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2 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:

3 Good afternoon, everyone. And thank you
4 to my Council colleagues and everyone
5 joining us.

6 I understand that state law
7 currently requires that the following
8 announcement be made at the beginning of
9 every remote public hearing. This is
10 the Committee on Appropriations meeting
11 today Monday, April 12th to consider an
12 appropriations to the New Normal Budget
13 of City Council.

14 Due to the current public
15 health emergency, City Council
16 Committees are currently meeting
17 remotely. We are using the Microsoft
18 Teams to make these remote hearings
19 possible. Instructions for how the
20 public may view and offer public
21 testimony of public hearings of Council
22 Committees are included in the public
23 hearing notices that are published in
24 the Daily News, Inquirer and Legal
25 Intelligencer prior to the hearings and

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1 can also be found on PHLCouncil.com. I
2 note that the hour has come and we will
3 begin our Council Committee.

4 Eric, will you please call the
5 roll to ensure attendance. Members that
6 are in attendance, will you please
7 indicate that you are present when your
8 name is called. Also, please say a few
9 words when responding so that your image
10 could be displayed on screen when you
11 speak.

12 THE CLERK: Councilmember
13 Quinones-Sanchez.

14 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
15 Present.

16 THE CLERK: Councilmember
17 Johnson.

18 (No response.)

19 THE CLERK: Councilmember
20 Thomas.

21 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Present.

22 THE CLERK: Councilmember
23 O'Neill.

24 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Present.

25 THE CLERK: Councilmember

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1 Henon.

2 COUNCILMAN HENON: I am
3 present, Madam Chair, and thank you.

4 THE CLERK: Councilmember Oh.

5 COUNCILMAN OH: Good afternoon,
6 Madam Chair. I am present.

7 THE CLERK: And, Councilmember
8 Domb.

9 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Good
10 afternoon, Madam Chair. I am present.

11 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
12 Thank you. A quorum of the Committee is
13 present and this hearing will now be
14 called to order. I want to thank my
15 Council colleagues again for joining us
16 this afternoon. This is the public
17 hearing of the Committee on
18 Appropriations regarding Bill No.
19 210226.

20 Eric, could you please read the
21 title of the bill.

22 THE CLERK: Bill No. 210226,
23 authorizing transfers and appropriations
24 for Fiscal Year 2021 from the General
25 Fund, the Council to the General Fund,

1 certain or all City offices,
2 departments, boards and commissions, for
3 the purpose of further implementing
4 Council's "New Normal Jobs Initiative"
5 and adjusting Council's internal
6 appropriations.

7 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:

8 Thank you. Before we begin to hear
9 testimony from the witnesses we have for
10 today, everyone who's been invited to
11 the meeting to testify should be aware
12 that this is a public hearing which is
13 being recorded. Because the hearing is
14 public, participants and viewers have no
15 reasonable expectation of privacy. By
16 continuing to be in the meeting, you're
17 consenting to be recorded.

18 Additionally, prior to
19 recognizing Members for questions and
20 comments they have for the witnesses, I
21 will note for the record at this time
22 that we will use the chat feature
23 available in Microsoft Teams to allow
24 Members to signify that they wish to be
25 recognized. In order to comply with the

1 Sunshine Act, the chat feature must only
2 be used for this purpose.

3 Before we call our first panel,
4 are there any comments from
5 Councilmembers? I know that the New
6 Normal Jobs program with this budget has
7 been a compilation of many conversations
8 with Council and Council priorities in
9 this recovery and in response to some of
10 the challenges in the City. So we only
11 have today as a registered panel, we
12 have one person.

13 Eric, will you please call the
14 first panel to testify this afternoon on
15 Bill No. 210226.

16 THE CLERK: Sharmain Matlock-
17 Turner.

18 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
19 Before Sharmain gets started to testify,
20 I just want to thank her and all of the
21 work of the Urban Affairs Coalition. If
22 those of you who know Sharmain during
23 this time of year, she is always talking
24 jobs, jobs, jobs, young people, jobs,
25 jobs, jobs. And that's what she will do

1 this afternoon.

2 I want to signify for the
3 record that Councilman Johnson did join
4 us. Councilmember Johnson, thank you
5 very much.

6 Sharmain, would you state your
7 name for the record and proceed with
8 your testimony.

9 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: Certainly.
10 Thank you very much, Councilwoman
11 Quinones-Sanchez. My name is Sharmain
12 Matlock-Turner and I am the President
13 and CEO of the Urban Affairs Coalition.

14 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
15 Proceed with your testimony.

16 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: Thank you
17 very much, and thank you all for being
18 here today, to Councilmember Quinones-
19 Sanchez for chairing this wonderful
20 effort and all of the hard work that
21 went into making sure that
22 Philadelphia's teens and workers had
23 additional opportunities, and really
24 appreciate that and the hard work of the
25 Appropriations Committee as well as all

1 of the other members of Council who are
2 here with us today.

3 As I said, my name is Sharmain
4 Matlock-Turner. I'm the President and
5 CEO of the Urban Affairs Coalition and I
6 thank you for the opportunity to comment
7 on Council's ordinance to transfer
8 appropriations for Fiscal Year '21 for
9 the purpose of further implementing
10 Council's New Normal Jobs Initiative.

11 UAC has been a trusted
12 community partner for 50 years. More
13 than 80 area nonprofits and social
14 entrepreneurs are a part of the UAC
15 family of programs. We work every day
16 to end homelessness, find paths and
17 bridges to self-sufficiency, support
18 quality education, help youth plan their
19 futures and so much more. We believe in
20 a multi-faceted approach to achieving
21 self-sufficiency and we have over the
22 years seen friends, family and neighbors
23 succeed and move on to productive and
24 fulfilling lives.

25 Summer youth employment, one of

1 the closest loves to my heart. The
2 Urban Affairs Coalition has led the
3 initiative to provide summer employment
4 for youth for more than 50 years. From
5 PhilaJob, which I know many of you know
6 about, to today's WorkReady. In
7 partnership with the Philadelphia Youth
8 Network and Philadelphia Works, UAC
9 formed the Summer Youth Employment
10 Cabinet five years ago to drive ongoing
11 fundraising support with government, the
12 private sector and citizens through our
13 Committees.

14 Employment opportunities for
15 young Philadelphians ages 12 to 24 are
16 not only critical to the strength of
17 Philadelphia's workforce, but also are
18 critical to the next generation of
19 Philadelphians as they develop career
20 awareness, learn on-the-job skills and
21 hone their leadership skills.

22 Philadelphia was the first, and
23 I want to say this proudly, was the
24 first city in the nation to pivot during
25 the pandemic last summer to support our

1 teens. The city-wide program provided
2 6,000 young people with a summer
3 employment alternate experience from
4 virtual to safely distance inperson
5 experiences.

6 The Summer Youth Employment
7 Program had 300 employers city-wide who
8 hosted youth participants, and I am
9 proud to say that 120 of those 300
10 employers were employer partners of the
11 Urban Affairs Coalition and a majority
12 of the employer partners were small
13 businesses and nonprofits. For the
14 summer of 2021, the Summer Youth
15 Employment Program will employ with your
16 help and support an ongoing advocacy
17 8,000 12- to 24-year-olds through the
18 city-wide youth employment system.

19 The Summer Youth Employment
20 Program will continue this summer
21 because of the year-round work of the
22 Cabinet and because of the tremendous
23 work and leadership coming from you,
24 City Council. Thank you so much. We
25 are close to our goal. We're not there

1 yet. But with your commitment of \$1.875
2 million for this program, we are very,
3 very close to getting to our goal of
4 8,000 young people working this summer.

5 This day is also very special
6 for this hearing, Councilwoman Quinones-
7 Sanchez. Today kicks off Summer Jobs
8 Week. From April 12th to April 16th, we
9 will be sending out a lot of special
10 messages to the community about the
11 importance of this program. And so,
12 this hearing date was just absolutely
13 perfect. We will share information with
14 Councilmembers so that you can share it
15 with your constituents to again get the
16 entire City of Philadelphia excited
17 about summer youth employment.

18 So thank you to all of you with
19 the leadership of Councilwoman Quinones-
20 Sanchez for the \$1.875 million transfer
21 that will provide the support for teens
22 for this summer. I also want to thank
23 Councilwoman Quinones-Sanchez and
24 Councilman Green and Johnson for your
25 work in --

1 (Background noise.)

2 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:

3 Councilman O'Neill, you need to go on
4 mute.

5 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: Okay.

6 Thank you. Have been working with us to
7 seek additional funds from the
8 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to make
9 sure we reach our goal. And the City
10 has definitely put down a strong marker
11 to say to the Commonwealth, let's close
12 the gaps. So thank you so very, very
13 much.

14 The other thing I do just want
15 to touch on that is included in the
16 ordinance is the work that we're doing
17 to make sure that every Philadelphian
18 who is ready, willing and able and
19 looking and wants to get connected to
20 work a real opportunity, to do that.
21 HIRE! Philly, a partner of the Urban
22 Affairs Coalition was created to act
23 uniquely as a conduit between employers,
24 education and training resources and
25 workforce development organizations to

1 get Philadelphians connected to work,
2 and we know how important that is at
3 this time.

4 Through the Pipeline Philly
5 platform, which will be available on
6 your phone, on your computer, we are
7 going to make sure that jobs that are
8 available in Philadelphia are easy
9 accessible to those in communities who
10 are looking for work. So Pipeline
11 Philly will also be enforcing and
12 clearly articulating the standards of
13 diversity, equity and inclusion in its
14 platform to make sure that we are
15 opening these opportunities to everyone
16 in our City. So thank you for your
17 support of this initiative at the
18 \$50,000 level. We expect that we will
19 begin the first part of this work in the
20 late spring.

21 So just in closing, in these
22 unprecedented times we look forward to
23 continuing to work with you and just
24 appreciate the fact that you
25 consistently hear the voices and

1 concerns of the community. We know that
2 we can get Philadelphians back to work.
3 We know that Philadelphians want to work
4 and we know that Philadelphians can make
5 a tremendous contribution, whether they
6 are teens or whether or not they are
7 seniors. So thank you very much for the
8 opportunity and I am glad to work with
9 you and open to answering any questions
10 that you might have.

11 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
12 Thank you, Sharmain. Jobs, jobs, jobs
13 and more jobs. We need to get jobs. We
14 need to get young people jobs. We need
15 to get everybody jobs, parents' jobs.
16 So thank you so very much.

17 I'm going to open it up to
18 questions for my colleagues. I want to
19 recognize Councilmember Domb.

20 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Thank you,
21 Madam Chair.

22 And good afternoon, Sharmain.

23 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: Good
24 afternoon, Councilman.

25 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Just a

1 question for you: The types of jobs
2 that you're looking for, give me an idea
3 of the type of jobs that you would like
4 to see our young people participate in.

5 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: We really
6 want a range of experiences for our
7 young people. For many of the younger
8 ones who are just getting started in the
9 workforce, working at a nonprofit
10 including working for the City of
11 Philadelphia and the Department of
12 Recreation and other spaces gives them
13 an opportunity to begin to sort of
14 understand what the world of work looks
15 like.

16 As they gain experience, we're
17 really looking for private sector
18 experiences for them to get connected
19 to. So whether it's something in
20 technology, energy, education, it can be
21 a range of experiences. The beauty of
22 the program is that we get a chance to
23 talk to young people and find out what
24 their interests are and the same thing
25 is true with employers.

1 Before the pandemic, we were
2 actually able to put together a job fair
3 with our summer teens and they and their
4 parents were actually able to talk to
5 employers where they were able to share
6 information and experience. So we think
7 that every employer offers something
8 special and unique and we can help them
9 design an experience that will make a
10 high schooler successful.

11 COUNCILMAN DOMB: I'm just
12 thinking out loud to myself that due to
13 the pandemic, and this is one area where
14 having offices open and having the
15 mentorship of young people with people
16 in offices would really be helpful, is
17 there anything we can do to help you to
18 make sure we have enough opportunities
19 of jobs because of what's going on in
20 our City right now with the pandemic?

21 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER:
22 Absolutely. We have reached out to
23 employers and the Chamber as well. I
24 did an outreach virtually a couple of
25 weeks ago with Chamber members

1 encouraging them to hire young people.
2 And whether it's virtual or whether it's
3 in person, both of those experiences are
4 important for young people. So, yes,
5 any names, any companies that you know
6 of, we'll be very glad to reach out to
7 them and help them join the jobs, jobs,
8 jobs, summer jobs program.

9 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Thank you
10 very much.

11 Thank you, Madam Chair.

12 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: Thank you,
13 Councilman.

14 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
15 Thank you. The Chair recognizes
16 Councilman Kenyatta Johnson.

17 I was a participant in the
18 summer employment program many moons ago
19 when I thought I was going to be an
20 accountant and that experience led me
21 not to be an accountant, but I still
22 deal with numbers.

23 Councilmember Johnson and then
24 Councilmember Henon. KJ, you had your
25 hand up.

1 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
2 Madam Chair.

3 I just wanted to just, one,
4 commend Sharmain for all her hard work
5 and dedication really when it comes down
6 to advocating for our most precious
7 resource here in the City of
8 Philadelphia, and that's our young
9 people. And so, I just commend you for
10 stepping up to the plate on the front
11 line. I will be publicly advocating for
12 as much funding as we can provide you as
13 it relates to this upcoming budget
14 process.

15 We know that we're going to
16 receive a significant amount of COVID-19
17 funding from our federal government, and
18 for me in support of our young people
19 and investing in our young people in
20 terms of a school-to-career pipeline and
21 if the work that you're doing isn't part
22 of that conversation, then I would think
23 that would be totally unacceptable.
24 Because at the end of the day when we
25 talk about those who have suffered most

1 during the pandemic, it's families who
2 live in poor neighborhoods across the
3 City of Philadelphia. It's just that
4 simple. Thank you for your hard work
5 and dedication.

6 I will be advocating and making
7 sure of that in this upcoming budget
8 process and I'm sure the rest of my
9 colleagues will as well. But I just
10 want to state for the record when we
11 talk about the significant amount of
12 funding that will be flowing to the City
13 of Philadelphia, this is a part of our
14 strategy of investing in our young
15 people who will ultimately be the
16 individuals who run this City, so that's
17 how we have to look at it.

18 We should never be in a
19 position where 5,000 young people apply
20 for summer jobs and only 2,000 get them.
21 No, not at all, especially when we're
22 very supportive of the business
23 community in a variety of different
24 ways. So this year should be the year
25 we do a reset and make sure we're

1 supporting our young people. And so, I
2 just want to thank you for your hard
3 work and dedication.

4 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: Thank you
5 so much, Councilman Johnson, and thank
6 you for your leadership and your
7 support. I remember speaking in South
8 Philadelphia. It seemed like just a
9 couple of months ago -- I know it was
10 before the pandemic -- about the
11 importance of summer jobs. You've
12 always been a great advocate as well as
13 talking to you just a couple of weeks
14 ago as well.

15 I will certainly say that we
16 are absolutely resetting the clock this
17 year. As the Summer Employment Cabinet,
18 we agreed that we could increase the
19 number from last year from 6,000 to
20 8,000 this year, but our real goal is to
21 get to full employment.

22 Even last year, Councilman,
23 20,000 young people in the middle of the
24 pandemic applied or showed interest in
25 jobs. We know that they want to work

1 and they want to get connected and they
2 want to build careers. So next summer
3 we are really counting on your
4 leadership and the leadership of the
5 City to say we want every teen who wants
6 a job to have one, and that's between
7 16,000 and 18,000 young people with a
8 price tag of \$30 million. We think it's
9 a wonderful and valuable contribution to
10 make to the next generation of
11 Philadelphians.

12 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: I second
13 that. And my first summer job was with
14 Anti-Graffiti Network, got my working
15 papers from Broad and Lehigh.

16 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: That's
17 great.

18 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: I'm on
19 board. If you look at the crisis that
20 our City is in right now when you talk
21 about the issue of gun violence, right,
22 I would be remiss if I didn't just talk
23 about that we're the No. 1 big city when
24 it comes to poverty. We're second
25 behind Chicago when it comes to gun

1 violence. And we know where there's
2 high areas of poverty, we see high
3 levels of gun violence.

4 So at some point in time, we
5 got to do something that's different
6 which is to invest on the front end so
7 we don't have to address the ills that
8 we're addressing now on the back end.
9 But I'll do more than just talk about
10 it. We will be advocating and fighting
11 for our youth as we move through this
12 budget process. So thank you, Sharmain.
13 Take care.

14 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: Thank you.

15 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
16 Thank you so much, Councilman Johnson.
17 We got to call our State delegation
18 folks, man. They got to put up a little
19 bit more money.

20 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: Yes.
21 Thank you.

22 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
23 Jordan Harris and others. We got to
24 challenge them. Now, we got a number.
25 They got to come meet us.

1 Councilmember Henon, please.

2 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,
3 Madam Chair. Is that an instead of the
4 ice-bucket challenge, the
5 show-us-the-money challenge?

6 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
7 There you go. I even offered to have
8 you give them a dance lesson if they --

9 COUNCILMAN HENON: Whatever it
10 takes because, one -- a comment to
11 Sharmain. I think we are finally in a
12 place where the investment that you were
13 just talking about and managing and
14 helping forge careers for people at all
15 sectors, right, is just quite amazing.
16 So amazing work. Your written testimony
17 is amazing. So I just wanted to state
18 that for the record.

19 I have a technical question for
20 the Chair, if I may, and maybe it's me
21 being a little naive. But when we're
22 appropri -- and I just want to clarify
23 for the record here. The \$7.5 million
24 to the Council, is that to our Council
25 and going to initiatives of the New

1 Normal appropriation which I
2 full-heartedly support? And are we
3 responsible for managing all that and
4 how come it didn't go directly to the
5 departments?

6 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:

7 No, it is. All the money goes directly
8 to the departments. I think we sent out
9 the amendment that shows -- so we had
10 set the money aside that was in our
11 budget, so we're re-allocating it to the
12 department so it goes directly to the
13 program.

14 So as Sharmain said, the 1.8 is
15 going to the Summer Employment Cabinet,
16 DHS. There's money going to Mural Arts.
17 There's Managing Directors. So it's
18 going to the departments where it will
19 go directly to the program. We do not
20 do any management of any of this money.
21 We work with our great partners to do
22 so.

23 Councilmember, do you have the
24 amendment that shows you where it's
25 going?

1 COUNCILMAN HENON: And I
2 appreciate the clarity.

3 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
4 Okay. Thank you.

5 Any other questions for our
6 witness?

7 (No response.)

8 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
9 Seeing none, we're going to -- Sharmain,
10 thank you very much. You can disconnect
11 now. We will --

12 COUNCILMAN HENON: That
13 (inaudible) --

14 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
15 I'm not hearing you.

16 (No response.)

17 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
18 I think he got disconnected.

19 MS. MATLOCK-TURNER: Okay.
20 Well, thank you again, Councilwoman
21 Quinones-Sanchez and to all members of
22 Council.

23 Again, this kicks off Summer
24 Employment Week. So please talk about
25 it, share information. Please pat

1 yourself on the back and then start
2 calling Harrisburg and telling them to
3 put up the rest of the money so that
4 8,000 Philadelphia kids will, what we
5 say, be going to school with the idea
6 that they're going to get a diploma in
7 Philadelphia, but they're also going to
8 have a dream for their future. So thank
9 you all very much for your help and
10 support.

11 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
12 Thank you again. So you can disconnect.
13 Our apologies.

14 Councilmember Henon is having a
15 little bit of tech problems. Are you
16 back on, Councilman? Are you okay?

17 (No response.)

18 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
19 All right. We'll move on.

20 So is there anybody else here
21 to testify on this bill?

22 (No response.)

23 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
24 Seeing none, this will conclude our
25 hearing and we will now go to our public

1 meeting. There being no questions or
2 other witnesses to consider, I now
3 invite all panels and witness to please
4 disconnect from the meeting as we move
5 to our public meeting.

6 So we will now convene for the
7 public meeting. Eric, for the purposes
8 of the roll call, please call the
9 Members and have them say present so
10 that we can proceed with the action
11 before this Committee this afternoon.

12 THE CLERK: Councilmember
13 Quinones-Sanchez.

14 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
15 Present.

16 THE CLERK: Councilmember
17 Johnson.

18 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Present.

19 THE CLERK: Councilmember
20 Thomas.

21 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Present.

22 THE CLERK: Councilmember
23 O'Neill.

24 (No response.)

25 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:

1 He was just on. Go ahead.

2 THE CLERK: Councilmember
3 Henon.

4 COUNCILMAN HENON: I am
5 present. I apologize. My signal was
6 lost and I dropped off in the middle of
7 our conversation a few minutes ago. I
8 am present.

9 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
10 Thank you.

11 THE CLERK: Councilmember Oh.

12 COUNCILMAN OH: Present.

13 THE CLERK: Councilmember Domb.

14 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Present.

15 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
16 Thank you.

17 So the Chair recognizes --
18 Councilmember Johnson, are you ready to
19 do the amendment? I know we gave it to
20 you, Councilmember Johnson.

21 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Yes, let's
22 rock and roll.

23 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
24 You're ready to rock and roll.

25 So the Chair recognizes --

1 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: I'm ready.

2 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:

3 -- Councilman Johnson for a motion on
4 the amendment to Bill No. 210226.

5 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
6 Madam Chair.

7 I offer an amendment to Bill
8 No. 210226. A copy of the amendment has
9 been circulated to all members of the
10 Committee. I move that the amendment to
11 Bill No. 210226 be approved.

12 (Duly seconded.)

13 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Point of
14 order. Councilmember O'Neill present.

15 COUNCILWOMAN QUINONES-SANCHEZ:
16 Thank you, Councilmember O'Neill. The
17 record will reflect that Councilmember
18 O'Neill rejoined us.

19 Having heard a second, all
20 those in favor will signify by saying
21 aye.

22 (Aye.)

2 It's been moved and properly seconded
3 and Bill No. 210226, the amendment has
4 been approved.

5 The Chair recognizes
6 Councilmember Johnson for a motion on
7 Bill No. 210226 as amended.

8 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
9 Madam Chair.

10 I move that Bill No. 210226 as
11 amended be reported from this Committee
12 with a favorable recommendation and
13 further move that the rules of Council
14 be suspended to permit first reading of
15 this bill at the next session of
16 Council.
