2 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.

3 I understand that state law currently
4 requires that the following announcement
5 be made at the beginning of every remote

10 to make these remote hearings possible.

11 Instructions for how the public

15 notices that are published in the Daily
16 News, Legal Intelligencer and Inquirer
17 prior to the hearings and can also be
18 found on PHLCouncil.com. I now note
19 that the hour has come.

20 Madam Clerk, will you please
21 call the roll to take attendance.
22 Members that are in attendance will
23 please indicate that you are present
24 when your name is called. And also,
25 please say a few brief words when

1 responding so that your image may be
2 displayed when you speak on screen --
3 may be displayed on screen when you
4 speak.

5 Madam Clerk.

6 THE CLERK: Councilmember

8 COUNCILMAN HENON: Good
9 morning, Madam Chair. Good morning,
10 colleagues.

11 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
12 morning.

13 THE CLERK: Councilmember Oh.
14 (No response.)

15 THE CLERK: Councilmember Gym.

16 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Good
17 morning, Madam Chair. Good morning,
18 colleagues. I am present.

19 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
20 morning.

21 THE CLERK: Councilmember
22 Green.

23 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Good
24 morning, Madam Chair. Good morning,
25 colleagues. I am present. Looking

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1 forward to today's conversation.

2 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
3 morning.

4 THE CLERK: Councilmember
5 Thomas.

6 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
7 morning, Madam chair. Good morning,
8 colleagues. I'm present.

9 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Morning.

10 THE CLERK: Councilmember
11 Brooks.

12 COUNCILWOMAN BROOKS: Good
13 morning, Madam Chair. Good morning,
14 colleagues. I'm present.

15 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
16 morning.

17 THE CLERK: Chair Bass.

18 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: And I am
19 present. Thank you.

20 A quorum of the Committee is
21 present and this hearing is now called
22 to order. And this is the public
23 hearing of the Committee on Public
24 Health and Human Services regarding Bill
25 No. 210510 and Bill No. 210511.

1 Madam Clerk, will you please
2 read the title of the bill and the
3 resolution.

4 THE CLERK: Bill No. 210510,
5 amending Chapter 6-200 of The
6 Philadelphia Code, entitled
7 "Preventative Medicine," by adding a new
8 section offering gift certificates to
9 citizens and property owners at
10 Philadelphia who receive vaccinations
11 for COVID-19 in order to incentivize
12 immunizations against the disease, all
13 under certain terms and conditions.

14 Bill No. 210511, amending
15 Chapter 6-200 of The Philadelphia Code,
16 entitled "Preventive Medicine," by
17 adding a new section offering vouchers
18 for rebates on City gas and water
19 charges to citizens and property owners
20 of Philadelphia who receive vaccination
21 for COVID-19 in order to incentivize
22 immunizations against the disease, all
23 under certain terms and conditions.

24 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.
25 Before we begin to hear testimony from

1 the witnesses we have for today,
2 everyone who has been invited to the
3 meeting to testify should be aware that
4 this public hearing is being recorded.
5 Because the hearing is public,
6 participants and viewers have no
7 reasonable expectation of privacy. By
8 continuing to be in the meeting, you are
9 consenting to being recorded.

10 Additionally, prior to
11 recognizing Members for the questions or
12 comments they have for witnesses, I will
13 note for the record at this time that we
14 will use the chat feature available in
15 Microsoft Teams to allow Members to
16 signify that they wish to be recognized.
17 In order to comply with the Sunshine
18 Act, the chat feature must only be used
19 for this purpose.

20 And before I call on the Clerk
21 to call the first panel, would any of my
22 colleagues like to make an opening
23 statement or comment?

24 (No response.)

25 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Okay.

1 Seeing none, Madam Clerk, please call
2 the first panel of witnesses.

3 THE CLERK: Our first witness
4 is Cheryl Bettigole, Acting Health
5 Commissioner.

6 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.
7 Is the Commissioner available?

8 DR. BETTIGOLE: Yes. Good
9 morning.

10 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
11 morning. How are you?

12 DR. BETTIGOLE: Good. How are
13 you?

14 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Very well.
15 Please state your name for the record
16 and proceed with your testimony.

17 DR. BETTIGOLE: So good
18 morning, Chairmember Bass and the
19 members of the Public Health and Human
20 Services Committee. I am Dr. Cheryl
21 Bettigole, the Acting Health
22 Commissioner for the City of
23 Philadelphia. Thank you for allowing me
24 to give testimony on Bill No. 210510 and
25 Bill No. 210511, which if enacted would

1 provide authorization for the City to
2 create certain incentives for COVID-19
3 vaccinations for (inaudible).

4 Although the use of incentives
5 is an evidence-based strategy for
6 increasing vaccination rates and is
7 supported by the Centers for Disease
8 Control and Prevention and although the
9 Philadelphia Department of Public Health
10 strongly supports the use of incentives
11 to help increase vaccination rates among
12 Philadelphians, the Administration
13 recommends that City Council hold
14 temporarily Bill No. 210511 to allow
15 time for current incentives to roll out
16 and to assess their impact.

17 Philadelphia has been making
18 progress toward containing the COVID-19
19 pandemic and toward greater equity in
20 our containment efforts. To date, 67.4
21 percent of Philadelphia residents aged
22 18 and over had at least one COVID-19
23 vaccine and 52 percent of residents 18
24 and over are fully vaccinated recently
25 in dramatic drops in case rates and

1 hospitalizations.

2 Our vaccination rates compare
3 favorably with the national rate of 64
4 percent of adults who have received at
5 least one shot and with the rates of
6 other large cities, for example New York
7 City at 64 percent of adults and Chicago
8 at 64.1 percent of adults. Though
9 focused efforts together with many
10 partners through racial disparities for
11 Philadelphians 45 and over have closed,
12 but we still have a great deal of work
13 to do to reach younger Black City
14 residents.

15 Our data team has worked to
16 identify the census tracts with the
17 lowest vaccination rates, and we've
18 worked with partners throughout the City
19 and our team to place brick-and-mortar
20 mobile and pop-up vaccine clinics in
21 those locations. Community vaccine
22 providers, including of course the Black
23 Doctors COVID Consortium have been
24 invaluable partners in this work and the
25 assistance of FEMA the Pennsylvania

1 National Guard vaccinating large numbers
2 of City residents at the Convention
3 Center and at Esperanza greatly expanded
4 our ability to reach City residents.
5 But despite all of that work, we know
6 that there are people in Philadelphia
7 who are on the fence about getting
8 vaccinated and haven't yet gotten their
9 shots.

10 According to community surveys
11 by Philly Counts, about 13 percent of
12 Philadelphians say they will not get a
13 vaccine. The remaining people who have
14 not yet been vaccinated are still
15 waiting, some for more data, some
16 because of concerns about side effects
17 in this work, and some for just the
18 right opportunity. This is the time for
19 us to reach those who are still waiting.

20 The work we do this summer will
21 determine whether we still have pockets
22 of unvaccinated people in North, West
23 and Northeast Philadelphia, pockets
24 where a new surge of infections could
25 start in the fall. It will determine

1 whether Philadelphia still has people
2 who remain vulnerable because we have
3 not yet found the right way to reach
4 them. Incentives will not motivate all
5 of them, but they could make the
6 difference for those who are still
7 saying yes but not yet.

8 Incentives provided by
9 community partners including our local
10 sports teams have helped to bring people
11 to our sites. We're working with the
12 University of Pennsylvania on a vaccine
13 incentive sweepstakes designed by
14 behavioral scientists that the
15 Administration announced yesterday.
16 We're very excited about that
17 announcement and about its potential to
18 further increase vaccination rates in
19 the City. The sweepstakes was designed
20 by the Center for Health Incentives and
21 Behavioral Economics at the University
22 of Pennsylvania, which is hiring a
23 third-party sweepstakes vendor to
24 implement the sweepstakes.

25 It will involve weekly drawings

1 beginning on June 21st, with two
2 \$50,000, six \$5,000 prizes -- I'm sorry,
3 that's actually four \$5,000 prizes and
4 six \$1,000 prizes each week for three
5 weeks. One week before each week we're
6 drawing a new selected zip code which
7 will be chosen at random from
8 Philadelphia zip codes with the lowest
9 vaccination rates as of May 2021. Half
10 of the subsequent weeks' lottery winners
11 will come from that selected zip code
12 and the rest will be drawn from the
13 City's remaining 47 zip codes.

14 The selected zip code will be
15 announced a week before each drawing,
16 and the residents will be informed that
17 they have especially high odds compared
18 to other Philadelphia residents of
19 winning a prize of the following week's
20 sweepstakes if they receive their COVID-
21 19 vaccine by the day before the
22 drawing. Any winnings that have not
23 been allocated by July 8th will be given
24 out in a bonus sweepstakes by July 9th
25 following the usual rules. So half to

1 selected zip code residents, half to
2 residents of all other zip codes.

3 And for the first time ever,
4 the CDC recently announced that it will
5 allow use for grant funds for incentives
6 for vaccination. This is usually
7 completely forbidden. The Public Health
8 Department is currently working on a
9 revision request that would allow us to
10 take advantage of this new policy with
11 the plan to use \$2.5 million for grant
12 funds for vaccine incentives, including
13 for gift certificates. We look forward
14 to working with City Council as we roll
15 out an incentive plan that will continue
16 to (inaudible).

17 While we're strongly supportive
18 of incentives and are excited to see
19 City Council's enthusiasm to encourage
20 vaccinations, the Administration has
21 concerns about Bill 210511 in terms of
22 equitable delivery and implementation
23 time. We believe that our current
24 incentive plans are strong and will meet
25 Council's intent to use incentives to

1 maximize vaccination rates. Thank you
2 for the opportunity to offer testimony
3 on these bills and for your partnership
4 in ending this pandemic for all
5 Philadelphians. I'm happy to answer any
6 questions.

7 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you,
8 Commissioner. Thank you for your
9 testimony.

10 Are there any questions from
11 members of the Committee?

12 (No response.)

13 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Okay.
14 Seeing that there are no questions --
15 oh, Councilman Bobby Henon.

16 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,
17 Madam Chair.

18 And good morning, Acting
19 Commissioner, and thank you for stepping
20 up to the task that you have, godspeed,
21 I say that with humor. Keep doing the
22 good work. I just had some questions
23 and they're dating back several months
24 and even to the end of 2020. So the
25 surveys that we're talking about now,

1 the surveys we've been hearing basically
2 mirror the surveys that were early on
3 when the vaccination plan was first
4 submitted to the CDC and the onset of
5 the process of putting together the Comp
6 Plan for Philadelphia and how it
7 vaccinates its citizens.

8 How come things haven't changed
9 in your opinion? So we're incentivizing
10 now, and don't get me wrong, I think we
11 should for the simple fact that the
12 rates are what the rates are, right.
13 There's certain parts of our City and
14 communities that haven't been
15 vaccinated. Was it lack of execution of
16 our Comp Plan that was supposed to start
17 in January?

18 I just don't know why we are
19 where we are at this point when there
20 was a robust plan that was submitted to
21 the CDC back in November, we had our
22 first hearing with this Committee back
23 in November, there's been a lot of
24 controversy back and forth on who's
25 getting vaccinated, how they're getting

1 vaccinated, how they're being
2 communicated with. I'm just a little
3 curious on why we're in a similar
4 position other than 52 percent of adults
5 are currently fully vaccinated.

6 So my question is what's going
7 to change in addition to the incentives
8 on communicating in the hard-to-reach
9 neighborhoods and neighborhoods who have
10 traditionally had distrust with
11 government and vaccines?

12 DR. BETTIGOLE: So it's a big
13 and important question. I would not
14 necessarily agree that nothing's
15 changed. So I was not part of the
16 vaccine effort for the first few months,
17 but was brought on at the beginning of
18 February with a group of other folks
19 just to get a bigger deeper team. And
20 one of the things we did at that point
21 was really to take a data-driven equity
22 approach and to say we need to figure
23 out -- initially, we used zip codes and
24 then we moved to the census tract, which
25 is the smaller level analysis, where are

1 we missing people, and locate vaccine
2 opportunities and information in those
3 places.

4 And if you look at the
5 week-by-week analysis of who is getting
6 vaccinated in Philadelphia, it is
7 majority Black and Latino residents who
8 are getting vaccinated week by week now,
9 so I think we've made big differences
10 there. We are seeing the needle move
11 slowly in terms of acceptance of
12 vaccine. When Philly Counts does those
13 surveys, people are gradually shifting.

14 I think one of the things that
15 shifts people most effectively is when
16 they know other people who've gotten
17 vaccinated. So one of the reasons that
18 I'm so interested in incentives, it's
19 not that I believe that everyone is
20 going to be motivated by an incentive,
21 but if we reach one person in the family
22 or one person by block with an incentive
23 and then that person talks to the people
24 they know, that's going to help us to
25 move the needle the rest of the way.

1 So we are taking a very
2 different position. In terms of our
3 disparities by race and by ethnicity,
4 they have closed with the exception of
5 the younger Black residents, and some of
6 that may be that we were too effective
7 in saying please wait your turn, you're
8 not at risk to that younger group
9 because now we're really trying to reach
10 them. But for people 45 and over, the
11 disparities have really closed
12 remarkably so we made some progress
13 there, and then we just need to reach
14 everybody. But there is a big
15 canvassing effort now through Philly
16 Counts just getting out to
17 neighborhoods, getting information to
18 people and then getting the vaccine into
19 neighborhoods as well.

20 COUNCILMAN HENON: Well, that's
21 good to know about Philly Counts. And
22 by no means do I -- I know that you were
23 not a part of it and I appreciate it,
24 and I know your history with childhood
25 obesity and your longevity with the

1 Department and doing a lot of good
2 things, so I do appreciate that and look
3 forward to continuing to work with you.

4 I was talking about we have
5 identified from the onset where our
6 challenges are going to be and I just
7 don't think we met our communication and
8 outreach goals that we needed to do from
9 the beginning. All right. We got
10 derailed, things were a little
11 confusing. I think we're just trying to
12 figure out the execution of the plan and
13 the delivery of the plan as we go.

14 So I guess it's more of an ask,
15 can we increase our communication plan
16 in these neighborhoods and to these
17 communities where there is a gap because
18 it is incredibly important? And the
19 numbers really haven't changed from
20 early on who is going to get vaccinated
21 or who will absolutely not get
22 vaccinated. And in the middle of those
23 15 to 20 percent who are just going to
24 wait and see the effects on others and
25 just the time for trust, and that only

1 comes with as you said vaccinating their
2 neighbor, their uncle, their aunt, their
3 brother, their sister, their mother, but
4 that goes with a real robust
5 communication and education plan. So I
6 feel very, very strong with that.

7 Our initial plan was an
8 18-month plan. It was fast-tracked
9 because of the federal government and
10 the availability of our vaccines
11 increased dramatically as you had stated
12 in your testimony. So in the end here,
13 I would just ask that the Department
14 increases the communication plan. I
15 still haven't even heard where we are
16 with any of the community-based
17 organization RFPs. They held up on it
18 last I heard. Have you brought more
19 people on board to get in these
20 neighborhoods where there are trusted
21 community organizations or folks that
22 people can rely on to reach that 15 to
23 20 percent of our population?

24 DR. BETTIGOLE: Yes. I
25 completely agree with what you're saying

1 about the importance of grassroots
2 community outreach, the direct
3 communication to people in neighborhoods
4 as well as mass communications. All of
5 that is critical. A lot of that work is
6 going to happen through our partnership
7 with Philly Counts and really staffing
8 up and getting people out, getting
9 trusted communicators out into
10 neighborhoods. I'm blocking on the
11 second part of your question. I'm so
12 sorry.

13 COUNCILMAN HENON: It was the
14 community organizations and --

15 DR. BETTIGOLE: Oh, yes.

16 COUNCILMAN HENON: -- the
17 communication plan to help getting to
18 certain communities and to the general
19 public overall.

20 DR. BETTIGOLE: Yeah. So 11
21 community organizations were funded
22 through the RFP and are out doing
23 vaccinations, and I think that's really
24 helped to extend the effort into
25 neighborhoods. And one of the other

1 things we've done is for groups that
2 weren't successful for the RFP, because
3 that process of becoming a vaccine
4 provider for CDC is pretty complex, but
5 we've been able to do some partnerships
6 with some of those organizations to do
7 pop-up clinics to reach the
8 neighborhoods, and they have the
9 connections to bring people in. So
10 we've been getting some great feedback
11 on those efforts as well as a way of
12 just really connecting with people
13 through the organizations they know and
14 trust.

15 COUNCILMAN HENON: Great.
16 Well, thank you. Good luck with
17 ensuring that the plan gets executed
18 with high integrity and the right
19 information. Anything that we can do as
20 Councilmembers to help this issue, feel
21 free to circulate any of the information
22 that you have and we'll certainly get
23 them out to our platforms and our
24 communities, so thank you.

25 DR. BETTIGOLE: Right. Thank

1 you very much.

2 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you,
3 Councilman Henon, for your questions.
4 Very important and very poignant. And
5 we thank you for your time and attention
6 towards this matter.

7 Commissioner, I'm going to take
8 your testimony as being for both
9 bills -- hold on one second -- for Bill
10 No. 210510 and the companion Bill
11 210511. So there's no separate
12 testimony; am I right?

13 DR. BETTIGOLE: That's correct.

14 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Okay. All
15 right.

16 Chair recognizes Councilman
17 Thomas.

18 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you,
19 Councilmember Bass, thank you Madam
20 Chair.

21 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.

22 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: I just want
23 to take a minute to say thank you to
24 Councilmember Henon for his line of
25 questioning. I think it's extremely

1 important. He just communicated
2 concerns that we've been trying to
3 stress to the Administration since the
4 start of the pandemic.

5 I also just wanted to make
6 myself available to try to help with the
7 demographic that you're saying you're
8 struggling with. I talk to these young
9 people on a consistent basis and if
10 there's any way we can provide
11 education, right, because incentives are
12 great, I think that that's one good
13 mechanism, but there is a lot of
14 misinformation being presented out
15 there, especially through social media,
16 and we're not doing a good job of
17 combating that. We're doing a good job
18 of advertising and incentivizing, but
19 we're not doing a good job of providing
20 facts and information. So anything I
21 can do to help like my colleague said, I
22 just want to be here for support.

23 Thank you, Madam Chair.

24 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you,
25 Councilman. And thank you for

1 recognizing and putting it out there,
2 that there's so much misinformation,
3 particularly on social media, which I
4 think we should abolish all together.
5 But there's just a lot of misinformation
6 and it travels, it travels very quickly,
7 so the more we can get in front of it
8 and make sure that people have their
9 facts, the better off we all are.

10 Are there any additional
11 comments from members of the Committee?

12 (No response.)

13 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: And I don't
14 see any for this witness. Thank you
15 very much, Commissioner.

16 Are there any additional
17 witnesses to testify or anyone who would
18 like to speak on these bills whose name
19 has not been called?

20 (No response.)

21 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: There being
22 no further questions from members of the
23 Committee and no other witness to
24 testify, I'll ask again if there's
25 anyone else who is present in the

1 hearing whose name we have failed to
2 call and that wishes to offer testimony
3 on the bills being considered today?

4 (No response.)

5 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: And hearing
6 none, I want to thank the Commissioner
7 for her participation. We value your
8 opinion, and I now invite you to please
9 disconnect from the meeting before we go
10 into our public meeting, and we will now
11 pause the proceedings briefly as the
12 Commissioner exits. Okay. I see she
13 has exited.

14 This concludes the public
15 hearing of the Committee, and we'll now
16 go into the public meeting to consider
17 the action to be taken on the bill
18 before this Committee today.

19 Madam Clerk, will you please
20 call the roll to take attendance.
21 Members that are in attendance, please
22 indicate that you are present when your
23 name is called and also say a few brief
24 words so that your picture and image
25 will be displayed on screen as you

12 A quorum of Committee members is
13 present.

14 And the Chair recognizes
15 Councilmember Henon for a motion on Bill
16 No. 210510.

17 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,
18 Madam Chair.

19 I move that Bill No. 210510 be
20 reported out of Committee with a
21 favorable recommendation and further
22 move that the rules of Council be
23 suspended as to permit the first reading
24 of this bill at our next session of
25 Council. Can I get a second?

1 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Second.

2 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.

3 The Chair notes for the record that
4 Councilmember Gym has seconded the
5 motion. It's been moved and properly
6 seconded that Bill No. 210510 be
7 reported from this Committee with a
8 favorable recommendation and further
9 move that the rules of Council be
10 suspended to permit first reading of
11 this bill at the next session of
12 Council.

13 All of those in favor of the
14 motion will signify by saying aye.

15 (Aye.)

16 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Any
17 opposed?

18 (No response.)

19 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: The ayes
20 have it and the motion carries.

21 The Chair now recognizes
22 Councilmember Henon for a motion on Bill
23 No. 210511.

24 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,
25 Madam Chair.

1 I move that Bill No. 210511 be
2 reported from this Committee with a
3 favorable recommendation and further
4 move that the rules of Council be
5 suspended as to permit the first reading
6 of this bill at our next session of
7 Council.

8 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Can we get
9 a second?

10 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Second.

11 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you.
12 The Chair notes for the record that
13 Councilmember Green seconded the motion.
14 It's been moved and properly seconded
15 that Bill No. 210511 be reported from
16 this Committee with a favorable
17 recommendation and further move that the
18 rules of Council be suspended to permit
19 first reading of this bill at the next
20 session of Council.

21 All of those in favor of this
22 motion will signify by saying aye.

23 (Aye.)

24 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Does anyone
25 oppose?

10 be held on the calendar.
