20 COUNCILMAN DiCICCO: Thank you,
21 Madam President, and good morning,
22 everyone. I have a resolution honoring
23 and congratulating the Settlement Music
24 School on its 100th anniversary and
25 recognizing and commending its directors,

2 officers, faculty, staff and students,
3 both past and present, for making the
4 Settlement Music School an institution
5 known worldwide for its excellence.

6 Whereas, Settlement Music
7 School originated in 1908 at the College
8 Settlement House in the Southwark section
9 of South Philadelphia where Jeanette
10 Selig Frank and Blanche Wolf Kohn, two
11 volunteers, offered piano lessons to the
12 immigrant community for five cents per
13 lesson;

14 COUNCILMAN JONES: Whereas, the
15 school has grown steadily and today has
16 six branches throughout the Philadelphia
17 region, serving 16,000 students annually
18 and 300,000 students over the hundred
19 years of service through on-site and
20 special programs;

21 Whereas, Settlement's mission
22 is to provide children and adults in the
23 Philadelphia region with high-quality
24 instruction and activity in music and
25 related arts, and serve the broadest

2 possible constituency, regardless of
3 race, age, gender, color or creed,
4 national origin, physical disability and
5 ability to pay;

6 Whereas, Settlement distributes
7 two million in financial aid annually to
8 families in need;

9 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Whereas,
10 Settlement Music School's core program
11 provides individual and class instruction
12 in all instruments, voice and theory,
13 Suzuki, Music Workshop, Fundamentals of
14 Music and ensembles and dance. The
15 school also offers special programs for
16 senior adults, students with
17 disabilities, outreach programs with area
18 preschools, daycare centers, charter and
19 independent schools, and summer programs;

20 Whereas, the school developed
21 the nationally recognized Kaleidoscope
22 Preschool Arts Enrichment Program, an
23 arts-based pre-kindergarten program for
24 underserved, inner-city children offered
25 virtually tuition free, and the Teacher

3 and students, both past and present, for
4 making Settlement Music School an
5 institution known worldwide for its
6 excellence.

21 MR. CAPANNA: Thank you very
22 much. It's a great pleasure and honor to
23 be before City Council on such a happy
24 occasion as the hundredth anniversary of
25 Settlement Music School. When I hear the

10 introduction, because she is a radio
11 star. She's the roving reporter on NPR's
12 From the Top and has been studying at
13 Settlement Music School since she was 6
14 years old. And she has a very brief
15 Paganini "Caprice" to play for you.

9 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you.
10 This is a resolution in solemn
11 recognition during the week of May 2
12 through May 9, 2008 as the Annual
13 Remembrance of the Six Million Jewish
14 Martyrs who perished during the
15 Holocaust.

16 Whereas, over half a century
17 ago, six million Jews were murdered in
18 the Nazi Holocaust as part of a
19 systematic program of genocide, and
20 millions of other people suffered as
21 victims of Nazism; and

22 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,
23 the people of the City of Philadelphia
24 should continually rededicate themselves
25 to the principle of equal justice for all

2 people; and

3 Whereas, the people of the City
4 of Philadelphia should remain eternally
5 vigilant against all tyranny and
6 recognize that bigotry provides a
7 breeding ground for tyranny to flourish;
8 and

9 Whereas, the Memorial Committee
10 for the six million Jewish martyrs has
11 chosen as the theme for this year's
12 memorial, "As the Branches of This Tree,
13 So the Branches of Our People: Remember
14 the Children." We applaud the Committee
15 for the honor they have bestowed on the
16 memory of those who perished and on those
17 who survived to build and strengthen life
18 in Philadelphia and other communities;
19 now therefore

20 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Resolved,
21 by the Council of the City of
22 Philadelphia, that by virtue of this
23 citation, we hereby recognize the week of
24 May 2 through May 9, 2008 as the Annual
25 Remembrance of the Six Million Jewish

3 Further resolved, we recognize
4 the horror of the Holocaust and extend to
5 the Memorial Committee the respect and
6 admiration of this legislative body.

7 A true and correct copy of the
8 original resolution, adopted by the

10 the 27th day of March 2008. Signed by
11 the President of City Council, Anna C.
12 Verna, and co-sponsored by every
13 Councilmember.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
16 Chair recognizes Ms. Gocial for remarks.

17 MS. GOCIAL: Good morning. On
18 behalf of the Jewish Community Relations
19 Council of the Federation of Greater
20 Philadelphia, I am pleased to be here
21 today to receive the City Council
22 resolution recognizing Sunday, May 4th as
23 the day of remembrance for the six
24 million martyrs of the Holocaust. We
25 thank Council President Anna Verna,

2 Councilman Brian O'Neill and members of
3 City Council for this recognition.

4 This year's memorial will focus
5 on the one and a half million innocent
6 children massacred at the hands of the
7 Nazis. Their stories, perhaps more than
8 any others, tug at our hearts. Yet in
9 the midst of turmoil and deprivation,
10 there were those who rose to a higher
11 level. There was such a person in
12 Theresienstadt, the model camp built by
13 the Nazis. At its peak, over 53,000
14 persons were crowded into a very small
15 area. Due to the overcrowding, absence
16 of sanitation and malnutrition, disease
17 spread so quickly that the death rate was
18 over 50 percent in 1942, and yet in this
19 living hell, there were moments of great
20 strength and courage.

21 Irma Lauscher was a school
22 teacher who was determined to teach the
23 children of Theresienstadt the meaning of
24 sedaka. Irma told the children that
25 sedaka means righteousness, and on the

2 Festival of the Trees, TuBishvat, 1942,
3 they would understand what this really
4 meant.

5 Mrs. Lauscher enlisted the help
6 of a friendly guard to bring her a tree
7 seedling. The next day the guard
8 presented her with a seedling about four
9 inches high. The children and
10 Mrs. Lauscher planted the tree in the
11 children's quarters. She told them that
12 this tree seedling needed water and sun
13 to grow. She asked each of the children
14 to give up a portion of their water each
15 day so the living plant could be
16 nourished and thrive.

17 Can you imagine asking children
18 to give up a portion of their daily water
19 when their ration was so small? But they
20 did.

21 When Irma died, she was buried
22 beneath her tree, which stood 30 feet
23 tall. The tree in Theresienstadt was
24 dying when cuttings were taken from it
25 and brought to the United States.

2 On Sunday, May 4th, the City of
3 Philadelphia will be the recipient of one
4 of the these cuttings, one of only ten
5 cities in the United States to be so
6 honored. When the seedling is large
7 enough, it will be planted at the site of
8 the Holocaust Memorial as a symbol of
9 humanity and reverence for life. It is
10 our hope that future generations will
11 continue the work that Irma Lauscher
12 began 66 years ago.

13 We very much appreciate the
14 City of Philadelphia for continuing to
15 support our efforts.

19 MS. HYDE: Good morning. On
20 behalf of more than 1.9 million members
21 in Pennsylvania of AARP, I want to thank
22 you all for this great honor.

23 Today kicks off our 50th
24 anniversary celebration in this City.
25 There are a great number of events that

2 we have planned. Tomorrow there will be
3 a "Celebrate Age" expo in partnership
4 with CASA at Harrah's Casino. On Monday,
5 May 5th, we're going to have a reception
6 to honor certain dignitaries, et cetera,
7 at the Westin Hotel.

8 On Tuesday, May 6th, we have a
9 Legacy Award School Recognition Program,
10 and that will be given at Central High
11 School. They are the recipient of that
12 award.

13 On Wednesday, May 7th, we have
14 an innovation award for a school
15 recognition, and that will be given to
16 Norristown High School.

17 On Thursday, May 8th, we will
18 participate in Day of Service with
19 Rebuilding Together Philadelphia. We'll
20 have a lot of our volunteers
21 participating in that event.

22 On Friday, May 9th is
23 Washington Week and we will present and
24 work at a taping with Gwen Ifill at the
25 University of Penn.

2 On May 13th and on May 20th, we
3 have celebrations of centenarian birthday
4 party with CASA and a professional aging
5 conference, also in partnership with
6 them, at the Drexelbook Country Club.

7 At this time, I would like to
8 recognize two of our national Board
9 members who are with me here today,
10 Mr. Dick Johnson and Mr. Bob Romasco.

11 (Applause.)

12 MR. JOHNSON: Thank you,
13 Estelle, and thank you to the Council for
14 this great honor.

15 As Co-Chair of the 50th
16 anniversary celebration, I'd just like to
17 reiterate what Estelle has said, all of
18 the awards that we are going to be giving
19 to the people in high schools here in
20 Philadelphia. It might be interesting to
21 learn that these awards are being given
22 to seven major cities throughout the
23 United States for the legacy and our
24 contribution -- for their contribution to
25 learning. Within all 53 states and

2 territories, AARP will also be
3 recognizing high schools in each of those
4 states with a \$10,000 Legacy Award.

5 Just as a brief history of
6 AARP, as was mentioned by your
7 Councilman, it was founded by Ethel Percy
8 Andrus in 1958, but the story begins 11
9 years earlier than that. Ethel Percy
10 Andrus was one of the first, if not the
11 first, high school principal in Los
12 Angeles, and as she retired, she joined
13 the California Teachers Association to
14 try to help the teachers of that state.

15 She found that one of her past
16 teachers was living in a chicken coop,
17 and that inspired her to begin the
18 National Retired Teachers Association,
19 where they strived to improve the
20 pensions and the healthcare benefits of
21 all retired teachers.

22 She approached 42 insurance
23 companies, because they were loath to
24 insure seniors at that point, and finally
25 she achieved insurance capabilities for

2 one more thought. Most people think of
3 AARP as that organization that sends you
4 that silly little letter when you turn
5 50. There are 40 million of us. The
6 landscape is changing, and we are
7 dedicated to providing intergenerational

10 financial security is not an issue for
11 mature Americans but for all Americans,
12 and we're dedicated to providing a
13 vibrant, just society for everyone.

12 good work we have done; for example, the
13 benefits bill, the minimum wage bill, are
14 being signed into law today. That's a
15 product of Wilson Goode's introduction,
16 but this body's good work.

17 So we cannot affect the price

19 suffering of some of our constituents,
