiding
22 gun owners. It's about challenging any
23 city authority to keep its people safe.
24 And so we would urge you to give special
25 consideration to that, and thank you

2 again for all the steps you've taken to
3 act and Harrisburg's failure to act to
4 give you the tools you need, and
5 CeaseFirePA continues to stand ready and
6 willing to help in any way we can.

7 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
8 you, Ms. Goodman, and certainly thank you
9 for all the work CeaseFire is doing.
10 It's something that's extremely
11 important, obviously, and I know you're
12 up against some tough opposition there.
13 So, again, thanks for everything you're
14 doing.

15 What you raised on that one --
16 the issue with the Protection against
17 Abuse, is that something that's in here
18 now or in the bill?

19 MS. GOODMAN: So currently in
20 the Protection from Abuse Act, judges
21 have the discretion to require surrender
22 of firearms. It is not mandatory.
23 Though, of course, that's something we're
24 working with our partners in the domestic
25 violence community to change. But in the

2 Philadelphia ordinance, there is a little
3 more authority in Philadelphia than the
4 state provides. Again, obviously you
5 have to defer to counsel, but I think
6 it's very clear that because that's one
7 of the few things that the NRA did
8 challenge, I think it shows really what
9 these lawsuits are all about, and I think
10 for Philadelphia to stand strong there,
11 certainly there will be time during the
12 pendency of the Commonwealth Court case
13 should that not succeed and you are
14 called upon to defend the lawsuit in full
15 to revisit the idea.

16 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Okay.

17 All right. Thank you. Thank you very
18 much.

19 I'm sorry. Any questions?

20 (No response.)

21 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Seeing
22 none, again, thank you for all you do.

23 MS. GOODMAN: Thank you.

24 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Is there
25 anyone else here to testify on Bill No.

3 (No response.)

4 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Seeing
5 none, we will move to our second bill
6 today. Ms. Marconi, please read the
7 title.

8 THE CLERK: Bill No. 150001, an
9 ordinance amending Chapter 17-2100 of The
10 Philadelphia Code, entitled "Conflicts
11 Counsel Contracts," by requiring that
12 certain City contracts dealing with the
13 provision of services for indigent legal
14 defense may only be made when permitted
15 by ordinance where the contractor is the
16 Defender Association of Philadelphia, the
17 Support Center for Child Advocates, or
18 Community Legal Services; all under
19 certain terms and conditions.

20 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
21 you. Our first witness?

22 THE CLERK: Michael Resnick.
23 (Witness approached witness
24 table.)

25 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE:

2 Mr. Resnick, before you get started,
3 Councilman O'Brien, the prime sponsor of
4 this bill, would like to make a
5 statement.

6 MR. RESNICK: I'd be surprised
7 if he didn't.

8 COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: Thank you,
9 Chairman Greenlee.

10 The right to counsel is a
11 fundamental procedural safeguard
12 guaranteed under the Bill of Rights to
13 all persons accused of a crime who are
14 unable to afford a lawyer. In the
15 landmark case Gideon versus Wainwright,
16 the U.S. Supreme Court recognized the
17 fundamental role that legal
18 representation plays in a fair criminal
19 justice system.

20 In November of 2013, I
21 introduced two pieces of legislation that
22 made changes to the Philadelphia Home
23 Rule Charter. Bill No. 130851 was a
24 ballot question. Resolution 130861 was
25 the accompanying resolution. The Charter

2 amendment was approved by a majority of
3 voters in May of 2014. Before this
4 amendment to the Charter, Section 2-309
5 of the Charter, titled "Leases and
6 Contracts," stated that Council may by
7 ordinance authorize the leasing of real
8 estate for more than one year and the
9 contracting for personal property to be
10 supplied or for services to be rendered
11 over a period of more than one year. As
12 a result, City Council had no authority
13 to review contracts the Administration
14 enters into when the length of the
15 contract is for one year or less. This
16 is an approach to government that I agree
17 with. I do not believe that every
18 contract should require City Council
19 approval. However, I do strongly believe
20 that any contract dealing with an
21 individual's constitutional right is
22 important enough to require Council
23 approval.

24 Furthermore, these contracts
25 are of such importance that an exception

2 to the Charter was not only required but
3 was in the best interest of the City of
4 Philadelphia.

5 The right to counsel is a
6 constitutionally protected right. The
7 contract the Administration issued an RFP
8 for and plans to eventually sign deals
9 directly with this constitutionally
10 protected right. This Charter amendment
11 does not prohibit the Administration from
12 entering into a contract. It just
13 requires a public forum to be able to
14 review the contract and get answers
15 before any contract is signed. Before
16 the passage of this legislation, there
17 was no allowance for Council or public
18 input.

19 The amendment to the Home Rule
20 Charter requires that all contracts for
21 the rendering of services for a year or
22 less that involve the expenditures of
23 more than \$100,000 for the purpose of
24 providing legal representation and
25 related services for the indigent may

2 only be made when permitted by ordinance.

3 This provision applies to the contract's
4 renewals and extensions.

5 In order to make the amendment
6 as narrow as possible, so as not to open
7 the floodgates of Council approval for
8 every contract, I did the following:

9 One, put a monetary threshold
10 of over \$100,000 and, two, specifically
11 state that this amendment not only
12 applies to contracts dealing with the
13 legal representation of the indigent, but
14 the monetary amount is necessary to make
15 sure that only large contracts are
16 considered. As a result, this excludes
17 individual private attorneys who are
18 currently providing legal representation
19 to the indigent by being court-appointed
20 conflict counsel. However, the monetary
21 amount includes the Philadelphia
22 Defender's Association, Support Center
23 for Child Advocates, and Community Legal
24 Services.

25 Because these organizations

2 have been contracting with the City for
3 many years, they are exempt from the
4 review requirement unless Council
5 provides an ordinance to the contrary.
6 This bill, 150001, revokes the exemption
7 of reviewing contracts entered into with
8 the City -- with the Philadelphia
9 Defender's Association, Child Support
10 Center, and Community Legal Services only
11 to the extent that those contracts, in
12 whole or in part, are related to legal
13 representation of indigent individuals in
14 matters requiring the use of conflict
15 counsel.

16 For instance, if the
17 Administration chooses to enter into a
18 contract with the Philadelphia Defender's
19 Association for the representation of the
20 indigent, as they have for many years
21 now, Council does not need to review that
22 contract. However, if the contract, in
23 whole or in part, deals with conflict
24 counsel services, an area of work new to
25 the Defender Association, then under this

2 piece of legislation Council has the
3 right and duty to review that portion of
4 the contract.

5 The intent of this legislation
6 is to ensure that standards are being met
7 and adequate representation will be given
8 to those indigent individuals requiring
9 the services of conflict counsel.

10 I believe the Defender's
11 Association provides quality
12 representation to the indigent population
13 of the City of Philadelphia. However, I
14 also believe that adding a new conflict
15 counsel office to their responsibilities
16 warrants an open and transparent process,
17 including Council input in a public
18 forum.

19 Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

20 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
21 you, Councilman.

22 Any other comments?

23 (No response.)

24 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Seeing
25 none, again, Mr. Resnick, identify

2 yourself.

3 MR. RESNICK: Good afternoon,
4 Chairman Greenlee, Councilman O'Brien,
5 members of the Committee. I'm Michael
6 Resnick, Director of Public Safety for
7 the City. It's a pleasure to appear
8 before you to testify on Bill 150001.

9 The Administration shares the
10 sponsor's concerns for the rights of the
11 criminally accused as well as those faced
12 with mental health or dependency
13 proceedings. This mutual commitment is
14 unchanging.

15 Respectfully, however, the
16 Administration does not believe this bill
17 advances this commitment. Its sole
18 policy change is to require an ordinance
19 before the City can contract for conflict
20 counsel services with three longstanding,
21 long-established, highly respected, and
22 professionally impeccable organizations -
23 the Defender Association, the Support
24 Center for Child Advocates, and Community
25 Legal Services. These three

2 organizations are at the top of their
3 field nationally, and any proposal they
4 make for indigent defense or conflict
5 counsel is, consistent with their
6 consummate professionalism, apt to be 100
7 percent sound.

8 As members of the Committee may
9 recall, under last May's indigent defense
10 Charter amendment, essentially all
11 contracts for indigent defense services,
12 not just conflict counsel, must be
13 authorized by ordinance. This amendment
14 made specific exceptions from the
15 ordinance requirement for the Defender
16 Association of Philadelphia, the Support
17 Center for Child Advocates, and Community
18 Legal Services. Indigent defense
19 contracts with these particular
20 organizations would not need an
21 ordinance.

22 This bill would revoke that
23 exception for these three organizations,
24 but only when the contract is for
25 conflict counsel services or includes

2 those services to some degree. These
3 entities would still be able to contract
4 for their core functions absent Council
5 approval, and that appears to be by
6 design inasmuch as the quality of their
7 services simply is not an issue.

8 Thus, in the absence of the
9 bill, contracts for conflict counsel
10 services proposed by the Defender
11 Association, the Support Center or CLS
12 would not typically require an ordinance,
13 but contracts with any other provider
14 would require one. With this bill now,
15 all contracts for conflict counsel
16 services, including and perhaps
17 especially those with the Defender,
18 Support Center, and CLS, are subject to
19 the ordinance requirement.

20 But the truly shared goal is
21 assurance of high-quality legal
22 representation worthy of the Sixth
23 Amendment guarantee of the right to
24 counsel, whether provided by a primary
25 provider or conflict counsel. And

2 organizations like the Defender, Support
3 Center, and CLS are unlikely to present a
4 problem in any event. To the extent they
5 may propose an approach to conflict
6 counsel in addition to providing primary
7 representation, we have every reason to
8 expect them to undertake their
9 obligations in a sound, ethical manner.
10 Indeed, as David Carroll of the Sixth
11 Amendment Center testified before this
12 Committee, the model of service delivery
13 is not the primary issue. It's that it
14 meets appropriate standards. This is a
15 statement I believe the sponsor would
16 agree with.

17 And indeed in the case of
18 conflict counsel, the sponsor's companion
19 legislation to the indigent defense
20 Charter amendment, Code 17-2101, requires
21 a system of financial and performance
22 auditing. All conflict counsel providers
23 will be subject to it, including for any
24 conflict counsel services they provide,
25 the Defender Association, Support Center,

2 and CLS. This is a help, although
3 17-2101 will apply even without the
4 present bill.

5 We remain open to discussing
6 more comprehensive ways to provide
7 oversight and protect the rights of the
8 accused and others in our justice system,
9 not merely with respect to the conflict
10 counsel system.

11 I'd be happy to answer any
12 questions the Committee may have.

13 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
14 you, Mr. Resnick.

15 Let me just be clear. As
16 Councilman O'Brien said, and I think
17 everybody agrees, the three entities
18 involved in this bill do quality work.
19 Nobody is questioning them. I guess my
20 one question to you would be, but what's
21 the problem with Council reviewing that?
22 I mean, nobody is questioning them.
23 Nobody is saying they don't do their job.
24 But I guess we're -- I don't want to
25 speak for Councilman O'Brien, but we're

2 sort of closing a kind of loop here.

3 MR. RESNICK: Well, I guess,
4 Councilman, as was stated in the
5 testimony, there is no requirement that
6 the contracts of these organizations for
7 their underlying core work be reviewed,
8 and that's the bulk of their work. Now
9 what we're saying is we want to bring
10 forward a contract for just a very small
11 amount of the work that they don't even
12 do yet. We don't even have contracts yet
13 with any one of these organizations to do
14 this work yet. I mean, so if we're
15 trusting them, if we're trusting the
16 Defender Association, we're trusting
17 Community Legal Services, we're trusting
18 the Support Center for Child Advocates to
19 do their core work, the bulk of their
20 work, without coming to Council and
21 having those contracts reviewed, because
22 these are impeccable organizations and
23 they provide top-quality representation,
24 very ethical, then why should we do it
25 for a very small portion of the work that

2 none of them even have yet?

3 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: I guess
4 we could go back and forth. I guess the
5 answer to that is, it's just a small part
6 and it might not even come to fruition
7 that we have to, but it's just a
8 possibility. But, again, there's
9 certainly no intended detriment to any of
10 these organizations.

11 Any questions, comments?

12 (No response.)

13 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
14 you. Thank you, Mr. Resnick.

15 MR. RESNICK: Thank you. Thank
16 you, Councilman. Thank you.

17 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: First of
18 all, before I recognize Councilman
19 O'Brien again who is going to put a
20 letter into the record, is there anyone
21 else here who wants to testify on this
22 bill?

23 (No response.)

24 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Seeing
25 none, Councilman O'Brien.

3 Mr. Chairman. David Carroll, the
4 Executive Director of the Sixth Amendment
5 Center, was going to testify here today.

7 continue to have snow and nobody is
8 getting out. So I would like to submit
9 his testimony for the record.

10 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
11 you. And that will be made part of the
12 record. I believe everyone has a copy of
13 that letter. Thank you very much,
14 Councilman.

15 Please let the record reflect
16 that the Vice Chair of the Committee,
17 Councilman Kenney, is also present. I
18 just want to recognize all the efforts
19 the Vice Chair has put over these years
20 in this Committee and certainly helping
21 me get started and keep going.

22 Councilman Kenney.

23 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: I was on
24 the phone when Mr. Resnick sat down, but
25 I just wanted to make sure I said

2 good-bye to Mike Resnick from all the
3 times he's been in here and I guess we've
4 had our moments, our tete-a-tetes, but I
5 want to let you know how much I respect
6 you and admire the work you're doing.

7 MR. RESNICK: Thank you,
8 Councilman. It's been fun.

9 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: You left
10 the table before I had a chance to say
11 it, so thanks.

12 MR. RESNICK: I'll see you
13 after.

14 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: I know.

15 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: I think
16 the record will say that Mr. Resnick said
17 it was fun. I don't know if he really
18 means that or not or you're just being
19 nice today.

20 Any other questions or
21 comments?

22 (No response.)

23 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Again,
24 anyone else here to testify on Bill No.
25 150001?
