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COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good morning, everyone.

(Good morning.)

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The hour has come. We have a quorum. I'd ask all guests and visitors to please retire behind the rail. If the members will take their seat, we will get started. Thank you.

To give our invocation this morning, the Chair recognizes Reverend Donald D. Moore, Senior Pastor of Mount Carmel Baptist Church. He is here today as the guest of Councilman Curtis Jones.

Would all guests and visitors please rise.

(Members and guests rise.)

REVEREND MOORE: Let us pray.

Dear Wise and Loving Father, thank you for this day. Lord, I come praying for our Mayor as he continues to lead and direct this city.

Lord, we now enter collectively in prayer asking for your continued love

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2 and guidance as these elected officials
3 assemble here on today to conduct the
4 matters of the City of Philadelphia.

5 We come seeking your blessing
6 on the tasks that are before them as they
7 navigate through the process of making
8 decisions. And, Lord, we ask that you
9 will walk with them as they walk among
10 your people.

11 Grant each member represented
12 here clear insight, deliberation, and
13 wisdom as they make balanced and
14 impartial choices that will impact the
15 day-to-day lives of the residents and
16 those who work in the City.

17 Equip this Council with the
18 eyes and hearts for humanity, to know
19 that at the end of every meeting and
20 political decision is a human being that
21 is depending on this Council to act
22 wisely, humbly, and justly.

23 Oh, God, I ask that you give
24 these Councilmembers a sympathetic ear to
25 hear and listen to the voices of those

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2 marginalized in the City, and I ask that
3 this body of officials become the voice
4 to make a difference.

5 Lord, I conclude this prayer by
6 requesting that you continue to
7 transform, heal, and make a difference in
8 this city through this Council.

9 In Jesus' name, we pray.

10 Amen.

11 (Amen.)

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13 Thank you so much, Pastor, for those
14 inspiring words.

15 Council will be at ease.

16 (Council at ease.)

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 Thank you very much.

19 The next order of business is
20 the approval of the Journal of the
21 meeting of Thursday, January 22nd, 2015.

22 The Chair recognizes Councilman
23 Greenlee for a motion.

24 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
25 you, Mr. President. I move that the

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2 Journal of the meeting of Thursday,
3 January 22nd, 2015 be approved.

4 (Duly seconded.)

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

6 Thank you. It has been moved and
7 properly seconded that the Journal of the
8 meeting of January 22nd, 2015 stand
9 approved.

10 All those in favor indicate by
11 saying aye.

12 (Aye.)

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 Those opposed?

15 (No response.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
17 ayes have it, and the Journal is
18 approved.

19 The next order of business is
20 requests for leave of absence, and the
21 Chair recognizes Councilman Jones.

22 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
23 Mr. President. On behalf of the
24 majority, there are no requests for
25 leaves of absence today.

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
3 Chair thanks the gentleman.

4 The Chair recognizes Councilman
5 O'Neill.

6 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,
7 Mr. President. On behalf of the
8 republicans, there are no requests for
9 leave of absence.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
11 Thank you. The Chair thanks the
12 gentleman.

13 At this time, I would like to
14 dispense with the regular order of
15 business and I would like to welcome and
16 thank everyone who has taken time out of
17 their busy day today to come down and
18 witness your government in action. We
19 hope that your experience today is a
20 pleasurable one, so much so that you come
21 back again. So, again, thank you very
22 much. There will be some level of
23 history made today, so you can say when
24 you go home, I was there. So thank you
25 very much.

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2 At this time, the Chair
3 recognizes Councilman Jones, who will
4 present a resolution honoring Ready,
5 Willing and Able. Would Jason Miller and
6 those accompanying him please join the
7 Councilman at the podium.

8 And joining Councilman Jones,
9 we have Councilman Greenlee, Councilman
10 Goode, Councilman Kenney, Councilwoman
11 Reynolds Brown, and Councilman Johnson
12 and Councilwoman Blackwell.

13 (Councilmembers and guests
14 approached podium.)

15 COUNCILMAN JONES: So as a
16 freshman -- and we age in animal years up
17 here because of the intensity of the
18 work -- a kind Councilman told me about
19 protocol. His name was Councilman
20 Kenney. He turned around and said how
21 things are done in these Chambers. So
22 recognizing that Ready, Willing and Able
23 is in Councilman Johnson's district, I
24 will yield the podium so he can say a few
25 words to start us off about this

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2 resolution.

3 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Of course.

4 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: What

5 are you going to do with it being my

6 issue?

7 COUNCILMAN JONES: I'm going to

8 then give it to --

9 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: No.

10 I'm only kidding. I'm only kidding.

11 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Good

12 morning, everyone.

13 (Good morning.)

14 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: I am truly

15 honored and privileged to have this

16 opportunity to present this citation and

17 resolution to an organization that does

18 outstanding work here in the City of

19 Philadelphia. My grandmother liked to

20 call them the men in the blue suits,

21 working throughout South Philadelphia as

22 well as the City of Philadelphia as a

23 whole. But what makes these guys unique

24 is that these are individuals who are

25 taking the opportunity to not only make

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2 the City of Philadelphia a great city,
3 but also taking the time to improve the
4 quality of their lives.

5 And so I'm just honored and
6 privileged that they are here with us.
7 I've had the opportunity to come down and
8 visit their headquarters in the great
9 district of the 2nd Councilmanic District
10 in South Philadelphia, and I've always
11 been inspired by the work that they have
12 done.

13 So let's just say thank you for
14 being here, and we'll get started with
15 the resolution.

16 Thank you, Councilman Curtis
17 Jones.

18 COUNCILMAN JONES: And you're
19 right, no one cares more about homeless
20 people than Councilwoman Jannie
21 Blackwell.

22 But what I want to say here
23 today about this is that over two decades
24 ago, the Center City District was formed,
25 and it was designed to take people and

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2 give them dignity in the work of keeping
3 our city straight in the Center City
4 area. Some 20 programs later, there are
5 special services districts in and around
6 Philadelphia. I had an opportunity to
7 see President Councilman Clarke's
8 rendition of the Center City District in
9 North Philly. But these gentlemen are
10 unique in this way, that they have come
11 from a different path, that many of them
12 have been homeless and many of them have
13 been incarcerated and many of them have
14 suffered some of the slings and arrows
15 that life sometimes puts on us as
16 individuals and in particular urban men.
17 And a national study shows that if you
18 are homeless for more than five years,
19 that your life expectancy is cut by 20,
20 that if you wind up homeless for more
21 than five years, that you can be
22 anticipated to have a shorter lifespan.

23 So for these young men to be
24 back on track, we are pleased and proud
25 to have the men in blue doing their thing

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2 throughout the City. So we are going to
3 honor them today.

4 And we honor and celebrate
5 Ready, Willing and Able for helping
6 hundreds of men overcome poverty,
7 addiction, crime to become productive,
8 contributing members of our community,
9 responsible fathers to their children in
10 the City of Brotherly Love by providing
11 resources to men such as transitional
12 housing, recovery services, life skills
13 and living wage employment that promotes
14 healthy households and responsible
15 fatherhood.

16 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

17 Whereas, Ready, Willing and Able (RWA) is
18 an organization dedicated to providing a
19 hand up rather than a handout by
20 assisting homeless men who demonstrate a
21 commitment to becoming self-sufficient
22 and living healthier lifestyles; and

23 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,

24 Ready, Willing and Able was established
25 by The Doe Fund with a mission to help

2 the homeless lead independent, productive
3 lives. Ready, Willing and Able expanded
4 programming to respond to the specific
5 needs of difficult-to-employ populations,
6 including recent parolees, homeless
7 individuals living with HIV/AIDS,
8 homeless veterans, and low-income
9 individuals and families;

10 COUNCILMAN GOODE: And whereas,
11 Ready, Willing and Able works with
12 Philadelphians facing serious social and
13 economic barriers: 100 percent are
14 homeless, nearly 70 percent of RWA
15 trainees have incarceration histories of
16 5 years or more, 96 percent have a
17 history of drug or alcohol abuse, and 36
18 percent do not have a high school diploma
19 or a GED; and

20 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,
21 to solve homelessness for a night, you
22 need shelter. To solve homelessness for
23 good, you need work. Since Ready,
24 Willing and Able launched, it has used
25 paid transitional work and a holistic

2 individualized service package to
3 catapult hundreds of men over difficult
4 social and economic barriers into the
5 workforce and out of the cycles of
6 homelessness, crime, and addiction;

7 COUNCILMAN NEILSON: And

8 whereas, RWA helps develop practical life
9 skills in men by providing rehabilitative
10 services, vocational training, adult
11 basic education, social support services,
12 including conflict resolution, parenting
13 and financial management classes as well
14 as life-long graduate services; and

15 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Whereas,

16 Ready, Willing and Able combats
17 recidivism and homelessness through
18 career development classes, covering
19 topics such as identification of
20 occupational aptitudes and interests, job
21 searching, resume preparation, and
22 interview skills. RWA provides
23 occupational training opportunities such
24 as commercial driving, culinary arts,
25 energy efficient building maintenance,

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2 pest control, security, and
3 supervisor-in-training programs. Job
4 readiness and placement services are
5 available;

6 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas,
7 driven by the simple premise that "work
8 works," RWA honors its trainees by
9 providing a blue uniform during assigned
10 hours that distinguishes them as a group
11 of community members, notably known as
12 "The Men in Blue"; and

13 COUNCILMAN JONES: Whereas, RWA
14 provides a great deal of services to its
15 community with its assistance
16 particularly in the 4th District on
17 District Day and the community clean-up;
18 now, therefore, be it

19 Resolved, by the Council of the
20 City of Philadelphia, that we hereby
21 honor Ready, Willing and Able for its
22 outstanding efforts helping hundreds of
23 men overcome poverty, addiction, crime to
24 become productive, contributing members
25 of our community and responsible fathers

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2 to their children in the City of
3 Brotherly Love by providing resources to
4 men such as transitional housing,
5 recovery services, life skills and living
6 wage employment that promotes healthy
7 households and responsible fathers.

8 Further resolved, that an
9 engrossed copy of this resolution shall
10 be presented to Jeffrey Stubbs, Director
11 of Administration, and Mr. Wills,
12 Senior -- Ms. Wills, sorry -- Housing
13 Manager, and Jason Miller, Program
14 Director, from the 36th Ward, and Ready,
15 Willing and Able of Philadelphia as
16 evidence of our sincere sentiments of
17 this entire legislative body. Signed by
18 all members of Council.

19 (Applause.)

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
21 Chair recognizes Mr. Miller for remarks.

22 MR. MILLER: Good morning,
23 everyone. I'm the Executive Director at
24 Ready, Willing and Able, and I just want
25 to thank everyone for this. It means

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2 more than you can ever know.

3 The six guys that are up here,
4 if you would have asked them where they
5 were a year ago, that they'd be standing
6 right here, they wouldn't have been able
7 to say this is possible.

8 The opportunities that our
9 program provides are not about me. It's
10 not about our staff. It's about the men
11 choosing to grow their opportunities,
12 choosing to go out and figure out a new
13 path for themselves. We always talk
14 about you've got to be a leader and you
15 have to be able to understand that
16 everybody's watching at all times.
17 That's why they wear the blue uniform.
18 They're in all of your districts in some
19 way, shape or form. Hopefully we can
20 grow that in the future. But they're out
21 there and they're being neighbors and
22 they're bringing fathers and they're
23 being a part of all this, because they're
24 going to go back and live in all these
25 neighborhoods. These are your brothers.

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2 So thank you. We will give
3 this to all six of -- excuse me. All 70
4 of the men in the program and let them
5 know that they're doing a good job. So
6 thank you.

7 (Applause.)

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

9 Council will be at ease.

10 (Council at ease.)

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Thank you very much.

10 Coded by Kids started with one
11 instructor and three students two years
12 ago, and two years later it has 14
13 instructors and 40 to 50 students
14 learning every year about STEM.

7 The Chair recognizes Councilman
8 Oh.

10 much, Council President. I'm fortunate
11 to be in the minority because I get to be
12 the first to wish Councilman Kenney
13 congratulations and good luck and to
14 appreciate his 23 years of service.
15 Whether people agree or disagree with
16 some of the things he's done, he has done
17 it passionately and with the public's
18 best interest at heart. And I think it's
19 wonderful for him to take this step to
20 pursue something he's wanted to pursue.
21 And as I read his quote, he doesn't want
22 to kind of let this moment go by him, and
23 I think that's to be commended, and best
24 of luck to you.

25 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you.

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3 Thank you very much.

4 Any speeches on the part of the
5 majority?

6 The Chair recognizes Councilman
7 Johnson.

8 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Cool.

9 First? Wow. This is a first.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

11 Quick on the draw, sir.

12 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
13 sir. Just, one, I want to just speak
14 briefly on the bill that I introduced
15 today to rezone a parcel of green space
16 that will be the future of the Carpenter
17 Green Park on 17th and Carpenter in the
18 Southwest Center City part of my
19 district. The park will be known as
20 Carpenter Green and has been spearheaded
21 by the South of South Neighbors
22 Association. We rezoned the park from
23 commercial space to actual -- from
24 residential -- it is currently
25 residential and commercially zoned now

2 for green space and it's going to be a
3 green park sponsored by South of South
4 Neighbors Association. But particularly
5 I just want to salute Ms. Lauren Vidas
6 for heading this effort to make sure that
7 that part of my district has a level of
8 green space, which it recently didn't
9 have. So I just want to acknowledge her
10 for her hard work and dedication.

11 I also just want to acknowledge
12 my colleague as well as he goes off into
13 his endeavors, Councilman Kenney, who
14 served as one of my professors at the
15 University of Pennsylvania Fels Center of
16 Government so many moons ago, and when I
17 was just a young student getting involved
18 in politics, he was a good adjunct
19 professor. And so I just want to
20 acknowledge him, his hard work, and his
21 dedication to this body as well.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Thank you, Councilman.

24 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: You're
25 welcome.

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
3 Chair recognizes Councilman Greenlee.

4 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
5 you, Mr. President. I just want to join
6 with everyone here in wishing Councilman
7 Kenney the best of luck in the future.
8 And I had to kid him today. I say, I'm
9 amazed at the lengths some people will go
10 not to have to vote for paid sick leave.
11 It's amazing, you know. But I think it's
12 okay to put on record he did tell me that
13 he would have voted for it.

14 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: If I was
15 here, I'd vote for it.

16 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: There you
17 go.

18 But on a personal note, I just
19 want to first thank him for, as the many
20 years I was a staff member here, for
21 always being nice to me. I'm sure it had
22 nothing to do that I was a ward leader.
23 And also once I got here, along with
24 Councilman O'Neill, we made up the St.
25 Joe Prep caucus, and he was always very

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2 helpful to me as I got my legs in this
3 place. And also as a citizen, I just
4 think we all owe him a debt of gratitude
5 for all the hard work he did in here and
6 all the positive things he did for the
7 City of Philadelphia. So I just want to
8 say to him good luck and Godspeed.

9 Thank you.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

11 Thank you.

12 The Chair recognizes Councilman
13 Jones.

14 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
15 Mr. President. I had an opportunity to
16 share that end of the Chamber with my
17 upperclassman, Councilman Kenney, and for
18 the first like six months he didn't speak
19 to me. He wanted to make sure I was
20 meritorious of his commentary.

21 But some of the things that you
22 find out -- the press sits over there.
23 We're constantly under cameras, but some
24 of the best comments, some of the best
25 information happens in between these

2 chairs and desks, and I've been fortunate
3 over the first four years to share that
4 end of the world with him. Gaining his
5 insight on matters helped me immensely as
6 a freshman. He will be sorely missed by
7 us. You may not always agree with him,

9 on public policy, and I thank him for
10 that.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Thank you, Councilman.

13 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
14 Mr. President.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
16 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Reynolds
17 Brown.

18 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Thank you,
19 Mr. President. I join this legislative
20 body in saying farewell to my friend.

21 I need to see your eyeballs,
22 Jim Kenney.

23 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Oh, I'm
24 sorry.

25 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: That's the

2 teacher in me.

3 Farewell to my friend and
4 legislative partner, because he and I
5 worked closely on a number of issues.
6 The record should always reflect that it
7 was Councilman James Kenney who crafted
8 the idea that we should have a new
9 Committee on the Environment and
10 Sustainability. So we should ever be
11 thankful to him for that. And he loved
12 the arts, and we both love hospitality
13 and tourism in a big, big, big way, and
14 more recently we've been great partners
15 on the LGBT-related issues.

16 Secondly and lastly, I searched
17 high and low for a quote I believe
18 captures the essence of who he is. I
19 believe blue and white, and so does Jim
20 Kenney when it comes to Penn State. So
21 Joe Paterno said, and I quote, "Play as
22 hard as you can. Don't be stupid. Pay
23 attention to details and have enough guts
24 in the clutch that you're not afraid to
25 make a play." This was Jim Kenney on a

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2 lot of issues right here in Philadelphia
3 City Council.

4 So we thank you, and we salute
5 you.

6 (Applause.)

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8 Thank you, Councilwoman.

9 The Chair recognizes Councilman
10 Henon.

11 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,
12 Mr. President.

13 Twenty-three years of service,
14 Jim. I want to congratulate you with
15 that. And as I recall, you've been in
16 the forefront of some of the most
17 pressing issues that this city has been
18 faced with through the good times and
19 through the not so good times with our
20 economy, and you definitely stood up when
21 it wasn't necessarily an easy thing to
22 do.

23 So I want to give you a lot of
24 credit for that, from education, work and
25 families, to the underground economy and

2 making sure that our taxes are trying to
3 be collected so we can focus in on our
4 core services to the City.

5 We haven't always agreed
6 politically, as you well know, and
7 sometimes there hasn't been agreement in
8 this body, but you were able to disagree
9 with civility and find common ground, and
10 I guarantee you're going to take that
11 wherever you go in your future endeavors.

12 And I don't know if you realize
13 how far we go back. I was an apprentice
14 working on your first campaign with Local
15 98 as a little political minion, going
16 around and speaking with the general
17 public, but from there and the birth of
18 your daughter, we were standing in line
19 and I congratulated you, you were at the
20 bank in Center City, to being on the
21 inside of this rail, which is totally
22 different than being on the outside of
23 this rail. And your advice when I needed
24 it and to bounce things off, I'll never
25 forget as a friendly hand. And, most

2 important, you told me who not to get
3 into a disagreement inside this body.

4 So I wish you luck. We're
5 going to miss your wit, your comedy.
6 We're going to miss your wit and comedy
7 in this body at the appropriate times

9 good luck and Godspeed.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

11 Thank you, Councilman.

12 The Chair recognizes --
13 Councilman, hold on. Hold on. We got
14 more. Don't be that anxious to get out
15 of this body, sir. You got a couple of
16 more.

17 The Chair recognizes
18 Councilwoman Quinones-Sanchez.

19 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Thank
20 you, Mr. President. I was going to speak
21 briefly and I'll mention it around some
22 of the School District's position on the
23 testing and the parents and the teachers
24 of Feltonville Sciences. This body held
25 hearings, thanks to Councilwoman

2 Blackwell and Councilman Squilla, who
3 brought this to our attention. It is my
4 understanding that the School District is
5 going to put together a huge delegation
6 to investigate these teachers and these
7 parents.

8 The School District is going to
9 come before us soon and ask us for some
10 additional resources, as they have in the
11 last four years and as we've tried to
12 provide and we all know they needed.
13 Wasting time on a witch hunt for folks
14 who are not being defiant but just really
15 frustrated at the lack of funding for
16 children of special needs and English
17 language learners is important, and
18 parents have a right to opt out. So I
19 ask the School District to focus in on
20 working with the Secretary of Education
21 and looking at how we opt out of Keystone
22 Exams altogether as opposed to looking to
23 reprimand teachers and parents for
24 exercising their rights.

25 And speaking of language

2 learners, I don't think there's a
3 stronger advocate for immigration than
4 Councilman Kenney. In this Council he
5 has been steadfast and focused in
6 providing a different view as to the
7 importance that immigrants -- the
8 important role that immigrants play in
9 the City of Philadelphia. I've joined
10 him at many meetings, and he has always
11 been incredibly eloquent in reminding
12 people that everybody got here on some
13 sort of boat. And I really, really
14 appreciate it, because it's not always
15 been popular. I get tons of e-mails. I
16 can just imagine the types of e-mails
17 that he gets on the issue, and he's never
18 wavered on the many progressive issues
19 that he's pursued in this Council. So I
20 want to thank him for his service.

21 When I first sat here, Jim
22 Kenney would look over here, Councilman
23 Kenney, and he didn't always have a smile
24 on his face, and it took me a while to
25 understand it wasn't at me. But I want

2 to really thank him for always being open
3 to a conversation and sharing his
4 experience and his expertise here on
5 Council.

6 So thank you, Councilman
7 Kenney, and good luck.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

10 The Chair recognizes Councilman
11 Squilla.

12 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you,
13 Mr. President. And I too want to echo my
14 colleague, Councilwoman Sanchez, on the
15 school issue and the things that we need
16 to be careful for and looking at during
17 this process and during the budget
18 process, which is so important. We need
19 some accountability from the District to
20 us, and hopefully the questions that we
21 have can get answered along the way. And
22 so I stand with her and Councilwoman
23 Blackwell on this message, and hopefully
24 the School District will react in a
25 favorable way.

2 Also, before I get into my
3 colleague, I just wanted to let everybody
4 know, I did put an invitation in for a
5 party at the Market, which is the Reading
6 Terminal Market, one of the best markets
7 in the country, and they are having a
8 fundraiser there February 21st, 7:30. If
9 anybody could help out or attend, it
10 would be great. It's a great cause, and
11 the proceeds do go to the Market to
12 support the preservation of the historic
13 Market and the performing arts and other
14 cultural programming that goes on.

15 So I just wanted to say that
16 before -- I do really appreciate the time
17 I had with Councilman Kenney. Obviously
18 as a next-door neighbor, he was relied on
19 heavily when I first came into office,
20 and it was so important to have a friend
21 and somebody in the office that I could
22 go to with questions and the processes of
23 how the government worked and what needs
24 to be done. And Jimmy knows and I'm sure
25 a lot of people on the Council knows that

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2 of course we always didn't agree, and
3 when you see Jimmy's face getting real,
4 real red, you know that sooner or later
5 his head was going to pop off and he
6 would start stomping out, but in the end,
7 like Councilman Henon said, he was able
8 to work through things. And a lot of
9 times you can't say that with political
10 people, where sometimes it's their way or
11 the highway. And even when we didn't
12 agree, we were able to come to some type
13 of conclusion where we could compromise
14 on an issue to make things work. And his
15 institutional knowledge is something that
16 I would always be grateful for, and it's
17 really prepared me for my first term here
18 in Council, along with my other
19 colleagues. I mean, I sit next to one of
20 the oldest Councilmembers -- not oldest,
21 longer tenured Councilmembers. Sorry,
22 Councilman. I tried to correct that
23 right away. And it's really important to
24 get that knowledge of people who have
25 been around for a long time, because you

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2 can't pay for that and you can't learn
3 that anywhere and it takes time to get
4 that. And Jimmy's experience and vision
5 is something that I see as an example of
6 how we want to perform and move forward
7 with the City of Philadelphia.

8 And I just want to be one of
9 the first people to say I support you in
10 your endeavor. I wish you the best of
11 luck, whatever help I can provide along
12 the way. And I know it's not an easy
13 task for you to give up something you did
14 for a long time, but I know it's your
15 vision and your passion, and I think the
16 City would be better for it. So thank
17 you for what you given to me and thank
18 you for what you have given the City.

19 (Applause.)

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
21 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Tasco.

22 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Thank you
23 very much, Mr. President.

24 Jim Kenney, get over here. You
25 remember those words from our fine,

2 illustrious Augusta Clark, who was a
3 Councilwoman.

4 When he came to Council as a
5 young guy from South Philadelphia, he
6 thought he knew everything, but he ran
7 into Gussie Clark, and then I was her
8 side kick, but she was the mother hen.
9 And we worked with him, because he had
10 some strange ideas and notions and he
11 thought he knew everything, but through
12 the years, he began to understand how
13 this body works, also became very much
14 involved in the community activities, and
15 it's been a pleasure to work with Jim
16 Kenney. He's been supportive of most of
17 my -- I must say all of my legislation,
18 particularly around the issue of
19 predatory lending.

20 The other thing I'd like to say
21 and thank him for on behalf of the 50th
22 Ward, he has always come to our ward. He
23 has always supported our Up Close and
24 Personal program that we have every year
25 and where we educate our election boards

3 on Election Day, and all of the other
4 events we invited him to, he has been

17 you. I just want to echo some of the
18 statements that have been made earlier
19 and I want to say as a freshman, you
20 know, we make our fair share of runs,
21 hits, and errors, and I just wanted to
22 say that you've been a really good
23 friend, a great mentor, and someone who
24 has helped us out, as Mark had mentioned
25 earlier, because as freshmen, it's easy

11 just what you've done, but how you've
12 done it. And so I just want to say that
13 and wish you well and Godspeed.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

15 Thank you, Councilwoman.

16 (Applause.)

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
18 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell.

19 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
20 you, Mr. President. First let me say to
21 Councilwoman Sanchez, Squilla and all
22 that we are working on a response to this
23 whole issue of the Keystone test that we
24 will be presenting in Council. So we all
25 agree that that is not the way that we

2 should go.

3 But for this special day, Jim
4 Kenney and I started together. Only
5 Councilman O'Neill, as it has been said,
6 served longer. I was asking him this
7 morning if he started with Lu, but Lu
8 started in January 3rd, '76 when Rizzo
9 became Mayor and I started with him
10 working for him. But Jim and I started
11 in Council in 1992, and over the years we
12 have grown together, and he's done a
13 wonderful job, as has been said. You
14 know, Jim has done so much in
15 immigration. He's done so much to help
16 Africans and Caribbeans. He's done so
17 much to help people in need. I know that
18 he who sits high and looks low will bless
19 him, because the scripture tells us when
20 you do it in secret, God will reward you
21 openly. He's done a lot to help people
22 in need.

23 And one of the other thoughtful
24 things he did that we'll miss, every St.
25 Patrick's Day we get our little flowers.

2 We're going to miss that.

3 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: That's

4 Henon and Neilson's job now.

5 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: But we
6 appreciate that. But he has -- he really
7 is skillful at politics. He learned the
8 difference between at-large and District
9 Councilpeople.

10 That wasn't supposed to be
11 funny.

12 But he's just done a wonderful
13 job. He's a person who has the courage
14 of his convictions. And a lot of people
15 say they do, but they don't. But he's a
16 good leader, a sound person, an honest
17 man, and certainly we wish him Godspeed
18 and all the best.

19 God bless you, Jim. We'll miss
20 you.

21 I'll miss having him sitting by
22 me.

23 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you.

24 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
25 you.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
4 Chair recognizes Councilman Goode.

5 COUNCILMAN GOODE: Thank you,
6 Mr. President. It's an interesting day
7 to say good-bye to my colleague and
8 someone who I now call a friend. Some
9 might say that Jim Kenney is responsible
10 for me being the Councilperson that I am,
11 because there was not always a time when
12 I would call him colleague and friend.

13 When I first came here, it was a very
14 interesting time, but we have grown to a
15 level of mutual admiration and respect,
16 not just for each other's legislative
17 work but as people. And so it is
18 actually sad to see my friend and
19 colleague go, but I wish him well.

20 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you,
21 Wilson.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
23 Thank you, Councilman.

24 The Chair recognizes Councilman
25 O'Brien.

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2 COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: Thank you,
3 Mr. President. I had spoken briefly in
4 caucus, but I didn't want to be remiss in
5 expressing my sentiments for my friend
6 and colleague, Jim Kenney. Our
7 relationship goes back to our legislative
8 days in Harrisburg, and we both
9 recognized early in our careers that no
10 constituency was too small or too large
11 to get our attention. And Jimmy's
12 reputation is legendary in recognizing
13 individuals with needs, and his
14 responsiveness to an individual in the
15 neighborhood or somewhere across the City
16 has always gotten his help. He's never
17 shied away from fighting for
18 firefighters, and his dad would be very
19 proud looking down on him as --

20 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Oh, no.
21 He's still here.

22 COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: I mean,
23 he'd be looking in this Chamber, in this
24 Chamber. I didn't mean it like that. I
25 meant looking on TV and --

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2 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: He's still
3 around.

4 COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: --
5 observing the Councilman in this Chamber.
6 I didn't mean that he was gone. But
7 Jimmy has championed the --

8 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Hello, dad,
9 are you all right?

10 COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: -- causes
11 of the firefighters.

12 He always talks over me when I
13 have an issue.

14 But whether it's the
15 firefighters, the LGBT community or
16 whoever, Jimmy has always stood up for
17 issues that are important to him, his
18 constituency in the City of Philadelphia,
19 and I thank him for his friendship and
20 his leadership in this Chamber.

21 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you,
22 Denny.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
24 Thank you.

25 The Chair recognizes Councilman

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2 O'Neill.

3 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,
4 Mr. President. Councilwoman Blackwell
5 was asking me today if I started in '76
6 with her husband, Lucien, and I said,
7 Jannie, I was too young in '76, but I did
8 start the following term. And, you know,
9 if you live long enough, you see certain
10 things, maybe everything, and if you stay
11 in Council long enough, you see
12 everything. And Councilman Kenney,
13 having both been educated by Jesuits at
14 the Prep and probably had our foundation,
15 was our common bond, because while we may
16 disagree on certain things, come at
17 things from a different perspective, live
18 in different parts of the City, the one
19 thing you know about Jim that came, I'm
20 guessing, out of St. Joe's Prep is that
21 we know he's smart, he's trustworthy, he
22 works hard, he cares about those less
23 fortunate. And I don't know what more
24 you can say about somebody who is
25 striving for the highest office in the

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2 City. I might not have said it four
3 years ago, I might not have said it eight
4 years ago, but I'll say it today, he's
5 ready. And I just know we'll all miss
6 him, but we all know he's going hopefully
7 to a better place, downstairs.

8 Thank you.

9 (Applause.)

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

11 Thank you, Councilman. I don't know
12 about better, though. Thank you.

13 That concludes those speeches,
14 and I'd just like to bend the rules for a
15 little bit. I know I'm not supposed to
16 speak from the podium, but I would like
17 to, if it's okay with the members, to do
18 that briefly.

19 I concur with all of the words
20 and accolades that have been said
21 earlier. Personally I came in a similar
22 situation when the Council President left
23 and I ended up being the last person
24 standing and ended up getting elected
25 Councilperson, and it was interesting

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2 because it took the Councilman about two
3 years to realize that I wasn't John
4 Street, you know. You worked for Street.
5 Oh, he's going to be just like Street.
6 But as a result of that, we really ended
7 up having a good working relationship.

8 One of the things that I'd like
9 to say, that when people vote for you and
10 when they elect you, they want you to be
11 consequential. They just don't want you
12 to come down here and just kind of
13 collect a salary. They want you in the
14 game. And I must say that Councilman
15 Kenney has been in the game, sometimes to
16 his detriment, been willing to say what
17 needed to be said regardless of who he
18 rubs the wrong way. I must say that has
19 happened relatively frequently. But it
20 was all based on his passion for the job
21 and passion for the City, and I just want
22 to say, Jim, that having an opportunity
23 over the years as now one of the really
24 senior members being here to be able to
25 talk to you about your perspective on

2 different issues as they come up and
3 sitting in the office, either in your
4 office or my office, and kind of bouncing
5 things off of you since I've been the
6 Council President has been very important
7 for me, very important for the City. I'm
8 going to miss that. We'll be calling you
9 every now and then, although you'll no
10 longer be on the payroll, to ask for your
11 advice for some things. But your
12 knowledge of government, your
13 institutional knowledge will be missed in
14 this body, and I want to thank you so
15 much on behalf of the citizens that I
16 represent in the 5th Council District for
17 all the things you've done.

18 What I'd like to do now is to
19 bend the rules a little bit, use some
20 councilmanic prerogative. Is it okay
21 with you, Majority Leader Jones?

22 COUNCILMAN JONES: Yes, sir.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: I'd
24 like to ask my good friend to come up and
25 speak from the podium.

3 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: No, I'm not
4 going up there. No, I'm not going up
5 there.

6 I don't know where anything
7 works up here. That's the problem. My
8 light is not on. I'm too high up.

9 Can you hear me well? Good.

10 Thank you. Thank you very
11 much. It's really nice to be able to
12 attend your funeral while you're alive,
13 for good or for ill. And a lot of what I
14 was going to say has been said, but I
15 won't repeat it, but I'll kind of build
16 on it.

17 I was 32 years old when I came
18 into this room 23 years ago, and Marian
19 Tasco was absolutely correct, I knew
20 everything. I had an answer for all the
21 City's problems and I was going to fix
22 the world and blah, blah, blah, blah.
23 And you know when you're 14, 15 years old
24 and you think your parents are really
25 dumb and the older you get, the smarter

2 they get, and at some point in time, you
3 realize how smart your parents really
4 were in the first place? Well, that's
5 been my journey through this body and
6 through this place.

7 I've had the opportunity to
8 work with three different Council
9 Presidents over my years. Council
10 President Street, who is a unique
11 individual unto himself. I remember he
12 said to me one time -- and he was very
13 smart, had a grasp of the knowledge of
14 the issues he was facing. But he said to
15 me one time, because we used to have our
16 differences, and he said -- and I want to
17 try to do my John Street impersonation.
18 Councilman, you're holding me up. You
19 know what you need, Councilman? You need
20 nine votes to pass any piece of
21 legislation. And I learned that lesson
22 on more than one occasion.

23 Council President Verna was one
24 of the nicest, classiest, inclusionary
25 people that I've ever had a pleasure to

2 serve with on Council, and she just
3 carried herself with dignity and class
4 and treated everybody the same and
5 included everybody's opinions.

6 And, Council President Clarke,
7 you have been here a short time, but
8 you're walking in those shoes at the same
9 time. You have the knowledge of John
10 Street on the issues and you have the
11 class and dignity of Anna Verna and
12 you're moving forward in that same mold,
13 and I'm so, so proud of the President
14 that you've become and working with you
15 to help you be there.

16 Before I talk about some of my
17 colleagues -- and we don't have time, I
18 guess, to talk about everybody, but I
19 would like my staff to stand and I would
20 also -- don't clap for anybody yet.
21 Don't clap for anybody yet. I'd like my
22 staff to stand. They're such a good
23 staff that I don't have to tell everybody
24 who their names are. And I would also
25 like every other Council staff member in

2 this room that's sitting to stand or
3 that's standing to at least wave your
4 hand and acknowledge that you're here.

5 Everyone on this floor today
6 and everyone who has ever served in this
7 body owes everything that we are and
8 everything that we're portrayed to be and
9 everything we accomplish to all the folks
10 that are standing, whether it's --

11 (Applause.)

12 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Whether
13 it's your own personal staff, whether
14 it's tech staff, whether it's the
15 Sergeant-At-Arms who work their tails off
16 all the time, we're nothing without them.
17 We know how much we appreciate them, but
18 I want the public to understand how
19 important they are as public servants and
20 that they earn their money every day and
21 they give their all every day for the
22 people of the City. So I thank them from
23 the bottom of my heart as I stand here
24 today.

25 I'd also like to talk about a

2 couple of my colleagues. Councilwoman
3 Tasco brought up some issues and so did
4 Councilwoman Blackwell. I had the
5 distinct privilege of being taken to the
6 woodshed on the same day by Augusta
7 Alexander Clark and Joan Krajewski, one
8 with her hand on my ear and the other one
9 with her foot on my butt. And
10 accompanying them, also their partner in
11 crime, was Councilwoman Tasco who is
12 here. The two of those have gone on. I
13 miss them dearly. I hope they're looking
14 down, and I know Joanie is saying, Hey,
15 Jim Kenney, why don't you smile a little
16 more. And Councilwoman Tasco is here to
17 tell her -- that I can thank her
18 personally for all that she's done for
19 me, for the educational progress that
20 I've made as a person, as a legislator,
21 as a public servant. I thank all of you.

22 My dear friend and probably one
23 of the best Councilpeople who ever served
24 in this body and certainly the best
25 Councilmember in the 1st District, where

2 is Frank DiCicco? He's got to be around
3 here somewhere.

4 Frank, thanks for all your
5 friendship and all your guidance and all
6 your loyalty. It's been just a wonderful
7 time with you, and your district is in
8 just wonderful hands from a guy that's
9 kind of like the same style as you. You
10 Italian guys are very smooth. The Irish
11 are rough and they get mad. The Italian
12 guys, very smooth. Hey, don't worry
13 about it. They bring flowers on -- thank
14 you. Thank you very much.

15 Councilman O'Neill, longest
16 serving member in this Council, carries
17 the GOP standard with dignity and decency
18 and contributes to every issue that we've
19 dealt with. You look at Washington and
20 Harrisburg and some of the issues that
21 they're dealing with with party
22 differences. He represents and the other
23 members that are sitting there with him
24 represent what the GOP -- the GOP that I
25 love, the GOP that I respected, and I

2 think that he has done that all the time
3 as a leader in this body, and I just --
4 pleasure of working with you all these
5 years.

6 I'd just like to say a word
7 about a former colleague of mine who is
8 now the Mayor of the City of
9 Philadelphia, Councilman and now Mayor
10 Michael Nutter. Again, ups and downs,
11 ins and outs. We've had our issues both
12 in this room and with others here and the
13 second floor. Let us not forget that in
14 2009, 2010, 2011, the waves of the
15 economic meltdown in this country and in
16 this world could have taken this ship
17 estate and sunk it, and it didn't, and it
18 didn't because of the hard decisions he
19 had to make that were not popular and the
20 hard decisions we had to make to support
21 him in doing it. He's accomplished a lot
22 of things as Mayor, and I'll talk maybe
23 one or two about them later on, but let's
24 not forget that this city was at the
25 precipice as it was back in 1991 and '92

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2 and this Mayor brought it back from the
3 brink, and I think he deserves a round of
4 applause for that work.

5 (Applause.)

6 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: And the
7 press. Hi, folks. You know, I can tell
8 you for sure that over 23 years of my
9 experience with every single one of you,
10 those who are sitting at that table and
11 those who are no longer here, covering
12 somewhere else or working somewhere else,
13 the only two things I could say about
14 you, describing you is professional and
15 fair. And I think that a journalist
16 being described as professional and fair
17 is probably the highest compliment that
18 anyone can give them. And I want to
19 thank you for being professional and fair
20 and for being knowledgeable and doing
21 your research, and both electronic media
22 and the print media. Thank you for your
23 work. We do appreciate it, even though
24 sometimes we get a little mad and maybe
25 we block you on Twitter.

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2 There's been some general
3 guiding principles that I've tried to
4 deal with over my years, and one is don't
5 ever be afraid to take an unpopular
6 position because you think it's unpopular
7 when you know in your heart it's right.
8 And, you know, in the beginning when you
9 take the position, it's going to be a
10 little rough. When you stand up in the
11 1990's for domestic partnerships in the
12 City of Philadelphia for City employees
13 and you're standing up against
14 institutions that are totally, totally
15 against it, it's a hard thing to do, but
16 in the end, as time goes on and you
17 realize we're in the era that we are now,
18 you were right back then, we were right
19 back then, and you have to stick to your
20 guns, and you know when you have to and
21 you do it.

22 Always defend the underdog.
23 Never let bullies overcome. And I want
24 to thank Jannie Blackwell for that. You
25 have taught me that. You have stood up,

2 and I watched you do it, and you taught
3 me that people who are down and out and
4 on the street and having bad times are
5 human beings that deserve dignity and
6 respect. And learning that from you is
7 one of the most greatest lessons I've
8 ever learned. Thank you.

9 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
10 you.

11 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: I think
12 government should maximize everyone's
13 potential. Government should be in a
14 position where it allows people to just
15 do the things they can do best and
16 maximize the persons they can be, and I
17 think that's something I've always stood
18 for. And there's no such thing as
19 economic prosperity that doesn't include
20 economic prosperity for every single
21 citizen in this town, and thank you,
22 Wilson Goode, for doing that every day.
23 You taught me that every day.

24 (Applause.)

25 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: The

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2 accomplishments I guess I'm most proud of
3 in this short time that we have to talk
4 is sensible immigration policy as it
5 relates to City government, ending ICE
6 holds and treating immigrants and other
7 newcomers who are just coming here, as
8 those ravaged Irish came in the 1840's
9 and '50s, for a better life, and I thank
10 Maria Quinones-Sanchez for being my
11 partner in standing up and stopping that
12 ability or that desire for us as a City
13 government to hold someone in jail
14 without a warrant while the federal
15 government decides what they want to do
16 with them. And we don't do that anymore,
17 and Maria was part and parcel of that
18 being eliminated, and I'm proud to have
19 stood by her in doing that.

20 (Applause.)

21 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: If I drop
22 my glasses one more time, I'm leaving.

23 No one has all the answers to
24 schools. No one has all the answers to
25 schools. But I'm proud this body on many

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2 occasions had the courage to take tough
3 votes, to keep our schools open when they
4 were on the brink of closing or closing
5 for half a year or closing for half a day
6 or reducing the number of days a week the
7 kids go to school. In an election year
8 we did hard votes to keep those schools
9 open. I don't know what the answer is
10 coming from Harrisburg, but I honestly
11 think that waiting for Superman to fly in
12 from Harrisburg is not going to be an
13 option for us in the coming years and we
14 got to figure out a way going forward how
15 we maximize our government services,
16 maximize revenue, maximize the way we do
17 things with our schools to create
18 every -- make every school a centerpiece
19 for our neighborhood so that people make
20 it the center of town, and I think we can
21 to do that on our own. We need help from
22 Harrisburg, we need help from Washington,
23 but I will tell you, we are on our own
24 for a while and we got to get used to
25 doing that and we got to work together to

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2 make that happen.

3 (Applause.)

4 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: I want to
5 thank Councilman Michael Nutter. And I
6 know we've had our difficulties in
7 dealing with this issue and getting used
8 to all the new rules, but good government
9 reforms, Ethics Board, campaign finance
10 reform, it was hard getting used to it.
11 When I voted for that campaign finance
12 reform, that first election I ran
13 afterwards, I was lost. Poor Debbie was
14 dealing with requests from the Ethics
15 Board every two seconds, but in the end,
16 it was a good way to go, and we shouldn't
17 go back. I think we need to go forward,
18 we need to build on it, and Michael
19 Nutter was primarily responsible for
20 having that happen.

21 My support in the LGBTQ -- and
22 we get a new letter like every year.
23 It's awesome. LGBTQ rights, transgender
24 healthcare, dignity, decency, this city
25 was voted the number one LGBTQ-friendly

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2 city in the country, and we beat San
3 Francisco, and that's awesome.

4 (Applause.)

5 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: I would be
6 remiss if I did not thank Angel Ortiz and
7 the late David Cohen for their work in
8 that effort, because they educated me in
9 that regard. A white Irish Catholic guy
10 from South Philly didn't know a thing
11 about gay rights or the things that LGBT
12 people were going through in this town
13 and in this country, and they helped
14 school me in that regard.

15 And, finally, the last thing
16 that I'm very proud of is the
17 criminalization of marijuana possession.
18 Now, this issue was never ever about
19 marijuana. It had nothing to do with
20 marijuana. It had to do with criminal
21 records. It had to do with a young
22 person in our town who was stopped for
23 whatever reason. And we can talk about
24 stop and frisk or some of the other stuff
25 that goes on. A young person in our town

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2 being stopped for something that's a
3 stupid thing for them to do. I'm not
4 advocating it. But there's no reason why
5 a person 19, 20 years old should have to
6 live the rest of their life with a
7 criminal record that keeps them from
8 going in the military, getting financial
9 aid, getting a job, and now we expect
10 them to be upstanding, decent,
11 contributing people when we saddle them
12 with a criminal record.

13 I am very, very proud to say
14 that since we've imposed this bill with
15 the cooperation of the Administration and
16 with the Police Department, the last
17 month, two months we are down 90 percent
18 arrests, 90 percent less arrests.

19 (Applause.)

20 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Finally,
21 I'd like to talk a little bit about my
22 personal upbringing and my personal
23 formation. Councilman O'Neill is
24 absolutely right, the Jesuits -- and,
25 Councilman Greenlee, you know it -- the

2 Jesuits, they just formed you. They just
3 molded your psyche, your attitude. It's
4 kind of a crazy process, but when you
5 come out at the end as a senior, you
6 really know that you cannot be truly
7 happy, no matter what you accomplish, no
8 matter what you accumulate, no matter how
9 much money you have, no matter how much
10 bling you acquire, you're never truly
11 happy unless you're serving someone else.
12 Unless you are helping someone else get
13 their problems solved, get their issues
14 dealt with, you are never ever truly
15 happy. And once you figure that out,
16 God, that makes so much sense. It was so
17 simple that it's so wonderful and
18 beautiful.

19 And, finally, before the
20 Jesuits -- and this is how I'll conclude.
21 Before the Jesuits, my parents. My mom
22 was a homemaker and she always worked
23 outside the home. She always had a
24 second job. She worked at a bank. She
25 worked at the Inquirer in the ad

2 department. She took in typing. I mean,
3 she always did something else. My dad
4 also had second jobs. He worked as an
5 usher at the Spectrum. We all remember
6 the Spectrum. And he delivered flowers
7 on the weekends for funerals and
8 weddings. But my father's real job and
9 his real profession was a firefighter.
10 And when you grow up -- and he identified
11 himself as a firefighter. And he's 79
12 years old now and he's still -- if you
13 ask him, What are you? I'm a
14 firefighter. It's part of what you are
15 and it's part of what your family is.
16 And when you're a kid growing up in South
17 Philly and my dad would take us to
18 firehouses in the neighborhood and
19 whatever and you're 7, 8 years old and
20 you're climbing on equipment and climbing
21 on apparatus and you're sitting in the
22 cab driving the car and you're putting
23 your boots on and you got your helmet on
24 and you say, My God, my dad has got the
25 greatest job in the world. And if you

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2 think about public service and you think
3 about firefighters and police officers,
4 prison guards, sheriffs, paramedics,
5 people who are the emblematic example of
6 public service, because you know why?
7 They will lose their life for you. And
8 in my career I have tried to take on that
9 persona, take on that attitude about
10 public service, and I have never been in
11 a situation where I have to be as brave
12 or as selfless as those individuals are,
13 because I've never run into a burning
14 building, I've never chased anybody up a
15 dark alley. I've never done those things
16 and had to worry about what my safety was
17 like in this body. But I'll tell you one
18 thing about a personal story. I lived in
19 a little row house in South Philly on
20 Cantrell Street, 300 block. We had like
21 70 houses and no trees. It was just
22 typical urban little street. And
23 firefighters, as you know, worked four
24 days on, four days off. They did then.
25 I don't know if they do now. Two days

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2 daywork, two days night work. My night
3 work father shift, the next morning, he'd
4 come home sometime in the morning after
5 his shift, and you would wake up in bed
6 and you would smell this unmistakable
7 smell of burnt rubber, wood. It was
8 terrible. And you lay in bed and you
9 spelled that, but you also knew your dad
10 was home, because he would take off his
11 running clothes and he'd throw them down
12 the cellar steps to get washed. That was
13 the kind of a thing that was very
14 reassuring, that you knew your father had
15 come home. As we know as elected
16 officials over the years, a lot of people
17 didn't come home, and we've been to those
18 funerals and we've seen those families
19 suffering and we've seen the grief, but
20 they still do what they do based on their
21 public service and their desire to serve
22 us. And I think if we dedicate
23 ourselves -- we're not running into
24 burning buildings or cutting people out
25 of cars, but let's dedicate ourselves to

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2 that type and attitude of public service,
3 and I think in the end, we'll all have a
4 better city and we'll go forward
5 together.

6 I just want to say finally
7 before I walk out of here, hopefully not
8 for the last time, I want to tell you all
9 here assembled, all my colleagues, I love
10 you. I really do. I just love you, and
11 I'll miss you. And I'll get out of here
12 before I do something I shouldn't do. So
13 good luck, and thank you all.

14 (Standing ovation.)

15 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you
16 all, good luck, and I'll see you soon.

17 (Applause.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Folks, Councilmembers at least, we still
20 have to adjourn.

21 We've concluded our speeches on
22 behalf of the majority and minority, and
23 I'm going to bend the rules one more
24 time. I'm going to ask Councilman Kenney
25 to make a motion to adjourn. You got

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2 your script?

3 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: I don't
4 have my script.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
6 Councilwoman.

7 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
9 Chair recognizes Councilman Kenney for a
10 motion to adjourn.

11 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you,
12 Mr. President. I move that Council stand
13 adjourned until Thursday, February 5th,
14 2015 at 10:00 a.m.

15 (Duly seconded.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It's
17 been moved and properly seconded.

18 All in favor?

19 (Aye.)

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
21 Those opposed?

22 (No response.)

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
24 ayes have it. Council is adjourned until
25 Thursday, February 5th, 2015, 10:00 a.m.

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2 Thank you all very much.
