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COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERA: Good morning.

I note that the hour has come and that a quorum of

this Council is present. Council will come to

6

order. Members will take their seats and visitors

will retire to the seats outside the rails.

8

To give our invocation this morning, the

Chair welcomes Rabbi Brian Walt of Mishkan Shalom

Synagogue. He is here as the guest of Councilman

11

Nutter. Members and guests will please rise.

12

RABBI WALT: Oh, source of life, source

13

of compassion and love, source of justice and of

14

freedom, the one who has called the members of this

15

Council to public service, be here with us this

16

morning.

17

As we take these moment to open our

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hearts in prayer, let us reflect on the values, the

19

passion, the commitments that called us to public

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service. At this moment before we begin the

21

business of the meeting, let us remember the call,

22

the deepest values that brought each of us into this

23

room at this time.

24

In two weeks, the Jewish people will

25

celebrate Passover, the festival of freedom that has

1 INVOCATION

2 inspired so many of different faiths and many
3 different peoples in their struggle to make our
4 world just, free and fair.

5 As people who have taken on the sacred
6 task of leadership in this City, I want to bring to
7 mind Moses, the one who was called by God to lead
8 the struggle for justice. Moses, our teacher, the
9 teacher of all people, whose passion for justice and
10 freedom burns inside of him and he's never consumed.

11 As a young man, Moses encounters an
12 Egyptian hitting an Israelite. The Jewish Bible
13 teaches us he looks this way and that way and he saw
14 there was no man, no person. On a simple level, it
15 seems that Moses to checking to see if there was any
16 official who might catch him in the act. Jewish
17 tradition presents a different understanding. Moses
18 looked this way and then that way to see if there
19 was anyone else around who would intervene to stop
20 the injustice. And as he looked around, he was
21 horrified to find not only was there injustice, but
22 there was no decent human being around; there was no
23 person. There was no one who would intervene. It
24 was then that he lost his temper and acted on his
25 passion.

1 INVOCATION

2 Let us take this moment to reflect on
3 our young lives, our lives when we were young and
4 the events that impelled us to be a voice for
5 humanity and decency in our community. And let us
6 remember Moses and let us remember the bush that
7 burned for him and burns within us, our passion to
8 be a voice for the voiceless, to bring decency,
9 fairness, equality, and justice for all citizens.
10 Let these values guide our deliberations.

11 May the example of Moses and the message
12 of Passover give us hope when we are discouraged.
13 We are each called to do our part. Jewish tradition
14 teaches none of us is obliged to finish the work,
15 only to do our part.

16 The Psalmist asks, Who is fit to hold
17 power and worthy to act in God's place? Those with
18 a passion for truth and are horrified by injustice,
19 who act with mercy to poor and take up the cause of
20 the helpless, their strength is in their compassion.
21 God's light shines through hearts. Their children's
22 children will bless them, and the work of their
23 hands will endure.

24 May God's light, the power that calls to
25 freedom and justice, the power that called Moses,

2 the power that calls each of us shine through our
3 hearts. May our children's children bless us and
4 may the work of our hands and the work of this
5 Council endure. And let us say amen.

9 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: You're welcome.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair

12 honoring the 25th Anniversary of the Philadelphia
13 Gay News. Will Mr. Mark Segal and those
14 accompanying him please join Councilman DiCicco at
15 the podium.

16 COUNCILMAN DI CICC0: Thank you, Madam
17 President. On behalf of the City Council of the
18 City of Philadelphia, we introduce a resolution
19 honoring the Philadelphia Gay News on its 25th
20 anniversary.

21 Whereas, Philadelphia is a City that
22 prides itself in the rich diversity of its citizens
23 regardless of race, religion, gender, or sexual
24 orientation; and

25 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Whereas, in 1976,

2 recognizing the need for a publication that would
3 speak to and educate what at that time was a largely
4 hidden community, Mark Segal took a daring step by
5 creating one of the first newspapers in America
6 dedicated to serving and representing the lesbian,
7 gay, bisexual and transgendered community. And as
8 the community grew, so did the Philadelphia Gay
9 News.

10 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: And whereas,
11 from the recent domestic partnership legislation to
12 the elimination of hate crimes, from voter education
13 to HIV and AIDS education and information, PGN has
14 been a leader in the newspaper and the newspaper of
15 record for the community it represents. PGN has
16 broaden our perspective on gay issues and enhanced
17 our understanding of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and
18 transgendered community and made this City a safer,
19 saner and more humanitarian place; and

20 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Whereas, although
21 PGN has championed causes important to the lesbian,
22 gay, bisexual and transgendered community and has
23 worked to foster better relationships, it has always
24 attempted to present and unbiased viewpoint, even
25 when the subject is painful such as financial

2 scandals in some AIDS groups. As publisher Mark
3 Segal has stated, "It is not our job to be
4 cheerleader every day;" and

5 COUNCILMAN ORTIZ: Gayness has arrived.

6 Whereas, with a staff dedicated to
7 serving the community, the Philadelphia Gay News is
8 one of the most long-lived and award-winning gay
9 newspapers in the country and is well-respected
10 within a journalism circles. As the paper has
11 grown, so has the staff, now including, along with
12 Mark Segal, Victor Havens, Alicia Hicks, Karen
13 Goulart, Doug Gruse, Gene Kohl, Tony Lombardo, Rick
14 Lombardo, don Pignolet, Pat Romanelli, Chris Schwam,
15 Patti Tihey, David Watson and Joel Weiner; now,
16 therefore

17 COUNCILMAN DI CICC0: Resolved by the
18 City of the City of Philadelphia, that we hereby
19 recognize and congratulate the Philadelphia Gay News
20 on the occasion of its 25th anniversary.

21 Further resolved, that an engrossed copy
22 of this resolution be presented to Mark Segal as
23 publisher of PGN as evidence of the respect and
24 sincere sentiments of this legislative body. This
25 is a true and correct copy of the original

3 Philadelphia on the 1st day of February in the year
4 2001. Signed by the President of City Council, Anna

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
10 recognizes Mark Segal for remarks.

11 MR. SEGAL it is indeed an honor to BE
12 recognized by President Council Verna, the first
13 woman Council President of this Council in history
14 of the City of Philadelphia. And that sort of shows
15 you what we've become as a City. We've all grown up
16 together. There's not a person that's sitting in
17 Council today that I have not politically grown up
18 with over the last 25 years and we've created a City
19 that has embraced diversity.

20 I'm sort of humbled today sitting here
21 and realizing that I'm speaking and I keep looking
22 at the galleries because there's no one here
23 objecting, and this feels very uncomfortable, to be
24 quite honest with you because usually when I come
25 into this Council Chamber, I'm here harangue you

2 about something or ask for your support for
3 something. But we've grown up together as a City,
4 as a community, and as people.

5 Philadelphia is a progressive City and
6 we're very proud of the City. I'm very proud that
7 today all Members of Council are sponsoring this
8 resolution. It shows how far we as community have
9 come and it shows how far the City government has
10 come together. And I thank you for that and I
11 cannot be more humble. I'd rather have this than a
12 document from the President of the United States
13 today. Thank you.

20 The Chair recognizes Councilman Nutter.

21 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Thank you, Madam
22 President. I offer one resolution and I wish to be
23 heard on it.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank you.

25 The Clerk will please read the title of

2 the resolution.

3 THE CLERK: A resolution requesting that
4 the Board of Education of the School District of
5 Philadelphia suspend any action which establishes
6 any new or increased fee schedule for Parent
7 Cooperative Nursery Program until a comprehensive
8 review and analysis of all the early childhood
9 programs have been performed by the School District
10 in conjunction with all the stakeholders.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
12 recognizes Councilman Nutter.

13 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Thank you, Madam
14 President. I move the adoption of the resolution.
15 (Duly seconded.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: It has been
17 moved and seconded that the resolution be adopted.
18 You care to speak on it, Councilman
19 Nutter?

20 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Very briefly, Madam
21 President. Thank you very much.

22 Madam President, I know that myself,
23 along with many of my colleagues are strong
24 supporters of the Philadelphia Public School system.
25 I know that also we are very careful about any

2 instance that might be considered micro-management
3 of the District. I am very mindful that we have
4 essentially an independent school system and a Board
5 of Education that's appointed by the Mayor. We do
6 have an obligation and responsibility, though, and
7 we will take part of that action today in
8 re-authorizing the taxes that help support the
9 schools on the City side; the State subsequently
10 will take its action.

11 The issue regarding the Parent
12 Cooperative Nursery Program has been the topic of a
13 lot of conversation since last year, also this
14 year's budget hearings and at the moment as we speak
15 is still an unresolved issue. It is a program that
16 serves 4-year-olds, some of whom may be members of
17 the Class of September of 2002 in first grade, maybe
18 in Philadelphia Public Schools.

19 We've tried to reach resolution on this
20 particular issue. We've gone beyond anyone's notion
21 of whether there should be an increase fee or not.
22 I'm beyond that. There will be an increased fee for
23 this program. The question that is unresolved is,
24 how do we reach a number that makes any sense? What
25 are we trying to accomplish with this particular

2 program? And how do we encourage to the greatest
3 extent possible parents to be involved in the
4 education and the lives of their children at the
5 earliest possible stage?

6 I can only say to you, Madam President,
7 that based on what has happened over the past year
8 or so, any parent under this circumstance who has to
9 continue to fight with the District about a program
10 that everyone agrees will lead to a better
11 educational opportunity for their 4-year-old going
12 to our full-day kindergarten, which we've both from
13 a policy standpoint implemented a number of years
14 ago and subsequently were ordered by the Court to
15 have in place; everyone agrees that a 4-year-old's
16 educational experience helps to lead to a better
17 5-year-old and 6-year-old and hopefully on to a
18 great life and career in our City. It's an
19 important program. It should be expanded; it should
20 not be reduced. There are probably many other areas
21 in the City that could benefit from that kind of
22 educational experience that some of us may have had
23 many, many years ago in a different kind of fashion;
24 whether we had stay-home parents or some other
25 educational experience as a young child.

1 INTRODUCTION OF BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS

2 I wish to see a resolution to this
3 particular issue. The process has been flawed. In
4 the District's own testimony in public hearings
5 indicates that they did not do many of the things
6 that they had committed to do in last year's
7 resolution passed by the Board on this particular
8 issue. All I've asked is that the School District
9 take some time -- and if they don't want to work
10 with the parents for whatever reason in a legitimate
11 fashion, then they at least should give the courtesy
12 to this City Council, as we have raised this issue
13 time and time again, they should do what they said
14 that they were going to do, give us the information
15 and then let us reach a collective resolution.

16 We are all serving the same people. The
17 parents of these children who go to a non-mandated
18 program will one day be public school students. We
19 will serve them in the schools, we will serve them
20 in our City services; they're all the same people.
21 And in a City that has lost more population than any
22 City in the United States of the America in the last
23 50 years, who the Mayor of this City indicated that
24 the No. 1 issue in this City in a news story was
25 schools, schools, schools, I do not understand why

2 we continue to have to fight and struggle about a
3 program that helps to serve people throughout this
4 City that actually might encourage them to have a
5 good educational experience and stay with us for the
6 next 12 or 13 years of their lives.

7 And so with that, Madam President, I
8 would encourage my colleagues to support this
9 particular resolution and let us get a final answer
10 to this issue and not have to revisit this issue
11 year after year after year. Thank you, Madam
12 President.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank you.
14 All of those in favor of the adoption of the
15 resolution will signify by saying aye.

16 (Aye.)

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Those opposed?

18 (No response.)

11 to try to stem that population flight. And it spoke
12 about Philadelphia where the flight, or at least
13 population was replaced. The left, but immigrants
14 and other individuals did come in in sufficient
15 numbers so that we did not lose the population that
16 everyone was speaking and talking that we were going
17 to lose. And they spoke about this other city and
18 activities that they did, the government and the
19 Mayor and the City Council. Among one of the things
20 that they did and they've been hailed and even they
21 came down here to testify and to tell us the route
22 to take, some of them, they built ballparks, they
23 built stadiums, they built Camden Yards and they
24 built a football stadium. And the reporter makes a
25 point that says it did not stop the flight, it did

2 not bring in population, and it did not create the
3 jobs.

4 We have not built the stadiums as of yet
5 and we still grew or at least maintained a semblance
6 of the population, although we lost some. But the
7 panacea, the prescription that we were being given
8 as to expenditures on these projects really did not
9 bear fruition. The City is Baltimore. The stadium
10 is Camden yards. It really did not produce the
11 results that the Mayor and City Council thought they
12 were going to produce. Thank you, Madam Chair.
