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COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good morning, everyone.

(Good morning.)

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
We're going to get started now. Can I have quiet, please.

Members will take their seats and visitors and guests please retire behind the rail. We have a quorum, and we will get started. Thank you.

To give our invocation this morning, the Chair recognizes Elder K. Rose Samuel-Evans of Metropolitan Baptist Church. She is here today as the guest of Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds Brown.

I'd ask all guests and visitors and members to please rise.

(Members and guests rise.)

ELDER SAMUEL-EVANS: Giving honor to our God, a God who sits high but looks low. I stand here, oh God, in the name of God the father, God the son, and God the holy spirit.

I stand, God, having been given

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2 this divine assignment for this appointed
3 time through your servant leader
4 Councilwoman at-large Blondell Reynolds
5 Brown, and for this privilege I say thank
6 you.

7 I stand here, God, at a time
8 and moment in history in this month of
9 March on this 19th day in the year 2015,
10 in which the accomplishments of women are
11 being acknowledged. Therefore, thank
12 you, God, for women who help to lead this
13 City and serve on this Council, women in
14 the personalities of Marian Tasco, Maria
15 Quinones-Sanchez, Cindy Bass, my Council
16 representative Jannie L. Blackwell and,
17 of course, Blondell Reynolds Brown.

18 Then, God, because there are
19 heart prints and handprints and
20 footprints that have left a legacy of
21 leadership in this City, I lift up the
22 spirits of the Council of Ethel Allen,
23 Happy Fernandez, and Augustus Clark,
24 women whom I had the privilege to admire
25 and learn from.

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2 God, now you know I stand
3 before a Council which consists of ten
4 elected district representatives, seven
5 at-large Councilmembers. God, I ask your
6 blessings on each of them, for they are
7 your chosen servants to lead this City,
8 who is in dire need of strong and
9 righteous leadership.

10 And then, God, I stand before
11 the people who come week after week on
12 this Thursday morning with the hopes of
13 knowing that you are still a God who sits
14 on the throne. They hope with
15 expectation and anticipation that this
16 Council, whom they have given their vote
17 of confidence, will enact and pass bills
18 with godly consciousness.

19 God, I know this Council is
20 charged with building a first-class city,
21 where all mankind, irrespective of race,
22 religion, gender, creed, sexual
23 orientation, can live together in peace
24 and prosperity. And so I pray, oh God,
25 that the laws will be enacted as the

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2 prophet Amos proclaimed, let justice roll
3 down like waters and righteousness like a
4 mighty stream.

5 And then, oh God, I pray that
6 the politicians and the preachers and the
7 law enforcement entity can sit down and
8 work together for the betterment of the
9 City, for they have all been charged with
10 the welfare of people.

11 Now, God, I know and understand
12 that according to your word, the poor
13 will always be among us on this earth.
14 Yet, God, I pray that equal attention,
15 resources, and opportunities be given by
16 this Council to neighborhoods such as the
17 one that I come from called Mantua and
18 neighborhoods all around the City be
19 given the same attention as what is
20 called and known as the center of our
21 City.

22 God, I ask that while you
23 continue to bless the high skyscrapers
24 that look over the low skyscrapers, that
25 they too all will be blessed for the

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2 betterment of this City.

3 Now, God, I stand with the
4 knowledge and understanding the work of
5 Council requires the skills of
6 negotiation through dealmaking, but, oh
7 God, I pray that your righteousness
8 abides in the heart of each Councilmember
9 in such a way that when they make deals,
10 that they'll make deals where poverty is
11 reduced. Let them make deals where jobs
12 are created and livable job wages become
13 a reality. Let them make deals where
14 homelessness ceases and hunger goes away,
15 that also ends drugs that will transform
16 innocent children from turning into
17 street thugs, because instead of seeing
18 hope, they see dope and they get roped
19 into a pipeline of prison.

20 Oh God, I pray that when deals
21 are made, the Council will hear the
22 voices of children that say they require
23 and need a first-class education.

24 And as I bring this prayer to a
25 close, God, I just ask that this City

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Council hear the voices of children, that
they remember when they were children.
If it were not for someone who loved
them, guided and re-guided them, showed
them unconditional love, where would they
be today.

God, let every Councilperson
remind themselves that they did not make
it on their own, but they made it because
of a God that will have his way.

God, you know even after I
enter and exit from this prayer, the
problems are not going to go away, but,
God, I ask that you have your way that
this City of Philadelphia will see
brighter days.

God bless you all.

(Applause.)

Thank you very much. Thank you.

5 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank

6 you, Mr. President. I move that the

7 Journal of the meeting of Thursday, March

8 12th, 2015 be approved.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Can

10 I get a second?

11 (Duly seconded.)

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13 Thank you. It has been moved and

14 properly seconded that the Journal of the

15 meeting of Thursday, March 12th, 2015

16 stand approved.

17 All those in favor say aye.

18 (Aye.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20 Those opposed?

21 (No response.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The

23 ayes have it, and the Journal is

24 approved.

25 The next order of business is

1 3/19/15 - STATED - LEAVES

2 requests for leaves of absence, and the
3 Chair recognizes Councilman Jones.

4 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
5 Mr. President. On behalf of the
6 democrats, there are no requests for
7 leaves of absence today.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
9 Chair thanks the gentleman.

10 The Chair recognizes Councilman
11 O'Neill.

12 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,
13 Mr. President. On behalf of the
14 republicans, there are no requests for
15 leave of absence.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
17 Thank you. The Chair thanks the
18 gentleman.

19 At this time, I would like to
20 take a moment to welcome and thank
21 everyone who has come down today to
22 witness their government in action. We
23 appreciate your participation. We really
24 appreciate the fact that you view this
25 important enough for you to take time out

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2 of your busy day. We hope that your stay
3 here is a pleasurable one and a
4 knowledgeable one, so much so that you
5 come back again. Again, thank you so
6 much.

7 At this time, the Chair
8 recognizes Councilman O'Brien, who will
9 present a resolution recognizing April
10 2015 as Autism Awareness Month. Would
11 Karen Krivit and those accompanying her
12 please join the Councilman at the podium.

13 And joining Councilman O'Brien,
14 we have Councilman Henon and Councilwoman
15 Bass and Councilman Oh.

16 (Councilmembers and guests
17 approached podium.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Please proceed, Councilman.

20 COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: Thank you,
21 Mr. President.

22 I would like to start off by
23 just thanking Darrell Clarke, the
24 President of City Council, and all my
25 colleagues in City Council for their

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support of the Philadelphia Autism Project. It is now going to enter its second phase. The first phase represented a conversation of over 130 individuals who came up with 119 recommendations that was supported by the Administration in their welcoming of four different agencies that are working cohesively and comprehensively to devise the first municipal response to this ever-growing epidemic known as autism.

I'd like to thank the ASERT Collaborative, which stands for Autism Services, Education, Resources, and Training Collaborative. We launched the first census that exists on any disease malady in the history of the United States, and I will always repeat these numbers rather than dwell on idle statistics. By the year 2020, we are going to have 20,000 adults crash the system with no services, 20,000. That's when the bus stops and the parents are home and the children who are now adults

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2 have no place to go.

3 That is a statistic that
4 mirrors every state population in the
5 United States of America. The autism
6 conversation in the Commonwealth of
7 Pennsylvania is ten years ahead of every
8 other state. We should be proud of that,
9 but through the Philadelphia Autism
10 Project, we are recognizing
11 Philadelphia-specific autism needs and
12 responses, and I'd like to thank
13 everybody that was involved in that
14 conversation; specifically, the Library
15 of the City of Philadelphia, Siobhan
16 Reardon, Sara Moran, and Nate Eddy. They
17 are developing strategies around sensory
18 story time. They're going to disseminate
19 Philadelphia autism-specific information,
20 and they will create physical hubs where
21 individuals living with autism and their
22 families can go there and experience a
23 very positive environment.

24 Karen Krivit, who you're going
25 to hear from, has been wonderful in

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creating training and consultive services
in this conversation through Elwyn, who
has always been a leader in early
intervention and programs for individuals
living with all disabilities but very,
very successful in the field of autism.

And I'd like to also recognize
our Builders Owners and Managers who are
going to light this city up blue in the
autism awareness conversation going
forward.

So with that, ladies and
gentlemen, I would like to begin to read
this resolution.

Whereas, April is National
Autism Awareness Month. Autism, also
known as Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD),
describes a complex neurological disorder
that affects, in varying degrees,
language and social skill development,
characterized by challenges in
communication and social interactions,
repetitive behaviors and movement; and

Whereas

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COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: In 2014, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention estimated that 1 in 68 children, that is to say 1 in 42 boys and 1 in 189 girls, in the United States of America will meet the criteria for ASD diagnosis; and

Whereas, the Autism Services, Education, Resources, and Training Collaborative (ASERT) released the Pennsylvania Autism Census Update in 2014 and found that in Philadelphia, the number of individuals with autism receiving services has more than doubled from 2005 to 2011, and despite increased awareness many adults with autism remain undiagnosed, misdiagnosed and are not receiving services; and

COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas, Karen Krivit, a licensed social worker and the Training and Resource Specialist at Elwyn's Philadelphia Early Intervention Program, has been a leader in outreach to underserved individuals

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and families, through her direct
community based practice and by providing
training and consultation to day care
centers, and community and professional
groups; and

Whereas, Ms. Krivit's
demonstrated commitment is evidenced by
her development of the A-List Annual
Resource Guide, the Philadelphia Autism
Network Workshops, the Philadelphia
Professional Autism Networking workgroup,
and more recently her video series that
addresses cultural differences and other
roadblocks that prevent individuals and
families from accessing needed services;
and

COUNCILMAN HENON: Whereas, the
Free Library of Philadelphia, under the
leadership of Siobhan Reardon, is
actively working to ensure that their
libraries are welcoming environments for
individuals and families with autism,
including efforts to develop sensory
story time and other programming that is

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responsive to the needs of children and
adults living with autism; and

Whereas, the Free Library is
working with the Philadelphia Autism
Project in our efforts to create
accessible physical hubs throughout the
community to disseminate Philadelphia
specific autism resources, promote
awareness initiatives, and serve
connecting sites for individuals and
families living with autism; and

COUNCILMAN OH: Whereas, the
Building Owners and Managers Association
(BOMA) of Philadelphia warmly embraced
the idea of Philadelphia to Light It Up
Blue, to raise awareness of autism; and

Whereas, BOMA has worked with
their members to make this celebration a
reality so buildings in Philadelphia will
light up blue on World Autism Awareness
Day, Thursday, April 2nd, for the first
time ever in Philadelphia; now,
therefore, be it

COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: Resolved,

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2 by the Council of the City of
3 Philadelphia, that we hereby recognize
4 April 2015 as Autism Awareness Month in
5 honor of individuals living with Autism,
6 their families and those working to
7 improve the quality of life for the
8 entire Autism community.

9 And further resolved, that an
10 engrossed copy of this resolution be
11 presented to Karen Krivit of Elwyn, as
12 evidence of the sincere sentiments of
13 this legislative body.

14 Karen, I would like to present
15 this citation and welcome you to City
16 Council to offer remarks.

17 (Applause.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

19 Thank you.

20 The Chair recognizes Ms. Krivit
21 for remarks.

22 MS. KRIVIT: Thank you. I can
23 only stand here today and hope with all
24 my heart that in another 20 years, the
25 programs for people with autism that

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we're forming today will actually no longer be needed. In the meantime, I will keep creating, helping, teaching, advocating and, most of all, collaborating with all of you in this City.

It is a thrilling time for me to be recognized and to have the support from the City Council to create culturally sensitive, family-friendly videos that will be featured at community library outreach events in the next few months.

I want to thank the members of City Council and Denny's team for this honor, and I want to thank my agency, Elwyn, for allowing me to be innovative when resources are scarce.

Autism is a controversial field. There's no cure and there's no known cause. So information about this syndrome can be distorted, and finding good services and programs can be confusing. Therefore, I strive to help

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2 address this need for all families and
3 especially the underserved.

4 I am honored to be recognized
5 for my work, and I'm pleased to say thank
6 you to everybody.

7 (Applause.)

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

9 Thank you.

10 Council will be at ease.

11 (Council at ease.)

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13 Thank you.

14 At this time, the Chair
15 recognizes Councilman Johnson, who will
16 present a resolution recognizing the
17 Reverend Dr. Napoleon Livingston Divine
18 and Mr. Dahn Kepayea Dennis. Would
19 Mr. Dennis and those accompanying him
20 please join the Councilman at the podium.

21 And shall I say joining
22 Councilman Johnson, we have Councilman
23 Oh, Councilwoman Bass, Councilman
24 Greenlee, and Councilman Goode and
25 Councilwoman Blackwell.

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2 (Councilmembers and guests
3 approached podium.)

4 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Good
5 morning.

6 (Good morning.)

7 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: During
8 some time ago last year, we as a city and
9 specifically members of City Council
10 wrapped our arms around the Liberian
11 community after a fire where there was a
12 loss of life of particularly two young
13 babies, and as we advocate in the City of
14 Brotherly Love and Sisterly Affection, we
15 want to continue to support members of
16 the Liberian community, members of the
17 African and Caribbean community. And
18 today we'll be honoring two individuals
19 who are leaders of that community who
20 played a significant role in making sure
21 that the members of his community was
22 supported through that tragedy.

23 I would be remiss if I wouldn't
24 acknowledge the leadership of my
25 colleague Councilwoman Jannie Blackwell,

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who stepped up to the plate and began organizing and working with me to make sure that the members of the Liberian community receive all the resources and necessary support that they needed on behalf of the City of Philadelphia. So I want to thank her for her leadership, working with this community but also, most importantly, partnering and working with me to make sure that we supported the family as much as possible. And I thank all my colleagues for joining me during this presentation. And the resolution reads:

The Council of the City of Philadelphia is pleased and proud to honor, recognize and commend the Reverend Dr. Napoleon Divine, an ordained Baptist Minister, and Mr. Dahn Dennis, an advocate for the Liberian community, for their devotion to their communities and the people of Philadelphia.

COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

Whereas, both Reverend Dr. Divine and

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Mr. Dennis are exceptional leaders in
their communities -- and this we know
personally -- and hold advanced degrees;
and

Whereas, Reverend Dr. Divine
and Mr. Dennis serve as leaders of the
Liberian community on the local and
national level as founding members of our
organization, the Mayor's Commission on
African and Caribbean Immigrant Affairs,
and are Board members of various
organizations devoted to improving the
quality of life of Liberians in the
United States; and

COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas,
both men advocate for rights of the
Liberian community in the United States
and in Liberia through offering services
such as interpretation, scholarship,
transportation, tutoring, housing,
cultural awareness and other
community-related services while
fostering reconciliation among Liberia's
warring parties and bringing about peace

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2 and stability to Liberia; and

3 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas,

4 both the Reverend Dr. Divine and

5 Mr. Dennis have provided relief and

6 support to the victims of the tragic fire

7 that took place in Southwest Philadelphia

8 the morning of July 5th, 2014 and

9 resulted in the destruction of eight

10 homes, the dislocation of 43 residents

11 and the death of four children under the

12 age of 5; and

13 COUNCILMAN GOODE: Whereas, the

14 Reverend Dr. Divine and Mr. Dennis sought

15 to uplift the emotional, physical and

16 spiritual needs of the victims of the

17 fire and helped them to re-establish

18 themselves and improve their states of

19 well-being; and

20 COUNCILMAN OH: Whereas, the

21 Reverend Dr. Divine and Mr. Dennis are

22 both married and abide by the Bible

23 passage in Proverb Chapter 3 Verse 5,

24 Trust in the Lord with all your heart and

25 lean not on your own understanding, in

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all your ways acknowledge Him and He will
direct your path; now, therefore

COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Resolved,
that the Council of the City of
Philadelphia, hereby honors, recognizes
and commends the Reverend Dr. Napoleon
Divine, an ordained Baptist Minister, and
Mr. Dahn Dennis, an advocate for the
Liberian community, for their devotion to
their communities and the people of
Philadelphia.

Further resolved, that an
engrossed copy of this resolution be
presented to the Reverend Dr. Napoleon
Divine and Mr. Dahn Dennis as evidence of
the sincere admiration of this
legislative body.

On behalf of the City of
Philadelphia, we would like to officially
present these citations to Dr. Divine and
Mr. Dennis.

(Applause.)

COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: I want to
give a special shout-out to Mr. Dennis,

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who is also an alumni and a student with me as we both attended Mansfield University of Pennsylvania in upstate Pennsylvania. And so it's not too many Philadelphians who actually attended school in the middle of the country, but I do want to say it's a pleasure working with you and being back on the path here in the City of Philadelphia.

MR. DENNIS: Thank you.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

Thank you.

The Chair recognizes Mr. Dennis for remarks.

MR. DENNIS: Thank you. Thank you very much. Mr. President, City Council members, my family, senior advisor Dr. Tolbert, and good morning to all of us. I'm very happy to be here in front of us, and a message from the Ambassador, Jeremiah C. Suluteh, to the City Council for this recognition. We won't have done it without the support of the City Council, particularly

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Councilwoman Jannie Blackwell and
Councilman Johnson. And to all City
Council members who were there for us,
for our people, for our community, we
want to say thank you very much.

My appeal and request to City
Council right now is, our community is
growing. The Liberian community is
growing every day. We have people moving
out of state from other states moving to
our City of Philadelphia, and our youth
population is also growing, and we need
to have some programs to keep our youth
going and keep them off the street.

So my appeal is please help us
to get a building so that we can provide
programs, after-school programs and some
mentoring programs, for our young folks
so that they can have a place to go after
school. And those who are high school
dropouts, we will have programs to help
them. Not that they're not smart in
school, but they don't have the skills.
The foundation is not there. So that we

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2 can help them build a foundation and also
3 be productive citizens in Philadelphia.

4 Again, thank you very much. On
5 behalf of Liberian community, I want to
6 say thank you, thank you. We will
7 forever remember this citation.

8 (Applause.)

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

10 Council will be at ease.

11 Did he want to speak?

12 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Yes, sir.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 Please do.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER:

16 Distinguished members of City Council,
17 I'm very delighted to be here to
18 represent the Reverend Dr. Napoleon
19 Divine, who could not make it today due
20 to health reason. I'm sure he's going to
21 cherish this citation.

22 Thank you and God bless you.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

24 Thank you so much.

25 Council will be at ease.

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2 (Council at ease.)

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

4 Thank you very much.

5 Before we proceed with our next
6 presentation, the Chair recognizes
7 Councilwoman Quinones-Sanchez.

8 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Thank
9 you, Council President. In my
10 councilmanic district, I happily have
11 collaborated from its founding day with
12 the Sankofa Freedom Academy Charter
13 School in Frankford. Over our
14 relationship, part of what we do is
15 provide internship opportunities for
16 young women and men from Frankford and
17 all over the City. Over the last month,
18 I've had two wonderful young ladies in my
19 office. I'm going to ask them to stand.

20 Come on, Amini and Pastel, get
21 up.

22 (Applause.)

23 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Amini
24 Vance is 17 years old. She's a senior at
25 Sankofa Freedom Academy. She's currently

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2 researching gentrification and she wants
3 to major in criminal justice and business
4 at Lincoln University, my alma mater.

5 Pastel Albritton is age 18.
6 She's also a senior. She's researching
7 teen homelessness and she's planning to
8 major in sports management at Temple
9 University.

10 They've been with us for a
11 month. Tomorrow is their last day. I
12 want to thank them. They came into the
13 office and were willing to do whatever
14 was necessary, and they helped me keep
15 real and gave me some new terminology.
16 So thank them very much, and I look
17 forward to being at their graduation this
18 June.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20 Thank you, Councilwoman.

21 (Applause.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Congratulations.

24 At this time, the Chair
25 recognizes Councilman Neilson, who will

6 And joining Councilman Neilson,
7 we also have the District Councilperson,
8 Councilwoman Jannie Blackwell.

9 (Councilmembers and guests
10 approached podium.)

11 COUNCILMAN NEILSON: Thank you,
12 Mr. President.

13 For years we've been hearing
14 how Philadelphia is an incubator of
15 talent. Many times we don't know that
16 until after kids graduate from school and
17 they're long gone on their way up the
18 corporate ladder. However, we have a
19 distinct honor today in recognizing a
20 Drexel University senior today. He's
21 here. He's created a great application,
22 which we'll talk about a little bit, to
23 help inner City kids and everybody across
24 the country to have the ability to attend
25 college, to look at different things.

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2 And I'd rather not tread on my
3 resolution, but having five kids and one
4 in high school now getting ready to make
5 that journey and start looking into
6 colleges, this is a great application for
7 him.

8 So without further adieu and --
9 ready, Councilwoman? I'll start it off.

10 A resolution recognizing and
11 congratulating Drexel University Senior
12 Christopher Gray for serving as a role
13 model of entrepreneurship, and on the
14 business success of his software
15 application Scholly, designed to improve
16 access to scholarship support for
17 aspiring college students in the
18 Philadelphia area and beyond.

19 Whereas, according to the
20 National Association for College
21 Admission Counseling, high school
22 graduation peaked to 3.43 million
23 students in 2010, declining slightly
24 through 2014-15, but is expected to rise
25 again to over 3.4 million by 2017;

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Whereas, almost 21 million students enrolled in degree-granting postsecondary institutions in 2011. The Department of Education expects that total of college students will increase to 24 million through 2021; and

Whereas, according to NACAC, only 54 percent of high school student graduates from the lowest income enroll in college, while African American and Hispanic heritage students make up almost 35 percent of the college-aged population. They represented only 29 percent of postsecondary education enrollees; and

Whereas, college funding concerns are a reality for most college bound students and their families. While some academic funding is based upon academic performance or outstanding athletic achievements, many scholarships, grants, and loan programs have become based on an income-based component and are critical to making college more

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accessible to all students, including low income, who could not otherwise afford to attend college; and

Whereas, matching the unique characteristics, strengths, and financial need of individual students to scholarship and financial aid programs can be complex and overwhelming. Some online and published sources offer free information to students on financial aid sources. Many national scholarship databases are licensed only to institutions, while other scholarship software programs are costly; and

COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

Whereas, although Christopher Gray was the child of a teenage mother, he did not let his circumstances define him, demonstrating an entrepreneur spirit at the age of 13, starting his own video game delivery service; and

Whereas, still in high school, Christopher Gray expended a great deal of time and effort in finding and applying

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to college scholarship programs, and by
graduation, he had been awarded \$1.3
million in scholarships; and

Whereas, Christopher Gray is a
Gates Millennium Scholar, a Horatio Alger
National Scholar and Coca-Cola Scholar,
among others; and

Whereas, determined to help
other students find scholarship money, as
a finance and entrepreneurship major at
Drexel University, Gray joined with two
Drexel computer-science majors to help
create Scholly, a scholarship search
program that launched in 2013; and

Whereas, Scholly has received
national attention by publications
including Forbes and USA Today. In
addition, Scholly was chosen as one of
Inc. Magazine's 2014 Top College Start-up
programs; and

Whereas, Christopher Gray
recently appeared on the television
program "Shark Tank" where he
successfully pitched his business to

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obtain funding to expand his application.
Since his television appearance, Scholly:
Scholarship Search, by Scholly, Inc., is
now a top seller on iTunes as a 99 cent
download and is available for iPhone and
Android devices on the web; now,
therefore

Resolved, by the Council of the
City of Philadelphia, that we recognize
and congratulate Drexel University Senior
Christopher Gray for serving as an
exemplary role model of entrepreneurship,
and on the business success of his
software application Scholly, designed to
improve access to scholarship support for
aspiring college students in Philadelphia
and beyond.

Further resolved, that an
engrossed copy of this resolution be
presented to Christopher Gray as evidence
of the sincere sentiments of this
legislative body.

17 roads and go over a rail line or are a
18 private property bridge that is a rail
19 line above a public street, that after
20 decades of non-use and deterioration,
21 they've become a hazard and a danger to
22 the pedestrians and drivers in
23 Philadelphia. And I believe that it is
24 important that these private owners
25 maintain these passageways and ensure

CHIEF CLERK: F.E. Savage.

(Witness approached podium.)

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good morning.

MS. SAVAGE: Good morning, Councilman Clarke and other Councilmembers. This bill I'm -- I want to talk about Bill 140906, which concerns Urban Experiential Displays. This bill allows the right to install very large

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digital commercial advertising signs to
be sold for almost nothing, peanuts in
the word of Inga Saffron, architecture
critic for the Inquirer.

If the City needs income so
much that it is willing to permit huge
advertising signs on Broad Street and at
the Convention Center, then City Council
should be sure to get the highest price
possible for such signs if and when they
are sold.

City Council needs to be
guarding the City's assets very carefully
instead of perhaps being swayed by
\$10,000 and campaign contributions from
the developer.

This bill allows the goose that
lays the golden eggs of advertising
income to be sold for the price of a
goose, not the much higher value of the
golden eggs of commercial advertising.

In addition, it appears that
some of the legislation was written or
influenced by the developer who hopes to

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profit from this arrangement. Take the measurement that limits how bright these signs are. The 7,500 nits is 50 percent above industry standards, and the note on one draft of the bill as it is being amended said "Thaddeus to supply." Thaddeus would probably be Thaddeus Bartkowski, the sign developer.

Nits are very important in measuring digital sign brightness. Foot-candles are the measurement you want to use if you're interested in how bright your living room is when you walk in and turn on the light. You don't usually take off the lamp shade and look at a bulb and say, Hey, that looks too bright. On the other hand, sometimes your computer screen looks too bright. You know this because your eyes tell you when you look directly at the screen.

Nits is the measure most like looking at a computer screen and knowing it is too bright. That is the one Thaddeus apparently provided the number

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for. It is a key to ensuring the signs
are not too bright.

Sure, nits are not easy to
measure. So where is the clause in the
bill that says that sign is installed and
the scaffolding is still up, a
professional should come in and measure
while the scaffolding is still there.

When I read the bill, I could not even
find a limit on how big the overall sign
is, only limits for the video area, and
that is -- and is Thaddeus the only game
in town?

Councilman Squilla first said
he signs his art. He says to the Rules
Committee, if you look at the three sites
that we picked, I think you could agree
that all three of them don't have
tremendous architectural value. We have
a parking garage on the Avenue of the
Arts. Well, the front facade of that
parking garage was designed by
internationally known architect and
designer Michael Graves, who recently

2 died. Some of us could not agree that it
3 doesn't have architectural value.

4 Please think about it before
5 you vote yes on this bill and sell once
6 and for all the goose that could lay
7 golden eggs for the City for the price of
8 an ordinary goose.

11 CHIEF CLERK: Michelle Sahl,
12 commenting on 140906.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
15 morning.

16 MS. SAHL: Good morning. Thank
17 you, Mr. President, City Council members,
18 and fellow Philadelphians. I'm speaking
19 today on behalf of my opposition to Bill
20 140906.

21 The City has recently spent
22 millions of dollars refurbishing the
23 exterior of the gem that we currently
24 convene in - City Hall. Down the same
25 corridor as where we are currently

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meeting, we highlight beautiful examples of art in City Hall. In part thanks to our City's place in history, we will soon be hosting a visit from the Pope and we will be welcoming the Democratic National Committee for the 2016 democratic presidential nomination.

Philadelphia should be on the forefront of progress and positive change of value. Greening the City has ushered in new leads, guidelines, expansion of and improvements in parks, mini parks, walking trails, and an abundance of conservation initiatives such as Greenworks for the City, which has made notable progress since 2008 in meeting or exceeding our goals in energy consumption and greenhouse emissions. As Scenic Philadelphia has well stated, our greening initiatives could be set back dramatically by the consumption of energy required by enormous digital signage.

Bills such as 140906 that support the increased electricity

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consumption for digital signage place us
one step ahead in the greening race and
three steps backwards for energy
conservation. Other cities who are
actually leading the way in digital
signage control include Bismarck, North
Dakota; Mobile, Alabama; Kansas City; and
various municipalities in Illinois. Do
we want to stand behind them in line? I
don't think so.

We should be ahead of the
curve. We should be ahead rather than
being at the end of the line waiting to
see the lights flashing in our rear-view
mirror.

Thank you.

Thank you for your testimony.

CHIEF CLERK: Michael

McGettigan, commenting on 140906.

(Witness approached podium.)

MR. McGETTIGAN: Hello.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
morning.

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MR. McGETTIGAN: I brought a single LED with me. I can guarantee it's definitely not as bright as anything that people are going to have to contend with if these UEDs go through.

At a recent hearing, the guys from the Convention Center said they were worried that people would have trouble finding their facility and thus we needed that sign, which raises the question, A, are they competent; B, why does not the Convention Center build, operate, and profit from their own illuminated sign? Did Bartkowski buy up all the LEDs? Seriously, was this course of action explored and dismissed? If not, we should know why.

Number two, in all enterprises, timing is key. Mr. Bartkowski and Catalyst are very late to the party development-wise. Market East and South Broad Street are on the move. Thank you, Carl Dranoff. Thank you, Daniel Killinger. There's no need to use

2 billboard blight as a driver.

3 Of course, the New York Times
4 recently reported that Times Square,
5 while a success at attracting millions of
6 gawkers who buy T-shirts, is not a
7 commercial success. In fact, it's
8 becoming a growing problem for New York's
9 midtown.

10 Our newest Philadelphians, by
11 the way, millennials, are the key to --
12 is this thing distracting anybody? Okay.
13 -- (continued) are the key to
14 Philadelphia's growth, and here too
15 Catalyst is behind the curve. I see a
16 lot of smartphones and mobile devices.
17 That is how millennials get their
18 information, not from TVs on a stick,
19 which is essentially what Mr. Bartkowski
20 III is selling.

21 Recently, former City
22 Councilman-turned lobbyist, Frank
23 DiCicco, said that -- suggested that UED
24 opponents move to Mayberry, implying that
25 billboards are somehow intrinsic to

Philadelphia. Does Mayberry have the Liberty Bell, which does not ring and is not equipped with speakers? Does Mayberry have the Rocky steps, which don't light up? These are the core of what brings tourists and businesses here and part of the beauty they and we who live here value.

I would like to thank Councilman Kenyatta Johnson for seeing the LED, or the light, in opposing signs in his district, and I would ask that he represent all of us by pledging to vote against these UEDs anywhere in our city.

We've talked about who it's going to hurt. Who benefits and how much? This morning I spoke with Ms. Anne Kelly in Councilman Squilla's office. I asked her did she know how much -- everybody has heard 5.2 million over 25 years going to our arts groups, which is really a drop in the bucket, and we need money for many other sources, but did she know how much Mr. Bartkowski would make

from these TV billboards? No, she did not. I couldn't believe this. I said, Check around, and she said, No, I know as much about the UEDs as anyone in this office, including Councilman Squilla. She checked around, got back to the phone, and told me no one had asked how much Mr. Bartkowski expects to make from these, from selling our public space for his private profit. I think that's a relevant question.

Thank you very much. Please vote against this.

CHIEF CLERK: Mary Tracy, commenting on 140906.

(Witness approached podium.)

MS. TRACY: Good morning --

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good morning.

MS. TRACY: -- Mr. President and esteemed members of Council. My comments will be very brief, because I

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haven't really seen the amended bill, and I have to say Councilman Squilla has done everything under the sun to try to make this a better bill. But the problem with this bill is that it's a terrible bill, and it was terrible from the beginning and no matter what improvements he has been trying to make, it's still going to be terrible when we walk around the corner and we see a huge 1,500, 3,000, 2,500 square foot television screen five, six stories high that's dominating our beautiful city. And I just don't see what the benefit is, and of course, I'm not objective on this.

But I did want to share with Councilmembers that we tried to set up -- Scenic America tried to set up a gateway for e-mailing you so people could share their opinion, and I think there's a glitch in your system and so they all bounced. And so what we set up instead was a place where people could actually sign a petition, and to date, we have

almost 500 names on that petition, and that's just people who have gotten word of it. It is spreading. And the people who -- and I think the other thing is Councilman -- and we know about councilmanic privilege, and we certainly respect that, but our Center City is more than just one Council district. No matter where you live in the City -- and I used to live in West Philly for 25, 30 years, and I always brought my guests, my family to Center City. The activities are in Center City. The restaurants are in Center City. It's the place that no matter where you live in the City, we all take pride in our downtown area. And so I think that there is a responsibility for every single Councilmember to take some responsibility for Center City and not just think of it as one Councilperson's responsibility.

And I'll be back next week I think because I know there were a lot of people who were planning to come today

COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you very
much, Council President. I had the
pleasure to participate with the Global
Cities Initiative just earlier this week.
It's a combined effort. It's actually a
nationwide effort, but it brings the
Brookings Institute, the Economy League,
and the World Trade Center together to
look at increasing exports in our region.

Philadelphia is in a
metropolitan region that ranks tenth out
of ten regions. So we're last. And if
we could get to the middle of the pack in
terms of exports, we would create 37,000
new jobs within five years. And it's
critical to put this within the context
of where the economy is growing globally
and where it's not growing. And so I'd

just like to point out that according to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, in the year 2000, 75 percent of the global middle-class consumption was contained within the U.S., Mexico, Canada, the European Union, and Japan. Twenty-five percent was contained in China, India, and all other countries. But by the year 2050, Japan, the European Union, Canada, Mexico, and the U.S. will only make up 15 percent, 1-5, 15 percent of the global middle-class consumption in the world. Eighty-five percent of the world's middle-class consumption will be in China, India, and other nations.

And so it is very important that we more fully engage in the global economy. And I appreciate the opportunities that are being brought to our city through Global Cities Initiative and the steps that we have taken here in City Council in particular in recognizing the need for global opportunities, trade

investment and other items for bringing
jobs, investment to Philadelphia.

Thank you very much.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

Thank you very much, Councilman.

Speeches on the part of the

COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
Mr. President. One of the things that we
discovered early on is that there are
licenses for everything. To be a pilot,
you need hours of instruction both in the
air and in book manuals. To drive a car,
same thing. You got to pass a driver's
test. In order to make a hamburger in
the City of Philadelphia, you need a food
handler's license. But in order to make
a child, no instructions included, no
licenses required.

So what we want to do in light
of some of the issues that we see that
stem from the lack of guidance in a home

that translates all over our society,
whether it's in a classroom because a
child wasn't taken care of at home, it's
the responsibility of the teacher;
whether it's in the prisons when
parenting failed, society had to step in
with corrective action in prison. We are
offering a parenting workshop.

Now, that's not a panacea. You
know, different strokes for different
folks. Everyone has a different
parenting style, but we're offering some
workshops on Saturday that talk about
social media and you, which means think
before you push send. And we all need to
do that from time to time.

What does a parent do when you
go into a child's room -- and I know God
knows I've explored and found things I
didn't want to see in my boys' rooms.
But what do you do if you discover drugs?
That denial comes in, not my child. How
do you react then?

So we're doing these parenting
