4 Marconi, and I'm the Director of
5 Legislative Affairs for the
6 Department of Streets. I'm here
7 today to offer testimony on Bill
8 No. 250844, introduced by
9 Councilmember Bass.

10 This bill establishes a
11 one-way regulation on West
12 Lippincott Street between 22nd
13 Street and 23rd Street westbound.
14 The Department of Streets is not
15 opposed to this one-way regulation
16 and signs can be posted within 30
17 days. This concludes my testimony
18 and I'm pleased to answer any
19 questions you may have.

17 Code, entitled "Use of an Automated
18 Red Light Enforcement System to
19 Prevent Red Light Violations," by
20 authorizing the installation of red
21 light enforcement systems at the
22 intersection of School House Lane &
23 Henry Avenue, all under certain
24 terms and conditions.

1 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
2 you. Mr. Johnson, would you please
3 call the witnesses to testify on
4 this bill.

23 afternoon. As mentioned, I'm the
24 Deputy Executive Director of the

1 Philadelphia Parking Authority.

2 I'd like to thank the members of
3 this committee for allowing me to
4 testify today. I would also like
5 to thank Councilman Curtis Jones
6 for introducing this legislation.

7 I'm testifying in favor
8 of Bill No. 251068, which would add
9 an additional intersection to the
10 Redlight Camera program in the City
11 of Philadelphia. This intersection
12 will be located at School House
13 Lane and Henry Avenue. The
14 intersection of School House Lane
15 and Henry Avenue is a highly
16 traveled area, not only by
17 vehicles, but by pedestrians and
18 bicyclists.

19 This intersection is
20 located in the heart of Jefferson
21 University, along with many
22 residents with a high rate of
23 pedestrian crossing. The Authority
24 believes by installing a redlight

1 camera at this location, the
2 intersection will be much safer for
3 driving, riding and walking public.

4 I ask that the committee
5 give Bill No. 251068 a favorable
6 recommendation and request that the
7 rules be suspended to allow first
8 reading at the next Council
9 session. Thank you again for the
10 opportunity for allowing me to
11 testify.

10 This bill establishes
11 the following street directional
12 regulations: Adams Avenue between
13 Frankford Avenue and Ruan Street,
14 one-way westbound; Adams Avenue
15 between Church Street and Ruan
16 Street, two-way established; Adams
17 Avenue between Church Street and
18 Wingohocking Street, one-way
19 westbound; Leiper Street between
20 Adams Avenue and Ruan Street,
21 two-way established.

22 The Department of
23 Streets is not opposed to these
24 street directional regulations and

1 signs can be posted within 30 days.
2 This concludes my testimony. I'm
3 pleased to answer any questions you

11 testimony.

12 MS. MARCONI: Good
13 afternoon, Chairperson and members
14 of the Streets and Services
15 Committee. My name is Noelle
16 Marconi, and I'm the Director of
17 Legislative Affairs for the
18 Department of Streets. I'm here
19 today to offer testimony on Bill
20 No. 251102, introduced by
21 Councilmember Squilla.

22 This bill authorizes
23 Philip E. Harvey, the owner, to
24 install, own and maintain

1 encroachments in the nature of a
2 sidewalk cafe at Function Coffee
3 Labs, located at 1001 South 10th
4 Street. A total of two tables and
5 four seats for a sidewalk cafe will
6 be located along the property line
7 of 1001 South 10th Street.

8 The Department of
9 Streets is not opposed to this
10 proposed sidewalk cafe, as it will
11 maintain 6 feet of unobstructed
12 footway. This concludes my
13 testimony and I'm pleased to answer
14 any questions you may have.

15 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
16 you. I see Ms. Chiu. You're also
17 here to testify on this bill?

18 MS. CHIU: Yes.

1 the Committee on Streets and
2 Services. I'm Sarah Chiu, City
3 Planning Manager with the
4 Philadelphia City Planning
5 Commission. I'm here to testify on
6 Bill No. 251102, introduced by
7 Councilmember Squilla on December
8 11, 2025.

9 This bill will allow
10 Sidewalk Cafe at 1001 South 10th
11 Street a minimum of 6 feet of clear
12 sidewalk space is to remain after
13 the installation. This action
14 meets the city's Complete Streets
15 policy. The Planning Commission at
16 its meeting on January 15, 2026
17 recommended Bill No. 251102 for
18 approval. I'll be happy to answer
19 any questions.

7 MS. MARCONI: Good
8 afternoon, Chairperson Young and
9 members of the Streets and Services
10 Committee. My name is Noelle
11 Marconi, and I'm the Director of
12 Legislative Affairs for the
13 Department of Streets. I'm here
14 today to offer testimony on Bill
15 No. 260025, introduced by
16 Councilmember Squilla on behalf of
17 Council President Johnson.

18 This bill authorizes
19 Avenue of the Arts, Inc., the
20 owner, to install, own and maintain
21 various encroachments in the
22 vicinity of the 300 block of South
23 Broad Street. Various
24 encroachments, including a proposed

1 raised granite curb, median planter
2 box, two sculptures and a total of
3 62 private lakes will be located on
4 the 300 block of South Broad Street
5 between Pine Street and Spruce
6 Street.

7 The Department of
8 Streets is not opposed to these
9 encroachments, as the Avenue of the
10 Arts will be responsible for the
11 maintenance and landscaping as
12 outlined in an encroachment
13 agreement between the Avenue of the
14 Arts and the City. This concludes
15 my testimony and I'm pleased to
16 answer any questions you may have.

17 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
18 you so much. Mr. Johnson, please
19 call any other witnesses to testify
20 on this bill.

11 Councilmember Squilla on January
12 22, 2026.

13 This bill will allow
14 various encroachments in the median
15 of 300 block of South Broad Street.
16 This includes a raised granite
17 curb, median planter box, two
18 sculptures, and a total of 62
19 private lights. This does not
20 affect the existing layout of the
21 right-of-way.

22 The City Planning
23 Commission at its meeting on
24 February 19, 2026 recommended Bill

1 No. 260025 for approval. I'll be
2 happy to answer any questions.

9 terms and conditions.

10 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank

15 Philadelphia City Planning

16 Commission; and Noelle Marconi,

17 Director of Legislative Affairs for

19 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank

20 you.

21 MS. CHIU: Good

22 afternoon, Chairman and members of

23 the Committee on Streets and

24 Services. I'm Sarah Chiu, City

1 Planning Manager with the
2 Philadelphia City Planning
3 Commission. I'm here to testify on
4 Bill No. 260095, introduced by
5 Councilmember Driscoll on February
6 12, 2026.

7 This bill will allow an
8 enclosed elevator structure
9 constructed along the property line
10 of 3400 Aramingo Avenue. It will
11 encroach upon approximately 7 feet
12 along the north footway of Aramingo
13 Avenue. This encroachment leaves a
14 minimum of 11 feet 9 inches of
15 clear, unobstructed footway, which
16 complies with the city's Complete
17 Streets policy.

18 The City Planning
19 Commission is scheduled to consider
20 this bill at its meeting on March
21 19, 2026 with the staff
22 recommendation for approval. I'll
23 be happy to answer any questions.

18 encroachment in the vicinity of
19 3400 block of Aramingo Avenue, a
20 proposed enclosure elevator will be
21 located along the property line of
22 3400 Aramingo Avenue.

23 The Department of
24 Streets is not opposed to this

2 of clear, unobstructed footway will
3 be maintained. This concludes my

24 Convention Avenue and Civic Center

2 maintain conduits in, under, and
3 across the northwest corner of 34th

6 purpose of supplying electrical

2 today to offer testimony on Bill
3 No. 260115, introduced by
4 Councilmember Gauthier.

5 This bill authorizes
6 Mukeshkumar Patel, owner and
7 operator of the newsstand at the
8 northwest corner of 34th Street and
9 Convention Avenue and Civic Center
10 Boulevard to construct, use and
11 maintain conduits in and under and
12 across the northwest corner of 34th
13 Street and Convention Avenue and
14 Civic Center Boulevard for the
15 purposes of supplying electrical
16 service to said newsstand.

17 Currently, this bill
18 conflicts with a capital project
19 being undertaken by Penn Medicine.
20 The Department of Streets is
21 working with Councilmember
22 Gauthier's office to come to a
23 solution with both parties. This
24 concludes my testimony and I'm

10 general question about these
11 newsstands in general. Does the
12 Streets Department conduct an audit
13 of these newsstands to ensure that
14 they are actually still selling
15 news?

16 MS. MARCONI: Let me ask
17 Rich Martinez, our Deputy
18 Commissioner, to come up. And
19 thank you for that.

20 (Witness approached
21 witness table.)

22 MR. MONTANEZ: Good
23 afternoon, Councilmember Young and
24 members of the committee. My name

Committee on Streets and Services

1 is Richard Montanez. I'm the
2 Deputy Commissioner of Streets and
3 Services. The ordinance that
4 allows the newsstands to be there
5 states that they have to be
6 operated once every 30 days. We do
7 try to look to make sure that they
8 are at least open within the code,
9 just to make sure that they're
10 following the code. If any of them
11 are not, then we try to contact the
12 property owner to issue a notice to
13 them that they're in violation.

14 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
15 you. I only ask that because I
16 have a lot of newsstands currently
17 in the 5th Council District in
18 Center City. And as I walk around,
19 I see newsstands that are maybe in
20 operation, but they're essentially
21 just corner stores in a box, right.
22 They're not selling news any
23 longer.

24 And so, if you're not,

1 having the newsstands were
2 permitted under the First
3 Amendment. But if they're no
4 longer selling news to folks, then
5 what still allows them to be
6 permitted at that particular site?

7 MR. MONTANEZ: There
8 have been amendments to the
9 ordinance which allows them to sell
10 certain water, snacks, things like
11 that, that still allows them to be
12 in business.

13 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: But
14 do they have to sell news at the
15 same time or now they can just pop
16 up and start selling candy and
17 water and juice without selling
18 news?

19 MR. MONTANEZ: I would
20 have to ask the Law Department for
21 a legal definition on that.

22 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
23 you. I appreciate that. Again,
24 that's something that we've been

1 looking at. And what is the
2 process to remove an abandoned
3 newsstand? We have one that's on
4 the 17th of Spring Garden area
5 we've been trying to get removed
6 for some time now. What's that
7 process like?

8 MR. MONTANEZ: There is
9 a legal process. The Streets
10 Department has to notify. The
11 property owner has to do all due
12 diligence to try to get a hold of
13 whoever's responsible, the owner of
14 that. If we cannot, then we ask
15 L&I to see what they can do. In
16 short, it probably takes us
17 somewhere like nine months to
18 remove one.

19 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Okay.
20 Thank you. That's good to know. I
21 can let my constituents know who've
22 been calling about that. We got
23 six more months to go. Thank you
24 so much for your testimony on that

18 are Rick Montanez, First Deputy
19 Commissioner of the Streets
20 Department and colleagues from
21 other city departments.

22 I'm here today to
23 testify in support of Bill No.
24 260131 and Bill No. 260161, which

1 complete the neighborhood
2 enhancements authorized under Bill
3 No. 250887-A, signed into law
4 December 17, 2025, which authorized
5 the city to install right-of-way
6 encroachments that bring the 250th
7 celebration to all 10 Council
8 Districts, boosting economic
9 activity, the spirit of celebration
10 and civic pride across our city.

11 Mayor Parker's Bring It
12 On One Philly Unite celebration
13 places Philadelphia's neighborhoods
14 at the center of America's 250th
15 anniversary. This is not simply an
16 events program. It's an economic
17 and civic strategy designed to
18 ensure the celebration is built
19 from the community level up, not
20 just from the top down.

21 Bells Across PA sit at
22 the intersection of this. It
23 unifies communities with world-
24 class public art, activates

1 neighborhoods and destinations and
2 celebrates the stories, heritage
3 and fusion of cultures and people
4 who make Philadelphia the city it
5 is today. Local artists select in
6 partnership with Mural Arts,
7 Philadelphia and Philadelphia 250
8 painted 23 fiberglass Liberty Bell
9 sculptures developed in deep
10 collaboration with community
11 stakeholders.

12 Each bell reflects the
13 specific culture, history and
14 aspirations of the neighborhood
15 where it stands. The sculptures
16 are 3 feet x 3 feet fiberglass
17 installations, mounted on heavily
18 weighted bases, which will be
19 displayed through the end of 2026.
20 Most bells will be located on
21 private property or in parks, which
22 would not require an ordinance.
23 However, Bills 260131 and 260161
24 before you today identify as

1 authorized as the installation of
2 the remaining bells and
3 encroachments.

4 This program works
5 because of the organizations and
6 residents behind it. We engaged
7 every Council District office,
8 listened to community members,
9 including residents like Karen
10 Warrington in Yorktown, and
11 partnered with corridor
12 organizations, civic groups,
13 business improvement districts and
14 cultural anchors from every corner
15 of the city.

16 Further, landscape
17 architect ground reconsidered in
18 partnership with the Streets
19 Department, under Commissioner
20 Del Rossi, surveyed each proposed
21 encroachment site for pedestrian
22 safety, traffic flow and regulatory
23 compliance. Neighborhood partners
24 from across all 10 Council

1 Districts, including the
2 Philadelphia Chinatown Development
3 Corporation, United Merchants of
4 South 9th Street, Bartram's Garden,
5 Lancaster Avenue 21, Roxborough
6 BID, Parkside Association, The
7 Franklin Institute, Hunting Park
8 United, Mayfair BID, Glen Foerd,
9 Impact Services and Esperanza.
10 Germantown United, Mt. Airy CDC,
11 The Olney Community Collaborative,
12 OARC, Fox Chase, The Knights of
13 Columbus, among others.
14 Citywide institutional
15 partners include Mural Arts,
16 Philadelphia 250, America 250,
17 Philadelphia Convention and
18 Visitors Bureau, Visit
19 Philadelphia, Mother Bethel AME and
20 the Office of State Rep. Jared
21 Solomon. The America 250
22 encroachments in Philadelphia
23 designed to achieve three concrete
24 outcomes: Ensuring that every

1 Council District benefits directly
2 and visibly from the 2026
3 celebration, not just Center City
4 and historic district, but every
5 neighborhood across our great city.

6 Second, they drive foot
7 traffic and economic activity to
8 the neighborhood commercial
9 corridors, putting the 250th
10 anniversary work for local
11 businesses and the residents who
12 depend on them. And finally, they
13 amplify community stories and
14 cultural identity, centering the
15 voices and histories of the people
16 who live in our great neighborhoods
17 as essential historians of
18 America's story.

19 We believe that every
20 neighborhood has a story worth
21 telling and every community
22 deserves to be celebrated as part
23 of America's most important
24 birthday. These encroachments are

1 not decorations. They are
2 declarations. I welcome your
3 questions and thank you for the
4 opportunity to testify.

5 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
6 you, Mr. Newmuis. And I appreciate
7 your efforts with this matter. I
8 just want to put on the record that
9 your office and the Commerce
10 Department has gone above and
11 beyond for communities in this
12 effort to ensure that their
13 community is recognized in the
14 250th celebration.

15 I just want to thank you
16 all on the record again for working
17 with the Yorktown community and
18 ensuring that their neighborhood is
19 recognized during the celebration.
20 They are very appreciative. And
21 we're working with a public-private
22 partnership with the Leon H.
23 Sullivan Trust, where they're going
24 to allow us to put a bell on their

1 property. So we don't need
2 encroachment legislation because
3 we're going on private property.

4 And so, I'm grateful for
5 that partnership between the
6 Yorktown community, the Leon H.
7 Sullivan Trust, the Commerce
8 Department and also your office,
9 Mr. Newmuis. So I just want to put
10 that on the record. So thank you
11 for your hard work in ensuring that
12 that happens.

13 Are there any questions
14 of this witness on Bill No. 260161?

15 (No response.)

16 COUNCILMAN YOUNG:
17 Seeing none, are there any other
18 folks in chambers wishing to
19 testify on Bill No. 260161?

20 (No response.)

21 COUNCILMAN YOUNG:
22 Seeing none, thank you so much for
23 your testimony.

24 MR. NEWMUIS: Thank you.

1 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Mr.

2 Johnson, please call the title of
3 the next bill.

4 THE CLERK: Bill No.
5 260132, an ordinance regulating the
6 direction of movement of traffic on
7 Hermit Street between Manor Street
8 and Manayunk Avenue.

9 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
10 you. Please call the witness to
11 testify on this matter.

12 THE CLERK: Noelle
13 Marconi, Director of Legislative
14 Affairs for the Department of
15 Streets.

16 (Witness approached
17 witness table.)

18 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
19 you, Ms. Marconi. Please begin
20 with your testimony.

21 MS. MARCONI: Good
22 afternoon, Chairperson Young,
23 members of the Streets and Services
24 Committee. My name is Noelle

Committee on Streets and Services

1 Marconi and I'm the Director of
2 Legislative Affairs for the
3 Department of Streets. I'm here
4 today to offer testimony on Bill
5 No. 260132, introduced by
6 Councilmember Jones.

7 This bill establishes a
8 one-way regulation on Hermit Street
9 between Manor Street and York
10 Avenue, one-way eastbound. The
11 Department of Streets is not
12 opposed to this one-way regulation.
13 Signs can be posted within 60 days.
14 This concludes my testimony and I'm
15 pleased to answer any questions you
16 may have.

17 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
18 you, Ms. Marconi.

19 Are there any questions
20 of this witness on this bill?

21 (No response.)

22 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Are
23 there any folks in chambers wishing
24 to testify on this bill?

Committee on Streets and Services

1 (No response.)

2 COUNCILMAN YOUNG:

3 Seeing none, thank you so much.

4 Mr. Johnson, please read
5 the title of the bill.

6 THE CLERK: Bill No.
7 260161, an ordinance authorizing
8 the installation, ownership and
9 maintenance of a right-of-way
10 encroachments in various parts of
11 the city, under certain terms and
12 conditions.

13 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: I
14 believe that was the bill that Mr.
15 Newmuis did. So I think we heard
16 that bill.

17 THE CLERK: There's a
18 260131 and a 260161. They're
19 related.

20 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Okay.
21 He testified together on both
22 bills?

23 MR. NEWMUIS: Yes.

24 THE CLERK: Perfect.

Committee on Streets and Services

1 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Okay.

2 Thank you. I will note for the
3 record that Mr. Newmuis testified
4 on both 260131 and 260161 together.
5 So we're going to incorporate his
6 testimony with this bill as well.

7 And just for the record,
8 is there anyone else in chambers
9 wishing to testify on Bill No.
10 260161?

11 (No response.)

12 COUNCILMAN YOUNG:
13 Seeing none, thank you.

14 Mr. Johnson, please read
15 the next bill.

16 THE CLERK: There are no
17 more bills.

18 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Thank
19 you. The Chair recognizes
20 Councilmember Squilla for a motion
21 on Bill Nos. 250884, 251068,
22 251069, 251102, 260025, 260095,
23 260114, 260115, 260131, 260132 and
24 260161.

Committee on Streets and Services

1 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA:

2 Thank you, Mr. Chair.

3 I move that Bill Nos.

4 250844, 251068, 251069, 251102,

5 260025, 260095, 260114, 260115,

6 260131, 260132 and 260161 be moved

7 with a suspension of the rules to

8 be read at the next session of

9 Council.

10 (Duly seconded.)

11 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: For

12 the record, I want to note that

13 260114 has been held by the

14 sponsor.

15 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA:

16 Thank you, Mr. Chair.

17 I move that the bills

18 read into the record besides Bill

19 No. 260114, which was held, be

20 moved with a favorable

21 recommendation and further move

22 that all rules of Council be

23 suspended to submit the first

24 reading at the next session of

Committee on Streets and Services

1 Council.

2 (Duly seconded.)

3 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: It

4 has been moved and properly

5 seconded that Bill Nos. 250884,

6 251068, 251069, 251102, 260025,

7 260095, 260114, 260115, 260131,

8 260132, 260161 be moved out of

9 committee and reported from this

10 committee with a favorable

11 recommendation and further move

12 that the rules of Council be

13 suspended to permit first reading

14 of this bill at the next session of

15 Council.

16 All those in favor

17 signify by saying aye.

18 (Aye.)

19 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Those

20 opposed?

21 (No response.)

22 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: The

23 ayes have it. The bills just read

24 into the record will be reported

Committee on Streets and Services

1 out of this committee with a
2 favorable recommendation.

3 This concludes the
4 public meeting of the Committee on
5 Streets and Services with the
6 suspension of the rules. Let me
7 clarify that. These bills just
8 read will be reported from this
9 committee with a favorable
10 recommendation and further move
11 that the rules of Council will be
12 suspended to permit the first
13 reading of these bills at the next
14 session of Council.

15 All those in favor
16 signify by saying aye.

17 (Aye.)

18 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: Those
19 opposed?

20 (No response.)

21 COUNCILMAN YOUNG: The
22 ayes have it. Again, this
23 concludes the public meeting of the
24 Committee on Streets and Services.

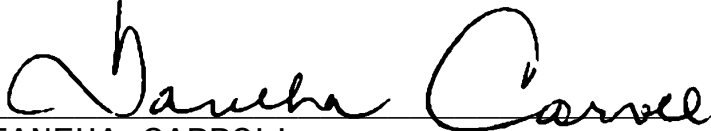
