18 Councilman Johnson, do you want to speak  
19 now on the resolutions?

20 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON:  
21 Absolutely. Absolutely. Thank you.  
22 Thank you, Madam Leader.

23 I just want to speak briefly  
24 about the resolution I'm introducing to  
25 hold joint hearings with the Public

2       Safety Committee as well as the Health  
3       Committee and also going to be partnering  
4       with the state with State Senator Anthony  
5       Hardy Williams to examine the impact of  
6       COVID-19 in our local prison system as  
7       well as in our state prison system.

8               I have been receiving several  
9       calls from family members across the  
10      State of Pennsylvania in prisons such  
11      Mahanoy, SCI Phoenix, and on a local  
12      level, prisons such as Chester as well as  
13      our local prison system on State Road.

14             And so we just want to take a  
15      look at while we address these issues  
16      around the pandemic, that those who are  
17      in our prison system are still addressed  
18      with the most efficient and effective  
19      healthcare, they are being addressed in a  
20      safe manner in terms of how they're being  
21      taken care of and, most importantly, as  
22      we move forward, they have a voice as  
23      relates to us addressing all the issues  
24      around COVID-19 and making sure that  
25      they're safe and, most importantly, their

2       family members, because, again, I'm  
3       getting constant calls from mothers and  
4       fathers and girlfriends, brothers talking  
5       about the conditions of some of our  
6       prisons on the state level as well as our  
7       local level.

8                   And so thank you very much,  
9       Council President, for allowing me to  
10      make remarks.

15                   CHIEF CLERK: Councilwoman

10 Coronavirus-related restrictions on  
11 Philadelphia's restaurants and other  
12 significantly affected businesses and to  
13 explore how these actions will impact the  
14 safety of our citizenry and the City of  
15 Philadelphia's Five-Year Financial Plan."

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
17 Chair recognizes Councilman Domb.

18 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Thank you,  
19 Council President. I just want to speak  
20 briefly about this. This was introduced  
21 by myself, Councilmember Johnson,  
22 Councilmember Squilla, Councilmember  
23 Henon, co-sponsored by many,  
24 Councilmembers Gilmore Richardson,  
25 O'Neill, Gym, Oh, Bass, Jones, and

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2 Gauthier, and I think I speak on behalf  
3 of almost all of our colleagues,  
4 everyone, and the Administration and you,  
5 Council President, that there was  
6 actually an editorial today in the  
7 Inquirer saying that we're not doing  
8 enough for businesses and to help people.  
9 This resolution, the work we have been  
10 doing, maybe people are not aware of it,  
11 but we've been working very diligently  
12 behind the scenes trying to help  
13 businesses, and I want to speak to that  
14 issue.

15 As we continue to adhere to all  
16 the health and safety guidelines, which  
17 are important to protect everyone from  
18 the virus, we must also work with  
19 businesses and help them survive through  
20 this pandemic, and a major part of that  
21 needs to be a conversation about  
22 transparency and process regarding how we  
23 make our decisions and communicate them  
24 to business owners, who are bearing an  
25 unsustainable strain during this

2 pandemic.

3 So we need to be honest about  
4 what this means for our businesses, in  
5 this case our hospitality businesses. I  
6 know we were on that call last week.  
7 Restaurants, arts and culture, hotels,  
8 tourism have been hit the hardest all  
9 over the country and especially in  
10 Philadelphia. Their doors are closing,  
11 and in too many cases they're closing  
12 permanently, so much so that the Inquirer  
13 has now been posting a list of closures,  
14 and it continues to grow, which is  
15 heartbreaking.

16 Our once healthy and growing  
17 job market for local residents is  
18 contracting quickly. We must keep in  
19 mind that the overwhelming majority of  
20 Philadelphia's businesses are small  
21 businesses, small operations that employ  
22 two, three, four, five or ten people, and  
23 our people can't afford the job losses,  
24 our city can't afford the business  
25 closings, and we can't sit back and let

2       it happen without careful discussion and  
3       action.

4               If there ever was a time when  
5       businesses needed government, now is the  
6       time. This hearing will be a  
7       conversation about how decisions are  
8       being made and communicated, what's most  
9       affecting industries, how we can help  
10      them survive right now, develop some  
11      ideas to keep these businesses in  
12      business, and we'll discuss how various  
13      policies and actions will impact the  
14      financial and social future of our city.

15              Many of us in this body have  
16      been focused on building these supports,  
17      as I mentioned, since the virus hit, and  
18      I appreciate my colleagues, especially  
19      and most recently Councilmember  
20      Quinones-Sanchez. I want to thank you  
21      for your leadership yesterday, and the  
22      world should know this, especially the  
23      City, \$20 million was found by  
24      Councilmember Quinones-Sanchez in that  
25      Appropriations hearing to support this

2 group during the appropriation process.  
3 Phenomenal.

4 There's a lot happening right  
5 now in the wake of COVID, but we have to  
6 stay on top of the big picture and  
7 continue to bring these issues forward.  
8 We do care about the restaurant  
9 businesses. We do care about hotels. We  
10 care about cultural industries. We care  
11 about every business in the City and the  
12 residents. And I want to thank everyone  
13 for their support of this resolution  
14 today, and thank you for this time,  
15 Council President. Thank you very much.

4 pride in the hard work that this body  
5 does, and a lot of times we get outside  
6 critics talking about what we are or  
7 aren't doing. I'm waiting for them to  
8 call on our congressional delegation to  
9 see what they are doing, because they  
10 print money in DC, and that money comes

14 We have a track record of  
15 making sure that during this COVID-19, we

18 your leadership, Council President, and  
19 the leadership of Councilwoman Maria  
20 Quinones-Sanchez to come up with funding  
21 to support small businesses in the amount  
22 of \$20 million.

23 And so I just want to state

25 we do a lot of the heavy lifting that

18 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank

11      to ten-minute recess to give our  
12      technology professionals some time to  
13      connect the speakers that we have for

18              COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20      started with our public comment process.  
21      Now that everyone is connected to the

24      us today, we will consider our public  
25      comment.

10              When you call, we will take  
11 your name, phone number, the number of  
12 the legislative item you are commenting  
13 on, and whether you are in support or  
14 against the legislation, and add you to  
15 the list. We will then telephone each  
16 person on the list during the Council  
17 session and invite them to our remote  
18 meeting.

19              Now, under ideal circumstances,  
20 they will each have three minutes to  
21 speak. However, this time limit may vary  
22 from time to time. Today we have a  
23 significant amount of individuals on the  
24 list, so to ensure that everyone has an  
25 opportunity, we're going to have a

12 CHIEF CLERK: Jihad Ali,  
13 commenting on 200588, 200589, and 200590.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
15 morning.

16 MR. ALI: Good morning, Council  
17 President Clarke and other honorable  
18 members of City Council. My name is  
19 Jihad Ali. I am providing testimony on  
20 the legislative package of Bills 200588,  
21 200589, 200590, collectively known as the  
22 Dr. Walter P. Lomax, Jr. Transparency and  
23 Business Act.

24 These bills will disclose the  
25 demographics in the labor pool, the

2       executive team, staffing demographics,  
3       and salaries of contractors on City  
4       contracts. I am in support of these  
5       bills.

6               I agree with Councilwoman  
7       Parker that we have a right to know this  
8       information, that the contractor, the  
9       contract, and the labor pool information  
10      have traditionally and currently not been  
11      disclosed to the public. As pointed out  
12      by Councilwoman Parker, Philadelphia has  
13      a majority minority community. However,  
14      this majority means the minority portion  
15      of the wealth these contracts generate.

16             These legislative bills named  
17      in honor of a distinguished African  
18      American, Dr. Walter P. Lomax, Jr., will  
19      provide transparency of the City's  
20      business to African American and other  
21      large minority communities. This  
22      transparency will reveal the  
23      discrepancies we face in the awarding of  
24      contracts, executive positions, and  
25      staffing on City contracts. It will be

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2 another tool to dismantle and remove the  
3 systemic racism from the granting of City  
4 contracts.

5 In closing, I want to offer my  
6 condolences to the family of Joey Temple.  
7 He was a citizen who was dedicated to  
8 advancing the African American community  
9 concerns and stood up on multiple issues  
10 confronting our community.

11 Thank you.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13 Thank you very much for your testimony.  
14 We appreciate you.

15 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
16 is Duncan Gromko, commenting on 200666.

17 MR. GROMKO: Hi. This is  
18 Duncan. Can you hear me?

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
20 morning. Please state your name for the  
21 record and proceed with your testimony.

22 MR. GROMKO: My name is Duncan  
23 Gromko. I'm a resident of Philadelphia  
24 living in District 2. I'm a member of  
25 Philadelphia's Democratic Socialists of

2       America Chapter and Chair of our Green  
3       New Deal Commission, and I'm speaking in  
4       favor of the green recovery resolution,  
5       200666.

6               Thank you to Councilmember  
7       Richardson and others for sponsoring this  
8       resolution. However, we need much more  
9       to ensure that our city receives the  
10      green recovery it needs. Many working  
11      Philadelphians are struggling with COVID,  
12      and the city, state, and federal  
13      government have let them down time and  
14      time again. More than 90 percent of  
15      workers in Unite Here lost their jobs.  
16      Workers have struggled to access entirely  
17      insufficient unemployment and other  
18      public benefit programs. Sanitation and  
19      healthcare workers were asked to go back  
20      without proper PPE. The District  
21      provided a chaotic reopening process for  
22      teachers and students and had to reverse  
23      their clearly unsafe plan. SEPTA workers  
24      have gotten sick and died and have been  
25      denied hazard pay or death benefits.



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2 We now need investment in green  
3 infrastructure to support our workers and  
4 to make our city healthier and safer. We  
5 can rebuild our toxic schools to protect  
6 our children and teachers and create  
7 green jobs for electricians and other  
8 building trades. SEPTA faces a massive,  
9 massive budget shortfall, and funds can  
10 help keep our city connected. Our parks,  
11 pools, libraries, museums, and other  
12 public spaces can be made into vibrant  
13 community centers.

14 These are just a few examples  
15 of how COVID recovery funds can kick off  
16 a green new deal for Philadelphia, and I  
17 hope that there's community consultation  
18 to determine how these funds are used for  
19 a green recovery.

20 While federal COVID funds will  
21 help, the City needs to get serious about  
22 its own budget, as it's facing enormous  
23 shortfalls in the coming years. The  
24 Philadelphia Police Department has a huge  
25 strain on resources, and these funds

2       should go towards other social services.  
3       Millionaires and wealthy corporations  
4       should pay their fair share. We should  
5       end the tax abatement and force wealthy  
6       non-profit, in quotes, organizations like  
7       universities and hospitals to pay PILOTs.  
8       We can't rely only on the federal  
9       government to rebuild the green  
10      Philadelphia that we need.

11               Thank you very much.

12               COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13      Thank you very much for your testimony.

14               CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
15      is Timothy Leonard, commenting on 200666.

16               MR. LEONARD: Good morning,  
17      Councilmembers.

18               COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
19      morning.

20               MR. LEONARD: My name is  
21      Timothy Leonard. Good morning. My name  
22      is Timothy Leonard, a resident of Ward  
23      21, speaking in support of the green  
24      recovery resolution, No. 200666. I'd  
25      like to thank Councilwoman Richardson and

2       all others sponsoring this resolution.

3               Starting some time around the  
4       second or third week of the pandemic back  
5       in March, it became fashionable to  
6       describe our conditions as the new  
7       normal. The unspoken meaning of this is  
8       generally that we now live in a country  
9       with a federal government that has given  
10      up any responsibility it has to its  
11      citizens, especially the most vulnerable,  
12      and that people have to decide between  
13      risking their health and well-being as  
14      well as their family's by going to work  
15      or risk staying home and not affording  
16      next month's rent.

17              Resolution 200666 is a start to  
18      creating a new "new normal," one that  
19      values the well-being of everybody.  
20      However, it is only a start. While  
21      Councilwoman Richardson recognizes the  
22      solution to our current situation is  
23      forward, that COVID has shown us how our  
24      environment is inextricably linked to our  
25      health and economic security and how

2 systemic racism exacerbates even those  
3 further as outlined in the resolution, I  
4 encourage the Council to pursue an even  
5 bolder vision for the City.

6 The resolution being considered  
7 today lays the groundwork for easing the  
8 financial toll the pandemic has had on  
9 your constituents by creating good green  
10 jobs and affordable housing, but it  
11 should also lay the groundwork for more  
12 democratic control over the local  
13 environment and democratic ownership over  
14 the recovery from this pandemic. The  
15 Council should aggressively pursue public  
16 investment in green infrastructure and  
17 give its constituents a voice in  
18 directing that investment. The private  
19 sector has failed to provide a way out of  
20 our current predicament for both COVID  
21 and climate change, and I fear without  
22 truly transformative policy, even on our  
23 local level, we will be stuck complaining  
24 about the old new normal.

25 Thank you.

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3 Thank you so much for your testimony.

4 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
5 is Lena Smith, commenting on 200666.

6 MS. SMITH: Good morning,  
7 Councilmembers.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
9 morning.

10 MS. SMITH: This is Lena Smith.  
11 Hello. I'm here to speak today in  
12 support of two agenda items, Resolution  
13 200666 and Bill No. 200425-A. I'm  
14 representing Penn Future. I'm the  
15 Campaign Manager for Clean Water  
16 Advocacy.

17 COVID-19 and the federal  
18 government's lack of response has laid  
19 bare the fragile foundation that our  
20 political economy was built upon. A  
21 state and local strategy reliant on  
22 fossil fuels and extracted economies has  
23 created divestment from the people and  
24 neighborhoods that make this city great.

25 Something the pandemic has

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2 exposed is that our communities are also  
3 not prepared to withstand the impacts of  
4 climate change. We saw flooding in  
5 Eastwick and a summer with 22 degree  
6 temperature differences in historically  
7 redlined communities, a phenomenon known  
8 as the urban heat island effect.  
9 Meanwhile, the only way to stay safe from  
10 the pandemic was to stay home.

11 That's why the green recovery  
12 resolution is so important. Philadelphia  
13 needs to prioritize climate action and  
14 environmental justice to these ongoing  
15 COVID-19 recovery efforts. One strategy  
16 for a green recovery among many is to  
17 rebuild and grow our economy to invest in  
18 some green space. Philadelphia has seen  
19 success in creating green space with our  
20 Green City, Clean Waters program. It's  
21 an innovative approach to stormwater  
22 management, investing in historically  
23 neglected communities and increasing  
24 access to green space. It's creating  
25 jobs and economic opportunities for

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2       Philadelphians and reducing blight and  
3       improving safety.

4               The program is not only a  
5       linchpin, but -- is not the only linchpin  
6       to solve our problems, but it is an  
7       investment to address the crises we face.  
8       And while we invest in our green spaces,  
9       these also need to be spaces healthy for  
10      children and families to play and  
11      recreate. So we are also supporting the  
12      Healthy Outdoor Public Spaces bill, which  
13      is also important to improve the water  
14      quality in the Delaware River basin, a  
15      source of drinking water for  
16      Philadelphia.

17             A shift to organic land  
18      management may seem scary and  
19      unattainable, but many also thought this  
20      about the City's huge shift from gray to  
21      green infrastructure. Today Green City,  
22      Clean Waters is one of the most  
23      thoughtful programs in the history of our  
24      city, and I know that we can take the  
25      steps needed to create healthy,

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2       accessible green spaces.

3               Thank you.

4               COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

5       Thank you. Thank you so much for your  
6       testimony.

7               CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
8       is Jonathan Leibovic, commenting on  
9       200666.

10              MR. LEIBOVIC: Thank you, and  
11       thank you, Councilmember Gilmore  
12       Richardson and all the co-sponsors of the  
13       resolution. As a member of Philly  
14       Thrive's Green Recovery --

15              COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Sir, just  
16       state your name for the record briefly.

17              MR. LEIBOVIC: My name is  
18       Jonathan Leibovic and as a member of  
19       Philly Thrive's Green Recovery Circle,  
20       we've spent the last seven months of this  
21       pandemic studying policy proposals that  
22       could make a big difference in the lives  
23       of working-class black and brown  
24       Philadelphians. So we're excited to  
25       speak more with Councilmembers about



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2 these job-creating policies for housing,  
3 transportation, and education, but the  
4 intent to prioritize is not enough. We  
5 have to make some tough choices.

6 We don't currently have the  
7 funds to pay for the green recovery that  
8 we deserve and need, and it's going to  
9 require significant up-front investment,  
10 even though it will pay for itself in the  
11 long run. But some big things in our  
12 city's budget need to change. The police  
13 budget, as already mentioned, is bloated.  
14 The PPD has a pattern of overreaction and  
15 escalation. It's been featured in the  
16 New York Times and the Washington Post.  
17 They gassed peaceful protesters, they  
18 murdered Walter Wallace, Jr., they  
19 smashed Rakia Young's van and posed with  
20 her baby on social media as if they were  
21 saviors.

22 There's no excuse to continue  
23 funding millions of dollars of overtime  
24 pay for officers who have become a  
25 national disgrace. So if you really

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2 intend to prioritize climate action and  
3 environmental justice, you have to stand  
4 up to the bullies at the FOP and de-fund  
5 the police.

6 Developers' pockets are loaded.  
7 New construction is still booming  
8 throughout the City. We have to end the  
9 ten-year tax abatement and we have to do  
10 it now. Advocates have been demanding  
11 this for years. It's not time to wait.  
12 It's time to do it now and City Council  
13 to prove that you really represent the  
14 people and not the developers. And by  
15 the way, Allan Domb must recuse himself  
16 from any vote regarding the tax abatement  
17 due to his clear conflict of interest as  
18 a real estate developer.

19 And then there are the  
20 non-profits in name only. The University  
21 of Pennsylvania, my alma mater, made  
22 headlines when they promised a hundred  
23 million dollars, but their endowment is  
24 \$15 billion, and Amy Gutmann's salary is  
25 \$6.3 million. Penn must pay more, and so

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2       must Drexel and Jefferson and all the  
3       other non-profits in name only.

4               Thank you very much for my  
5       time.

6               COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
7       Thank you for your testimony.

8               CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
9       is Lynn Robinson, commenting on 200666.

10              MS. ROBINSON: Good morning,  
11       Councilmember Katherine Gilmore  
12       Richardson and all Councilmembers in this  
13       meeting. This is Lynn Robinson speaking.  
14       I'm the Director of Neighbors Against the  
15       Gas Plants and a resident of (inaudible).  
16       I am speaking in support of green  
17       recovery Resolution 200666, but I also do  
18       support the Healthy Outdoor Spaces bill.

19              This resolution provides the  
20       clear high road to a healthier economy  
21       while improving public health beginning  
22       right now. COVID-19 recovery in itself  
23       is a short-term goal, but a green  
24       recovery will have long-term effects.  
25       Hopefully we'll no longer have to accept

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2 Philadelphia as normal as the nation's  
3 large cities' cancer and asthma capital.

4               One gem in the resolution is  
5 the promotion of a circular economy,  
6 which honors the dignity of all involved.  
7 A circular economy, which builds  
8 environmental justice and climate action,  
9 will better protect people from falling  
10 through the cracks and becoming part of  
11 what we politely have been calling the  
12 most vulnerable.

13              An environmental priority will  
14 begin to lift health burdens from certain  
15 zip codes in our city, where lower  
16 average life expectancy was widely  
17 publicized and accepted as inevitable  
18 before the pandemic began.

19              COVID, as a threat of  
20 contagion, has forced the general public  
21 to admit who suffers the most from  
22 chronic diseases. Now we have to see  
23 that our city and nation's health is only  
24 as strong as our weakest link.

25              It's not a trickle-down theory

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2 resolution. It's just the City's  
3 official perception, away from the idea  
4 that the salvation and backbone of our  
5 city relies on an influx of high-income  
6 residents and comes to term with the  
7 reality that our future, while including  
8 new people, rests on the diverse  
9 population whose ancestors (inaudible)  
10 decades to centuries ago. That includes  
11 with equity the 23.3 percent under the  
12 federal poverty line.

13 I'm running out of time.

14 Before you lose interest in my applause,  
15 there's a fly in the ointment, not in the  
16 resolution but in past history. Up until  
17 the recent City Council elections, any  
18 time City Council thought about anything  
19 environmental, they followed the lead of  
20 the Mayor's Office. Now we have four new  
21 members. We'll see if you're willing to  
22 ruffle feathers with the City  
23 Administration's fossil fuel advisors,  
24 friends, and colleagues.

25 I have to cut it short? Okay.

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2 I don't know if you cut me off.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: No.

4 Just your time is up, but thank you. We  
5 appreciate your testimony.

6 MS. ROBINSON: Thank you.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8 You're welcome.

9 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
10 is Meenal Raval, commenting on 200666.

11 MS. RAVAL: Yes. Hi. I'm  
12 here. This is Meenal Raval with the  
13 Sierra Club. I support Resolution  
14 200666. For years I've spoken on the  
15 need to lead on climate. Leading on  
16 climate cannot be an afterthought but the  
17 lens through which Council makes each  
18 decision.

19 COVID-19 has pushed the pause  
20 button for us and shown us who is  
21 affected by the virus, who is the most  
22 vulnerable, and who is the most essential  
23 amongst us. I'm talking about the young  
24 and the old and the essential workers who  
25 cannot work from home like most of us.

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2 COVID-19 has also shown us that  
3 the safest spaces are outdoors. COVID-19  
4 is a message from earth, inviting us back  
5 to her garden. For us to venture  
6 outdoors, though, we need to make our  
7 streets safe from police violence. We  
8 also need to improve our air quality,  
9 often being unsafe due to pollution from  
10 fossil fuel.

11 In addition, we need to stop  
12 polluting our green space. I'm referring  
13 to the Healthy Outdoor Public Spaces  
14 bill.

15 If we consider carbon pollution  
16 for each of our decisions, we would find  
17 ourselves aware of our car-centric  
18 culture and craft policies that encourage  
19 walking, cycling, riding, and transit, as  
20 well as policies that encourage electric  
21 vehicles and public charging  
22 infrastructure.

23 If we consider carbon pollution  
24 for each decision, we would consider  
25 banning the sale of new gas appliances in

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2 our city, especially for new  
3 construction, and work to retool the PGW  
4 workforce for the needed electrification.

5 If we consider carbon pollution  
6 for each decision, newly trained staff  
7 would ensure that every street in our  
8 city would be tree-lined with trees cared  
9 for.

10 These are just some examples.  
11 Overall we need to ensure that we do not  
12 approve any new fossil fuel projects, no  
13 matter how tempting. They're bad for  
14 children and other living beings. No new  
15 fossil fuel projects is an international  
16 call, and it means no new combined heat  
17 and power plants like the SEPTA gas  
18 plant, no new liquefied natural gas  
19 facilities, no LNG export terminals for  
20 plastic manufacturing elsewhere, and no  
21 new gas hook-ups. Our guiding mantra  
22 should be electrify everything and power  
23 it all with clean energy. This could  
24 translate to using tax abatements solely  
25 for climate solutions so that we further



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2 the tax reduction only for net-zero  
3 buildings.

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

5 Thank you.

6 MS. RAVAL: We need greater  
7 transparency for PGW, and every budget  
8 decision made by this body must concern  
9 air quality and greenhouse gas emissions.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

11 Thank you.

12 MS. RAVAL: It's time we put  
13 our money where our mouth is. Thank you.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Ms.

15 Raval, your time is up. Thank you.

16 Thank you for your testimony.

17 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
18 is Kendra Mohr, commenting on 200666.

19 MS. MOHR: Good morning,  
20 Councilmembers. My name is Kendra Mohr,  
21 the Government Relations Manager for the  
22 Sustainable Business Network for Greater  
23 Philadelphia, and I'm calling in support  
24 of 200666.

25 As a network, we are pleased to

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2 see that Katherine Gilmore Richardson  
3 introduced this in resolution and  
4 received support from her colleagues.  
5 Its language largely mirrors SBN's vision  
6 and values, and over the past 20 years,  
7 SBN has supported thousands of local  
8 independent businesses across the region  
9 that practice and measure success by the  
10 triple bottom line of people, planet, and  
11 profitability, and we've long called for  
12 investment in climate-resilient  
13 infrastructure, such as renewable energy  
14 and energy efficiency transportation  
15 system improvements that minimize  
16 greenhouse gas emissions and nature-based  
17 stormwater management.

18 We also believe that the City  
19 should invest in workforce training and  
20 placement for millions of construction,  
21 manufacturing, and maintenance jobs that  
22 support climate-resilient infrastructure.  
23 We should invest in restoring and  
24 strengthening local food systems, a known  
25 growth industry for our region, and of

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2 course prioritize small business  
3 development.

4 Given our members' deep  
5 commitment to rebuilding our economy with  
6 strong focuses on localism, equity, and  
7 climate resilience, we look forward to  
8 working closely with Councilmember  
9 Gilmore Richardson and the rest of  
10 Council, as well as the Administration,  
11 to bring this resolution into action.

12 These goals will require  
13 intentional stakeholder engagement,  
14 planning, budgeting, and hard work, and  
15 we're eager to support that effort.

16 Thank you.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 Thank you for your testimony.

19 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
20 is Julian Boggs, commenting on 200666.

21 MR. BOGGS: Thank you. My name  
22 is Julian Boggs. I'm a resident of  
23 Philadelphia. I wanted to speak up today  
24 as others have in favor of Resolution  
25 200666 by Councilmember Gilmore

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2       Richardson. I want to echo what a lot of  
3       the previous speakers have said, and so I  
4       will just briefly say maybe a couple  
5       additional pieces.

6                I think one thing that has  
7       happened over the last decade that some  
8       of the members on the Council perhaps are  
9       less familiar with because it's been an  
10      absolute sea change since you first came  
11      on the Council is that the underlying  
12      economics of shifting to clean energy  
13      have dramatically changed in the last ten  
14      years. There are -- earlier this year  
15      you had oil companies like BP saying that  
16      we've reached oil and shifted resources  
17      to clean energy. Solar and wind are the  
18      cheapest sources of new electricity  
19      across the globe.

20              It's happening. The question  
21      for Philadelphia and for all of us is how  
22      fast and who will benefit, and that's why  
23      the action now as we rebuild over COVID  
24      and action now, as I know so many of you  
25      are thinking deeply about equity and

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2 justice across the City, are so critical.

3 The question is, who is going to benefit

4 and are we going to invest in gas fossil

5 fuel infrastructure that is just going to

6 be torn out in 15, 20 years or are we

7 going to put the money into heat pumps,

8 geothermal systems, and green jobs

9 programs for folks across the City who

10 deeply need it.

11 Those are the real questions,

12 and I urge you to not just let this be

13 words on a page but commit real dollars,

14 following up on Council President

15 Clarke's clean energy campaign commitment

16 of a billion dollars and continue to

17 invest real dollars in the transition so

18 that all of Philadelphians benefit.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20 Thank you. Thank you for your testimony.

21 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker

22 is Amy Steffen, commenting on 200425-A.

23 MS. STEFFEN: Good morning,

24 President Clarke and Councilmembers. My

25 name is Amy Steffen. I am a member of

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2       Toxic Free Philly and I support Bill  
3       200425. Thank you so much, Councilwoman  
4       Bass and the co-sponsors, for introducing  
5       this important legislation, and thank you  
6       to the Public Health Committee for voting  
7       it unanimously out of committee.

8               For many years, I've helped  
9       with native plant restoration and removed  
10      invasive plants. I saw supposedly safe  
11      herbicides cause unexpected damage,  
12      killing mature trees. I saw how invasive  
13      plants came back again and again, even  
14      after being sprayed with glyphosate. A  
15      safer approach is needed.

16             Currently, there is no policy  
17      to reduce herbicide use in Philadelphia.  
18      It is sprayed around basketball courts  
19      and tennis courts where people put their  
20      backpacks and water bottles. It's  
21      sprayed along Forbidden Drive to kill  
22      invasive plants as children and families  
23      walk by with no warning. It is sprayed  
24      on poison ivy while schoolchildren stand  
25      downwind.

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2 Without your leadership to  
3 mandate change, the City would continue  
4 to apply these toxins and jeopardize our  
5 health.

6 We now know the toxic  
7 herbicides are dangerous. The evidence  
8 is overwhelming, as you heard and saw in  
9 the testimony. And during COVID-19, we  
10 know all too well that black and brown  
11 people are at increased risk from  
12 environmental toxins.

13 Critics may be nervous about  
14 changing their landscape practices  
15 because they may not know another way,  
16 but there is another way. Organic land  
17 management works. It's working all  
18 across the country. It's effective, and  
19 it creates safe jobs. A waiver process  
20 with public oversight can accommodate  
21 rare instances when pesticide use may be  
22 necessary.

23 We need your leadership to pass  
24 this bill. Without a mandate from you,  
25 the City would continue to jeopardize our

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2       health. Philly can do better. Thank you  
3       so much for improving our health now and  
4       for future generations by voting on this  
5       bill yes.

6               Thank you.

7               COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8       Thank you so much for your testimony.  
9       Appreciate it.

10              CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
11       is Thakiyah Yankowy.

12              MS. AHMAD-YANKOWY: Hi. Good  
13       morning, everyone.

14              COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
15       morning.

16              MS. AHMAD-YANKOWY: My name is  
17       Thakiyah Ahmad-Yankowy and I've been  
18       asked to testify on the behalf of the  
19       Friends of Fernhill Park to address the  
20       Philadelphia City Council Bill 200425,  
21       Healthy Outdoor Public Spaces, Committee  
22       on Public Health and Human Services. I  
23       am also a 13th Ward committee person, a  
24       member of Neighbors Against the Gas  
25       Plants, a community liaison for



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2 Philadelphia Job Corps, co-block captain  
3 for West Abbottsford Avenue, and a wife  
4 and mother of three, and I can tell you  
5 that our community is in support of the  
6 Healthy Outdoor Public Spaces bill  
7 introduced by Councilwoman Cindy Bass.

8 I've lived across the street  
9 from the Fernhill Park for the last 17  
10 years. The park is a green space used by  
11 not just our community but the community  
12 at-large. It is located in the Southwest  
13 Germantown section of Philadelphia, so  
14 it's used by those neighbors, as well as  
15 East Falls neighbors, Nicetown neighbors,  
16 and by the John B. Kelly Elementary  
17 School, the Wissahickon Charter School,  
18 which uses the park on a regular basis  
19 for recess, physical education, and as a  
20 conducive resource for the students'  
21 emotional and physical development. They  
22 also help with park cleanup.

23 I'm here today to ask you to  
24 please consider non-toxic methods to  
25 treat our parks and green spaces.

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2 Testify there are very serious concerns.

3 The children of our Nicetown community

4 have the highest asthma rate in the

5 entire City of Philadelphia, and they

6 rank within the top ten of our country.

7 Unfortunately, when pesticides

8 are used, they don't just stay in place,

9 and even if they did, our children don't.

10 These chemicals, spread with the wind,

11 could become a part of the air we

12 breathe, the water we drink, and they are

13 tracked into our homes and they cover

14 our children's hands and feet.

15 So today I ask you, please open

16 your hearts to making Philadelphia a

17 healthier place for all of us, especially

18 to create a healthier future for our

19 children.

20 Thank you for giving me the

21 opportunity to testify, and have a great

22 day.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

24 Thank you. Thank you for your testimony.

25 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker

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2 is Drew Toher.

3 MR. TOHER: Good morning.

4 Thank you for the opportunity to speak.

5 I am Drew Toher, Community Resource and  
6 Policy Director at Beyond Pesticides. I  
7 am here representing our members and  
8 supporters in Philadelphia. We  
9 appreciate the Council taking up Bill No.  
10 200425, Healthy Outdoor Public Spaces,  
11 also known as HOPS. Beyond Pesticides  
12 supports this legislation and urges its  
13 passage.

14 We applaud the Council for its  
15 diligent work on this bill, including  
16 amendments adopted at the last hearing  
17 providing for a waiver review process  
18 that allows exceptions only in limited  
19 circumstances when public health is at  
20 issue or ecological balance is threatened  
21 by invasive species.

22 We remain hopeful that in the  
23 future, the Council will consider further  
24 restrictions that broaden the reach of  
25 HOPS to include not just herbicides but

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2        all toxic pesticides used in lawn and  
3        landscape management as well as prohibit  
4        the use of synthetic fertilizers that are  
5        harmful to soil ecology.

6                In the meantime, Beyond  
7        Pesticides is prepared to work with the  
8        City to provide the education and  
9        training necessary to establish a firm  
10       foundation for successful transition to  
11       organic land management.

12               The Council's action on this  
13       issue comes at an incredibly important  
14       time. As the science on the dangers  
15       pesticides pose to health and the  
16       environment continues to accumulate, a  
17       weakened EPA has continued to register  
18       and reregister toxic pesticides.

19               COVID-19 is causing higher  
20       rates of disease among people of color in  
21       proportion to their percentage of the  
22       population, and pesticides using turf  
23       management can exacerbate underlying  
24       conditions and increase vulnerability to  
25       COVID and other diseases.

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2 Bees, butterflies, and other  
3 pollinators are dying off, and the  
4 pesticides that harm these important  
5 species also contaminate local waterways.

6 We again thank Councilmember  
7 Bass and the rest of the Philadelphia  
8 City Council for its work on this issue  
9 at such a critical time and urge the  
10 passage of HOPS.

11 I appreciate the opportunity to  
12 speak, and happy to answer any questions  
13 if you have them.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
15 Thank you. Thank you so much for your  
16 testimony, sir.

17 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
18 is Lena Smith, commenting on 200425-A.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
20 morning.

21 (No response.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
23 morning, Ms. Smith.

24 COUNCIL SUPPORT: The next  
25 speaker, please.

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2 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
3 is Dr. Francie Rubin, commenting on  
4 200425-A.

5 DR. RUBIN: Greetings.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
7 morning.

8 DR. RUBIN: Good morning. My  
9 name is Dr. Francie Rubin. I'm speaking  
10 in favor of eliminating herbicides and  
11 fungicides from Philadelphia's public  
12 green spaces. I'm a veterinarian and  
13 owner of the Rockledge Veterinary Clinic  
14 located just outside of Northeast  
15 Philadelphia. I've been a veterinarian  
16 for 31 years. My veterinary association,  
17 the AVMA, reports that one in four dogs  
18 dies of cancer every year. Almost one in  
19 two dogs over the age of ten develops  
20 cancer. These are alarming statistics.

21 When I walk my own dog during  
22 this clean summer, I can smell the lawn  
23 chemicals that many of my neighbors have  
24 applied. I see the little almost  
25 invisible signs that the companies like

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2 TruGreen leave in the lawn. I often  
3 experience burning in my eyes and nose  
4 and a sore throat during these walks.  
5 These little signs, often inconspicuous,  
6 will say don't walk on this area until  
7 dry. Who are they kidding? Do they  
8 think the dogs won't absorb the chemicals  
9 through their foot pads or inside their  
10 noses when they sniff the lawn once it's  
11 dry? Dogs' feet are the only part of the  
12 body that sweat. The pads are porous,  
13 and that means that all kind of nodules  
14 can be easily absorbed through their  
15 feet, wet or dry. In addition, dogs lick  
16 their feet, thereby increasing their  
17 exposure by ingesting more toxic  
18 products.

19 Most of the chemicals in these  
20 lawn applications have not been evaluated  
21 for their long-term health effects. With  
22 our dogs' life expectancies being shorter  
23 than ours, they are Guinea pigs. As  
24 their cancer rate increases, we need to  
25 ask ourselves hard questions, why is this

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2 happening, what are the causes. I can  
3 tell you it's not because they live  
4 longer. More younger pets succumb. They  
5 live in a toxic world. Better life  
6 through chemistry? I'm not so sure.

7 I hope that you will vote in  
8 favor of banning all of the potentially  
9 dangerous chemicals in our public spaces  
10 and set a precedent so that I can start a  
11 movement in my own community. Our  
12 children are pets. Helpless bees deserve  
13 our efforts to protect them from these  
14 dangerous chemicals.

15 Thank you.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17 Thank you so much for your testimony.

18 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
19 is Michaela Majoun, commenting on  
20 200425-A.

21 MS. MAJOUN: This is Michaela  
22 Majoun. Can you hear me?

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Yes,  
24 we hear you. State your name for the  
25 record and just proceed with your

2       testimony.

3               MS. MAJOUN: Thank you. I  
4       support the Healthy Outdoor Public Spaces  
5       bill to stop the City from using toxins  
6       in public places, but I'm here today to  
7       read the comments of another Philadelphia  
8       citizen. His name is John Janick. He's  
9       owned Good Host Plants Nursery for the  
10      past five years and he's participated in  
11      many public land restoration efforts  
12      throughout Philadelphia over the past ten  
13      years. And here's what John says:

14             I strongly support passage of  
15      this bill. I designed and planted many  
16      gardens over the years in the City, most  
17      of which first required removal of  
18      invasive species, and I've never used  
19      herbicides. I've always found mechanical  
20      removal to be the most successful  
21      technique. Even the most aggressive  
22      invasive species like Japanese Knotweed  
23      can be eliminated using organic gardening  
24      techniques.

25             In October 2019, I worked with

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about 50 students, and in just two hours,  
we removed English ivy from an entire  
block from the sidewalk to about 50 feet  
deep in the woods. The students learned  
about ecology and horticulture, and our  
work allowed native species to thrive and  
provide essential food for migrating  
birds.

I recently moved to a property  
in Mount Airy that contains all of the  
invasive species that are found  
throughout Fairmount Park. Starting this  
past summer, I've been documenting what  
just one person can do to restore a  
critical wildlife habitat without the use  
of herbicides and pesticides. I believe  
the same techniques can be applied on a  
larger scale to our public spaces with  
buy-in from the City.

Thank you for your time.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

Thank you for your testimony.

CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
is Logan Welde, commenting on 200425-A.

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
3 morning.

4 MR. WELDE: Yes. Hello?

6 MR. WELDE: I'm Logan Welde. I  
7 am staff attorney at Clean Air Council.  
8 Good morning. I am also a co-block  
9 captain and a committee member in the  
10 14th Ward.

11 I am lucky enough right now to  
12 be in Ludlow, and I'm looking out my  
13 window and I'm seeing a lot of litter.  
14 So today I want to comment on both 200425  
15 and 200666.

16 In my opinion, both of these  
17 bills are -- this resolution and this  
18 piece of legislation are no-brainers.  
19 They should both easily pass, and I  
20 assume they will. We have to look  
21 towards the future. We've got to protect  
22 our citizens in Philadelphia.

23 Pesticides being sprayed in  
24 common places where children are playing  
25 and, as you heard, animals are wandering

2       is dangerous for public health, and these  
3       are simple things that we should be able  
4       to approve of as a society to get rid of  
5       these things.

6                You also heard today someone  
7       mention new gas hook-ups. In Oakland,  
8       California they were the most recent  
9       municipality to ban new gas hook-ups for  
10      residential and commercial.

11              We have a goal in Philadelphia  
12      to reduce our greenhouse gases, and one  
13      of the best ways to do that is to ensure  
14      that our buildings are more energy  
15      efficient and do not use fossil fuels to  
16      heat and cook with, and reducing that is  
17      going to take a lot of guts from City  
18      Council and it's going to be a long-term  
19      plan, probably 20 years in the making.  
20      We need to start now by reducing new  
21      residential and commercial gas hook-ups  
22      in Philadelphia.

23              So I encourage City Council to  
24      pass both of these, 200425 and 200666,  
25      and if you've got any questions, I know

6               COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
7       Thank you so much for your testimony.

8               CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker  
9       is Dr. Naomi Johnson-Booker, commenting  
10      on 200580.

11              DR. JOHNSON-BOOKER: Good  
12      morning. My name is Dr. Naomi  
13      Johnson-Booker and I am one of the  
14      co-founders of the African American  
15      Charter School Coalition. Our coalition  
16      is made up of 22 black-founded and led  
17      schools and parents from across the City  
18      of Philadelphia and represent close to  
19      15,000 children and working-class  
20      families. The purpose of our coalition  
21      is to create a non-biased system of  
22      public charter school oversight, renewal,  
23      and expansion, which currently does not  
24      exist today.

25              For over ten years,

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2 black-founded and led schools have  
3 succeeded in providing a high-quality,  
4 culturally rich educational program for  
5 students that celebrate a child's  
6 heritage and ethnicity, but we have also  
7 suffered many times through the process  
8 of just existing and being recognized as  
9 an important part of the educational  
10 landscape here in Philadelphia. There  
11 are inequities that exist between white  
12 and black-led schools when it comes to  
13 funding, resources, and support.  
14 Examples of this include the School  
15 District renewals and expansion,  
16 approvals, and philanthropic resources  
17 and distribution.

18 We continue to fight to stop  
19 budget cuts as the same state and city  
20 officials who advocate for the  
21 dissolution of public charter schools  
22 without fully understanding or  
23 appreciating the consequences of closing  
24 a public charter and how that not only  
25 impacts the neighborhood it serves but

2       also the children and working-class  
3       families who attend these schools and who  
4       are also your constituents.

5               Our schools have selectively  
6       dealt with racism, discrimination,  
7       inequity, and bias when it comes to our  
8       schools' oversight, expansion, and  
9       renewal opportunity.

10              Councilwoman Gym's resolution,  
11       which supports House Bill 526, sends a  
12       strong message to all of us that you  
13       support forcing parents to pay for access  
14       to a public educational option that many  
15       of these families currently receive for  
16       free. The only people hurt by this are  
17       the people who can't afford to pay the  
18       bill.

19              We all know and agree that the  
20       charter -- the state charter school law  
21       needs to be revamped, but trying to hide  
22       those quick fixes that negatively impact  
23       and hurt poor people does not work. It's  
24       not equal and it's not just.

25              COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 name is -- thank you. My name is Larry  
15 Jones and I'm one of the co-founders of  
16 the African American Charter School  
17 Coalition.

18 Based on Philadelphia School  
19 District data, there have been 23 charter  
20 schools recommended for closure within  
21 the past ten years, and 20 of them were  
22 black-led or minority-led schools,  
23 representing an 87 percent number.

24 There's also a recent Johns  
25 Hopkins study that illustrates that



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2 nationally charter school authorizing  
3 policies create disproportionate barriers  
4 for African American and Hispanic charter  
5 operators.

6 Our Black Schools Matter  
7 campaign is a new initiative to highlight  
8 the importance of black-led schools and  
9 raise awareness of inequities that exist  
10 between black and white-led schools. Our  
11 goals are to correct misinformation,  
12 highlight what fits our schools apart  
13 from others, and demand equity when it  
14 comes to funding, renewal, and expansion.

15 Our schools collectively serve  
16 a larger number of disenfranchised  
17 children and working-class families who  
18 deserve the same options and  
19 opportunities as anyone else, which is  
20 why we must have a non-biased system of  
21 public charter oversight, renewal, and  
22 expansion.

23 The Charter Office must be  
24 revamped to ensure fairness,  
25 transparency, and equity when it comes to

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2 evaluation and oversight. The  
3 authorization outcomes shouldn't be  
4 different for different schools. We want  
5 to work with the School Board and the  
6 Charter Office to address these issues,  
7 because we can no longer be silent. Our  
8 voices matter, and we hope all members of  
9 Council will support our efforts as we  
10 continue to move our Black Schools Matter  
11 campaign forward.

12 Additionally, we know  
13 Councilmember Gym's resolution supporting  
14 House Bill 526 is non-binding, but it is  
15 symbolic in nature. It sends the wrong  
16 message to parents and working-class  
17 families who wish to exercise their right  
18 to have a free public option where to  
19 send their child to school. This was a  
20 right afforded to many of you that you  
21 are now attempting to deny other  
22 families. This is not fair nor  
23 equitable, and to suggest parents need to  
24 pay to have their child attend a public  
25 school option that they currently receive

2       for free during a global pandemic and job  
3       loss is shameful.

4               We support the revamp of the  
5       charter school law, but this is not the  
6       way to do it. Therefore, we are asking  
7       you to please vote no to Councilwoman  
8       Gym's resolution. Also, in the future  
9       please consider reaching out to our  
10      coalition on issues impacting public  
11      education or public charter school  
12      policies so we can provide our valuable  
13      insight.

14              Thank you.

15 our citizenry and the City of  
16 Philadelphia's Five-Year Financial Plan,  
17 introduced by Councilman Domb.

18                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
19 Chair recognizes Councilman Domb.

20                  COUNCILMAN DOMB: I move for  
21 its adoption, Council President.

22                   (Duly seconded.)

23                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It's  
24 been moved and properly seconded that the  
25 resolution be adopted.

2           All in favor say aye.

3           (Aye.)

4           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

5 Those opposed?

6           (No response.)

7           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
8 ayes have it, and that resolution is  
9 adopted.

10           CHIEF CLERK: There are no  
11 other resolutions on the Final Passage  
12 Calendar, Mr. President.

13           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 Thank you very much.

15           That completes our Calendar for  
16 today.

17           Prior to recognizing members  
18 regarding speeches, I will note for the  
19 record at this time that we will use the  
20 Chat feature available in Microsoft Teams  
21 to allow members to signify that they  
22 wish to be recognized. In order to  
23 comply with the Sunshine Act, the Chat  
24 feature must only be used for this  
25 particular purpose.

2           With that said, are there any  
3 speeches on behalf of the minority?

4           The Chair recognizes Councilman  
5 Oh.

6           COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you very  
7 much, Council President. Today I  
8 introduced a bill to amend the code  
9 regarding the sections that deal with  
10 emergency epidemic control and prevention  
11 of congregation of persons under Section  
12 6-205 and 6-206. There's no limitation  
13 on these orders compared to Section  
14 10-819, which is state of emergency,  
15 which is what I originally thought was  
16 the authority of the Mayor to issue  
17 citywide restrictions, and that's a  
18 well-written section that basically  
19 provides the Mayor two weeks in which he  
20 can declare an emergency to shut down  
21 bars, restaurants, things like that,  
22 followed by another two weeks, but after  
23 four weeks, the Mayor must get approval  
24 from City Council with a written  
25 explanation of what he is trying to do

2     and why he needs to do that. However,  
3     the other two sections, which appears is  
4     how the City's proceeding, has no time  
5     limitation, no reporting requirements or  
6     anything like that. The code properly  
7     gives the Mayor and the Health Department  
8     the power to issue restrictions for  
9     public health.

10           What I'm introducing, very  
11     similar to the section on state of  
12     emergency, is a limitation of 60 days,  
13     after which if there is a desire to  
14     continue with these restrictions, they  
15     have to get approval from this body,  
16     which I think is proper being that this  
17     is a check and balance, a body that is  
18     very accessible to the public whereby we  
19     can ask the Health Commissioner, the  
20     Administration why they want to continue  
21     the restrictions, have they been  
22     successful, what is their data, what have  
23     they learned, what is their goals, and  
24     that will ensure the engagement of this  
25     body in this process.

2           So that's the reason I  
3 introduce it. I just wanted to explain  
4 it.

5           Thank you very much.

6           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

7 Thank you, Councilman.

8           Speeches on behalf of the  
9 majority?

10          The Chair recognizes  
11 Councilwoman Gilmore Richardson.

12          COUNCILWOMAN RICHARDSON: Thank  
13 you so much, Mr. President. I have two  
14 important issues I want to raise today.

15          First, I want to thank you,  
16 colleagues, and all of the citizens who  
17 testified in support of the green  
18 recovery resolution. Right here in  
19 Philadelphia we are already feeling the  
20 impacts of climate change. Last week a  
21 report came out showing the average  
22 winter temperatures have risen 4.8  
23 degrees in Philadelphia since 1970, and  
24 the season has 19 more days with above  
25 normal temperatures.

2           This summer we also had  
3   record-breaking average minimum, which we  
4   were also around five degrees warmer than  
5   in the 1960s.

6           We cannot wait any longer to  
7   take action. As climate change worsens,  
8   entire swaths of the globe will be  
9   uninhabitable, disrupting life as we know  
10   it. And these impacts are not felt  
11   equitably. Today in Philadelphia your  
12   zip code determines your life expectancy,  
13   and that isn't an accident. Black and  
14   brown Philadelphians were redlined into  
15   specific areas, areas that are more  
16   likely to be near polluting industries  
17   and will also see disproportionate  
18   impacts from climate change, like urban  
19   heat island and flooding.

20          Our economy is also in need of  
21   new growth and innovation, and clean  
22   energy, energy efficiency, organic land  
23   management, green infrastructure,  
24   materials reuse and recovery, and many  
25   more sectors of the green economy provide

2   the opportunity to help put  
3   Philadelphians back to work in  
4   family-supporting and sustaining jobs,  
5   spur new business development, and put  
6   Philadelphia at the forefront of these  
7   fast-growing industries.

8           I want to thank the over 60  
9   organizations that participate in the  
10   Civilian Environmental Advisory Committee  
11   who have taken the time to partner with  
12   us to work on how we can address these  
13   big challenges. And I want to thank you,  
14   colleagues, and the Administration, past  
15   and present, who have worked so hard to  
16   build the strong foundation on climate  
17   action here in Philadelphia. I  
18   appreciate your willingness to stand with  
19   me on this bold vision for our city, and  
20   I look forward to working with you to  
21   make this vision a reality.

22           Second, I want to address an  
23   issue that feels deeply personal to me.  
24   As a graduate of the Philadelphia High  
25   School for Girls, I know how impactful a

2   high school academic experience can be.  
3   Every good thing in my life is a result  
4   of the Philadelphia High School for  
5   Girls. Girls' High gave me a strong  
6   academic foundation, confidence, and the  
7   support I needed to thrive. Without  
8   Girls' High, I may not be sitting here  
9   today as a member of Philadelphia City  
10   Council.

11                So when I read about John W.  
12   Hallahan Catholic Girls High School and  
13   Bishop McDevitt High School, I felt  
14   compelled, compelled to support the  
15   respective boards, alumni, staff, and  
16   students who are fighting to keep their  
17   doors open.

18                John W. Hallahan is the first  
19   all-girls Catholic high school in the  
20   country and is on the cusp of celebrating  
21   their 120th anniversary. Hallahan has  
22   graduated over 43,000 women of all  
23   backgrounds and faiths, many who are  
24   industry leaders and public servants  
25   right here in Philadelphia and also in

2       our Philadelphia City Council.

3           Bishop McDevitt has been a  
4       leader in educating an incredibly diverse  
5       student body for decades. Over 70  
6       percent of the student body is African  
7       American, and the vast majority of  
8       students live in Philadelphia.

9           Both of these schools have  
10      strong support from board leaders,  
11      alumni, and students who have shared  
12      their love for their schools and worked  
13      hard to increase enrollment and saw  
14      financial challenges, only to be met with  
15      a surprise announcement about closing  
16      with little to no communication.

17          Additionally, I do not think  
18      it's a coincidence or a happenstance as  
19      this information continues to unfold that  
20      the site adjacent to Hallahan at 1801  
21      Vine, what we've known as Family Court,  
22      will go back out to bid after it was  
23      proposed as a hospitality site and a  
24      black-owned hotel to the surprise of many  
25      of us. So more on that at another time.

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2           But if these historic  
3 institutions are closed, it will not only  
4 be a loss for the students who attend  
5 Hallahan and McDevitt, but it will also  
6 be a loss for our region as a whole.  
7 These schools are community anchors, and  
8 I am grateful for their significant  
9 contribution to the Philadelphia  
10 community.

11           So thank you to my colleagues  
12 who co-sponsored this resolution,  
13 particularly you, Council President, as  
14 the District Councilmember where Hallahan  
15 is located and our Majority Leader,  
16 Councilmember Cherelle L. Parker, who  
17 represents the families of a number of  
18 McDevitt students who reside in the Ninth  
19 Councilmanic District.

20           To all the students and alumni  
21 of Hallahan and Bishop McDevitt, please  
22 know we stand with you and support you in  
23 your efforts. More importantly, we will  
24 continue to work with you to get a  
25 meeting scheduled with Archbishop Perez.

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2           Archbishop Perez, we are  
3 looking forward to meeting with you and  
4 the respected boards of each school.

5           Thank you, Mr. President, and  
6 thank you, colleagues.

7           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8 Thank you, Councilwoman.

9           On behalf of the majority, the  
10 Chair recognizes Councilman Jones.

11          COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,  
12 Mr. President. Today I introduced a  
13 resolution to evaluate what I call Plan  
14 B. Plan B deals with the fact that we as  
15 a nation have come dangerously close to  
16 running out of beds and facilities that  
17 can house patients that are stricken by  
18 the Coronavirus.

19          2020 is a year that none of us  
20 will forget but all of us hope to put  
21 behind us. It is a year that has -- and  
22 yesterday alone there were over 3,100  
23 deaths nationally due to the Coronavirus.  
24 To give you some context of how many that  
25 is, it is more deaths than what resulted



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2 in the 9/11 terrorist attack on the Twin  
3 Towers. To give you further context,  
4 we've reached over 264,000 deaths  
5 nationally. To give you further context,  
6 if you put World War I, the Vietnam War,  
7 the Afghanistan Conflict, and the Iraq  
8 Conflict combined, more people have died  
9 of COVID-19 than all of those wars  
10 combined.

11 I was excited to hear that the  
12 vaccine is being distributed as we speak  
13 in Great Britain and the fact that the  
14 United States may indeed start by the end  
15 of the year distributing to even places  
16 like Philadelphia. I am thankful for our  
17 health czar, Dr. Fauci, and locally  
18 Dr. Farley. They are making us focus on  
19 the science to keep us healthy.

20 But if you're a sports buff  
21 like I am, then you realize that we are  
22 approaching the two-minute warning in the  
23 fourth quarter of this virus. You'll  
24 realize that we are in the fourth leg of  
25 the relay to beat this race. You will

2     realize that we are in the final round of  
3     the fight to defeat COVID in our city.  
4     And for you that are auto racing buffs,  
5     you don't take your foot off the pedal  
6     until you pass the finish line,  
7     Mr. President.

8           So I'm telling Philadelphians  
9     to mask up during these final days of the  
10    COVID-19 crisis. I deal with a lot of  
11    people all the time, and there are all  
12    kinds of conspiracy theories about how  
13    COVID started in a laboratory just to  
14    kill off black and brown people, and I  
15    get all of that. I get those same  
16    conspiracy theories on YouTube and others  
17    on how the vaccine is designed to do  
18    terrible things, but we need to follow  
19    the science.

20           I also hear in barber shops,  
21    often they say, I don't like wearing  
22    masks. Let me tell you something. If  
23    you don't like the mask, you're going to  
24    hate the ventilator. All right?

25           So let's not lighten up,

2   Philadelphia. Let's mask up while we end  
3   this thing and let's look for better days  
4   and better ways, but you stay masked up  
5   until we cross this finish line.

6           Thank you, Mr. President.

7           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8   Thank you, Councilman. You are so right.

9           The Chair recognizes Councilman  
10   Green.

11           COUNCILMAN GREEN: Thank you,  
12   Council President.

13           Thank you, Councilmember Jones,  
14   for those comments. We definitely have  
15   some challenging weeks ahead before we  
16   get into the new year and we start to  
17   receive that distribution of vaccine in  
18   our city, state, and nation.

19           I want to thank and give a  
20   shout-out to my colleague Councilmember  
21   Katherine Gilmore Richardson, who is a  
22   proud graduate of Girls' High, along with  
23   my wife and mother, who are also Girls'  
24   High grads. They are coming to the  
25   rescue. The women are leading. And when

2    you talk about those 43,000 graduates of  
3    John Hallahan High School for Girls, I  
4    would be remiss in not talking about one  
5    of those leaders in our midst in City  
6    Hall, my Chief of Staff, Sharon Vaughn,  
7    who is working with so many other Council  
8    staff to help in the fight to keep  
9    Hallahan open. So thank you,  
10   Councilmember Gilmore Richardson, for  
11   those comments.

12           I just have two other points.  
13   One, today is the International Day of  
14   Disabled People. I want to thank  
15   Disability Pride Philadelphia for hosting  
16   the Thrive Aid - The Art of Protest event  
17   tonight at 7:00 p.m. To get more  
18   information about that event, you can go  
19   to [disabilitypridephiladelphia.org](http://disabilitypridephiladelphia.org) to get  
20   more information. The Thrive Aid really  
21   focuses on a couple major outcomes - to  
22   raise awareness and discussion about  
23   disabled people and the pandemic; to  
24   support disabled people all over the  
25   world with messages of strength,

2   solidarity, and focus anger with  
3   non-violent direct action; to celebrate  
4   disabled people and their achievements;  
5   and to celebrate disability arts  
6   globally.

7           So I want to make that  
8   announcement. I hope as many people that  
9   can participate and support Disability  
10   Pride Philadelphia as possible and the  
11   great work that Vicki Landers and her  
12   team does with that organization.

13           As I was reflecting on some of  
14   the comments made by Councilmembers Domb  
15   and Johnson earlier, I just took a time  
16   to just kind of look through some of my  
17   old e-mails and information about the  
18   real work and leadership that this  
19   legislative body has done really to help  
20   small businesses. We know a lot more  
21   needs to be done, but I wanted to thank  
22   Council President Clarke and  
23   Councilmember Maria Quinones-Sanchez back  
24   in March 12th of this year for the \$85  
25   million transfer ordinance, and of that

2   transfer ordinance, \$7 million was  
3   dedicated to the Philadelphia COVID Small  
4   Business Relief and Grant Fund.

5           I believe just based on my work  
6   with both the National League of Cities  
7   and Pennsylvania Municipal League and  
8   Democratic Municipal Officials probably  
9   one of the first, if not the first,  
10   initiative by a legislative body in this  
11   country to help small businesses.

12           Remember, March 12th was a week  
13   before we actually had the full lockdown  
14   or the beginning of the lockdown here in  
15   the City of Philadelphia and also around  
16   the nation. And out of that \$7 million,  
17   it went to a total of about \$13 million,  
18   another 2 million from Commerce and a  
19   couple other million dollars raised from  
20   private sources, to help small  
21   businesses, and within the first 15 days  
22   of that grant process being open, we at  
23   the City received 7,200 applications,  
24   representing \$146 million.

25           So this was an initiative

2   funded by the quick work of this body to  
3   create a fund to help small businesses  
4   well before the Payroll Protection  
5   Program and even before some of the  
6   initiatives at the state level. And then  
7   throughout the summer working with  
8   Councilmember Squilla, we had hearings in  
9   the joint Finance and Commerce and  
10   Economic Development Committee, and then  
11   we also learned that over the summer that  
12   Governor Wolf and Senator Hughes and I  
13   know Councilmember Parker, our Majority  
14   Leader, helped pull together a number of  
15   us on calls to talk about that initiative  
16   of \$225 million helping small businesses,  
17   and we implored the City to provide  
18   additional dollars to help in that  
19   regard.

20           When we continued having  
21   hearings September 30th, we heard from  
22   Jim Burnett and Dan Betancourt. Many  
23   people know Jim Burnett from the West  
24   Philadelphia Financial Services  
25   Institution and Dan Betancourt is the CEO

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2 of Community First Fund, and they are  
3 both part of a CDFI network. And what  
4 they informed us during that September  
5 30th hearing that was a joint Finance and  
6 Commerce and Economic Development  
7 Committee hearing is that we needed to  
8 put in additional money to help small  
9 businesses to augment the money that  
10 Councilmember Parker told us about as  
11 well as Senator Hughes to provide some  
12 additional resource to help small  
13 businesses here in the City of  
14 Philadelphia.

15 We learned that Montgomery  
16 County put in \$10 million, Pittsburgh had  
17 put in \$20 million, and we still were  
18 just at that \$7 million threshold, and in  
19 a period later the Administration put in  
20 initially 20 and then another \$10 million  
21 of CARES dollars following up with some  
22 of the issues that I and other members of  
23 Council as well as the CDFI advocates  
24 made to help small businesses.

25 And I know that throughout this

2   year, Councilmember Domb had legislation  
3   that we adopted in reference to sidewalk  
4   sales. Councilmember Isaiah Thomas  
5   focused on local bid preferences to help  
6   small businesses during COVID.

7   Councilmember Jones, through his longtime  
8   work in talking about small businesses,  
9   introduced a resolution for hearings on  
10   safe reopening for small businesses. And  
11   I know that Councilmember Domb as well as  
12   Councilmember Johnson have been bringing  
13   together restaurants to talk about these  
14   issues, how they've been impacted by  
15   these issues.

16           And then just this week we had  
17   a Finance Committee hearing and we were  
18   having some questions about relief  
19   measures, and in my office Frank Iannuzzi  
20   and I reached out to the Revenue  
21   Commissioner asking what about some  
22   relief on use and occupancy tax, and we  
23   were set to meet with the Revenue  
24   Commissioner and then we learned a few  
25   days later that the Administration was

2   going to provide some relief on use and  
3   occupancy, because many of our  
4   restaurants are not using all of the  
5   space that they are leasing because of  
6   these measures.

7           So I just want to take a few  
8   moments to kind of give some of that  
9   perspective and thank this body for the  
10   work that you've been doing for small  
11   businesses. And despite all the  
12   challenges that we are seeing, small  
13   businesses are still opening. This past  
14   Saturday in Councilmember Bass's district  
15   a young entrepreneur by the name of Tina  
16   Dixon Spence, a graduate of Central High  
17   School -- sorry, Kathy -- Councilwoman  
18   Gilmore Richardson, but a graduate of  
19   Central High School and Spelman College  
20   opened up a retail boutique at Emlen and  
21   Mount Pleasant called Buddha Babe, and  
22   she's been in business for 2014 but  
23   decided to open up her storefront  
24   business on Small Business Saturday in  
25   spite of all the challenges that are

2   going on because of the pandemic and the  
3   challenges for small businesses.

4           So I just wanted to take a few  
5   moments as I was reflecting on the  
6   comments made by Councilmember Domb and  
7   Johnson and give some perspective on just  
8   really quickly -- because I'm sure  
9   there's a lot of other things that this  
10   body has done in reference to small  
11   businesses that I have not had a chance  
12   to mention, but just a quick recitation  
13   of some things that I remember that this  
14   body has done regarding small businesses,  
15   and I look forward to working with my  
16   colleagues to help all the small  
17   businesses get through this global  
18   pandemic that has also been an economic  
19   crisis in our city.

20           Thank you, Council President.

21           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

22   Thank you, Councilman.

23           The Chair recognizes Councilman  
24   Henon.

25           COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,

2   Council President. I too -- now, I  
3   appreciate -- I too want to reflect a  
4   little bit on what this Council body has  
5   done during the course of the year.  
6   Councilman Green gave a great timeline to  
7   all the hard work that members have been  
8   doing, along with working with the  
9   Administration. And sticking to the  
10  small business conversation, today  
11  particularly we passed a bill that I  
12  introduced with Councilmember Bass and  
13  Councilmember Gym to help stabilize the  
14  restaurant industry, prohibiting the  
15  evictions of restaurants meeting certain  
16  criteria, also providing relief on rental  
17  payments and limiting late fees and other  
18  penalties so they can as well survive  
19  during these difficult times.

20           Councilman Green also noted  
21  some of the hard work that members have  
22  done throughout the course of the year.  
23  Councilman Domb and myself co-introduced  
24  the sidewalk cafe, supported by all  
25  members of Council, was critical to the

2     beginning of some businesses floating to  
3     date as we sit here to date and extended  
4     that another year. Since then,  
5     Councilmember Domb has spearheaded a  
6     small business working group, right,  
7     dealing with the hospitality industry,  
8     which I am a part of and proud of working  
9     with some of the solutions and  
10    recommendations that have been accepted  
11    with our Revenue Department.

12           Just this week, as  
13    Councilmember Green had noted, led by  
14    Councilmember Maria Quinones-Sanchez in  
15    Appropriations Committee working with the  
16    Administration found an additional --  
17    well, procured an additional \$20 million  
18    for small businesses working with the  
19    Department of Commerce and the  
20    Administration in concert with every  
21    member of this City Council as we  
22    approach the holiday season, providing  
23    them with relief. And I know that we as  
24    elected officials will continue to  
25    listen, we will continue to support, and

2   we will continue to find ways for our  
3   small businesses, commercial corridors to  
4   survive and recover through these  
5   difficult times.

6           So I want to thank every member  
7   of City Council. I want to thank the  
8   working groups. I want to thank you,  
9   Council President, for guiding us and  
10   helping working with the Administration  
11   to procure these funds so people do not  
12   go out of business.

13           I am getting a little disturbed  
14   and frightened about the GoFundMe pages  
15   for a lot of our small businesses in our  
16   neighborhoods. That's why I strongly  
17   encourage everyone in Philadelphia,  
18   especially our members, we can use our  
19   social media outlets and PHLCouncil,  
20   strongly encourage everybody to shop and  
21   buy local during these holidays, because  
22   it's the beginning of the holiday season.  
23   People are going to look for us to  
24   support our local businesses, and I  
25   strongly encourage that. And I want to

2    thank you all for your continued support  
3    for the people that we represent.

4           Thank you, Council President.

6    Thank you. Thank you, Councilman.

7           The Chair recognizes  
8    Councilwoman Parker.

9           COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank  
10   you, Mr. President. I want to take this  
11   opportunity to join with you and my  
12   colleagues in sending my sincere respect  
13   and sympathy to members of the Temple  
14   family, Joey Temple's family. A lot of  
15   people met Joey through politics and a  
16   lot of them met him if you were at WHAT  
17   or WDAS radio station, but I met Joey  
18   when I was a young girl -- I know I'm  
19   telling my age -- catching the C bus from  
20   19th and Cheltenham, staying on it until  
21   I got to Broad and Lehigh, getting off  
22   there, Mr. President, taking the 54 bus.  
23   And other people may not know, but you  
24   know, I was getting off at 31st and  
25   Lehigh to go to Big Murt's house where my

2   great-grandmother, my grandfather's  
3   mother, lived and all of my aunts and  
4   uncles, and I have deep routes in that  
5   Strawberry Mansion community. And so  
6   when I first met Joey, it was because he  
7   was always at my family's house when we  
8   were having family cookouts.

9           You know, people say, Cherelle,  
10   you know uptown, right? Yeah. I was in  
11   West Oak Lane, but we come from North  
12   Philly. And let me tell you this, the  
13   best communal sort of block parties, they  
14   were in North Philly on 31st Street with  
15   families coming together, and Joey was  
16   there.

17           So I want to say to you, Joey,  
18   to Mark Temple, Autumn, who is BFFs with  
19   my niece Asia, and another one of their  
20   family members -- and, Curtis Jones, I  
21   know you know this name because these are  
22   the stalwarts from the past, because some  
23   people might think we forget, but I'm  
24   talking about Melba Guy. You all will  
25   remember Melba Guy. That was Joey's

2   aunt.

3           So to that family who has given  
4   so much to Philadelphia, I want you to  
5   know that Joey Temple was a part of us  
6   and we send you our respect.

7           Secondly, I want to say a  
8   special thank you to Councilwoman  
9   Katherine Gilmore Richardson. You know  
10   you are a member of this body now, but  
11   Councilwoman Richardson, you've been  
12   educating me and teaching me since you  
13   were a staffer in this body, the  
14   leadership that I just watched you  
15   display regarding this green recovery  
16   resolution. And to members of the public  
17   in my district, you know I'm a teacher by  
18   profession, so I believe in always giving  
19   credit where credit is due, you know,  
20   documenting, don't plagiarize somebody's  
21   work. I didn't even know what a heat  
22   island was, Councilwoman, but I learned  
23   that because of your work, and I want to  
24   say thank you, and for the Bishop  
25   McDevitt/Hallahan resolution. You and I

2       talked. I had members of my district  
3       particularly up here with the West Oak  
4       Lane Youth Association, Oak Lane Youth  
5       Association, Wildcats, our Ivy Hill. And  
6       I know it's Catholic, and I'm a proud  
7       supporter of public schools, but growing  
8       up in the community I was in, we had  
9       Saint A's, we had Saint Therese.  
10      Hallahan was where you looked forward to.  
11      Dougherty was where people went, and of  
12      course there was Bishop McDevitt. And my  
13      nephew graduates this year, Noah,  
14      Tonyelle's son. And, Councilwoman, while  
15      you are working and leading on this  
16      effort, I hope you will also look at the  
17      Dezzi family, Eleanor and Chris. You  
18      know they've been actively engaged with  
19      the Diocese. And if there's anything I  
20      can be doing, Councilwoman, to help, I  
21      want you to call on me.

22               Finally, I want to mention that  
23      our late Governor Bob Casey -- and many  
24      of us on here, we know him well. He had  
25      a saying relative to elected officials,

2     and he said we would all be held  
3     accountable for, and the question was  
4     what did you do when you had the power?  
5     What did you do when you had the power?  
6     That's from our late Pennsylvania  
7     Governor Rob Casey.

8           Mr. President, I want to say to  
9     you and all members of our legislative  
10    body that last night I had the  
11    opportunity to participate in the  
12    Community Revitalization Award  
13    celebration that was sponsored by a group  
14    that has a long name. It's the  
15    Affordable Housing Centers of  
16    Pennsylvania, but we call them AHCOPA,  
17    and I was there with Executive Director  
18    Ken Bigos, a lot of lenders and realtors,  
19    and all they were talking about,  
20    Mr. President, was the number of  
21    homeowners, new homeowners, in the City  
22    of Philadelphia, Councilmember Squilla,  
23    who could take advantage of Philly First  
24    Home. And then they were saying --  
25    giving us stats, and to Councilman

2       O'Neill and Councilmember Henon and  
3       Quinones-Sanchez, the zip codes that they  
4       read where they had the highest numbers  
5       of people who have purchased those new  
6       houses, they were in our areas.

7           And, Mr. President, I've got to  
8       say this for the record. They were not  
9       in areas or in developments that were  
10      simply new developments for new houses.  
11      They talked about people getting  
12      mortgages in middle neighborhoods,  
13      Councilman Jones, where the houses were  
14      built in the '50s and the '60s, but they  
15      only had one bathroom upstairs. The  
16      electric was old. They needed to be  
17      modernized. And then they talked about  
18      having access to loans from Restore,  
19      Repair, Renew.

20           So I just want to say to my  
21      colleagues that when you put that work in  
22      perspective and you think about the  
23      action, the legislative action, that we  
24      just took here in this body, I know you,  
25      Pennsylvania -- the late Pennsylvania

2   Governor Bob Casey, you would be proud of  
3   this body when you watched what we just  
4   did when we have to answer the question  
5   what did you do when you had the power.  
6   We did this to lower the number of  
7   Philadelphians, and I want to be clear  
8   for the record, who are renters because  
9   they decide to be renters in their own  
10  right. We will not be happy in simply  
11  advocating for rental assistance to keep  
12  people in the constant state of paying  
13  1,500, 1,600, 1,700, sometimes 2,000  
14  dollars to rent a house. And for those  
15  people who couldn't even afford rent  
16  right now, some can't -- people don't  
17  believe this because a lot of people  
18  don't see it -- people are renting rooms.  
19  Families are renting rooms because they  
20  don't have access to the dollars to  
21  actually either rent a home or become  
22  homeowners.

23           So I'm not going to be  
24  satisfied, Mr. President, with people  
25  talking about homeownership versus

2    Philadelphians in Philadelphia and it's  
3    almost at 50/50. I want us back up to  
4    the numbers when we can say despite our  
5    high poverty rate, that Philadelphia had  
6    one of the highest rates of homeownership  
7    amongst all cities in the nation, because  
8    we want our people self-sufficient and we  
9    want them to have the ability to build  
10   wealth the way people like my grandmother  
11   with an 8th grade education, daddy with  
12   limited education but having served in  
13   the circus, and when they moved from  
14   North Philly on uptown like the  
15   Jeffersons, they owned. And it shouldn't  
16   just be them. Everybody has a right to  
17   do it. And special thanks to us for  
18   putting together the plan and you,  
19   Mr. President, for leading that and for  
20   us having the gumption to support it.

21                So thank you so very much,  
22   colleagues. We may agree to disagree on  
23   a whole lot of issues, but I want to  
24   thank each of you for your work. I would  
25   put our body of work against any other

2       municipal legislative body in this  
3       nation, and more important than that, the  
4       sausage making that people don't see  
5       behind the scenes -- and I want the  
6       public to know this -- we can't get  
7       anything done unless we give each other  
8       our words, and when we give our words,  
9       we've got to make our words matter. So  
10      I'm happy that for my colleagues when  
11      they say yes, they say yes, and when you  
12      say no, you say no, and I can go to sleep  
13      and I don't have to worry about you  
14      changing your mind three minutes after  
15      you've given me a yes or a no, because I  
16      know you mean what you say.

17                Thank you, Mr. President.

19      Thank you, Councilwoman. Thank you. The  
20      Philly First is one of the best programs  
21      that we've actually done. Really proud  
22      and happy for those individuals that took  
23      advantage of it.

24                The Chair recognizes Councilman

2 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you,  
3 Council President. I guess I'll start by  
4 echoing the sentiments of my colleague  
5 and Council representative Councilmember  
6 Parker when she talks about the work of  
7 this body. We've been spending a lot of  
8 hours in hearings, and I've tried to  
9 listen to every single piece of testimony  
10 that is a part of any hearing that I'm  
11 in. And I remember being in a hearing  
12 and listening to a witness who happened  
13 to be listening to this Council work, and  
14 she talked about the fact that she was  
15 new to Philadelphia and she was very  
16 impressed with how the body was working,  
17 the work that was being done, and how  
18 unapologetic we were about advocating for  
19 poor people and people of color. And I  
20 think sometimes what happens is when you  
21 hear us say these things day in and day  
22 out, week in and week out but you still  
23 see folks suffering from the Coronavirus  
24 crisis and other crises that we have in  
25 the City, it's just -- it's hard to

2    appreciate the work that's being done and  
3    the things that's being done behind the  
4    scenes, and sometimes our biggest victory  
5    are the things that we prevent from ever  
6    happening to people, which is often  
7    difficult for people to see because  
8    that's not something tangible, it's not  
9    something they could touch.

10           So I do commend Councilmember  
11   Parker and I commend the entire body,  
12   because even when we disagree, you see  
13   people's passion and their intentions as  
14   it relates to representing those who put  
15   them in office.

16           I also want to echo the  
17   sentiments of a lot of my colleagues in  
18   talking about Mr. Joey Temple. I don't  
19   do this often, but Mr. Temple meant a lot  
20   not just to a lot of people in this  
21   Council body but to somebody like me. I  
22   didn't have the traditional entrance into  
23   politics and it wasn't easy for me in the  
24   beginning, and you remember the few  
25   people who were nice to you when you

2 weren't necessarily polished in what it  
3 is that you were trying to do, and he was  
4 one of those people who made an early  
5 impression to me. He was one of those  
6 people who gave me that positive energy  
7 that I needed to kind of continue to  
8 fight the good fight even when I wasn't  
9 putting up the best possible argument for  
10 myself.

11           And so I appreciate and commend  
12 him. Just learning all the different  
13 things he's been a part of, I know the  
14 political scene is one, but Mr. Temple  
15 was very instrumental in the basketball  
16 community as well too, the Sonny Hill  
17 league and a lot of different initiatives  
18 coming up in the basketball scene, and  
19 I'm a big-time sports person. So I just  
20 wanted to just put that out there as a  
21 part of his legacy.

22           Also, the Disadvantaged  
23 Communities Task Force, we will having  
24 our listening session this evening with  
25 representatives from the Third

2       Councilmanic District. I want to thank  
3       my colleagues, Councilmember Sanchez as  
4       well as Councilmember Squilla and the  
5       people of the Seventh and Second  
6       Councilmanic District, because we heard  
7       from them recently and they gave us more  
8       valuable information. And of course  
9       thank you to my Co-Chair, Councilmember  
10      Katherine Gilmore Richardson, and I'm  
11      proud to co-sponsor her bill  
12      supporting -- her resolution supporting  
13      those institutions that are looking to  
14      close.

15                Last, but not least, I want to  
16      close out by congratulating all the  
17      members of the Arts and Culture Task  
18      Force, which was communicated yesterday,  
19      and I want to commend my colleague  
20      Councilmember David Oh that chaired the  
21      Global and Creative Economy for  
22      partnering and working with us to be able  
23      to make this Task Force happen, as well  
24      as Councilmembers Brooks and Gilmore  
25      Richardson, who have been extremely

3       the goal is to put us in a position to  
4       try to advocate for those who feel like  
5       they have had no voice and who are  
6       suffering even more through this

10      everybody, and of course thank you to the  
11      listening public.

12           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13      Thank you, Councilman. Thank you for  
14      that great work that you guys are doing  
15      on the Task Force. Awesome work.

16           I believe that is the last of  
17      speeches on behalf of the minority and  
18      majority. So with that, I'd like to  
19      recognize Councilman Jones for a motion  
20      to adjourn.

21           COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,  
22      Mr. President. I move that Council stand  
23      adjourned until Thursday, December 10th,
