18 celebrate the diversity of your people in
19 the City of Philadelphia. Lord, help us
20 to serve them at every stage of their
21 lives, in every condition, so that in so
22 doing, we may reflect your love, as did
23 Martin De Porez and so many other people
24 of courage and love and justice.

25 We ask your blessing upon the

4 state and this country. Let them all
5 have the same appreciation of the dignity

12 by loving and serving our sisters and
13 brothers. Bring peace to our world,

18 God of peace and justice, now and
19 forever. Amen.

24 (Council at ease.)

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Leave
10 will be granted.

11 The Chair recognizes Councilman
12 O'Neill.

13 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Madam
14 President, on behalf of the republicans,
15 there are no requests for leave of
16 absence.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
18 Chair thanks the gentleman.

19 The Chair will dispense with
20 the regular order of business to
21 recognize the guests and visitors joining
22 us in chambers this morning. On behalf
23 of all members of City Council, I welcome
24 you to our Council session. We
25 appreciate your taking the time to join

5 At this time, the Chair
6 recognizes Councilman DiCicco, who will
7 introduce some special guests that we
8 have with us this morning.

9 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Good
10 morning and thank you, Madam President.
11 This morning I have the pleasure of
12 introducing 19 guests from 19 countries,
13 from Bangladesh to Iraq to Zimbabwe.
14 They're here today with Nancy Gilboy, who
15 we all know, and they are the guests of
16 the State Department on a program
17 entitled Accountability of Government and
18 Business, with the Philadelphia theme of
19 Ethical Practices in Local Government and
20 Law Enforcement, very appropriate.

21 So they're here today this
22 morning, Madam President. I'd like them
23 to stand to be recognized.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: We
25 certainly welcome you. Welcome.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank
4 you. We certainly welcome you and hope
5 you enjoy your visit to Philadelphia.

6 At this time, the Chair
7 recognizes Councilwoman Tasco.

8 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Madam
9 President, last week Rosa Parks passed,
10 and we all know her history and the great
11 outstanding stand she took. I'd just
12 like for this Council to stand for a
13 moment of silence in her memory.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna:
15 Certainly.

16 At this time, I would ask
17 everyone to please stand for a moment of
18 silence for Ms. Parks.

19 (Everyone stands in silence.)

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank
21 you very much, Councilwoman. I'm glad
22 you did that.

23 At this time, the Chair
24 recognizes Councilman Rizzo, who will
25 present a resolution recognizing the 85th

2 anniversary of the 19th Amendment.

3 Will Ms. Isabelle Clouser and
4 those accompanying her please join the
5 Councilman at the podium.

6 I see that the Councilman is
7 being joined by Councilwomen Krajewski,
8 Miller and Tasco and Blondell.

9 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: And
10 including you, Madam President.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
12 you very much. I appreciate that.

13 How about Councilwoman
14 Blackwell?

15 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
16 you.

17 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: Good
18 morning, Isabelle.

19 Isabelle is the past President
20 of the League of Women Voters.

21 Recognizing, honoring and
22 celebrating the 85th anniversary of a
23 great American milestone - in 1920, the
24 19th Amendment to the United States
25 Constitution was passed giving women the

2 right to vote.

3 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,
4 progressives for years, nay decades, nay
5 well more than a century, struggled
6 mightily to secure for women the right to
7 vote and political equality, fulfilling
8 the promise of the Declaration of
9 Independence; and

10 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:
11 Whereas, American women now compose more
12 than half of our nation's voting-age
13 population; and

14 Whereas, the non-partisan
15 League of Women Voters was founded
16 shortly before the 19th Amendment was
17 passed to educate women about the
18 importance of the right to vote and the
19 exercise of that franchise; and

20 COUNCILWOMAN KRAJEWSKI:
21 Whereas, the League began as a mighty
22 political experiment designed to help 20
23 million women carry out their
24 responsibilities as voters, encouraging
25 them to use their new power to

2 participate in shaping public policy.

3 COUNCILWOMAN MILLER: And
4 whereas, the League currently continues
5 to encourage women to use their new power
6 to help shape public policy. Members are
7 encouraged to educate citizens about, and
8 lobby for, government and social reform
9 legislation; and

10 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Whereas,
11 Philadelphia's National Constitution
12 Center and the National Women's History
13 Project of Santa Rosa, California have
14 co-sponsored Women Win the Vote: 85
15 Years and Beyond.

16 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: Resolved, by
17 the Council of the City of Philadelphia,
18 that City Council hereby recognizes,
19 honors and celebrates the 85th
20 anniversary of a great American
21 milestone - the 19th Amendment to the
22 United States Constitution was passed
23 giving women the right to vote.

24 Further resolved, that an
25 engrossed copy of this resolution be

1 11/3/05 - STATED - PRESENTATIONS
2 presented to the League of Women Voters
3 of Philadelphia as further evidence of
4 the sincere admiration and gratitude of
5 this legislative body. And to receive
6 this resolution today is the past
7 President of the League of Women Voters,
8 Isabelle Clouser.

9 (Applause.)

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
11 Chair recognizes Ms. Clouser for remarks.

12 MS. CLAUSER: I am here
13 representing our current President, who
14 is working and who has an ill mother, and
15 members of our Board, who are also
16 working. So it's up to the very senior
17 past President to receive this
18 commendation and in recognition of the
19 work that we have been doing to encourage
20 people to vote, not only women but all
21 people. And certainly the membership of
22 the City Council is proof of the fact
23 that women have indeed earned their right
24 in government.

25 Thank you very much.

16 Councilwoman Tasco is being
17 joined by Councilwoman Blackwell.

18 The Chair recognizes
19 Councilwoman Tasco.

20 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Good
21 morning and thank you, Madam President.

22 This is a great story that
23 really hasn't been properly told.
24 Hopefully we can get some more PR about
25 this wonderful team here. But we are

2 pleased, Councilwoman Blackwell and I.

3 The school is in her district. Carol

4 Smith is our friend, but I knew about the

5 program through her.

6 Honoring the Shawbotics Team of

7 Shaw Middle School for representing

8 Philadelphia and Pennsylvania in the

9 First Lego League/First Japan No Limits

10 Challenge in Aichi, Japan.

11 Whereas, Joseph Daniel,

12 Patricia Parker, Sa'ood Abdul-Basit,

13 Amber Reid, Ashley Reid and Corey Edmonds

14 are members of the Shawbotics Team and

15 students at Shaw Middle School, and the

16 Shawbotics Team was assisted by Shaw

17 Middle School Teacher and Robotic

18 Competition Project Manager Janet Hudson,

19 Engineering Coach Keith Sevic, Drexel

20 University Mechanical Engineering

21 Professor Bradley Layton, and Coach Ward

22 McCrae.

23 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

24 Whereas, the Shawbotics Team represented

25 Philadelphia and Pennsylvania in the

2 First Lego League/First Japan No Limits
3 Challenge in Aichi, Japan against some of
4 the best young minds in the world who are
5 fellows 9- to 14-year-old students from
6 various countries, included but not
7 limited to, Korea, Singapore, China,
8 Thailand and Japan; and

9 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Whereas,
10 with just two weeks to plan and prepare,
11 the Shawbotics Team built, programmed,
12 tested and reprogrammed their Lego robot
13 to perform nine missions aimed at aiding
14 people with disabilities and, through the
15 assistance of Janet Hudson and Bradley
16 Layton, the Shawbotics Team used the
17 Frederick O. Hess Lab at Drexel
18 University to prepare for the challenge.

19 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: And
20 whereas, during the challenge, the
21 Shawbotics Team was tested in the areas
22 of team spirit, team work and team
23 research and earned top honors and medals
24 in the team work section of this
25 competition.

2 Therefore, be it resolved that

3 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: By the

4 Council of the City of Philadelphia, that

5 we hereby honor the Shawbotics Team of

6 Shaw Middle School for successfully

8 Pennsylvania in the First Lego

9 League/First Japan No Limits Challenge in
10 Aichi, Japan.

11 Further resolved, that an

12 engrossed copy of this resolution be

13 presented to the Shawbotics Team as

14 evidence of the sincere sentiment of this

15 legislative body.

16 Certification, this is a true

17 and correct copy of the original

18 resolution adopted by the Council of the

19 City of Philadelphia on the 27th day of

20 October 2005.

21 It is signed by President

22 Verna, introduced by Tasco and Blackwell,

23 and supported by all members of City

24 Council.

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
3 Chair recognizes Ms. Hudson for remarks.

4 MS. HUDSON: Good morning,
5 everyone. I would really like to thank
6 all of City Council, Council President
7 Verna, Mayor John Street and Councilwoman
8 Blackwell and Councilwoman Tasco for
9 facilitating and encouraging the kids and
10 bestowing this honor upon them in such a
11 prestigious environment here and full of
12 visitors as so prestigious.

13 It was indeed an honor to
14 represent our country, the State of
15 Pennsylvania and the City of
16 Philadelphia. We know that our Mayor is
17 really for technology in general. He's
18 really trying to make sure the School
19 District of Philadelphia infuses that
20 through all the curriculum.

21 But our First Japan experience
22 was a revolutionary experience. It was a
23 new awakening, I think, for the kids here
24 especially and their parents, because it
25 provided them with an opportunity not

2 only to act as diplomates first for their
3 country because their behaviors and their
4 representation was first and foremost,
5 but it also allowed them to acquire
6 skills needed for them to be the next
7 generation of explorers, either working
8 in the NASA environment or for this
9 country in general, and I think that that
10 was the most important part when they had
11 an opportunity to visit the Expo 2005,
12 which was formerly the World's Fair, and
13 see the world state-of-the-art
14 technology.

15 It was more than just a
16 competition. They were there competing,
17 but also the Japanese government and the
18 Japanese First Japan opened up their
19 country to them and really honored them
20 while they were there, and they were very
21 nice and taught them a lot about skills
22 and different things, and the kids from
23 the other countries also.

24 There are two students here
25 that would like to just make a short

2 comment, but we would like to thank all
3 of you for being in presence here, and I
4 just wanted to recognize very, very
5 quickly the people who without their
6 support financially and -- because there
7 were people who donated to the cause, and
8 without their support and working
9 administratively, we could not have done
10 this, and that is, first and foremost,
11 Mayor Rendell for providing the funds --
12 I mean Governor. I'm sorry. Well,
13 Mayor, that was a prerequisite. I'm
14 sorry. But Governor Edward Rendell;
15 Mayor Street; Joseph Certaine, the
16 Director of Governor Rendell's Southeast
17 Regional Office; the Gear-Up Program, the
18 Federal Gear-Up Program sponsored by
19 Councilman Chaka Fattah -- Congressman;
20 V. Chapman-Smith, a Regional
21 Administrator of the Midatlantic Region
22 of the National Archives; Leslie Simon.
23 Many of these people are
24 present here, so if I named your name,
25 please stand up. And I'm almost done

3 Leslie Simon, the Director of
4 the National Archives; Carol Smith, the
5 Mayor's Commission on Technology, because
6 she actually sponsored the team, her
7 organization did, that Department,
8 because we needed a sponsor. Several
9 members of the Fund for Philadelphia,
10 which helped to facilitate the funding,
11 manage the funding, who are Karen Leslie
12 Garrison, Trudy Wright and Orisha Pringo;
13 Dr. Mun Choi from Drexel University;
14 Dr. Bradley Layton from Drexel
15 University, who donated his lab for
16 practice space; Mr. El-Mekkii, Principal
17 of Shaw Middle School; Senator Anthony H.
18 Williams' office, who actually expedited
19 and facilitated financially the process
20 of them getting their passports in less
21 than a week actually, his office was very
22 instrumental in doing that; and Ward
23 McCrae and Keith Sevvick, who were coaches
24 that went along also; and Amber Hudson
25 Robeson, who went along as a mentor; and

3 five of the parents actually went as
4 escorts also, and they were phenomenal

10 going to allow Corey to say something
11 real quick, Corey Edmonds, who was one of
12 the members of the team, and then Ashley
13 Reid will speak on behalf of the team
14 real quick.

15 Corey.

16 COREY EDMONDS: My trip to
17 Japan was exciting and educational, and I
18 enjoyed the people in Tokyo, Okinawa and
19 Tokushima. The Japanese citizens spoke
20 nice, and I hope one day I could speak
21 Japanese and study Japanese and learn
22 their history, and one day I want to live
23 there, because it was nice.

24 Thank you.

25 (Applause.)

2 MS. HUDSON: And now Patricia,
3 who was a Chief Engineer.

4 PATRICIA PARKER: My name is
5 Patricia Parker and I attend Dr. Anna
6 Howard Shaw Middle School. On the
7 Shawbotics Team, I am known as the Chief
8 Mechanical Engineer.

9 My trip to Japan was very
10 interesting and successful. Thank you
11 for inviting us here. I appreciate all
12 the love you gave us, and I also
13 appreciate what you've done for
14 Shawbotics. I thank you for recognizing
15 our team.

16 I want to recognize my mom,
17 dad, brother and Umie for supporting me.
18 Going to Japan affected my career by
19 making me want to become an engineer.

20 Thank you.

21 (Applause.)

22 MS. HUDSON: And for closing
23 remarks, we'll have Ashley Reid, who is
24 actually now a sophomore at Girl's High.
25 She graduated from Shaw, but she was the

2 Manager of the team while they were in
3 Japan.

4 ASHLEY REID: Good morning,
5 Governor, Governor's Office, Mayor John
6 Street, Councilmembers and sponsors. My
7 name is Ashley Reid. I was the Manager
8 of the Shawbotics Team 2004-2005 school
9 year.

10 We want to take you on a brief
11 trip to Japan with us. It was wonderful.
12 We saw things like Buddhist temples and
13 Shinto shrines. We interacted with
14 Japanese, Singaporean, Chinese and other
15 students from other countries. We shared
16 precious moments where we signed our
17 names and well-wishes on other teams'
18 shirts and their ours.

19 I am no longer a member of
20 Shawbotics because I now go to Girl's
21 High, but I still go to Shaw after school
22 and help with robotics when needed. I
23 even go to their competitions as a guest.

24 The team is still going strong.
25 That was evident in their last

2 competition. The same team members
3 remained in the program during the
4 2005-2006 school year. I know it gives
5 them a great deal of hope for the future
6 that they might one day use this
7 technology to improve the world.

8 We would like to give a

10 Rendell; Joseph Certaine; Mayor Street;
11 to First Japan and Ms. V. Chapman-Smith;
12 the Mayor's Commission on Technology;
13 Lego League; Midatlantic Regional
14 Archives; Senator Williams; Drexel
15 University; WURD; Cody Anderson; and
16 Ms. Janet Hudson for her support and
17 generosity. Their gift to us was more
18 than money. It was the opportunity of a
19 lifetime, for which we are very thankful.

20 Thank you very much.

18 read any other communications in her
19 possession.

20 CHIEF CLERK: That's all I
21 have, Madam President.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
23 you.

24 The next order of business is
25 the introduction of bills and

18 (Aye.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Those
20 opposed?

21 (No response.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
23 ayes have it and the motion carries.

24 The Chair recognizes Councilman
25 Kenney.

3 Madam President. On behalf of myself and
4 Councilwoman Reynolds Brown, I offer one
5 resolution.

10 CHIEF CLERK: A resolution
11 authorizing City Council's Legislative

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
18 you.

19 The Chair recognizes Councilman
20 Kenney.

21 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: I move the
22 adoption of the resolution.

23 (Duly seconded.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: It
25 has been moved and seconded that the

3 All in favor will please say

4 aye.

5 (Aye.)

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Those

12 The Chair recognizes

13 Councilwoman Blackwell.

14 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank

17 was co-signed by all members, save one,

18 of this body, two on your behalf and one

19 on behalf of Councilman Mariano.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank

21 you.

22 The Chief Clerk will please

23 read the title of the first resolution.

24 Councilwoman, I'm just being

25 told we have two ordinances, too.

16 the first bill, Councilman DiCicco, your
17 light is on. Did you want to be
18 recognized?

10 committee.

11 CHIEF CLERK: And an ordinance
12 approving the sixth amendment of the
13 redevelopment proposal for the Point
14 Priest East Urban Renewal Area.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: This
16 bill will be referred to the appropriate
17 committee.

18 CHIEF CLERK: And a resolution
19 authorizing the Commissioner of Public
20 Property to execute and deliver to the
21 Redevelopment Authority deeds located in
22 the 7th and 19th Wards of the City of
23 Philadelphia.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
25 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell.

2 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank

4 adoption of the resolution.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
22 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell.

23 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
24 you, Madam President. I move for the
25 adoption of the resolution.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: It

11 (No response.)

15 CHIEF CLERK: And a resolution

19 redevelopment and urban renewal of a
20 portion of 44th and Aspen Urban Renewal
21 Area.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
23 Chair again recognizes Councilwoman
24 Blackwell.

25 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank

2 you, Madam President. I move for the
3 adoption of the resolution.

4 (Duly seconded.)

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: It
6 has been moved and properly seconded that
7 the resolution be adopted.

8 Councilman DiCicco.

9 COUNCILMAN DiCICCO: Thank you,
10 Madam President. Not yet? I just got my
11 light on, I'm ready to go.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: All
13 those in favor of the adoption of the
14 resolution will say aye.

15 (Aye.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Those
17 opposed?

18 (No response.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
20 ayes have it and the resolution is
21 adopted.

22 CHIEF CLERK: And a resolution
23 approving the redevelopment contract for
24 the redevelopment and urban renewal of a
25 portion of 44th and Aspen Urban Renewal

2 Area, Parcel No. 81 and 84.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
4 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell.

5 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
6 you, Madam President. I move for the
7 adoption of the resolution.

8 (Duly seconded.)

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: It
10 has been moved and properly seconded that
11 the resolution be adopted.

12 All in favor will say aye.

13 (Aye.)

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Those
15 opposed?

16 (No response.)

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
18 ayes have it and the resolution is
19 adopted.

20 CHIEF CLERK: And a resolution
21 calling on the Board of Revision of Taxes
22 to delay raising real estate tax
23 assessments on Philadelphia property
24 owners under the Board's Full Valuation
25 Project.

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
3 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell.

4 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
5 you, Madam President. I move for the
6 adoption of the resolution.

7 (Duly seconded.)

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: It
9 has been moved and seconded, and at this
10 time, the Chair recognizes Councilman
11 DiCicco.

12 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Thank you,
13 Madam President.

14 I would like to ask the sponsor
15 of this resolution to withdraw it for
16 possible consideration at another time,
17 but before I go any further, let me make
18 it perfectly clear. I am not in favor, I
19 am not in support of the BRT's Full Value
20 Project. I think I understand
21 Councilwoman Blackwell's reasoning behind
22 this resolution. She's scared about what
23 the BRT's Full Value Project will mean to
24 her constituents. Quite frankly, I sit
25 here today and I'm scared, too, but just

2 because we're afraid doesn't mean we
3 should not fully explore other options.

4 When I first introduced my
5 resolution exploring the BRT's proposal,
6 I thought about introducing a similar
7 bill. I wanted to understand this issue.
8 I wanted to be able to look at what
9 options we have, and I wanted to have a
10 constructive conversation. I thought we
11 might be able to unite around a single
12 issue and actually come up with something
13 that we can all agree on.

14 Again, I am not in support of
15 the BRT's Full Value Project. I do,
16 however, recognize that their proposal
17 does have some merit. More importantly,
18 we may find ourselves in a situation like
19 our neighboring counties where the courts
20 may force us to go full value. For that
21 reason alone, it may make more sense for
22 us to move to full value sooner rather
23 than later. However, if we do so, it
24 should be under our terms and not the
25 court's terms. But in reality, none of

2 that really matters, because City Council
3 has no control over whether the BRT
4 enacts full value assessments or not.

5 So rather than the conversation
6 be about how we stop full value, I've
7 decided to focus on how to mitigate its
8 effects on our constituents. I've
9 decided to ask for a constructive
10 conversation. I've decided to find real
11 answers to real questions, real solutions
12 to real problems.

13 This is about the livelihoods
14 of our constituents, and I promise all of
15 them, as I know all of the folks in this
16 room, my colleagues, do, to do our
17 damndest to protect them. And if their
18 taxes still go up despite our best
19 efforts, I pledge today, and I'm certain
20 all of my colleagues here as well, on the
21 record, we'll pledge to do our best to
22 help our constituents fight the BRT's
23 reassessment, because that's our job.

24 So I would respectfully ask
25 that the Councilwoman at this particular

2 time withhold this resolution, because at
3 some point in the future, if through all
4 of our conversation and all our debates
5 should we not come up with a program that
6 we're all comfortable with, I will be in
7 full support of this resolution. I will
8 fight for it. But I just think we need a
9 little bit more time to go through this
10 process and see if we can find some
11 mechanisms and techniques that will
12 soften the blow to our constituents all
13 across the City, rich and poor, no matter
14 what section you live in.

15 So, again, I respectfully
16 request that the Councilwoman withdraw
17 this resolution for the time being.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank
19 you very much.

20 The Chair recognizes
21 Councilwoman Tasco.

22 COUNCILWOMAN TESCO: Thank you,
23 Madam President.

24 Madam President, I will be
25 voting for this resolution, because in

1 11/3/05 - STATED - INTRO. OF BILLS
2 listening to the testimony that has been
3 given before this body -- while I may not
4 have been here on the floor, I was
5 listening to it in my office -- I'm very
6 perplexed about why we're doing this. As
7 I understand it, we were to do it 50
8 years ago. I don't know who is pushing
9 to have the fair market value assessment
10 done. The court has not charged us in
11 all the 50 years to do it.

12 I look at my district and what
13 would happen if we go to the fair market
14 value. It would have a very, very
15 devastating -- my area would be one of
16 the 50,000 properties, homes in my area,
17 that would receive a very sharp increase
18 in property taxes and including my own
19 home. So, I mean, there's some selfish
20 reason here also, as you look at what it
21 would do to family members who are
22 struggling to make it daily and also
23 dealing with this whole heating issue.

24 So I think we need some time to
25 really figure out how we come to a

2 resolution on dealing with property
3 taxes.

4 We know there was a meeting in
5 Harrisburg on Tuesday with the
6 representatives to bring this issue in
7 conjunction with their discussion about
8 property taxes.

9 The other thing is, the other
10 explanation given for the movement on
11 this was that it makes it simpler. Well,
12 I'd rather have what we've had for the
13 last 50 years, while it may sound
14 complicated, than having a fair market
15 value tax and then I'm paying \$7,000 or
16 \$8,000 so I understand it better.

17 The rationale for raising these
18 taxes or changing the process by how we
19 assess properties just doesn't hold water
20 with me, and I think it's going to be
21 very devastating on the people in
22 Philadelphia who are really trying to
23 stay here and to maintain their
24 properties. I have a lot of predatory
25 lending issues in my district, as well as

2 City-wide. So there are many issues that
3 could be impacted by raising these taxes
4 on property owners.

5 So I think right now we need to
6 take a few moments and look -- while we
7 may not have any control over it, I think
8 in some way we do, and I think we ought
9 to do whatever we can do. So I'll be
10 supporting this.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
12 you, Councilwoman.

13 The Chair recognizes
14 Councilwoman Blackwell.

15 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
16 you, Madam President.

17 Let me say that proponents
18 argue that full valuation is a good
19 policy and that it may be good for
20 government, but certainly the working
21 families of our City continue to tell me
22 and many of us that it would be terrible
23 for them. Many property owners feel that
24 full valuation is a tax hike, pure and
25 simple.

2 If this tax was going to be
3 such a good deal, as proponents have
4 claimed, why would taxpayers need caps,
5 homestead exemptions, buffers, deferrals
6 and other so-called tax-relief measures?

7 So no matter where I go, I've
8 heard it around this City, as have all of
9 you, that this is not something that we
10 support, and we feel it's bad
11 legislation.

12 Having said that, I'm willing
13 to -- and this resolution was signed by
14 all members, save my colleague,
15 Councilman DiCicco, but I am willing to
16 defer it for a month so that by the first
17 week in December -- this is the 3rd
18 today -- so that whatever our first
19 voting day is somewhere around this time
20 next month, and that gives him and all
21 the proponents a chance to certainly come
22 up with something that they think would
23 be helpful.

24 We try to be fair to everyone
25 on this Council and work with them, but

2 we certainly agree with the statements
3 made by Councilwoman Tasco. And
4 everywhere I go in this City, I mentioned
5 it at a ward meeting the other night and
6 every committeeman in my ward clapped for
7 me.

8 So this is a real, real big
9 issue, but we will try to give my
10 colleague time to certainly do whatever
11 he feels he needs to do to make it more
12 palatable or to appeal to the BRT, or
13 whatever he feels is necessary. So I'm
14 happy to then defer our voting on this
15 for one month.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
17 you.

18 The Chair recognizes Councilman
19 Kenney.

20 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you,
21 Madam President.

22 I understand Councilwoman
23 Blackwell is holding the resolution for a
24 month. I just wanted to say that this
25 body at some point in time should be on

2 the record as to this train that's coming
3 down the track, and the further it gets
4 down the track, the harder it's going to
5 be to stop.

6 And I understand the nuances
7 and the legalities, that the BRT is not
8 in our control and we can't do anything
9 about it, but in the end, this body and
10 the members of this body are going to be
11 held accountable for the tax increase
12 that people have to pay.

13 Now, we'll be able to say, They
14 did the hundred percent valuation, but we
15 lowered your taxes, we lowered the
16 millage rate.

17 They don't care. They're going
18 to get a tax bill in their envelope at
19 their door which is going to be
20 substantially higher than they're used to
21 paying or they've seen before, and in the
22 end, despite Dave Glancey's assurances,
23 despite the hard work of the staff of the
24 BRT, despite all the hard work that we
25 could put in here, we're the ones who are

2 going to have to hold the bag when it
3 comes to this tax increase which people
4 are going to experience. And if we lose
5 and we can't control it and it happens, I
6 think we should at least be on record
7 being opposed to the process.

8 Now, if people want to work
9 with the BRT and try to make the process
10 better, that's certainly understandable
11 and laudable, but I want to be on record
12 as saying I don't trust this process. I
13 think it's going to be a disaster, and I
14 want to be on record now as being opposed
15 to it.

16 If we have to do something
17 later on as a body and go to court to
18 stop it, I think we have to do everything
19 we can.

20 But I think that the bills that
21 people are going to get when this process
22 is over are going to be shocking to some
23 people. They say some people's property
24 taxes will go down. I find that hard to
25 believe, and I think that the best we can

2 do in this process is try to keep it as a
3 zero sum gain so that there's no
4 increase, but I think a substantial
5 number of people are going to experience
6 a substantial increase that's going to
7 sticker shock them, and they'll be back
8 in this body in a year or two holding us
9 accountable for something we had no
10 control over.

11 So I think at some point, a
12 month from now or a couple months from
13 now, we need to be on record as being
14 opposed to this process, because I don't
15 trust where it's going.

16 Thank you.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: I
18 totally agree with you, Councilman, and
19 at this time, I recognize Councilman
20 DiCicco.

21 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Thank you
22 again, Madam President.

23 I agree with all the comments
24 that have been made, and I want to make
25 it perfectly clear again, I am not a

1 11/3/05 - STATED - INTRO. OF BILLS
2 proponent of full valuation. As
3 Councilwoman Tasco suggested that a
4 significant number of property owners in
5 her district would be affected, I'm well
6 aware of that. In '03, 35,000 property
7 owners in my Councilmanic District out of
8 about 60 City-wide were impacted by the
9 reassessments. I held town meetings. It
10 was a very long year for me.

11 We were able to get the BRT to
12 reconsider all, if not the majority, of
13 those increases and we were able to
14 satisfy our constituents.

15 I don't know where we wind up.
16 I just don't know, but I do know one
17 thing, based on the meetings that we had,
18 the three public hearings that we had
19 here last week and as recent as Monday,
20 that if one taxpayer feels as though
21 they're being aggrieved by the present
22 system, all they need to do is to walk
23 into a court and file a suit. That will
24 then trigger the mechanism for the courts
25 to figure out how Philadelphia will have

2 to do its taxing, whether it's full
3 valuation or some formula thereof. I
4 don't want the courts to decide. I want
5 for us to try to figure that out. We
6 may, at the end of the day, not come up
7 with a reasonable solution, may not come
8 up with a solution that is acceptable to
9 the majority of this body and/or the
10 Administration. I don't have that answer
11 today. The reason for those three
12 meetings was to get some information as
13 to why we wound up here.

14 I know it's about three years
15 that the BRT has been talking about this,
16 and I guess we had so many other things,
17 myself included, to deal with, we kind of
18 just realized maybe this day wasn't
19 coming. But it's here.

20 So I appreciate the sponsor
21 holding off for at least a month. I'm
22 going to have some bills ready. They may
23 not be the bills that at the end of the
24 day we all agree on. I don't know. I'm
25 not going to try to be the hero in this,

2 but I am going to get slammed in my
3 district.

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: As
5 all of us will.

6 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Well, we
7 all will. I think if I look at some of
8 the things that are going on my district,
9 I think I'll probably get slammed the
10 worst if full value were to become a
11 reality without any mechanisms or tools
12 to make reasonable adjustments.

13 I'm a realist. I understand
14 that. And I get stopped on the street.
15 I have people knock on my door at home,
16 no exaggeration, telling me, You can't
17 allow this to happen. They don't even
18 know what they're talking about when they
19 say "you can't allow this to happen," but
20 they're afraid, because they read the
21 paper, they hear on the news where full
22 valuation may triple, double, quadruple
23 their taxes, and they have every right to
24 be afraid and scared about that.

25 So, again, thank you,

1 11/3/05 - STATED - INTRO. OF BILLS
2 Councilwoman Blackwell. We'll work as
3 hard as we can. And, again, if all else
4 fails, I will support this. I will fight
5 for it in the end, as well as you and
6 everyone else.

7 Thank you.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA:

9 You're welcome.

10 The Chair recognizes Councilman
11 O'Neill.

12 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Yes, Madam
13 President. I agree that this is a
14 disaster on a fast track waiting to
15 happen, and it's going to hit every
16 Councilmember in this room right in the
17 face when those envelopes go out, and you
18 try to explain that the sucker punch of
19 the hundred percent evaluation was
20 coupled with the donkey punch of the
21 increases in value that's being done
22 through all the new computers.

23 It's tough enough to do one of
24 those things right all by itself and to
25 deal with the ramifications of just one

1 11/3/05 - STATED - INTRO. OF BILLS
2 of those two items, either the hundred
3 percent or this enormous revaluation
4 that's being done City-wide, and whether
5 it's buffering, caps or whatever all the
6 possibly ways of dealing with it are, but
7 to try to do it together is absolute
8 insanity, and there's going to be a price
9 to pay.

10 And from what I can understand,
11 we still have a two-term limit on the
12 Mayor, and Council is permitted to run
13 for re-election. There's absolutely no
14 reason both of these things should be
15 done at once. In fact, the hundred
16 percent should be the second one done
17 after some period of time where we're
18 pretty sure everyone is around the same
19 fractional level, whether it's 70, 71
20 percent.

21 You can't have people that you
22 know are at 50 percent, other people you
23 know are at 75 and try to go to 100
24 percent. Just trying to get them to 70
25 percent -- and we now have the equipment

2 to do it and the technology to do it.

3 Then we have to figure out how to make

4 that affordable for people. But to do it

5 both at the same time is just a plan for

6 disaster that I hope none of us buy into.

7 Thank you.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank

9 you very much.

10 The Chair recognizes Councilman

11 Goode.

12 COUNCILMAN GOODE: Thank you,

13 Madam President.

14 Let me first thank Councilwoman

15 Blackwell for the resolution, because

16 something had to be done to slow down

17 this process, and something will continue

18 to have to be done to slow it down.

19 I don't believe the process in

20 the end should be stopped. Without

21 speaking fully in favor of full

22 valuation, I will say that the current

23 system is unfair. There are

24 neighborhoods that are overassessed and

25 there are neighborhoods that

2 underassessed. Keeping things just the
3 way they are does not make things fair,
4 but the process as laid out is not one
5 that essentially will equalize it
6 automatically.

7 Part of the problem in this
8 whole scenario is related to certain

11 package, one that would dissolve the BRT
12 and put the whole process of property
13 assessment under the control of the
14 Executive Branch, so that essentially
15 between Council and the Administration,
16 we would have a little bit more control
17 over this process.

20 whether it's homestead exemptions,
21 whatever other mechanism we will use to
22 protect people, we still have to take
23 into consideration there needs to be some
24 equalization in the end, because right
25 now, some people still are carrying too

11 opportunity to speak on this bill.

12 Madam President, for years it's
13 been obvious that the legislators in
14 Harrisburg do not believe that we in
15 Philadelphia can act responsibly. That
16 fact was hammered home when the State
17 Assembly passed legislation that
18 permitted two slot bollards in
19 Philadelphia but failed to allow
20 Philadelphia Zoning control over the
21 process.

22 Fortunately, that portion of
23 the legislation was struck down by the
24 courts. Yet, there are whispers in
25 Harrisburg, and rumors continue, that

2 Harrisburg doesn't want Philadelphia to
3 have a say, and the House leadership
4 intends to introduce legislation to
5 restrict our Home Rule.

6 By doing so, if they're
7 successful, they would restrict our
8 ability to protect our neighborhoods and
9 our residents and our businesses. By
10 doing so, they would refuse to allow us
11 to grow and direct our own economic
12 development. By doing so, they would be
13 slapping us in the face, the Mayor and
14 every member of this Council, and most
15 importantly, they would slap the faces of
16 our constituents.

17 The legislation that I am
18 introducing today written by the Gaming
19 Task Force and supported by Mayor Street
20 is meant to show a few things to our
21 friends in Harrisburg. It is meant to
22 show that we, as elected officials, are
23 committed to protecting our constituents.
24 While we cannot dictate our slot bollards
25 where they will go, we can offer

2 stringent guidelines on what the
3 establishments will look like, how tall
4 they are, how much open space they would
5 provide, how much parking they provide
6 for customers and what kind of signage
7 they erect and how they would ensure
8 adequate traffic patterns.

9 If the state takes this control
10 away from us, the City may be struck with
11 concrete blocks in the middle of cement
12 parking lots adjoined by neon signs.
13 Maybe Harrisburg thinks that's okay, but
14 I don't believe that we should allow
15 Philadelphia's architectural integrity,
16 our neighborhood's fabric and our quality
17 of life to deteriorate for the sake of
18 this industry.

19 But this legislation is also
20 meant to show that there are those of us
21 in the City that are willing to enact
22 reasonable zoning legislation in regards
23 to gaming.

24 We recognize the economic
25 impact that this industry will bring to

2 Philadelphia. It will provide thousands
3 of jobs, spur economic activity in
4 depressed neighborhoods, increase the
5 City's tax base, add other entertainment
6 option for tourists and, lastly, will
7 provide desperately needed wage tax
8 relief.

9 In short, this legislation will
10 allow us to protect our residents while
11 encouraging that type of economic
12 development.

13 I need to note at this point
14 that this may not be the final draft of
15 the legislation and that I would be
16 willing to listen to my Council
17 colleagues, the Administration and the
18 residents of the City during public
19 discussions to explore possible
20 amendments.

21 This bill is not a perfect
22 solution to the quality-of-life issues
23 that surround gaming establishments, but
24 it is a first step, I believe, in
25 building a foundation of long-term,

2 responsible and effective measures. I
3 hope our friends in Harrisburg take note.

4 Before I close, I want to take
5 this opportunity to thank the Mayor for
6 his leadership in forming the Gaming
7 Advisory Task Force. We appreciate the
8 dedication of Paul Levy, Dr. Bernard
9 Anderson, Sandra Dungee Glen and Romulo
10 Diaz for their stewardship of the Task
11 Force. The Task Force's various
12 volunteers should be commended for their
13 time, energy and expertise. And I wanted
14 to thank Shawn Fordham and his staff for
15 working along with me in drafting this
16 legislation.

17 Thank you, Madam President.
