2 P R O C E E D I N G S

3 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Good morning.

4 Thank you for waiting.

5 The Committee on Licenses and
6 Inspections is now in session to consider three
7 bills. There were four bills listed originally on
8 the calendar. Bill No. 990158 is being held at
9 the request of the Department of Licenses and
10 Inspections. The first bill we will deal with
11 today is Bill No. 990157, which is an ordinance
12 amending Section 9-205 of The Philadelphia Code
13 relating to sidewalk sales by adding a new
14 provision prohibiting sidewalk sales on the unit
15 block of South 30th Street, west side.

16 Please identify yourself for the
17 record.

18 MR. CAMPBELL: Good morning, Councilman
19 Kenney, Chairman of the L&I Committee and
20 committee members.

21 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Good morning.

22 MR. CAMPBELL: I'm John P. Campbell,
23 Legislative and Regulatory Affairs Manager for the
24 Department of Licenses and Inspections. And I'm
25 today to testify on the provisions of Bill 990157,

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2 which, if adopted by this Council, will prohibit
3 sidewalks sales and vending on the unit block of
4 South 30th Street, west side.

5 We ask that -- we have no objection to
6 the implementation of this bill, and if Council so
7 deems, we will enforce its provisions. This bill
8 is a companion bill to a bill that we had enacted
9 -- had this Council previously enact, banning
10 vending on the 3000 block of Market Street. So
11 this is a companion bill to that.

12 And we would ask that you suspend the
13 rules and have first reading this coming Thursday.

14 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you very
15 much.

16 Any questions for Mr. Campbell?

17 (No questions.)

18 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Mr. Doyle, do you
19 have anything you want to add?

20 MR. DOYLE: No, Councilman. That's --

21 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Okay, thank you,
22 there's no other --

23 Anyone else to express their views on
24 this bill?

25 (No response.)

1 4/19/99 L&I COMMITTEE - Bill 980923

2 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Seeing none, we
3 will now move to Bill No. 980923, which is an
4 ordinance amending Section 9-205 of The
5 Philadelphia Code relating to sidewalk sales by
6 adding a new provision permitting sidewalk sales
7 on the 1400 block of Morris Street, south side,
8 and 1421 West Passyunk Avenue.

9 Please identify yourself for the
10 record. I'm sorry. Please let the record show
11 that in attendance for the committee today is
12 Councilmembers Rizzo, Ortiz, DiCicco, and
13 Councilman Kenney.

14 Please identify yourself for the
15 record.

16 MR. CAMPBELL: Okay, Councilman
17 Kenney. Again, I am John P. Campbell, Legislative
18 and Regulatory Affairs Manager for the Department
19 of Licenses and Inspections.

20 And before I begin my testimony, I
21 would like to propose an amendment to the
22 ordinance. And if I may just read the language
23 into the bill.

24 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Please.

25 MR. CAMPBELL: After -- as the current

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2 bill is written, the word "bill" is bracketed,
3 which is deleted, and the new language of
4 "subsection (.318)), as is the 1400 block
5 Morris Street, south side. Notwithstanding this
6 section (.318), the owner of the business property
7 located at 1421 West Passyunk Avenue may conduct
8 sidewalk sales within three feet of the building
9 line in front of the business if such owner
10 complies with all the provisions of this section
11 9-205. Including but not limited to, license
12 requirements of subsection (3), except that such
13 owner shall be exempt from the following
14 provisions: subsection (8)(c) relating to
15 placement of stands at the curb line; subsection
16 (8)(o), relating to the number of stands; and that
17 part of subsection (8)(m), which prohibits the
18 placement of stands within ten feet of the
19 intersection as defined therein."

20 (Above amendment attached to
21 transcript.)

22 MR. CAMPBELL: I ask that that
23 amendment be adopted.

24 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Fine.

25 MR. CAMPBELL: This bill is at the

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2 request of Council President Verna, and this is a
3 complementary bill to the Broad and Snyder and the
4 general banning of vending on South Broad Street.

5 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: The Chair
6 recognizes Councilmember DiCicco.

7 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Thank you, Mr.
8 Chairman.

9 The Morris Street part of the bill, the
10 1400 block of Morris, if I'm not mistaken, I
11 notice that the vendor sometimes has more than one
12 stand. I mean, under the ordinance, he's still
13 required to adhere to the code 4-by-8 stand or
14 what have you, right?

15 MR. CAMPBELL: That is correct. He's
16 subject to all the provision of Section 9-205.

17 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Now, would this
18 allow other stands on the 1400 block of Morris, or
19 are we speaking about the one stand only?

20 MR. CAMPBELL: The one stand.

21 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: And that will be
22 clear in the -- I'm not reading from the --

23 MR. CAMPBELL: Yes, sir. Actually, as
24 the situation now exists, there is a vendor there
25 currently and because we are in anticipation of

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2 this bill, we have not enforced the provision
3 against him. Originally, we had banned all
4 vending, and I believe the neighbors, the people
5 in the neighborhood had petitioned the Council
6 President to permit this vendor to remain. And
7 this is, you know, for the --

8 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Yeah, I understand
9 that. My concern is that other vendors won't take
10 advantage of -- when you say 1400 block, even if
11 gave the 30-foot distance between the stands, you
12 can probably have 15 stands on that block, or
13 whatever it comes to.

14 I mean, I think Councilwoman Verna's,
15 her intentions were to permit just the one stand
16 to operate there. And I don't know if we can -- I
17 don't want to make it any more cumbersome than we
18 may have to, but I don't think -- and, again,
19 she's not here and I can ask her. I don't think
20 her intention was to allow vending for the entire
21 1400 block.

22 (Councilman DiCicco confers with aide
23 to Council President Verna.)

24 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Bear with us a
25 moment.

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2 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: I'm being told by
3 Councilwoman Verna's staff person that there were
4 two stands that would be permitted, and that's
5 what I think the --

6 Was that the maximum that they were
7 looking to do?

8 STAFF PERSON: Yes.

9 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: A maximum of two.
10 I know there was one there for a long time.

11 MR. CAMPBELL: Yes.

12 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: How do we handle
13 that? Do you just say within so many feet from
14 Broad Street, going west and no other --

15 MR. CAMPBELL: We could do that or we
16 could --

17 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: You're going to
18 have to make some decision, I guess.

19 MR. CAMPBELL: Or I could say, "As in
20 the 1400 block of Morris Street" before the
21 comma. After the comma, add the words "one
22 vending slot only," similar to what do in Center
23 City. Or, as in this case, we're talking to a
24 maximum.

25 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: A maximum, right?

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2 MR. CAMPBELL: Yeah. We could a put
3 comma or semi colon, "a maximum of two vending
4 slots" --

5 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: On the south side.

6 MR. CAMPBELL: -- "would be permitted
7 on the south side."

8 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Okay.

9 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Okay, are we
10 amending the amendment?

11 Do me a favor. Make the additional
12 amendment change, and then read for the record the
13 newly amended amendment.

14 MR. CAMPBELL: Okay.

15 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Please let the
16 record indicate that Councilmember Nutter is also
17 in attendance today for our hearing.

18 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Mr. Campbell,
19 would you rather we hold this for a week? Or --

20 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: We could do it
21 today. Yeah, let Mr. Campbell take a shot at it.
22 He's pretty good on his feet.

23 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Okay.

24 MR. CAMPBELL: Yeah. Okay, just one
25 quick question. This is the south side of Morris

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2 street, correct?

3 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Yes.

4 MR. CAMPBELL: All right. So that this
5 should now read "subsection," and I'll pass this
6 up to the committee and to the table.

7 Subsection (.318) as in the south side
8 of the 1400 block of Morris Street; two vending
9 locations shall be permitted."

10 Delete the "south side," the last two
11 words, because we've already put that in front of
12 the 1400 block.

13 Then the rest of the section remains
14 unchanged.

15 So, again, let me read the whole
16 thing. The amendment would be, delete the word
17 "bill" and then "subsection (.318), as in the
18 south side of the 1400 block of Morris Street, two
19 vending spaces shall be permitted.

20 Notwithstanding this subsection (.318), the owner
21 of the business property located at 1421 West
22 Passyunk Avenue may conduct sidewalk sales within
23 three feet of the building line in front of the
24 business if such owner complies with all of the
25 provisions of this Section 9-205, including but

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2 not limited, to license requirements of subsection
3 (3), except that such owner shall be exempt from
4 the following provisions: subsection (8)(c)
5 relating to the placements of stands of the curb
6 line; subsection (8)(o), relating to the number of
7 stands; and that part of subsection (8)(m) which
8 prohibits the placement of the stands within ten
9 feet of the intersection as defined therein."

10 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Let me ask you a
11 question in general. Aren't business owners, by
12 virtue of their business privilege licence
13 permitted to vend wares that they sell within
14 their own store within three feet of the building
15 line?

16 MR. CAMPBELL: No.

17 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: That is not --

18 MR. CAMPBELL: That is not. When we
19 redid the vending laws in 1975 and again in 1976,
20 we had repealed all existing vending legislation
21 at the time, and those provisions which existed
22 prior to that were deleted so that, I guess, we
23 started sometime in the '80s. And I believe,
24 Councilman, you did -- I'm sorry, in '92,
25 permitting owners to again vend in front of their

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2 stores.

3 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Right.

4 MR. CAMPBELL: And also to have the
5 stand at the store front within two or three feet
6 at the store rather than at the curb because,
7 again, of the way, when we redid the legislation
8 in '75 and '76, all vending had to be at the
9 curb.

10 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Okay.

11 Councilman DiCicco, does that amended
12 amendment cover your concerns?

13 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: I'm having a
14 sidebar with Mr. DeMarco. One minute, please.

15 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: So, what is it,
16 making sausage and legislation as the two things
17 you don't want to watch?

18 (Laughter.)

19 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: The question is,
20 is there any way we could control who the vendors
21 are, meaning the two that are there now? Or would
22 it mean any two spots? I mean, we don't want to
23 have that situation where --

24 MR. CAMPBELL: We could do the other
25 thing, then; we could make it a special vending

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2 district like we did under 9-204, then I would --

3 (Unintelligible, parties speaking over
4 each other.)

5 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: We don't have the
6 situation where somebody shows up an hour before
7 the guy's who regularly vending --

8 MR. CAMPBELL: Yeah, exactly.

9 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: -- and then have
10 the battle going on.

11 MR. CAMPBELL: Then at that point, I
12 recommend that you hold this.

13 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: My recommendation
14 is that we hold the bill.

15 MR. CAMPBELL: Yeah, right.

16 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: And try to craft
17 something that make sense from both the vending
18 standpoint and from the neighborhood confusion.

19 MR. CAMPBELL: Yeah.

20 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Okay, all right,
21 fine.

22 Is there anyone else while they're here
23 that has anything to say about this bill, even
24 though it's going to be held?

25 (No response.)

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2 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Okay. The final
3 bill for today is Bill No. 980890, which is an
4 ordinance amending Section 9-205 of The
5 Philadelphia Code relating to sidewalk sales by
6 adding a new provision prohibiting sidewalk sales
7 on Glenwood Avenue from Broad Street to 16th
8 Street, both sides, and on the westerly) side of
9 Broad Street from Glenwood Avenue to Indiana
10 Avenue.

11 Please identify yourself.

12 MR. CAMPBELL: Okay. Again, good
13 morning, Councilman Kenney, Chairman of the L&I
14 Committee, and L&I committee members. I am
15 John P. Campbell, Legislative and Regulatory
16 Affairs Manager for the Department of Licenses and
17 Inspections.

18 I am here to testify on the provisions
19 the Bill 980890, which would prohibit vending and
20 sidewalk sales on Glenwood Avenue from Broad
21 Street to 16th Street, both sides, and the
22 westerly side of Broad Street from Glenwood Avenue
23 to Indiana Avenue.

24 We have no objection to the enactment
25 of this bill. In fact, we urge Council to adopt

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2 this bill because this is the kind of investment
3 protection that we want to give to those people
4 who are developing North Philadelphia.
5 Particularly, we're opening a supermarket, and
6 this is the -- they need this kind of assistance.

7 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you very
8 much.

9 Any questions for Mr. Campbell?
10 Councilmember Nutter?

11 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Thank you, Mr.
12 Chairman.

13 Mr. Campbell, no question on this
14 particular bill. But on all of these vending
15 prohibition bills, the question continues to
16 occur, which is enforcement and our ability to
17 enforce the multitude of no-vending bills. I've
18 got, you know, I've done a few myself. And so my
19 question resolves around the stretching of the
20 Department's ability to ensure compliance in what
21 amounts to be at times a six-to-seven-day-a-week
22 operation that some people have.

23 If you could continue to reinforce with
24 the Department that -- I mean, we do these bills
25 for the best of purposes and intentions, but our

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2 efforts are totally undermined at times if people
3 know that they can get around us either in the
4 later evening hours and especially on Saturday and
5 Sunday. I mean, I recognize that you've got a
6 budget and you've got to live within that budget
7 and we can't drive your overtime up significantly,
8 but you totally undermine the purpose of these
9 kinds of bills if people know that there's not
10 going to be much enforcement.

11 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: I guess -- and can
12 I just -- I hate to use the word "piggyback," but
13 I'd like to piggyback on that question 'cause
14 when, for example, we do cease-operation orders,
15 each police district is given a list of those
16 operations that are ceased by the Department. And
17 if, during the course of evening hours or weekend
18 hours, the police have that list and can go in and
19 enforce the cease-operations, why would not a list
20 similar to a cease-operations list be provided to
21 the police captain?

22 'Cause, normally, a lot of these
23 people are out there on the weekends selling
24 illegal goods anyway -- bootleg tapes and, you
25 know, other types of non-licensed materials. Is

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2 that something that maybe we need to explore with
3 the Police Commissioner?

4 MR. CAMPBELL: Councilman, that's an
5 excellent idea. For example, the Police
6 Department, obviously, is also co-enforcer of any
7 code section that the Department enforces, and we
8 would be very happy to explore that with the
9 Police Commissioner because the sector car riding
10 -- there are how many thousands policemen, and
11 we're a department of 450, 460 people.

12 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: All right. We'll
13 explore that outside this hearing to see whether
14 or not it makes any sense. I mean, 'cause it
15 couldn't be that much more work if they're getting
16 a cease-operations order list; we'd just add that
17 to the cease-operations order list.

18 MR. CAMPBELL: And this is, I believe,
19 it's like the 320th or 21st or 30th, you sort of
20 -- well, yeah, about the 320th, 22nd vending
21 prohibition in the City, and we are now going to,
22 I guess, little by little, if you look at the
23 history of the whole vending prohibition, you go
24 back, and we're pretty much taking the City block
25 by block, saying that no more vending. For

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2 example, we've just banned all vending in the 6th
3 Councilmatic District. There are large chunks in
4 the 10th Councilmatic District and a significant
5 portion of Districts 1 and 2 where vending is now
6 banned. Ultimately, I guess, in some generations
7 in the future, there will be one vending block
8 maybe left in the City.

9 In answer to Councilman --

10 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: That will help
11 ensure massive enforcement then, 24-hour
12 enforcement.

13 MR. CAMPBELL: Yeah. Well, again, at
14 Councilman Kenney's suggestion, we are going to
15 explore that.

16 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Add the vending
17 prohibition locations to the cease-operations that
18 the police captains all have so that they have it
19 and then some supervisor on the street would be
20 responsible that if they saw that, that they take
21 the appropriate action.

22 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Yeah, that would
23 definitely --

24 MR. CAMPBELL: Our other experience
25 over the years is, as we've been advised of the

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2 hot spots in the various Councilmatic districts,
3 we have gone out there and our presence, and it's
4 something, I guess, that you're never going to
5 eradicate 100 percent, but the presence does get
6 it to abate somewhat.

7 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Not to belabor the
8 length of this hearing, but let me go a little
9 further afield because, as a result of some of the
10 discussions that we're having over Veterans
11 Stadium in the last week, there have been
12 vociferous complaints from the vendors there that
13 there are people, multitudes of people out and
14 around the perimeter of the stadium selling
15 unlicensed goods, like women from New Jersey go-go
16 bars pressing information into the hands of
17 fathers and mothers with kids in tow.

18 Who's responsible for all of that
19 activity down there? 'Cause I understand that
20 during the National League All-Star game, there
21 was a vending prohibition from Snyder Avenue to
22 Pattison Avenue, which was strictly enforced. And
23 also during the NBA, although we didn't have it,
24 but the NBA was going to basically do the same
25 thing. How can we enforce those kinds of

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2 situations in special circumstances but not all
3 the time?

4 MR. CAMPBELL: Generally, vending is
5 banned in the stadium area. I believe it's from
6 10th Street to either 17th or 18th, and I forget
7 what the cross streets are -- Packer Avenue north.

8 Our main detail down at the stadium, in
9 addition to the vending, is also the scalpers
10 detail, which is where we front our activity on.
11 And we do pre-game sweeps, we try to do post-game
12 sweeps of any vendors in the area.

13 The whole issue of the little handouts
14 that the -- whatever the place was, the Fantasy
15 Bar or --

16 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: The Fantasy Show
17 Bar.

18 MR. CAMPBELL: Show Bar, yeah. Again,
19 that -- we sort of got hung up in a first-
20 amendment issue. And, you know, as far as banning
21 them, actually, we haven't really. I guess it's
22 the police more than us who have been, you know,
23 trying to enforce around that -- you know, what
24 you can ask them not to do and --

25 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: I guess part of the

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2 problem is --

3 MR. CAMPBELL: I'm not familiar with
4 that 'cause --

5 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Part of the problem
6 in that whole area is that it has become so unruly
7 and so unregulated that I think it spills over
8 into what goes on inside the building, inside the
9 facility as far as the -- for example, the
10 tailgating issue. Tailgating is banned in the
11 City parking lots. I mean, my understanding is
12 that most of the people involved in those
13 fisticuffs on Monday were tailgating pretty
14 heavily in the parking lot as a result.

15 And I'm not asking you to comment on
16 police and other security issues, but there seems
17 to be a generally laxity of enforcement down there
18 in general. So, well, maybe we can revisit that
19 at another time.

20 Are there any other questions on this
21 bill?

22 Councilmember Rizzo.

23 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: I'd just like to
24 comment on your concept. I know it needs to be
25 develop on the cease orders going to the police,

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2 but I would hope that during the discussion that
3 this policy would be more of a notification to L&I
4 rather than taking police out of service to deal
5 with L&I issues.

6 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: They're not being
7 taken out of service; they're in service, driving
8 by locations that --

9 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: Well, I just wanted
10 to --

11 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Well, they're on
12 the street anyway.

13 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: Well, I want the
14 record to reflect that if they see a violation of
15 an L&I that they would be a referral and not
16 actively involve themselves and not taken out of
17 service to deal with the issue.

18 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Well, we'll explore
19 this, but I don't want the record to be
20 misreflected in that these officers are in
21 service, driving through the streets in their
22 sector during the course of their shift.

23 There's lots of things that they go out
24 of service for in order to respond to complaints,
25 the problems in the neighborhoods, or to illegal

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2 activities. And if this is a prohibited activity,
3 if they're doing it, they're doing it illegally.
4 If someone had set up a truck and is selling beer
5 from the back of the truck, certainly that
6 person's vending but I'll bet you the police
7 officer driving by will get out of the car and
8 make a stop of that activity.

9 So, you know, it's what goes on during
10 the course of the day in a particular shift
11 considering how busy someone is. But those are
12 the individuals that are on the front line. They
13 see what's going on every day. And unless I get
14 some complaints from the Police Commissioner,
15 maybe we can pursue this with him. But if he
16 tells me that it can't be done, I'll take his
17 advice.

18 Any other questions for Mr. Campbell?

19 (No further questions at this time.)

20 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Seeing none, is
21 there anyone else to testify on this bill?

22 (No response.)

23 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Seeing none, we
24 will now convene the public meeting.

2 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: The Chair
3 recognizes Councilmember Nutter for a motion on
4 Bill No. 990157, with a rules suspension.

5 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Mr. Chairman, I
6 move that Bill 990157 be reported out of this
7 committee with a favorable recommendation and a
8 further recommendation that the rules of Council
9 be suspended so as to permit first reading at our
10 next session.

11 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Is there a second?
12 (Duly seconded.)

13 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: It's been moved and
14 seconded.

15 All in favor?

16 There are none opposed.

17 Bill No. 990157 is reported out of this
18 committee favorably, with a request to rules
19 suspension to allow for first reading at our next
20 Council session.

21 The Chair recognizes Councilman Nutter
22 for similar motion on Bill No. 980890.

23 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Mr. Chairman, I
24 move that Bill No. 980890 be reported out of this
25 committee with a favorable recommendation and a

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2 further recommendation that the rules of Council
3 be suspended so as to permit first reading at our
4 next Council session.

5 (Duly seconded.)

6 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: It's been moved and
7 seconded.

8 All in favor, aye?

9 There are none opposed.

10 Bill No. 980890 will be reported out of
11 this committee favorably and a request will be
12 made for a rules suspension to allow for first
13 reading at our next Council session.

14 Bill No. 980923 will be held to the
15 call of the Chair along with Bill No. 990158.
