7 Council, I welcome you to our Council session. We
8 appreciate your taking the time to join us as we
9 attend to the legislative affairs of our city. We
10 certainly invite you to come again.

11 This morning, I am very pleased to
12 welcome a group of ten government officials, mostly
13 City Councilmembers from Azerbaijan. They are in
14 our city to study local government administration
15 and they are guests of the United States. They are
16 accompanied by Miss Ann Stauffer, Vice President of
17 the International Visitors Council of Philadelphia.

18 Again, we welcome you to our city. We
19 ask that you please rise so that we may recognize
20 you. Would you please stand.

21 (Applause.)

22 TRANSLATOR: Dear Miss President and
23 dear members of the Council and dear guests: On
24 behalf of the people and the members of our
25 municipalities of cities (indiscernible), I would

2 like to present the flag of our state to you, and I
3 would like to say that Azerbaijan is a good
4 friend of the United States, and let me wish you
5 all health and luck in all you're doing here.

7 TRANSLATOR: And the group of members of
8 local municipalities of Azerbaijan is the first
9 democratic elected group of people in their
10 country. It was the first time they had local
11 elections in local municipalities.

12 (Applause.)

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank you.
14 Enjoy your stay with us.

15 At this time, the Chair recognizes
16 Councilman Kenney, who will make a presentation
17 honoring Larry Bowa. Will Mr. Bowa and those
18 accompanying him please join the Councilman at the
19 podium. I see Mr. Montgomery is here.

20 (Applause.)

21 (Honoree et al. come forward.)

22 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you.

23 This is a resolution congratulating
24 Larry Bowa for being named the "National League
25 Manager for the Year" and for his selection as

3 2002.

4 Whereas, Larry Bowa is a two-time Golden
5 Gloves shortstop with the Phillies, which, in 1980,
6 defeated the Kansas City Royals to win the World
7 Series; and

8 Whereas, in November 2001, the Baseball
9 Writers Association of America named Larry Bowa the
10 "National League Manager of the Year," having
11 previously received that honor from the Sporting
12 News, USA Today, Baseball Weekly, and ESPN
13 magazine; and

14 Whereas, Larry Bowa will serve as the
15 2002-2003 spokesperson for the American Heart
16 Association's Call to Action Campaign to educate
17 the public about cardiac arrest and the chain of
18 survival, a four-step process to assist someone in
19 cardiac arrest; and

20 Whereas, the Larry Bowa Call to Action
21 Campaign will feature posters, print, and broadcast
22 public service and billboards with the message
23 "Learn to Save a Life, Learn to the Chain of
24 Survival"; and

25 Whereas, the American Heart Association

2 documents nearly 600 Americans die daily, totaling
3 220,000 yearly deaths from sudden cardiac arrest;
4 and

5 Whereas, the American Heart Association
6 estimates that 20 percent of the victims of cardiac
7 arrests could survive if the elements of the chain
8 of survival strategy were in place. For example,
9 call for emergency assistance, call 911, perform
10 CPR, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, use a
11 defibrillator to shock the heart to normal rhythm,
12 get the victim to advanced medical care;

13 Now, therefore, resolved by the City
14 Council of the City of Philadelphia that we
15 congratulate Larry Bowa for being named "National
16 League Manager of the Year" and for his selection
17 as spokesperson for the American Heart Association
18 for 2002 in their mission to save lives by reducing
19 death and disability from disease, heart disease,
20 and stroke. And based on last night's wonderful
21 come-from-behind win, we all may need the rest of
22 the season to learn CPR and other life-saving
23 procedures.

24 Thank you.

2 MR. BOWA: Thank you.

3 On behalf of the Phillies, I would like
4 to welcome everyone here this morning. I told the
5 players last night before the game, I said, I have
6 a an appointment tomorrow morning at City Hall, so
7 I want one of two things: I want, first of all, I
8 want to win, and want it be real quick. Well, we
9 got a win, but it didn't happen really quick; we
10 went the extra innings and we got home about 12,
11 12:30.

12 But it's an honor to be here. I'm very
13 happy to be a part of the American Heart
14 Association. It's a great team to be involved
15 with. I think our number-one goal is to create
16 awareness, which we are doing. As we all know,
17 heart disease is still the number-one disease,
18 killer disease in the United States.

19 So as long as we can continue to get the
20 word out on how important it is to stay on top of
21 the situations involving your health, I think that
22 we can continue to progress and take care of this
23 disease.

24 One of the main reasons that I'm
25 involved in this, I've had some people very close

2 to me pass away because of heart disease -- my mom
3 and my aunt and ex-Philly Hall-of-Famer Richie
4 Ashbourne, who was a very close friend of mine died
5 of a heart attack.

6 So hopefully, we can continue to try to
7 put a stop to this disease, and if I can do
8 everything in my power to create awareness out
9 there, that's the main thing I'm going to try to
10 do.

11 And, again, it's a privilege to be here
12 and a privilege to be involved with the American
13 Heart Association.

14 Thank you.

16 AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION REP: I'm
17 Paul (indiscernible), Board of Directors of the
18 American Heart Association of Southeastern
19 Pennsylvania.

20 On behalf of the hearts Heart
21 Association, I would like to sincerely thank
22 Councilman Kenney and the Philadelphia City Council
23 for recognizing Mr. Bowa's partnership with the
24 American Heart Association. I would also like to
25 thank Mr. Bowa for his continued support of our

9 their participation.

4 COUNCILMAN CLARKE: Thank you, Madam
5 President.

6 Madam President, I just told the coach
7 that I'm going to have to get him a seat down here.
8 It seems like they're down here every year after
9 winning the championship, so we need to make a
10 permanent space for our great team.

11 I'd like to read the resolution
12 congratulating the Community College of the
13 Philadelphia Men's Basketball Team.

14 Whereas, in a bid to regain the
15 Pennsylvania State College Championship 2001,
16 Community College of Philadelphia, the Colonials,
17 faced its old nemesis, Community College of Beaver
18 County, the Titans, once again on February 24,
19 2002; and

20 Whereas, the Titans had denied the
21 Colonials the title in three consecutive years in
22 late '90s and the Philadelphia Colonials were
23 determined not to let this one slip away. With
24 Jazz Black and fellow forwards Mat Cardera, 19
25 points, Eric Houston providing much of the offense,

2 Philadelphia matched the Titans up-and-down style.
3 The trio combined for 27 points with guards Isaiah
4 Thomas -- that's not fair that's not fair.

5 (Laughter.)

6 COUNCILMAN CLARKE: And Jamar Butz,
7 doing a good job of getting the ball; and

8 Whereas, Philadelphia had a 41-40 edge
9 at intermission, after forward Jazz Black made a
10 free throw with 18 seconds remaining; and

11 Whereas, reserved guard Bob Black scored
12 11 points in the first eight minutes of the second
13 half, and the game stood tied at 61 points. Guard
14 Terrence Brown came off the bench and scored two
15 consecutive baskets, and Black dropped in to put
16 the Colonials ahead 71-65. Beaver County tied the
17 score at 77, with less than four minutes less to
18 play. You could feel the tension all around as the
19 Colonials went into high gear to finish the game
20 with a 90-77 win that prompted fans to storm the
21 home court in celebration of this magnificently
22 focused junior college championship game honor.

23 Now, therefore, resolved by the Council
24 of the City of Philadelphia that we honor and
25 congratulate the Community College of

2 Philadelphia's Men's Basketball Team in claiming,
3 without any dispute, the Pennsylvania State Junior

8 team.

10 of this resolution be presented to the State Junior
11 College Champions Community College of Philadelphia
12 Men's Basketball Team and to Coach Dondi DeShields,
13 who was named "Coach of the Year" by the
14 Pennsylvania Collegiate Athletic Association. We
15 present this document as evidence of the high
16 commendation and wholehearted congratulations of
17 this legislative body. Signed and sponsored by all
18 members of City Council.
