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1 GREETING/INVOCATION

2 P R O C E E D I N G S

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank you,  
4 thank you very much.

5 We're going to do this Council session  
6 and we're going to do it without any disturbance, so  
7 please be very cooperative. Please. I know you're  
8 all here and I know that many of you would rather be  
9 working, so in order for you to know what we're  
10 doing today, I will make an announcement very early  
11 on that Bill No.'s 658 and 137 are not going to be  
12 considered today; they're going to be held until  
13 fall.

14 So if any of you feel that you'd like to  
15 leave and go to work, feel free to do so, but I am  
16 going to tell you that we are going to do this  
17 Council session without any disruption. Anybody  
18 that causes disruption will be escorted out of the  
19 chamber. I think I've made myself clear, and I'm  
20 not going to say it again.

21 I note that the hour has come and that a  
22 quorum of this Council is present. The Council will  
23 come to order, members will take their seats,  
24 visitors will retire to the seats outside the rails.

25 To give our invocation this morning, the

2 welcomes Reverend Dr. W. Goode, Sr., Assistant  
3 Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Pascal. He is  
4 here today as the guest of Councilman Goode.

5 Councilmembers and guests will please  
6 rise.

7 REVEREND GOODE: Almighty and all-wise  
8 and all-loving God, we come this morning to ask Your  
9 blessings upon this noble body of men and women with  
10 authority to make laws and authorize budgets.

11 Endow them with a high sense of  
12 responsibility. Make them immune to temptation of  
13 selfish interests. Fill them with knowledge and  
14 wisdom so that the interests of the people come  
15 before the interests of politics and patronage.  
16 Empower them to be an advocate and a special  
17 advocate for our children.

18 We pray today especially for our  
19 children, that no child will suffer from hunger,  
20 that no child will spend their life in homeless  
21 shelters or suffer from the abuse of a parent, a  
22 loved one, of a coming danger because of an  
23 insincere but unprepared teacher. Protect our  
24 children from the expediency of budget cuts and  
25 political Russian roulette. Protect our children

2 from uncaring prosecutors and judges and members of  
3 City Councils who advocate for locking our children  
4 up as adults. Protect us, protect our children, and  
5 protect those who seek social services but deny  
6 appropriate service to them.

7 And we pray for those misguided and  
8 misdirected political politicians in Harrisburg who  
9 seek political patronage under the guise of helping  
10 our children.

11 And now, Lord, as we bring this prayer  
12 to a close, we thank You for this body of noble men  
13 and women charged with legislation of this city.  
14 Empower them, O, God, to make mountains level, to  
15 make valleys high and rough places smooth and  
16 crooked place straight. Inspire them, O, Lord, to  
17 be merciful, to love justice, and to walk humbly  
18 with their God. We pray in Your name and for Your  
19 sake.

20 Amen.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Amen.

22 The Chair thanks the Reverend Goode for  
23 his inspiring invocation.

24 Council will be at ease.

25 (Council stands at ease.)

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Mr. Balka, I  
5 did make an announcement before we started our  
6 session. Apparently, I was not clearly understood.  
7 Do you want to make a statement so that your  
8 membership would know exactly what is happening here  
9 today?

10 MR. BALKA: Thank you. Thank you very  
11 much.

12 Vendors, you've won. Go home.

13 (Commotion as vendors exit chamber.)

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Mr. Balka,  
15 Mr. Balka, Mr. Balka, I'm not going to tolerate  
16 this. You can't hear me. Mr. Balka, come to the  
17 floor.

18 (Mr. Balka comes forward.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Mr. Balka, I'm  
20 sorry, we can't tolerate this. Please tell your  
21 people that --

22 MR. BALKA: DiCicco started it.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: I don't care.  
24 This has got to stop.

25 (Vendors leave chambers.)

4 the Chair recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell.

5 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank you,  
6 Madam President. There are no requests for leaves  
7 of absence on the part of the majority.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank you.  
9 The Chair recognizes Councilman O'Neill.

10 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you, Madam  
11 President. There are no requests for leaves of  
12 absence today on behalf of the Republicans.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair  
14 thanks the gentleman.

15 - - -

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair will  
17 dispense with the regular order of business to  
18 recognize guests and visitors joining us in chambers  
19 this morning. On behalf of all members of City  
20 Council, I welcome you to our session today we  
21 appreciate your taking the time to join us as we  
22 attend to the legislative affairs of our city. We  
23 certainly invite you to come again.

24 At this time, the Chair recognizes  
25 Councilman Kenney, who will present a resolution

2 honoring principal dancer Jeffrey Gribler of the  
3 Pennsylvania Ballet Company. Will Mr. Gribler and  
4 those accompanying him please join him at the  
5 podium.

6 (Honoree et al. come forward.)

7 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you, Madam  
8 President.

9 This is a resolution honoring principal  
10 dancer and ballet master Jeffrey Gribler on the  
11 occasion of his retirement from the Pennsylvania  
12 Ballet.

13 Whereas, Jeffrey Gribler, a principal  
14 dancer of the Pennsylvania Ballet is an unusually  
15 gifted ballet dancer, who began dancing at the age  
16 of 7 in his hometown of Dayton, Ohio, and at the age  
17 of 17, was offered an apprenticeship with  
18 Pennsylvania Ballet, one of the premier ballet  
19 companies in the nation, joining its Corps de Ballet  
20 in 1976 and promoted to its principal dancer 1982;  
21 and

22 Whereas. . .

23 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Whereas, Jeffrey  
24 Gribler has demonstrated remarkable versatility over  
25 the years with an extensive repertoire of both

2 classical and modern works, including dancing  
3 leading roles in numerous ballets by George  
4 Ballanchine, such as A Mid Summer Night's Dream,  
5 Prodigal Son, (indiscernible) and the Fourth  
6 Temperments, leading roles in other classical  
7 repertoires such as Sigfried in Swan Lake, Albrecht  
8 in Giselle, Franz in (indiscernible), and a  
9 stepsister in Cinderella, and Mercutio in Romeo and  
10 Juliette, and modern works such as Paul Taylor's  
11 Company B, Cunningham's Arcade, Kevin O'Day's  
12 (indiscernible), and Laura Lubichev's Concerto 622;  
13 and. . .

14 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas, Jeffrey  
15 Gribler has choreographed several works for Shut Up  
16 and Dance, the annual benefit of MANNA, and has had  
17 several pieces included in the company's annual  
18 program of new works and has staged works by Lynn  
19 Taylor Corbett and Peter Martins around the United  
20 States and Europe; and. . .

21 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Whereas, after  
22 entertaining so many audiences throughout the region  
23 and the world, Jeffrey Gribler has recently  
24 announced his retirement as principal dancer at age  
25 43, marking an extraordinarily long and

2 distinguished career of 26 years with the  
3 Pennsylvania Ballet; and

4 Whereas, Jeffrey Gribler has also been  
5 ballet master for the Pennsylvania Ballet since  
6 1986, a position he will continue to hold,  
7 responsible for rehearsing the students who appear  
8 in the company's annual production of The  
9 Nutcracker, and he will henceforth be responsible  
10 for teaching the Ballet's contemporary repertoire.

11 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the  
12 Council of the City of Philadelphia that we honor  
13 principal dancer and ballet master Jeffrey Gribler  
14 on the occasion of retirement from the Pennsylvania  
15 Ballet.

16 And let me just add one other note  
17 that's not in the resolution. Those of us who have  
18 enjoyed over the last few months watching the  
19 Philadelphia 76ers' Allen Iverson, Dikembe Mutondo,  
20 and others who are graceful athletes, those who  
21 enjoy watching Donovan McNab and wide receivers in  
22 the NFL do tremendous things, those who love  
23 watching Doug Landel (ph.) run into center field and  
24 snag a ball in deep center field, if you enjoy those  
25 kinds of things and events, then you would love the

2 ballet. These individuals standing here, Mr.  
3 Gribler and Mr. Kaiser, are world-class athletes.  
4 And not only are they world-class physical athletes,  
5 but they have to do something else too: They need  
6 to be able to dance a piece with precision and with  
7 grace, at the same time maintaining their  
8 athleticism.

9 Mr. Gribler has given us as much fame  
10 throughout the world in the arts and cultural  
11 community as Allen Iverson has done in the last few  
12 months. And for that, I want to thank him for  
13 putting us on the map of ballet and arts and culture  
14 in this world and want to wish him well on his  
15 retirement from the ballet.

16 Thank you.

17 (Applause.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair  
19 recognizes Mr. Gribler for remarks.

20 MR. GRIBLER: Thank you, ladies and  
21 gentlemen of the Council for a very exciting morning  
22 -- exciting in more ways than that I thought it  
23 would be.

24 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: You thought they  
25 were all here for you.

2 MR. GRIBLER: I did, I thought they were  
3 all here for me, but they said to me, no, man, don't  
4 retire. I'm going to keep this really brief because  
5 I haven't retired yet and I have to go to class.

6 So I can't imagine that I danced for 26  
7 years. I mean, I'm just a kid from Ohio who wanted  
8 to dance and somehow I was lucky enough to end up  
9 doing what I wanted to do, which was to dance in a  
10 company what that I love, which is Pennsylvania  
11 Ballet, and in a city that I just think is  
12 incredible that I've learned to call home, and  
13 that's Philadelphia. It's been more amazing to me  
14 than I could have imagined. This 26 years, it's  
15 gone like that. If I could do 26 more, I'd do 'em.  
16 Not possible.

17 So, like I said, I'm going to keep this  
18 really brief. Thank you very much for this honor  
19 and from someone who has spent, oh, probably the  
20 first ten years of his career feeling like the  
21 underdog, I just want to say, Go Sixers!

22 (Applause.)

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Council will  
24 be at ease.

25 (Council stands at ease.)

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair now  
5 recognizes Councilwoman Tasco, who will make a  
6 presentation honoring the Father's Day Rally  
7 Committee. Will Mr. Bilal Quayyum and those  
8 accompanying him please join the Councilwoman at the  
9 podium.

10 (Honoree et al. come forward.)

11 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Thank you, Madam  
12 President.

13 It gives me great pleasure this morning  
14 to present a, friend, longtime friend, this  
15 resolution recognizing the wonderful world of  
16 Father's Day rally and the leadership of Bilal  
17 Quayyum as head of this outstanding and dynamic  
18 group.

19 And this is a resolution honoring  
20 Father's Day Rally Committee on its efforts and  
21 initiatives that have positively impacted on the  
22 quality of life of African-American communities and  
23 African-American males in particular within both  
24 Philadelphia and the entire Delaware Valley region  
25 at large.

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2           Whereas, nationally and locally,  
3 African-American males lead in every category of  
4 negative statistics and are more likely than any  
5 other singular group to be unemployed, involved in  
6 the criminal justice system, or to commit suicide.  
7 Startling data documents that the homicide rate is  
8 six times higher, AIDS contractions three times more  
9 likely, and death from heart attacks 50 percent  
10 higher among African-American males in comparison to  
11 their white male counterparts; and

12           Whereas, a group of concerned  
13 African-American men established the Father's Day  
14 Rally Day Committee, Inc. in 1989. Seeing and  
15 understanding the myriad of social ills that plague  
16 minority communities, FDRC sought to formulate clear  
17 initiatives geared at reducing violence and  
18 educating communities that many of them at one time  
19 or another called home; and

20           Whereas, the Father's Day Rally  
21 Committee believes and positively exemplifies  
22 through their word and by deed that men working  
23 together at the grassroots level can launch a  
24 meaningful attack on the negatived attitudes which  
25 contribute to the destruction of families and

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2 neighborhoods; and

3               Whereas, the Father's Day Rally  
4 Committee initiated a citywide peace campaign  
5 designed to heighten awarenessness of and open  
6 dialogue on decreasing the number of senseless  
7 killings and other acts of violence against and  
8 attributed to African-American males in response to  
9 a dramatic increase in the City's already  
10 historically high homicides rate. FDRC has  
11 sponsored dozens of peace marches and rallies,  
12 reaching upwards of 25,000 people in connection with  
13 this and other similar campaigns; and

14               Whereas, the Father's Day Rally  
15 Committee has spearheaded many noteworthy and  
16 innovative programs that are reaching  
17 African-American males, particularly between the  
18 ages of 15 to 25 with positive and lasting results.  
19 Those programs include the David P. Richardson, Jr.  
20 Rites of Passage Program, an outgrowth of the  
21 African-American awakening of the 1960s and '70s,  
22 designed to teach young men of responsibilities of  
23 manhood as they relate to the family, community, and  
24 the nation at large; Operation Footprint, a  
25 mentoring program where older African-American males

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2 speak and make themselves available to their younger  
3 counterparts, attending area high schools;  
4 Fatherhood Always, a noncustodial parent project;  
5 and an annual Father's Day picnic, the 12th being  
6 held on Sunday, June 17, 2001, celebrating and  
7 honoring African-American fathers and fatherhood,  
8 has become a well-attended and highly-regarded event  
9 in the Philadelphia area.

10 Now, therefore, resolved by the Council  
11 of the City of Philadelphia that we hereby honor and  
12 commend the Father's Day Rally Committee's efforts  
13 and initiatives that have impacted on the quality of  
14 life of African-American communities and  
15 African-American males in particular within both  
16 Philadelphia and the entire Delaware Valley region  
17 at large.

18 We further salute them on their 12th  
19 anniversary and admire their fortitude and resolve  
20 to attack those issues that have robbed our  
21 neighborhoods of an essential component, young  
22 African-American males, for far too long.

23 Further resolved that an engrossed copy  
24 of this resolution be presented to Bilal Quayyum,  
25 President of the Father's Day Rally Committee, as an



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2 expression of the sincere sentiment and high regard  
3 of this legislative body.

4 Certification that this is a true and  
5 correct copy of the original resolution adopted by  
6 the Council of the City of Philadelphia on the 31st  
7 day of May, 2001, signed by Council President Verna,  
8 introduced by Tasco, and supported by all members of  
9 City Council.

10 We congratulate you, Bilal, on the fine  
11 work that you do and trust that you will keep up the  
12 good work.

13 (Applause.)

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair  
15 recognizes Mr. Quayyum for remarks.

16 MR. QUAYYUM: Madam President,  
17 Councilmembers, and visitors and guests today, I  
18 just want to be very brief.

19 Let me, first of all, thank my  
20 councilwoman for presenting the resolution. I'd  
21 like to thank Councilman Kenney for a donation to  
22 our fatherhood awards reception that will take place  
23 tomorrow night, where we honor 18 fathers. We also  
24 will -- unfortunately, we do national fatherhood  
25 awards and we're honoring this year reverend Leon

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2 Sullivan, who, unfortunately, passed away, but we  
3 hope to be giving his award to his family.

4 Let me just briefly say that statistics  
5 show that without a father in the household, a  
6 child's most likely to drop out of school. Without  
7 a father in the household, a child will most likely  
8 have some kind of encounter with the criminal  
9 justice system. Without a father in the household,  
10 a child will most likely grow up in poverty. So  
11 having fathers around, taking care of their  
12 children, is probably one of the most important  
13 things -- or the most important thing that men can  
14 do in today's society.

15 I totally believe that unless fathers  
16 step up to the bat, take on responsibility to take  
17 care of their children, not only financially,  
18 spiritually, and morally, then we as a society will  
19 have failed. Most of the proceedings that take  
20 place in this Council is affected by men not being  
21 in the household, when you talk about budgets in the  
22 Health Department, Recreation, whatever. So fathers  
23 have to step up and become men and take care of  
24 their kids. That's what the Father's Day Rally  
25 Committee is about, that's what we believe, that's

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2 what we promote.

3 We have in the past honored our good  
4 councilman, Councilman Clarke, as one of the  
5 awardees. We're now working on finding him a wife.

6 (Laughter.)

7 MR. QUAYYUM: But a lot of folks don't  
8 know there are a lot of Councilman Clark's out  
9 there, men taking care of their kids, taking on that  
10 responsibility, and there are thousands of them in  
11 this City of Philadelphia and millions across the  
12 country. We just think we're just playing a small  
13 part in being an advocacy for men and fathers.

14 Once again, thank you very much for your  
15 support and the continued support and work that we  
16 will continue to do in the City of Philadelphia.

17 Thank you.

18 (Applause.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Council will  
20 be at ease.

21 (Council stands at ease.)

22 - - -

23 (Proceedings resume.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: At this time,  
25 the Chair recognizes Councilman Ortiz for the

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2 introduction, passage, and presentation of a special  
3 resolution.

4 COUNCILMAN ORTIZ: Madam Chair, I move  
5 the adoption of this resolution.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: You're  
7 presenting the resolution. The clerk will please  
8 read the title of the resolution.

9 THE CLERK: A resolution welcoming the  
10 distinguished Puerto Rican Reverend Wilfredo Estrada  
11 Adorno as he visits Philadelphia and other cities in  
12 the Northeast as part of his ongoing work to end the  
13 US Navy bombings in Viesques, Puerto Rico.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair  
15 recognizes Councilman Ortiz.

16 COUNCILMAN ORTIZ: Madam Chair, I move  
17 the adoption.

18 (Duly seconded.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: It has been  
20 moved and properly seconded that the resolution be  
21 adopted.

22 All in favor will say aye.

23 Those opposed?

24 COUNCILMAN LONGSTRETH: No.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The record

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2 will indicate that Councilman Longstreth voted in  
3 the negative, all other members in the affirmative.

4 The motion passes.

5 The Chair now recognizes Councilman  
6 Ortiz, who will make the presentation.

7 COUNCILMAN ORTIZ: I want to thank  
8 President Verna for allowing this. It's not often  
9 that you get one of your heroes really, one of the  
10 individuals that you admire for their work in terms  
11 of national liberation and human rights to -- for  
12 you to give him an award and an honor while he is  
13 still alive and ongoing.

14 Puerto Rico, as you know, has been going  
15 through the struggles against the Navy for over  
16 sixty years. This morning, the Navy announced that  
17 it will end its bombardment in the year 2003 and  
18 will look for somewhere else.

19 (Applause.)

20 COUNCILMAN ORTIZ: And President Bush  
21 has committed to that, but that commitment would not  
22 have been possible without the work of Reverend  
23 Wilfredo Estrada Adorno and the other clergy in  
24 Puerto Rico who have organized and unified the  
25 nation of Puerto Rico as it has never been organized

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2 and unified around any issue of human rights in  
3 Puerto Rico.

4 And this is a resolution from me and the  
5 Puerto Rican community in Philadelphia and the  
6 Latino community in Philadelphia and the City  
7 Council of the citizens of Philadelphia, thanking  
8 him for his work, welcoming the distinguished Puerto  
9 Rican Reverend Wilfredo Estrada Adorno as he visits  
10 Philadelphia and other cities in the northeast as  
11 part of his ongoing work to end the US Navy bombings  
12 in Vieques, Puerto Rico.

13 Whereas, the Reverend Wilfredo Estrada  
14 Adorno is visiting the City of Philadelphia to meet  
15 with local leaders and convey the urgent nature of  
16 the plight of the Puerto Rican people in Viesques  
17 who have been victims of US Navy bombing exercises  
18 for the last five decades; and

19 Whereas, Reverend Estrada Adorno is one  
20 of Puerto Rico's most prominent spiritual leaders,  
21 well known for his relentless efforts on behalf of  
22 the poor and those who are victims of human rights  
23 violations and social injustices; and

24 Whereas, in his capacity as spokesperson  
25 for the Pro Viesques Ecumenical Coalition, Reverend

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2 Estrada Adorno has met with Congressional  
3 representatives and top White House officials in  
4 order to bring attention to the human and  
5 environmental injustices that are being perpetrated  
6 against the people of Puerto Rico by the United  
7 States Navy; and

8               Whereas, Reverend Estrada Adorno is a  
9 highly respected religious official and educator  
10 who has served in varying capacities in many  
11 prominent religious institutions and associations,  
12 he currently serves as general secretary of the  
13 Bible Society of Puerto Rico and was vice president  
14 of the Latin American Ministries of Evangelism,  
15 Reverend Adorno completed his doctorate degree in  
16 ministry from Emory University in Atlanta and has  
17 taught in prestigious religious and secular  
18 educational institutions; and

19               Whereas, in 1999, the City Council of  
20 Philadelphia unanimously passed a resolution urging  
21 the President of the United States and the  
22 Philadelphia Congressional Delegation to bring about  
23 a complete cease of United States military bombing  
24 on the Island of Vieques, Puerto Rico.

25               Therefore, be it resolved that the City

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2 Council of Philadelphia extends its warm welcome to  
3 the distinguished Reverend Wilfredo Estrada Adorno  
4 as he visits Philadelphia and other cities in the  
5 northeast as part of his ongoing work to end the US  
6 Navy bombings in Viesques, Puerto Rico.

7 Further resolved that a copy of this  
8 resolution be presented to the Reverend Wilfredo  
9 Estrada Adorno as an expression of the sincere  
10 sentiments of this legislative body, Ann Verna,  
11 President, introduced by City Councilman Angel  
12 Ortiz, and supported by almost all members of City  
13 Council.

14 (Applause.)

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair  
16 recognizes the Reverend for remarks.

17 REVEREND ADORNO: Thank you,  
18 Mrs. Chairperson. Thank you, men and women. What a  
19 privilege to be with you today here. So on behalf  
20 of the Puerto Rican people and the people of  
21 Viesques, I thank you for this distinct honor.

22 It hasn't been easy, but somehow the  
23 Lord always calls us to the things that we must do,  
24 and I have felt the spirit of the Lord guiding me in  
25 the process of uniting the people of Puerto Rico



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2 together in this work to stop bombing in Viesques.

3 Let's just be sure of a few facts about  
4 Viesques. Viesques is a tiny island in the  
5 archipelago of Puerto Rico, and 72 percent of its  
6 population of 9,400 live below the poverty level.  
7 The rate of unemployment in Viesques is over  
8 60 percent. Viesques has 27 percent higher cancer  
9 rate than the rest of Puerto Rico.

10 The US Navy expropriated and controls  
11 26,000 of Viesques' 33,000 acres since the 1940s.  
12 The Navy uses three-fourths of Viesques soil war  
13 maneuvers and bomb storage. The sea, air, and land  
14 are highly contaminated by Navy pollutants and  
15 military debris, napalm, and depleted uranium have  
16 been used by the Navy in Viesques. Due to Navy  
17 bombing, the east tip of Viesques has more craters  
18 per kilometers than the moon. Endangered species  
19 have been massacred by the Navy in Viesques. Human  
20 and civil rights have been disregarded shamelessly  
21 by the Navy in Viesques.

22 Civil disobedience has been the last  
23 resource in our quest for peace, dignity, and  
24 justice. Hundreds of civilians have been imprisoned  
25 and are awaiting trial. We say enough is enough.

5                   COUNCILWOMAN VERNA:   Councilman Cohen,

7     recognized on this resolution?

8                   COUNCILMAN COHEN:   Is that the school  
9     resolution?

10                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA:   Yes, sir.

11                  COUNCILMAN COHEN:   I want to be  
12     recognized in support of the resolution.

13                  I am very concerned yet about the  
14     responsibility of the City on a continuing basis for  
15     the \$45 million which we are prepared to offer for  
16     the School District.   I'm glad the Mayor included in  
17     his letter that he would not take action to carry it  
18     out without assurance that the State legislation  
19     would be changed so as to free us from the specter  
20     of the State deciding to take over the school system  
21     and then using a provision which already exists to  
22     show that the 45 million remains a continuing  
23     obligation.

24                  One could take the State on its good  
25     faith until what happened yesterday in the Parking

2    Authority, the grab for power. I just can't  
3    understand how the State could have permitted  
4    legislation to get through the House of  
5    Representatives and the State Senate, and I can't  
6    understand the Governor's willingness to sign the  
7    legislation. It's the most drastic violation of the  
8    Home Rule Charter.

9                   So for all of these reasons, I'm just  
10   very concerned about the action of the State and  
11   about the use of this \$45 million and whether or not  
12   it is going to be a problem in the future for us.

13                  The State, as far as I can see it, has  
14   not offered anything to the schools. We've been  
15   waiting for delivery on the promise of the Governor  
16   to take necessary action to see that the schools are  
17   properly funded by the State, and instead of State  
18   action, all we get is this effort to grab hold of  
19   the Parking Authority and use it as a patronage tool  
20   for the House Speaker and for members of the -- for  
21   partisan political purposes as far as anybody could  
22   see.

23                  So I'm very concerned about the matter,  
24   Madam President, and thank you for the opportunity  
25   to be heard on the question.

18 really in resolving the issue of school funding. We  
19 have gone and what we're doing today in transferring  
20 \$45 million is another Band-Aid procedure, it's  
21 another patchwork, it's another patch that we put on  
22 a system that is hurting because it doesn't have the  
23 resources that are necessary. It's like when you're  
24 a kid and you have a bicycle and your bicycle  
25 continuously disinflates and you put a patch on it.

2 There comes a time when it doesn't work anymore.

3 And that's what we're doing here in this  
4 Council here in the City. We have gone from 15  
5 million added, we have gone to 45 million plus the  
6 15 million added. That still is a Band-Aid, it is  
7 patchwork.

8 The other day, I received a letter from  
9 Senator Fumo, and I'm sure that every one of us got  
10 it, and I happen to agree with his premise. If they  
11 are not serious and we cannot keep on telling our  
12 kids in this city that we are really doing something  
13 for public education, but if the State, the  
14 Governor, and the legislature are not serious about  
15 really correcting the funding problem that we have,  
16 really reforming the formula so that we have a  
17 funding source that is reliable and equitable across  
18 the board, across the State, then let them run it.  
19 Let Governor Ridge and the State legislature run it.  
20 Because what we're doing by putting more patches on  
21 the wall, by putting fingers on the dike is not  
22 solving our problem. And if they want to take the  
23 Parking Authority and they want to take the school  
24 system and they want to run the City, let 'em do it,  
25 let 'em do it.

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2 But we cannot keep on keep on fooling  
3 ourselves that we're sustaining a public school  
4 system that works, that has the resources. We  
5 cannot keep on -- even if we add another \$45 million  
6 to the \$45 million that we have today, it still is  
7 not going to do the job because we need new schools,  
8 we need new wiring, we need smaller classes, we need  
9 equitable pay for teachers. These are the issues  
10 that the legislature's not looking at and Governor  
11 Ridge refuses to come forward on.

12 Taking the Parking Authority is not  
13 going to resolve the problem of the School Board and  
14 the public school system of Philadelphia. That is  
15 not going to add the monies that are necessary. So  
16 if they're serious about this, if they want to do  
17 it, come in and take it, run the Philadelphia public  
18 school system, give it the resources, and find out  
19 whether those are the resources that are needed.

20 But I'm tired of us trying to fool the  
21 people of Philadelphia that we're actually funding a  
22 system in an equitable manner.

23 Thank you, Madam Chair.

23 opposite to the interests of Philadelphia, and seems  
24 interested in curtailing the rights of  
25 Philadelphians to run their own organizations the

2 way they judge to be in the best fashion. And I  
3 think that maybe cuts through both parties because  
4 of the number of representatives that seem to vote  
5 for the State against the City's interest.

6 I think it's time that we did something

9 community, your responsibility is to the body that  
10 elects you, not to some other body. And I hope that  
11 the people elected by Philadelphia to represent  
12 Philadelphia in the House and in the Senate come to  
13 their senses and begin to take interests which are  
14 in the line of the interests of Philadelphians  
15 rather than in the interest of those who, either for  
16 patronage reasons or for reasons that no one  
17 understands, are seeking to punish Philadelphia  
18 instead of giving us direction and assistance to  
19 help solve Philadelphia's problems.

20 Thank you, Madam President.

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2 I too was going to call for a roll-call

17     firefighters' hard-fought arbitration award, that we  
18     are going out of our way to provide additional funds  
19     on top of the hundreds of millions of dollars that  
20     we have provided for this project to create jobs and  
21     to build much needed sports facilities, while at the  
22     same time move forward with the promise that those  
23     teams and these corporations would not be back  
24     asking for additional money, and five months later,  
25     they're back.

2                   I think we have an opportunity to  
3   utilize this bill as leverage to help our  
4   firefighters, the only municipal union in the City  
5   without a contract today. If we were to hold this  
6   bill, I'm sure that come the fall, we would have a  
7   resolution to our firefighters' contract along with  
8   the severe problem of hepatitis C.

9                   I know that Councilmember have said that  
10   things like this should not be linked. I believe  
11   that this is the perfect opportunity for linkage.  
12   There's been linkage used in the past on other  
13   bills, and I think our firefighters should come  
14   before our sports teams, I think that our our  
15   children and schools should come before our sports  
16   teams, and I do not believe that we should be  
17   providing additional monies to this project unless  
18   and until our firefighters have a contract that was  
19   fairly awarded to them through an arbitration  
20   process that they depend on until they get the  
21   Administration to stop its appeals of this  
22   hard-fought arbitration award.

23                  Firefighters and police officers cannot  
24   strike and we don't want them to be able to strike,  
25   but but they depend on binding arbitration as a way

2     in which to get fairness in their contracts. This  
3     arbitration was binding -- it should have been  
4     binding, but the Administration simply says, We're  
5     not going to abide by it and we're going to use  
6     taxpayers' dollars to go into court to fight our  
7     firefighters.

8                   Now, our firefighters haven't stopped  
9     working. They don't stop running into burning  
10    buildings or cutting you out of a car in a car  
11    accident because they haven't gotten their way, but  
12    I think this is the appropriate time to either turn  
13    this bill down, because construction won't stop on  
14    this project. We have provided, again as I said,  
15    hundreds of millions of dollars to provide good work  
16    for our construction employees in the building  
17    trades --

18                   (Sound system difficulties).

19                   COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you very much.

20                   I think that what we did back in  
21    December, although the circumstances were difficult,  
22    I think in the end, it was the right thing to do.  
23    It's going to create hundreds of construction jobs,  
24    hundreds of tax ratables. And the three teams  
25    there, both the Eagles and the Phillies and Comcast

2 Spectacore, are decent, good companies who do great  
3 work in our city, and I'm happy that they're moving  
4 forward. This is not pitting one union against the  
5 other. This is our need and our responsibility to  
6 stand up in unison and to support our firefighters  
7 who unflinchingly support and serve us us by saying  
8 we will not do this bill until the City simply does  
9 one thing: And that's stop spending taxpapyers'  
10 money to appeal a binding arbitration award that is  
11 disgracefully being appealed and is keeping people  
12 in limo as it relates to their employment  
13 circumstances relative to the City of Philadelphia.

14 So I would urge either our colleagues  
15 here to vote no on this bill or that we all should  
16 stick together and withhold the vote on this bill  
17 until September to do what's right by our  
18 firefighters because we've already done in December

3     the issues that he puts forward.

4                   We have gone through this argument once  
5     before. The City had said that they were not coming  
6     back for any more money from the taxpayers, this and  
7     another return back to the taxpayers trough so that  
8     they can again subsidize the millionaires who own  
9     the baseball and football teams so that they can  
10    build their palaces. I don't believe the taxpayers  
11    should be in that type of business, not while the  
12    school is underfunded, not while we have joblessness  
13    in this city, not while we have neighborhoods who  
14    have homes that are sinking. I think our money  
15    better be spent somewhere where taxpayers get a  
16    direct benefit and not on corporate welfare.

17                  I am voting no on this bill and on the  
18    bill that follows for those reasons and reasons that  
19    I have previously stated.

20                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank you.

21                  (Applause.)

22                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair

3   Actually, with the firefighters, the situation is  
4   even worse. In the most recent hearing just held a  
5   couple days ago by the Law and Government Committee,  
6   it turns out that the City refuses to recognize the  
7   fact that firefighters and police injured on duty,  
8   that those medical claims ought to be paid under  
9   Workman's Compensation laws. Instead, the City  
10   seems to be requiring the health funds of both the  
11   firefighters and the police groups -- and maybe  
12   others, we don't know yet -- they're requiring the  
13   health funds to pay costs that properly are work  
14   injuries. So that the cause that Councilman Kenney  
15   espouses on behalf of the firefighters is indeed a  
16   very worthy cause.

17                   And, secondly, I wanted to state that on  
18   the question of linkage that Councilman Kenney  
19   raises, I think that's a very important concept. To  
20   deny that all issues are linked is to take away the  
21   power from Council. Even in the old wild west days,  
22   cowboys and others knew that if they were going into  
23   a tavern where there may be a fight, that it was a  
24   very unwise thing to disarm themselves or to turn  
25   their weapons over to the opponents because they

2    know they might need them, but we in Council  
3    historically follow the policy of never being able  
4    to deal successfully with the Mayor because we  
5    always permit any mayor to convince us -- and it's a  
6    total fantasy -- that each issue should be treated  
7    separately. Everybody knows all these issues are  
8    linked, and the way in which a legislative body has  
9    leverage is by dealing with issues on a leverage  
10   basis. If the Mayor feels one way on one bill and  
11   comes to us for support, he certainly has to listen  
12   to our procedures on other bills.

13                So I support fully this concept of  
14   linkage. I think this bill ought to be held for the  
15   various reasons given by Councilman Kenney and by  
16   Councilman Ortiz. But in addition, it would also  
17   begin to maximize the negotiating strength of City  
18   Council. There's no reason for us to be a pushover  
19   body. We don't accomplish the duties for which we  
20   were elected when we put ourselves in a position of  
21   having no power when we negotiate with the Mayor.  
22   We do put ourselves in a position to honestly  
23   represent those who elect us when we maintain our  
24   power and understand that City government consists  
25   of many issues, all of them are linked together, and

2 you use leverage to deal not only with that issue  
3 but also with other issues.

4 So for that reason, I urge strongly that  
5 we either take no action, as Councilman Kenney

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2 passed unanimously a bill condemning predatory

4 without the Mayor's signature by the end of April.  
5 I was very concerned there were reports that even  
6 representatives from the Philadelphia area both in  
7 the Senate and in the House were considering  
8 support.

9 I ordered my staff to immediately  
10 prepare a resolution since I received this  
11 information during the session today, and they have  
12 prepared it, but before -- just a few minutes ago, I  
13 received a telephone conversation, and I apologize  
14 to the Chair for the interruption in the orderly  
15 processes of Council. I took that call from  
16 Councilwoman Tasco, who is the leader of the fight  
17 in City Council to get this legislation passed. We  
18 all know the long time she spent educating us on the  
19 problems that the predatory lending practices  
20 raised, and she is now very busy in negotiating at  
21 the state level with representatives from the Senate  
22 and the House of Representatives. She urges that we  
23 not present this resolution and hopes that the  
24 discussions she's having both with leadership and  
25 with members, and particularly with Philadelphia

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2 delegation, that the matter will be satisfactorily  
3 resolved.

4 Accordingly, I thank the President for  
5 her consideration permitting me to have this  
6 opportunity to introduce the resolution, but the  
7 resolution had been distributed to each of the  
8 members of the Council so you see the language of it  
9 and you know the content, but I'm not going to be  
10 offering it in the hope that maybe for once in this  
11 case, we're going to stop the effort to preempt  
12 Philadelphia from carrying out its duties.
