2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
3 Chair will dispense with the regular
4 order of business to recognize the
5 guests and visitors joining us in
6 chambers this morning.

7 On behalf of all members of
8 City Council, I welcome you to our
9 Council session. We appreciate your
10 taking the time to join us as we attend
11 to the legislative affairs of our city.
12 We certainly invite you to come again.

13 Councilman Rizzo, your light is
14 on; did you want to be recognized?

15 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: No, Madam
16 President.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Okay.
18 Thank you.

19 At this time, the Chair
20 recognizes Councilman Kenney who will

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Sorry

6 (Honoree and guests come
7 forward.)

8 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you
9 madam President.

10 On this occasion in this room,
11 we often honor many famous people, movie
12 stars, athletes, entertainers, and
13 normal people from the community, but
14 today is one of those rare occasions
15 that we have to really honor somebody
16 that all of us, including our kids, need
17 to look up to, 'cause this is one of the
18 real heroes of our city, and I thought
19 it was appropriate to recognize him in
20 this way.

21 This is a resolution
22 recognizing Professor John Rich, MD,
23 MPH, Chair of Health Management and
24 Policy at Drexel University for being
25 named a 2006 MacArthur Fellow and

2 receiving the \$500,000 Genius Grant.

3 Whereas, on September 19, 2006,
4 the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur
5 Foundation named 25 new MacArthur
6 Fellows for 2006; and

7 Whereas, Dr. John Rich was
8 named one of those fellows based on
9 exceptional creativity, promise for
10 important future advances, based on a
11 track record of significant
12 accomplishments, and potential for the
13 fellowship to facilitate subsequent
14 creative work; and

15 Whereas, the John D. and
16 Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation
17 Fellows Program's purpose is to
18 encourage recipients to pursue their own
19 creative, intellectual, and professional
20 inclinations. With the grant money the
21 fellows are encouraged to accelerate
22 their current activities or take their
23 work in new directions; and

24 Whereas, Dr. John Rich had
25 dedicated his life to researching and

2 improving inner-city health-care needs.
3 In 1993, he began the Young Men's Health
4 Clinic at Boston City Hospital a,
5 primary care clinic designed to meet the
6 needs of young men in the inner-city.
7 In 1995, he developed the Boston Health
8 Crew Training Program to train young men
9 of color as community-outreach
10 educators; and

11 Whereas in 2005, Dr. Rich
12 joined Drexel University School of
13 Public Health. Currently, he is Chair
14 of Health Management and Policy and
15 Director of the Center for Academic
16 public Health Practice, and works
17 closely with the Center for Health
18 Equality; and

19 Whereas, the MacArthur
20 Foundation President, Jonathon Stanton,
21 stated, "The annual announcement of the
22 MacArthur Fellows is a special
23 opportunity to celebrate the creative
24 individuals in your our midst."

25 Now, therefore, be it resolved

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2 that the Council of Philadelphia does
3 hereby recognize Professor John Rich,
4 MD, MPH, Chair of Health Management and
5 Policy at Drexel University for being
6 named the 2006 MacArthur Fellow and
7 receiving the \$500,000 grant award.

8 And this guy lives in our City
9 of Philadelphia, and we're very proud to
10 have him here.

11 Thank you.

12 (Applause.)

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
14 Chair recognizes Professor Rich for
15 remarks.

16 DR. RICH: Thank you very much,
17 Councilman Kenney, Councilmembers. It's
18 a distinct honor and privilege to stand
19 before you and to be a part of this
20 proud city.

21 The issues that the MacArthur
22 Foundation acknowledged, or cited, when
23 I received this award really related to
24 the fact that much of my work has
25 focused on the inner-city young men of

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2 color.

3 And we heard mention earlier of
4 all across the country how we're losing
5 young people to violence. I simply want
6 to say that I, as a member of this city,
7 I hope to dedicate my work and time to
8 this issue and would offer myself to you
9 in any way that I and also the Drexel
10 University School of Public Health can
11 assist you in your efforts as you
12 represent the citizens of this city in
13 really looking at how do we make sure
14 that we reclaim all of the lost
15 potential that's currently being lost to
16 violence.

17 Thank you so much for the honor
18 of being with you today.

19 (Applause.)

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
21 you. Council will be at ease.

22 (Council stands at ease.)

23 (Proceedings resume.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: At
25 this, time the Chair recognizes

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2 Councilwoman Blackwell, who will present
3 a resolution honoring Charles L. Bloxon.
4 Will Mr. Bloxon and those accompanying
5 him please join the Councilwoman at the
6 podium.

7 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Also
8 Councilman Clarke and Goode.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: I
10 also understand that Councilman Clarke
11 and Councilman Goode are also joining
12 Councilwoman Blackwell at the
13 presentation.

14 (Honoree and Councilmembers
15 comes forward.)

16 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
17 you very much. This is an honor and a
18 privilege.

19 This is a resolution honoring
20 and congratulating Charles L. Bloxon on
21 his career as an educator in
22 African-American Studies, collector of
23 African and African-American artifacts,
24 and wishing him well on his upcoming
25 retirement.

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2 Whereas, Charles L. Bloxon was
3 born on December 16, 1933, in Norristown
4 Pennsylvania and

5 Whereas, he graduated from
6 Pennsylvania State University in 1956
7 and during his was early career, taught
8 local and multicultural history while
9 serving as a human relations advisor for
10 Norristown Area School District; and

11 Whereas, Mr. Bloxon has
12 traveled around the world, collecting
13 African, African-American and
14 African-Carribean publications, some
15 dating back to the 16th century; and

16 Whereas, in 1982, Mr. Bloxon
17 donated his collection to Temple
18 University, which he preferred over
19 other prestigious repositories,
20 including the Library of Congress,
21 because Temple University is located in
22 the heart of an African-American
23 community; and

24 Whereas, the collection
25 includes first-edition works by Phyllis

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2 Wheatley and W.B. DuBois, Paul Robeson's
3 sheet music, narratives by Sojourner
4 Truth, Fredrick Douglas, thousands of
5 photographs and more than 500,000 items
6 including rare books, manuscripts, print
7 letters, and archived issues of the
8 Philadelphia Tribune; and...

9 COUNCILMAN CLARKE: Whereas, he
10 now lectures internationally and
11 organizes exhibitions in Black Studies
12 programs around the country; and

13 Whereas, he served as the
14 Director of the Pennsylvania Black
15 History Committee, Director of the
16 African-American History Board, and the
17 Governor's Commissioner for the
18 Governor's Heritage Program; and

19 Whereas, he's been a member of
20 the Historical Society of Pennsylvania,
21 the NAACP, the State University Alumni
22 Council, the Urban League, and the
23 American Antiquarian Society; and

24 Whereas, he received a Lifetime
25 Achievement Award from the Before

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2 Columbus Foundations, and holds multiple
3 honorary documents; and...

4 COUNCILMAN GOODE: Whereas, he
5 is considered one of the country's
6 leading experts of the Underground
7 Railroad; and

8 Whereas, Charles L. Bloxon
9 scheduled to retire in December of 2006;

10 Now, therefore, be it resolved
11 that Philadelphia City Council honors
12 and congratulates Charles L. Bloxon on
13 his career as an educator in
14 African-American Studies, collector of
15 African and African-American artifacts
16 and wishes him well on his upcoming
17 retirement.

18 And be it further resolved that
19 an engrossed copy of this resolution be
20 prepared as an expression of this body's
21 sincere appreciation of Mr. Bloxon's
22 contributions to the City and the
23 nation.

24 Certification that this is a

10 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Madam
11 President, let me note that our own
12 wonderful, esteemed Charles L. Bloxon is
13 joined by Dr. Walt Palmer, who is a
14 doctor and a lawyer and also the head of
15 his own charter school.

16 And let me also bring greetings
17 on behalf of Mr. Lewis Muhammad from
18 Essence International School in Nigeria.

19 Thank you.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA:

21 You're welcome.

22 The Chair recognizes Mr. Bloxon
23 for remarks.

24 MR. BLOXON: A heartfelt
25 thank-you for this prestigious award and

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2 to all of the Councilmembers and all of
3 the supporters over the years who came
4 out and supported me from my days at
5 Penn State.

6 I grew up in Norristown helping
7 my family, which goes back to the days
8 of the Underground Railroad in
9 Philadelphia. My ancestors escaped from
10 southern Delaware with Harriet Tubman
11 and went up to Canada. Some of them
12 came back.

13 One of my relatives fought in
14 the Civil War and some my other
15 relatives were in the (indiscernible)
16 war where Dr. W.E. DuBois, in 1899,
17 published his famous "Philadelphia
18 Negro," so I have a long history with
19 Philadelphia, although I was born in
20 Norristown.

21 African people have a long
22 tradition going back to 1539 when they
23 came to the city aboard ships docked at
24 what is now Penn's Landing with the
25 Dutch, the Swedes, and later with the

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2 Quakers and William Penn, who, himself,
3 and other merchants, Quaker merchants,
4 and others were slaveholders.

5 Strange as it may seem in this
6 city today, one of the reasons I kept
7 collecting to preserve the history was
8 coming here from Norristown to visit the
9 Liberty Bell and so forth, I never knew
10 that they sold enslaved people right
11 here in the City of Brotherly Love at
12 Front and High Street and also among the
13 coffee houses at 2nd and Market.

14 So what I'm saying to you is
15 that it was important for me to come to
16 the City to visit the old
17 (indiscernible) bookstore at Ninth and
18 Market Street from Norristown. When I
19 was participating in Penn relays, I
20 would always go to bookstores. And,
21 (indiscernible), as you know, is a
22 historical landmark.

23 The reason why I donated my
24 collection at Temple University back in
25 1984 was the fact that it was located in

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2 the heart of the African-American
3 community. And I felt that of all the
4 places -- Penn State, Lincoln
5 University, University of Pennsylvania,
6 University of Nigeria -- I thought that
7 Temple was a very good place because at
8 that time, they were aggressively trying
9 to bring in more African-Americans.

10 So I went there, and while I
11 was there, it placed in Sullivan Hall by
12 my good friend, the President Peter
13 Licouras, who said he wanted the
14 collection near him, where people,
15 children, and others could be accessible
16 to see their history.

17 And I was in tears when Rosa
18 Parks came, the Mother of the Civil
19 Rights movement, among the many people
20 internationally who came. I will never
21 forget what she told me she said it was
22 an inspiration to be in the room with
23 all of these great books, and I looked
24 at her and said to myself, What she went
25 through for us, so it goes on, it's a

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2 legacy.

3 The last couple weeks, maybe
4 two months or, more you've been reading
5 the paper -- and I'll be finished a
6 second -- that there was possibility of
7 moving the collection from Sullivan
8 Hall. That has been resolved as
9 promised by President Ann Hart Weaver
10 and her administration that the
11 collection will remain there in Sullivan
12 Hall. It will remain there.

13 (Applause.)

14 MR. BLOXON: Thanks to you.
15 Support came from all over the world.
16 It's important.

17 I will be retired December
18 31st. However, I will be given the
19 title of Curator Emeritus. I will still
20 be collecting and will be on the search
21 committee for a new curator, and I'm
22 also going to be involved with the
23 endowment committee.

24 I started my collections in
25 1968 -- excuse me, in 1948, but now I'm

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2 here and retired, and this is a great
3 city. Temple University is a great
4 university and thank you very much.

5 (Applause.)

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
7 you very much.

8 Council will be at ease.

9 (Council stands at ease.)

10 (proceedings resume.)

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
12 Chair now recognizes Councilwoman Tasco,
13 who will present a resolution honoring
14 Teenshop, Incorporated, and their
15 founder, Eleanor Jean Hendley.

16 Will Miss Hendley and those
17 accompanying her please join the
18 Councilwoman at the podium, and the
19 Councilwoman is also accompanied by
20 Councilwoman Miller.

21 (Councilwomen, honoree, and
22 others comes forward.)

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA:
24 Councilwoman Tasco.

25 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Thank you,

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2 Madam President.

3 Today it gives me great
4 pleasure to present this resolution to
5 my friend and for all of the wonderful
6 work she's done with young women across
7 this country.

8 For 20 years, she has given of
9 her time, self, and money to help young
10 people, and she is someone who doesn't
11 get a lot of recognition for this, and
12 she has not sought recognition, but I
13 thought it was important because we're
14 dealing with so much with violence and
15 in our community, and I wanted to show
16 that there are some positive programs
17 out there in this community that are
18 local and highlight and congratulate
19 local leadership for their work with you
20 know people.

21 So today, this resolution
22 honoring Teenshop, Inc. and founder
23 Eleanor Jean Hendley.

24 Whereas, the Council of the
25 City of Philadelphia is pleased and

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2 proud to honor Miss Eleanor Jean Hendley
3 and the tremendous contribution of her
4 Teenshop, Inc. Program to the
5 empowerment and achievement of
6 generations of teenage girls from
7 Philadelphia to Los Angeles, building a
8 legacy of more than 20 years of success;
9 and...

10 COUNCILWOMAN MILLER: Whereas
11 in 1985, Eleanor Joan Hendley founded
12 Teenshop, Inc., now one of the nation's
13 longest-running volunteer-driven
14 youth-development nonprofit agency
15 dedicated exclusively to nurturing the
16 growth and achievements of teenage girls
17 with goals. The organization currently
18 has branches in north, south, west, and
19 northwest Philadelphia as well as a
20 chapter in Los Angeles, California,
21 where successful teens like America's
22 Next Top Model winner, Eva Pickford, had
23 participated in the program. Teenshop
24 encourages academic excellence, promotes
25 abstinence, and enhances girls' self-

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2 esteem, using workshops, field trips,
3 community-service opportunities, and
4 college tours; and

5 Whereas, more than 100 girls
6 from Philadelphia to Los Angeles are
7 enrolled in Teenshops groups each year,
8 and the program has earned increasing
9 accolades, receiving write-ups in
10 publications like the Philadelphia
11 Tribune and Ebony Magazine.

12 Eleanor Jean Hendley was also
13 recognized for her work this year by the
14 Girl Scouts of Southeastern
15 Pennsylvania, receiving the
16 organization's "Take the Lead Award."

17 In all, more than 2,000 young
18 women have benefitted from Teenshop,
19 Inc., moving on to become doctors,
20 lawyers, teachers, and business owners;
21 and...

22 COUNCILWOMAN TASC0: Whereas,
23 Eleanor Jean Hendley's success with
24 Teenshop comes as no surprise
25 considering her background as an

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2 educator in New Jersey, where she
3 created an award-winning after-school
4 dance program for young girls.

5 Miss Hendley also served for
6 many years as the education reporter for
7 CBS-3 Eyewitness news here in
8 Philadelphia, and is the founder CEO of
9 E.J. Hendley Consultants, LLC, Education
10 & Development Company.

11 Miss Hendley is also a founding
12 member of the Pennsylvania Coalition of
13 100 Black Women, a member of the Forum
14 of Executive Women, and a member of the
15 Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.

16 Now, therefore, resolved by the
17 Council of the City of Philadelphia that
18 we hereby recognize and congratulate
19 Miss Eleanor Jean Hendley and the
20 tremendous contributions of the
21 Teenshop, Inc. Program to the
22 empowerment and achievement of teenage
23 girls from Philadelphia to Los Angeles,
24 spanning a record of more than 20 years
25 of success.

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2 I further resolve that an
3 engrossed copy of this resolution be
4 presented to Miss Eleanor Jean Hendley
5 as evidence of the sincere sentiments of
6 this legislative body.

7 Certification that this is a
8 true and correct copy of the original
9 resolution adopted by the Council of the
10 City of Philadelphia on the 26th day of
11 October, 2006, signed by President Anna
12 Verna, introduced by Marion B. Tasco and
13 Donna Reed-Miller and supported by all
14 Councilmembers.

15 We congratulate you, and we
16 thank you so much.

17 (Applause.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
19 Chair recognizes Miss Hendley for
20 remarks.

21 MS. HENDLEY: Thank you very
22 much. It is a pleasure and an honor to
23 be here to receive this very prestigious
24 recognition.

25 And thank you, Councilwoman

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2 Tasco, and also thank you Councilwoman
3 Miller.

4 Now, Councilwoman Tasco is a
5 longtime supporter of Teenshop, and we
6 really value her for her leadership, her
7 community service and setting such a
8 positive example for our young ladies to
9 follow.

10 And it's because of supporter
11 like her that Teenshop has been able to
12 survive and thrive for the past 21
13 years, but we are a volunteer
14 organization, and it really takes the
15 work of a group of women who are
16 extraordinarily committed to the mission
17 of, as we say, helping other mothers
18 raise their daughters.

19 We have four chapters in
20 Philadelphia, as you heard, and the
21 executive directors of all of our
22 Philadelphia chapters are here today,
23 and I would certainly like to recognize
24 them.

25 Brendan Norman, Executive

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2 Director of Grace Teenshop in
3 Germantown.

4 Also, althea Fogle, the
5 Executive Director of Mt. Carmel
6 Teenshop in West Philadelphia.

7 Donna Ruley, the Executive
8 Director of Zion Teenshop in North
9 Philadelphia, which was the founding
10 chapter.

11 And Lorraine Williams, the
12 Executive Director of World Teenshop in
13 South Philadelphia.

14 Also, Teenshop, we're an
15 abstinence-based program, and we are
16 very proud that we do not lose girls to
17 teenage pregnancy.

18 (Applause.)

19 MS. HENDLEY: And we do that by
20 keeping them focused, by setting goals
21 for education and career success, so
22 they realize that becoming a mother too
23 soon is not an option.

24 We're also proud that more than
25 2,000 girls have been enrolled and that

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2 all of our graduates, all of our
3 graduates, attend college or pursue
4 other education goals.

5 (Applause.)

6 MS. HENDLEY: I have three
7 young ladies who are here with us today.
8 They were able to get a half day off
9 from school I guess. I'm sure that City
10 Council has been a wonderful lesson
11 today, and I'd like for them to step
12 forward.

13 Alicia Holmes is 16 and a
14 student at Central High School for
15 Girls.

16 (Applause.)

17 MS. HENDLEY: Troy Tasco, this
18 is Marion Tasco's granddaughter.

19 (Applause.)

20 MS. HENDLEY: And she's
21 enrolled in the Grace Teenshop chapter
22 this year.

23 And also Jessica Johnson.
24 Jessica is 17 years old, a student at
25 Philadelphia High School for Girls, and

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2 is first in her class.

3 (Applause.)

19 Under the ordinance, day care
20 for 12 children or less will be
21 permitted in C-1 commercial districts.
22 And day care centers will be permitted
23 in the office/commercial district and in
24 the neighborhood shopping center
25 districts, which currently they cannot

3 As a result, day care in some
4 form will be permitted in all commercial
5 districts except for the 10th and the
6 6th Councilmatic districts.

11 of residences. The limitation
12 accommodates the needs of parents in
13 those communities for child care and
14 avoids overly intensive uses of these
15 properties.

16 It should be noted further that
17 in a C-1 classification day care, like
18 commercial uses, only the first floor of
19 the building is permitted.

20 There are also two
21 non-substantive changes to the
22 ordinance -- a definition of day care;
23 and, secondly, a clarification that day
24 care is permitted as an accessory use to
25 churches and places of worship.
