2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
3 morning. We're going to get started. As
4 you can see, we are operating under
5 somewhat different circumstances today.
6 I just want to read a brief statement.

7 After consulting with our
8 Department of Health, we have made
9 several changes to Council's regular
10 routine today. This will likely continue
11 until further notice from the Department
12 of Health with respect to the process.
13 It is obviously based on the concerns
14 about the coronavirus.

15 You will notice that we have
16 every other chair blocked. That's a part
17 of the social distancing strategy that we
18 have put in place based on those
19 recommendations. We want to reduce any
20 potential exposure.

21 We ask you please not panic,
22 but it's important for us to be cautious
23 and follow the science and the
24 recommendations. We will not allow
25 anybody to stand alone. We have moved

2 our caucus, as you have just witnessed,
3 from the Caucus Room to the Chambers.
4 That Caucus Room lends itself to
5 potential exposure because of the
6 closeness of the traditional operation of
7 caucus. So we want to make sure that as
8 we continue to proceed, that we follow
9 that policy.

10 I'd ask if anybody here has
11 some certain symptoms, if you are feeling
12 feverish, if you have a persistent dry
13 cough, if you are short of breath, you
14 obviously have potentially some health
15 challenges, so we would ask you to leave
16 for your benefit and for everyone in the
17 room. Again, we don't want to panic
18 anyone, but we do want to be responsible
19 and follow the recommendation.

20 So thank you very much. We
21 will change also our public comment
22 process. We will continue to have public
23 comment, because we think it's important
24 to give people an opportunity to voice
25 their opinion about legislation, but we

2 will change the process. Because the
3 transmission, what I'm being told and
4 what the professionals are telling us,
5 can be transmitted by droplets; i.e., any
6 moisture coming from individuals' mouths,
7 it could potentially be on the
8 microphone. So we're going to ask
9 individuals to stand back at least three
10 feet from the microphone.

11 We understand that there may be
12 a little difficulty in terms of hearing,
13 but we ask that you please adhere to
14 those particular guidelines, because they
15 are important, because individuals will
16 be coming up one after another.

17 So, again, we want to give you
18 an opportunity to speak, but we want to
19 make sure that we're prudent in terms of
20 being able to continue that policy.

21 If you do not wish to be a part
22 of the public comment session, you can
23 always submit your testimony. It will be
24 put in the record as a matter of record
25 and subsequently in the Council Journal.

2 I just want to thank you all so
3 much for your cooperation, as we are
4 clearly in some difficult times, to some
5 degree unprecedented. So we're asking
6 everybody to please be cautious. Please
7 wash your hands and please follow the
8 science and the recommendation of the
9 health professionals.

10 So thank you very much. And we
11 probably need this today more so than
12 any. To give our invocation this
13 morning, the Chair recognizes Minister
14 Reshaun Carlton of the Church of
15 Christian Compassion. She is here today
16 as the guest of Councilwoman Gilmore
17 Richardson.

18 I would ask all guests,
19 visitors, and members to please rise.
20 (Councilmembers, guests, and
21 visitors rise.)

22 MINISTER CARLTON: Good
23 morning. Good morning. I'm honored to
24 be here, and thank you, Councilwoman
25 Katherine Gilmore, for inviting me.

2 So let's look to the Lord.

3 Father, in the name of Jesus,
4 Heavenly Father, we pause right now just
5 to give you praise and just to thank you
6 for this moment right here.

7 We want to pray and thank you
8 for covering and keeping us. And right
9 now in the mighty name of Jesus, I ask,
10 Father, that you will touch every one of
11 your leaders right now. Father, you did
12 not give them a spirit of fear, but you
13 have given them power, love, and a sound
14 mind.

15 Now, God, as we go forward and
16 we're dealing with this coronavirus, we
17 know that we can handle anything in
18 prayer. So, Father, I pray in the name
19 of Jesus that you would give your leaders
20 wisdom like no other, that you would give
21 them peace that will surpass their
22 understanding.

23 I pray right now that you will
24 give them wisdom, that you will give them
25 guidance in the name of Jesus, that we

2 will know exactly what to do.

3 And, God, I pray for this city,
4 oh God, that we will be obedient to what
5 the leaders have put in place, because,
6 God, you have put them in place.

7 So, God, I thank you for
8 leaders that operate in integrity. I
9 thank you for leaders that operate in the
10 authority that you have given them. God,
11 I thank you that you are doing something
12 new in this atmosphere and with your
13 leaders.

14 So, Father, I thank you for
15 this meeting right here, that it will be
16 none other, oh God, in the name of Jesus.

17 Father, we thank you, we give
18 you praise, and we give you honor.

19 And it's in Jesus' name that I
20 pray.

21 Amen.

22 (Amen.)

23 MINISTER CARLTON: God bless
24 you.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

2 Thank you very much for those very
3 inspiring words. We genuinely need them
4 today. Thank you.

5 Council will be at ease.

6 (Council at ease.)

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: So,
8 again, thank you very much, Minister.

9 Our next order of business is
10 the approval of the Journal of the
11 meeting of Thursday, March 5th, 2020, and
12 the Chair recognizes Councilman Squilla.

13 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you,
14 Mr. President. I move that the Journal
15 of the meeting of Thursday, March 5th,
16 2020 be approved.

17 (Duly seconded.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Thank you. It has been moved and
20 properly seconded that the Journal of the
21 meeting of Thursday, March 5th, 2020
22 stand approved.

23 All those in favor indicate by
24 saying aye.

25 (Aye.)

3 Those opposed?

4 (No response.)

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
6 ayes have it, and that Journal is
7 approved.

8 And our next order of business
9 is requests for leave of absence, and the
10 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Parker.

11 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
12 you, Mr. President. On behalf of the
13 members of Council, there are no requests
14 for leaves of absence.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
16 Chair thanks the Councilwoman.

17 At this time, I would like to
18 dispense with the regular order of
19 business and just welcome and thank
20 everyone who has come to Council today to
21 witness their government in action. We
22 genuinely appreciate you being here. We
23 hope that your stay is a knowledgeable
24 one and more so a pleasurable one, so
25 much so that you come back again. So

2 thank you very much.

3 Today we have no presentations,
4 so our next order of business is
5 communications, and the Chair requests
6 that the Sergeant-of-Arms delivers the
7 messages from the Mayor to the Chief
8 Clerk.

9 And, Mr. Decker, please read
10 those messages.

11 CHIEF CLERK: To the President
12 and members of the Council of the City of
13 Philadelphia, I am pleased to advise you
14 that on March 11, 2020, I signed Bill No.
15 200117, and I am returning without my
16 signature Bill No. 200016, both of which
17 were passed by Council on February 27,
18 2020; and that on March 11, 2020, I
19 signed all of the bills that were passed
20 by Council on March 5, 2020, except Bill
21 No. 200019, which I am returning without
22 my signature.

23 And I am submitting herewith
24 for the consideration of your honorable
25 body a resolution appointing Jack Soloff

4 A resolution reappointing
5 Randall Scott to the Board of Directors
6 of the Center City District; and

7 An ordinance authorizing
8 transfers in appropriations for Fiscal
9 Year 2020 from the Grants Revenue Fund,
10 the Director of Finance - Provision for
11 Other Grants to the General Fund, the
12 Managing Director and to the General
13 Fund, to certain or all City offices,
14 departments, boards and commissions; and

15 An ordinance amending Section
16 20-303 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled
17 "Salaries of Specified Officers," to
18 establish salaries based on an Annual
19 Compensation Plan, all under certain
20 terms and conditions.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
22 Thank you very much, Mr. Decker. Do you
23 have any additional communications?

24 CHIEF CLERK: I have none,
25 Mr. President.

3 Thank you very much.

4 At this time, we will have the
5 introduction of bills and resolutions,
6 and the Chair recognizes Councilwoman
7 Parker.

8 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
9 you, Mr. President. I have one bill on
10 your behalf, one bill on my behalf that
11 is co-sponsored by members Gilmore
12 Richardson, Brooks, Gauthier, Bass, along
13 with Squilla, Gym, Sanchez, Johnson,
14 Green, Thomas, Jones, and yourself.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

16 Thank you, Councilwoman.

17 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: And I
18 wish to be recognized after the title is
19 read.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Thank you, Councilwoman.

22 CHIEF CLERK: An ordinance
23 amending Chapter 9-1100 of The
24 Philadelphia Code, entitled "Fair
25 Practices Ordinance: Protections Against

2 Unlawful Discrimination," to clarify that
3 unlawful discrimination includes
4 discrimination based on characteristics,
5 such as hair texture and hairstyles; and

6 An ordinance amending Section
7 20-303 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled
8 "Salaries of Specified Officers," to
9 establish salaries based on an Annual
10 Compensation Plan.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Those two ordinances will be referred to
13 committee.

14 The Chair recognizes
15 Councilwoman Parker.

16 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
17 you, Mr. President.

18 Mr. President, as a young black
19 girl growing up being raised by my
20 grandparents, I can remember as young as
21 four years old sitting between her legs
22 getting my hair plaited and/or braided,
23 and she would constantly note the
24 importance of taking care of your crown.
25 And that is not just a cultural

2 experience that I am familiar with, but
3 every black girl across this nation and
4 across this world knows what a special
5 cultural experience, I will refer to it
6 as, getting your hair done. And it was
7 during our, I think, first or second
8 session here in Council, I looked back at
9 my colleagues Councilwoman Brooks and
10 Councilwoman Gauthier and they have
11 beautiful braided hairstyles.

12 Councilwoman Gilmore Richardson had our
13 sort of travel wet and wavy. And for
14 those of you who don't know, I had my
15 nice Jackee in, don't pull it too hard.
16 And I thought to myself, Mr. President,
17 that we here in this body are welcomed
18 when we have our hair in different
19 styles, and it communicates different
20 expressions about what we are and what we
21 feel, and we are allowed to be members of
22 this body without being discriminated
23 against when we are out there campaigning
24 amongst the public relative to our hair.

25 So today I am proud to

2 introduce what I consider to be the local
3 version of the CROWN Act. And for those
4 of you who may not be familiar, CROWN is
5 an acronym that stands for Creating a
6 Respectful and Open World for Natural
7 Hair.

8 What this bill would do is
9 amend the Code to clarify that unlawful
10 discrimination on the basis of race
11 includes discrimination based on
12 characteristics commonly associated with
13 race, such as hair textures and styles.
14 The legislation would ban hair
15 discrimination in housing, employment,
16 school, competitive sports and beyond.

17 If in fact this Council decides
18 to pass this legislation, we would, in
19 effect, become the first city in the
20 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to adopt
21 such a law, and we would also be joining
22 a growing list of states and other
23 jurisdictions that have either introduced
24 and/or adopted legislation banning hair
25 discrimination.

2 Now, I do want to note for the
3 record and say a specific thanks to our
4 colleagues in the General Assembly,
5 specifically Democratic Caucus Chair
6 Joanna McClinton, along with our
7 Democratic Appropriations Chairman
8 Vincent Hughes in the Senate, who are
9 also working on this legislation at the
10 state level.

11 I also have to thank Rue Landau
12 on the Commission of Human Relations.
13 Rue, thank you for your guidance and your
14 assistance and working to get the
15 legislation moving and drafted and
16 comparing and contrast where Philadelphia
17 would stand and what we were proposing
18 compared to other jurisdictions.

19 For those of you who don't
20 know, hair discrimination is still very
21 much a reality for black people. Earlier
22 this year you'll remember a black student
23 in Pittsburgh was told that he would be
24 suspended from school or even kept from
25 graduating if he did not cut his locks.

2 In October 2019, a Penn State
3 University football player, he received a
4 letter from an alumnus of Penn State
5 stating that his, quote/unquote, locks
6 look disgusting and are certainly not
7 attractive.

8 And there have been other
9 recent high-profile instances at the
10 national level too. You'll remember the
11 New Jersey wrestler who was forced to cut
12 his locks before he could participate in
13 a match that he went on to win. Kudos to
14 him.

15 And we can't forget actress
16 Gabrielle Union, who was told on multiple
17 occasions that her hairstyles were, in
18 effect, too black for America's Got
19 Talent.

20 As a black woman, I personally
21 understand how we've been forced to
22 conform to mainstream standards of beauty
23 for decades. I'm proud to witness more
24 and more women embracing their natural
25 beauty and rejecting the need to fit into

2 what we call a makeshift frame that was
3 once defined what beauty was and what was
4 acceptable. It's about accepting who we
5 are and loving who we are.

6 For anyone who would attempt to
7 minimize this legislation and say that it
8 is just about hair, it's not just about
9 hair. It's also about culture. And I
10 want to thank my colleagues who
11 co-sponsored this legislation today. I
12 look forward to working with you to make
13 it a reality in the future, and just have
14 to state as a matter of personal
15 privilege, my son, Langston, following in
16 the footsteps of his dad, actually locked
17 last year. He's coming up on his second
18 year and he wants a ponytail, but it
19 hasn't grown long enough yet for a
20 ponytail. So he just has to wait for it.

21 When we pass this legislation,
22 it will make me feel confident enough to
23 know that Langston, who is now seven,
24 he'll be eight this year, when he gets
25 older, even if he's able to grow into

2 that ponytail, he won't be discriminated
3 against in school, in housing, in
4 competitive sports or anything in the
5 City of Philadelphia, and that will be
6 because this local government made a
7 decision to include it in its
8 anti-discrimination laws.

9 Thank you, Mr. President.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

11 Thank you, Councilwoman.

12 The Chair recognizes
13 Councilwoman Gilmore Richardson.

14 COUNCILWOMAN RICHARDSON: Thank
15 you, Mr. President. Today I introduce
16 one non-privileged resolution on your
17 behalf and one privileged resolution
18 signed by all members of City Council.

19 Thank you.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Thank you, Councilwoman.

22 CHIEF CLERK: A privileged
23 resolution encouraging the National
24 Committee of the Young Democrats of
25 America to hold their 2021 Biennial

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
4 Today's Calendar.

5 CHIEF CLERK: And a
6 non-privileged resolution authorizing the
7 Philadelphia Land Bank to dispose of 1421
8 Letterly Street located in the Fifth
9 Councilmanic District.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
11 that will be on next week's Calendar.

12 The Chair recognizes
13 Councilwoman Gym.

14 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Thank you
15 very much, Council President. I have one
16 non-privileged resolution and would like
17 to be recognized upon its reading.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Thank you, Councilwoman.

20 CHIEF CLERK: A non-privileged
21 resolution calling on the Philadelphia
22 Sheriff's Office, the First Judicial
23 District of Pennsylvania, and area
24 utility companies to explore moratoriums
25 on eviction, residential foreclosures,

2 tax liens on residential properties, and
3 utility shut-offs in response to the
4 COVID-19 health emergency.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
6 that will be on next week's Calendar.

7 The Chair recognizes Councilman
8 Henon -- I'm sorry, Councilwoman.

9 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: That's okay.
10 Thank you very much, Council President.

11 I know these are somber and uncertain
12 times for all of us as a city. This
13 resolution talks about what it looks like
14 when we come together instead of pulling
15 apart in a time of fear and uncertainty.

16 We as local leaders have to
17 understand that our public health is also
18 tied to economic security, and this is
19 particularly important when we're dealing
20 in a public health emergency in which
21 those who are most vulnerable, least
22 economically secure, and least covered by
23 social services are essential to our
24 public health, and we have to do all that
25 we can to make sure that people are going

2 to be in stable housing and will have
3 full access to utilities in the event of
4 a public health emergency.

5 Over the last several weeks,
6 cities and municipalities have had to
7 grapple with things that should really be
8 the purview of the federal government,
9 and it is extraordinarily unfortunate
10 that the federal government has chosen
11 instead to peddle in untruths to mask a
12 significant amount of incompetency. And
13 I do want to specifically note that the
14 xenophobia and anti-Asian sentiments
15 exhibited by the occupant at the White
16 House, particularly in reference to the
17 coronavirus disease and COVID-19, has
18 been appalling and is untrue and results
19 in people not having appropriate
20 information or getting appropriate
21 testing as needed.

22 Nevertheless, that means that
23 we as a city have to come together to
24 lead a bold and efficient response that
25 protects the safety of all our residents,

2 and that's in part why we're calling upon
3 and asking my colleagues to call upon our
4 responsible agencies to explore a
5 temporary moratorium on evictions,
6 mortgage foreclosures, and utility
7 shut-offs in the event of a COVID-19
8 public health outbreak and emergency here
9 in the City of Philadelphia.

10 We already have the support of
11 our Sheriff. Miami Police have just
12 announced a suspension of evictions under
13 their purview. San Jose and San
14 Francisco are also moving. Other cities
15 are also talking about this. And it's
16 serious.

17 And so our feeling is is that
18 we have long believed in this body, we
19 have taken tremendous measures to keep
20 people housing secure, and even more so
21 now in this public health crisis. We
22 believe that housing is a human right,
23 and no one should have to choose between
24 their own safety, their health, and the
25 ability to keep a roof over their heads.

2 I want to thank my co-sponsors,
3 Councilmember Brooks, Gauthier, Johnson,
4 Thomas, Gilmore Richardson, Henon,
5 Quinones-Sanchez, Bass, and Jones and
6 others, and I also want to thank our
7 Sheriff, Rochelle Bilal, who has
8 committed to taking a look at this issue
9 very seriously.

10 Thank you very much.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Thank you, Councilwoman.

13 The Chair recognizes Councilman
14 Henon.

15 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,
16 Mr. President. Today I introduce one
17 bill.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

19 Thank you, Councilman.

20 CHIEF CLERK: An ordinance
21 establishing a no truck parking
22 regulation on both sides of Milnor
23 Street, from Bleigh Avenue to New State
24 Road.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3 The Chair recognizes Councilman
4 Jones.

5 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
6 Mr. President. Three privileged
7 resolutions, one non-privileged

10 Thank you, Councilman.

11 CHIEF CLERK: An ordinance
12 authorizing the paving of Parker Avenue
13 from a point approximately one-hundred
14 fifty-six feet southwest of Matthias
15 Street to a point approximately
16 one-hundred eighty-six feet further
17 southwestwardly therefrom.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Referred to committee.

20 CHIEF CLERK: And an ordinance
21 authorizing the revision of lines and
22 grades on a portion of City Plan No. 299
23 by striking from the City Plan Parker
24 Avenue from a point approximately
25 three-hundred forty-two feet southwest of

3 approximately fifty-eight feet further

17 resolution authorizing the City Council
18 Committee on Public Safety to hold
19 hearings to investigate the Police Board

10 Street.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13 CHIEF CLERK: And a privileged
14 resolution recognizing Bringing Hope Home
15 for providing years of emotional and
16 financial support to local families with
17 cancer.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Today's Calendar.

20 The Chair recognizes
21 Councilwoman Quinones-Sanchez.

22 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Thank
23 you, Mr. President. I have one bill on
24 behalf of the Administration.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

2 Thank you, Councilwoman.

3 CHIEF CLERK: An ordinance
4 authorizing transfers in appropriations

14 The Chair recognizes Councilman
15 Green.

16 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Good
17 morning, Council President. I have no
18 bills or resolutions today.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
20 Thank you, Councilman.

21 The Chair recognizes
22 Councilwoman Brooks.

23 COUNCILWOMAN BROOKS: Good
24 morning, Council President. For the
25 record, I have laryngitis. I have to

20 care of their families, so it is
21 important that this plan is established.
22 There is some significance to that.

23 And part two, I would like to
24 recognize two young people that I worked
25 with throughout my 17 years working at

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That
9 will be on today's Calendar.

10 CHIEF CLERK: And a privileged
11 resolution recognizing, honoring, and
12 congratulating the Academy of Vocal Arts
13 on the occasion of its 85th Anniversary:
14 1934 through 2020.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Also
16 on today's Calendar.

17 CHIEF CLERK: And a
18 non-privileged resolution urging the
19 School District of Philadelphia and the
20 State Board of Education to temporarily
21 suspend the requirement to provide a
22 doctor's note after 3 days of absence
23 during the coronavirus outbreak.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
25 Chair recognizes Councilman Oh.

2 COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you very
3 much, Council President. So there is a
4 lot said by various experts about the
5 coronavirus. It's to be taken seriously,
6 carefully, but they really warn against
7 overreactions that are not carefully
8 thought out. One of them, Michael
9 Osterholm, Director of the Center for
10 Infectious Disease Research and Policy at
11 the University of Minnesota, has been
12 recognized as someone who has predicted
13 the coronavirus in this format coming
14 from China to the United States and
15 around the world. One of the things that
16 he's really kind of emphasized is a
17 thoughtful process. This is, in his
18 opinion, an airborne virus and, as such,
19 he really emphasizes the need to ensure
20 that our community is functioning and
21 that our healthcare systems are working,
22 and one of the things he urges since
23 children, young children, do not appear
24 to be susceptible to the symptoms of the
25 coronavirus, that we be very careful

2 about the adults so that healthcare
3 workers are not compromised.

4 For example, simply closing
5 schools, which we can close schools but
6 to be careful about that, then requires
7 people who work in the healthcare
8 industry, whether they be secretaries or
9 people who clean the rooms or are nurses,
10 administrators, doctors, they have to
11 then provide childcare, and that may
12 actually lower the opportunity to provide
13 healthcare to those who need it.

14 In terms of our schools,
15 children who are sick, while not likely
16 to be injured from the coronavirus, do
17 carry it, and they can then transmit it
18 to adults in the school or to people at
19 home and others. And so during this
20 time, I would hope that parents be given
21 the opportunity that if their children
22 appear to be sick, that they keep them at
23 home to protect the adults around them,
24 themselves as well as others. And that,
25 during this time, would require or

2 hopefully the School District and the
3 State Board of Education would consider
4 that parents have the capability to
5 understand that if their children are not
6 feeling well, they're exhibiting some
7 type of underlying symptoms, to keep them

10 The final note on that is this,
11 for people who are not -- who are adults,
12 could be young adults or others, it would
13 be really recommended that they maintain
14 their health, not get an underlying
15 sickness such as a cold or flu and then
16 get the coronavirus on top of that, and
17 that's really I think what his message
18 has been, that it is coming, we have to
19 accept that it's coming, try to maintain
20 your health, and in that part, I think
21 try to maintain that our society is
22 functioning, our healthcare workers are
23 there, and that we carefully consider
24 what to do with education, our children
25 and those adults working in the education

3 Thank you.

20 (Aye.)

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

22 Those opposed?

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The

16 the purpose of calling up bills and
17 resolutions that are on our Final Passage
18 Calendar today.

19 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
20 you, Mr. President. The following
21 resolutions and bills are being called up
22 from the Second Reading and Final Passage
23 Calendars today. They are Nos. 200226,
24 200227, and 200010. All other bills and
25 resolutions are being held.

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3 Thank you very much.

4 Prior to acting on these bills
5 and resolutions that are on our Final
6 Passage Calendar today, we will have our
7 public comment session. As I indicated
8 earlier, we please ask that any
9 individual who wishes to speak, please
10 adhere to our recommendations that you
11 stand no less than three feet from the
12 microphone as a result of -- per
13 recommendations of the Health Department
14 as relates to the possibility of
15 transmitting any potential coronavirus.

16 In addition to that, when your
17 name is called, you will go to the podium

19 There's a device on that podium. When

11 CHIEF CLERK: Joe Danihel,
12 commenting on 200226.

13 (Witness approached podium.)

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
15 morning.

16 MR. DANIHEL: Good morning.
17 This is an official decree of the people
18 in writ of mandamus quo warranto and, as
19 such, requires immediate action and
20 remedy.

21 Every week, Council, Mayor,
22 Governor, and others transfer private
23 property to the government, probably
24 unlawfully.

25 This Council refused to listen

2 to the government here assembled, as
3 required by oath, constitution, and law.
4 Does government have documented consent
5 to deny any public comment or use federal
6 low-income housing money to build a mall
7 on top of my stolen home?

8 Solving the poverty problem
9 requires the government to stop stealing
10 the people's property.

11 My 26 years of
12 government-created hell requires
13 immediate remedy. Your failure to
14 perform your known duty or task requires
15 prosecution.

16 The constitutions require
17 immediate remedy of this breach of law,
18 breach of close, breach of fiduciary
19 duty. Your oath of office requires you
20 to act or face prison.

21 42 USC 1982, 1983, 1985, 1986,
22 1987; 18 USC 241, 242, 2381, 2384; PA
23 Constitution, Article I, Sections 1
24 through 28; 26 PA CSA 703, 705, 708, 709,
25 711, 712, 713, 716, 902, and other laws

2 listed in SCOTUS 15-8965, 14-1330,
3 14-4056 appear violated.

4 I call on the federal and
5 Commonwealth governments to perform their
6 constitutional obligations to investigate
7 and prosecute all involved in the theft
8 and illegal deed transfer of my home,
9 1038 West Wyoming Avenue.

10 The denial of God-given 42 USC
11 1982 property rights for 26 years is
12 egregious, extraordinary, oath-violating,
13 and requires immediate remedy.

14 A just government must obey the
15 rule of law. This color of law
16 government must have its Charter to
17 govern revoked until a constitutionally
18 compliant government is installed.

19 Public servants cannot refuse
20 their sworn duty to act any more than a
21 fireman can refuse to fight a fire. The
22 sovereign people require oath,
23 constitution, and law be enforced, and
24 jail is required for all who violate
25 oath, constitution or law.

2 I remind Council, it takes a
3 lot of cooperation to create and allow
4 all of this monumental corruption.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

6 Thank you very much for your testimony.

8 commenting on 200227.

9 (Witness approached podium.)

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
11 morning.

12 MR. GLOVER: So my name is
13 National Vice President Phil Glover from
14 the American Federation of Government
15 Employees and also we're part of the
16 Philadelphia Central Labor Council. I
17 simply came to thank Councilmembers
18 Green, Johnson, Henon, Squilla, Gilmore
19 Richardson, Brooks, Gauthier, and Gym for
20 the introduction of 200227 supporting our
21 collective bargaining rights against the
22 Trump Administration.

23 You have the privilege of over
24 20,000 federal workers in the City of
25 Philadelphia. They are parts of the EPA.

2 They are part of SSA, VA, VBA, your
3 prisons, the National Park Service on
4 Independence USDA and others. These
5 employees deserve bargaining rights like
6 all other workers do, and we certainly
7 want to thank the Council. I want to
8 thank Pat Eiding for his leadership from
9 the Central Labor Council for asking you
10 to look at this issue and acting upon it.

11 So thank you very much,
12 Mr. President.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 Thank you for your testimony, sir.

15 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: I move
16 for its adoption.

17 (Duly seconded.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It's
19 been moved and properly seconded.

20 All those in favor say aye.

21 (Aye.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
23 Those opposed?

24 (No response.)

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The

2 ayes have it. Resolution No. 200226 has
3 been adopted.

4 Mr. Decker, 200227.

5 CHIEF CLERK: A resolution
6 calling Upon the Trump Administration to
7 uphold the Collective Bargaining Rights
8 of Federal Workers.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
10 Chair recognizes Councilman Green.

11 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Thank you,
12 Council President. I want to thank the
13 speaker during public comment for
14 supporting this resolution that we
15 introduced in Council a few weeks ago.

16 In addition to being a member
17 of this body, I serve as the Labor Chair
18 for the national organization called
19 Democratic Municipal Officials. We were
20 just in DC for a couple days. In
21 addition to learning how to do the corona
22 bump, we also had a number of meetings
23 and gatherings during the National League
24 of Cities' Annual Congressional Cities
25 Conference. I was joined by our past

2 President of the National League of
3 Cities, Councilmember Brian O'Neill, as
4 well as Councilmember Jamie Gauthier who
5 was at the conference.

6 It was through these
7 conferences where I learned different
8 ideas and concerns, especially in
9 reference to collective bargaining. This
10 has been an issue. There's been an
11 assault on collective bargaining
12 unfortunately by this administration and
13 especially for our federal employees.

14 The early part of this year we
15 had a labor roundtable, City's jobs and
16 labor roundtable here in Philadelphia as
17 the Philadelphia AFL-CIO. A number of
18 members of Council attended, really to
19 create a better bond between labor and
20 our local elected officials, and that's
21 where I learned about this issue.

22 So in addition to passing this
23 resolution here in the City of
24 Philadelphia, I'm encouraging my
25 colleagues and members of the Democratic
