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1 2/20/20 - STATED - INVOCATION

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
3 morning. We're going to get started. If
4 members will take their seats, and any
5 visitors, I'd ask that you please retire
6 behind the rail.

7 Just before we get started, I'd
8 ask that if anyone has a cell phone or
9 any other electronic device that makes
10 any noise, please turn it off or turn it
11 on airplane mode or vibration. We
12 appreciate your cooperation.

13 To give our invocation this
14 morning, the Chair recognizes Pastor
15 Brian Grant of Germantown Christian
16 Assembly Church. He is here today as the
17 guest of Councilwoman Bass.

18 I would ask all guests,
19 visitors, and members to please rise.

20 (Councilmembers, guests, and
21 visitors rise.)

22 PASTOR GRANT: Good morning,
23 everyone.

24 (Good morning.)

25 PASTOR GRANT: It's a pleasure

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2 for me to be here this morning, and I
3 want to thank President Clarke and each
4 Councilmember for the invitation and
5 especially to Councilwoman Bass, to who
6 extended the invitation on your behalf.

7 Let me just say one thing
8 before I give you a brief prayer. I'm
9 not going to be longwinded, but, you
10 know, a man was walking on the beach one
11 morning, and as he walked on the beach,
12 he noticed that every time the tide came
13 in, it left hundreds of starfish on the
14 beach.

15 He decided he's going to do
16 something. So he picked up one of the
17 starfish and he threw it back into the
18 water, because the starfish were laying
19 in the sun dying. And one by one, he
20 started throwing more starfish back into
21 the water.

22 A man passed by him and he
23 said, what are you doing?

24 He said, I'm saving the
25 starfish.

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2 The man said, there's hundreds
3 of starfish out here. The few that you
4 are saving really isn't making any
5 difference. You're really not making any
6 impact.

7 The man didn't say anything.
8 He picked up one more starfish. He threw
9 it into the water. He said, it sure made
10 a difference to that one.

11 And, you know, sometimes I'm
12 sure in the work you do, sometimes you
13 might become discouraged. You're trying
14 to save the City. And sometimes you're
15 discouraged that all that you hope to see
16 happen has not happened, but my God
17 encourage you that every life you touch,
18 every life you have impacted, you have
19 sure made a difference to that starfish.

20 And so I just want to let you
21 know that you are making a difference,
22 and may God bless you as you continue to
23 serve our city.

24 Let us pray.

25 Heavenly Father, we come to you

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2 today with a heavy heart, for despite the
3 efforts of this Council, despite the
4 efforts of so many officials in our land,
5 our nation is filled with division and
6 violence.

7 Lord, in this time of
8 challenge, keep us reminded of the words
9 of Solomon, that righteousness makes a
10 nation great, but that sin will destroy
11 any people.

12 We, therefore, pray that you
13 will turn the hearts of our nation
14 towards you and that you will give us a
15 desire to seek after righteousness.

16 And, Lord, in this age of rage,
17 may each of us pursue peace. As our
18 master said, Lord, help us to even love
19 our enemies.

20 May we be challenged by the
21 words of Saint Francis of Assisi when he
22 said, Lord, make me an instrument of your
23 peace. Where there is hatred, let me so
24 love. Where there is injury, pardon.
25 Where there is doubt, faith. Where there

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2 is despair, hope. Where there is
3 darkness, light. Where there is sadness,
4 joy.

5 Oh, grant that we may not seek
6 to be consoled as to console, to be
7 understood as to be understood, to be
8 loved as to love, for it is in giving
9 that we receive. It is in pardoning that
10 we are pardoned. It is in dying that we
11 are born again to eternal life.

12 Heavenly Father, I ask that you
13 bless each member of this City Council in
14 a special way. Meet their needs as only
15 you can. Endue them with wisdom and
16 guide them to discern your will.

17 We pray in the name of Christ,
18 our savior.

19 Amen.

20 (Amen.)

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

22 Thank you so much, Pastor, for those
23 inspiring words.

24 Council will be at ease.

25 (Council at ease.)

1 2/20/20 - STATED - APPROVAL OF JOURNAL

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3 Thank you. And, again, thank you,
4 Pastor, for those inspiring words.

5 Our next order of business is
6 the approval of the Journal of the
7 meeting of Thursday, February 13, 2020,
8 and the Chair recognizes Councilman
9 Jones.

10 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
11 Mr. President. I move that the Journal
12 for the meeting of Thursday, February 13,
13 2020 be approved.

14 (Duly seconded.)

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
16 Thank you. It has been moved and
17 properly seconded that the Journal of the
18 meeting of Thursday, February 13, 2020
19 stand approved.

20 All those in favor say aye.

21 (Aye.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Those opposed?

24 (No response.)

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The

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2 ayes have it, and that Journal is
3 approved.

4 Our next order of business is
5 requests for leave of absence, and the
6 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Parker.

7 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
8 you, Mr. President. On behalf of members
9 of Council, there are no requests for
10 leaves of absence today.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
12 Chair thanks the gentle lady.

13 At this time, I would like to
14 dispense with the regular order of
15 business and I would like to thank
16 everyone who has taken time out of their
17 busy day to come to witness their
18 government in action. We hope your stay
19 here today is a knowledgeable one but,
20 more importantly, a pleasurable one, so
21 much so that you come back again. So,
22 again, thank you so much for being here.

23 At this time, the Chair
24 recognizes Councilman Jones, who will
25 present a resolution recognizing living

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2 legends. Would Judge Frederica
3 Massiah-Jackson and those accompanying
4 her please join the Councilman at the
5 podium.

6 (Councilmembers and guests
7 approached podium.)

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
9 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Parker.

10 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
11 you, Mr. President. While everyone is
12 moving forward, I just wanted to note for
13 the record that if you look to my right,
14 you will see that there are a bunch of
15 ladies in pink and green sitting here.
16 These are the ladies of the Omega Omega
17 Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority,
18 Incorporated. They are here to support
19 their sorer and our history-making judge,
20 Frederica Massiah-Jackson, and they will
21 also, Councilman Johnson, be staying for
22 the special hearing this afternoon on gun
23 violence, because it's an issue that
24 they've worked on.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: All

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2 right. Thank you.

3 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
4 you, Mr. President.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
6 thank you so much, ladies, for being here
7 today. Thank you for your service.

8 Joining the Councilman, we have
9 Councilwoman Bass, Councilwoman Gilmore
10 Richardson, Councilman Johnson,
11 Councilwoman Parker, Councilwoman
12 Gauthier, and Councilman Johnson.

13 COUNCILMAN JONES: Are we
14 almost there?

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
16 Councilman, hold on one second.
17 Councilman, before we start, I'd like a
18 chance to recognize a very special person
19 to all of us.

20 Councilwoman Blackwell, you
21 didn't think you were going to sneak in
22 here without being noticed? Councilwoman
23 Jannie Blackwell, how you doing?

24 (Applause.)

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

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2 Thank you.

3 Proceed, Councilman, sir.

4 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
5 Mr. President.

6 History is not the story if
7 only others tell it. It is his story.
8 The living legends recognition is made
9 because sometimes people are so busy
10 making history, that they don't take the
11 time to look up and smell the roses and
12 see the accomplishments and things that
13 they have done. What we want to do is
14 recognize those individuals annually that
15 are really making a difference.

16 A life is only measured by the
17 impact it has on other lives, said Jackie
18 Robinson. And that's a true statement
19 then; it's a true statement now. And the
20 living legends that we're going to
21 recognize today live by that. It doesn't
22 matter their field of endeavor. Whether
23 it is in education, whether it is in
24 music, whether it is in the halls of
25 justice in City Hall, they are making a

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2 difference in other people's lives every
3 single day.

4 Give them a round of applause.

5 (Applause.)

6 COUNCILMAN JONES: So today we

7 are going to recognize Georgio Cojulun.

8 I always just called him Georgio.

9 Dr. Naomi Johnson-Booker, the Honorable

10 Frederica Massiah-Jackson in the halls of

11 city justice. Give her a round of

12 applause too.

13 (Applause.)

14 COUNCILMAN JONES: As well as

15 our own Lynette Brown-Sow.

16 (Applause.)

17 COUNCILMAN JONES: And

18 Constance Clayton. All of these

19 individuals who are living legends have

20 made a difference in the lives of others

21 and are continuing to do that.

22 So, therefore...

23 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Whereas,

24 Lynette Brown-Sow, point of personal

25 privilege, lady of Delta Sigma Theta

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2 Sorority, Incorporated, Philadelphia
3 Alumnae Chapter.

4 With that being said, Lynette
5 Brown-Sow is a well-known leader in the
6 education and behavioral health
7 communities in Philadelphia. In her role
8 as the Vice President of Marketing and
9 Government Relations with the Community
10 College of Philadelphia, Ms. Brown-Sow
11 worked diligently at both local and
12 national levels to ensure education for
13 all. She worked with the American
14 Association of Community Colleges, as
15 well as the White House, to support
16 tuition-free programs at community
17 colleges and maintenance of funding for
18 Federal Pell Grants. Ms. Brown-Sow also
19 served as the Chair of the Board of
20 Directors for The Consortium, a
21 behavioral healthcare organization that
22 pioneered the strategy of balancing the
23 input of community leaders and medical
24 experts to expand access to
25 patient-centered behavioral healthcare

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models into individual neighborhoods.

After 22 years with Community College of Philadelphia, Ms. Brown-Sow returned to her path of entrepreneurship as manager of L.M. Brown Management Group, a consultant firm she founded in 1980 that provides a range of professional services; and

COUNCILMAN GREEN: As the son of a retired Philadelphia school teacher and as a parent of a son who has only been educated in the School District of Philadelphia, it gives me great pride and joy to read the next honoree.

Whereas, Dr. Constance Clayton has been recognized on numerous occasions for her contributions to Philadelphia's education system. She began her career in 1955 as an elementary school teacher with the School District of Philadelphia at the former William H. Harrison School. In 1973, she became the first Director and then Associate Superintendent of the Early Childhood Program for the School

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2 District. In 1982, she was the first
3 African American person to serve as the
4 Superintendent of the School District of
5 Philadelphia. Her work as Superintendent
6 was characterized by her reputation for
7 tackling the District's most difficult
8 budgetary crises without cutting, without
9 cutting student services, and for
10 partnering with the businesses to secure
11 resources and center the community around
12 education. Dr. Clayton has been awarded
13 numerous honors for her service to the
14 education system, including becoming the
15 first African American woman to have a
16 professorship named for her at an Ivy
17 League institution when the University of
18 Pennsylvania established the Constance E.
19 Clayton Professorship in Urban Education
20 in 1992; and

21 COUNCILWOMAN GAUTHIER: Before
22 I read the passage of Greg Pac Cojulun, I
23 just want to say that I've had the
24 benefit of knowing Mr. Greg for many
25 years. He's a change-maker and a leader

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2 in the Third District, and we've all been
3 made better by his efforts.

4 Whereas, Gregorio Pac Cojulun
5 has served his community for over 30
6 years, first as a block captain for the
7 5000 block of Osage Avenue, and then as
8 President of the Friends of Malcolm X
9 Park organization. As the President of
10 the organization since 1997, Mr. Cojulun
11 spearheaded the transformation of Malcolm
12 X Park, formerly Black Oak Park. Mr.
13 Cojulun has worked tirelessly to make the
14 park a point of pride for the community
15 through initiatives like the Annual Jazz
16 Heritage Series, where the park hosts
17 free concerts featuring local jazz
18 artists on evenings throughout the
19 summer, as well as the biannual Love Your
20 Park Day. He was also awarded the annual
21 Governor's Award for Outstanding Citizen
22 in Crime Prevention for his stewardship
23 of the park. Mr. Cojulun continues to
24 serve as a community anchor in West
25 Philadelphia, as well as the City

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2 at-large; and

3 COUNCILWOMAN RICHARDSON: And
4 I'd also like to take a point of personal
5 privilege to thank Councilmember Jones
6 for allowing me to read the whereas
7 clause in honor of the daughter of my
8 esteemed triumphant soror of Zeta Phi
9 Beta Sorority, Incorporated, Audrey
10 Johnson-Thornton, who is President
11 Emeritus of Belmont Mansion, and we thank
12 her for her service and we miss her.

13 Whereas, Dr. Naomi
14 Johnson-Booker is the Founder and Chief
15 Executive Officer of the Global
16 Leadership Academy Charter School and has
17 worked for more than 40 years in the
18 field of public education. Dr. Naomi
19 Johnson-Booker started her career in
20 education as a teacher with the School
21 District of Philadelphia. She then went
22 on to become a principal and an area
23 superintendent, before retiring from the
24 District in 2004. Dr. Johnson-Booker
25 went on to become the Regional Vice

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2 President of the Keystone Alliance for
3 Public Charter Schools, where she served
4 until she formed the Global Leadership
5 Academy in 2007. Dr. Johnson-Booker has
6 received numerous awards and honors for
7 her work in education, including an honor
8 by the White House Initiative for
9 Education Excellence in 2014, as well as
10 Philadelphia Martin Luther King, Jr.
11 Association for Non-Violence Salute to
12 Greatness Educational Award in 2015; and

13 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: And
14 whereas, the Honorable Frederica A.
15 Massiah-Jackson is a remarkable and
16 accomplished jurist who has spent her
17 career serving the people of Philadelphia
18 in numerous ways. Judge Massiah-Jackson
19 obtained her Juris Doctorate degree from
20 the University of Pennsylvania at only 23
21 years old and went on to clerk for
22 Justice Robert N.C. Nix on the
23 Pennsylvania Supreme Court from 1974
24 until 1976. In 1983, she was elected to
25 the Philadelphia Court of Common Pleas

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2 after working for 7 years at the
3 Philadelphia firm Blank Rome. From 2001
4 to 2006, she sat as the President Judge
5 of the Court of Common Pleas. And in
6 addition to her judicial service, Judge
7 Massiah-Jackson has also served as an
8 educator, teaching legal studies and
9 business law at the Wharton School of the
10 University of Pennsylvania; and now,
11 therefore

12 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: And just
13 taking a moment of personal privilege, I
14 just want to acknowledge some individuals
15 who helped me become the person who I am
16 today. I remember when I first wanted to
17 run for public office, I remember sitting
18 down and talking to the Honorable
19 Frederica Massiah-Jackson, and I want to
20 just personally thank you for your words
21 of encouragement. And I remember as a
22 young man attending Childs Elementary
23 School and Barrett Junior High School,
24 and that was under the leadership of
25 Constance Clayton. And I remember when

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2 we were growing up, the teachers would
3 show up at your house when you weren't
4 behaving, because they cared. I remember
5 if there was a snowstorm, you were still
6 coming to school to learn. That was in
7 the leadership and caring compassion of
8 Constance Clayton, one of the best
9 superintendents in the history of
10 Philadelphia. And most of you may or may
11 not know, under the leadership of my
12 former, I like to say, the late, great
13 Hardy Williams and his political
14 organization, I had a mentor who was the
15 field general who taught me the art of
16 political organizing in the field, and if
17 you ever see me out on the street and
18 wonder why I'm always going door to door
19 and talking to the neighbors, it was
20 under her leadership and she was the
21 enforcer to make sure that I had my ward
22 book together, made sure I knew my
23 committee people and my block captains
24 and, most importantly, made sure I knew
25 the people, and as a result, I am 5 and 0

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2 as it relates to elections in terms of me
3 being a State Representative and the
4 first African American representing the
5 Second District in City Council, and
6 that's my mentor, Lynette Brown-Sow.

7 And so I just want to take a
8 moment to acknowledge them for their
9 dedication in helping me become the
10 person who I am today. And I will be
11 remiss if I didn't acknowledge Dr. Naomi
12 Johnson-Booker for just her hard work and
13 dedication to make sure all young people,
14 all young people receive a quality
15 education regardless of their
16 neighborhood and/or their zip code.

17 Be it resolved, by the Council
18 of the City of Philadelphia, that we
19 hereby honor and celebrate Philadelphia's
20 Living Legends: Lynette Brown-Sow,
21 Dr. Constance Clayton, also I call him
22 Mr. Greg because he runs Malcolm X Park.
23 He's always out there on the ground
24 making sure that the people in that part
25 of West Philadelphia are supported.

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2 Dr. Naomi Johnson-Booker, and the
3 Honorable Frederica Massiah-Jackson, who
4 are leaders in Philadelphia in their
5 respective fields of behavioral health,
6 education, art, music and the justice
7 system as part of the commemoration of
8 Black History Month.

9 Further resolved, that an
10 engrossed copy of this resolution be
11 presented to these Living Legends as
12 further evidence of the sincere respect
13 of this legislative body.

14 And we say congratulations.
15 (Applause.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
17 the Chair recognizes the Honorable
18 Frederica Massiah-Jackson for remarks.

19 JUDGE MASSIAH-JACKSON: Well,
20 good morning, Council President Darrell
21 Clarke, Councilman Curtis Jones, and to
22 all the Councilmembers who introduced
23 this resolution, to all those who
24 sponsored this resolution, and to all
25 those who supported this amazing

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2 resolution, we hope it was unanimous.

3 I extend on behalf of all five
4 living legends of the year 2020, I extend
5 our sincere thanks and appreciation on
6 behalf of Lynette Brown-Sow,
7 Dr. Constance Clayton, Mr. Gregory,
8 Dr. Naomi Johnson-Booker, and myself. We
9 are so proud and delighted to be here
10 this morning surrounded by family and so
11 many friends in this City Council
12 Chambers. And a special shout-out to all
13 the pink and green friends who are here
14 today.

15 (Applause.)

16 JUDGE MASSIAH-JACKSON: We are
17 here today to celebrate Black History
18 Month and to acknowledge our Philadelphia
19 communities.

20 This City Council has
21 demonstrated leadership under the
22 auspices of President Clarke, and we
23 applaud you. Each of us as living
24 legends work in the communities of
25 Philadelphia in education or in the arts

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2 or music or the courts or a combination
3 of these. We believe in this city. We
4 believe in the people of Philadelphia all
5 12 months of the year. And, again, thank
6 you on behalf of all of us.

7 Thank you.
8 (Applause.)

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
10 Council will be at ease.

11 (Council at ease.)

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
13 Thank you and, again, congratulations.

14 At this time, the Chair
15 recognizes Councilwoman Bass, who will
16 present a resolution recognizing the
17 Reverend Robert H. Paul and the Sheet
18 Metal Workers Union Local 19.

19 Would Reverend Paul and those
20 accompanying him please join the
21 Councilwoman at the podium.

22 (Councilmembers and guests
23 approached podium.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
25 joining Councilwoman Bass, we have

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2 Councilman Squilla, Councilman Oh,
3 Councilman Henon, Councilwoman Gilmore
4 Richardson, Councilwoman Gauthier,
5 Councilman Jones. You guys coming up?
6 And Councilmen Green and Johnson.

7 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
8 morning.

9 (Good morning.)

10 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
11 morning.

12 (Good morning.)

13 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: It's really
14 just such an honor for me to be here with
15 Reverend Paul, who is not just a
16 minister, not just a strong supporter and
17 member of the Sheet Metal Workers Union,
18 but who has been a friend and who has
19 been a pastor or been "the" pastor at the
20 Piney Grove Baptist Church in my
21 district, in the Eighth District, for a
22 long time now.

23 We want to thank Pastor Paul.
24 We want to recognize him. And he spent
25 so much time lifting us up in the

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2 community and lifting up our neighbors
3 and our friends and the whole entire City
4 of Philadelphia, that we thought it was
5 time that we did something to recognize
6 him for all of the outstanding work that
7 he does on our behalf.

8 I know that when I need just a
9 little more Jesus, that's who I call. I
10 call Pastor Paul. Because in this job,
11 in this business, when we're out here, we
12 need to be prayed up. I believe in the
13 power of prayer. And so I am just
14 honored to have Pastor Paul here with us
15 today.

16 And so the resolution reads:
17 Recognizing and honoring the Reverend
18 Robert H. Paul and the Sheet Metal
19 Workers Union Local 19 for over 15 years
20 of commitment and dedication to the Piney
21 Grove Baptist Church Tutorial Program and
22 their commitment to the surrounding
23 community.

24 Whereas, Reverend Robert H.
25 Paul for the past 32 years has been a

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2 Pastor/Teacher at the Piney Grove Baptist
3 Church known as "The Lighthouse of
4 Logan"; and

5 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: I also
6 want to take a moment to acknowledge Gary
7 Masino and his team from the Sheet Metal
8 Workers Union for their commitment to
9 diversity and inclusion. Again, we're
10 the number one big city when it comes to
11 poverty, and so in order for us to move
12 forward, it's going to take for all of us
13 to focus and make a commitment to
14 diversity and inclusion so everyone can
15 participate in the great growth in this
16 City of Philadelphia.

17 Whereas, Reverend Robert H.
18 Paul is a servant indeed by serving on
19 the Logan Improvement Association,
20 Evening Baptist Ministers Conference of
21 Philadelphia and Vicinity, Missionary
22 Baptist Pastor's Conference, The Black
23 Clergy of Philadelphia, The Philadelphia
24 Council of Clergy, The Greater
25 Philadelphia Baptist Association and the

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2 National Baptist Convention of United
3 States of America; and

4 Whereas, in 1973, Reverend
5 Robert H. Paul was first employed with
6 the Sheet Metal Workers Union Local 19.
7 Within four years, Reverend Robert H.
8 Paul received the Apprentice of the Year
9 Award and was awarded a two-year
10 scholarship to sketching school; and

11 COUNCILMAN OH: Whereas, with
12 the help of former Presidents, Mr. Tom
13 Kelley, Mr. Joe Sellers, and current
14 President, Mr. Gary Masino, Reverend
15 Robert H. Paul has led the Piney Grove
16 Tutorial Program; and

17 Whereas, the Piney Grove
18 Tutorial Program is a 12-week training
19 program that prepares its students to
20 take the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational
21 Aptitude Battery) Test. After passing
22 this test, an interview is granted, then
23 an opportunity is extended to that
24 student an apprenticeship into the Union;
25 and

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2 COUNCILWOMAN RICHARDSON:

3 Whereas, the Piney Grove Baptist Church
4 Tutorial Program is open to all men and
5 women regardless of ethnic background or
6 education levels or having had past
7 incarcerations; and

8 Whereas, the Piney Grove
9 Baptist Church Tutorial Program's success
10 over the years has been 60 percent
11 minority and 20 percent female acceptance
12 into the apprentice program; and

13 COUNCILMAN JONES: And whereas,
14 the Piney Grove Baptist Church Tutorial
15 Program and the leadership of President
16 Mr. Gary Masino, the Sheet Metal Workers
17 Union Local 19 are the second best --
18 recount -- second best minority
19 participation union in Philadelphia; and

20 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Whereas,
21 Reverend Robert Paul and the Sheet Metal
22 Workers Union Local 19 have continued to
23 give back to the Logan community
24 including the homeless, seniors, sick and
25 shut in, Logan Elementary School, Piney

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2 Grove Day Care, the 35th Police District
3 and Firefighters from Ogontz and
4 Champlost Avenue Firehouse by sponsoring
5 the Annual Thanksgiving Dinner and
6 Christmas baskets; and

7 COUNCILWOMAN GAUTHIER:

8 Whereas, for the past 5 years, Reverend
9 Robert H. Paul and the Sheet Metal
10 Workers Union Local 19 have contributed
11 backpacks filled with school supplies to
12 the Logan Elementary School, Piney Grove
13 Day Care, school students, children of
14 the church and neighborhoods; and

15 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Whereas, to
16 recognize the Reverend Robert H. Paul's
17 contribution to the Union, the Sheet
18 Metal Workers Union Local 19 elected him
19 a Trustee in 2000 and in 2005 was elected
20 to the Executive Board. He has worked as
21 a part-time Recruitment Officer and now a
22 full-time Recruitment Officer. This
23 afforded him the opportunity to
24 participate in Job Fairs in public and
25 parochial schools, churches, community

15 a starship -- starfish. I ruined it.
16 Everybody is a starfish. Because he

19 building trades, but the communities that
20 he serves.

21 So whereas, after 46 years of
22 being a part of the Sheet Metal Union
23 Local 19, the passion and the commitment
24 continues with him now and will in the
25 future; now, therefore be it

7 All those in favor say aye.
8 (Aye.)

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

10 Those opposed?

11 (No response.)

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
13 ayes have it, and these bills will be
14 placed on our First Reading Calendar
15 today.

16 The Chair now again recognizes
17 Councilwoman Parker for a report from the
18 Committee on Labor and Civil Service.

19 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank

17 CHIEF CLERK: Joe Danihel,
18 commenting on 200154.

19 (Witness approached podium.)

20 MR. DANIHEL: Good morning.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
22 morning.

23 MR. DANIHEL: This is an
24 official decree of the people in writ of
25 mandamus quo warranto and, as such,

3 Every week, Council, Mayor,
4 Governor, and others transfer private
5 property to the government, probably
6 unlawfully.

7 Martin Luther King knew a

10 so that all people would have secure
11 houses, persons, and effects.

12 Even the most diverse City
13 Council ever, corruption and oath
14 violating appears even worse than ever.
15 This Cain versus Abel form of brotherly
16 love and sisterly affection steals homes,
17 sends children to dangerous schools,
18 fails to secure the houses, persons, and
19 effects of the people.

20 This difficult plague of
21 corruption requires prosecution. Laws
22 are like Bibles. Unless they are
23 followed, nothing changes.

24 The constitutions require
25 immediate remedy of this breach of law,

2 breach of close, breach of fiduciary
3 duty. Your oath of office requires you
4 to act or face prison.

5 42 USC 1982, 1983, 1985, 1986,
6 1987; 18 USC 241, 242, 2381, 2384; PA
7 Constitution, Article I, Sections 1
8 through 28; 26 PA CSA 703, 705, 708, 709,
9 711, 712, 713, 716, 902, and other laws
10 listed in SCOTUS 15-8965, 14-1330,
11 14-4056 appear violated.

12 I call on the federal and
13 Commonwealth governments to perform their
14 constitutional obligations to investigate
15 and prosecute all involved in the theft
16 and illegal deed transfer of my home,
17 1038 West Wyoming Avenue.

18 The denial of God-given 42 USC
19 1982 property rights for 26 years is
20 egregious, extraordinary, oath-violating,
21 and requires immediate remedy.

22 A just government must obey the
23 rule of law. This color of law
24 government must have its Charter to
25 govern revoked until a constitutionally

2 compliant government is installed.

3 Public servants cannot refuse
4 their sworn duty to act any more than a
5 fireman can refuse to fight a fire.

6 The sovereign people require
7 oath, Constitution, and law be enforced,
8 and jail is required for all who violate
9 oath, Constitution or law.

10 I remind Council, it takes a
11 lot of cooperation to create and allow
12 all of this monumental corruption.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 Thank you so much for your testimony.

15 CHIEF CLERK: David Pearl,
16 commenting on 200040 and 200006.

17 (Witness approached podium.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
19 morning.

20 MR. PEARL: Good morning still.

21 I made it by three minutes. My name is
22 David Pearl. I am here as a
23 representative from the State of
24 Pennsylvania to the National Legislative
25 Council in Washington, DC for the VFW. I

am one of two in the State of Pennsylvania that has this appointment. I answer only to our commander of the VFW, Doc Schmitz, and our VFW legislative office in Washington, DC.

The VFW has over 1.6 million members, with over 72,000 of them from the State of Pennsylvania. This would mean and translate to close to 60,000 veterans that are in Philadelphia. We have most of them as members of our VFW.

I want to give you some more numbers. In the U.S., 7.5 of the population are veterans. That's one out of every 15. In the State of Pennsylvania, 10 percent are veterans, one out of every ten. In PA counties all over throughout the state, 10 percent are veterans, but in Philadelphia, it's only 4 percent. That's four out of 100 are veterans.

I've also been told that of the City workers, only 1.8 of them are veterans. That's two out of 100. And

2 out of the veterans that applied for City
3 jobs, only 1.5 of them out of 100.

4 My mission today comes from, as
5 I said, my boss, the commander of the
6 VFW, Doc Schmitz. It is a simple one
7 and, that is, first to support our
8 veterans in any way that is possible.
9 Second is to listen to what happens here
10 and to report. And the last is, two
11 weeks I will be storming the Hill and
12 talking to all our national level
13 Congressmen and Senators, and this
14 information will certainly come up, what
15 transpires here in Philadelphia. So
16 don't think the world is not listening,
17 at least our world.

18 Our mission as Legislative
19 Council members is to talk with our
20 members, get their input on what they
21 think is important, and to protect the
22 rights of veterans throughout the
23 country. We don't only work for VFW
24 members. We work for all veterans.

25 Lastly, I would be remiss if I

3 Obdulio Soto, III. I want to thank you
4 all for the opportunity to speak today.

5 I'm a Hispanic veteran, a
6 veteran, and I'm opposed to extending the
7 extra civil service points to anyone who
8 has not sacrificed for our greater good.

9 My opposition to the change in
10 the Charter of the extra points isn't
11 intended out of malice, but rather out of
12 respect for our brothers and sisters, our
13 fallen brothers and sisters; that is,
14 people like my cousin, Detective Lisa
15 Rosato of the NYPD, who ultimately paid
16 for our safety with her life at just 51
17 years old.

18 My cousin Lisa passed away
19 almost a year ago due to complications
20 related to her risk being a first
21 responder on 9/11. Her family has local
22 roots in the City, much like many of our
23 veterans. They didn't ask for these
24 extra points, but as a civilized society,
25 I feel that we owe it to them and to them
