11 nationwide effort to get nutritious food
12 to starving people of the earthquake- and
13 tsunami-ravaged Haiti, the Salvation Army
14 along with you Numana, Inc. and Drexel
15 University will package one million
16 people for Haiti; and

17 Whereas, the Salvation Army's
18 relief effort in Haiti is the largest
19 international relief effort since the
20 Indian Ocean tsunami in 2005, and more
21 than 20,000 people are currently
22 homeless, hungry, and living near the
23 army's main compound in Port Au Prince;
24 and

25 Whereas, the Salvation Army is

2 working with the Haitian government, the
3 U.S. military, FEMA, the United Nations,
4 and NGOs and its corporate partners to
5 implement a broad response to the
6 tragedy; and...

7 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

8 Whereas, 700 Salvation Army officers and
9 staff are permanently stationed in Haiti
10 and have been joined by more than 40
11 disaster-response workers coordinating
12 their relief; and

13 Whereas, since the devastating
14 earthquake in January, the Salvation Army
15 has distributed more than 8.5 million
16 meals in Haiti and will continue to
17 distribute meals over the next six to
18 nine months; and

19 Whereas, meal-packing events
20 have been held across the United States,
21 in cities including Chicago, Kansas City,
22 Los Angeles, San Francisco, and Wichita;
23 and

24 Whereas, Mayor Michael A.
25 Nutter has urged Philadelphians to

3 Salvation Army requests only a one
4 two-hour shift from volunteers at the
5 event at the Drexel armory on Friday and

11 COUNCILMAN CLARKE: Thank you,
12 Madam President.

13 Madam President, again, we have
14 probably concluded a very difficult
15 budget year. Over the last two fiscal
16 years, we have had significant
17 challenges, budget deficits projected
18 over the five-year plans of upwards of
19 \$2 billion.

20 The Administration has done a
21 number of things as it relates to
22 resolving those budget challenges and
23 those proposed deficits by rebalancing,
24 not filling positions, a number of makers
25 internally.

2 This council was asked on
3 several occasions to do a number of
4 things to close those challenged
5 deficits. We, to my knowledge, passed
6 every fee increase, and there were a
7 significant number that were proposed in
8 a very meaningful way.

9 We actually, with State
10 authorization, increased the sales tax
11 for the City of Philadelphia, some people
12 would say, creating a significant
13 disadvantage for a number of our
14 retailers in the City of Philadelphia,
15 but because we wanted to ensure that we
16 maintain a reasonable level of services,
17 we supported that.

18 And I think, most importantly,
19 one of the things that's not discussed is
20 the fact that our municipal unions
21 stepped to the plate and agreed to a
22 deferral program with respects to their
23 pensions that allowed us to raise, I
24 believe the numbers are, upwards of
25 \$130 million, and that is on top of the

2 \$120 million as a result of the sales tax
3 increase.

4 So there have been a
5 significant level of hurdles achieved and
6 put in place by all members of the
7 government, both the executive, the
8 legislative; and most importantly, our
9 municipal workers.

10 Fiscal '11 rolls around.
11 Again, through no fault of the City of
12 Philadelphia and the Administration, we
13 are faced with another extremely
14 difficult challenge. And this one, I
15 think, frankly speaking, has probably
16 been the most difficult of all three.

17 And we've been asked again to
18 support revenue measures to raise a
19 significant amount of money -- again, to
20 support the services and, subsequently,
21 our municipal workers.

22 And this council, through a
23 very difficult process -- although it
24 rejected some of the earlier proposals
25 put forth by the Administration, it was

2 the responsibility of this council to put
3 revenue on the table to supplant those
4 proposals. And I think that this council
5 stepped to the plate.

6 This council took a vote which
7 was probably one of the most difficult
8 votes -- if not the most difficult
9 vote -- that an elected official can take
10 is raising real-estate taxes in this
11 particular environment, in this
12 particular city, given all of the
13 challenges -- not that the City has but
14 those individuals who will receive those
15 real-estate tax increase bills.

16 And not to mention the
17 political side -- that it is done a year
18 before the election. That is, like, very
19 difficult, and I'm sure that those of you
20 who traveled throughout the City of
21 Philadelphia on Tuesday, as I did, every
22 polling place that I went to throughout
23 my district, the question about Council's
24 vote for a real-estate tax increase came
25 up, all right?

2 So that was a very difficult
3 vote. And it was something that we had
4 to do because, at the end of the day, we
5 had to maintain services in the City of
6 Philadelphia and, therefore, make sure
7 that our municipal workers continue to
8 work.

9 And as a result of that, we
10 were able to turn, which was in fiscal
11 '10, more than a \$30 million deficit to a
12 \$42 million fund balance, all right? And
13 in most of the time that I've been here a
14 \$42 million fund balance is a reasonable
15 fund balance.

16 But for whatever reason, we
17 received word today that, in spite of the
18 \$42 million fund balance, that there
19 needs to be layoffs or some disruptions
20 in services at a time when the upwards of
21 \$2 billion deficits were in place that
22 there were probably less than 50 people
23 laid off, all right?

24 So, Madam President, I just
25 don't simply understand the math. If you

2 had to close a upwards of \$2 million fund
3 balance over a five-year plan, and you
4 only had to affect 50 people -- and a lot
5 of those people were actually able to
6 come back to work in other departments in
7 the City -- how, with a \$42 million fund
8 balance you are wrestled with the
9 decision to have to lay off City
10 employees?

11 So, Madam President, I just
12 want to say given what this council had
13 to do, which was an extremely heavy lift,
14 from my perspective, providing upwards of
15 \$100 million in additional revenue, I
16 just simply don't understand the math.

17 If -- and let's get to the
18 underlying problem, since we can be
19 candid in a very public way. We
20 understand that our municipal workers
21 have not had the ability to get a
22 contract. And it is very unfortunate,
23 'cause I think we all support them,
24 including the Administration.

25 But at the end of the day, they

2 don't have a contract. And at some
3 point -- and I hope that point at some
4 point will actually happen, that they
5 will receive a fair contract.

6 (Applause.)

7 COUNCILMAN CLARKE: It will
8 have to be paid for.

9 And understanding that, as in
10 all of the years that I've been here, at
11 the end of the day, when asked to support
12 revenue measures to fund that contract,
13 the Council -- this council and the
14 councils prior to us have stepped to the
15 plate and ensured that our municipal
16 workers received a fair and equitable
17 contract.

18 So I think we're prepared to do
19 what we need to do when the contract is
20 put in place to support the municipal
21 workers union.

22 So, in finishing my comments,
23 Madam President, I think that we have
24 passed today a reasonable and a
25 responsible budget that leaves a

2 \$42 million fund balance that could
3 conceivably go beyond the \$42 million.
4 And I think, frankly speaking, that we've
5 done a responsible thing today.

6 So I'd like to, you know, thank
7 all of the members for the difficult
8 challenges that they've had as it relates
9 to this particular budget process.

10 Thank you, Madam President.

11 (Applause.)

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
13 Chair recognizes Councilman Green.

14 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Thank you,
15 Madam President.

16 I would like to echo Councilman
17 Clarke's comments and just say I'm very
18 proud to serve on a body that, for three
19 years, has put together responsible
20 budgets that have saved taxpayers
21 hundreds of millions of dollars during
22 that time.

23 Last year, we prevented a 19
24 percent property increase; we get no
25 credit for that. This year, as

2 Councilman Clarke said, the choices were
3 much tougher.

4 And although I did not vote for
5 this budget, we, as a body, did identify
6 \$46 million in potential reduced
7 appropriations; these are appropriations
8 above last year's level. We could only
9 get the Administration to agree to
10 \$18 million of the potential identified
11 reduced appropriations.

12 The budget that this body
13 passed provides funding for every
14 position basically that the
15 Administration requested and leaves a
16 \$42 million surplus.

17 It is worth noting that this
18 budget provides a hundred dollars million
19 in new taxes. What the Administration
20 requested was \$146 million in new taxes
21 this year and \$186 million in new taxes
22 next year.

23 So, once again, this body has
24 saved over \$130 million in taxes being
25 levied on the citizens of Philadelphia

2 through its hard work. And although I
3 would have gone further, I just want to
4 commend my colleagues and leadership for
5 bringing us to this conclusion for the
6 citizens.

7 Thank you.
