2 Madam President. This morning I request a leave
3 of absence for Councilman Cohen.

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
5 thanks the Councilwoman, and leave will be
6 granted.

7 The Chair recognizes Councilman
8 O'Neill.

9 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Madam President,
10 on behalf of the Republicans, there are no
11 requests for leaves of absence.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
13 thanks the gentleman.

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15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
16 will dispense with the regular order of business
17 to recognize guests and visitors joining us in
18 chambers this morning.

19 On behalf of all of City Council, I
20 welcome you to our Council session. We appreciate
21 your taking the time to join us as we attend to
22 the legislative affairs of our city. We certainly
23 invite you to come again.

24 At this time, the Chair recognizes
25 Councilman DiCicco.

2 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Thank you, Madam
3 President. This morning, I take pleasure in
4 introducing two longtime residents of the 1st
5 Councilmatic District, Mr. and Mrs. Veto Petticino
6 (ph.). They have with them this morning a guest
7 from London, England. His name is Mr. Leo Delea
8 (ph.). Mr. Delea?

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: If they are
10 here, would they stand so that we can recognize
11 you.

12 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: He's taking your
13 picture as he's standing.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Welcome,
15 welcome.

16 (Applause.)

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Philadelphia
18 is home to many fine educational institutions.
19 Not least among these is our own Community College
20 of Philadelphia. They are currently celebrating
21 their 25th anniversary. I understand there are
22 double honors today for Community College, as
23 Council is also hosting the Men's Basketball Team.

24 Would Councilman Darrell Clarke and
25 Councilman Frank Rizzo please come to the podium.

2 I invite Community College President Stephen
3 Curtis and those accompanying him to please join
4 the Councilmen.

5 (Councilmen et al. come forward.)

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERA: I stand
7 corrected -- I understand it's the college's 35th
8 anniversary.

9 The Chair recognizes Councilman Clarke.

10 COUNCILMAN CLARKE: Thank you, Madam
11 President. Today we have another group of fine
12 athletes and students from the 5th Councilmatic
13 District. It seems like we're doing this every
14 week. This is great.

15 I'd like to say that Councilman Mariano
16 has also joined us up here. He is also a graduate
17 of Community College, an alumni. Actually, I
18 spent a few years there myself, so. . .

19 This is a resolution honoring the
20 Community College of Philadelphia Men's Basketball
21 Team for winning the Pennsylvania Collegiate
22 Athletic Association Championship.

23 Whereas, Community College of
24 Philadelphia's athletic program has won 23
25 basketball championships in the past 33 years --

2 wow -- and;

3 Whereas, the Community College of
4 Philadelphia's Men's Basketball Team, under the
5 leadership of Coach Larry Conti, concluded their
6 season victoriously, with a 31 and 2 record; and

7 Whereas, on Sunday, February 20, 2000,
8 the Community College of Philadelphia Colonials
9 defeated the Community College of Beaver County
10 101 to 96; and

11 Whereas, the Community College of
12 Beaver County are the nationally-ranked four-time
13 defending State champions; and

14 Whereas, the members of this team are
15 Michael Ajedho, Marcellus Boone, Sharif Brown,
16 Jason Clayton, Ellis Gindraw, Roger Glispy,
17 Denelle Holly, Bill Keene, and Akil Moody -- I
18 hope I didn't mess up anybody's name;

19 Now, therefore, resolved by the Council
20 of the City of Philadelphia that we extend our
21 heartfelt congratulations to Community College of
22 Philadelphia Men's Basketball Team.

23 Resolved further that an engrossed copy
24 of this resolution be presented to Coach Conti as
25 evidence of the sincere sentiments of this

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
8 recognizes President Curtis.

9 PRESIDENT CURTIS: On behalf of the
10 Community College of Philadelphia and certainly
11 the whole athletic program, but particularly the
12 Men's Basketball Team, we are very grateful and
13 delighted to have this recognition. Coach Conti
14 had a long and distinguished tradition at the
15 college and, as you heard, a very successful
16 tradition, but not only athletically but in terms
17 of student athletes. He's very attentive to the
18 academic nature of our program as well.

19 Coach, do you have anything?

20 COACH CONTI: I'd just like to thank my
21 assistant coaches Joe Rome and Donde DeShields
22 (ph.) and all of the players for giving the effort
23 that they did. We do concern ourselves primarily
24 with academics. We have transferred every
25 second-year student that stayed with us to a

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank you and
8 congratulations.

9 The Chair recognizes Councilman Rizzo.

10 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: Thank you, Madam
11 President.

12 Also today, we're going to honor the
13 Community College of Philadelphia upon celebrating
14 its 35th anniversary. And as Councilman Clarke
15 mentioned, Councilman Mariano is a graduate of
16 Community College, and I've asked him to join me
17 to read this resolution.

18 Whereas, the Community College of
19 Philadelphia is an open-admission associate
20 degree-granting institution which provides access
21 to higher education in its programs of study in
22 the liberal arts and sciences career,
23 technologies, and basic academic skills, provides
24 a coherent foundation for college transfer,
25 employment, and a lifelong learning; and

2 Whereas, for 35 years. The Community
3 College of Philadelphia has played a forceful role
4 in both the intellectual and economic development
5 of the City of Philadelphia as it prepares its
6 students to be informed and concerned citizens,
7 active participants in the life of the City, and
8 enable them to meet the changing needs of
9 businesses, industry and the professional; and

10 Whereas, it addresses broad academic,
11 cultural, and political concerns in the City and
12 beyond, the Community College of Philadelphia
13 draws together students from a wide range of ages
14 and backgrounds, and seeks to provide the programs
15 and support they need to achieve their goals; and

16 Whereas. . .

17 COUNCILMAN MARIANO: . . . the
18 Community College of Philadelphia seeks to create
19 a caring environment which is intellectually and
20 culturally dynamic and encourages all students to
21 achieve greater insight into their strength, needs
22 and aspirations, and a great appreciation of their
23 own cultural background, increased awareness and
24 appreciation of the diverse world where they will
25 all be independent-heightened, curious and active,

2 interested intellectual questions and social
3 issues, and improve the ability to pursue paths of
4 inquiry to interpret and evaluate what is
5 discovered and to express reactions effectively
6 and self-fulfillment-based on service to others,

8 enjoyment of present challenges and
9 accomplishments;

10 Now, therefore. . .

11 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: . . . resolved by
12 the Council of the City of Philadelphia that it
13 hereby honors the Community College of
14 Philadelphia upon celebrating its 35th
15 anniversary.

16 Further resolved that an engrossed copy
17 of this resolution be presented to the Community
18 College of Philadelphia as evidence of the sincere

20 I'd like to present this resolution to
21 the President.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank you.

24 PRESIDENT CURTIS: Thank you very much.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: President

2 Curtis, do you want to add anything to what you've
3 already said?

4 PRESIDENT CURTIS: Again, thank you.
5 We're very proud that in the 35-year history of
6 the college, almost one half a million
7 Philadelphians have been served by the various
8 programs that our college provides. This Sunday
9 is the latest group -- about 1350 graduates will
10 be honored in our 34th commencement exercises.

11 So we're very proud of that tradition,
12 we're very proud of the support this Council has
13 provided in those 35 years, and we thank you very
14 much for this distinguished honor today.

15 (Applause.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Council will
17 be at ease.

18 (Council stands at ease, then resumes.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Our second
20 resolution today honors Leslie Seymour.

21 The Chair recognizes Councilwoman
22 Jannie Blackwell to make the presentation, and I
23 ask Miss Seymour and anyone with her to please
24 join Councilwoman Blackwell at the podium.

25 (Councilwoman Blackwell et al. come

2 forward.)

3 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank you.

4 Can we also ask Councilman Mariano to come
5 forward.

6 (Councilman Mariano comes forward.)

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The Chair
8 recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell.

9 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank you,
10 Madam President.

11 This is a resolution congratulating
12 Leslie Seymour.

13 Whereas, Leslie Seymour is a retired
14 27-year veteran of the Philadelphia Police
15 Department, known well for her long-standing
16 commitment to equal justice and civil rights
17 issues. And let me say that she worked very, very
18 hard with us, as an aside, on 52nd Street during
19 years when we've had, and still have, problems
20 there. And I'm especially happy to make this
21 presentation today because many, many years ago --
22 we have a lot of housing down in West
23 Philadelphia, and it was the impetus of a woman
24 named Vera Cook, a community activist, who took
25 her little monthly check and gave it to seniors

2 and fed people. And let me say that most people
3 don't know it, but her father, Vera Cook's father
4 is still alive, and Leslie Seymour helps him --
5 writes bills, goes by, checks on him, and takes
6 care of him there are. And for that, it shows you
7 the caliber, and for that, we'll always be truly
8 grateful; and

9 Whereas, in the late 1960s, Ms. Seymour
10 filed a lawsuit against the Philadelphia Police
11 Department for racially discrimination hiring
12 practices. In the mid-'70s, she challenged the
13 Police Department's assignments and promotional
14 practices in court; and

15 Whereas, Ms. Seymour prevailed in both
16 suits and helped bring back important changes in
17 the way the Police Department operates; and

18 Whereas, Leslie Seymour served on the
19 Philadelphia Chapter Board of Directors of the
20 American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) for nine
21 years. She has been an outspoken advocate on
22 issues involving racial and gender discrimination,
23 police practices and is an avid and vocal opponent
24 of the death; and

25 COUNCILMAN MARIANO: Whereas, for the

1 VISITOR RECOGNITION/PRESENTATIONS

2 first time in its 49-year history, the ACLU
3 Philadelphia Chapter has elected a former police
4 officer to serve as its president. Ms. Leslie
5 Seymour is also the first African-American woman
6 to serve as president of the Philadelphia
7 Chapter. As a former law enforcement officer, Ms.
8 Seymour brings the unique and important
9 perspective to this presidency.

10 Now, therefore, resolved by the Council
11 of the City of Philadelphia that we hereby
12 congratulate Leslie Seymour on her election as
13 president of the Philadelphia Chapter of the
14 American Civil Liberties Union, which has
15 dedicated itself to protecting the rights and
16 personal freedoms in the United States
17 Constitution and the Bill of Rights through
18 advocacy, education, and litigation.

19 Resolved further that an engrossed copy
20 of this resolution be presented to Leslie Seymour
21 as evidence of the sincere sentiments,
22 congratulations, and high esteem of this
23 legislative body. Signed by Council President
24 Anna C. Verna and the rest of City Council.

3 recognizes Ms. Seymour for remarks.

4 MS. SEYMOUR: Good morning to the
5 Council President and the rest of the Council of
6 the City of Philadelphia. I am indeed pleased to
7 be here this morning. First, thanking the
8 Almighty without whose grace, none of this would
9 be possible.

10 I'd like to thank my family. My
11 mother's here with me today. My son and his
12 family couldn't be here because they're in
13 Nebraska, visiting -- my daughter-in-law's father
14 is very ill, so they're not with me today.

15 But this is my entire Philadelphia
16 family (indicating).

17 (Applause.)

18 MS. SEYMOUR: The Breast Health
19 Institute is here today, retired policewomen from
20 the Philadelphia Police Department, and we were
21 policewomen initially.

22 (Applause.)

23 MS. SEYMOUR: The second Baptist Church
24 of Germantown, the Northwest Philadelphia
25 Interfaith Hospitality Network, and the American

2 Civil Liberties Union is here with me today.

3 And I am especially pleased to have
4 Larry Walls, who is the Executive Director of the
5 Philadelphia Baptist Association, who also happens
6 to be a member of my church.

7 Thank you all for being with me. I --
8 I am speechless for a change.

9 (Laughter.)

10 MS. SEYMOUR: Oh, and my pastor is
11 here, Reverend Ernie Flores, and his wife and
12 daughter.

13 Thank you so much for this honor. It
14 has always been my pleasure to serve this city in
15 whatever capacity I was asked to sit in, and I was
16 commenting this morning that the only time I've
17 ever been on this side of the railing was either
18 to give testimony or as part of a police
19 delegation during a demonstration. So I am
20 pleased to be here actively wanted.

21 So thank you all for this wonderful
22 honor, and I thank you very much.

23 (Applause.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Council will
25 be at ease.
