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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Good
3 morning, everyone. I note that the hour
4 has come and that a quorum of this
5 Council is present.

24 blood of school children. Saving God,

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2 similar.

4 only to see your face in those without
5 homes, those behind bars, those walking
6 and living in the streets, but also those
7 who mourn in the cemeteries and those who
8 look to us to find your presence.

9 We as officials, as people
10 called to do your will, are called to
11 mercy, purpose, healing and justice, and
12 in the words of Archbishop Desmond Tutu,
13 we are called to be people through other
14 people, that our humanity is caught up,
15 bound up and inextricably tied up with
16 one another, that this is why we seek to
17 work for the common good, because our
18 humanity comes into its own through
19 relationships with one another.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank

3 Tai, Commissioner 4, Ogun State Local
4 Government Service Commission. Also
5 Mr. Ewuosho Olusola James, Director of
6 Promotion and Transfer, Ogun State Local
7 Government Service Commission. Also
8 Mr. Owotoma Tokunbo Olubokun, Director of
9 Management Services for Ogun State Local

20 (Applause.)

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERA: At
22 this time, the Chair recognizes
23 Councilwoman Krajewski and Councilman
24 DiCicco, who will present a resolution
25 recognizing Thursday, March the 5th, 2009

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2 as "Blue Thursday" in the City of
3 Philadelphia.

4 Will Mr. Dominic Giordano and
5 those accompanying him please join the
6 Councilwoman at the podium.

7 I see that the other
8 Councilmembers are being joined by
9 Councilman O'Neill.

10 Councilwoman.

11 COUNCILWOMAN KRAJEWSKI: Thank
12 you very much, Madam President.

13 This is a resolution
14 recognizing Thursday, March 5, 2009 as
15 "Blue Thursday" in the City of
16 Philadelphia.

17 Whereas, Thursday, March 5,
18 2009 is "Blue Thursday," a special day
19 created and promoted by talk show host
20 Dom Giordano and The Big Talker, WPHT
21 1210 AM; and

22 Whereas, Dom is asking
23 listeners from all over the Delaware
24 Valley to show their support for police
25 officers, who are increasingly under fire

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2 from armed criminals on our streets. He
3 is urging his audience to show their
4 support by wearing blue, decorating your
5 car, home or place of business with blue
6 ribbons, and encouraging everyone you
7 know to do the same and show support for
8 police officers throughout the region on
9 "Blue Thursday";

10 COUNCILMAN DiCICCO: And
11 whereas, The Big Talker 1210's Dom
12 Giordano will host a special live
13 broadcast from Geno's Steaks from 6:00
14 p.m. to 12:00 midnight on Thursday, March
15 5, 2009, today. Dom and an array of
16 special guests will discuss and analyze
17 the reasons for the recent rash of police
18 killings in Philadelphia and ways to
19 reduce gun violence and make our streets
20 safer; and

21 Whereas, "Blue Thursday"
22 coincides with Joey Vento's Geno's Steaks
23 fundraiser for the families of fallen
24 officers. Joey Vento will again donate
25 all dollars generated by sales of his

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2 famous cheese steaks from 10:00 a.m. on
3 Thursday, March the 5th until 6:00 a.m.
4 on Friday, March the 6th. Previous
5 individual Geno's fundraising efforts
6 have raised more than \$50,000; and

7 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Whereas,
8 on "Blue Thursday," The Big Talker 1210
9 will also debut a new "Salute-A-Cop"
10 promotion where the station will begin to
11 regularly recognize police officers for
12 individual excellence on the job; and

13 Whereas, in conjunction with
14 "Blue Thursday," the Port Richmond Town
15 Watch has been participating in a program
16 called "Project Blue Light," where
17 hundreds of homes in the river ward
18 neighborhood have placed blue light bulbs
19 on their front door and porch lights to
20 show support and solidarity for the
21 Philadelphia Police Department during
22 this time of crisis and violent loss to
23 those men and women in blue who have
24 given the ultimate sacrifice. The hope
25 is for "Project Blue Light" to become

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2 popular citywide.

3 Now, therefore

4 COUNCILWOMAN KRAJEWSKI:

5 Resolved, by the Council of the City of

6 Philadelphia, that we hereby recognize

7 Thursday, March 5, 2009 as "Blue

8 Thursday" in the City of Philadelphia.

9 Resolved further, that an

10 engrossed copy of this resolution be

11 presented to Dom Giordano of WPHT 1210 AM

12 as further evidence of the sincere

13 appreciation of this legislative body in

14 his effort to create "Blue Thursday" to

15 showcase and highlight the phenomenal

16 support of the Delaware Valley to those

17 men and women who protect and serve as

18 police officers.

19 Signed by the President of City

20 Council and sponsored by all members of

21 City Council.

22 (Applause.)

23 MR. GIORDANO: Thank you,

24 everyone. Thanks to --

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The

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2 Chair recognizes Mr. Giordano.

3 MR. GIORDANO: Oh, I'm sorry.

4 I'm used to taking to the microphone too
5 quickly. I apologize.

6 Thank you, City Council. Thank
7 all the members, and Joan in particular
8 and Ann Verna that supported this. And
9 Joey Vento, what he does again tonight, I
10 don't know if this is the seventh or
11 eighth time, it's not \$50,000 in toto.
12 It's \$50,000 every time, is what he
13 raises for police officers. And I wanted
14 you to know that I know that the Mayor,
15 City Council -- we do a show regularly
16 with the Police Commissioner and the
17 Cardinal -- are personally engaged in
18 this battle, and tonight we're going to
19 try to see if there's any pattern, any
20 small thing that we might take away to
21 lessen this. And I want to commend the
22 Cira Centre, Boathouse Row, Liberty One,
23 Liberty Two and the Ben Franklin Bridge,
24 who will all be lit up in blue tonight,
25 which the police, the "Salute-A-Cop"

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2 suggestions that we've gotten, what
3 Philadelphia police do on a regular
4 basis, not just the acts of heroism, but
5 the everyday type of thing, like a cop
6 putting in 11 hours of his own time after
7 work to find a kid's stolen bicycle,
8 these types of stories we need to get the
9 media to put out there. These are
10 positive stories about the men and women
11 in blue, who do put their lives on the
12 line every day, but, more importantly,
13 they need our recognition, our
14 bolstering. They grieve when one of
15 these officers goes down.

16 So thank you very much. I hope
17 you can participate tonight. Thanks to
18 Joan, Councilman DiCicco, Councilman
19 O'Neill and Council President Verna.
20 Thanks for having me today. We
21 appreciate it very much at The Big
22 Talker.

23 (Applause.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA:

25 Council will be at ease.

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2 (Council at ease.)

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: At
4 this time, the Chair recognizes
5 Councilwoman Tasco, who will present a
6 resolution recognizing the 2008 Northwest
7 Philadelphia Wildcats.

8 (Applause.)

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Will
10 Mr. Carlton Williams and those
11 accompanying him please join the
12 Councilwoman at the podium.

13 Councilwoman Tasco is being
14 joined by Councilwoman Miller.

15 The Chair recognizes
16 Councilwoman Tasco.

17 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Thank you,
18 Madam President. Madam President, we are
19 joined by winners this morning, winners
20 from West Oak Lane, and we're proud to
21 have them here today to honor them.

22 (Applause.)

23 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: I am proud
24 to present this resolution recognizing
25 and honoring the 2008 Northwest

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2 Philadelphia Wildcats on winning the Pop
3 Warner Football 160-pound Midget Team
4 National Championship.

5 (Applause.)

6 COUNCILWOMAN TASC0: On Friday,
7 December the 12th, at the Disney Wide
8 World of Sports in Orlando, Florida, the
9 2008 Northwest Philadelphia Wildcats
10 160-pound Midget Team Wildcats defeated
11 the Oak Park Trojans 8 to 6 to win the
12 Pop Warner Football National
13 Championship; and

14 Whereas, led by the dynamic and
15 committed Head Coach Carlton Williams and
16 helped by Assistant Coaches Thomas
17 Morgan, Chris Frazier, Harun Reed and
18 Kenneth McCuthchen, the Wildcats had a
19 spectacular season that consisted of 15
20 wins and no losses, where they
21 outscored --

22 (Applause.)

23 COUNCILWOMAN TASC0: --

24 (continued) where they outscored their
25 opponents 350 to 55 and defeated teams

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2 from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maryland,
3 Michigan and California on their road to
4 this National Championship; and

5 COUNCILWOMAN MILLER: Whereas,
6 the Wildcats is a football program
7 located in the West Oak Lane section of
8 Philadelphia and consists of youth
9 between the ages of 13 and 16 years old,
10 and its mission is to establish and
11 maintain a well-organized program of
12 intellectual and athletic experiences
13 that stress the qualities of
14 participation, competition, sportsmanship
15 and pride and facilitate a basic
16 understanding between parents, youth and
17 coaches, resulting in community
18 solidarity through mutual involvement;
19 and

20 Whereas, the Wildcats' football
21 program has a vested interest in the
22 growth and development of each and every
23 member on and off the field and helps
24 prevent inner city youth from engaging in
25 negative behavior and is an effective

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2 alternative to drugs, violence and crime
3 and give youth the opportunity to healthy
4 lifestyles, prevents childhood obesity
5 and prevents health-related illness in
6 the future; and

7 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Whereas,
8 the Wildcats are participants in the
9 Liberty Youth Athletic Association,
10 "Liberty Youth," Pop Warner Little
11 Scholarship Football League, and Liberty
12 Youth is organized to develop and operate
13 a football league in affiliation with Pop
14 Warner Little Scholars, Inc., which is a
15 non-profit corporation founded in 1929
16 that provides youth football and cheer
17 programs for approximately 400,000 young
18 people ranging in ages from 5 to 16 years
19 old in 42 states and several countries
20 around the world.

21 Now, therefore, be it resolved,
22 by the Council of the City of
23 Philadelphia, that we hereby recognize
24 and honor the 2008 Northwest Philadelphia
25 Wildcats on winning the Pop Warner

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2 Football National Championship.

3 We congratulate Head Coach
4 Williams, the Assistant Coaches and the
5 entire Wildcats team on this impressive
6 accomplishment and for serving as
7 outstanding ambassadors for the City of
8 Philadelphia and being a source of pride
9 for all of the citizens.

10 Further resolved, that an
11 engrossed copy of this resolution be
12 presented to the Wildcats as evidence of
13 the sincere sentiments of this
14 legislative body and a demonstration of
15 its unwavering support for the Wildcats
16 in their defense of the National
17 Championship next season.

18 Certification that this is a
19 true and correct copy of the original
20 resolution, adopted by the Council of the
21 City of Philadelphia on the 5th day of
22 February 2009. Signed by President Verna
23 and supported by all members of City
24 Council.

25 Thank you, young men. We are

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2 proud of you.

3 (Applause.)

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The
5 Chair recognizes Mr. Williams for
6 remarks.

7 MR. WILLIAMS: Thank you so
8 much, Councilwoman Tasco, Councilwoman
9 Donna Reed Miller and all the City
10 Council. I guess many of you know me by
11 day with my daytime job as Deputy Streets
12 Commissioner for the City of
13 Philadelphia, but this is my second job.
14 This is a job that I don't get paid for
15 by monetary rewards, but I do get paid
16 for in other ways, and that's inspiring
17 young people to be successful. And these
18 young men right here did an outstanding
19 job when they went down to Florida. We
20 went down along with three other teams in
21 the City of Philadelphia, the North
22 Philly Aztecs and the Frankford Chargers,
23 and I can tell you that our young people
24 represented the City of Philadelphia with
25 pride, dignity, respect and true

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2 Philadelphia brotherly love. It's the
3 type of atmosphere that we want to create
4 in all of our neighborhoods, and this is
5 what our young people do. These are the
6 young people that go out here and are the
7 positive success stories in the City of
8 Philadelphia who come out and work hard
9 and accomplish great things.

10 So I am extremely proud of what
11 they accomplished on the field, but I'm
12 even more proud of them for what they're
13 doing in school. Pop Warner Little
14 Scholars requires you to have academic
15 standards, that you meet minimum academic
16 requirements to participate. They cannot
17 be on the team if they're failing in
18 school. So one of the grades, one of the
19 things --

20 (Applause.)

21 MR. WILLIAMS: Absolutely. We
22 work very hard with them to make sure
23 that they stay on top of their grades,
24 because we know the true reward is not at
25 the end of the day -- if they make it to

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2 the NFL, that's great, and I hope many of
3 them or some of them do, but by a long
4 shot, the most important thing that we
5 want them to do is stay in something
6 productive, positive and get a good
7 education. And these are the things that
8 we are proud of them by being not only
9 champions on the field but champions off
10 the field as well.

11 So I am proud of you.

12 Thank you so much, Councilwoman
13 Tasco, Councilwoman Donna Reed Miller and
14 the entire City Council. Without the
15 Philadelphia Activity Fund grant and
16 without a lot of the fundraising that you
17 helped us accomplish, these kids would
18 not have been able to go down to Florida
19 and participate in such a wonderful
20 experience. So thank you so much.

21 (Applause.)

22 MR. WILLIAMS: Thank you, Madam
23 President.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERA:
25 Congratulations.

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2 Council will be at ease.

3 (Council at ease.)

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The
5 Chair recognizes Councilman Clarke, who
6 will present a resolution recognizing the
7 Strawberry Mansion Athletic Association.

8 Will Mr. Derrick Ford and those
9 accompanying him please join the
10 Councilman at the podium.

11 I see that Councilman Clarke is
12 being joined by Councilwoman Brown and
13 Councilman Greenlee.

14 The Chair recognizes Councilman
15 Clarke.

16 COUNCILMAN CLARKE: Thank you,
17 Madam President. Madam President,
18 continuing along the sports theme, it's a
19 pleasure today for me as a longtime
20 resident and native of Strawberry Mansion
21 to be in a position to bring these men
22 and women to Council today. This is kind
23 of like the other side of the coin from
24 the prior presentation. One of the
25 things that I would like to do -- wanted

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2 to do today was to kind of give you the
3 people who traditionally are in the
4 background, the coaches, the parents, the
5 people who do the work to make sure that
6 these kids go to practice, make sure that
7 these kids have the level of respect that
8 they did.

9 This Strawberry Mansion -- one
10 of the reasons why I thought this was
11 particularly interesting, that the start
12 of this Athletic Association actually
13 started at a meeting in Strawberry
14 Mansion when we were unveiling security
15 cameras and we were talking about crime
16 in the community, and we had this big
17 presentation that was covered by the news
18 and we were talking about all of the
19 things that were happening in a negative
20 sense, and at that meeting, there was a
21 challenge issued to particularly the
22 young men in the neighborhood -- and I'd
23 like to say "young," because they're like
24 my age -- to step to the plate, and we
25 talked about the fact that when I grew up

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2 in Strawberry Mansion, all of these men
3 and women grew up in Strawberry Mansion,
4 the parents and all the neighbors stepped
5 to the plate and made sure that they got
6 us involved in sports and other types of
7 activity, and about a week later, I got a
8 call from my man Derrick telling me -- he
9 sends me a flyer about this tryout that
10 he's having for the baseball team, and
11 now it has ballooned into a significant
12 Athletic Association. It's actually been
13 covered by Channel 10 and the Daily News
14 on a consistent basis, and I'm just so
15 proud of them, and I wanted to get them
16 down here in our house to show them how
17 significant what they're doing in the
18 neighborhood, because these are the role
19 models in the neighborhood. And, frankly
20 speaking, when I go out to the games, the
21 young men and women, they don't care who
22 I am, right, but they look up to these
23 individuals. They say, This is
24 Councilman Clarke. Yeah, whatever, I'm
25 going over to see Coach. You know what I

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2 mean? And that's what it should be all
3 about, because they're the ones that do
4 the hard labor in the community. So it's
5 an honor for me to be able to have them
6 down here today.

7 Recognizing and honoring the
8 Strawberry Mansion Athletic Association
9 on its establishment and for its
10 remarkable contribution to the youth of
11 the 5th District and the community as a
12 whole.

13 Whereas, the Strawberry Mansion
14 Athletic Association was established in
15 April of 2007 at a community meeting at
16 Cornerstone Baptist Church; and

17 Whereas, soon after a baseball
18 league was established by League CEO
19 Derrick Ford at Mander Playground located
20 at 33rd and Diamond Streets for boys and
21 girls from the ages of 8 to 16, with a
22 particular focus on education, family
23 values and respect; and

24 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,
25 the first season began with 147 kids

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2 showing up to play baseball, from which
3 eight teams from around the community
4 were developed; and

5 Whereas, those initial eight
6 teams grew to 18 teams in 2008 playing at
7 nine different locations around the City;
8 and

9 Whereas, the Strawberry Mansion
10 All-Stars Baseball League theme is
11 "Through It All, Let's Play Ball"; and

12 Whereas, several community
13 members volunteered to assist in
14 organizing and developing the league as
15 well as serve as coaches or assistant
16 coaches; and

17 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas,
18 these community members include Head
19 Coaches Commissioner David "Itchy" Lisby,
20 Tony Witfield, Karen Washington, Aaron
21 Washington, William McQueen, Kevin Beard,
22 Bill Thompson, Mike Griggs, Kirk Norwood,
23 David Givens, James Carter and Don
24 Blakeley, and Assistant Coaches Daphine
25 Goggins, Bernard Savage, Christopher

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2 Silver and Robert Gay; and

3 Whereas, the Strawberry Mansion
4 Flag Football League was established in
5 the fall of 2007; and

6 Whereas, development of the
7 Flag Football League was important after
8 the conclusion of the baseball season had
9 concluded, giving the youth something
10 positive to be involved in; and

11 Whereas, all Strawberry Mansion
12 Flag Football games are played at 33rd
13 and Diamond Streets and coached by
14 volunteer community members, including
15 Founder, Derrick Ford, Commissioner
16 Anthony "Kokonut," with a K, Rogers, and
17 Head Coaches Haile Johnson, Marcus
18 Grimes, Malik Quarels and Carl Robinson.

19 Now, therefore

20 COUNCILMAN CLARKE: Be it
21 resolved, by the City Council of
22 Philadelphia, that the Strawberry Mansion
23 Athletic Association be recognized on its
24 establishment and for its remarkable
25 contribution to the youth of the 5th

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2 District and the community as a whole.

3 Be it further resolved that an
4 engrossed copy of this resolution be

8 Congratulations, men and women.
