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COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good morning, everyone.

(Good morning.)

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It is a great day.

I'd ask all visitors and guests to please retire behind the rail. If the members will take their seats, we'll get started. Thank you.

Today to give our invocation, we have our own spiritual advisor, Councilwoman Jannie Blackwell.

(Applause.)

COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank you, Mr. President.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: You're welcome.

COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Dr. Martin Luther King said the ultimate measure of a man is not where he stands in moments of comfort and convenience, but where he stands in times of challenge and controversy.

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2 are reminded that there are people that
3 our country still doesn't fully recognize
4 all citizens. It means that we have not
5 arrived.

6 Heavenly Father, we ask that
7 you bless us here. We ask that you help

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Thank you so much, Councilwoman.

24 You'd better be careful,
25 Councilwoman, you might get invited to do

3 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: I'm
4 always ready. A privilege.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: You
6 said come on with it, right?

7 Thank you again, Councilwoman.

8 The next order of business is
9 the approval of the Journal of the
10 meeting of Thursday, February 5th, 2015,
11 and the Chair recognizes Councilman
12 Greenlee.

13 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
14 you, Mr. President. I move that the
15 Journal of the meeting of Thursday,
16 February 5th, 2015 be approved.

17 (Duly seconded.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Thank you. It has been moved and
20 properly seconded that the Journal be
21 approved.

22 All those in favor say aye.

23 (Aye.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
25 Those opposed?

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2 (No response.)

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
4 ayes have it, and the Journal is
5 approved.

6 The next order of business is
7 requests for leaves of absence, and the
8 Chair recognizes Councilman Jones.

9 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
10 Mr. President. On behalf of the
11 majority, there are no requests for
12 leaves of absence today.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
14 Chair thanks the gentleman.

15 The Chair recognizes Councilman
16 O'Neill.

17 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,
18 Mr. President. On behalf of the
19 republicans, there is no request for
20 leave of absence.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
22 Chair thanks the gentleman.

23 At this time, I would like to
24 dispense with the regular order of
25 business and I would like to welcome

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2 everyone who has taken time out of their
3 busy day to come down and witness their
4 government in action. We hope that your
5 stay here is both a pleasurable one and
6 one that you gain significant knowledge
7 as to the intricacies of our legislative
8 body. So I want to really thank you for
9 coming down, and I hope you come again.

10 At this time, the Chair
11 recognizes Councilman Jones, who will
12 present a resolution on my behalf to
13 Siobhan Reardon. Would Ms. Reardon and
14 those accompanying her please come up to
15 the podium.

16 (Councilmembers and guests
17 approached podium.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
19 joining Councilman Jones, we have
20 Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds Brown.

21 COUNCILMAN JONES: On your
22 behalf, Mr. President. This isn't bad
23 for a New Yorker to get this kind of
24 recognition, but I will have to say,
25 Mr. President, that I happen to have the

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2 largest number of free libraries of any
3 other Councilperson - Haddington,
4 Roxborough, Haverford, East Falls,
5 Overbrook Park, Wynnefield, and Andorra
6 in the 4th District. So I just want to
7 share her with you.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

9 Councilman, but we have the largest in
10 the 5th District.

11 COUNCILMAN JONES: Yes. That
12 is true.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: In
14 the 5th District.

15 COUNCILMAN JONES: You're
16 right.

17 I'd like to present and I'm
18 very proud of the fact that she's
19 received this award. I remember her
20 first year here and us asking about the
21 closing of the libraries, and she took it
22 on the chin and worked with us in spite
23 of the budget to make our library system
24 one of the best in the entire nation. So
25 there are a lot of library advocates in

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2 Council.

3 I would like to have one of
4 those advocates add their opinion.

5 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: I thank
6 the Majority Leader for allowing me to
7 add my two cents.

8 What I was struck most about
9 our honoree this morning is that she
10 listens carefully to members' concerns
11 around the composition of her Board and
12 the following year indicated to us in a
13 tangible way that strategies were
14 underway to make sure that her Board
15 looks more like Philadelphia. And that
16 matters to us on this side of the ledger
17 when we see department heads hear what
18 our concerns are, respond to what our
19 legitimate observations are, and then
20 ultimately makes a tangible difference in
21 fixing that particular situation. So for
22 that, we thank you, honoree.

23 Thank you, Majority Leader.

24 COUNCILMAN JONES: So we are
25 here to honor and recognize and

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2 congratulate Ms. Siobhan Reardon on being
3 named the 2015 Librarian of the Year by
4 the Library Journal.

5 Whereas -- that's right.

6 (Applause.)

7 COUNCILMAN JONES: Whereas,
8 Ms. Reardon was named the 2015 Librarian
9 of the Year by the Library Journal, a
10 well respected journal for the library
11 community that has been in publication
12 for over 100 years;

13 Whereas, she was appointed
14 President and Director of the Free
15 Library system in Philadelphia 2008 and
16 is the first woman to serve in that
17 capacity. During that time of economic
18 downturn, Ms. Reardon was forced to take
19 a 20 percent budget cut and drastically
20 reduced branch hours; and

21 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,
22 through the midst of budget cuts,
23 Ms. Reardon streamlined and enhanced
24 neighborhood library services, shared
25 resources in a staff of 800 among

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neighborhood libraries and collaborated with community leaders to develop programs and services most needed by Philadelphia residents. These efforts improved efficiencies, internal communications, and patron experience; and

Whereas, using a cluster model, every neighborhood now has expert librarians on core focused areas such as health information, family literacy, services for New Americans, small businesses and entrepreneurs, job seekers and people with disabilities; and

Whereas, Ms. Reardon has led the library's efforts to move beyond its walls by creating computer and Internet hotspots that offer free technology access and training in partnership with local organizations in underserved neighborhoods. In a city with more than 40 percent of the population lacks an Internet connection at the home, in a city where more than 40 percent of our

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Philadelphia residents still lack Internet connection at home, Reardon's efforts helped bridge the City's digital divide. The Free Library of Philadelphia now boasts seven hotspots, 54 physical buildings and the University of Pennsylvania facility; and

COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Whereas, Ms. Reardon has improved fundraising efforts on behalf of the Free Library during its campaign to raise money for renovations to the central branch. By focusing on phased improvements to both the central branch and the neighborhood libraries, she revamped the approach and decided to do the project on a piecemeal basis making substantial improvements. This process helped engage a number of important foundations in the City that were willing to provide the necessary funding; and

Whereas, previously, Ms. Reardon was Executive Director of the Westchester, New York Library System, a

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38-member cooperative library system.

Prior to that, she was the Deputy Executive Director of the Brooklyn Public Library, serving as Chief Operating Officer of the nation's fifth largest library system. She also served as Acting Executive Director and Director of Finance, responsible for the library's \$85 million annual budget.

And I'd just like to add I really felt her pain when she thought we might be selling libraries, and I can see it, but I knew she was -- did not like that, but we're glad we prevailed in not having to do that.

COUNCILMAN JONES: Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Council of the City of Philadelphia hereby honor, recognize and congratulate Siobhan A. Reardon for being named the 2015 Librarian of the Year by the Library Journal.

Be it further resolved, that an engrossed copy of this resolution be

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2 presented to Ms. Reardon as evidence of
3 our sincere sentiment of this entire
4 legislative body. Introduced by
5 President Darrell Clarke, Councilman
6 Jones, Councilwoman Tasco, and
7 Councilwoman Reynolds Brown.

8 (Applause.)

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
10 Chair recognizes Ms. Reardon for remarks.

11 MS. REARDON: Well, good
12 morning, everyone. I'm truly honored to
13 be recognized in this way by this
14 wonderful City Council, and it is
15 because -- as I've often said, it's not
16 just about me. It's about an entire city
17 that gets behind a library system that's
18 so desperately needed by its
19 constituents.

20 And so on behalf of the Free
21 Library of Philadelphia, my Boards, the
22 staff, and the City and the constituents,
23 thank you very much for this recognition.
24 I truly appreciate it.

25 Thank you.

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2 (Applause.)

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

4 Thank you.

5 Council will be at ease.

6 (Council at ease.)

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8 Thank you. Before we go on to our next
9 presentation, I'd like to recognize one
10 of our newest members of the Pennsylvania
11 General Assembly and a veteran of the
12 City Council staff, Jason Dawkins.

13 Representative, how are you?

14 (Applause.)

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

16 Thank you for coming down today.

17 At this time, the Chair
18 recognizes Councilman Oh, who will
19 present a resolution recognizing the 10th
20 Anniversary of Philadelphia Fashion Week.
21 Would Kevin Parker, Kerry Scott, and
22 those accompanying them please join the
23 Councilman at the podium.

24 And joining Councilman Oh, we
25 have Councilman Jones.

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2 (Councilmembers and guests
3 approached podium.)

4 COUNCILMAN OH: While we are
5 assembling, let me just say that one of
6 the hallmarks of a great city, an urban
7 city especially, a metropolitan city, is
8 fashion. Looking at me, you can tell
9 that I don't care much about fashion, but
10 it is a very important part of any big
11 city's economy. It makes a statement,
12 certainly is cosmopolitan. And one of
13 the things we've really been concerned
14 about is our retail industry, especially
15 in our affluent areas, and I say that
16 because we need the money. We need
17 visitors. We need people to spend money
18 so that we can support our city. But
19 more than that, the fashion industry is
20 part of the creative economy, and that
21 means jobs. And one of the things about
22 it is, it provides jobs for
23 creative/innovative people, many from our
24 neighborhoods, and the folks that we are
25 recognizing today really exemplifies

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that. And so they have been doing this work on their own, and I was fortunate to come across them, and it is their 10th Anniversary. They've been doing this work for ten years, and I think it is very important that we elevate them, recognize them, and support them.

And so today we have a resolution recognizing and celebrating the 10th Anniversary of the Philadelphia Fashion Week for its important enrichment to the City's fashion community and creative/innovative economy.

Whereas, Kevin Parker and Kerry Scott produced and founded the first Philadelphia Fashion Week (PFW) in 2006 with the vision to provide exposure for local models, designers and other industry-related professionals; and

COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas, Parker and Scott currently serve on the Advisory Board for the Philadelphia Fashion Incubator in Macy's Center City, and are involved in the Philadelphia

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2 Collection, which is a city initiative to
3 support retail in Philadelphia; and

4 Whereas, PFW is a nationally
5 recognized and nationally respected event
6 that provides a major platform for
7 designers to succeed and showcase their
8 work;

9 COUNCILMAN JONES: Whereas, PFW
10 invites buyers and industry insiders who
11 not only support the designers but who
12 create revenues for local businesses; and

13 Whereas, PFW has landed the
14 producers many opportunities for
15 international publications such as
16 Harper's Bazaar, Vietnam, features on the
17 Vietnam Style Network, Vietnam's Next Top
18 Model, FashizBlack Magazine, Paris cover
19 and inside spread with international
20 super model Sessilee Lopez, Timodelle
21 Paris Magazine, Runway Magazine, and a
22 number of others, all while providing
23 exposure for our local talent here in
24 Philadelphia and featuring their works;
25 and

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2 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas,
3 PFW has been featured on several
4 television programs and major press
5 outlets including WWD, Harper's Bazaar, O
6 Magazine, Better Philly, Eye Opener, VH1,
7 Bravo, PHL 17, Fox 29, 6ABC, NBC10, The
8 Epoch Times, The Daily News, The
9 Philadelphia Inquirer, and others; and

10 Whereas, in honor of its 10th
11 Anniversary which will be celebrated in
12 February and September, PFW prepares to
13 produce an eventful week Philadelphia has
14 never experienced before, featuring
15 national and international designers and
16 models presenting garments, exhibits of
17 luxury products and services and
18 world-class entertainment; now,
19 therefore, be it

20 COUNCILMAN OH: I'm going to
21 have to subscribe to O Magazine.

22 Be it resolved, by the Council
23 of this city, City of Philadelphia, that
24 it hereby recognizes and celebrates the
25 10th Anniversary of Philadelphia Fashion

And just thank you so much and thank God
for what you've done in our lives.

MR. EDWARDS: Good morning, Council President. I'm Mark Edwards, President and CEO of Philadelphia Works, and I want to thank you for the opportunity to be here today to testify

in support of Bill No. 150010, this legislation that requires Economic Opportunity Plans to include a statement acknowledging the receipt of First Source requirements for contracts that are expected to exceed \$250,000. We thank Councilman Goode for including this amendment in the legislation and his leadership on this bill, on this legislation.

As the workforce investment board for the City of Philadelphia, Philadelphia Works invests in employment and training solutions that connect employers to a workforce and talent and career seekers to jobs while ensuring the highest standards and accountability for these investments. In this role that we play, we have been in continued support and commitment to the success of the City's First Source Job Policy.

As we support the work of the City's Commerce Department and the City's implementation of this jobs creation

policy, we conducted a comprehensive review of first source policies throughout the country by reaching out to eight other cities with similar types of legislation. Many of these cities have had first source legislation for quite some time, and as a result, we sought their input on ways that we could learn from the lessons that they would be willing to share.

During our conversations, a common theme arose. Unless we could implement an effective mechanism by which we could, one, ensure that eligible projects are being captured and, two, an effective coordination between all parties involved, a first source policy cannot reach its fullest potential.

So based on our conversations, this legislation is simply commonsense reform that offers an opportunity to interact with every qualifying contractor. The benefits from this are simply twofold. Not only are contractors

more likely to become aware of the First Source requirements and more likely to adhere, but, secondly, through broader coordination of all of the parties involved, we can ensure that adherence occurs in accordance with the intent of the policy.

We have spoken with Baltimore, for example. They have one staffer who was responsible for pulling together all city contracts. It took them a full day to do so. With this legislation, connecting it to the OEO plans, we can incorporate this process into the City's system without going through similar efforts ourselves.

14 Holston. I am the Senior Pastor of New

19 Co-Chair of their Economic Dignity Team

20 representing 40 houses of faith, over

21 30,000 individuals in the City of

23 We stand in support of this

24 bill for earned paid sick leave and we do

25 it with joy today.

I pastored North Philadelphia where the poverty rate around my church is roughly 40 percent and a deep poverty rate of around 25 percent. Deep poverty is defined as less than \$5,500 per year for an individual.

Out of the many favorable statistics that support earned paid sick leave, the one that touched me the most was the statistics that 3.5 paid sick leave days equals one month's groceries. Just think about that. If I'm sick, then I got to choose between making a determination to pay for my groceries and go to work and go to work sick. And so these kinds of choices are being made every day by individuals, young family members choosing to go to work with a sick child at home or not having groceries for that sick child. That is simply morally reprehensible.

So this bill is clearly a public health bill, but it's certainly more than that. It's an anti-poverty

bill, because it puts more money in the hands of poor people. It's an economic stimulus bill, because it stimulates the economy in the poorest neighborhoods of our city. It's a pro employment bill, because it builds the businesses in our neighborhoods where the people shop and give their money to. It's a pro education bill, because so many children go to school hungry every day and because of this bill, their parents can have more dollars in their pocket. It is also an anti-hungry bill, because 40 percent of our children go to bed hungry every day. It is a pro Philadelphia bill, because it makes Philadelphia a better place to live, a better place to work, a better place to eat, and a better place to play.

My faith informs my politics and my public policy, and my faith says we're called to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and visit them in prison and minister to them that are sick. He says if we do this to the least of our

3 does exactly that.

And while I may be on the other side of this issue, I certainly respect and admire his tenacity, his perseverance, and his goodwill and good-mindedness, and this is clearly his day, well deserved, and I just want to congratulate him on his victory.

COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank you.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
Thank you.

Speeches on the part of the majority?

And the Chair recognizes Councilwoman Tasco.

COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Thank you, Mr. President. I couldn't get past the minority, but I wanted to also thank my colleague Councilman Greenlee for his tenacity in moving this bill forward. He's spent a lot of time on it, and I think it's worthwhile and I really appreciate serving with him in City Council and congratulate him on this

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victory today.

I also want to say that I will definitely miss Derek Green. He came to us when we were working on the predatory lending bill back in the early 2000's and was a part of a committee that drafted legislation that we passed in Philadelphia. But then I saw he was really good on issues and we hired him. So he's been with us. And we wish him well in his endeavors as he tries to become a member of this body next year.

And also I want to just say congratulations to the City, to you, Mr. President, for being so supportive in our Council on encouraging the Democratic National Committee to come to Philadelphia in 2016. It's a great victory for us, and I'm just very excited that we are going to be able to show that Philadelphia is the great city that it is. And as a member of the Board of the Convention Center, it's a great feather in our cap that they will be here, and

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2 thank you so much for your leadership and
3 all the members of City Council. We
4 thank you for your support in this
5 effort.

6 Thank you.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8 Thank you, Councilwoman. And, again,
9 thank you for your great work and your
10 leadership on working with the DNC and
11 the letter that -- the origin from this
12 particular body that kind of stimulated
13 other individuals to get engaged in a
14 very meaningful way. I want to commend
15 you for taking the lead on that and your
16 great work. It has proven to be a very
17 successful attempt. Thank you.

18 The Chair recognizes Councilman
19 Greenlee again.

20 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
21 you, Mr. President. Real fast. First, I
22 certainly join in wishing Derek Green
23 well. I have to add, though, I hope he
24 doesn't put any of us out of a job.
25 That's all. I'll leave it at that.

2 Not to be presumptuous, I
3 wasn't trying to be presumptuous before,
4 but I now want to officially thank
5 everybody for their support, you and all
6 of City Council, for the support of
7 earned paid sick leave. I know I have
8 been a pain in the neck in this whole
9 thing, but I think we did the right thing
10 today and I think it's something -- we're
11 joining the many cities and states around
12 that are providing this reasonable
13 service to people. And I just wanted to
14 add I know there's something else coming
15 up before this, but at 2 o'clock today in
16 the Mayor's Reception Room, the Mayor
17 will be signing the bill into law. So
18 please, everybody that can make it,
19 please come join us. I think we have the
20 right to celebrate this one.

21 Thank you, Mr. President.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Thank you, Councilman. Great work.

24 The Chair recognizes

25 Councilwoman Reynolds Brown.

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2 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Thank you,
3 Mr. President. I join members in
4 congratulating Councilman Bill Greenlee
5 on the passage of the sick leave bill.
6 And some of us use the word "tenacity."
7 I would use the word
8 "stick-to-itiveness." My mom uses the
9 word "gumption." He showed a lot of
10 gumption in making this measure happen.

11 I now turn our attention to
12 express my concern about an issue that
13 has been brought to my attention that I
14 also believe deserves our attention.
15 Unite Here, Local 634 represents
16 approximately 2,000 people who prepare
17 food, serve food, and watch over children
18 in our Philadelphia public schools.
19 Ninety-six percent of the members live in
20 Philadelphia. The overwhelming majority
21 of them are women. Unlike any other
22 group working directly for the School
23 District, 96 percent live in the City and
24 the majority of them are women.

25 What's the bad news? Almost 75

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percent of the cafeteria workers and student safety staff earn less than \$12,000 per year. The majority are earning -- forgive me; \$12,000 per year. The majority are earning \$10.88 per hour. The bad news is, without any increase in their pay, as of January 1, 2015, they will earn less than the City of Philadelphia minimum wage of \$12 an hour. The bad news is, the majority of the employees are not eligible for major medical benefits under their union contract.

What's the update? The membership staged a two-week fast in June 2014 to call attention to the need for additional funding from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, all designed to keep order in our schools. Many Councilmembers, including myself, went to visit with them at their various locations.

The cafeteria workers and student safety staff's contract with the

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School District of Philadelphia expired on September 30th, 2013. After months of negotiations, the union and the District began conversations on the core economics. Despite the economic challenges facing its membership, Unite Here, Local 634 is willing to provide savings of approximately \$1 million to the School District over the next two years. I repeat, despite the economic challenges facing its membership, Unite Here, Local 634 is willing to provide savings of approximately 1 million to the School District over the next two years. These savings could begin immediately, but must begin by September 2014, should have, in order for the School District to fully benefit.

Mr. President, these men and women are those behind the scenes feeding our kids every day and keeping them safe. They seldom ask for the spotlight. They do not ask for awards. They just want to be paid a fair salary to support their

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families. As President Barack Obama said in his 2015 State of the Union Address, quote, "If you truly believe you can work full time and support a family on less than \$15,000 per year, try it."

In closing, Mr. President, I rise to urge the School District of Philadelphia to sit at the table with those workers and figure out how we reasonably compensate them appropriately for their work. Today I rise to appeal to the School District of Philadelphia to search for and reach for a win-win, getting to a solution for Unite Here.

Thank you, Mr. President.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

Thank you, Councilwoman.

The Chair recognizes Councilman Johnson.

COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you, Council President. I want to also acknowledge the hard work of my colleague Councilman Bill Greenlee in getting the paid sick leave bill passed. It will

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2 surely go toward helping individuals who
3 are low-income individuals who live in
4 poverty to go to work and also have the
5 opportunity to do their best job and put
6 their best foot forward in their work
7 environment. And I surely don't want
8 anyone coughing into my food, so take
9 your day off if you are sick.

10 So I do sincerely thank you for
11 your efforts, because even as we move
12 forward in this city, the issue of
13 poverty is probably one of the major
14 issues that isn't always talked about,
15 and sometimes I think we get a little too
16 cute when it comes to -- well, not my
17 Councilman Wilson Goode, Jr., but we
18 don't often focus on people who are
19 living in poverty, and I think as we move
20 forward, this body has put together a
21 collective agenda to begin focusing on
22 raising people out of poverty, bringing
23 them into the middle class.

24 And so I just want to
25 acknowledge you for your efforts and tell

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you to keep up the good work.

I just want to make an announcement about two events taking place in my district. One, this evening at Yesha Fellowship Hall located at 23rd and Snyder Avenue, my good friend, State Representative Jordan Harris, will be hosting his annual Senior Citizen Sweetheart Ball. So for all who are listening, we encourage them to come out to participate. They have their annual bop contest. So that's always a fun experience, although I do not know how to bop. I got a mean two-step, but nevertheless, having a good time with our seniors is really what it's all about. And so that will be this evening, 5:00 p.m., Yesha Fellowship Hall, 23rd and Snyder Avenue.

On Tuesday, February the 17th, I will be hosting my annual Senior Valentine's Day Resource Fair and Luncheon. It will take place at St. Richard's Senior Citizens Center located

17 recognizes Councilwoman Reynolds Brown
