20 Taylor really learned very quickly that 01:03:28

22 money. He did not resist. He gave it
23 up. He went in every day, but he was on
24 the Jenny Craig diet through the years

2 Ernest every morning or every
3 other morning wound up in a fight, and he
4 could not fight, Mr. President. He got
5 beat up every time, but he kept fighting. 01:03:53
6 And eventually the guys said, you know
7 what, we're going to leave Ernest alone.
8 We can just victimize Taylor. He's easy.
9 He doesn't resist. Let's just take his
10 lunch money. Ernest took a lot of 01:04:07
11 lickings, but eventually he was relieved
12 of being victimized by them.

13 I say all that to say that
14 sometimes when we're dealing with the
15 courts, sometimes when we're dealing with 01:04:19
16 the state powers that be when it comes to
17 governing our own city with anti-violence
18 measures, whether it's gun laws and
19 things like that, we get beat up, but we
20 keep fighting, Mr. President, and we let 01:04:36
21 them know that we're not going to stop
22 fighting for the safety of our city.

23 Today this body took a step in
24 fighting back, and it's related to gun
25 violence, by governing the stores that 01:04:53

2 are in our communities. Member Bass and
3 other members have stood up about how the
4 disrespect that happens sometimes in our
5 corner stores, whether they're selling 01:05:08

9 weed.

10 And so when we look at the 01:05:21
11 rogue gambling machines that are in our
12 community that don't have to tell us
13 where they are, don't check for ID when
14 kids come in to play it using their lunch
15 money, when seniors who get their Social 01:05:40
16 Security checks come in and waste money
17 in a payoff that is already rigged, we
18 don't have tax revenues for it, we don't
19 have rules governing it, today we put a
20 stop to that. And Member Gilmore will 01:05:55
21 appreciate how our former colleague,
22 Blondell Reynolds Brown, used to always
23 go to the industry to try to seek
24 compromise. We did that, Mr. President.
25 We talked to them and talked to them, and 01:06:12

2 what they are doing is a stalling tactic.

3 There is a court case that is in the

4 state court where they are being told

5 that as long as there is no ruling, there 01:06:24

6 is no law governing their industry.

7 We just took a step in the

10 L&I, that means places like the Health 01:06:40

11 Department, that means like the Liquor

12 Control Board need to form a task force,

13 go into some of these stores and say

14 they're not doing this right. There are

15 laws on the books that govern how you are 01:06:54

16 to conduct your business to keep our

17 citizens safe.

18 So it's not just checking

19 grease traps. It's not just checking for

20 the BOCA code on electrical systems. It 01:07:06

21 is making sure that you do not create

22 hunting grounds in these corner stores

23 where our children, our citizens are

24 being victimized because we don't take

25 the laws that are on the books to 01:07:23

3 So stay tuned. I'm going to
4 work with this Administration to deal
5 with that. Until we do, when we go up 01:07:34

9 now. Are you enforcing them to keep the
10 citizens safe? Today we came a step 01:07:50
11 closer to being able to say, yes, we are.
