2 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: This
3 hearing is called to order. This is a
4 public hearing of the Committee on
5 Legislative Oversight. I am Councilman
6 Kenyatta Johnson, Chair of the Committee.

7 A quorum is present in the
8 presence of Councilman Derek Green and
9 Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds Brown.

10 Will the Clerk please read the
11 title of the bills.

12 THE CLERK: Bill No. 170794,
13 amending Chapter 6-300 of The
14 Philadelphia Code, entitled "Food," by
15 repealing Section 6-305 (relating to
16 milk, milk products and milk
17 derivatives); and making conforming
18 amendments to other provisions of Chapter
19 6-300, all under certain terms and
20 conditions.

21 Bill No. 170795, amending
22 Chapter 6-200 of The Philadelphia Code,
23 entitled "Preventive Medicine," by
24 repealing Section 6-207 (relating to
25 premarital examinations), all under

2 certain terms and conditions.

3 Bill No. 170796, repealing
4 Chapter 9-1800 of The Philadelphia Code,
5 entitled "Use of Electronic Scanners for
6 Customer Checkout," all under certain
7 terms and conditions.

8 Bill No. 170797, amending
9 Chapter 10-700 of The Philadelphia Code,
10 entitled "Refuse and Littering," by
11 repealing Section 10-712 (relating to
12 dropping litter from an aircraft), all
13 under certain terms and conditions.

14 Bill No. 170798, amending
15 Chapter 9-600 of The Philadelphia Code,
16 entitled "Services and Other Businesses,"
17 by repealing Section 9-621 (relating to
18 the sale of telephone activated pagers),
19 all under certain terms and conditions.

20 Bill No. 170799, amending
21 Chapter 6-400 of The Philadelphia Code,
22 entitled "Miscellaneous Standards and
23 Requirements," by repealing Section
24 6-401(2)(b) (relating to radiation), all
25 under certain terms and conditions; and

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2 170800, amending Chapter 9-700
3 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled
4 "Amusement Businesses," by repealing
5 Section 9-705 (relating to public baths),
6 under certain terms and conditions.

7 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Before we
8 call the first witness, I'm going to call
9 on Councilman Derek Green, who is the
10 Chair of the Regulatory Review Committee,
11 who has worked diligently on addressing
12 these issues to bring our Philadelphia
13 Code up to date.

14 Councilman Green.

15 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Thank you,
16 Chairman Johnson. I just wanted to say
17 for the record I want to thank the work
18 of the staff of the Special Committee on
19 Regulatory Review and Reform who have
20 helped to go through the code and bring
21 up this first slate of bills as part of
22 our process of trying to make the City of
23 Philadelphia more business friendly. So
24 I want to commend the work of Commerce
25 Chief of Staff Sylvie Gallier Howard as

2 well as Chris Goy from the Council
3 President's office as well as Frank
4 Iannuzzi from my staff. They've worked
5 diligently with members of the Special
6 Committee, which include Commerce
7 Director Harold Epps and Rob Wonderling,
8 President of the Greater Philadelphia
9 Chamber of Commerce. And this
10 legislation is just one step to
11 addressing some of the issues of creating
12 a more business-friendly climate here in
13 the City of Philadelphia that hopefully
14 going forward will allow us to continue
15 to be in the customer attraction and
16 retention business, helping to attract
17 businesses to the City of Philadelphia
18 and retain businesses here, as well as
19 attract citizens and retain citizens in
20 the City of Philadelphia for the greater
21 good of all people in the City.

22 So thank you.

23 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
24 Councilman Green.

25 Will the Clerk please call the

3 THE CLERK: Sylvie Gallier
4 Howard, Chief of Staff of the Department
5 of Commerce.

6 (Witness approached witness
7 table.)

8 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Sylvie, if
9 you can state your first and last name in
10 the microphone for the record and you can
11 begin your testimony.

12 MS. HOWARD: Sure. My name is
13 Sylvie Gallier Howard and I'm Chief of
14 Staff for the Commerce Department.

15 Good afternoon, Chairman
16 Johnson and members of the Legislative
17 Oversight Committee. I'll skip my name
18 now. I'm here to testify in support of
19 Bills No. 170794 through 170800, which
20 repeal seven regulations that have been
21 deemed archaic or no longer necessary.

22 The repeal of these seven
23 bills, spearheaded by the Committee on
24 Regulatory Review and Reform, is part of
25 a larger process of streamlining business

2 regulations, legislation, and processes

3 in order to foster a more

4 business-friendly environment in

5 Philadelphia. The Committee, which was

6 established by Council President Clarke

7 via Resolution No. 170179 in the spring

8 of this year, committed to, quote,

9 "taking stock of the City's regulatory

10 environment to determine what is being

11 done right, what needs to be eliminated,

12 and what needs to be improved," end

13 quote.

14 Over the course of the next ten

15 months, the Committee will continue to

16 recommend that outdated legislation be

17 removed from the books as a matter of

18 ensuring the most efficient and accurate

19 legislative code possible. While this is

20 an important role of the Committee on

21 Regulatory Review and Reform, I wish to

22 highlight that the Committee is also

23 committed to carrying out significant

24 reform efforts that will make it easier

25 to do business in the City.

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2 The Committee is supported by
3 five subcommittees, which are Food and
4 Hospitality, Manufacturing and Industry,
5 Construction and Real Estate, Tech and
6 Life Sciences, and Small Businesses, each
7 of which has made recommendations related
8 to improving processes within City
9 agencies, legislative mandates, and
10 regulations. The Committee is embarking
11 upon these improvements through direct
12 dialogue with various City departments
13 and with Council.

14 Over the last decades,
15 Philadelphia has made progress in
16 improving its business tax environment
17 through the continued reduction in wage
18 and business taxes, and I commend City
19 Council for leading this effort in
20 partnership with a succession of mayoral
21 administrations. And while our tax
22 structure is of critical importance to
23 our business community, so too is the
24 ease of opening, operating, and expanding
25 a business in our city. This Committee,

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2 which combines the efforts of both
3 branches of government with those of the
4 private sector, is one of the best
5 opportunities that we have to make
6 impactful change in this realm.

7 Thank you for the opportunity
8 to testify, and I am happy to answer any
9 questions that you may have.

10 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you
11 for your testimony.

12 Any questions?

14 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you
15 very much.

16 MS. HOWARD: Thanks for having
17 me.

18 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Any other
19 witnesses or comments from members of the

17 Bills No. 170794, 170795, 170796, 170797,
18 170798, 170799, and 170800 be reported

22 first reading of these bills at the next
23 session of Council.

25 motion will signify by saying aye.

7 bills will be reported from this
8 Committee with a favorable recommendation
9 with a request that the rules of Council
