## P R O C E E D I N G S

COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

Good morning, everyone.

I'm asking for all members to please take their seats. All visitors, please retire to the seats outside the rails. Please take all sidebar conversations out of the Council chambers.

I note that the hour has come and that a quorum of this City Council is present. Before proceeding, I'll ask all those presents to please set your cell phones to silent and/or vibrate. Thank you very much.

To give our invocation this morning, the Chair recognizes Reverend Tony Pritchette, founder and pastor of Provision of Grace World Mission Church. He is here today as guests of the Majority Deputy Whip Councilmember Cindy Bass.

1 Will all members and guests  
2 please rise?

3 PASTOR PRITCHETTE: Good  
4 morning, Council and the people of  
5 Philadelphia. Let us pray.

6 Heavenly Father, we come  
7 before you with gratitude for the  
8 opportunity to serve and to lead.  
9 We thank you for this City of  
10 Philadelphia, its people, its  
11 history, its future. Lord, we lift  
12 up this Council, especially its  
13 President, Kenyatta Johnson, and  
14 every member gathered here today,  
15 grant them wisdom to make sound  
16 decisions, the courage to stand for  
17 what is right, and humility to serve  
18 with integrity.

19 As Philadelphia, the  
20 birthplace of our nation, prepare to  
21 celebrate its 250th anniversary, we  
22 thank you for all the generations  
23 that have come before us and for the  
24 foundation they laid. As events and

1 gatherings take place across this  
2 city, we pray for peace, safety, and  
3 unity. Let this be a time not only  
4 of celebration, but of reflection,  
5 renewal and commitment to the values  
6 that strengthen our nation, cities,  
7 and community.

8           Guide their discussions  
9 that they may be thoughtful and  
10 productive. Let every decision made  
11 in this place promote justice,  
12 fairness, and the well-being of all  
13 citizens, especially those who are  
14 underserved, overlooked, vulnerable,  
15 and in need.

16           Father, help them to rise  
17 above division and work together in  
18 unity for the common good of all.  
19 Give them clarity in complex matters  
20 and peace in the moment of  
21 disagreement.

22           We pray for our  
23 neighborhoods that may be safe,  
24 thriving, and filled with hope.

1 Strengthen those who serve this city  
2 daily and bless every work and  
3 effort that seeks to uplift this  
4 city and every hand committed to  
5 building a better Philadelphia. May  
6 all that is done here today bring  
7 honor, accountability, progress, and  
8 commitment to truth and service in  
9 building this great city. In your  
10 name we pray. Amen.

11 COUNCILMEMBERS: Amen.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
13 Amen.

14 The Chair thanks the  
15 Reverend for the invocation. The  
16 City Council will now be at ease.

17 (Council at ease.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

19 Members, please take your  
20 seats. The next order of business  
21 is the approval of the journal of  
22 the meeting of Thursday, April the  
23 23rd, 2026.

24 The Chair recognizes

1 Majority Deputy Whip Councilmember  
2 Cindy Bass.

3 COUNCILMEMBER BASS: Thank  
4 you, Mr. President. I move to the  
5 journal of the meeting of Thursday,  
6 April 23rd, 2026 be approved.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
8 It has been moved and properly  
9 seconded that the journal of the  
10 meeting of Thursday, April the 23rd,  
11 2026 stand approved. All those in  
12 favor will signify by saying aye.

13 COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
15 Those opposed? The ayes have it,  
16 and the journal is approved.

17 The next order of business  
18 is request for leave of absence, and  
19 the Chair recognizes Councilmember  
20 Majority Leader Katherine Gilmore-  
21 Richardson.

22 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-  
23 RICHARDSON: Thank you,  
24 Mr. President. On behalf of the

1 majority, there are no requests for  
2 leave of absence today.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

4 Thank you very much. The Chair  
5 thanks the Majority Leader. The  
6 Chair recognizes Minority Leader  
7 Councilmember Kendra Brooks.

8 COUNCILMEMBER BROOKS:

9 Thank you. On behalf of the  
10 minority, there are no requests for  
11 leaves of absence.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

13 Thank you very much. The Chair  
14 thanks the Minority Leader.

15 The Chair now recognizes  
16 Councilmember Majority Leader  
17 Katherine Gilmore-Richardson for a  
18 motion concerning certain  
19 legislative matters that may arise  
20 during the course of today's session  
21 of Council and that were not listed  
22 on the calendar circulated prior to  
23 today's City Council session.

24 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE -

1 RICHARDSON: Thank you,  
2 Mr. President. I move that any of  
3 the following matters, if considered  
4 today, may be added to the agenda  
5 for this session of Council, and as  
6 required by law, subsequently  
7 published on an amended agenda after  
8 the consideration of those matters.

9 Resolutions authorizing  
10 hearings, amendments to bills on  
11 first reading, the reconsideration  
12 of a bill vetoed by or recall from  
13 the Mayor, amendments to bills  
14 recall from the Mayor, resolutions  
15 taking substantive action to be  
16 voted on in this session, a motion  
17 to withdraw a bill or resolution  
18 that is not on the calendar, and a  
19 motion placing a bill or a  
20 resolution on, or returning a bill  
21 or resolution from the suspension  
22 calendar that is not listed on  
23 today's calendar.

24 The purpose of this motion



1 is to provide the public with notice  
2 concerning possible actions by  
3 Council that arose too late to be  
4 included on the calendar that was  
5 published prior to today's session.

6 COUNCILMEMBER: Second.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

8 It has been moved and properly  
9 seconded that the legislative  
10 matters stated by Majority Leader  
11 Katherine Gilmore-Richardson may be  
12 added to the agenda for today,  
13 should those matters arise during  
14 the course of this session of  
15 Council. All those in favor will  
16 signify by saying aye.

17 COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

19 Those opposed? The ayes have it,  
20 and the motion carries.

21 The Chair will dispense  
22 with a regular order of business to  
23 recognize the guests and visitors  
24 joining us in City Council Chambers

1 this morning. On behalf of all  
2 members of City Council, I welcome  
3 you to our Council session. We  
4 appreciate you taking the time to  
5 join us as we attend the legislative  
6 affairs of our great city. We  
7 certainly invite you to come again.

8 I want to take a moment to  
9 acknowledge, joining us today for  
10 today's City Council session, State  
11 Representative Keith Harris. Thank  
12 you for joining us, sir.

13 I also have the staff  
14 joining me as my guest, the staff of  
15 State Senator Anthony Hardy  
16 Williams. Thank you for joining us  
17 as well today.

18 At this time, the Chair  
19 recognizes Majority Leader Katherine  
20 Gilmore-Richardson.

21 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-  
22 RICHARDSON:

23 Thank you, Mr. President.  
24 Today, I rise to recognize the

1 presence of our National  
2 Apprenticeship Week partners. I ask  
3 that they stand as they are  
4 recognized.

5 We have our union partners  
6 from the Philadelphia Building  
7 Trades. We have the carpenters  
8 represented. The AFL-CIO. A big  
9 shout out to Monica Robinson for all  
10 of her work this week, particularly  
11 with the Union Experience Fair. All  
12 of our CTE teachers who are  
13 represented, including our middle  
14 school CTE teacher, Mr. Jared, and  
15 all of the partners who are with us  
16 today for National Apprenticeship  
17 Week, thank you very much for being  
18 here. We appreciate your presence.  
19 And thank you to the PFT for their  
20 coordination amongst schools, all  
21 the schools that we visited this  
22 week.

23 In addition, Mr. President,  
24 I wanted to take this opportunity

1 prior to the presentation to welcome  
2 the guest of the Reverend Dr. Lorina  
3 Marshall-Blake here to City Council  
4 Chambers. You will hear more about  
5 her wonderful body of work over the  
6 last 35 years here in the City of  
7 Philadelphia.

8 And if you know anything  
9 about Philadelphia, you know the  
10 name Reverend Dr. Lorina Marshall-  
11 Blake. So I wanted to take this  
12 opportunity just to recognize many  
13 of her guests who are here today.  
14 We have the opportunity to celebrate  
15 and uplift her last night at  
16 Independence Blue Cross.

17 But I wanted to recognize  
18 her family, if her family could  
19 please stand, as well as the Vine  
20 Memorial Baptist Church family, as  
21 well as -- as well as the ladies,  
22 the lovely ladies of Alpha Kappa  
23 Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, as  
24 well as the members and the members

1 of The Links, Incorporated, who are  
2 here as well for the Reverend  
3 Dr. Lorina Marshall-Blake. We will  
4 also recognize all of the members of  
5 the Independence Blue Cross family  
6 during the resolution presentation.  
7 Thank you.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

9 Thank you, Majority Leader. A well-  
10 deserved presentation today for  
11 Dr. Lorina Marshall-Blake. And when  
12 we talk about the Labor Movement,  
13 Majority Leader Gilmore-Richardson,  
14 I also want to acknowledge one of  
15 your guests, Mr. Butch Bennett. We  
16 thank him for all the work that he's  
17 doing on behalf of the building  
18 trades. Thank you for joining us.

19 The Chair recognizes  
20 Councilman Dr. Nina Ahmad.

21 COUNCILMEMBER AHMAD: Thank  
22 you. Thank you, Council President.  
23 In recognition of National Volunteer  
24 Month, I'd like to take a moment to

1 recognize some honored guests who  
2 are going to have a resolution in  
3 their honor as well later on. And  
4 they're in the chamber today, whose  
5 exemplary history of volunteer  
6 service in their communities must be  
7 acknowledged.

8 Dr. Charlotte Brown, Rachel  
9 Hannibal, Tiana T. Goodwin,  
10 Dr. Jasmine Wright, and Mecca  
11 Robinson, and all who are here to  
12 support them. Please stand so we  
13 can give you a round of applause.

14 Thank you, Council  
15 President.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
17 You're welcome. Very well deserved.  
18 Councilmember Curtis Jones, Jr.

19 COUNCILMEMBER JONES: Yes.  
20 Thank you, Mr. President. And my  
21 esteemed colleague Jamie Gauthier is  
22 recognizing, I believe, Boys Latin  
23 today. So are they here? So we  
24 share -- she has one school in the

1 3rd, I have one school in the 4th,  
2 and we meet in the middle on Market  
3 Street. So welcome and I would say  
4 something in Latin like veni, vidi,  
5 vici: we came, we saw, we  
6 conquered, but we are proud of those  
7 young men. Thank you,  
8 Mr. President.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

10 Thank you very much. Where are  
11 those little young men from Boys  
12 Latin? They're still in the  
13 chambers? Can you-all stand? Let's  
14 get these young men a round of  
15 applause. Can we get a real big  
16 round of applause, please? Channel  
17 6, can you get a picture of this  
18 over there? These young men with  
19 their ties on and their blazers,  
20 very fine young men? They don't  
21 have Pooh Shiesty masks on and pants  
22 ain't sagging. We definitely want  
23 to see that on Channel 6. They sure  
24 enough show the other side.

1           The Chair recognizes  
2 Councilmember Dr. Anthony Phillips.

3           COUNCILMEMBER PHILLIPS:

4       Thank you, Council President. In  
5 the spirit of recognizing young  
6 people in the city of Philadelphia,  
7 today, we have the privilege and  
8 honor. They just stepped out for a  
9 please second, but I want them to  
10 know that we acknowledged them, that  
11 we have students from Phelps High  
12 School.

13           Their coach, Mr. Lindsey is  
14 here who's being recognized for his  
15 contributions to athletics in the  
16 9th District, as well as Coach  
17 Shakir Johnson from Olney High  
18 School is also being recognized  
19 today, and his team and his members  
20 are here today. So let's get those  
21 young people around of applause  
22 today.

23           COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

24       Indeed.



1 Member Young, your light  
2 was on. You still like to be  
3 acknowledged, sir? Okay. All  
4 right. Thank you very much.

5 At this time, the Chair  
6 recognizes the gentleman from South  
7 Philadelphia, Chair of  
8 Appropriations, the 1st Councilmanic  
9 District, Mark Squilla, who will  
10 present a resolution honoring and  
11 recognizing Lodge No. 2 of the Grand  
12 Lodge of Pennsylvania, free and  
13 accepted ancient York Masons for its  
14 historical significance and the  
15 founding of the Nation's 268 years  
16 of dedication to leadership and  
17 mentorship, and its continued  
18 contributions to charitable  
19 organizations in the city of  
20 Philadelphia.

21 Would the Worship Master  
22 Peter Lavelle and those accompanying  
23 him please join Councilmember  
24 Squilla at the podium?

1                   Joining Member Squilla are  
2                   the following members:

3                   Councilmember Nicolas  
4                   O'Rourke, Councilmember Rue Landau,  
5                   Councilmember Jim Harrity, and  
6                   Councilmember Dr. Anthony Phillips  
7                   and Councilmember Quetcy Lozada.

8                   The floor is yours,  
9                   Mr. Squilla.

10                  COUNCILMEMBER SQUILLA:

11                  Thank you, Mr. President.

12                  And today, it's a great  
13                  honor of mine to be able to offer  
14                  this recognition to an organization  
15                  that is always out there giving back  
16                  to our community, to our city, to  
17                  the Commonwealth and to the nation.  
18                  So it's with great pleasure that we  
19                  honor and recognize Lodge 2 of the  
20                  Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania Free and  
21                  Accepted Ancient York Masons for its  
22                  historical significance in the  
23                  founding of the nation and its 268  
24                  years of dedication to leadership

1 and mentorship, and its continued  
2 contributions to the charitable  
3 organizations in the city of  
4 Philadelphia.

5 COUNCILMEMBER O'ROURKE:

6 Whereas, Lodge No. 2, Free and  
7 Accepted Ancient York Rite Masons  
8 was constitutionally warranted in  
9 1758 and has maintained a continuous  
10 existence in the city of  
11 Philadelphia for 268 years, making  
12 it the oldest existing Masonic Lodge  
13 in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania,  
14 and one of the oldest fraternal  
15 organizations in North America. And  
16 --

17 COUNCILMEMBER HARRITY:

18 Whereas, the history of Lodge No. 2  
19 is intricately linked to the birth  
20 of the United States, as its  
21 membership during the Revolutionary  
22 War included a distinguished roster  
23 of Patriots, comprising 16 colonels,  
24 10 majors, and 28 captains on the

1 continental Army, including such  
2 notable figures as Colonel Thomas  
3 Proctor, High Sheriff of  
4 Philadelphia, and Colonel Allen  
5 McLane. And --

6 COUNCILMEMBER LANDAU:

7 Whereas, Lodge No. 2 played a  
8 pivotal role in their early civic  
9 life of the young nation, organizing  
10 the historic procession to Christ  
11 Church on December 28th, 1778, in  
12 which brother George Washington  
13 participated, celebrating the  
14 British evacuation of Philadelphia.  
15 And --

16 COUNCILMEMBER PHILLIPS:

17 Whereas, the Reverend Smith D.D.  
18 Provost of the College of  
19 Philadelphia, now known as the  
20 University of Pennsylvania, and a  
21 prominent member of Lodge No. 2  
22 authored the Almond Resin of 1783,  
23 the book, A Masonic Law, dedicated  
24 to General George Washington,

1     thereby cemented a bond between the  
2     father of our country and the  
3     Philadelphia fraternity.  And --

4                 COUNCILMEMBER GAUTHIER:

5     Whereas, the indelible mark of Lodge  
6     No. 2 on the founding documents of  
7     this nation is embodied by Brother  
8     John Dunlap, Esquire, who entered  
9     the Lodge in 1768, and who, serving  
10    as the official printer to the  
11    continental Congress, worked through  
12    the night of July 4th, 1776 to  
13    produce the first printed broadsides  
14    of the Declaration of Independence,  
15    thereby disseminating the  
16    fundamental ideals of American  
17    liberty to the colonies and the  
18    world.  And --

19                COUNCILMEMBER BASS:

20    Whereas, the patriotic devotion of  
21    the brethren of Lodge No. 2 is  
22    further exemplified by the  
23    extraordinary sacrifices of Brother  
24    Haym Salomon, a brilliant merchant

1 and indispensable financier of the  
2 American Revolution, who tirelessly  
3 brokered bills of exchange, secure  
4 critical foreign loans, and pledge  
5 his personal fortune to fund the  
6 Continental Army and the delegates  
7 of the Continental Congress,  
8 ensuring the survival and ultimate  
9 victory of the Patriot cause. And  
10 --

11 COUNCILMEMBER LOZADA:

12 Whereas, Lodge No. 2 established a  
13 president of organized municipal  
14 philanthropy in 1785 by donating the  
15 proceeds of the sale of the  
16 Freemasons Lodge, amounting to over  
17 1,500 to the city of Philadelphia to  
18 establish a fund for relief of  
19 the indigent, a charitable trust  
20 that continues to benefit the city  
21 today. And --

22 COUNCILMEMBER YOUNG: And

23 whereas, the Lodge demonstrated  
24 remarkable resilience during the

1 19th century, particularly through  
2 the leadership of Worship Master  
3 William Cummings, who preserved the  
4 Lodge's warrant and continuity  
5 during the anti-Masonic agitation of  
6 the 1830s, ensuring that its lights  
7 would not be extinguished.

8           And whereas Lodge No. 2  
9 continues to exemplify the Masonic  
10 tenets of brotherly love and relief  
11 in the 21st century through active  
12 hands-on community service,  
13 including regularly volunteering  
14 their time and resources to prepare  
15 meals for transplant patients and  
16 their families at Gift of Life  
17 Howie's House, as well as regularly  
18 donating blood through the Masonic  
19 Blood and Organ Donor Program. Now  
20 therefore be it --

21           COUNCILMEMBER SQUILLA:

22 Resolved by the City Council and the  
23 city of Philadelphia, hereby honors  
24 and recognizes Lodge No. 2 of the

1 Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania for its  
2 extraordinary 268-year history in  
3 foundational role of the American  
4 Revolution and its unwavering  
5 commitment to charity, leadership,  
6 and the welfare of the citizens of  
7 Philadelphia.

8 Further resolved in this  
9 engrossed copy of this resolution be  
10 presented to Worship Master Peter  
11 Lavelle and Brethren of Lodge No. 2,  
12 as an expression of sincere respect  
13 and its admiration of this  
14 legislative body. Congratulations.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
16 The Chair recognizes Worship Master  
17 Peter Lavelle for remarks. Brother  
18 Peter Lavelle.

19 MR. LAVELLE: Thank you.  
20 This is kind of overwhelming. So  
21 what I want to do is actually I want  
22 to -- I have the brothers that  
23 joined me today, starting this way,  
24 introduce themselves. So we have --



1 Ariel, you want to start?

2 MR. GONZALEZ: Ariel

3 Gonzalez, past master of Lodge 2.

4 Thank you for your -- for inviting  
5 us.

6 MR. LAVELLE: Okay. Yeah.

7 Brother Miraldi Gustave and Brother  
8 Kevin Rees, Brother Bill Soloway,  
9 Brother Chris Julio, Brother Dennis  
10 Zavala, and Brother Mike Vivas.

11 First of all, I just want  
12 to acknowledge the men and women  
13 that currently serve in the military  
14 and have served that has made it  
15 possible for us to celebrate the 250  
16 years of a nation we call our home.

17 Our challenges and progress  
18 make us the greatest experience in  
19 experiment on earth. Thank you,  
20 Council President, members of City  
21 Council, distinguished guests, and  
22 all those gathered here today.

23 On behalf of Lodge No. 2,  
24 Free and Accepted Masons of

1 Pennsylvania, I'm deeply honored to  
2 stand before you and accept this  
3 resolution. The recognition is not  
4 only a reflection of our  
5 organization's history, but also a  
6 testament to the enduring commitment  
7 of our members, past and present,  
8 who have dedicated themselves to  
9 service integrity and the betterment  
10 of our community.

11 Lodge No. 2 has long stood  
12 as a pillar of unity and purpose.  
13 From our earliest days, we have  
14 sought to uplift those in need,  
15 foster strong bonds among our  
16 members, and contribute meaningfully  
17 to the civic life of this great  
18 city. Philadelphia is a place of  
19 rich in history, resilience and  
20 hope, and we all are proud to play  
21 even a small role in carrying those  
22 traditions forward.

23 This resolution affirms  
24 that our efforts matter, it reminds

1 us that service, when done with  
2 sincerity and inconsistency creates  
3 a lasting impact, whether through  
4 charitable initiatives, mentorship,  
5 or simply showing up for our  
6 neighbors. We strive everyday to  
7 live out the values we hold dear,  
8 because attitude reflects  
9 leadership.

10 I would like to extend my  
11 gratitude to the members of City  
12 Council for this honor, and to  
13 everyone who has supported Lodge No.  
14 2 along the way. Most importantly,  
15 I want to recognize the brothers of  
16 the Lodge, their significant others,  
17 those who came before us, and those  
18 who serve today, and those who will  
19 carry this work into the future.  
20 This recognition belongs to all of  
21 you.

22 As we accept this  
23 resolution, we do not see this as a  
24 culmination, but as a renewed call

1 to action. We remain committed to  
2 strengthening our community,  
3 building bridges across differences,  
4 and continuing our legacy of service  
5 here in Philadelphia.

6 Members of City Council,  
7 please accept this small gift as a  
8 token of our gratitude. It is a  
9 commemorative coin to commemorate  
10 our nation's birthday, with the  
11 opposite side featuring Lodge No.  
12 2's seal, a reminder of being second  
13 to none. However, also a reminder  
14 that those in service to others of  
15 being first among equals in which  
16 much is appreciated.

17 In closing, we celebrate  
18 the founding of our nation this  
19 year. Happy birthday to all. To  
20 everyone, thank you very much for  
21 this. We're deeply honored.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
23 Council will be at ease.

24 (Council at ease.)

1 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

2 At this time, the Chair recognizes  
3 Majority Leader Katherine Gilmore-  
4 Richardson, who will present a  
5 resolution honoring and recognizing  
6 the awesome, iconic, empowering,  
7 committed, passionate, public  
8 servant, spiritual Dr. Lorina  
9 Marshall-Blake. Joining Majority  
10 Leader Gilmore-Richardson are the  
11 following Councilmembers:

12 Councilmember Dr. Anthony  
13 Phillips, Councilmember Jamie  
14 Gauthier, Councilmember Rue Landau,  
15 Councilmember Quetcy Lozada,  
16 Councilmember Jeffrey J. Young,  
17 Councilmember Minority Leader Kendra  
18 Brooks, Councilmember Jim Harrity,  
19 Councilmember Cindy Bass, and  
20 Councilmember Dr. Nina Ahmad.

21 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-

22 RICHARDSON: Thank you. Thank you  
23 very much, Council President.  
24 Please join us Councilmember

1 Blondell Reynolds Brown. Thank you  
2 so much, Council President, and  
3 thank you to my --

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
5 Excuse me, Majority Leader  
6 Richardson. Just one second.

7 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-  
8 RICHARDSON: Yes, sir.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
10 Could we take all sidebar  
11 conversations out of Council  
12 chambers, and we will present the  
13 resolution presentation when our  
14 guests are at the podium. Now I've  
15 been down here since 2011, I never  
16 seen this many people. Never. Not  
17 one time. You talk about a life  
18 well spent touching people, you  
19 never seen nothing like this. Don't  
20 let no smoke at all.

21 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-  
22 RICHARDSON: Thank you. Thank you  
23 very much, Council President. Thank  
24 you very much, Council President,

1 and to my colleagues and all  
2 assembled, this large robust  
3 gathering, the largest I've ever  
4 seen. Not only since being a member  
5 of Council, but since I had the  
6 opportunity to serve here as an  
7 intern and a former staffer for  
8 Councilmember Blondell Reynolds  
9 Brown. I have never seen a  
10 resolution presentation this large,  
11 but it is truly a testament to a job  
12 well done by the Reverend Dr. Lorina  
13 Marshall-Blake.

14 "May the work I do speak  
15 for me to appreciate beauty, to find  
16 the best in others, to leave the  
17 world a bit better, whether by a  
18 healthy child, a garden patch, or a  
19 redeemed social condition, to know  
20 that even one life has breathed  
21 easier because you have lived, this  
22 is to have succeeded." That is  
23 Ralph Waldo Emerson, and it  
24 perfectly describes the Reverend

1 Dr. Lorina Marshall-Blake.

2 Today is a very special  
3 day, and we are celebrating a true  
4 Philadelphia icon, Reverend  
5 Dr. Lorina Marshall-Blake, the  
6 former president of the Independence  
7 Blue Cross Foundation, and former  
8 Vice President of Community Affairs  
9 for Independence Blue Cross, known  
10 for her kind spirit, her loving  
11 heart, her wonderful prayers, her  
12 great books, and a hat collection  
13 that will rival any. We want to  
14 take this auspicious occasion to  
15 recognize our true Philadelphia icon  
16 today.

17 So first, I want to  
18 recognize those who are joining us  
19 for this momentous occasion. And in  
20 their absence, I must recognize Greg  
21 Devins and Kelly Munson of  
22 Independence Blue Cross. Steve  
23 Farrah, executive Vice President of  
24 Public Affairs for Independence Blue



1 Cross; Mitch Vidovich, Vice  
2 President of Government Affairs for  
3 Independence Blue Cross. You know,  
4 we can't do anything without Heather  
5 and without Denise. Thank you,  
6 Heather and Denise.

7 And for everyone else here  
8 from the IBX team to support our  
9 legendary Philadelphia icon, as well  
10 as the family of the Reverend  
11 Dr. Lorina Marshall-Blake, all of  
12 her friends and loved ones who were  
13 here, the Vine Memorial Baptist  
14 Church family, Alpha Kappa Alpha  
15 Sorority, Incorporated, The Links,  
16 Incorporated, Metropolitan Chapter  
17 of the Continentals, the Forum for  
18 Executive Women, the Committee of  
19 Seventy, the Anti-Defamation  
20 Committee, and the National  
21 Coalition of 100 Black Women,  
22 Incorporated Pennsylvania chapter.  
23 And I'm going to say that's just to  
24 name a few.

1           And so it has been an  
2 absolute honor not only to work with  
3 the remarkable Reverend Dr. Lorina  
4 Marshall-Blake over the years, but  
5 to have the distinct privilege to  
6 consider her a friend. When I first  
7 became a member of Philadelphia City  
8 Council, it was three months into  
9 the role, and the world was hit with  
10 COVID. And I will tell you it was  
11 an opportunity for her to shine.

12           She worked with us to  
13 ensure that we created a program to  
14 reskill and upskill home health  
15 aides, to give them opportunities to  
16 become certified nursing assistants,  
17 so that we were able to fill empty  
18 slots and vacancies across our  
19 healthcare institutions and nursing  
20 care facilities during the pandemic  
21 when they were needed most. That's  
22 the type of work that she does.

23           To know Reverend Dr. Lorina  
24 Marshall-Blake is to truly

1 understand the power of her  
2 leadership, her ability to light up  
3 a room, uplift Philadelphians at  
4 every level while exemplifying the  
5 values and mission of Independence  
6 Blue Cross and just who she is, and  
7 show up for our communities.

8           Though I know we will see  
9 her often, her retirement or her  
10 rewiring marks the end of an era,  
11 one that has had a lasting positive  
12 impact on the lives of so many  
13 Philadelphians and beyond. Whether  
14 her -- whether through her impactful  
15 work at Independence Blue Cross, and  
16 for those of you who have been  
17 around a little bit at the  
18 Philadelphia Gas Works to improve  
19 the health and wellbeing of  
20 Philadelphians, her service across  
21 25 boards and committees throughout  
22 her career or the unmistakable way,  
23 she pulls off the most elegant hats  
24 you have ever seen, she has

1 redefined leadership in this city  
2 and her impact will be felt for  
3 generations to come.

4 To say you will be missed  
5 simply does not do you justice. You  
6 are a true champion for  
7 Philadelphians. Reverend Dr. Lorina  
8 Marshall-Blake, on behalf of a  
9 grateful city of Philadelphia, thank  
10 you for your extraordinary service,  
11 your unwavering commitment, and the  
12 legacy you are leaving behind at  
13 Independence Blue Cross.  
14 Congratulations on a remarkable  
15 career and a well-deserved  
16 retirement and rewiring.

17 Whereas, Reverend  
18 Dr. Lorina Marshall-Blake has  
19 distinguished herself as a  
20 trailblazing leader and dedicated  
21 public servant whose career has been  
22 defined by her steadfast commitment  
23 to advancing the needs of the city  
24 of Philadelphia and improving the

1 lives of those she serves. And --

2 COUNCILMEMBER LOZADA:

3 Whereas, Reverend Dr. Lorina  
4 Marshall-Blake has served as the  
5 president of the Independence Blue  
6 Cross Foundation, where she has led  
7 strategic programmatic and  
8 operational efforts to advance the  
9 foundation's mission to lead  
10 sustainable solutions that improve  
11 the health and wellness of  
12 communities in Philadelphia. And --

13 COUNCILMEMBER BROOKS:

14 Whereas, Reverend Dr. Lorina  
15 Marshall-Blake has overseen  
16 115-million in grant-making while  
17 leading the foundation, and has  
18 distinguished herself as a  
19 collaborator, innovator, convener of  
20 the birth organizations and  
21 thoughtful leader in addressing  
22 emerging health needs. And --

23 COUNCILMEMBER AHMAD:

24 Before I begin, I just want to give

1 my thanks. This is a woman who got  
2 engaged in maternal mortality. She  
3 trained as a doula; that's the kind  
4 of person she is. So sorry about  
5 that, but I had to put that in.  
6 Thank you.

7           Whereas, Reverend  
8 Dr. Lorina Marshall-Blake has  
9 devoted her time to her church and  
10 community through serving as an  
11 associate minister at Vine Memorial  
12 Baptist Church, and through her  
13 active involvement in more than 30  
14 professional and civic  
15 organizations, including serving as  
16 the 28th president of Alpha Kappa  
17 Alpha Sorority, Inc. Omega Omega  
18 chapter. And --

19           COUNCILMEMBER BASS:  
20 Whereas, Reverend Dr. Lorina  
21 Marshall-Blake has been recognized  
22 for her exemplary leadership and  
23 service by diverse organizations,  
24 such as the NAACP, the Girl Scouts

1 of Eastern Pennsylvania, and the  
2 Philadelphia Tribune. And just as a  
3 matter of personal privilege, thank  
4 you for all of your service. God  
5 bless you. And --

6 COUNCILMEMBER LANDAU:

7 Whereas, Reverend Dr. Lorina  
8 Marshall-Blake has been the  
9 recipient of many prestigious awards  
10 and honors, including the 2025  
11 Philadelphia Region's Leaders Award  
12 from the Philadelphia Tribune and  
13 the Healthcare Innovator Award from  
14 the Philadelphia Business Journal.  
15 And --

16 COUNCILMEMBER GAUTHIER:

17 Whereas, Reverend Dr. Lorina  
18 Marshall-Blake has given her time in  
19 service on 25 nonprofit boards and  
20 committees of local, state, and  
21 national organizations, including  
22 Urban Affairs Coalition, Baptist  
23 Pastors Ministers Conference, and  
24 Forum for Executive Women. And --

1 COUNCILMEMBER PHILLIPS:

2 What an -- I'm going to be two  
3 seconds out of the decorum, maybe  
4 10, but I just want to say if there  
5 was ever an organization in the city  
6 of Philadelphia that needed support,  
7 this lady, through \$115 million,  
8 provided that support and put IBX in  
9 the city of Philadelphia on the map  
10 for their community contributions.  
11 So she has the right to wear many  
12 hats.

13 Whereas, Reverend  
14 Dr. Lorina Marshall-Blake's academic  
15 achievements include a bachelor's  
16 degree from Antioch College, and a  
17 master's degree from the University  
18 of Pennsylvania, and she has been  
19 named the Honorary Fellow of the  
20 American Academy of Nursing and as a  
21 former appointee to the National  
22 Advisory Council on Nursing  
23 Education and Practice in the US  
24 Department of Health and Human



1 Services. And --

2 COUNCILMEMBER YOUNG: And  
3 whereas, Reverend Dr. Lorina  
4 Marshall Blake throughout her  
5 accomplished career has exemplified  
6 an unwavering commitment to  
7 improving the lives of others and  
8 has left a lasting legacy on the  
9 city of Philadelphia, as you can  
10 see, and beyond. Now, there's --  
11 now therefore being --

12 COUNCILMEMBER HARRITY: You  
13 know, everybody knows the Reverend  
14 Dr., so we all have something to  
15 say, but Councilwoman Gilmore-  
16 Richardson quoted Emerson, but I  
17 always think of Martin Luther King  
18 in my favorite speech, "If you want  
19 to be great, wonderful." And then it  
20 ends with, "But those who are  
21 greatest among us are those who are  
22 of service." And that is her to a  
23 T.

24 Therefore be it resolved by

1 the city of Philadelphia that we  
2 hereby celebrate and acknowledge the  
3 leadership and outstanding  
4 contributions of Reverend Dr. Lorina  
5 Marshall-Blake in the city of  
6 Philadelphia, and extend our best  
7 wishes on her retirement. She's not  
8 going anywhere.

9 COUNCILMEMBER JONES: So  
10 Dr. Marshall is known by many names  
11 in many different rooms, but all of  
12 them with respect, all of them  
13 making a difference. And I shared  
14 one room with her in grad school  
15 with Dr. James Speedy, where we  
16 shared cold pizza and a lot. And he  
17 would provoke Dr. Marshall into  
18 these debates. And I was like, "No,  
19 don't engage. No." But she would go  
20 right at him. And he relished  
21 arguing with her about different  
22 things from women's rights to  
23 politics and everything. And I will  
24 say this today, Dr. Speedy would be

1 proud.

2 MS. MARSHALL-BLAKE: He  
3 would be.

4 COUNCILMEMBER JONES: Thank  
5 you, ma'am.

6 COUNCILMEMBER BASS: And  
7 further resolve that an engrossed  
8 copy of this resolution be presented  
9 to Reverend Dr. Lorina Marshall-  
10 Blake further evidencing the sincere  
11 respect of this legislative body.  
12 Congratulations.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
14 Congratulations. The Chair  
15 recognizes the Reverend  
16 Dr. Marshall, Dr. Lorina Marshall-  
17 Blake for remarks.

18 MS. MARSHALL-BLAKE: Thank  
19 you, Mr. President. First thing I  
20 would say before I even start my  
21 remarks, is to God be the glory for  
22 the great things he has done and  
23 continues to do in me for his  
24 people. But again, thank you,

1 Mr. President, especially Majority  
2 Leader Katherine Gilmore-Richardson,  
3 for doing this.

4 I am deeply honored and  
5 profoundly grateful to the  
6 Philadelphia City Council for this  
7 resolution, acknowledging 35 years  
8 of service to Independence Blue  
9 Cross, and most importantly, for me,  
10 to the people of this great city.

11 Philadelphia has shaped me,  
12 challenged me, and inspired me. And  
13 to be recognized by its elected  
14 leaders is both humbling and  
15 meaningful beyond words. For 35  
16 years, it has been my privilege to  
17 serve alongside dedicated colleagues  
18 at Independence Blue Cross, who  
19 believe as I do that access to care,  
20 community investment, and health  
21 equity are not optional; they are  
22 essential.

23 This work has never been  
24 about a single individual, but about

1 collective impact, shared purpose,  
2 and standing in the gap for our  
3 neighbors. I also want to thank my  
4 family, who has been my first  
5 ministry, my steady foundation, and  
6 my greatest source of strength.  
7 Thank them for their love, their  
8 patience, and prayers have made  
9 every season possible.

10 To my church family, Vine  
11 Memorial Baptist Church, thank you  
12 for grounding me in faith, service,  
13 and servant leadership. You remind  
14 me daily that our work in the  
15 community must always be anchored in  
16 love.

17 I'm also grateful for the  
18 sisterhood and service of Alpha  
19 Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated,  
20 The Links, Incorporated, the  
21 Coalition of 100 Black Women, the  
22 Impact Continentals Forum for  
23 Executive Women, the Committee of  
24 Seventy, and the Black Jewish

1 Committee of the Anti-Defamation  
2 League, and the other many  
3 organizations and boards that I've  
4 had the opportunity and privilege to  
5 serve. Each has strengthened my  
6 commitment to leadership, advocacy,  
7 and lifting as we climb.

8           Someone once said, no one  
9 is more cherished in this world than  
10 someone who lightens the burdens of  
11 another. That belief has guided my  
12 life's work. Service is not simply  
13 what we do, it is who we are. Thank  
14 you again to City Council for this  
15 acknowledgement and to the people of  
16 Philadelphia for allowing me the  
17 honor of serving. I remain  
18 committed to this city, to its  
19 communities, and to doing work that  
20 matters. This is not a goodbye;  
21 it's just a thank you, and stay  
22 tuned for the next chapter.

23           COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
24 Council will be at ease.

1 (Council at ease.)

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

3 At this time, the Chair recognizes  
4 Minority Leader Kendra Brooks, who  
5 will present a resolution honoring  
6 and recognizing Women Against Abuse  
7 on the occasion of his 50th  
8 anniversary and celebrating five  
9 decades of leadership on the front  
10 lines of Philadelphia's response to  
11 domestic violence. With someone who  
12 is no stranger to City Council,  
13 who's Joanna Otero Cruz, and those  
14 accompanying her, please join the  
15 councilmember at the podium.

16 Joining the presentation  
17 with Member Brooks is Councilmember  
18 Quetcy Lozada, Councilmember Jamie  
19 Gauthier, Councilmember Cindy Bass,  
20 Councilmember Dr. Nina Ahmad,  
21 Councilmember Rue Landau, and  
22 Councilmember Katherine Gilmore-  
23 Richardson. The Ladies of City  
24 Council.

1 COUNCILMEMBER BROOKS: Good

2 morning. Good morning. Today we  
3 are celebrating the leaders, the  
4 advocates, the attorneys, the  
5 providers, and the survivors who  
6 make up Women Against Abuse. Some  
7 of you know I lost my cousin Tiana  
8 to domestic violence 10 years ago.  
9 Since then, I have honored Tiana's  
10 memory by advocating for survivors  
11 of domestic violence, passing  
12 legislation on coercive control, and  
13 working to expand the resources  
14 available for impacted families.

15 Over the past few weeks,  
16 I've been deeply disturbed by the  
17 multiple stories of Black women and  
18 children murdered by men and their  
19 families. I want to take a moment  
20 to recognize a good friend of mine,  
21 Mayor Nancy Metayer from Coral  
22 Springs, Florida.

23 As a society and as a city,  
24 we have so much more work to keep



1 people safe from domestic violence.  
2 One of our leading partners in this  
3 work is Women Against Abuse. And  
4 today, we celebrate them for 50  
5 years of standing up for survivors,  
6 overcoming stigma, and creating  
7 pathways to lasting safety.

8 Women Against Abuse serves  
9 thousands of Philadelphians each  
10 year and provides the city's only  
11 domestic violence emergency shelter,  
12 and serves as the lead operator of  
13 the Philadelphia Domestic Violence  
14 Hotline. There's no way to measure  
15 how many lives have been saved over  
16 the past 50 years. But today, we  
17 can celebrate the countless women  
18 and children who are still alive  
19 today because of the care and  
20 commitment of Women Against Abuse.

21 Now, I would like to turn  
22 it over to Councilmember Lozada, who  
23 co-introduced this resolution with  
24 me, and who has been a long-time

1 supporter of Women Against Abuse and  
2 their work.

3 COUNCILMEMBER LOZADA: Good  
4 morning. I am honored to be here  
5 introducing this resolution with  
6 Councilmember Majority Leader  
7 Brooks. I'd also like to thank  
8 every single one of the women who  
9 are involved in the work, the  
10 day-to-day work, and normalizing  
11 talking about domestic violence in  
12 our communities. I'd also like to  
13 -- I'd also like to introduce Joanna  
14 Otero Cruz, executive director and  
15 president of Women Against Abuse.  
16 And recognize her for her  
17 leadership.

18 COUNCILMEMBER BROOKS:  
19 Honoring and celebrating and  
20 recognizing Women Against Abuse on  
21 the occasion of the 50th anniversary  
22 and celebrating five decades of  
23 leadership on a frontline of  
24 Philadelphia's response to domestic

1 violence.

2 COUNCILMEMBER LANDAU:

3 Whereas, Women Against Abuse was  
4 founded in Philadelphia in 1976 by  
5 volunteers committed to ensuring  
6 that survivors of domestic violence  
7 were heard, believed, and supported.  
8 And --

9 COUNCILMEMBER BASS:

10 Whereas, from its earliest days,  
11 including its first Germantown Rural  
12 Home Shelter that quickly filled  
13 with families seeking safety, Women  
14 Against Abuse has remained rooted in  
15 Philadelphia's neighborhoods, and  
16 today stands as the city's  
17 comprehensive domestic violence  
18 provider operating critical  
19 lifelines for survivors of all  
20 gender identities through inclusive,  
21 culturally responsive, and  
22 accessible services. And --

23 COUNCILMEMBER GAUTHIER:

24 Whereas, the organization's mission

1 is to provide quality,  
2 compassionate, and non-judgmental  
3 services that foster self-respect  
4 and independence in persons  
5 experiencing intimate partner  
6 violence while leading the broader  
7 movement to end domestic violence  
8 through advocacy and community  
9 education. And --

10 COUNCILMEMBER AHMAD:

11 Whereas, for five decades, women  
12 against Abuse has helped shape how  
13 Philadelphia understands and  
14 responds to domestic violence,  
15 transforming it from a hidden, often  
16 dismissed issue into a public  
17 concern requiring coordinated  
18 citywide action. And --

19 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-

20 RICHARDSON: Whereas through  
21 leadership and innovation, Women  
22 Against Abuse has strengthened  
23 Philadelphia's safety net for  
24 survivors by operating two 100-bed

1 emergency shelters, providing  
2 nationally recognized legal  
3 services, delivering youth  
4 prevention programming, and  
5 expanding coordinated pathways to  
6 safety, and has advanced system-wide  
7 collaboration by convening community  
8 organizations, public agencies, and  
9 city leadership to support a more  
10 unified response to domestic  
11 violence, including through shared  
12 safety, Philadelphia's coordinated  
13 community response to relational  
14 violence. And --

15 COUNCILMEMBER LOZADA:

16 Whereas, as a trusted partner to the  
17 city of Philadelphia, Women Against  
18 Abuse has remained open, accessible,  
19 and responsive to survivors in times  
20 of crisis. And whereas, the  
21 organization's work reflects the  
22 strength and the compassion of  
23 Philadelphia, impacting countless  
24 survivors who have found safety,

1 stability, and hope towards  
2 programs. Now therefore be it --

3 COUNCILMEMBER BROOKS:

4 Resolve that the City Council hereby  
5 honors and recognizes Women Against  
6 Abuse for 50 years of service,  
7 celebrates its leadership in  
8 advancing safety and justice for  
9 survivors of domestic violence, and  
10 reaffirms his commitment to  
11 strengthening support systems and  
12 resources across Philadelphia.

13 I'd like to introduce  
14 Joanna Otero Cruz, director and  
15 President of Women Against Abuse.  
16 Joanna has a distinguished history  
17 of serving children, families, and  
18 survivors of intimate partner  
19 violence, and currently serves as  
20 the board president of the  
21 Pennsylvania Coalition Against  
22 Domestic Violence. She's a seasoned  
23 non-profit leader with deep roots in  
24 the Philadelphia region.

1           Most recently, Joanna was  
2   appointed by Mayor Kenny as deputy  
3   managing director of community  
4   services for the city of  
5   Philadelphia, where she oversaw  
6   eight departments and managed a  
7   \$23-million budget. Joanna.

8           COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

9   The Chair recognizes Joanna Otero  
10 Cruz.

11           MS. CRUZ: Good afternoon  
12 or actually good morning still  
13 members of Council. Thank you,  
14 Councilmember Lozada, and  
15 Councilmember Brooks, and all of the  
16 distinguished Councilmembers here  
17 praesenti. I'm here with my fellow  
18 WAA familia, friends and family, and  
19 I know that some early founders. I  
20 see Carol Tracy, and I know that  
21 Cynthia Fierro is around too, a  
22 former executive director and  
23 president of Women Against Abuse.

24           My name Joanna Otero Cruz,

1 and I am proud to stand here on  
2 behalf of Women Against Abuse as we  
3 celebrate 50 years of service of  
4 advocacy and partnership here in  
5 Philadelphia. Fifty years ago, our  
6 organization began with a simple but  
7 radical belief that everyone  
8 deserves to live free from violence  
9 in their own home.

10 We've come a long way from  
11 the volunteer run hotline that first  
12 answered calls from a woman -- for  
13 women at Philadelphia hospitals  
14 injured and afraid, and from our  
15 first shelter, as mentioned earlier,  
16 a three-bedroom, one bathroom row  
17 house that immediately got built  
18 with families that were in desperate  
19 need of safety.

20 And yet today, the same  
21 belief continues to guide every  
22 shelter bed we provide, every  
23 hotline call we answer, every legal  
24 protection we help secure in courts,



1 and every survivor we walk alongside  
2 with. But we know that this  
3 milestone is just not looking back;  
4 it's also about recognizing the  
5 all-going reality of our city.

6 Domestic violence remains  
7 one of the most urgent public safety  
8 and public health issues facing  
9 Philadelphia, and yet it is also one  
10 of the most solvable when we have  
11 strong systems, committed partners,  
12 and sustained investment.

13 That is where City Council  
14 leadership has mattered so deeply,  
15 and we thank you. Your support has  
16 helped ensure survivors have access  
17 to emergency shelter, legal support,  
18 safe housing, and prevention  
19 education. You have helped  
20 transform a life-threatening crisis  
21 into pathways towards safety and  
22 healing. And still we know that  
23 there is still more work to be done,  
24 because behind every statistic is a

1 person, a parent trying to protect  
2 their children, a young person  
3 navigating their first relationship,  
4 a survivor rebuilding their life  
5 after the unimaginable fear.

6           And behind every survivor  
7 is a community that must decide will  
8 we turn away or will we show up. At  
9 Women Against Abuse, we choose to  
10 show up every day, and we are  
11 grateful to have a city that has  
12 also chosen to show up with us. As  
13 we march 50 years, we honor the  
14 survivors whose courage fuels our  
15 mission. We honor the dedicated  
16 staff and volunteers and advocates  
17 who do this work with compassion  
18 each and every day, and we honor our  
19 city partners, especially City  
20 Council, for standing with us in the  
21 belief that safety is a right and  
22 not a privilege.

23           Let this anniversary be not  
24 only to celebrate how far we've

1     come, but a renewed commitment to  
2     where we -- where we must go. Next  
3     towards a Philadelphia where every  
4     home is safe and every survivor is  
5     believed and supported. Thank you  
6     for this honor, and for your  
7     continued partnership.

8                 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
9     Council will be at ease.

10                (Council at ease.)

11                COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

21 recognizes Councilman Quetcy Lozada  
22 for a report from the Committee on  
23 Public Property and Public Works.

24 COUNCILMEMBER LOZADA:

1 Thank you, Council President. The  
2 Committee of Public Property and  
3 Public Works reports out eight bills  
4 with a favorable recommendation.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
6 Thank you very much. Will the Chief  
7 Clerk please read the report.

8 CHIEF CLERK: The Committee  
9 on Public Property and Public Works  
10 to which we referred the following  
11 bills:

12 Bill No. 251067, an  
13 ordinance authorizing real estate  
14 transaction by the Commissioner of  
15 Public Property, the Philadelphia  
16 Redevelopment Authority, and the  
17 Philadelphia Land Bank necessary to  
18 permit the city of Philadelphia to  
19 acquire property bounded by Island  
20 Avenue, Elmwood Avenue, South 77th  
21 Street, Buist Avenue, South 78th  
22 Street, Cobbs Creek Waterway, the  
23 vacated section of South 75th, and  
24 the former Grays Avenue, including



1 property known as Jabari Recreation  
2 Center, all under certain terms and  
3 conditions.

4 Bill No. 251100, an  
5 ordinance authorizing the  
6 Commissioner of Public Property on  
7 behalf of the city to enter into an  
8 amendment to a sublease agreement  
9 with the Philadelphia Municipal  
10 Authority for use by the city of all  
11 or a portion of the premises located  
12 at 1600 through 26 John F. Kennedy,  
13 Boulevard, under certain terms and  
14 conditions.

15 Bill No. 260063, an  
16 ordinance renaming and designating  
17 the property commonly referred to as  
18 Panati Playground, located at 3100  
19 North 22nd Street, to the Allegheny  
20 West Recreation Center in  
21 recognition of community and  
22 neighbor -- and neighborhood that it  
23 serves.

24 Bill No. 260242, an

1 ordinance authorizing the  
2 Commissioner of Public Property to  
3 execute and deliver a deed to the  
4 Philadelphia Authority for  
5 Industrial Development, conveying  
6 fee simple title to a certain tract  
7 of city-owned land with buildings  
8 and improvements situated at 5928  
9 through 30 Germantown Avenue in the  
10 8th Councilmanic district of the  
11 city of Philadelphia.

12 Bill No. 260337, an  
13 ordinance authorizing the  
14 Commissioner of Public Property on  
15 behalf of the city of Philadelphia  
16 to enter into a lease or sublease  
17 agreements with the Philadelphia  
18 Authority for Industrial Development  
19 for all or a portion of the premises  
20 that includes certain parcels of  
21 land, generally referred to as  
22 Victory Gardens and Emerson  
23 Landfill, for environmental  
24 remediation of the land, develop a

1 facility -- development of a  
2 facility at set premises, and use by  
3 the International Union of Operating  
4 Engineers, Local 542, under -- all  
5 under certain terms and conditions.

6 Bill No. 260338, an  
7 ordinance authorizing the  
8 Commissioner of Public Property on  
9 behalf of the city of Philadelphia  
10 to grant PECO Energy Company an  
11 easement for the purpose of  
12 accessing, installing, maintaining,  
13 and repairing underground  
14 transformers and supporting  
15 infrastructure along and adjacent to  
16 a portion of the Penny Pack path in  
17 and about the area commonly known as  
18 7801 State Road, under certain terms  
19 and conditions.

20 Bill No. 260339, an  
21 ordinance amending Bill No. 241031,  
22 approved January 15th, 2025,  
23 authorizing the Commissioner of  
24 Public Property on behalf of the

1 city of Philadelphia to enter into a  
2 sublease agreement with the  
3 Philadelphia Municipal Authority for  
4 use by the city of a portion of the  
5 premises located at 1 South Broad  
6 Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania,  
7 under certain terms and condition,  
8 to authorize the lease of additional  
9 space within the premises, under  
10 certain terms and conditions.

11 And finally, Bill No.  
12 260341, an ordinance authorizing the  
13 Commissioner of Public Property on  
14 behalf of the city of Philadelphia  
15 to enter into a lease or sublease  
16 agreement with the Philadelphia  
17 Municipal Authority for use by the  
18 city of a portion of the premises  
19 located at 9353 Krewstown Road,  
20 under certain terms and conditions,  
21 respectfully reports it has  
22 considered the same and returns the  
23 attached bills to Council with a  
24 favorable recommendation.

1           There are no further bills  
2   to report out from the Committee on  
3   Public Property and Public Works,  
4   Council President.

5           COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
6   Thank you very much. The Chair  
7   recognizes Councilman Quetcy Lozada  
8   for a motion.

9           COUNCILMEMBER LOZADA:  
10   Thank you, Mr. President. I move  
11   that the rules of Council be  
12   suspended to permit first reading  
13   this day of the bills just read into  
14   the record by the Chief Clerk.

15           COUNCILMEMBERS: Second.

16           COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
17   It has been moved and properly  
18   seconded that the rules of Council  
19   be suspended so as to permit the  
20   consideration of the bills just read  
21   by the Chief Clerk at today's  
22   session of Council. All those in  
23   favor of the motion will signify by  
24   saying aye.

1 COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

3 Anyone opposed? The ayes have it.

4 The motion carries. These bills  
5 will be placed on our first reading  
6 calendar for today.

7 The Chair recognizes  
8 Councilmember Jeffrey J. Young for a  
9 report from the Committee on Streets  
10 and Services.

11 COUNCILMEMBER YOUNG: Thank  
12 you, Mr. President. The Committee  
13 on Streets and Services reports out  
14 12 bills with a favorable  
15 recommendation.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
17 Thank you very much. Chief Clerk,  
18 please read the report.

19 CHIEF CLERK: The Committee  
20 on Streets and Services to which  
21 were referred the following bills:

22 Bill No. 250806, an  
23 ordinance authorizing encroachments  
24 in the nature of a sidewalk cafe in

1 the vicinity of 1811 Fairmount  
2 Avenue, Philadelphia, PA 19130,  
3 under certain terms and conditions.

4 And Bill No. 250836, an  
5 ordinance authorizing encroachments  
6 in the nature of a sidewall cafe in  
7 the vicinity of 1444 Frankford  
8 Avenue, Philadelphia, PA 19125,  
9 under certain terms and conditions.

10 Bill No. 250918, an  
11 ordinance authorizing encroachments  
12 in the nature of a sidewalk cafe in  
13 the vicinity of 161 West Gerard  
14 Avenue, Philadelphia, PA 19122,  
15 under certain terms and conditions.

16 Bill No. 251029, an  
17 ordinance amending Title 12 of the  
18 Philadelphia Code, entitled Traffic  
19 Code, to provide for designated  
20 transportation network company  
21 vehicle stands, definitions and  
22 prohibitions, clarifying penalties  
23 related to bus, taxi cabs, and TNC  
24 vehicle stands, amending violations

1 subject to camera-based parking  
2 enforcement and amending parking  
3 violations subject to towing, all  
4 under certain terms and conditions.

5 Bill No. 251070, an  
6 ordinance amending section 12-926 of  
7 the Philadelphia Code, entitled  
8 Center City Parking Regulations, to  
9 confirm regulations adopted by the  
10 Department of Streets that  
11 established and revised loading zone  
12 regulations in additional portions  
13 of the center city area and  
14 reauthorize changes in additions to  
15 such regulations, all under certain  
16 terms and conditions.

17 Bill No. 260026, an  
18 ordinance amending section 12-701 of  
19 the Philadelphia code, entitled  
20 Designation of Bicycle Lanes to  
21 authorize a bicycle lane and removal  
22 of parking on Columbia Avenue, under  
23 certain terms and conditions.

24 Bill No. 260134, an



1 ordinance amending chapter 12-923 of  
2 the Philadelphia Code, entitled  
3 Smart Loading Zones, authorizing the  
4 Philadelphia Parking Authority to  
5 install smart loading zones in the  
6 area of Center City bounded by  
7 Spring Garden Street, Bainbridge  
8 Street, the Schuylkill River, and  
9 the Delaware River for the purpose  
10 of improving the appropriate use of  
11 loading zones and reducing traffic  
12 congestion, all under certain terms  
13 and conditions.

23 ordinance authorizing various  
24 encroachments in the vicinity of

1 2655 South Juniper Street,  
2 Philadelphia, PA 19148, under  
3 certain terms and conditions.

4 Bill No. 260240, an  
5 ordinance removing the parking lane  
6 and prohibiting stopping on the  
7 south side of Cinnaminson Street  
8 from Mitchell Street to Peach  
9 Street.

10 Bill No. 260267, an  
11 ordinance authorizing an  
12 encroachment in the nature of a  
13 staircase in the vicinity of 611  
14 South 7th Street, Philadelphia, PA  
15 19147, under certain terms and  
16 conditions, respectfully reports it  
17 has considered the same and returns  
18 the attached bill to Council with a  
19 favorable recommendation.

20 And Bill No. 260340, an  
21 ordinance authorizing various  
22 encroachments in the vicinity of 323  
23 North Broad Street, Philadelphia, PA  
24 19107, under certain terms and

1 conditions, respectfully reports it  
2 has considered and amended the same  
3 and returns the attached bill to  
4 Council with a favorable  
5 recommendation.

6 There are no further bills  
7 to report out from the Committee on  
8 Streets and Services, Council  
9 President.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
11 Thank you very much. The Chair  
12 recognizes Councilmember Jeffrey J.  
13 Young for a motion.

14 COUNCILMEMBER YOUNG: Thank  
15 you, Mr. President. I move that the  
16 rules of Council be suspended to  
17 permit first reading of these bills  
18 that were just read into the record  
19 by the Chief Clerk.

20 COUNCILMEMBERS: Second.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
22 It has been moved and properly  
23 seconded that the rules of Council  
24 be suspended so as to permit the

1 consideration of these bills just  
2 read by the Chief Clerk at today's  
3 session Council. All those in favor  
4 of the motion will signify by saying  
5 aye.

6 COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

8 Those opposed? The ayes have it.

9 The motion carries. These bills  
10 will be placed on our first reading  
11 calendar for today.

12 The Chair recognizes  
13 Councilman Mike Driscoll for a  
14 report from the Committee on  
15 Transportation and Public Utilities.

16 COUNCILMEMBER DRISCOLL:

17 Thank you, Mr. President. The  
18 Committee on Transportation and  
19 Public Utilities reports out two  
20 bills with a favorable  
21 recommendation.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

23 Thank you very much. Will the Chief  
24 Clerk please read the title of the

1 report?

2 CHIEF CLERK: The Committee  
3 on Transportation and Public  
4 Utilities to which were referred the  
5 following bills:

6 Bill No. 260265, an  
7 ordinance amending title 12 of the  
8 Philadelphia Code, entitled Traffic  
9 Code, to amend certain requirements  
10 applicable to buses and areas  
11 designated for use by buses,  
12 including applicable penalties, all  
13 under certain terms and conditions.

14 And Bill No. 260266, an  
15 ordinance authorizing the  
16 procurement commissioner to enter  
17 into agreements to purchase  
18 electricity, natural gas, and motor  
19 fuel for use by the city and city  
20 facilities and vehicles, including  
21 agreements that obligate payment for  
22 delivery of such energy supplies in  
23 future fiscal years, all under  
24 certain terms and conditions,

1 respectfully reports it has  
2 considered the same and returns the  
3 attached bills to Council with a  
4 favorable recommendation.

5 There are no further bills  
6 to report out from the Committee on  
7 Transportation and Public Utilities,  
8 Council President.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
10 Thank you very much. The Chair  
11 recognizes Councilman Mike Driscoll  
12 for a motion.

13 COUNCILMEMBER DRISCOLL:  
14 Thank you. Thank you,  
15 Mr. President. I move that the  
16 rules of Council be suspended to  
17 permit first reading this day of the  
18 bills just read into the record by  
19 the Chief Clerk.

20 COUNCILMEMBERS: Second.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
22 It has been moved and properly  
23 seconded that the rules of Council  
24 be suspended, so as to permit the

1 consideration of these bills just  
2 read by the Chief Clerk at today's  
3 session of Council. All those in  
4 favor of the motion will signify by  
5 saying aye.

6 COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

8 Those opposed? The ayes have it.

9 The motion carries. These bills  
10 will be placed on our first reading  
11 calendar for today. The next order  
12 of business is the consideration of  
13 the calendar. I note that the bills  
14 just reported from committees with  
15 suspension of the rules have been  
16 deemed to have had a first reading.  
17 These bills will be placed on the  
18 second reading and final passage  
19 calendar for the next session of  
20 Council.

21 As there are no additional  
22 bills on the first reading calendar,  
23 the Chair recognizes Majority Leader  
24 Katherine Gilmore-Richardson for a

1 motion concerning the bills and  
2 resolutions on the second reading  
3 and final passage calendar.

4 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-  
5 RICHARDSON: Thank you,  
6 Mr. President. The following  
7 resolutions on the final passage  
8 calendar, and the bills on second  
9 reading and final passage calendar  
10 are being called up today.

11 Resolution Nos. 260398,  
12 260399, 260400, 260401, 260402,  
13 260403, 260406, 260407, and 260408.  
14 And Bill Nos. 260213, 260214, and  
15 260215-A. The following bills on  
16 second reading and final passage are  
17 being held: 250768 and 250807.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
19 Thank you very much. Because --  
20 before considering these bills and  
21 resolutions, we will consider public  
22 comment as follows:

23 Your public comment must  
24 concern matters on the second



1 reading and final passage calendars  
2 for possible action in today's  
3 Council sessions.

4 All speakers must sign up  
5 in order to testify. If you have  
6 not already signed up for today's  
7 Council session, please do so now by  
8 giving your name to staff at the  
9 table outside the rail to my left.  
10 Once you have signed up, you will be  
11 called in the order in which your  
12 name appears on the sign-up sheets.

13 Under ideal circumstances,  
14 public commenters each will have  
15 three minutes to speak. However,  
16 this time limit may vary from  
17 session to session. Today, the time  
18 limit will be two minutes. In order  
19 to be fair to all those wishing to  
20 speak, I intend to hold faithfully  
21 to the two-minute limit.

22 When you begin speaking,  
23 you will see a green light on the  
24 podium. When there are 30 seconds

1 remaining to your time, the light  
2 will turn yellow, which is your  
3 reminder to conclude your remarks.  
4 Once two minutes have passed, the  
5 light will turn red and the  
6 sergeant-at-arms will disconnect the  
7 microphone. At that point, please  
8 yield the podium to the speaker who  
9 is coming after you, if not have --  
10 if you have not done so already. I  
11 also reserve the right pursuant to  
12 our Rules of Council to limit  
13 repetitious comments on the same  
14 subject matter.

15 I will now ask the clerk to  
16 please read the name of our first  
17 speaker.

18 CHIEF CLERK: Will the  
19 Honorable State Representative Keith  
20 Harris, Michael Fattih, Wick Savage,  
21 Lynn Landes, William Small,  
22 Dr. Charlotte Brown, Debbie  
23 Friedman, and Natasha Harris, please  
24 make your way to the podium.

1 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

2 State Representative Harris, the  
3 floor is yours, sir.

4 MR. HARRIS: State  
5 Representative Keith Harris. Before  
6 I speak on this resolution, I just  
7 would like to say as we celebrate  
8 the 50th anniversary of the Women  
9 Against Abuse, I just like to echo  
10 one name in this chamber, our own  
11 Linda Rios Newby, and honor her, and  
12 may she rest in peace.

13 Distinguished body of Council,  
14 Council President, I come as a  
15 neighbor and as a witness.

16 As someone who knows that  
17 strength of Philadelphia has always  
18 lived in the people who serve  
19 without needing a spotlight. Today,  
20 I'm a proud -- I'm proud to  
21 celebrate two remarkable women from  
22 my community and also the other  
23 honorees, I just work closely with  
24 these two women, Dr. Charlotte Brown

1 and Monica Boutier, best known as  
2 Mother Loving.

3 Dr. Brown has done the hard  
4 work, patient, heart-centered work  
5 of building spaces where people can  
6 heal, organize, and be restored.  
7 Her leadership reminds us that  
8 service is not just about showing up  
9 when the cameras are present. It is  
10 about staying present when people  
11 are hurting, when communities are  
12 tired, and when the work requires  
13 love, discipline, and consistency.

14 Monica Boutier represents  
15 that same spirit of community-rooted  
16 leadership. She is one of those  
17 people who holds the fabric  
18 together. She leads with care, she  
19 moves with purpose. She understands  
20 that real change is not always loud,  
21 but it is always felt by people  
22 whose lives are touched by it. And  
23 that is my -- that is why this  
24 recognition matters.

1                   When Councilmember Dr. Nina  
2 Ahmad honors women leaders through  
3 this resolution, she is not only  
4 lifting individual achievement; she  
5 is naming something bigger. She is  
6 naming the truth that Philadelphia  
7 is better because of women like  
8 Dr. Brown and Monica Boutier and the  
9 other honorees, who nurture,  
10 protect, organize, mentor, and lead  
11 with both strength and compassion.

12                   So today, I simply want to  
13 say thank you. Thank you for your  
14 service, thank you for your example.  
15 Thank you for showing our young  
16 people what leadership looks like  
17 when it is rooted in love,  
18 accountability, and community. On  
19 behalf of the neighbors who see you,  
20 the families who benefit from your  
21 work, and the community that is  
22 stronger because of you,  
23 congratulations on this well-  
24 deserved honor. Thank you.

1 MR. FODY: My name is Mike  
2 Fody. It's a pleasure to be here.  
3 I'm speaking today on the resolution  
4 where we're urged -- we have to urge  
5 President Trump and his  
6 administration to provide  
7 comprehensive fertility care and  
8 intravenous fertilization to the  
9 city. Here's the good news, folks;  
10 he already did it.

11 On October 16th, 2025,  
12 President Trump negotiated what's  
13 called most favorable, no, most  
14 favored nation status with EMD  
15 Serono, a leading drug manufacturer  
16 of fertility medication. The drug  
17 called Gonal-F, a common fertility  
18 drug, is now offered on [trumprx.gov](http://trumprx.gov)  
19 at a discounted rate of nearly 800  
20 percent.

21 The Center for Medicare &  
22 Medicaid Services estimated that  
23 women can save net -- nearly 50  
24 percent now on fertility drugs from

1 Trump's negotiations. If you're low  
2 income, drastically more. I just  
3 wanted to get the truth out now. We  
4 don't have to urge him. He already  
5 did it, but not only for the city,  
6 he did it for all of America.

7 But as I say this, and I'm  
8 glad he's working to bring more  
9 children into the world, I'm  
10 wondering how are we protecting our  
11 children now. Other cities are.  
12 News flash, The Maryland Daily  
13 Record newspaper said that  
14 Washington, D.C., Virginia, and  
15 Maryland just arrested 20,000  
16 criminals because they allowed ICE  
17 in.

18 Now, they said a majority  
19 of these criminals had criminal  
20 records: pedophiles, murderers,  
21 rapists. Sadly, these criminals  
22 will remain in Philadelphia because  
23 the board has restricted ICE. These  
24 were not the values that this great

1 city was founded on. It's much  
2 greater than that.

3 In fact, I went to a movie  
4 recently called A Great Awakening.  
5 Go see it. Instead of being woke,  
6 you'll be awakened like our founding  
7 fathers. I didn't know how much  
8 these men were guided by God. They  
9 gave their lives to Jesus Christ.  
10 They realized he died on the cross  
11 for their sins, your sins, my sins;  
12 past, present, and future.

13 And when you repent and put  
14 your faith in him, believe he died  
15 on the cross and rose again, he'll  
16 give you a new heart. He'll give  
17 you a new life.

18 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Your  
19 time is up.

20 MR. FODY: Okay. Let me --  
21 can I close one thing? Can I say  
22 one thing?

23 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE -  
24 RICHARDSON: Please conclude your



1 remarks.

2 MR. FODY: If you do not  
3 cooperate with ICE against President  
4 Trump to revoke your sanctuary city  
5 status, it's your obligation to  
6 protect the citizens. If you don't,  
7 he will. Thank you.

8 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-

9 RICHARDSON: Excuse me. Thank you  
10 all so much for being here today.  
11 We do have a robust list of public  
12 commenters, so we are respectfully  
13 requesting that everyone adhere to  
14 the two-minute limit. Thank you  
15 very much.

16 MALE VOICE 1: Good  
17 morning, City Council and members.  
18 I want to speak on Bill 250768.  
19 That is the Clean Air Bill, I  
20 believe, that Councilwoman Gauthier  
21 is supporting. But I first want to  
22 take this moment to thank Council  
23 President for supporting an  
24 organization called Girls Inc. last

1 Thursday. And it was a success of  
2 making sure that we support young  
3 ladies and their development.

4 Speaking about the Clean  
5 Air Act, if we can just teach our  
6 young people to bend down and pick  
7 up their trash like potato chip  
8 bags. In my community and my  
9 travels, even though I'm an old man  
10 now, I get down on one knee and pick  
11 up trash, and it's not my trash, but  
12 it's my city. And if we are going  
13 to have a green, cleaner city, we  
14 all have to participate as citizens  
15 to control this trash matter.

16 Yes, clean air is very  
17 important for all of us, but it  
18 starts at home and if we can  
19 participate as a city and help this  
20 mayor with a clean green city, I  
21 think we will wind up not having to  
22 use the various units that they use  
23 to burn trash. Thank you.

24 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank

1 you, sir.

2 MS. LANDIS: Good morning.

3 I'm Lynn Landis of Philly's  
4 Republican Network. I'm opposed to  
5 Bill 250807 because Center City  
6 District violates the spirit and  
7 intent of the Sunshine Act. And  
8 that they are allowed to tax but not  
9 required to hold public meetings nor  
10 accept public comments. Their  
11 policies are a troubling extension  
12 of the rules of -- for City Council  
13 and city departments, both of which  
14 restrict public comments to agenda  
15 items only. Because of these and  
16 other rules, the public is not able  
17 to hear nor share important  
18 information. For example, the  
19 public may be unaware that the Asian  
20 Americans United, a nonprofit that  
21 promotes open borders and an anti-  
22 ICE agenda, also appears to receive  
23 funding from the city of  
24 Philadelphia.

1 Philadelphia is home to  
2 over 3000 nonprofits employing  
3 roughly 175,000 people and have an  
4 estimated income of billions; \$48.5  
5 billion in revenue. Reportedly, 90  
6 percent of city contracts are  
7 awarded to nonprofits every year.

8 The question is how many of  
9 these nonprofits are also promoting  
10 a political agenda using our tax  
11 dollars? It's issues like these  
12 that need to be brought to the  
13 public's attention, which is why I'm  
14 requesting that at least one City  
15 Councilmember propose putting the  
16 discussion of amending City Council  
17 rules on the Rules Committee agenda.  
18 Thank you very much.

19 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank  
20 you.

21 MR. SMALL: Good morning,  
22 everybody. My name is William  
23 Small. I am a candidate for U.S.  
24 Congress in the 3rd District. I do

1 want to say thank you to the City  
2 Councilmembers who did stand up for  
3 Lankenau Environmental.

4 But with that being said,  
5 Bill 250807; I am in opposition of  
6 this. Because we are tired of the  
7 same pattern; vague land deals,  
8 broad authority, and the public  
9 being asked to trust decisions  
10 without full transparency. Too  
11 often the meeting happens in this  
12 chamber, but the real deals happen  
13 behind closed doors.

14 The people know what that  
15 means; properties move through the  
16 Land Bank, sheriff sales, tax sales,  
17 redevelopment pipelines, land  
18 changes hands, contracts get  
19 awarded, connected interests  
20 benefit, and the taxpayers, we're  
21 left footing the bill.

22 Meanwhile, Philadelphia  
23 residents are already carrying one  
24 of the heaviest tax burdens in

1 America. The heaviest. Every time  
2 City Hall needs money, the answer is  
3 the same; more taxes, more fees,  
4 more burden on us.

5 Now another rideshare tax  
6 is being proposed. But when do we  
7 finally benefit? When do families  
8 feel relief? When do workers get a  
9 break? When do taxpayers see real  
10 return? And if public property is  
11 truly meant to serve the public,  
12 then why are institutions like  
13 Lankenau Environment being -- have  
14 uncertainty for the future? That's  
15 why a lot of these people are here  
16 today. Isn't that exactly the  
17 problem? What benefits the people  
18 is too often neglected. What  
19 benefits insiders, that moves  
20 quickly.

21 We support parks. We  
22 support development, we support  
23 progress. But we do not support  
24 vague legislation, insider politics,

1 and taxpayers always coming last.  
2 No more blank checks, no more  
3 backroom deals. It's time to put  
4 Philadelphia, people who are really  
5 from Philadelphia first. Thank you.

6 MS. BROWN: Good day. I'm  
7 Dr. Charlotte Brown. It's an honor  
8 to be here. I'm so grateful to  
9 Councilmember Dr. Nina Ahmad for  
10 making sure that the people you see  
11 behind me, the voices of  
12 Philadelphia is represented well.

13 From the corners of the  
14 most dangerous areas in the city of  
15 Philadelphia, during the pandemic,  
16 with tents put up with our own  
17 resources serving the city when the  
18 city was shut down, when the state  
19 was shut down, we were there.

20 From marching from City  
21 Hall all the way to Hunting Park  
22 with young people with Mecca  
23 Robinson, we are here represented  
24 today to let you know that there is

1 a village in the city of  
2 Philadelphia. Whether we are behind  
3 the scenes or whether we calling  
4 each other two or three o'clock in  
5 the morning, we are here.

6 I recognize about a decade  
7 ago we were here in the same place  
8 saying that we wanted to be friends,  
9 and a certain Councilmember Jones  
10 said he wanted to be friends with  
11 us. Well, here's my friends and  
12 we'll continue to do the work in the  
13 city of Philadelphia. And I am so  
14 honored to do this.

15 Dr. Nina Ahmad, Natasha  
16 Harris, Rachel Hanible, Randall  
17 Sims, Andrea Lawful Sanders, Bridget  
18 Powell, Yolanda Bryant, Denise  
19 Ripley, Faith Evans, Dr. Lola Blunt,  
20 Sonya Blunt, Tina Marie Russell,  
21 Dr. Deshonda Williams, Rachel  
22 Hanible, Jamal Johnson, Mecca  
23 Robinson, Ricky Duncan, Anthony  
24 Baker, Sarrita Lewis, Diane Map,



1 Kimberly Nicole Richardson, Nicole  
2 Milcept, Jackie Johnson, Aisha Sara  
3 Patterson, Sheila Armstrong, Wanda  
4 Walker Samuel, Theresa Lundy, Kyle  
5 Morris, Monica Bula, and Ebony  
6 Richardson. For those who I left  
7 out, I did not mean to. It's so  
8 many of us. It's 60 of us, and we  
9 are here to continue to serve  
10 communities. Thank you for this  
11 time.

12 CHIEF CLERK: Debbie  
13 Friedman. Natasha Harris, Arthur  
14 Steinberg, Jonathan Jacobs, Sarah  
15 Apt, and David Alexander Jenkins,  
16 please make your way to the podium.

17 MR. HOOVER: Good morning,  
18 Council President Johnson, Majority  
19 Leader Catherine Gilmore-Richardson  
20 and members of City Council. My  
21 name is Benjamin Hoover, and I'm  
22 speaking on behalf of Arthur  
23 Steinberg, President of Philadelphia  
24 Federation of Teachers or PFT Local

1 3.

2 I'm also here on behalf of  
3 our more than 14,000 members to  
4 speak in support of resolution  
5 recognizing National Apprenticeship  
6 Week in Philadelphia. We in the  
7 labor movement have a saying All  
8 work is skilled work. When it comes  
9 to public education, the same  
10 principle applies. Career and  
11 Technical Education or CTE is just  
12 as challenging and ultimately as  
13 rewarding as advanced placement  
14 algebra or biology. Students who  
15 prefer vocational programming and  
16 who do best learning with their  
17 hands literally are just as studious  
18 and ambitious as any other.  
19 Registered apprenticeships provide  
20 transformational opportunities for  
21 students who learn firsthand that  
22 there is dignity in all labor.

23 As an added bonus,  
24 apprenticeship programs that partner

1 with labor unions, as those in the  
2 School District of Philadelphia do,  
3 show young people that belonging to  
4 a union opens up paths to secure  
5 futures and strong communities. The  
6 PFT is proud to collaborate with  
7 AFLCIO and all the other unions to  
8 host union experience fairs in  
9 schools across the city, in which we  
10 connect students with unionized  
11 professionals to discuss  
12 apprenticeship and career  
13 opportunities.

14 We are grateful to elected  
15 leaders in this body, including  
16 Majority Leader Gilmore-Richardson  
17 for increasing the city's investment  
18 and CTE programming and for  
19 supporting registered apprenticeship  
20 programs. Life is better in a union.  
21 Let's keep working to expand  
22 opportunities and optimism for its  
23 Philadelphia public school students.  
24 Thank you.

1 MS. HARRIS: My name is  
2 Natasha Harris. If you show me the  
3 five people that you surround  
4 yourself around every day, it will  
5 tell me exactly who you are. So if  
6 you take a look behind me, I got  
7 those five people and more. That's  
8 how deep we are. We are The Elite  
9 30. When you call on us, we come,  
10 boots on the ground. Even without  
11 the funding, even without the  
12 approval, we still get the job done.  
13 How we get the job done? Because we  
14 collaborate, we brought our service,  
15 we put our egos aside, we put our  
16 pride aside and we will run down on  
17 any block when it come to these  
18 kids. Okay? We will run down on  
19 any block, any room when it come to  
20 these kids --

21 FEMALE VOICE: That's  
22 right.

23 MS. HARRIS: -- because we  
24 don't play when it come about

1 education. Education is the most  
2 important tool, and that's what we  
3 use through literacy, through  
4 changing lives. And we thank  
5 Dr. Brown so much for being able to  
6 bring us together -- United we  
7 stand, divided we fall. Everyone in  
8 this room, make sure you ask about  
9 us. Make sure you Google us,  
10 individually and collectively  
11 because we're coming to see you. I  
12 don't know where them bags at in  
13 this room, but we're coming to see  
14 you because we want to collaborate  
15 with you on all levels, and we thank  
16 you so much. Thank you.

17 MR. JACOBS: Good morning.  
18 Good morning. Thank you, Majority  
19 Leader Richardson. My name is  
20 Jonathan Jacobs. I work for the  
21 School District of Philadelphia. I  
22 represent the Office of Career and  
23 Tech Education. I represent  
24 Mastbaum High School, West

1 Philadelphia High School, and  
2 Kensington Health Science Academy.  
3 And I'm here today with the AFLCIO  
4 to represent apprenticeships and to  
5 represent -- and thank you guys for  
6 recognizing the importance of the  
7 workforce we have here in our  
8 schools.

9 I want to say yesterday we  
10 just had 10 students from West  
11 Philadelphia High School seniors  
12 graduating, walking out the door  
13 with jobs at Penn Medicine making  
14 over \$20 an hour before they're even  
15 outside.

16 It's -- I'm really hoping  
17 that, City Council, we can go out  
18 there and really encourage our local  
19 industries and companies to call  
20 their school and ask for employees.  
21 Every time we've had -- every time  
22 we've had a company, a local  
23 industry call us at Mastbaum or West  
24 Philly, we've been able to send

1 students out. And I'm also asking  
2 that if we can really focus on  
3 making the process easier for our  
4 youth to get the opportunities that  
5 are available in Philadelphia.

6 With Councilwoman  
7 Richardson put out this amazing  
8 apprenticeship guidebook, which has  
9 now put all the people that they  
10 needed to contact to apply in their  
11 hands, which has made it easier.  
12 But right now we also have a system  
13 where we have all these  
14 opportunities through our C2L, but  
15 it's been really hard for students  
16 to apply.

17 We've really been changing  
18 lives in the city of Philadelphia.  
19 Right now, I can say last year we  
20 had three kids hired as an  
21 electrician at the airport. We've  
22 had kids hired at SEPTA now as auto  
23 mechanics. The city of Philadelphia  
24 itself has knocked it down with five

1 city preference points and hired  
2 kids as fleet auto mechanics.

3 And I'm really hoping we  
4 just create more of that and give  
5 opportunities to all of our  
6 students. So I'm just asking if  
7 everyone reach out to their local  
8 business and just encourage them to  
9 please reach out to the school.  
10 Call us, let us know what they're  
11 looking for, mentor them early. CT  
12 students are graduating at a 93  
13 percent rate versus traditional high  
14 school students. So please just  
15 give us an opportunity and build the  
16 workforce of Philadelphia. Thank  
17 you.

18 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE -  
19 RICHARDSON: Thank you very much.  
20 Council will be at ease.

21 CHIEF CLERK: Will Jerrett  
22 Johnson make your way to the podium?

23 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE -  
24 RICHARDSON: Council will be at



1 ease. Excuse me, Council will be at  
2 ease.

3 (Council at ease.)

4 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-

5 RICHARDSON: Please resume.

6 MR. JOHNSON: My name is  
7 Jerrett Johnson. I represent  
8 Transit Forward Philadelphia and I'm  
9 also a Lead Transit Organizer for  
10 Fiscal Advocacy. I'm here today to  
11 support the universal student fares  
12 brought on by Councilmember Landau.  
13 Every youth deserves a chance for  
14 independence to get to school,  
15 extracurricular activities, jobs,  
16 shopping, leisure activities, and so  
17 on, as well as some of those  
18 opportunities and internships  
19 without cost barriers.

20 Young people in Philly  
21 deserve the freedom of mobility and  
22 access to opportunities that will  
23 help build their futures.  
24 Unfortunately, the current SEPTA

1 Student Fare Program does not go far  
2 enough. Students who live less than  
3 1.5 miles from their school have --  
4 who have jobs after school,  
5 enrichment activities on the  
6 weekends or programs over the suburb  
7 are unable to use the SEPTA passes  
8 to reach them. Not all students are  
9 delinquent that cause troubles or  
10 jump to fare gates. Not all  
11 students are -- mean to cause harm.

12 There are young people in  
13 this city that want to have a future  
14 in striving society as well. Just  
15 like students in New York City,  
16 Seattle, and Washington, D.C.,  
17 Philly deserves the freedom to move  
18 around the area without having to  
19 depend on parents, families, and  
20 others to get around or to get a  
21 ride during school hours -- or after  
22 school hours, I mean. There are  
23 parents and peers who may be  
24 struggling financially as well.

1 Peer studies such as Washington,  
2 D.C. and New York City have recently  
3 given their students much freedom of  
4 mobility, so Philly should have the  
5 same opportunities.

6 By expanding the fares, it  
7 will give these students a chance to  
8 open a lot of doors for other -- and  
9 have other options to have a great  
10 future and to have some breathing  
11 room for parents and peers as well.  
12 Thank you very much for your time.

13 CHIEF CLERK: Will Harry  
14 Graham, Evan Jarret, Matthew  
15 Sconbox, Will Tung, and Quinlan  
16 Burke, please make your way to the  
17 podium.

18 MS. APT: Good morning. My  
19 name is Sarah Apt, and this is my  
20 15th year teaching at Olney High  
21 School. Eight of my students are  
22 here with me so that they can be  
23 part of the civic processes that  
24 affect them. I'm here to speak

1 about the importance of providing  
2 pathways to apprenticeships for  
3 young people in Philadelphia. Some  
4 young people have talents and  
5 passions so strong that just the  
6 basics of school don't serve them  
7 well.

8 I'd like to tell the story  
9 of a young person whose life was  
10 changed by access to  
11 pre-apprenticeships and  
12 apprenticeships. Tatiana Johnson  
13 did not love school. In fact, our  
14 principal told her that if she could  
15 make it through her whole senior  
16 year without fighting, he would  
17 shout her out at graduation. She  
18 did and he did. Her first three  
19 years had been less smooth. What  
20 changed?

21 In October of her senior  
22 year, she became a pre-apprentice,  
23 with Rosie's Girls at IBEW.  
24 Suddenly, Tatiana was motivated.

1 She had a goal, she had a reason to  
2 come to school, to excel in her  
3 classes, and to stay out of trouble  
4 and distraction. All in service of  
5 her chosen career as an electrician.  
6 Tatiana thrived at Rosie's Girls.  
7 And after the program ended, she  
8 continued as an intern at IBEW.

9 She is now, including right  
10 now today, helping a new class of  
11 Rosie's Girls to achieve their  
12 dreams and is herself in the process  
13 of applying to be an apprentice.  
14 This was not a lucky chance. For  
15 young people like Tatiana to  
16 succeed, we need an infrastructure.

17 In February, 2023, Monica  
18 Robinson and I organized  
19 Philadelphia high school's first  
20 apprenticeship fair, at my school,  
21 Olney High School. Young people  
22 learned that they had options for  
23 high paying interesting work with  
24 unions and dignity. Monica and I

1 expanded these fairs throughout the  
2 city to reach thousands of young  
3 people in what we now call the Union  
4 Experience Fairs.

5 After a young person hears  
6 about an opportunity at one of these  
7 fairs, then what? Do we hope that  
8 they find their way there? No. We  
9 support them by educating all of  
10 their teachers about the  
11 opportunities. We support them  
12 through pre- and post-fair  
13 education.

14 At Olney, we support them  
15 through a referral process that  
16 helps young people in every grade to  
17 come speak with me and get  
18 counseling about their dreams and  
19 options. We support them by  
20 offering a trades major with classes  
21 for 10th, 11th, and 12th grade  
22 students. We support them with over  
23 a dozen apprenticeship focused field  
24 trips a year. This was the fourth

1 year of our Union Experience Fairs  
2 at Olney. Some of --

3 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-

4 RICHARDSON: Please conclude your  
5 remarks.

6 MS. APT: Thank you. Some  
7 of our seniors greeted  
8 apprenticeship coordinators by name,  
9 and Cece Chun, who as a senior had  
10 learned about the Urban Technology  
11 Project, came back as a presenter --

12 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Wind up.

13 MS. APT: Thank you. We  
14 would like to continue these  
15 programs. Olney stands to lose this  
16 program among others if the proposed  
17 staff cuts to our school go three --  
18 through, we don't need fewer  
19 resources allocated, need more.  
20 Thank you.

21 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-

22 RICHARDSON: Please conclude your  
23 remarks. I have to keep it fair for  
24 everybody. Thank you.

1                   MR. JENKINS: Madam Chair,  
2 speakers, and guests, I'm David  
3 Alexander Jenkins and I rise to the  
4 resolution as presented by Member  
5 Landau. When I think about  
6 educational excellence and I think  
7 about the standards set by the  
8 students of Boys Latin and those of  
9 Olney High School, or Fels High  
10 School here in chambers today, I  
11 think about what it takes to be  
12 raised up in a city like  
13 Philadelphia.

14                   This greatest of cities,  
15 this city of brotherly love and dare  
16 I add sisterly affection. I think  
17 about the word opportunity because  
18 opportunity is where the foundation  
19 upon which all success is founded.  
20 But I am however reminded at time to  
21 time again in Philadelphia that we  
22 are far often participating either  
23 in the complacency or competency of  
24 the building of inequity in the very



1 infrastructure of this city,  
2 creating an opportunity gap that  
3 cannot be closed.

4           It is therefore that I come  
5 before you today to urge the  
6 passages of this resolution as  
7 presented: Exhibit A, a low-income  
8 student doesn't choose between  
9 inconvenience and participation;  
10 they choose between paying out of  
11 pocket money that they do not have  
12 to participate in school activities  
13 at all.

14           As it stands today, the  
15 School District of Philadelphia  
16 restricts students' fare cards and  
17 students living more than one mile  
18 and a half from school, and it cuts  
19 off fare cards entirely after  
20 8:00 p.m. A mile and a half. That,  
21 ladies and gentlemen, is a distance  
22 between Penn's Landing and 30th  
23 Street Station to get to school in  
24 some instances by 7:30 in the

1 morning. I mean, what could  
2 possibly happen to a 12-year-old at  
3 a mile and a half on the blocks of  
4 Philadelphia at 7:30 in the morning?  
5 I mean, really, what could happen?  
6 This is obscene.

7 Beloved, I do not need to  
8 holler, scream, jock or jive in  
9 crude and distasteful displays of  
10 power to relay that these students  
11 cannot afford an Uber ride home from  
12 a late-night school activity with or  
13 without a dollar, a fact tax affixed  
14 to their lives. I said what I said.

15 These cards are necessary.  
16 These hearings are not a radical  
17 ask; they are the minimum. And we  
18 owe it to our young people who are  
19 trying against real odds to build a  
20 future in this city. Philadelphia  
21 already has the mechanism to work  
22 with the Commonwealth and address  
23 these issues. Philadelphia  
24 recognizes the moral obligation we

1 need now to support this resolution.

2 MR. GRAHAM: Good  
3 afternoon. For the record, my name  
4 is Harry Graham, Jr., and this is my  
5 11th year of teaching welding at  
6 Benjamin Franklin High School.

7 Today, I'm here to speak in support  
8 of the National Apprenticeship Week  
9 resolution.

10 I'd like to thank Council  
11 President Johnson for the  
12 opportunity to address this body as  
13 well as Councilmember Gilmore-  
14 Richardson for her leadership and  
15 bringing this critical resolution  
16 forward. As a career in technical  
17 education teacher, my  
18 responsibilities extend outside the  
19 classroom.

20 I serve as a liaison  
21 between the academic theory and the  
22 practical talents that fuel our  
23 city's economy. CTE is important  
24 because it gives students a why

1 behind their study. It converts  
2 abstract principles into real world  
3 applications, guaranteeing that our  
4 graduates not only are college  
5 ready, but also career ready from  
6 the start.

7           Today, I want to focus on  
8 the power of a registered  
9 apprenticeship programs. In my  
10 experience teaching welding, I've  
11 witnessed how these programs have  
12 debt free road to the middle class.  
13 For many of my students, the most  
14 significant advantage of an  
15 apprenticeship is to earn while you  
16 learn paradigm. It eliminates the  
17 financial constraints that often  
18 prevent outstanding young people  
19 from pursuing higher education or  
20 specialized training.

21           When I talk to students  
22 about these options, I frequently  
23 mention that the most surprising  
24 aspects of a registered

1 apprenticeship is the amount of  
2 mentorship. It is more simply than  
3 a job. It is an introduction to a  
4 community of crafts people that care  
5 about your success.

6 My one piece of advice to  
7 any student choosing this road is to  
8 approach it with curiosity and  
9 tenacity. Technical abilities can  
10 be learned, but a thirst for  
11 knowledge is what transform an  
12 apprentice into a journeyman. For  
13 me, the influence of this work goes  
14 beyond a theoretical; it is a  
15 government, it is a generational.  
16 One of my former welding students  
17 from Ben Franklin High School now  
18 teaches welding at A. Philip  
19 Randolph Career and Technical High  
20 School.

21 Seeing the student move  
22 from the -- move to the front of the  
23 classroom, becoming a colleague and  
24 a leader in the School District of

1 Philadelphia is the ultimate  
2 indication that these programs work.  
3 We are not simply training welders;  
4 we are training future leaders.  
5 Thank you.

6 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: State  
7 your name for the record. You have  
8 two minutes, sir.

9 MR. JARRETT: Okay. My  
10 name is Evan Jarrett. I'm the  
11 building trade instructor at Mayfair  
12 Elementary. I'm speaking from a  
13 different lens. I'm speaking from  
14 engaging the students earlier.  
15 You've never seen 4th graders run to  
16 a classroom excited to learn a  
17 trade.

18 And I always preach when I  
19 post my everything that I post,  
20 exposure and opportunity. We got to  
21 expose the kids earlier to the  
22 trades so they can have options  
23 about knowing what they want do.  
24 Imagine if Harry Graham, the

1 instructor right there, he gets my  
2 students from 4th grade and they  
3 graduate 8th grade, and they know  
4 they want to go into the trades.  
5 It's going to help the unions. It's  
6 going to improve the quality of  
7 life. Students are going to come to  
8 school; crime is going come down  
9 because they have a sense of purpose  
10 and they feel like they can lose  
11 something.

12 I see it because I go to  
13 these schools. I'm at Wagner, I'm  
14 at all these other schools, and I  
15 see the kids how engaged they are  
16 when they come to my classroom. And  
17 Wagner, I'm only there on Saturdays.  
18 I'm going to say in closing, like I  
19 said, I'm going to keep it short.  
20 If -- we got to stop doing what we  
21 always been doing. We got to try to  
22 do something different. And if you  
23 want to build taller buildings, you  
24 got to build it -- dig a deeper

1 foundation. Thank you.

2 MR. SCHANBACHER: Hello.

3 My name is Matthew Schanbacher. I'm  
4 the Apprentice Coronary Training  
5 Director for the Bricklayers Allied  
6 Craftworkers Local 1. First, I  
7 would like to thank Council  
8 President Johnson for the  
9 opportunity to speak and also  
10 Councilmember Gilmore-Richardson for  
11 introducing the National Apprentice  
12 Resolution.

13 I'm a proud graduate of  
14 Local 1 Bricklayers Apprenticeship  
15 Program. I did and -- before that,  
16 I went to W.B. Saul High School,  
17 where I also -- hey, there you go --  
18 where I went through CTE program.  
19 And one of the most interesting  
20 things when I graduated or got into  
21 my apprenticeship was how much the  
22 CTE program helped.

23 In my CTE program, I  
24 learned welding and other things I



1 was able to carry into the trade.  
2 And the other thing that I learned  
3 through my apprenticeship was all  
4 the opportunities that are afforded  
5 to you once you graduate. There's  
6 plenty of roles you can grow into.  
7 You can become a foreman, you can  
8 become a superintendent, project  
9 manager, safety director, business  
10 agent, instructor, you know, the  
11 list goes on and on and on.

12           These are real careers for  
13 people. And this year at our  
14 apprenticeship program, we're  
15 graduating 38 apprentices. Now  
16 they're graduating with, like, a  
17 family sustaining wage and a  
18 lifelong career. This is going to  
19 change a life and be a career for  
20 the rest of our lives.

21           Yeah, if I had one thing of  
22 advice for an apprentice just  
23 starting out would be -- is to be  
24 self-motivated and to, you know,

1 lead by example. You know, we  
2 always go by the rules. If you're  
3 -- if you're early, you're on time.  
4 If you're late, you know, that's  
5 unacceptable. If you're on time,  
6 you're late. So thanks a lot.

7 MR. TUNG: Hello. Hello.  
8 Good afternoon. My name is Will  
9 Tung. I'm speaking in support of  
10 Councilmember Landau's resolution  
11 calling for hearings on SEPTA  
12 Student Fares. I'm a volunteer with  
13 5th Square Advocacy. We're a member  
14 of the Transit Forward Philly  
15 Coalition. I live in Kingsessing in  
16 Southwest Philly with my wife and  
17 12-year-old daughter.

18 I just want to bring up  
19 that the -- on Monday this city  
20 kicked off -- it's a summer thing.  
21 It's a lineup of summer programming  
22 and opportunities for youth, like my  
23 daughter, and my daughter will be a  
24 part of this with her rec center

1 summer camp. Her six-week summer  
2 camp is wonderful and it's  
3 affordable, and it costs us \$325 for  
4 the six weeks. Guess how much the  
5 SEPTA Fare will cost for us to get  
6 her -- get her there? It's \$348.  
7 It's \$30 more than the actual summer  
8 camp itself.

9           So for thousands of  
10 families, SEPTA is the difference  
11 between getting by and falling  
12 behind. We at 5th Square advocacy  
13 applaud Councilmember Landau for  
14 leading the fight to make our city  
15 more affordable for Philadelphia  
16 families and open up opportunities  
17 for children.

18           We support the resolution  
19 for hearings on SEPTA Student Fares  
20 and look forward to them. And there  
21 are thousands of kids with this  
22 SEPTA Student Fare Card sitting  
23 useless in their bag all summer, all  
24 night, and all weekends. This is a

1 policy choice, and it can be a  
2 different one. Thank you so much.

3 MR. BURKE: Hello. My name  
4 -- hello. My name is Quinlan Burke  
5 and I'm a student at Temple  
6 University. I'm here on behalf of  
7 the SEPTA Youth Advisory Council,  
8 and the YC would like to extend its  
9 thanks the Councilmember Landau for  
10 introducing this resolution on  
11 student fares here today.

12 Before moving to Philly for  
13 school, I spent my K-12 years  
14 growing up in New York City, where  
15 an iconic part of being a student  
16 was our Student MetroCard Passes.  
17 This program works identically to  
18 how Philly's currently does. Valid  
19 only from 5:30 a.m to 8:30 p.m on  
20 weekdays. And I often find myself  
21 needing to ask my parents for a few  
22 bucks if I wanted to attend a late-  
23 night sports game or go to a weekend  
24 volunteering event, and many of my

1 friends would just resort to fare  
2 evasion.

3 But a couple years ago, New  
4 York City expanded the program to  
5 allow for rides on weekends and over  
6 the summer. As my luck would have  
7 it, the program was implemented  
8 right after I graduated, but my  
9 brother was able to take -- is  
10 currently taking advantage. And the  
11 expanded passes serve not just as a  
12 ride to school for him, but as a  
13 passport to extracurricular  
14 activities, community events, and to  
15 the city as a whole.

16 That's why I can stand here  
17 and confirm what many already  
18 suspect, that expanding Student Fare  
19 Programs works. It has helped my  
20 family and thousands of others back  
21 at home. And I know it will help so  
22 many families in this city that are  
23 dealing with a cost of living crisis  
24 that we're facing down this country

1 by taking a small but meaningful, or  
2 not so small as we previously saw,  
3 meaningful expense off their balance  
4 sheets.

5 It is imperative that we  
6 move forward quickly with these  
7 hearings. And this summer, young  
8 people will have more opportunities  
9 than ever to engage with an  
10 international community of young  
11 folks, bond over a universal level  
12 of sports. But how can we expect  
13 them to get to Lemon Hill or Penn's  
14 Landing or The Linc? How can our  
15 students view transit as a reliable  
16 method of travel when the card in  
17 their pockets shuts off completely  
18 over the summer? Students in Philly  
19 deserve their own passport to their  
20 own city. I hope the Council  
21 seriously considers a hearing on the  
22 proposal, and I thank you for your  
23 time.

24 CHIEF CLERK: Will Jerrett

1 Johnson, Quinlan Burke, John  
2 McCauley, Jeremy Blattstein, Steven  
3 Bronskill, and Queen Judith Robinson  
4 make your way to the podium.

5 MR. MCCAULEY: Good  
6 morning, everyone. My name is John  
7 Allante McCauley. I'm with a  
8 grassroots organization called Flip  
9 Philly Red. We're here to offer you  
10 something different because you've  
11 been voting for the mayor's office  
12 for the past 70 years. In regard to  
13 this resolution urging Congress to  
14 provide comprehensive fertility care  
15 for IVF. This is a sensitive topic  
16 that I don't treat lightly.

17 In my journey to have a  
18 stronger relationship with God, I'm  
19 working not on -- working on not  
20 compromising God's plans for my  
21 human desires. At what point do we  
22 stop trying to play God? If we  
23 believe life begins at conception,  
24 then we can't treat embryos like

1 it's builder bear. IVF creates  
2 multiple embryos and then discards  
3 them or freezes them indefinitely.

4 In regards to this  
5 resolution, when did Democrat  
6 politicians start caring about  
7 military families? Did they care  
8 about the military families when  
9 they forced them to get the COVID  
10 shot or be discharged from the  
11 military? Did they care about  
12 military families when they  
13 compromised their safety,  
14 implementing their DEI policies?

15 The NDAA is for national  
16 defense and war fighting; not broad  
17 fertility coverage. Babies are  
18 supposed to be a blessing, but when  
19 you're selecting eye color, hair  
20 color, and choosing the sex, tell  
21 me, where is God involved in that?  
22 Babies are not lab rats. We should  
23 prioritize restorative reproductive  
24 medicine that treats underlying



1 issues like endometriosis, hormone  
2 problems, or lifestyle factors. All  
3 of this is hypocrisy.

4 The Democrat Party is the  
5 reason for historic low birth rates,  
6 pushing LBGTQ and abortion. Nothing  
7 about their party is pro-family.  
8 They are truly the party of baby mom  
9 culture. Single baby moms with baby  
10 showers with the budget of a rapper  
11 in music video. John Allante  
12 McCauley for PAGOP State Committee.  
13 Stacey Garrity for Governor.

14 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank  
15 you.

16 MR. BLATTSTEIN: Hello.  
17 Jeremy Blattstein. Thank you,  
18 Councilman O'Rourke for your  
19 questions of the Philadelphia  
20 Sheriff's Office. Greatly  
21 appreciated. But I think we really  
22 need to understand what the timeline  
23 looks like because that was -- that  
24 question was not answered, right?

1 What does an ideal timeline look  
2 like for the eviction process? And  
3 then fund it from there.

4 But we're talking about the  
5 Philadelphia Land Bank, and let's  
6 raise your hand here -- let's ask  
7 some questions. Do you know that  
8 there are different rules in  
9 different districts of what the land  
10 disposition policy is for  
11 Philadelphia City Council, right?  
12 Each district member makes their own  
13 rules. That's not documented  
14 anywhere, that's not on the books  
15 and it's confusing to everybody. So  
16 if you want the process to get  
17 streamlined, we need to put that in  
18 public, right?

19 Councilman -- Council  
20 President Johnson says no side  
21 yards. Councilwoman Gauthier says,  
22 yeah, I support some side yards here  
23 and there. Councilwoman Lozada  
24 doesn't support anything. And like

1 we -- she has 30 homes on her desk  
2 right now that she says is going to  
3 spur gentrification, but instead she  
4 supports other nonprofits for the  
5 same thing.

6 And let's have a  
7 conversation about what it means  
8 when there's growth in the city of  
9 Philadelphia. And we're talking  
10 about generational wealth and  
11 properties. Values go up; it's  
12 plain and simple.

13 But luckily, we have policy  
14 in place to help long-term home  
15 owners and seniors and low-income  
16 people to freeze their taxes. Those  
17 programs work. But part of -- yeah,  
18 Councilman Thomas wants to talk  
19 about funding the School District.  
20 What funds the School District?  
21 Property taxes. So let's not --  
22 stop, stop, stop with this, oh, what  
23 about the increases of values?  
24 That's how you fund our School

1 District. Plain and simple.

2 And last but not least,  
3 we're talking about SEPTA. Fund it  
4 for the kids, right? The school  
5 kids should be using it. It'll help  
6 us to document and track it. Ride  
7 the Ride. Grow Philly to 2 Milly.  
8 Thank you.

9 MR. BRONSKILL: Good  
10 afternoon. Thanks so much for  
11 having me. My name is Steven  
12 Bronskill. I'm here with Transit  
13 Forward Philadelphia, also the  
14 Student Fare Coalition. I'm here in  
15 support of Councilmember Landau's  
16 resolution calling for hearings on  
17 student fares. I'm so grateful to  
18 her leadership and to many on the  
19 Council here.

20 We heard from so many  
21 amazing young people here today.  
22 They deserve great schools. They  
23 also deserve the freedom of mobility  
24 as you've heard from many folks.

1 There are so many plots on movies  
2 and TV shows about a young person  
3 trying to get a set of car keys when  
4 they turn 16.

5 There's a Fresh Prince  
6 episode I saw recently about it.  
7 But in Philly, we have something  
8 even better. That's not how it  
9 worked for me or for many in Philly.  
10 We have this Student Fare Card.

11 Unfortunately, though it  
12 could go farther, it can work on the  
13 weekends, over the summer, extended  
14 hours. I saw this firsthand as a  
15 youth cycling coach. Watch out,  
16 there is the future Lance Armstrong  
17 in Philadelphia. They are much  
18 stronger and faster than me, but  
19 they need to be able to get to where  
20 their bikes are.

21 When we do a tournament at  
22 Hunting Park, when we have summer  
23 programming for them at Sedgley,  
24 actually at Lemon Hill. And that

1 SEPTA fare is often the barrier  
2 between them and accessing a  
3 meaningful enrichment opportunity  
4 like so many of the programs you  
5 heard from today.

6 I also think about the  
7 30,000 Philadelphia students who  
8 don't get one of these at all.  
9 We're asking them to walk a mile and  
10 a half. That is like walking from  
11 here to Cherry Street Pier, from  
12 here to Gerard, from here to Tasker  
13 or here to 30th Street. Those are  
14 nice walks on a nice day, but in the  
15 rain or the snow or the heat, we  
16 think they deserve the free mobility  
17 to get to school and to get the  
18 opportunities that will help them in  
19 the future.

20 I applaud the leadership of  
21 this City Council in fighting for  
22 transit on so many fronts. I think  
23 student fares are a piece of the  
24 puzzle. It's how we're going to win

1 transit for all in everyone in  
2 Pennsylvania, that's how we're going  
3 to build future ridership and build  
4 a culture where we are all moving  
5 together. These hearings are a  
6 great opportunity to figure out how  
7 we can make the most of our limited  
8 resources. I urge you to support  
9 it, and I thank you so much for your  
10 time. Thank you.

11 CHIEF CLERK: Will the  
12 young gentlemen from the Boys Latin  
13 School make your way to the podium.  
14 Robert L. Parker, Zachary Paris,  
15 Aiden Marion, Lauren Meyers, Dylan  
16 Adkins, Jeremiah Roach, Stephanie  
17 Wells, and Stephanie Adkins.

18 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: You have  
19 two minutes. State your name for  
20 the record.

21 MS. ROBINSON: Yes. Good  
22 afternoon. Queen Judith Robinson  
23 here regarding 260406, 407, and 408.  
24 Land movement in the 5th District,

1 the 22nd Police District,  
2 Gentrification Central, where now is  
3 being built a \$40 million police  
4 facility.

5           Everybody knows Queen  
6 Judith is a steward of North  
7 Philadelphia. It's where I live,  
8 born and bred, and I live there now.  
9 I'm a committee person. I'm a real  
10 estate professional for many, many  
11 years. I'm grandmother, okay?  
12 Right in the neighborhood, North  
13 Philly.

14           So in the spirit of Clara  
15 Baldwin, who encourage us to don't  
16 change your address, address the  
17 problem. So for the past two years,  
18 I have written emails to my Council  
19 person, Jeffrey Young, the head of  
20 the police department, Captain  
21 Goodson, at the time, who decided  
22 not to enforce parking on the  
23 sidewalks. So land movement  
24 increases density, increases need



1 for parking. We need to do  
2 something about parking.

3 So therefore, I'm  
4 encouraging the members, especially  
5 you Council at-large folks who  
6 represent me too along with Jeffrey  
7 Young, help him out, because  
8 something is going on. Well, he  
9 can't hear me. He can't hear what  
10 I'm saying. Black grandmother from  
11 North Philly. Okay? When I asked  
12 over and over again to have this  
13 enforced, it is already illegal.  
14 What are we doing here?

15 So in that regard, I want  
16 to talk about the increase in  
17 density when we have this land  
18 movement that most people don't even  
19 know about. Being that I am who I  
20 am, I make sure I check on all  
21 things going on. So I'm asking for  
22 law enforcement, the murder in  
23 mayhem that's going on in the 22nd  
24 District, on the 22nd street in

1     gentrification central. Let's nip  
2     these things in the bud. Let's be  
3     proactive as we deal with increase  
4     in density in Philadelphia. Thank  
5     you.

6                 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank  
7     you.

8                 CHIEF CLERK: Will Sheila  
9     E. Armstrong, Sally Heck, Rashaun  
10    Moore, Dina Williams, Aisha Harris,  
11    Charles Friedman, Simona Birch,  
12    Madeline Jones, Dinee Mobley, Chris  
13    Wink, Ogbonna Hagins, and General  
14    Mutti Ajamu Asabora, please make  
15    your way to the podium.

16                MR. PARKER: Good  
17    afternoon, distinguished  
18    Councilmembers and Madam Chair. I  
19    stand to support the resolution for  
20    the five Boys Latin students who  
21    will be receiving their associates  
22    degrees this Saturday before they  
23    receive their high school diplomas.  
24    Yes.

1                   My name is Robert Parker  
2           and I have the pleasure of serving  
3           as the principal of Boys Latin High  
4           School. Nineteen years ago, David  
5           Hardy set out to address the issue  
6           of black and brown boys graduating  
7           from high school and going to  
8           college in the West Philadelphia  
9           area.

10                   I stand before you to say  
11          that we've lived up to the mission  
12          and vision of what David Hardy set  
13          out to establish, which is sending  
14          the most amount of black and boys --  
15          black and brown boys in the State of  
16          Pennsylvania to college, even to  
17          today.

18                   Fast forward to 2022, our  
19          current CEO, Dr. William Hayes, had  
20          the bold vision to be able to create  
21          a pathway for black and brown boys  
22          to be able to go to college to  
23          receive their associate's degree  
24          before they graduate from high

1 school. That was met with  
2 opposition. There was doubt, there  
3 were questions. People wondering  
4 can these boys actually compete?  
5 Will they be able to deal with the  
6 academic rigor that they'll have to  
7 face in college? Will they be able  
8 to handle the responsibility of  
9 being independent and navigating  
10 themselves on a college campus?

11 Well, I am glad to say that  
12 I stand here now in 2026 saying  
13 those young black and brown boys was  
14 able to be able to defy the odds and  
15 be able to show that they can handle  
16 the academic rigor of what college  
17 courses need and what they were able  
18 to face, because these five young  
19 men will now be graduating from CCP  
20 on Saturday.

21 And so because of that,  
22 they have now blazed the trail for  
23 not just their class, but the class  
24 of 2027, the class of 2028, the

1 class of 2029, and the many classes  
2 that will come behind them to be  
3 able to see that it is possible to  
4 be able to go that pathway of being  
5 able to get your associate's degree  
6 before getting your diploma. And  
7 this is why I ask that we celebrate  
8 and recognize these five young men  
9 for their hard work and their  
10 commitment.

11 MR. MARION: Good  
12 afternoon. My name is Aiden Marion.  
13 I'm a senior at Boys Latin High  
14 School of Philadelphia. So the  
15 question is: Why should we be  
16 honored for receiving our  
17 associate's degree before our high  
18 school diploma? Why wouldn't you  
19 want to honor us? Should be the  
20 real question when -- especially  
21 education excellence in the black  
22 community and young black men.

23 At Boys Latin, a pledge  
24 that we have to remember --

1 mesmerize, the first line is  
2 Educatio ius genere ortum meum  
3 est. That stands for education is  
4 my birthright -- education is -- and  
5 education is the birthright to all.  
6 When teachers and staff care,  
7 families care, we care. Students  
8 also care. From that care teaches  
9 us that not only support from staff  
10 and teachers and family members is  
11 coming into us, that we know that we  
12 can accomplish getting our  
13 associate's degree before our high  
14 school diploma. Thank you.

15 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank  
16 you.

17 MR. ADKINS: Good  
18 afternoon. My name is Dylan Adkins.  
19 I'm a senior at Boys Latin Charter  
20 School. I'm currently in the middle  
21 college program earning my  
22 associate's degree in liberal arts.  
23 The reason why I'm up here today is  
24 to celebrate the hard work, the

1 determination, and the courage to  
2 adapt to a new environment at CCP  
3 that it took us. Another reason why  
4 I'm here is to adapt -- is to  
5 commend us on the long life of  
6 studying that we did as seniors.  
7 Thank you.

8 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank  
9 you.

10 MR ROACH: How is it going  
11 everybody? My name is Jeremiah  
12 Roach, senior quarterback at Boys  
13 Latin High School, also in the  
14 middle college program. I just want  
15 to thank, you know, everybody in the  
16 city that actually recognizes us for  
17 our hard work and dedication and  
18 also, you know, just earned our  
19 associate's degree while in high  
20 school. Yeah, I just want to thank  
21 everybody.

22 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Okay.  
23 Thank you.

24 MS. HECHT: Hello. My name

1 is Sally Hecht, and I'm a  
2 Sustainable Transportation Program  
3 Coordinator with the Cleaner  
4 Council. We are Philadelphia's  
5 oldest non-profit environmental  
6 health organization. We advocate  
7 for policy and infrastructure that  
8 promotes sustainable modes of  
9 transportation like transit, biking,  
10 and walking to improve overall air  
11 quality. Well-funded public transit  
12 with high ridership is necessary to  
13 move towards greener and healthier  
14 communities.

15 Today, I'm here to urge  
16 City Council to pull together the  
17 key players and begin the necessary  
18 work for a fully funded and expanded  
19 Student Fare pass. The Student Fare  
20 pass, as it stands, has been  
21 extremely successful in moving  
22 students around the city to the  
23 various schools they attend. This  
24 has been wildly helpful, but the



1 pass is unable to be used during key  
2 times where school-aged youth can  
3 take advantage of all that  
4 Philadelphia has to offer.

5 In solidarity with  
6 advocates for the expansion, we are  
7 asking that the one-and-a-half-mile  
8 limit be removed, allowing students  
9 who live shorter distances to still  
10 receive a pass. This would allow  
11 them to take advantage of  
12 extracurricular activities, after-  
13 school programs, jobs, and  
14 internships outside of their  
15 neighborhoods.

16 We are also advocating for  
17 the fare card to be extended to  
18 weekends and through the summer. In  
19 2023, it was reported that 29.5  
20 percent of youth ages 16 to 19 were  
21 employed. That's almost a third of  
22 youths in the city. The cost of a  
23 round trip is often more than half  
24 of their hourly wage per day, eating

1 into their income.

2 Summer camps and activities  
3 for younger youth as well as career  
4 training programs for high schoolers  
5 are currently struggling for funding  
6 and budget cuts. Using limited  
7 funds to assist their students in  
8 their efforts to move across the  
9 city has strained these programs'  
10 already tight budgets and cut back  
11 on using that money for other  
12 important budget lines like tools,  
13 gear, and professional workshops.

14 Assisting young people in  
15 moving freely throughout their city  
16 is beneficial to this city itself  
17 and the people who live here. With  
18 the expanded Student Fare Card  
19 students can take advantage of  
20 internships, programs,  
21 pre-apprenticeships, and other  
22 amazing opportunities they would not  
23 be able to have access to. They can  
24 visit cultural institutions,

1 activate green spaces, and take part  
2 in nature. Thank you.

3 MS. MOORE: Hi. My name is  
4 Terica Moore. This is my son,  
5 Rashaun Moore. He's a -- he attends  
6 Lankenau. This is my son, Rashaun  
7 Moore. He attends Lankenau. He has  
8 a left eye blindness and a 50  
9 percent eye -- in the right eye  
10 blindness. Lankenau has been that  
11 community for me. To teach me how  
12 to help educate my son.

13 And please, whatever  
14 you-all do, do not close Lankenau.  
15 When we migrated from Florida in  
16 '23, his middle school left me  
17 hopeless with how to teach him.  
18 Lankenau has provided that village  
19 for me. Please keep Lankenau. So  
20 now they taught me how to text -- to  
21 speak. He's been taught by Braille.  
22 He has made straight A honor roll  
23 every semester since he's been there  
24 this past two years. They have

1 brought out the best in him.

2 Me being a young mother, I  
3 was -- I was broken. So please save  
4 Lankenau. Lankenau has been my  
5 reason to stay here in Philly from  
6 the Florida weather. Please  
7 anybody, vote to save Lankenau,  
8 please.

9 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-

10 RICHARDSON: Ma'am, may you please  
11 restate your name for the record for  
12 the stenographer.

13 MS. MOORE: Terica Moore.

14 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-

15 RICHARDSON: Thank you.

16 MS. MOORE: Go ahead,  
17 speak.

18 MR. MOORE: My name is  
19 Rashaun Moore, and the thing I like  
20 about Lankenau is we get to do math,  
21 reading, and fraction in our  
22 classroom, and we cook. And what I  
23 do downstairs, I clean up the  
24 cafeteria basically every day

1 because it's my job and it's my duty  
2 to do it. So I search up this thing  
3 called SEPTA, and that's why I'm  
4 cleaning up the cafeteria to work  
5 for that company. And please,  
6 whatever you guys do, please keep  
7 the school open because I don't want  
8 it to shut down. Thank you, please.

9 MS. MOORE: A future  
10 engineer, he says.

11 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE -  
12 RICHARDSON: Thank you. The Chair  
13 recognizes Councilmember Anthony  
14 Phillips.

15 COUNCILMEMBER PHILLIPS:  
16 Hi. Thank you, Chair. I just want  
17 to take 20 seconds to say just for  
18 the public who's listening, we in  
19 the City Council have provided our  
20 recommendations arduously to the  
21 city of Philadelphia regarding the  
22 School Board.

23 However, a lot of people in  
24 the public don't know that it's the

1 School Board, which is another body  
2 appointed that is making this  
3 decision. If it was up to City  
4 Council, Lankenau would not be on  
5 that list. But we are going to keep  
6 advocating it and fighting. Just  
7 want to make sure folks know. Okay,  
8 perfect. Oh, yeah, they know. All  
9 right, perfect. Thank you.

10 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE-  
11 RICHARDSON: Please proceed.

12 MS. WILLIAMS: Hello,  
13 everyone. My name is Dana Williams,  
14 and I come here today on the request  
15 of my son, who is a 14-year-old  
16 freshman at Lankenau, which is the  
17 first school where he felt safe.

18 Lankenau became his home  
19 and we have been welcomed and  
20 embraced. He is autistic and  
21 exceedingly mentally gifted, and  
22 with that combo comes an acute  
23 awareness of all of their faults and  
24 also all of the particulars of

1 everything around him. This causes  
2 anxiety, which is clinical and  
3 debilitation and also leads to his  
4 self-deprecation at times, which is  
5 a very common effect for those who  
6 share his disability.

7           With all that is going on  
8 in the news, as a student, he just  
9 simply asked one question, if they  
10 close our school, who is going to  
11 make sure that everyone in our  
12 school is mentally okay? I cannot  
13 give him that peace of mind, but as  
14 an educator, I ask, will there be  
15 grief counselors? Will there be  
16 grief counselors at night? Because  
17 tonight when the School Board  
18 decides which children are simply  
19 not valuable enough to keep their  
20 schools open, the social and  
21 emotional effects will be rapid as  
22 disabled people are once again  
23 devalued and discriminated.

24           When the decision gets

1 made, as a mother, I instinctively  
2 know that tonight there will be  
3 mothers throughout the city of  
4 Philadelphia who will have to  
5 counsel their children as they cry  
6 themselves to sleep. And tomorrow  
7 there will be mothers who will be  
8 sitting exhausted and sleepless in a  
9 hospital holding their child and  
10 praying that they survive through  
11 the night.

12 72 hours from now, there  
13 will be parents forced to make the  
14 painful decision as to whether they  
15 will send their child back to school  
16 or to an in-treatment center. If  
17 grief counselors are needed, because  
18 closing a school is a death to the  
19 future of a special needs child as  
20 it may be their only avenue to a  
21 healthy adult life. The disruption  
22 to their educational process is  
23 criminal as it is contributing to  
24 the delinquency of minors. Thank



1 you very much. Keep Lankenau open.

2 MS. HARRIS: Good evening,  
3 members of the board. I'm here to  
4 speak on behalf of my daughter and  
5 the students of Lankenau. I  
6 attended the School Board meeting  
7 that they had with our school of  
8 over 200 other concerned parents.

9 And what I was concerned  
10 about was, I didn't see any plan for  
11 the life skills class. They said  
12 that the school was going to be  
13 integrated with Roxborough. It is  
14 to my understanding that Roxborough  
15 does not have a life skills class.  
16 So my question is: What happens to  
17 the children who have IEPs like my  
18 daughter, Lanaya, who has down  
19 syndrome and is also legally blind  
20 because she's albino?

21 She's been going to  
22 Lankenau for the last three years.  
23 She left from Overbrook Educational  
24 Center with other students that

1 she's been with for the last 10  
2 years. They've built a family and a  
3 bond. Lanaya does not do well with  
4 transitions. So her leaving to a  
5 new school with new people in a new  
6 environment will be very detrimental  
7 to her progress and will cause her  
8 to regress and digress in which she  
9 has accomplished so far, as well as  
10 the other parent.

11 I'm concerned, is there  
12 going to be any grief counseling for  
13 these children who have been with  
14 these same students for over 10  
15 years, and they are like a family.  
16 Her teacher has told me how they  
17 support each other, how they help  
18 the teachers with each other because  
19 of the relationship they've had for  
20 the last 10 years.

21 So under the landmark  
22 Supreme Court ruling in Endrew F.  
23 versus Douglas County in 2017, the  
24 court established that a child's IEP

1 must be reasonably calculated to  
2 enable a child to make progress  
3 appropriate in light of the child's  
4 circumstances.

5 For my daughter, this life  
6 skill class isn't an extra; it is  
7 the specific environment that allows  
8 her to engage and progress.  
9 Transferring her to a genetic  
10 program where she cannot thrive,  
11 it's a failure to meet the Endrew F.  
12 standard. The law requires  
13 meaningful progress and just -- and  
14 not just the de minimis or bare  
15 minimum progress that she would  
16 receive elsewhere. Failure to  
17 provide free -- sorry. Thank you.

18 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE -  
19 RICHARDSON: Wait a minute. I know  
20 who you are, but please state your  
21 name, for the record.

22 MS. HARRIS: Aisha Harris.

23 COUNCILMEMBER GILMORE -  
24 RICHARDSON: Thank you.

1 MS. HARRIS: Thank you.

2 MR. HAGINS: Good morning,  
3 everyone. My name is Ogbonna  
4 Hagins. I'm the President of the  
5 Philadelphia Reparations Coalition  
6 for American Freedmen. On today's  
7 final passage calendar, you are  
8 voting on Land Bank and property  
9 disposition ordinances that  
10 determine who gets access to land  
11 development and long-term  
12 opportunity in this city.

13 I've had conversations with  
14 Councilmember Squilla and  
15 Councilmember Nina Ahmad in regards  
16 to the Office of Freedmen Affairs.  
17 And I seem to think that there are  
18 people in here that are afraid to do  
19 things specifically for the chattel  
20 slavery survivors. There are --  
21 there are pieces of legislation that  
22 this body has passed specifically  
23 dedicated to illegal immigrants and  
24 the tax paying citizens, the

1 American Freedmen don't have agency  
2 within this body, within this city  
3 government.

4 And not only is it an equal  
5 protection issue, but it's just not  
6 fair. And so what I've been finding  
7 out, and people have been asking me,  
8 well, maybe the American freedmen  
9 who are on this body are afraid to  
10 offend white people. This is what  
11 they've told me.

12 So I have to ask the  
13 American freedmen on this body that,  
14 like, let's say if I was a Jewish  
15 person and I was fighting for Jewish  
16 issues and this body was all Jewish,  
17 could you imagine this body going  
18 against this Jewish person about a  
19 constitutional mandate? This is  
20 what's happening with the American  
21 freedmen in this body. They've just  
22 haven't even talked about the Office  
23 of Freedmen Affairs. It's a  
24 constitutionally federally mandated

1 office, the Freedmen's Bureau Act.

2 So what's the hold up  
3 American Freedmen, Councilmembers?  
4 Why are you afraid to stand up for  
5 your own people? Ogbonna Hagins,  
6 over and out.

7 MR. NWALIPENJA: All right.  
8 Good afternoon, again, I don't  
9 (indiscernible) how to speak or say  
10 anything, but I'm from Lankenau. So  
11 I'm a life skill instructor. Okay?  
12 My name is Henry Nwalipenja. All  
13 right?

14 Listen, Lankenau is a team  
15 put in place, seriously put in  
16 place, people who care. We're  
17 together walking in the trench, like  
18 we see that people like this, they  
19 have a future. When we look at  
20 them, we don't look at them like  
21 there's a problem. Okay? They're  
22 real. They need real instructor,  
23 real things that they can put their  
24 hands on, and they can learn fast

1 and they can understand fast.

2 So Lankenau has built a  
3 team that can take care of people  
4 like this. When you shift this  
5 team, guess what? They'll be  
6 misplaced. I know there are many  
7 teachers all around the world, but  
8 teachers are different. There can  
9 be different abilities and skills.

10 If you do this, you will  
11 shift everything. One example, for  
12 example, I love sports. You guys  
13 know about sports. What happened  
14 when you develop a team and you  
15 change one player or two players,  
16 what happens? The team depletes.  
17 You got to be careful how you make  
18 changes in life.

19 So thank you all for your  
20 time. Thank you all for your  
21 devotion. But I know and I  
22 understand that we going to make the  
23 right decision not to close the  
24 Lankenau. But to start to really

1 take time, evaluate our lives, and  
2 bring better attention to this  
3 world. We can do these people.  
4 Yes, we can do this. Love you all.  
5 Have a great day.

6 MS. JOHNS: Hello. My name  
7 is Madeline Johns, and I am here  
8 with Transit Forward Philadelphia in  
9 support of Councilmember Landau's  
10 resolution to expand the current  
11 SEPTA Student Fare Program.

12 Being a Bryn Mawr College  
13 student, I utilize public  
14 transportation to advance myself  
15 academically and professionally. I  
16 travel around the city to attend  
17 class field trips, lectures at other  
18 universities, and for social  
19 activities. I enjoy being a college  
20 student in Philadelphia, a city that  
21 is rich in its history and community  
22 opportunities for students.

23 To access Philadelphia as a  
24 university student, I utilize



1 SEPTA's University Pass program,  
2 which allows me to travel around the  
3 city for free with up to 240  
4 unrestricted rides per month on all  
5 modes of SEPTA public  
6 transportation. School students in  
7 grade 7 through 12 should have the  
8 same access to mobility as  
9 university students in Philadelphia  
10 do.

11 As an intern with Transit  
12 Forward Philadelphia, I have been  
13 working to research, connect  
14 stakeholders, and advocate for  
15 Universal Student Fares to make  
16 public transit more accessible and  
17 equitable for all Philadelphia  
18 students. The current SEPTA Student  
19 Fare Program limits student mobility  
20 and places financial burden on  
21 students' families to transport  
22 their children to opportunities  
23 around Philadelphia.

24 Middle and high school

1 students in Philly deserve the  
2 freedom of mobility and access to  
3 opportunities that will help build  
4 their futures.

5           Unfortunately, the current  
6 SEPTA Student Fare Programs does not  
7 go far enough. Students who have  
8 live less than 1.5 miles from their  
9 school and who have jobs -- who have  
10 jobs after school, enrichment  
11 activities on the weekend or  
12 programs over the summer are unable  
13 to use their SEPTA passes to reach  
14 them. I've spoken to students who  
15 are not even eligible for the  
16 Student Fare Program because they  
17 live 1.4 miles from their school.  
18 Think about having to walk a 1.4  
19 mile -- 1.4 miles to school during  
20 Philadelphia winter. This pass is  
21 not supporting student mobility or  
22 academic success.

23           I'm asking you to consider  
24 supporting expanding the current

1 SEPTA Student Fare Program in  
2 Philadelphia so that middle and high  
3 school students can utilize mobility  
4 to access growth and experience  
5 opportunities around their city.  
6 Thank you for your time.

7 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank  
8 you.

9 MS. BIRCH: Hello. My name  
10 is Simona Birch. I'm the daughter  
11 of Herbert Drum Birch. To me, he  
12 was my father, but to the  
13 neighborhood, he was a hero. Collom  
14 Street is located in the Brickyard  
15 section -- the Brickyard section of  
16 Germantown. Brickyard is where my  
17 dad grew up.

18 He went from being a kid to  
19 growing to the Marine Corps and  
20 becoming a jet engine mechanic, then  
21 leaving the military and becoming a  
22 registered nurse. Not only did he  
23 serve our country as a Vietnam  
24 veteran, he also cared for his

1 community. When he joined his biker  
2 club, his name was Brickyard.  
3 That's how proud he was of his  
4 community.

5 My dad sat in meetings and  
6 at tables to make sure that his  
7 community was fed and had jobs. He  
8 also made sure that he personally  
9 shopped for toys and bikes for the  
10 children to have Christmas as well.

11 The day my father passed,  
12 the community was supposed to honor  
13 and recognize my dad for all of his  
14 contributions in the community, and  
15 that didn't go quite as planned,  
16 being as though he was no longer  
17 here. When my dad first passed,  
18 that block was the only comfort for  
19 some, and it's almost as if his  
20 presence is the -- his presence is  
21 still felt there.

22 I'm asking that the  
23 renaming of Collom Street and  
24 Wakefield be granted in order to

1 give my dad, Herbert Birch Drum as  
2 the community and neighborhood  
3 called him, the honor and respect  
4 that he deserves for all that he has  
5 done for the community. Thank you.

6 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank  
7 you.

8 CHIEF CLERK: Charles  
9 Freeman and General Mutti Ajamu  
10 Asaburu.

11 MR. ASABURU: Hotep  
12 atarhuru. I'm General Mutti.  
13 General is my title and Mutti Ajamu  
14 Asaburu is my name. Initially, I  
15 came here to talk about -- to object  
16 to a bill -- no specific bill, but  
17 because it was dealing with  
18 language. And I always have  
19 objections to the language, because  
20 the average Jane and John Q.  
21 Public, if you read the -- if they  
22 read the bill, they wouldn't even  
23 know what you were talking about.  
24 So that's something you all need to

1 work on.

2 This is for all City  
3 Council. This is for everybody in  
4 this room. It's for everybody who  
5 can see this, hear it. This is  
6 really about governing; you can take  
7 what I have to say. If you don't  
8 find it has any value, you throw it  
9 in the trash, or you can apply it to  
10 your life. This is for those who  
11 have ears to hear and eyes to see  
12 and a heart to discern the  
13 difference between the two.

14 Just reading the room, one  
15 of the things I see, a lot of folks  
16 come up on this mic and they're  
17 angry, they're hurt, they're  
18 traumatized. And the reality is  
19 that many of the agencies and  
20 organizations and entities in this  
21 city have traumatized them, have  
22 wounded them, and they're looking  
23 for redress. They're looking for  
24 comfort, they're looking for

1 solutions to their problems. And  
2 many times, they turn to City  
3 Council, they turn to the Mayor's  
4 office, and they turn to all these  
5 other agencies who can bring them  
6 relief and they get none. So  
7 they're looking for an outlet.

8           So when they come here,  
9 they speak and sometimes, you know,  
10 they trauma-dump and they accuse  
11 people of things falsely sometimes  
12 and sometimes justifiably. But it  
13 -- things -- it becomes a vicious  
14 cycle. And I'm saying that when you  
15 all govern, you-all should be  
16 mindful of that. That, you know,  
17 when somebody has something to say,  
18 you should listen. And that's why I  
19 encourage all of you who sit here  
20 and listen, I encourage that to all  
21 Councilmembers. Because it matters  
22 to what other people have to say.  
23 Thank you for your time.

24           COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

1 Thank you.

2 MR. FREEMAN: Yes. My name  
3 is Charles Freeman, and I was going  
4 to talk about something that we all  
5 know about. So -- but it's a little  
6 disheartening to me today that we --  
7 we're begging for money for schools,  
8 and we got the best school system in  
9 America. And it seems like it's not  
10 allowed to be better than parochial  
11 or private school. It has to remain  
12 at the bottom rung of education, and  
13 I just can't believe.

14 I -- I'm listening to all  
15 these resources today, and these  
16 good programs and saving lives, and  
17 we're sitting up there begging for  
18 more money when we got the system.  
19 The system is here. It is supposed  
20 to be for human beings. I mean,  
21 like, what are we doing?

22 And you're trying to get  
23 the kids on the bus for free and you  
24 got the other people getting on



1 every day for free, but you -- but  
2 you don't want to pass it for the  
3 children to get -- to get to the  
4 programs. This is a no brainer to  
5 me and this -- it is hitting me hard  
6 and we shouldn't be here. We should  
7 be celebrating 250 years of  
8 Philadelphia America, but we're  
9 sitting up here asking for more  
10 money, and I know next year we're  
11 going to ask for more money because  
12 there's another plan in the works  
13 already.

14 It seems like money is  
15 Philadelphia now. And, yeah, I hope  
16 you all have a good day and I'm  
17 going to pray for everybody, and I'm  
18 done.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

20 Thank you, sir.

21 CHIEF CLERK: Council  
22 President, this -- sorry. This  
23 completes our listing for public  
24 comment for today.

1 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

2 Thank you very much. Let's rock and  
3 roll. Bills -- we will now consider

18 Goodwin, Dr. Jasmyrn Wright, and  
19 Mecca Robinson during National  
20 Volunteer Month, for their  
21 extraordinary service, leadership,  
22 and enduring contributions to the  
23 city of Philadelphia, introduced by  
24 Councilmember Ahmad.

1 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

2 Chair recognizes Councilmember

3 Dr. Nina Ahmad for a motion on the  
4 resolution.

5 COUNCILMEMBER AHMAD: Thank  
6 you, Council President. I move for  
7 the adoption of the resolution.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
9 It has been moved and properly  
10 seconded that the resolution be  
11 adopted. All those in favor will  
12 signify by saying aye.

13 COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
15 Anyone opposed? The ayes have it,  
16 and the resolution is adopted.

17 Chief Clerk, please read  
18 the title of the next resolution.

19 CHIEF CLERK: There are no  
20 further resolutions in my  
21 possession, Council President.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
23 Thank you very much. Any speeches  
24 on behalf of the Minority? The

1 Chair recognizes Councilmember

2 Kendra Brooks.

3 COUNCILMEMBER BROOKS:

4 Thank you, Council President.

5 Today, I co-introduced a resolution  
6 honoring Grammy Award-Winning  
7 producer Will Yip with Councilmember  
8 Landau. Will is a Philly native,  
9 and his production talents have  
10 included some of the most famous  
11 locally grown Rock bands in  
12 Philadelphia. He has crafted a  
13 sound that is recognizable to the  
14 alternative music scene and produced  
15 records that will become timeless  
16 classics. My Senior Advisor, Eric,  
17 has told me all about them. I'm  
18 excited to be honoring Will today  
19 and to congratulate him for today's  
20 recognition and all of his success.

21 This morning, I was at Paul  
22 Robeson High School, along with 10  
23 of my Council colleagues, a huge  
24 crowd of students, and parents, and

1 community members. And we stood  
2 outside that building with a clear  
3 message for the School Board: do  
4 not vote on a facilities plan at  
5 today's meeting.

6 What we have seen over the  
7 past few weeks is that this board,  
8 which is appointed by the Mayor, is  
9 not responsive to City Council and  
10 not accountable to our communities.

11 In 2017, when I served as  
12 the co-chair of our City, Our  
13 Schools coalition, I led a campaign  
14 to force the School Reform  
15 Commission to dissolve itself. We  
16 did that in order to avoid this very  
17 situation; a school board that does  
18 not listen and does not partner with  
19 communities and local elected  
20 leaders.

21 If we have to -- if we have  
22 to force changes to the School  
23 Board, we will. We did it in 2017  
24 and we can do it again. We need a

1 school board that listens to  
2 feedback. We need a school board  
3 that works in partnership with the  
4 city. And right now, that means a  
5 board that stops this vote and  
6 listens to what the people of this  
7 city are saying, loud and clear.

8 Thank you to all of my  
9 colleagues who joined us this  
10 morning. Thank you, Councilmember  
11 Thomas, for leading the charge.  
12 This fight is far from over, and I'm  
13 asking everyone to join us today at  
14 440 to send a message loud and clear  
15 to the School Board. Today's school  
16 closure vote is unacceptable, and  
17 there will be consequences if this  
18 board chooses to move forward down  
19 this path. Thank you.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
21 Thank you, Member Brooks. Chair  
22 recognizes Councilmember Nicolas  
23 O'Rourke.

24 COUNCILMEMBER O'ROURKE:

1 Thank you, Mr. President. And  
2 co-signing all the words of my  
3 Minority leader on that matter. A  
4 couple of things I wanted to raise  
5 today, and I want to keep it tight,  
6 but I do want to speak on a few  
7 things. Yesterday, the Supreme  
8 Court gutted Section 2 of what any  
9 of us who have been students of  
10 history, or actually within the  
11 tradition of organizing from which  
12 the Civil Rights Movement comes,  
13 recognize the crowning jewel of the  
14 Civil Rights Movement to be the  
15 Voting Rights Act.

16 It was in the Louisiana v.  
17 Callais case, which was building off  
18 of the court's 2013 evisceration of  
19 Sections 4 and 5 of the Voting  
20 Rights Act, which required federal  
21 clearance of the voting maps of  
22 mostly southern districts with  
23 deeply racist histories of voting  
24 discrimination. Again, students of



1 history, students of politics in  
2 America recognize the history of the  
3 southern bloc of senators and  
4 elected officials down there, and  
5 how they thought, how they moved,  
6 how they operated.

7 Section 2 of the Voting  
8 Rights Act bans discrimination by  
9 race in elections. And the court's  
10 decision didn't formally repeal it,  
11 but instead it intensely deepened  
12 the burden of proof to achieve a  
13 Section 2 claim, recalling the  
14 typical historic dodge of requiring  
15 proof of racist intent instead of  
16 considering the material impact of  
17 certain actions.

18 Justice Alito's majority  
19 opinion stated that a successful  
20 challenger on Section 2 grounds must  
21 now prove that a state intentionally  
22 drew its districts to afford  
23 Minority voters less opportunity  
24 because of their race. Basically,

1 they want people who know that their  
2 opinions and their beliefs are  
3 unpopular, and have to find  
4 workarounds to get those things  
5 enacted, they must now -- we must  
6 now get them to say the things that  
7 are in their mind, which we know is  
8 virtually impossible.

9           This disgusting decision  
10 brings the logic of the Jim Crow  
11 literacy tests and grandfather  
12 clauses to this new era of partisan  
13 gerrymandering. And too many  
14 politicians in the South are  
15 gleeful, and I would say maybe even  
16 those in the North, to return to  
17 these old ways.

18           My thoughts, and my  
19 prayers, and solidarity are with the  
20 people of that region, we call the  
21 Black Belt, as their fight for equal  
22 representation will have to enter a  
23 new phase. And I hope that they  
24 know that they have some allies up

1 here in the North, as we fight off  
2 those that would set us back here in  
3 the Keystone State as well.

4 It only deepens my belief  
5 and recognition, really, that  
6 electoralism, as much as we continue  
7 to advocate for it, and everyone  
8 who's not registered ought to get  
9 registered if you're listening. And  
10 if you don't vote, vote in every  
11 single election, primary and  
12 general, and for every particular --  
13 on every particular ballot line.

14 But there is a reason why  
15 people have moved on in many ways  
16 from electoralism and are calling  
17 for revolution, because every time  
18 you make a move, and there were a  
19 lot of fights, people literally  
20 died. I heard somebody make a  
21 point, Eddie Glaude said yesterday  
22 there are people sitting in the  
23 bottom of the river of Mississippi  
24 who fought to make sure that we

1 would have these particular rights.

2 At a certain point when you  
3 see these things being clawed back,  
4 you start to question whether or not  
5 elections matter. I want to say  
6 that they do. I resonate with the  
7 frustration; they do matter. And  
8 also, democracy is a whole lot more  
9 than just when we vote. We have to  
10 stay vigilant. We have to stay  
11 engaged. We have to continue to  
12 imagine our possibilities and  
13 organize to change these situations,  
14 because everything that we gained,  
15 there are those who are committed to  
16 rolling it back, and it shouldn't  
17 happen on our watch.

18 I'm not always echoing the  
19 Congressional Black Caucus.  
20 Sometimes they're right, sometimes  
21 they're not. But they were dead on  
22 yesterday when they said the Supreme  
23 Court is illegitimate. Now, if we  
24 call for radical changes in the

1 Supreme Court, if folks start  
2 calling to get more justices, or  
3 even to say we ought to have a  
4 constitutional convention, it's  
5 rooted in stuff like this,  
6 recognizing that we need radical  
7 change, a radical redistribution of  
8 economic and political power, if  
9 we're going to be more than just  
10 democracy in branding.

11 Because currently, right  
12 now, we have a racist country in  
13 structure, and we're democratic in  
14 our branding and our marketing, and  
15 we have got to change that. So I  
16 just wanted to raise this point.

17 And I know that we are a  
18 municipality, and we don't  
19 necessarily control that, but it's  
20 something that we need to keep our  
21 eye on. We are living in some dire  
22 times, and we need to keep our eye  
23 on the prize.

24 Moving on to something a

1 little bit more positive. That was  
2 yesterday. Tomorrow is May Day.  
3 And your share -- and I am sharing  
4 -- I've shared on all of our desks,  
5 I hope that you've seen them, some  
6 red velvet cakes for all of my  
7 colleagues in recognition of May  
8 Day, International Workers' Day.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
10 Are they vegan? They've got vegan  
11 options? We're discriminating  
12 against the non --

13 COUNCILMEMBER O'ROURKE:  
14 Oh, dang it. I thought I was  
15 cooking, man.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
17 The floor is yours, sir.

18 COUNCILMEMBER O'ROURKE:  
19 Mr. President, I apologize.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
21 It's okay, sir.

22 COUNCILMEMBER O'ROURKE:  
23 All right. Listen, I got one more  
24 year --

1 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

2 What a great job, though.

3 COUNCILMEMBER O'ROURKE: I

4 got one more year in this body

5 before the people decide whether I

6 stay or not. So I got another

7 chance --

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

9 Sorry, sir.

10 COUNCILMEMBER O'ROURKE: --

11 to get it right for you next year.

12 My bad, Mr. President.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

14 The floor is yours, sir.

15 COUNCILMEMBER O'ROURKE:

16 Thank you, sir. I -- you all have

17 heard me say this before, I am not

18 just a liberal. I mean, liberal is

19 -- everybody is liberal. I'm a

20 leftist. And what that means

21 historically is that "left" means

22 labor. Right-wing generally means

23 capital, left means labor. Let me

24 just go into this for a second.

1           That would mean, therefore,  
2   that the labor movements the world  
3   over are movements that are  
4   committed to making sure that  
5   workers have power, that we see a  
6   distribution of power, political  
7   power towards the workers and not  
8   just those who run -- the bosses, as  
9   it were. And labor movements the  
10  world over have marched under red  
11  banners for generations, hence the  
12  red cakes that you have here today.  
13  Not as an appeal to nationalism,  
14  like today we see a lot of folks  
15  wearing red hats, but as an appeal  
16  to internationalism, recognizing  
17  that solidarity across borders has  
18  to happen in order for us to win.

19           The Philly AFL-CIO's May  
20  Day efforts include uniting Philly  
21  labor around a common policy  
22  platform, and we as elected  
23  officials represent hundreds of  
24  thousands of Philadelphians. And I



1 believe we deserve a city grounded  
2 in and organized around working  
3 people's values.

4           Here are some of those  
5 values, if I can share them: joy,  
6 community, solidarity, integrity,  
7 trust, love. They're calling us to  
8 organize around these values, and  
9 they believe that a city organized  
10 around these values would have fully  
11 funded public and human services, a  
12 thriving public education system, an  
13 end to the attacks on immigrants in  
14 all our communities, development for  
15 the people and not the billionaires,  
16 unions for everybody, safe and  
17 secure homes and neighborhoods, and  
18 it'd be a place where one job would  
19 be enough.

20           Healthcare is a human  
21 right. We expand democracy and not  
22 corporate power, and that we tax the  
23 billionaires and corporations, and  
24 we end up funding our people.

1 I am so excited to meet  
2 Philly's workers out in the street  
3 tomorrow, and I'm grateful that  
4 Philly's labor movement is growing  
5 closer to our social movements  
6 through organizing for this yearly  
7 celebration. As much as I love and  
8 appreciate Labor Day weekend, I'm  
9 also loving the overtly political  
10 edge that May Day, which is the  
11 International Labor Day, invites.  
12 An edge that names something I fully  
13 agree with, that in matters of  
14 public policy, the workers must come  
15 before the rich. I hope you all  
16 enjoy you all's cakes.

17 Two more things and I'm off  
18 the mic. In a better court-based  
19 story, the Pennsylvania Supreme  
20 Court's decision in Commonwealth v.  
21 Lee ruled that mandatory life  
22 sentences for second-degree murder  
23 charges are unconstitutional under  
24 the state's prohibition on cruel and

1 unusual punishments.

2 That ought to be celebrated  
3 by any lovers of justice in the  
4 room. Of the 1,100 people serving  
5 these unconstitutional sentences,  
6 approximately 700 have served more  
7 than 20 years of their sentence,  
8 with 300 of these individuals over  
9 the age of 60. Not only are they  
10 serving unconstitutional sentences,  
11 but they are also the most expensive  
12 inmates in our system. We have a  
13 state Supreme Court that's actually  
14 focused on justice, it seems to me.  
15 And they've given the General  
16 Assembly a golden opportunity to  
17 secure justice for hundreds of  
18 people who were serving  
19 unconstitutional sentences.

20 I am a member of the Church  
21 of the Lord Jesus Christ. I'm a  
22 minister in that tradition. And I'm  
23 reminded always that he began his  
24 ministry by saying that the Spirit

1 of the Lord was upon him to set at  
2 liberty those who are oppressed, or  
3 to set the captive free. And so I  
4 believe that there's a golden  
5 opportunity for us to make good on  
6 that particular call.

7 And so, to echo the many  
8 reformists, public defenders, the  
9 advocates, and abolitionists calling  
10 on the House to move forward boldly,  
11 we have got to pass HB 443, and we  
12 ought to do it soon. So I'm going  
13 to commend those who are already on  
14 their way. I'm going to encourage  
15 others who are not to vote yes on  
16 that.

17 Lastly, Philadelphia, as we  
18 all know, is a city overflowing with  
19 wonderful artists, but even we have  
20 only a limited number of Pulitzer  
21 Prize winners. And Temple graduate  
22 James, James happens to be one of  
23 them. As a Pulitzer Prize-winning  
24 playwright who has worked

1 extensively in the city. His latest  
2 work, "Wilderness Generation," is  
3 now playing at Suzanne Roberts  
4 Theatre, courtesy of the  
5 Philadelphia Theatre Company. And  
6 I'm excited to be joining them  
7 tonight for a pre-show conversation  
8 about the creative arts and civic  
9 life.

10 In that spirit, I want to  
11 remind us that supporting the arts  
12 is one huge way of strengthening our  
13 civic ties, and that it's something  
14 that we ought to do and do so  
15 regularly. So even if you can't  
16 make it to the screening tonight,  
17 make it a point to support our local  
18 artists in the near future. Our  
19 artists and our arts sector could  
20 always use some more love.

21 And I appreciate the  
22 attention both the Majority Leader  
23 and the Majority Whip have shown the  
24 arts since they joined this body

1 some years ago. And as a creative,  
2 a musician, and an artist of sorts  
3 in my own right, I intend to be  
4 another voice in what should be a  
5 growing support system within this  
6 body. I thank you all for you all's  
7 leadership. Let's make sure that we  
8 continue to support the arts. Thank  
9 you, Mr. President.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

11 Thank you very much. Speeches on  
12 behalf of the Majority, Chair  
13 recognizes Councilmember Isaiah  
14 Thomas.

15 COUNCILMEMBER THOMAS: Good  
16 afternoon, Council President and  
17 colleagues. First, Council  
18 President, I want to say thank you  
19 for your support --

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

21 You jumped up.

22 COUNCILMEMBER THOMAS: I  
23 know, yeah. I knew I pressed the  
24 button fast, but I didn't think it

1 was that fast. Council President, I  
2 want to say thank you for your  
3 support.

4 I read an article, and I  
5 don't reference articles much, but I  
6 did read an article a little while  
7 back, Council President, that talked  
8 about the fact that this school  
9 facilities fight that we're in right  
10 now, because this is a full-blown  
11 fight at this point, we shouldn't be  
12 doing it this way, and we should be  
13 negotiating behind the scenes. And  
14 anybody who knows me know I prefer  
15 to do things behind the scenes.

16 If I get to the point  
17 whereas though I'm pressing this  
18 button and making speeches on the  
19 floor and posting on social media,  
20 that means I've exhausted all of my  
21 resources.

22 And Council President, I  
23 first want to thank you because I  
24 know for a fact that even when I was

1 ready to quit the behind-the-scenes  
2 negotiating, you said, "no, little  
3 bro, we going to keep going. We  
4 going to keep fighting. We going to  
5 keep trying." And I commend you,  
6 Council President, for keeping  
7 trying.

8 To my colleagues, there  
9 were 10 of us today at a press  
10 conference talking about this  
11 facilities issue and what we don't  
12 want to see. So I know my  
13 colleagues are going to sound off  
14 about it; some of them have already  
15 done it. Let me just add my little  
16 piece. This right here is the  
17 contact information for the eight  
18 school board members that we  
19 confirmed in this legislative body.  
20 Notice I said eight, Council  
21 President. I'm being very spicy.

22 We're asking people to  
23 reach out to these eight school  
24 board members and let them know to



1 vote no. We're asking young people  
2 to DM them on social media. We're  
3 asking people to email them.

4 Contact the School Board right now  
5 and ask them to vote no.

6 If by chance they still  
7 decide not to listen to the public  
8 and vote in favor of this plan, just  
9 a couple of promises, no threats,  
10 because I'm not that type of person.  
11 I don't want to make anybody think  
12 I'm threatening them. I also just  
13 don't want to be -- catch anybody  
14 off guard, I don't want there to be  
15 a surprise. So understand what your  
16 vote will come with.

17 Number one, it will come  
18 with a pledge from myself and other  
19 members of this body, if you vote  
20 yes for this plan, and if the people  
21 of Philadelphia decide to bring us  
22 back, to quote my colleague back  
23 there, we pledge to vote no on your  
24 confirmation. That's No. 1.

1           Number two, we will do  
2 everything in our legal power,  
3 followed by the leadership of our  
4 Council President and our entire  
5 tech team, who's phenomenal, to put  
6 us in a position to sue you based on  
7 this decision, and other issues that  
8 we know exist that we will not talk  
9 about in this moment right now. But  
10 if you know, you know. We know and  
11 they know. So please make the right  
12 decision.

13           Last but not least, we're  
14 asking people to show up to the  
15 school district meeting at four  
16 O'clock today for what we like to  
17 call a peaceful protest. I've been  
18 warned that there are a number of  
19 police officers already outside of  
20 the School District building.

21           The irony of that,  
22 Councilmember Jones, and I know  
23 you're going to talk about the idea  
24 of putting up money -- I'll let

1 Councilmember Jones talk about it.  
2 There are already police out there  
3 right now anticipating, I'm not sure  
4 what, maybe it's the violent tan  
5 suit that I have on, or maybe it's  
6 the hostile behavior that they're  
7 expecting from honor roll students  
8 and disabled students from Lankenau  
9 High School. I'm not quite sure,  
10 but I know that they're prepared to  
11 try to meet this moment with a level  
12 of aggression that's not reflective  
13 of the passion that we have for our  
14 children.

15 This isn't personal. This  
16 isn't about adults. This isn't  
17 about anything else but folks like  
18 the blind young man who came down to  
19 testify, who is an extremely  
20 intelligent young man, if you sit  
21 and talk to him, and his mom told us  
22 the truth. "The only thing that's  
23 keeping me up North in Philly is a  
24 quality education for my child."

1 Council President, you're a dad,  
2 you're a good dad.

3           There are a lot of parents  
4 on City Council, and as parents, I'm  
5 sure most of us will give up this  
6 job and this city for our children.  
7 And that's not personal to the  
8 public. We love working for you,  
9 but we love our children. I'm  
10 asking the School Board to put  
11 themselves in the position of  
12 parents, just like the one who was  
13 here today, who said, if Lankenau  
14 closes, there's no reason for me to  
15 be here in the city of Philadelphia.

16           That's not just an  
17 individual narrative as it relates  
18 to that parent. That is the type of  
19 familial atmosphere that our schools  
20 like Paul Robeson, Lankenau, and  
21 others. This is what they do.

22           So, Council President,  
23 again, I want to say thank you for  
24 your leadership. To my colleagues,

1 I want to say thank you all so much.  
2 And the elders say that the common  
3 enemy of my enemy turns my enemy to  
4 my friend. And I know none of you  
5 all have ever been my enemy before  
6 as it relates to this legislative  
7 body. But I think that we have  
8 common ground, and I don't want to  
9 call anybody the enemy, but I think  
10 we have common ground as a  
11 collective as it relates to who's on  
12 the side of right, and who's on the  
13 side of wrong.

14 And on this one, because  
15 this is a legacy vote, we know we're  
16 on the side of right. I'm asking  
17 the School Board members, all eight  
18 of you, are you going to be on the  
19 side of right, and staying with the  
20 people, or are you going to be on  
21 the side of wrong and staying with  
22 the ultra-wealthy and billionaires  
23 and other people who are trying to  
24 gentrify, gentrify, displace our

1 community, our children, and those  
2 long-term residents who love our  
3 city? Thank you, Council President.

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

5 Thank you, Member Thomas. Chair  
6 recognizes Councilman Curtis Jones,  
7 Jr.

8 COUNCILMEMBER JONES: Thank  
9 you, Mr. President. I'm so very  
10 proud of my little brother over  
11 there fighting for what's right.  
12 Can we give him another round of  
13 applause? Because it isn't easy to  
14 stand up and speak truth to power.  
15 And I say to you, Mr. President, on  
16 all that I love, that I believe  
17 sincerely that everybody in this  
18 chamber wants to support public  
19 education for our babies.

20 I believe, conversely, that  
21 the people of the School Board, the  
22 School District; Streater, and the  
23 Superintendent really in their  
24 hearts want to do the right thing.

1 I believe their intentions are good;  
2 their methodology sucks. Let me say  
3 this to you. We are at crossroads,  
4 you-all. And I don't think you're  
5 reading the room. There were 10  
6 council people, not to count the  
7 State Representatives that we were  
8 able to garner out at that  
9 demonstration saying, please, please  
10 don't do this vote. And I know for  
11 a fact there was an 11th on the way.  
12 But couldn't get an Uber. But  
13 that's nothing.

14 So we in this chamber have  
15 done the right thing all the time.  
16 When it was time to look at the  
17 millage rates, we took tough tax  
18 votes all the time and passed it. I  
19 remember when they wanted to do -- I  
20 wasn't here, but liquor by the  
21 drink, this body stood up and took  
22 it on the chin. There were tavern  
23 owners that took people out because  
24 of that. I remember when we did the

1 beverage tax here, right? They  
2 wanted to put our faces on milk  
3 cartons because we wanted to help  
4 our babies, right? I remember now  
5 with the cigarettes, I remember the  
6 sales tax.

7           Every time called upon, we  
8 stood up and did the right thing.  
9 There's a thing called maintenance  
10 of effort. Once we give them this  
11 money, we can't call them back and  
12 say, we want to change the amount.  
13 I want to bring it down a little bit  
14 because things are a little better.  
15 No, once we do it, we can't retract  
16 it. So this vote is a serious long-  
17 term commitment to the School  
18 District. Lankenau, Overbrook  
19 Elementary are in my district. Two  
20 out of the three schools being  
21 considered are in the 4th  
22 Councilmanic District.

23           Now, my good friend, the  
24 Superintendent, asked me, "You know,



1 if we don't do this, are we still  
2 going to be friends?" Yes, we are  
3 still going to be friends. That is  
4 -- this is business, though. This  
5 isn't friendship and -- you know,  
6 this is business. And I want you to  
7 know this is a serious undertaking.  
8 And I know, you know, Streater is  
9 from, I think, North Philly now in  
10 my district, I love you, but we are  
11 10-toes down about this. And I  
12 don't like the high-stakes game of  
13 chicken. Two automobiles are  
14 running at each other at the same  
15 time and looking for which one is  
16 going to blink.

17 Our babies are watching us  
18 and how we resolve our problems.  
19 Grown-ups should be in the room  
20 negotiating this solution. We are  
21 not far off. But if we don't make  
22 the right decisions today, this is  
23 going to be a long, protracted  
24 struggle. Protracted struggle. And

1 everybody's going to get a black  
2 eye. Everybody.

3 I'm going to end with this.

4 I want to support my mayor so bad.

5 I'm not -- there isn't no shame in

6 my game. I'm pro-Parker. All

7 right? She gave an impassioned

8 speech that had me revved up, ready

9 to vote right now. But when I went

10 to Lankenau, when I went to

11 Overbrook Elementary, when I went to

12 Robeson, I saw our babies for the

13 first time, engaged in activities

14 saying, "Save us, adults." So I'm

15 going to do what I got to do. You

16 all can do what you all going to.

17 We going to be down there today, and

18 I got my bail money. Talk to you.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

20 What money was that?

21 COUNCILMEMBER JONES: Jail

22 money.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

24 Oh, jail money. Oh, okay. You're

1 locked up for the kids. That's  
2 what's up. Chair recognizes  
3 Councilmember Dr. Nina Ahmad.  
4 You're up there today.

5 COUNCILMEMBER AHMAD: Thank  
6 you, Council President.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
8 You pressed that button early,  
9 didn't you?

10 COUNCILMEMBER AHMAD:  
11 Listen.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
13 Go ahead.

14 COUNCILMEMBER AHMAD: I'm  
15 just so proud of my colleagues. And  
16 I'm just remembering these young  
17 people who came just today. People  
18 with visual disabilities standing  
19 here, learning disabilities, have  
20 found a place. Twenty-four percent  
21 of the student body at Lankenau is  
22 children with disabilities. We were  
23 just standing in front of Paul  
24 Robeson, sending children to

1 Harvard. I don't know what they  
2 want us to do. This is -- these are  
3 schools that are working, why are we  
4 trying to fix -- mess up something  
5 that's working?

6 But more importantly, they  
7 haven't shown us their work. How do  
8 they come to these decisions? We  
9 want each school, each school, to  
10 give us their cost-benefit analysis,  
11 to show us what is the deficit for  
12 each school, so we can address  
13 these. It's now 17 schools, and  
14 their cavalier manner in how they  
15 switched, they go, okay, Roxborough  
16 one day, no, not Roxborough. So,  
17 okay, we're going to make an  
18 environmental center when there's  
19 one right next door who are begging  
20 for the School District to use them.

21 What are we doing? It is  
22 going to cost money to close these  
23 schools. So, it is going to the net  
24 -- when we net this out, the

1 children who are here are going to  
2 leave Philadelphia. They're going  
3 to cost us by not keeping these  
4 schools where they're performing and  
5 functioning. So I -- you know, we  
6 have said all we can say, and we  
7 have to look at all -- any other  
8 alternatives we have.

9           And our Committee Chair,  
10 Isaiah Thomas, has outlined this.  
11 All I can say is, this is my first  
12 term in City Council, and I thought  
13 our education system, the School  
14 District, was an ally. They're not.  
15 They're not, because they're letting  
16 their egos get in the way of saying,  
17 let's come to a compromise.

18           We gave a compromise for  
19 Lankenau. We said, give it five  
20 years. If they can't fix what they  
21 can't fix, shut them down. But you  
22 can't just tell everybody, okay,  
23 this is right, this is wrong, and  
24 then we're going to shut it down

1 right now. No opportunity to fix  
2 things. That's not how compromise  
3 works.

4 And I'm echoing everybody,  
5 you know, I'm just using this time  
6 to say how disappointed I am with  
7 the city of Philadelphia pushing  
8 these children to sit every evening  
9 at that 4:40, as I said, eating dry  
10 pizza, waiting their turn to  
11 testify. These are children who  
12 should be home doing their homework.  
13 Who should be playing, who should be  
14 having an evening to themselves.  
15 And they're sacrificing this because  
16 a bunch of adults cannot get their  
17 egos in check. This is a -- there's  
18 nothing else left but to assume this  
19 is an ego issue.

20 So, if you're listening,  
21 please listen loud and clear; let's  
22 be adults in the room. Let us fix  
23 this problem. Slow this down,  
24 review all of this, and take a no

1 vote. Take a no vote.

2 On happier -- on happier  
3 things, I'll wrap this up very  
4 quickly. I once again want to  
5 recognize Dr. Charlotte Brown,  
6 Rachel Hanible, Tijania Tee  
7 Goodwin, Dr. Jasmyn Wright, and  
8 Mecca Robinson. And all the host of  
9 women who were here, who are -- who  
10 do volunteerism in the city of  
11 Philadelphia, in fact, are doing a  
12 lot of work with these educational  
13 systems as well.

14 It was my pleasure to  
15 acknowledge them and really  
16 acknowledge that Philadelphia is a  
17 city of giving back. Our tradition  
18 of public service runs deep.  
19 Volunteers are often on the front  
20 lines and rarely get acknowledged.  
21 So today, I am so proud to recognize  
22 our residents of the city who  
23 tirelessly serve every day.

24 I also wanted to commend

1 the Council President about  
2 introducing a bill, which I did on  
3 his behalf, which authorizes the  
4 procurement of construction,  
5 installation, operation, and  
6 maintenance of direct current fast  
7 chargers in the cell phone lots at  
8 Philadelphia International Airport.  
9 This is connected to Lankenau  
10 because the Lankenau children are  
11 going to be the stewards,  
12 environmental stewards, of tomorrow.  
13 And what we -- this bill will help  
14 us continue to address climate  
15 change. It's all on a continuum.  
16 So we have to create those new  
17 stewards while we are being stewards  
18 right now, because this is a global  
19 problem.

20 And finally, I wanted to  
21 just give a quick update on the  
22 Human Trafficking Prevention and  
23 Awareness campaign that is underway.  
24 We were -- we had a really wonderful



1 press conference to announce those  
2 who had won the RFPs and we are  
3 ready to roll. But this is also to  
4 say that 2026 is just the beginning,  
5 because we are not going to get rid  
6 of all -- we are not going to get  
7 rid of human trafficking in the next  
8 six months. It is going to take a  
9 fight, because it's \$152 billion  
10 global industry that uses people,  
11 coerces people to give either labor  
12 or sex.

13 So we are -- I'm very  
14 pleased, you know, Philadelphia can  
15 do this. I'm very pleased to be at  
16 the forefront of the first municipal  
17 city -- most -- first municipal  
18 entity that has passed -- has put  
19 money into doing this work. Nowhere  
20 in the country have we had this kind  
21 of awareness and prevention campaign  
22 that has rolled out with \$500,000.

23 So I commend Council  
24 President for pushing this, and for

1 the mayor to agree for this, and the  
2 Office of Public Safety to work with  
3 us to get this going. But if you  
4 juxtapose the school closings and  
5 doing this, we know we can do  
6 better. So let's get there, people.

7 So thank you very much. I  
8 had more to say, but I'm going to --  
9 I'm just so disappointed. I am so  
10 sad that our children are coming  
11 every day, and today their hearts  
12 are in their mouths. So please,  
13 school board, please put your egos  
14 aside, and you don't have the data  
15 to support it. I will tell you that  
16 because we are trying to do our own  
17 analysis. Thank you, Council  
18 President. Thank you everyone for  
19 fighting so hard for our children.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
21 Thank you. Chair recognizes  
22 Councilwoman Jamie Gauthier.

23 COUNCILMEMBER GAUTHIER:  
24 Thank you, Council President. I've

1 said a lot about the school  
2 facilities plan, so I won't stay  
3 long there, but I'll give a few  
4 thoughts. Like my colleagues, I am  
5 frustrated, and disappointed, and  
6 angry that we are in this place with  
7 the School District and the School  
8 Board. And that they are willing to  
9 take this vote today while it feels  
10 like the entire city, and most of  
11 the political leadership is against  
12 this plan. And I know who they  
13 report to, right? They report to  
14 the Mayor.

15 But I don't know who they  
16 think their responsibility is to,  
17 because I would argue that their  
18 responsibility is to young people  
19 and to our communities, and none of  
20 their actions have displayed that.

21 And, you know, they sort of  
22 honored the request of the Majority  
23 Leader and the Majority Whip and  
24 others in delaying this vote that

1 was supposed to happen last week.  
2 But in that time, they've also  
3 completely resisted making any  
4 changes. So I'm not clear what the  
5 delay was even for, if they weren't  
6 willing to have substantive  
7 conversations with us.

8           It's also incredibly  
9 confusing that they can be so dug in  
10 on a plan that so many people are  
11 against, that they can be so  
12 inflexible with Council who is  
13 asking them to make reasonable,  
14 thoughtful changes. But -- yet --  
15 and still come into this room and  
16 ask us to do huge things for them,  
17 right? Huge things for them. It  
18 seems to me to be the very opposite  
19 of partnership. And it seems to me  
20 that they're also very bad  
21 negotiators. We were at Robeson  
22 this morning for a press conference  
23 led by our Chairman of the Education  
24 Committee, and we were joined by so

1 many students from both Robeson and  
2 Lankenau at that presser.

3 And in the case of Robeson,  
4 they have gone so far, but they are  
5 refusing to take the next logical  
6 step. So, initially, they were  
7 looking at Robeson's land and  
8 thinking that they should give it to  
9 developers, as opposed to let our  
10 kids continue to learn there, right?  
11 So they scrapped that after the -- a  
12 lot of us put zoning overlays on the  
13 properties that they wanted to give  
14 over to developers. And we said  
15 that those properties would have to  
16 be -- remain schools. So they  
17 scrapped that idea, and they said  
18 they're going to keep, you know, the  
19 property in school district  
20 ownership. They even committed to  
21 creating a committee to perhaps  
22 build a new school at the site. And  
23 they also added more money; \$120  
24 million plus more, for facilities in

1 the 3rd district.

2 Because, originally, we  
3 were the district that had amongst  
4 the highest number of closures,  
5 recommended, and the lowest amount  
6 of facilities investment. And so,  
7 at this point, as it relates to  
8 Robeson, a stellar school, as was  
9 pointed out by Dr. Ahmad, 96 percent  
10 graduation rate, sending kids to  
11 Harvard, and nationally acclaimed  
12 HBCUs. Listed as a model by  
13 Dr. Watlington himself when he came  
14 to visit about a year ago.

15 So in the case of Robeson,  
16 we have the land under district  
17 control, and it will remain that  
18 way. We have more than enough money  
19 to either renovate or rebuild a  
20 school at the site. They are  
21 thinking about building a school at  
22 the site, but for some reason, that  
23 school can't be Robeson. For some  
24 reason, they cannot take that extra

1 step and say, wow, the new school  
2 we're talking about building there  
3 should be the school that has lasted  
4 there so long. And the school where  
5 the students and the leadership have  
6 taken great strides to make it a  
7 place of academic excellence. And  
8 to me, that feels like mean  
9 spiritness.

10 To me, that feels like the  
11 height of disrespect to my  
12 community. And to me, it also feels  
13 like politics. And I feel like our  
14 care for our young people and our  
15 community should rise above all of  
16 those things.

17 And, you know, we've been  
18 having pretty heated debates in this  
19 chamber at the School District  
20 headquarters, and President  
21 Streater, in particular, he bristles  
22 when I say that, you know, if this  
23 plan goes through, that the board is  
24 being an agent of gentrification.

1 That the board is carrying out the  
2 same legacy of displacement that has  
3 happened in West Philadelphia since  
4 the raising of the black bottom,  
5 since the demolition of the  
6 University City townhomes, and since  
7 the closing of University City High,  
8 he bristles at that.

9 But my comments are about  
10 outcome. I don't care what your  
11 intent is. If you close this  
12 school, if you take away the last  
13 public high school and University  
14 City serving black students where  
15 they are thriving, and if you take,  
16 essentially, the last vestige of  
17 black civic life out of University  
18 City, then you are indeed an agent  
19 of gentrification and displacement.

20 And so, miss me with your  
21 sensitive feelings about that,  
22 because it's about outcome, not  
23 intent. So I will join my  
24 colleagues at 4:00 p.m. I will join



1 my colleagues at 4:00 p.m. at 440.  
2 But I'm really disappointed that we  
3 have to make that trip today. And  
4 I'm really disappointed that the  
5 School District and the School Board  
6 doesn't think it's necessary to have  
7 input from our communities, to have  
8 input from City Council.

9 And I'll also say they  
10 created this situation that feels so  
11 contentious now, because not only  
12 was the community never really  
13 invited to the table on this plan,  
14 Council was never invited either.  
15 So they never had buy-in from the  
16 community or from any of the  
17 political leadership. And it has  
18 resulted in this tense,  
19 confrontational situation that we  
20 find ourselves in right now. But I  
21 hope, I hope that by 4 o'clock they  
22 find a sense of justice and do the  
23 right thing for our communities.

24 I'm going to move on. I

1 also wanted to talk about a  
2 resolution that we enacted today.  
3 And so this was a resolution that I  
4 introduced alongside Minority Leader  
5 Kendra Brooks and Councilmember  
6 Dr. Nina Ahmad, calling on Congress  
7 and the Trump administration to  
8 provide comprehensive fertility care  
9 to service members.

10 Our city is home to  
11 thousands of active-duty military  
12 personnel and veterans who have  
13 health insurance through TRICARE,  
14 the government plan for our  
15 military.

16 Service members face  
17 significant risk, including injuries  
18 that may impact their reproductive  
19 health. Yet MAGA Republicans in the  
20 House of Representatives strip  
21 language from a must pass defense  
22 spending bill that would have  
23 allowed active-duty service members  
24 and their families to receive IVF

1 and fertility care.

2 It is particularly cruel  
3 that while these families sacrifice  
4 their safety for our nation,  
5 extremists in Washington have chosen  
6 this moment to strip away their path  
7 to parenthood.

8 I am a mom, and the biggest  
9 blessing and honor of my life is  
10 being a parent to two intelligent  
11 and kind sons. It is hard to  
12 reconcile the fact that anyone will  
13 want to deny life's biggest joy to  
14 the people who put everything on the  
15 line to keep us safe and free. By  
16 restricting access to IVF and other  
17 essential reproductive services, the  
18 Trump administration is advancing an  
19 extreme agenda that treats military  
20 families' fundamental rights as  
21 pawns in its ongoing crusade against  
22 healthcare and bodily autonomy.

23 This is particularly cruel  
24 in a moment when Trump continues his

1 illegal war against Iran, where it  
2 is increasingly clear he is in over  
3 his head, putting our service  
4 members at risk.

5 I was proud to lock arms  
6 with Leader Brooks, and then  
7 Councilmember Gilmore-Richardson, to  
8 enact the reproductive freedom  
9 package in the wake of Dobbs. And I  
10 applaud my -- I applaud my  
11 colleagues who have been leading on  
12 this issue in the year since,  
13 cementing Philly's place as  
14 reproductive -- as a reproductive  
15 healthcare safe haven. Because here  
16 in Philly, we don't just talk about  
17 it; we act. MAGA likes to claim  
18 that they support our troops. The  
19 least Congress can do is ensure our  
20 service members have access to the  
21 full range of reproductive  
22 healthcare they need to become  
23 parents.

24 I want to thank everyone

1 who came to City Hall today to  
2 support this important issue and our  
3 partners with Americans for  
4 Contraception, who are holding the  
5 line for bodily autonomy in  
6 Washington and around the country.  
7 Thank you so much.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

9 Thank you very much. Chair  
10 recognizes Councilmember Rue Landau.

11 COUNCILMEMBER LANDAU:

12 Thank you, Council President. It is  
13 going to be very, very difficult to  
14 go after that fiery speech,  
15 colleague. I would take 30 seconds  
16 to just echo everything my  
17 colleagues are saying. I am so  
18 proud of all of you, and all of us,  
19 and for standing together on this  
20 issue. I was out arm in arm with  
21 the -- with everybody today outside  
22 of Robeson. And I will also be  
23 there at 440, at 4:00. But I wanted  
24 to just -- as we've been talking

1 about legal measures, just talk  
2 about a little legal terminology,  
3 which is so interesting. When  
4 there's a - when -- oftentimes when  
5 you cite a defect, a flaw, a maybe  
6 an infraction of a law, you give the  
7 party an opportunity to cure, to fix  
8 it. You give people an opportunity  
9 to fix it first.

10 The School Board dropped  
11 this on us with conclusions without  
12 giving us the information that we  
13 need about how to fix and what we  
14 need to fix in order to make this  
15 happen. And I do believe, as we've  
16 been saying, we've been talking  
17 about organizing with community,  
18 with parents, with students. Who  
19 knows? Even with some of the  
20 businesses in the area. We could  
21 fix these defects; we could cure  
22 them.

23 And I really do think that  
24 the lack of process, a lack of due

1 process that they gave us, the  
2 speeding along with this process is  
3 their biggest, biggest mistake.

4 But speaking of law and  
5 justice, in May, we celebrate 60  
6 years of CLS. I introduced a  
7 resolution today recognizing,  
8 congratulating, and honoring  
9 Community Legal Services on six  
10 decades of outstanding, dedicated  
11 service to Philadelphians.

12 As a proud former CLS  
13 attorney, I know the impact that  
14 this organization has on  
15 Philadelphians living in poverty,  
16 children, seniors, immigrants,  
17 people with disabilities, and so  
18 many more. I owe my current  
19 position as a Councilmember to the  
20 work I did at CLS, where I really  
21 cut my teeth as an attorney and was  
22 able to join the fight for justice  
23 and against inequities so many in  
24 our city face.

1 CLS helps more than 14,000  
2 Philadelphians each year, preventing  
3 homelessness, reuniting families,  
4 breaking down barriers to  
5 employment, and so much more. I'm  
6 so proud to be a part of this -- of  
7 their story, and even happier to be  
8 here in Council to congratulate them  
9 on this milestone.

10 Last week also, I held a  
11 press conference announcing my  
12 intention to fight for our arts in  
13 the budget. And I want to make sure  
14 that the musicians -- artists and  
15 musicians of this city don't get  
16 left out of that conversation. I  
17 was proud to co-sponsor Councilman  
18 Thomas's Music Month resolution  
19 today.

20 And also today,  
21 Councilmember Brooks and I  
22 co-introduced a resolution uplifting  
23 an amazing Philly producer, Will  
24 Yip. Will was the first Asian-



1 American and second Philadelphian  
2 producer to win the Grammy Award for  
3 best Rock album. And he is also a  
4 proud Central High School and Temple  
5 alum. It was a pleasure to welcome  
6 him and his family here in Council  
7 today.

8 I also introduced a  
9 resolution recognizing May 4th  
10 through May 8th, 2026 as Philly Tech  
11 Week. Philadelphia is a hope for  
12 innovation, technology, and  
13 entrepreneurship. From startups to  
14 tech giants, we're home to an  
15 animated and booming tech ecosystem.  
16 As Chair of the Technology  
17 Committee, I encourage everyone to  
18 check out the incredible programming  
19 being offered as we kick off in May.

20 And finally, I also  
21 introduced a resolution authorizing  
22 hearings on SEPTA Student Fares, so  
23 we can explore the expansion of this  
24 crucial resource. I know many of us

1 here are parents, and we know that  
2 students are more than scholars.  
3 They're participating in after-  
4 school jobs, extracurriculars,  
5 sports, and more.

6 For many young people, the  
7 costs of travel add up and fall to  
8 already struggling families. Right  
9 now, SEPTA fare cards only work  
10 during school days, only from 5:30  
11 to 8:00 p.m., and only for students  
12 who live over 1.5 miles from their  
13 school. I'm eager to learn more  
14 from these hearings and how we can  
15 best serve the young people of  
16 Philadelphia and make this the most  
17 teen friendly city in the country.  
18 Thank you.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
20 Thank you very much. Chair  
21 recognizes Councilman Jeffrey J.  
22 Young.

23 COUNCILMEMBER YOUNG: Thank  
24 you, Mr. President. Today, I just

1 wanted to acknowledge one of my  
2 interns Chase Mlatsi. Today is --  
3 this is his last week in our office,  
4 and I want to wish Chase the best as  
5 he goes on to his future endeavors.

6 I want to thank my  
7 colleague, Rue Landau, for  
8 introducing the resolution on  
9 Community Legal Services. I am a  
10 intern alum of Community Legal  
11 Services. I worked as an intern  
12 there during law school.

13 Special shout out to former  
14 State Rep Donna Bullock and my  
15 supervisor and attorney, Rasheedah  
16 Phillips, who worked under the  
17 Community Economic Development Unit  
18 where we worked on land use and  
19 zoning matters for daycares,  
20 childcare centers, and other small  
21 businesses.

22 I want to thank my  
23 colleague, Councilmember Gauthier,  
24 for introducing the resolution,

1 honoring the students from Boys'  
2 Latin. Two of the students are sons  
3 of my Chief of Staff. So just  
4 wanted to thank you for that, the  
5 honor and recognition.

6 Today, we introduced bills  
7 that would create a temporary permit  
8 parking around the Lemon Hill area  
9 during the FIFA Fan Fest. So I  
10 encourage every community around  
11 Lemon Hill to be on the lookout.  
12 We'll be having community meetings  
13 to discuss what this legislation  
14 looks like and the impact that it'll  
15 have on your community.

16 I want to thank my  
17 colleagues today for passing the  
18 resolution that would transfer  
19 property to Historic Fair Hill,  
20 which is a nonprofit in the 5th  
21 Council District. They'll be using  
22 this property to build a community  
23 center and to use it as a community  
24 garden for programming.

1           And of course, last but not  
2   least -- no, one more thing. We  
3   have a hearing tomorrow to talk  
4   about our library facilities in the  
5   city of Philadelphia. So if anyone  
6   wishes to come down, we have a  
7   hearing tomorrow at 10:00 a.m. here  
8   at City Council to talk about the  
9   state of our libraries here. But of  
10   course, last, I want to talk about  
11   the School District and the school  
12   facilities plan.

13           Many folks know that on day  
14   one, I introduced a bill that would  
15   allow city council to impeach school  
16   board members, right? Because I  
17   just -- I knew we were going to come  
18   to this point, right? We have to be  
19   able to hold that school board  
20   accountable to the people of the  
21   city of Philadelphia. And it seems  
22   like right now, you know, they're  
23   not listening to the people. It  
24   seems like that they put billionaire

1 interest over the interest of the  
2 people of the city of Philadelphia.  
3 And we cannot stand for that.

4 It is ironic how they --  
5 I'm looking here at a sheet of paper  
6 talking about billionaires for Uber  
7 and Lyft. They don't want to  
8 listen. But also at the same time,  
9 School District is listening to  
10 other billionaires that want to  
11 gentrify our city and close schools  
12 that send kids to Harvard. And  
13 close schools that have a hundred  
14 percent graduation rate, right? And  
15 close neighborhood comprehensive  
16 schools, which they say they want to  
17 increase, right? But that's -- it's  
18 just very contradictory.

19 Now, we've been saying this  
20 over and over again over the last  
21 few months. Let's just be fair  
22 about it or be honest, right? Be  
23 honest with us and tell us what it  
24 really is, right? Tell the people

1 of the city what it really is. You  
2 know, and -- you know, we've been  
3 saying this over and over again, and  
4 I just don't know why those members  
5 of the board are -- aren't just  
6 taking a hard look and really making  
7 this a partnership, right?

8           They talk about, you know,  
9 this --we are a partnership, but  
10 there was no discussion with me  
11 whatsoever on -- you know, on this  
12 plan. They just came out and it was  
13 like, this is what it is. We are  
14 closing Penn Treaty, we are closing  
15 Warren, you know, we're closing  
16 Robert Morris, right? That's just  
17 what it is, right? You have no  
18 conversation whatsoever about how  
19 it's going to impact our community.

20           And I was at Penn Treaty  
21 yesterday for a rally. And, you  
22 know, again, with Penn Treaty  
23 specifically, it's a lot of  
24 contradictions when they say they

1 want to lower transitions. Well,  
2 Penn Treaty is a 6-12 school. So  
3 what -- how many transitions do you  
4 need, right? It's a neighborhood  
5 comprehensive high school. That's a  
6 neighborhood school, but they want  
7 to increase neighborhood schools.  
8 They're closing that school, right?  
9 But it's not that the building --  
10 they're closing that school, but  
11 then want to put another school in  
12 that same building.

13           So the school is not good  
14 enough for the, you know, for the  
15 black and brown kids, you know, that  
16 go to Penn Treaty, but we want to  
17 put another school there, right?  
18 Same thing with Warren, they want to  
19 close Warren down for that  
20 community, but want to put master in  
21 there, right? So it's good enough  
22 for other kids, but not good enough  
23 for the community that lives there.  
24 And I -- it just doesn't make any



1 sense to me.

2 As my colleague said, this  
3 looks more like politics. And we  
4 shouldn't play politics with our  
5 kids. Like that's the one thing we  
6 shouldn't do. As government  
7 officials, our kids mean everything.  
8 They are our future. We look at our  
9 scores right now, we have some of  
10 the lowest scores amongst our kids.  
11 And yes, the School District is  
12 rising, but closing the -- some of  
13 the top schools in the city will not  
14 help us remain on up and up. Like  
15 that just doesn't -- it just won't  
16 work. It just won't work.

17 So you -- folks already  
18 know where I stand from the very  
19 beginning. I've been asking members  
20 of the School Board to vote no on  
21 this plan. It just doesn't make any  
22 sense logically to talk about, you  
23 know, closing, because it's --  
24 that's a school closure plan, right?

1 That's what it is. It doesn't make  
2 sense to talk about closing some  
3 schools while leaving others open  
4 that are dramatically  
5 underachieving, right? You're  
6 closing high achieving schools.  
7 It's just not right. It's just not  
8 right.

9 And I hope the members of  
10 the School Board are listening  
11 because my colleagues are upset.  
12 And if you think this is something  
13 that you want to remain on, you got  
14 to remember, it's a high likelihood  
15 that many of the members are going  
16 to be back here and you're going to  
17 be asking to be reappointed, right?  
18 I'm just saying.

19 So, you know, I hope you do  
20 the right thing. Do what's in your  
21 heart. Do what you think the right  
22 thing is for our city, right? Let  
23 the politics get -- let the politics  
24 go. We're not here -- I am not here

1 to play politics. I'm here to do  
2 what's right for my community and  
3 here to do what's right for the city  
4 of Philadelphia. And I hope you are  
5 too. Thank you, Mr. President.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
7 Thank you very much, Member Young  
8 Chair recognizes Councilmember Mark  
9 Squilla.

10 COUNCILMEMBER SQUILLA:  
11 Thank you, Mr. President. And, you  
12 know, I often don't give speeches,  
13 but I do have to say something  
14 today, and I apologize I wasn't -- I  
15 was unable to attend the press  
16 conference this morning. And it is  
17 sad that we see something happening  
18 today where we have so much  
19 unanimous support. Our Chair of our  
20 Education Committee has been working  
21 diligently and very respectfully  
22 with the School Board and District  
23 along this process.

24 And, you know, we heard all

1 the concerns about the schools'  
2 closures, but there's so many other  
3 different things that happen during  
4 this process. And one is  
5 modernization and how that money is  
6 being spent and the plan's moving  
7 forward. We went to a meeting at  
8 Southwark School, looking at the  
9 conditions there and reassessments  
10 that need to happen. Committees  
11 that are being set up, but things  
12 are to be voted on ahead of time  
13 before they do it. Was it just back  
14 at school the other day where they  
15 rush a committee, where they changed  
16 their decision on a Monday and we're  
17 going to vote on it on a Thursday  
18 without having given anybody any  
19 input of how a plan would work.

20 These things create  
21 mistrust. And when they do that,  
22 people look at us as way to try to  
23 address that mistrust. And we feel  
24 like at this point, even though

1 we're advocating, if you can't  
2 postpone this vote, you have to vote  
3 no, because there's not enough  
4 information for all the decisions to  
5 be made that quick. Even -- they're  
6 saying they've been doing this for a  
7 long time, but even the adjustments  
8 and changes they made without the  
9 data associated with it, makes it  
10 really difficult for people to buy  
11 into it, even if it was a good idea.

12           So I would just say, and  
13 I'm joining my colleagues today in  
14 that we have to postpone this vote.  
15 And if you can't postpone it, then  
16 you have to vote no. And I think  
17 that's the only option that we have.  
18 We support our colleagues. We will  
19 stand together united on a front  
20 here and making sure that they know  
21 that where we are as a body. And I  
22 think that is the most important  
23 thing.

24           And yes, they have a job to

1 do, and we want them to do it with  
2 thoughtfulness. And we wanted to do  
3 it with data and be able to -- not  
4 that we have to agree with  
5 everything, it's not, we have to  
6 agree with every decision they make  
7 and whatever. Just if you could  
8 show us why you made these decisions  
9 based on these facts, we may not  
10 even like it at that point, but at  
11 least we could respect it. So,  
12 thank you.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:  
14 Thank you. Councilman Dr. Anthony  
15 Phillips.

16 COUNCILMEMBER PHILIPS:  
17 Thank you, Council President. I  
18 just want to iterate that it is -- I  
19 don't think a lot of folks in the  
20 city of Philadelphia understand, you  
21 know, how passionate and deeply  
22 committed this council is to issues.  
23 And we -- not only is this Council  
24 deeply committed that we we're

1 about, you know, changing the status  
2 quo. And I'm just so proud to  
3 support, you know, all of our  
4 members here today as we stand up to  
5 the School District of Philadelphia.

6 I just want to briefly just  
7 say that this -- a lot of this has  
8 to, you know, for public to know,  
9 like, a lot of this is about  
10 process. The process of how this  
11 went down is just terrible, right?  
12 As an elected official, one of the  
13 things I always tell people as a --  
14 as a servant to members of the 9th  
15 District, I always have an idea, but  
16 I never make that idea without  
17 making sure our neighbors are step,  
18 you know, with -- on step with me on  
19 that idea.

20 I'll give you a prime  
21 example. I do love speed cushions.  
22 However, I may not love a lot of  
23 speed cushions in the city of  
24 Philadelphia, right? Yet, because

1 the public -- our residents in the  
2 9th District wanted speed cushions  
3 around our schools, I made the  
4 decision to create a law that would  
5 make it easier for speed cushions to  
6 be around our schools. And that  
7 took months and months of  
8 conversations with residents.

9 I always tell people we --  
10 the School Board was appointed and  
11 -- but they weren't appointed with  
12 this idea that, trust me to make a  
13 decision. It was appointed -- the  
14 same thing with us as  
15 Councilmembers, we were elected with  
16 the idea that we had the best  
17 character to be able to bring  
18 people's voices together, to listen  
19 to people, and then make a decision  
20 on their behalf. Whether or not  
21 it's something that you wanted to  
22 see or not; it's about what the  
23 people wanted to see.

24 And unfortunately, the



1 School Board is understanding of,  
2 I'm going to make a decision today  
3 because I think it's the right thing  
4 to do, and still ignoring everyone  
5 else. And they are all saying, oh,  
6 no, we had these listening sessions;  
7 we ended up doing town halls after  
8 that. It's -- that's not enough.

9 I remember two years ago,  
10 we had an issue in Northeast where  
11 we had this road that was constantly  
12 having a legal dumping taking place  
13 in Northeast. And I already knew  
14 that we probably would have to make  
15 a decision on closing that road, but  
16 I said, no, it's not my decision;  
17 it's the people's decision. And we  
18 went through a series, series of  
19 meetings with the public who just  
20 said, you know what, Phillips, we  
21 have finally come to an  
22 understanding that, you know, we  
23 probably have to close the road at a  
24 certain point of time, right?

1           That is an -- that's an  
2 inclusive process. That's when you  
3 make a decision that feels good,  
4 because you didn't just say through  
5 a knee jerk reaction, just like  
6 Dr. Watlington just did a couple  
7 months ago. I made this decision.  
8 You -- I'm going to -- I asked you  
9 to support me because I'm the school  
10 Superintendent, school board, same  
11 thing. We're making a decision. I  
12 asked you to support me because  
13 you're the School Board. We're  
14 going to listen to you a little bit.  
15 You're not going to get everything  
16 you want, but we're what -- you  
17 should just trust me.

18           You have to find a way to  
19 help people feel good about your  
20 decision when you're a public  
21 person. And you can't necessarily  
22 just be like, I'm in charge. Trust  
23 me.

24           The reason why the Mayor of

1 New York right now has so much  
2 popularity has not anything to do  
3 with his -- what he's doing. He has  
4 some of the great -- his policies,  
5 initiatives are great, but it's his  
6 style, right? It's how he's  
7 including people and being  
8 transparent and taking time to make  
9 decisions and holding himself  
10 accountable.

11 We have to have a school  
12 board who's truly -- you see people  
13 who are upset, so clearly you  
14 haven't brought everyone to the  
15 table in the best way, but you're  
16 still going forward. And that to  
17 me, is not right. It's not the  
18 proper leadership that we need right  
19 now in this 21st century.

20 And I think an old guard  
21 still believes that the public still  
22 loves this. Trust me, I'll do it.  
23 That's not the way it is. And I  
24 think people are going to find out,

1 unfortunately, that that's not how  
2 this world wants leadership to be  
3 anymore. And you have to be  
4 inclusive. So I just ask the School  
5 Board of Philadelphia to think about  
6 were they really inclusive and  
7 making sure that we had everyone's  
8 voice at the table so everyone can  
9 at some point feel relatively decent  
10 about this decision. Thank you.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

12 Thank you very much. Chair  
13 recognizes Councilmember Quetcy  
14 Lozada.

15 COUNCILMEMBER LOZADA:

16 Thank you, Council President. I  
17 promise to be brief because I think  
18 that we all share the same feelings  
19 about this school Board decision.  
20 The only thing I will add is that  
21 the School Board needs to look at  
22 the young people that have shown up.  
23 There have been so many young people  
24 that have never stood up for

1 themselves and advocated for their  
2 schools, for their friends, for  
3 their families, for their community,  
4 like they have this time.

5 I want to -- I want to  
6 recognize the students at Stetson  
7 Elementary, the students at Conwell,  
8 the students at Harding. Students  
9 that don't typically show up to  
10 rallies and to protest and to fight  
11 for things that they believe in.  
12 But because they truly believe that  
13 the decisions that are being made  
14 for them did not include them, does  
15 not include their voice, does not  
16 make sense to them, they felt  
17 important to be present.

18 And so I ask the School  
19 Board to take that into  
20 consideration. What are we saying  
21 to these young people? What are we  
22 saying to them with a vote in  
23 support of something that they truly  
24 do not believe in, right? We ask

1 young people to stand up and be  
2 present and stand up for themselves  
3 and be a part of the process. And  
4 they've done that. And so I ask the  
5 School Board to really look at that  
6 and take that into consideration and  
7 show them that they matter. That  
8 the -- that them being a part of  
9 this process really, really matters.

10 I stand with my colleagues  
11 in saying that we believe that  
12 things have to be done. We  
13 recognize that. We've been asking  
14 for a facilities plan for a really  
15 long time. So to all of those  
16 people out there saying, where was  
17 all of this -- all of this noise a  
18 year or two ago, where was the  
19 pushback on the facilities plan in  
20 the last budget cycle? I want you  
21 to know that it was there. We were  
22 talking about these possibilities  
23 last year and the year before that.  
24 And as a matter of fact, we've been

1 talking about the facilities plan  
2 and the need for this since I  
3 arrived here, and probably much  
4 longer than that.

5 And so this is not new. So  
6 let's stop the misinformation. This  
7 is not new. We have been pushing  
8 back and asking the School District  
9 and the board to come up with a plan  
10 that is inclusive and that makes  
11 sense for children and families in  
12 their communities for a really long  
13 time. We were talking about how  
14 fiscally responsible or  
15 irresponsible it was going to be  
16 last year. So this is not new.  
17 This is not new.

18 I want folks to understand  
19 that because a lot of the people  
20 that are calling my office are  
21 talking about where were you last  
22 year? Where were you when you were  
23 approving an initiative that was  
24 somebody else's priority? Where was

1 the priority of the children back  
2 then? The priority of the kids in  
3 our communities have always been  
4 present. We've always been talking  
5 about them.

6 I want folks to understand  
7 that. And I want the School Board  
8 to remember that. Remember the  
9 conversations that we had last year.  
10 Remember the conversations that have  
11 been led by Education Chair Thomas,  
12 who really -- we really have to give  
13 him kudos. And I know Councilmember  
14 Thomas is doesn't like to be put,  
15 you know, out front, but his  
16 leadership has really been firm and  
17 has been strong. And so I'm  
18 grateful for that. Thank you for  
19 speaking up for the kids in my  
20 community. Thank all of you, all of  
21 the Councilmembers who have  
22 prioritized the kids in our -- in  
23 our neighborhoods.

24 And lastly, I just want to



1 say congratulations to Conwell.  
2 Conwell was on the middle -- on the  
3 chopping block. They also  
4 advocated; they're celebrating 100  
5 years. And I hope that like  
6 Conwell, all of our other schools  
7 will be at that point to celebrate a  
8 hundred years of educating and  
9 preparing our kids to be future  
10 leaders. Thank you.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

12 Thank you. Thank you very much.

13 One, I do want to  
14 acknowledge in the same sentiments,  
15 which you talked about, the  
16 leadership of Member Thomas being  
17 Chair of the Education Committee.  
18 And he's not new to this. He meets  
19 with the board pretty much monthly  
20 regarding a variety of different  
21 issues. So he didn't just show up  
22 and say, let me start addressing the  
23 issue now. And so I'm also thanking  
24 the leadership of all the members of

1 sticking and staying together.

2 I remember Rue last week  
3 said, after we passed out the ICE  
4 bill that I think you said, I felt  
5 my inner activist or activism, which  
6 I think you were referring to when I  
7 talk about, this is an activist  
8 Council who has no problem speaking  
9 truth to power on behalf of those on  
10 most in need. And so continue to  
11 keep fighting the good fight. We'll  
12 see what happens this evening. But  
13 there is a path forward and we  
14 continue to keep advocating on  
15 what's in the best interest of our  
16 children here in the city of  
17 Philadelphia.

18 And with that being said,  
19 the Chair recognizes Councilmember  
20 Isaiah Thomas for a motion to  
21 adjourn.

22 COUNCILMEMBER THOMAS:  
23 Thank you, Council President. I  
24 move that Council stands adjourned

1 until Thursday, May 7th, 2026 at  
2 10:00 a.m.

3 COUNCILMEMBER: Second.

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

5 It has been moved and properly  
6 seconded that Council stand  
7 adjourned until Thursday, May 7th,  
8 2026 at 10:00 a.m.

9 All those in favor will  
10 signify by saying aye.

11 COUNCILMEMBERS: Aye.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT JOHNSON:

13 Anyone opposed? The ayes have it.  
14 The motion carries. Thank you all  
15 very much.
