4 At this time, the Chair
5 recognizes Councilman Ramos, who will
6 present a resolution recognizing and
7 honoring Pedro A. Ramos, Esquire.

8 Will Mr. Ramos and those
9 accompanying him please join Councilman
10 Ramos at the podium.

11 Councilman Ramos I see is being
12 accompanied by Councilwoman Blackwell
13 and --

14 COUNCILMAN SAVAGE: Madam
15 President, a point of order.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Yes.

17 COUNCILMAN SAVAGE: Yes. I
18 would like to ask for a leave absence. I
19 have to take care of Council business in
20 my district. I would like to be recorded
21 as voting aye on all bills and
22 resolutions and amendments, except for
23 Councilman O'Neill's resolution
24 concerning pro-life and pro-choice. I'd
25 like to vote no on that.

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
3 you.

4 COUNCILMAN SAVAGE: Thank you.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Leave
6 will be granted. Thank you.

7 Councilman Ramos is accompanied
8 by Councilwoman Blackwell and Councilman
9 Goode.

10 COUNCILMAN RAMOS: And if those
11 colleagues and former colleagues of
12 Mr. Ramos would like to join him, they
13 can come forward. I see people from
14 Blank Rome and from the Managing
15 Director's Office. Please come forward.

16 If anyone is in need of a
17 lawyer, you can take your pick this
18 morning.

19 Honoring and commending Pedro
20 Alberto Ramos, Esquire.

21 Whereas, Pedro Ramos received
22 his law degree, cum laude, from the
23 University of Michigan Law School and a
24 Bachelor of Arts Degree from the
25 University of Pennsylvania; and

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2 Whereas, from 1995 to 2001,
3 Pedro served on the Board of Education of
4 the School District of Philadelphia and
5 was the youngest person to be elected
6 Vice-President and President; and

7 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

8 Whereas, Pedro Ramos also served as one
9 of the City's negotiators with the
10 offices of Governors Ridge and Schweiker
11 regarding school funding, and ultimately
12 helped to forge a new city-state
13 partnership structure and secured an
14 increase in school funding; and

15 Whereas, from 2002 until 2004,
16 Mr. Ramos served as Vice-President and
17 Chief of Staff to then University of
18 Pennsylvania President Judith Rodin; and

19 Whereas, Pedro Ramos advised
20 the President and was responsible, but
21 not limited to, administrative oversight
22 of independent university functions,
23 liaison to the standing Trustee Committee
24 on Neighborhood Initiatives, the ad hoc
25 Committee of Diversity, the Social

10 Whereas, Pedro Ramos joined
11 Philadelphia City government as City
12 Solicitor in 2004 and is credited with
13 making significant improvements in the
14 collection of delinquent taxes, with
15 helping to resolve a labor dispute
16 involving a high-profile show visiting
17 the City and led the legal challenge to
18 proposed SEPTA fare and service
19 reductions in 2004; and

20 COUNCILMAN GOODE: Whereas, in
21 April 2005, Pedro was appointed Managing
22 Director by Mayor John F. Street and as a
23 hands-on manager, he directed City
24 resources for numerous highly complex
25 national and regional events, including

2 the Live 8 benefit concert, supervised
3 the City's emergency response to
4 Hurricane Katrina, the urgent
5 repatriation of 4,200 Americans from
6 Beirut, Lebanon through Philadelphia

8 Whereas, Mayor John F. Street,
9 in recognition of Pedro's extensive
10 experience in managing challenging
11 situations, appointed him to co-chair the
12 nationally recognized Emergency
13 Preparedness Review Committee and since
14 then, Pedro has led a marked
15 transformation in the City's emergency
16 preparedness, planning and response
17 capabilities;

18 Whereas, Pedro has held several
19 Board positions and currently serves on
20 the Board of Directors of the
21 Philadelphia Industrial Development
22 Corporation, the African-American History
23 Museum, the Police Athletic League;

24 Whereas, Pedro has given his
25 time to help non-profits by serving on

2 the Boards of the Greater Philadelphia
3 Tourism Marketing Corporation; the Samuel
4 S. Fleisher Art Memorial; Congreso de
5 Latinos Unidos, Incorporated; University
6 City District Special Services District;
7 the Philadelphia Award; Philadelphia
8 Futures; Hispanic Bar Association of
9 Pennsylvania Legal Education Fund; and
10 the Boys and Girls Clubs of Metropolitan
11 Philadelphia; and

12 COUNCILMAN RAMOS: Whereas,
13 Pedro has received and been recognized
14 with various civic awards, including the
15 Leon Obermayer Award of 2000, the annual
16 Puerto Rican Festival's Citizen of the
17 Year Award, the Philadelphia Education
18 Fund Giving Forward Award for 2002, and a
19 survey by Leadership Philadelphia of
20 4,800 Philadelphians recently identified
21 Pedro as one of the area's top
22 connectors, defined as leaders who
23 connect for the common good.

24 Now therefore, be it resolved,
25 by the Council of the City of

3 Pedro A. Ramos, Esquire for his work as

4 MR. RAMOS: Good morning.

5 First, I want to note that Councilman
6 Ramos did acknowledge finally the age
7 difference between us.

8 I do want to thank members of
9 City Council, the Mayor, my colleagues in
10 the Managing Director's Office and in the
11 cabinet, the staffs on Council and you,
12 colleagues, at Blank Rome for being here
13 today and for all of your support, not
14 only in the work I've done thus far but,
15 more importantly, to the residents of the
16 City of Philadelphia.

17 I think few people appreciate
18 the effort, the dedication that's
19 required to serve on City Council, and I
20 consider it a privilege to have worked
21 closely with all of you, to have full
22 appreciation for what it takes to do what
23 you do day in, day out, night in and
24 night out, as we all know, and it's a
25 particular honor for me to have this

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2 recognition from you today, and I look
3 forward to, as a private citizen,
4 continuing my relationship with this body
5 and with this Council and serving the
6 people of Philadelphia.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: We
10 thank you and we certainly wish you the
11 very best in your future endeavors.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
15 Chair acknowledges Councilman Kelly, who
16 will present a resolution recognizing
17 Kimberly Rogers, Miss Philadelphia 2007.

18 Will Ms. Rogers and those
19 accompanying her please join the
20 Councilman at the podium.

21 Councilman Kelly is being
22 joined by Councilman Rizzo.

23 The Chair recognizes Councilman
24 Kelly.

25 COUNCILMAN KELLY: Thank you,

2 Madam President.

3 First of all, I'd like to
4 acknowledge the presence of Mr. Brian
5 Keech today, who is a Vice-President of
6 Drexel, who has a lot to do with this
7 program of Miss Philadelphia.

8 (Applause.)

9 COUNCILMAN KELLY: Now, what a
10 wonderful way to end this summer -- or
11 end our session today. I think it's
12 honoring one of our most beautiful and
13 talented Philadelphians, and I think of
14 no better way to end our session today
15 with our summer break.

16 This resolution is recognizing,
17 honoring and celebrating Kimberly Rogers,
18 Miss Philadelphia 2007, for her talents
19 and well-rounded persona that earned her
20 the title Miss Philadelphia 2007, and
21 wishing her well in the Miss Pennsylvania
22 2007 Pageant.

23 Whereas, Ms. Rogers competed
24 against 15 of the Philadelphia area's
25 brightest, prettiest and most talented

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2 young women and excelled in the
3 competition; and

4 Whereas, Ms. Rogers'
5 tap-dancing talent, interviewing skills
6 and physical beauty exemplifies what it
7 means to hold the title Miss
8 Philadelphia.

9 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: Whereas, Ms.
10 Rogers earned her Bachelor of Arts Degree
11 in molecular biology at Princeton
12 University, where she completed 153-page
13 senior thesis on the genetic
14 misclassifications of hereditary
15 non-polyposis colorectal cancer -- now I
16 know why I got this -- which demonstrates
17 her intellectual acumen; and

18 Whereas, Ms. Rogers volunteers
19 her time to raise awareness for teenage
20 depression, which exhibits her strong
21 social commitment; and

22 Whereas, Ms. Rogers was the
23 winner of two national dance titles, Miss
24 Starpower in 2001 and America's Dancer of
25 the Year in 2000;

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2 Whereas, Ms. Rogers currently
3 works as a product manager at a
4 pharmaceutical consulting firm, and plans
5 to pursue her Master's Degree in Business
6 Administration; and

7 COUNCILMAN KELLY: Whereas,
8 Ms. Rogers will superbly represent the
9 City of Philadelphia in the Miss
10 Pennsylvania 2007 Pageant;

11 Now therefore, be it resolved,
12 by the Council of the City of
13 Philadelphia, that it recognizes, honors
14 and celebrates Ms. Kimberly Rogers, Miss
15 Philadelphia 2007, for her talents and
16 well-rounded persona that earned her the
17 title Miss Philadelphia, and wishing her
18 well in the Miss Pennsylvania 2007
19 Pageant.

20 Further resolved, that an
21 engrossed copy of this resolution be
22 presented to Ms. Kimberly Rogers further
23 evidencing the sincere admiration and

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
6 Chair recognizes Ms. Rogers for remarks.

7 MS. ROGERS: Thank you. It's
8 an honor for me to be here today, and I
9 just wanted to thank Drexel University,
10 who has provided me with a college
11 scholarship to be used to advance my
12 education. I received my Bachelor's from
13 Princeton and I plan to pursue a Master's
14 in Business.

15 This program has been wonderful
16 in promoting leadership in academics in
17 women, and several of the girls who have
18 been Miss Philadelphia in the past have
19 pursued their education at Drexel and
20 used the scholarship to do so. So I want
21 to thank you and recognize that today.

22 (Applause.)

23 MS. ROGERS: In addition, my
24 community service platform is centered on
25 teenage depression, so it's my

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2 responsibility to get out to the
3 community and work with youth
4 organizations and schools to encourage
5 teens and adolescents that it's okay to
6 speak up about being depressed or being
7 sad, because a lot of times teens are
8 reluctant to speak out because they think
9 that there's a negative stigma around
10 this issue, and I think that a lot of
11 teens would be cured faster and it
12 wouldn't lead to as many drug and alcohol
13 abuses and potential suicides if teens
14 would just learn to speak up.

15 So this year I look forward to
16 getting out into the community, and if
17 anybody is ever looking to have a speaker
18 or somebody to be involved with the
19 community around this issue, I'd be happy
20 to do so.

21 Thank you.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA:

24 Council will be at ease.

5 the Association of African-American Life
6 and History.

7 Will Ms. Marcela Jones and
8 those accompanying her please join the
9 Councilwoman at the podium.

10 I see that Councilwoman Miller
11 is being joined by Councilwoman Tasco and
12 Councilman Ramos.

13 The Chair recognizes
14 Councilwoman Miller.

15 COUNCILWOMAN MILLER: Thank
16 you, Madam President.

17 Good morning, everyone. It is
18 my pleasure to recognize and honor and
19 celebrate the Association of the Study of
20 African-American Life and History for
21 their mission of promoting, researching,
22 preserving, interpreting and
23 disseminating information concerning
24 African-American history and culture to
25 the global community.

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2 Whereas, the Association of
3 African-American Life and History, ASALH,
4 is the founding organization of
5 African-American History Month; and

6 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Whereas,
7 the Association of African-American Life
8 and History prides itself on its mission
9 to promote, research, preserve, interpret
10 and disseminate information concerning
11 African-American history and culture to
12 the global community; and

13 Whereas, the Association of
14 African-American Life and History was
15 founded in 1915 by Carter G. Woodson, a
16 Harvard-trained scholar and international
17 educator; and

18 Whereas, in 1929, the ASALH
19 Philadelphia branch, also known as the
20 Flagship Branch, was founded by the late
21 Judge Raymond Pace Alexander; and

22 COUNCILMAN RAMOS: Whereas,
23 while the general public celebrates the
24 numerous contributions of
25 African-Americans to the nation and the

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2 invaluable contributions of Dr. Carter G.
3 Woodson, it is recognized that there
4 remains much work to be done regarding
5 race relations and equality for all
6 citizens; and

7 Whereas, because of the work of
8 the ASALH, the designation of February as
9 African-American History Month has
10 brought additional attention to the need
11 for continued recognition and celebration
12 of the role of African-Americans in the
13 history of the United States; and

14 Whereas, it is recognized that
15 during the month of February, in cities
16 and towns across the nation, a majority
17 of citizens, children, schools, family
18 advocates, public and elected officials
19 will participate in special events and
20 activities to observe and recognize
21 African-American History Month;

22 COUNCILWOMAN MILLER: Resolved,
23 by the Council of the City of
24 Philadelphia, that City Council hereby
25 recognize, honor and celebrate the

2 COUNCILWOMAN MILLER: Before
3 Ms. Jones makes her remarks, I'd just
4 like to make some comments that -- my
5 former boss's mother, Representative
6 David P. Richardson, is here and also his
7 two uncles.

8 (Applause.)

9 COUNCILWOMAN MILLER: Uncle
10 Calvin and Uncle Ed.

11 MS. JONES: Thank you,
12 Councilwoman Donna Reed Miller, who stole
13 some of my thunder.

14 You've heard the history of the
15 organization, so just let me say that in
16 his book The Miseducation of the Negro
17 written in 1933, which is still so timely
18 and relevant today, Chapter 11 talks
19 about the need for service rather than
20 leadership. Members of the 1929 branch
21 revert how to have as members a family
22 that represents and is synonymous with
23 service in the City of Philadelphia, and
24 that is the Richardson-Robinson family,
25 and they're really going to speak for the

2 Germantown High School to have the
3 studies of African and African-American
4 history taught in the school system of
5 Philadelphia.

6 We have been fighting for this
7 endeavor for quite a while. My brother,
8 Dr. Ed Robinson and Calvin Robinson, will
9 speak to you further about this. We just
10 want to acknowledge the fact that the
11 fight never ends. The struggle
12 continues, and we will always do our
13 best. If there's any need for you to
14 contact us to help with anything to
15 further the enlightenment of all those in
16 the City of Philadelphia and surrounding
17 environments, we will be happy to do so.

18 We appreciate the fact that
19 Donna Reed Miller recognized us, and
20 we've been -- every time we were due to
21 come, something else happened, but, you
22 know, it's never too late to always be
23 recognized for the things that we attempt
24 to do.

25 Thank you so much.

2 (Applause.)

3 CALVIN ROBINSON: I want to
4 just add a few things that my sister has
5 just said, and that was that we have
6 always tried to lead our people in the
7 right direction, and one of the things
8 that Carter G. Woodson of this great
9 organization had always said, that there
10 was very little that was more important
11 than for any people to know their history
12 and their tradition and their language,
13 for without such knowledge, one stands
14 naked and defenseless before the world.

15 Thank you.

16 (Applause.)

17 DR. ED ROBINSON: I'm Edward
18 Robinson, the oldest one of them all.

19 Dr. Carter G. Woodson made very
20 sure in his writing of The Miseducation
21 of the Negro that if you left out the
22 history of the ancestors in the ancestral
23 home of black people, then you have left
24 out everything. African-American history
25 doesn't work it. It's a history of the

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2 great empire from which
3 African-Americans' ancestors came called
4 the Songhai Empire, an empire made up of
5 university cities and rolling farmlands,
6 medical schools, law schools. This had
7 to be hidden from the general public to
8 learn about.

9 In the 18th century, white men
10 tore the black pages out of the history
11 book and said that these people whom are
12 in slavery have no history. Because they
13 had torn the black pages out, nobody knew
14 about them until they taught their
15 children that we came from a jungle.
16 Never telling them the truth, that we
17 came from beauty and grandeur and
18 sophistication, law schools, medical
19 schools, operating for eye injuries in
20 the 15th century, giving to the world the
21 greatness of African people.

22 Up until 2004, no school
23 district in this country would even dare
24 talk about the greatness of the ancestors
25 of African-Americans. They'd talk about

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2 George Washington, Carver, Booker T.
3 Washington, all the usual things every
4 February. I call it the Parade of
5 Personalities. But they never talked
6 about the fact that a black man gave
7 algebra to the world 3,700 years ago,
8 black women gave calculus, trigonometry
9 and geometry to the world and gave their
10 findings over to the men of Egypt and
11 said, Now you have the mathematics to
12 build a great pyramid, the greatest
13 building ever built in history.

14 Up to 2004, as I said, no
15 school district. But in 2004 -- and I'm
16 calling him great -- the great Paul
17 Vallas turned to us; that is, the
18 Association for the Study of
19 African-American Life and History, turned
20 to us and said, It is time now that
21 Philadelphia takes the lead role in
22 making sure that black children have the
23 same thing that white kids have. White
24 kids learn all about the greatness of
25 Rome and Greece, the greatness of England

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2 or the ancestral homes of white people,
3 but there's not a thing in the history
4 books about the greatness of the
5 ancestors of black people. And so,
6 therefore, he commissioned me through the
7 auspices of ASALH to write that history,
8 and we have it from kindergarten through
9 12th grade. Children cannot graduate
10 from high school in Philadelphia unless
11 they pass the course in African -- and
12 I'm saying African -- and
13 African-American history. Only school
14 district in the country. And I think
15 Philadelphia should give itself a hand.
16 That is the only school district in the
17 country.

18 (Applause.)

19 DR. ED ROBINSON: And give
20 these people a hand who stood by us to
21 make sure that after 90 years of pleading
22 and begging and coming before City
23 Council, by the way, that we have to have
24 the same thing in our history books for
25 black kids that you have for white kids.

2 Nothing more, but nothing less. You know
3 the history of your people, and we now
4 know the history of ours.

5 Thank you.

6 (Applause.)

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
8 you. Council --

9 MS. JONES: I want to thank Dr.
