2 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
3 morning.

4 I understand that state law
5 currently requires that the following
6 announcement be made at the beginning of
7 every remote public hearing as follows:
8 Due to the current public health
9 emergency, City Council Committees are
10 currently meeting remotely and we are
11 using Microsoft Teams to make these
12 remote hearings possible.

13 Instructions for how the public
14 may view and offer public testimony of
15 public hearings of Council Committees
16 are included in the public hearing
17 notices that are published in the Daily
18 News, the Inquirer, Legal Intelligencer
19 prior to hearings and can also be found
20 on PHLCouncil.com. I note that the hour
21 has come.

22 Again, today is Tuesday,
23 December 7th, and welcome to everybody
24 to our Streets hearing. Mr. Maynard,
25 will you please call the roll and take

1 attendance of Members that are present.
2 Once your name is called, please
3 indicate that you are present and say a
4 few remarks so that your image may be
5 displayed on the screen.

6 Mr. Clerk.

7 THE CLERK: (Muted).

8 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Mr. Clerk,
9 you're on mute.

10 THE CLERK: I noticed. Thank
11 you, Mr. Chair.

12 Vice-Chair Squilla.

13 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Good
14 morning, Mr. Chair and colleagues. I'm
15 present.

16 THE CLERK: Good morning,
17 Councilmember.

18 Councilmember Bass.

19 (No response.)

20 THE CLERK: Councilmember Oh.

21 COUNCILMAN OH: Good morning,
22 Chairman. Good morning, colleagues.
23 I'm present.

24 THE CLERK: Thank you,
25 Mr. Councilmember.

1 Councilmember Brooks.

2 COUNCILWOMAN BROOKS: Good
3 morning. I'm present.

4 THE CLERK: Thank you,
5 Councilmember Brooks.

6 Councilmember Johnson.
7 (No response.)

8 THE CLERK: Councilmember
9 Gilmore Richardson.

10 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

11 RICHARDSON: Good morning, Mr. Chair.
12 Good morning, colleagues. I'm present.

13 THE CLERK: Thank you,
14 Councilmember Gilmore Richardson.

15 And, Chair Thomas.

16 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: I'm
17 present. Thank you. This hearing is
18 now called to order. This is the public
19 hearing of the Committee on Streets and
20 Services regarding Bill Nos. 210629,
21 210867, 210870, 210918, 210919, 210921,
22 210929, 210930, 210931 and 210932.

23 Mr. Maynard, will you please
24 read the titles of the bills.

25 THE CLERK: Of course. Bill

1 No. 210629, an ordinance authorizing the
2 revision of lines and grades on a
3 portion of City Plan No. 120 by striking
4 from the City Plan and vacating Nicholas
5 Street and Turner Street, each from 20th
6 Street to 21st Street, and reserving and
7 placing on the City Plan rights-of-way
8 for various utility purposes within the
9 beds of Nicholas and Turner Streets
10 being stricken and authorizing
11 acceptance of the grant to the City of
12 the said rights-of-way, all under
13 certain terms and conditions.

14 Bill No. 210867, an ordinance
15 amending Chapter 12-2700 of The
16 Philadelphia Code, entitled "Permit
17 Parking Districts," by amending the
18 boundaries for Permit Parking District
19 19, all under certain terms and
20 conditions.

21 Bill No. 210870, an ordinance
22 amending Chapter 10-400 of The
23 Philadelphia Code, Noise and Excessive
24 Vibration, to establish a prohibition
25 loud noise emanating from a motor

1 vehicle and to add a section authorizing
2 use of an automated system for
3 determining violations of the
4 prohibition, all under certain terms and
5 conditions.

6 Bill No. 210918, an ordinance
7 regulating the direction of movement of
8 traffic on Camac Street between Wagner
9 Avenue and Fisher Avenue, all under
10 certain terms and conditions.

11 Bill No. 210919, an ordinance
12 regulating the direction of movement of
13 traffic on East Godfrey Avenue between
14 Summerdale Avenue and Pratt Street, all
15 under certain terms and conditions.

16 No. 210921, an ordinance
17 authorizing various encroachments at
18 3536 at Calumet Street, Philadelphia,
19 Pennsylvania 19129, under certain terms
20 and conditions.

21 Bill No. 210929, an ordinance
22 establishing parking regulations in the
23 vicinity of Day Street and Wildey
24 Street; Thompson Street and Columbia
25 Avenue; Oxford Street and Belgrade

1 Street; East Montgomery Street and
2 Thompson Street; Columbia Avenue and
3 Belgrade Street; Crease Street and
4 Thompson Street; Belgrade Street and
5 Oxford Street.

6 Bill No. 210930, an ordinance
7 amending Section 5 of an Ordinance, Bill
8 No. 200423, approved November 10, 2020,
9 entitled "An Ordinance authorizing
10 Keystone Property group, Owner, to
11 construct, own and maintain a proposed
12 exterior building ramp at 100 South
13 Independence Mall West, Philadelphia,
14 Pennsylvania, 19106 property, all under
15 certain terms and conditions," by
16 extending the period of compliance with
17 the terms and conditions stated therein.

18 No. 210931, an ordinance
19 amending Section 5 of an Ordinance, Bill
20 No. 200092, approved March 11, 2020,
21 entitled "An Ordinance authorizing
22 Independence Park Hotel, Owner, to
23 construct, own and maintain a proposed
24 exterior building ramp at 235 Chestnut
25 Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania 19106

1 property, all under certain terms and
2 conditions," by extending the period of
3 compliance with the terms and conditions
4 stated therein.

5 And finally, Bill No. 210932,
6 an ordinance authorizing various
7 encroachments on North Broad Street in
8 the vicinity of 1344 to 1348 Arch
9 Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania
10 19107, under certain terms and
11 conditions.

12 These are the bills to be heard
13 by the Committee today.

14 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you,
15 Mr. Clerk.

16 Before we begin to hear
17 testimony from the witnesses we have for
18 today, everyone who has been invited to
19 the meeting to testify should be aware
20 that the public hearing is being
21 recorded. Because the hearing is
22 public, participants and viewers have no
23 reasonable expectation of privacy. By
24 continuing to be in the meeting, you are
25 consenting to being recorded.

1 Additionally, prior to
2 recognizing Members for questions or
3 comments they have for the witnesses, I
4 will note for the record at this time
5 that we will use the chat feature
6 available in Microsoft Teams to allow
7 Members to signify that they wish to be
8 recognized. In order to comply with the
9 Sunshine Act, the chat feature must only
10 be used for this purpose only.

11 Mr. Maynard, will you please
12 call the first set of bills and
13 witnesses we have to testify this
14 morning.

15 THE CLERK: Of course,
16 Mr. Chair.

17 The first bill that we'll hear
18 from is Bill 210629. Noelle Marconi
19 from Streets and Sarah Chiu from
20 Planning will be the witnesses
21 testifying on this bill.

22 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you.
23 Good morning. Please state your name
24 for the record and you may begin with
25 your testimony.

1 MS. MARCONI: Good morning,
2 Chairperson Thomas and members of the
3 Streets and Services Committee. My name
4 is Noelle Marconi and I'm the Director
5 of Legislative Affairs for the
6 Department of Streets. I'm here to
7 offer testimony on Bill No. 210629
8 introduced by Councilmember Parker on
9 behalf of Council President Clarke.

10 This is not an Administration
11 ordinance, but an ordinance requested by
12 Hercules W. Grigos, Esquire of Klehr
13 Harrison Harvey Branzburg LLP
14 representing the Philadelphia Housing
15 Authority. The purpose of this
16 ordinance is to authorize the striking
17 from the City Plan and the vacating of
18 Nicholas Street, from 20th Street to
19 21st Street and Turner Street, from 20th
20 street to 21st Street.

21 This action has been requested
22 by PHA in order to consolidate land and
23 facilitate the development and
24 construction of a logistics center and
25 maintenance building to support

1 PHA-owned housing and the neighborhood.
2 Rights-of-life for utility purposes will
3 be reserved in both streets being
4 stricken to accommodate existing water,
5 sewer, gas and other public utilities,
6 which will remain in place. This
7 ordinance is supported by the Department
8 of Streets and is recommended to your
9 Committee for a favorable action. This
10 concludes my testimony and I'm pleased
11 to answer any questions you may have.

12 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you
13 for your testimony.

14 Next witness, please state your
15 name for the record and you may begin
16 with your testimony.

17 MS. CHIU: Good morning,
18 Chairmember Thomas and members of the
19 Streets and Services Committee. I'm
20 Sarah Chiu, City Planner with the
21 Philadelphia City Planning Commission.
22 I'm here to testify on Bill No. 210629,
23 which was introduced by Councilmember
24 Parker for Council President Clarke on
25 June 24, 2021.

1 This bill will strike the 2000
2 blocks of Nicholas Street and Turner
3 Street to enable the Philadelphia
4 Housing Authority to build a warehouse
5 outdoor storage. The City Planning
6 Commission at its meeting of September
7 23, 2021 recommended Bill No. 210629 for
8 approval. I will be happy to answer any
9 questions at this time.

10 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you
11 for your testimony.

12 Are there any questions from
13 members of this Committee for this set
14 of witnesses?

15 (No response.)

16 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
17 none, thank you for your testimony
18 today. It is very much appreciated.

19 Mr. Clerk, will you please call
20 the next set of witnesses and the next
21 set of bills to testify this morning.

22 THE CLERK: Of course,
23 Mr. Chair.

24 The next bill to be heard is
25 Bill No. 210930. We'll hear from Noelle

1 Marconi from Streets and Sarah Chiu from
2 Planning, and we'll also hear from Brett
3 Feldman on public comment.

4 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
5 morning. You can state your name for
6 the record and begin with your
7 testimony.

8 MS. MARCONI: Good morning,
9 Chairperson Thomas and members of the
10 Streets and Services Committee. My name
11 is Noelle Marconi and I'm the Director
12 of Legislative Affairs for the
13 Department of Streets. I'm here today
14 to offer testimony on Bill No. 210930
15 introduced by Councilmember Squilla.

16 This ordinance authorizes
17 Keystone Property Group, the owner, to
18 construct, own and maintain a proposed
19 exterior building ramp at 100 South
20 Independence Mall and extends a time
21 period for compliance. Bill No. 200432
22 approved December -- excuse me, November
23 10, 2020 was conditional upon certain
24 requirements being complied with within
25 one year from the date of approval.

1 Bill No. 210930 will extend the
2 period of compliance until November 10,
3 2022. The Department of Streets have no
4 objection as to this bill. Thank you
5 for the opportunity to appear before you
6 today. I will be happy to answer any
7 questions.

8 MS. CHIU: Good morning,
9 Chairmember Thomas and members of the
10 Streets and Services Committee. I'm
11 Sarah Chiu, City Planner with the
12 Philadelphia City Planning Commission.
13 I'm here to testify on Bill No. 210930,
14 which was introduced by Councilmember
15 Squilla on November 18, 2020.

16 This bill will extend the
17 timeline for compliance with the terms
18 and conditions of the original
19 ordinance, Bill 200423, which authorized
20 the construction of the next year
21 building ramp at 100 South Independence
22 Mall West. The Planning Commission had
23 approved Bill No. 200423 on October 20,
24 2020. The Planning Commission is
25 scheduled to consider this current bill

1 at its meeting on November 9, 2021 --
2 December 9, I'm sorry, 2021 with a staff
3 recommendation for approval. I'll be
4 happy to answer any questions that you
5 have at this time. Thank you.

6 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
7 morning. Our next witness for this
8 panel, you can state your name for the
9 record and you may begin with your
10 testimony.

11 MR. FELDMAN: Yes. Good
12 morning, Mr. Chair, members of the
13 Committee. My name is Brett Feldman. I
14 represent the property owner at 100
15 South Independence Mall West as well as
16 a major lead tenant of that building.
17 We just wanted to thank Planning and
18 Streets for their work with us on this.

19 This is a handicap ramp to make
20 the building more ADA-compliant for a
21 new lead tenant. I would like to thank
22 Councilmember Squilla for his support of
23 this ordinance. The bill was previously
24 passed due to COVID. The construction
25 did not happen within the period of time

1 set forth with the bill, but the tenant
2 now again wants to move ahead with the
3 construction of this ramp, and that is
4 why we need this ordinance extended for
5 an additional year. With that, I will
6 be available for any questions, but
7 thank you to all.

8 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you
9 to everyone on this panel for your
10 testimony.

11 Are there any questions or
12 comments from members of the Committee
13 for this panel?

14 (No response.)

15 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
16 none, I want to say thank you to all of
17 the witnesses for your testimony this
18 morning. We appreciate it.

19 Mr. Maynard, will you please
20 call the next set of bills and witnesses
21 we have to testify this morning.

22 THE CLERK: Of course,
23 Mr. Chair.

24 The next two bills we'll hear
25 on are Bills 210931 and 210932. The two

1 witnesses for both bills are Noelle
2 Marconi from Streets and Sarah Chiu from
3 Planning.

4 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
5 morning. Please state your name for the
6 record and you may begin with your
7 testimony.

8 MS. MARCONI: Good morning,
9 Chairperson Thomas and members of the
10 Streets and Services Committee. My name
11 is Noelle Marconi and I am the Director
12 of Legislative Affairs for the
13 Department of Streets. I'm here today
14 to offer testimony on Bill No. 210931
15 introduced by Councilmember Squilla.

16 This ordinance authorizes
17 Independence Park Hotel owner to
18 construct, own and maintain a proposed
19 exterior building ramp at 235 Chestnut
20 Street and extends the time period for
21 compliance. Bill No. 200092 approved
22 March 11, 2020 was conditional upon
23 certain requirements being complied with
24 within one year for the date of
25 approval.

1 Bill No. 210931 will extend the
2 period of compliance until March 11,
3 2022. The Department of Streets have no
4 objections to this bill. Thank you for
5 the opportunity to appear before you
6 today. I will be happy to answer any
7 questions you have.

8 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
9 morning. You can begin with your
10 testimony.

11 MS. CHIU: Good morning,
12 Chairmember Thomas and members of the
13 Streets and Services Committee. I'm
14 Sarah Chiu, City Planner with the
15 Philadelphia City Planning Commission.
16 I'm here to testify on Bill No. 210931
17 which was introduced by Councilmember
18 Squilla on November 18, 2021.

19 This bill will extend the
20 timeline for compliance with the terms
21 and conditions of the original
22 ordinance, Bill No. 200092, which
23 authorized the construction of an
24 exterior building ramp at 235 Chestnut
25 Street. The Planning Commission

1 approved Bill No. 200092 in February
2 2020. The Planning Commission is
3 scheduled to consider this current bill
4 at its meeting on December 9, 2021 with
5 a staff recommendation for approval. I
6 will be happy to answer any questions
7 that you have at this time.

8 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you
9 both for your testimony.

10 Are there any questions from
11 members of the Committee for this panel?

12 (No response.)

13 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
14 none, I want to say thank you for your
15 testimony. We appreciate it.

16 Mr. Maynard, will you please
17 call the next set of bills and witnesses
18 we have to testify this morning.

19 THE CLERK: The next bill we'll
20 hear on is 210932. Noelle Marconi from
21 Streets and Sarah Chiu from Planning are
22 the two witnesses.

23 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Please
24 state your name for the record and you
25 may begin with your testimony.

1 MS. MARCONI: Good morning,
2 Chairperson Thomas and members of the
3 Streets and Services Committee. My name
4 is Noelle Marconi and I'm the Director
5 of Legislative Affairs for the
6 Department of Streets. I am here today
7 to offer testimony on Bill No. 210932
8 introduced by Councilmember Squilla.

9 This bill authorizes Arch
10 Street United Methodist Church or a
11 subsequent owner, the owner, to install,
12 own and maintain encroachments at
13 1344-1348 Arch Street, under certain
14 terms and conditions. The Department of
15 Streets support this proposed handicap
16 accessible building ramp as it will
17 maintain the 11 feet passable sidewalk
18 space, which meets the complete streets
19 minimum width. This completes my
20 testimony. I am pleased to answer any
21 questions you may have.

22 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you.
23 Please state your name for the record
24 and you may begin with your testimony.

25 MS. CHIU: Good morning,

1 Chairmember Thomas and members of the
2 Streets and Services Committee. I'm
3 Sarah Chiu, City Planner with the
4 Philadelphia City Planning Commission.
5 I'm here to testify on Bill 210932,
6 which was introduced by Councilmember
7 Squilla on November 18, 2021.

8 This bill will allow the
9 construction of an ADA accessible ramp
10 and building steps encroachment which
11 are located along the easterly right-of-
12 way of North Broad Street at the
13 building entrance near the intersection
14 of Broad Street and Cuthbert Street.
15 This encroachment will leave 11 feet of
16 clear walking zone space for pedestrian
17 traffic, and it has been a complete
18 streets policy standards.

19 The (inaudible) Commission has
20 also reviewed and approved this
21 proposal. The Planning Commission is
22 scheduled to consider this bill at its
23 meeting on December 9, 2021 with a staff
24 recommendation for approval. I'll be
25 happy to answer any questions at this

1 time. Thank you.

2 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you
3 both for your testimony.

4 I do want to take a minute to
5 note for the record that Councilmember
6 Cindy Bass did join the hearing some
7 time ago. So thank you, Councilmember
8 Bass.

9 Are there any questions or
10 comments from members of the Committee
11 for this particular panel and this bill?

12 (No response.)

13 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
14 none, I want to say again thank you for
15 your testimony.

16 Mr. Maynard, will you please
17 call the next set of bills and witnesses
18 we have to testify this morning.

19 THE CLERK: Of course,
20 Mr. Chair.

21 The Clerk thanks Sarah Chiu for
22 her time and she's excused as she has no
23 other bills to testify today. The next
24 two bills to be heard on are 210867 and
25 210929. Dionne Bracley from the

1 Philadelphia Parking Authority is the
2 sole witness on both bills.

3 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
4 morning. Please state your name for the
5 record and you can provide your
6 testimony consecutively for both bills.

7 MS. BRACLEY: Good day,
8 Council. My name is Dionne Bracley,
9 Deputy Manager at the Philadelphia
10 Parking Authority. Thank you for
11 allowing me to testify before Council
12 regarding Ordinance --

13 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: I'm sorry.
14 I'm sorry. Can you speak up just a
15 little bit. I can hear you, but I just
16 want to make sure that others can hear
17 you as well. It's a little low.

18 MS. BRACLEY: Yes, sir. Good
19 day, Council. My name is Dionne
20 Bracley, Deputy Manager at the
21 Philadelphia Parking Authority. Thank
22 you for allowing me to testify before
23 Council regarding Ordinance 210867,
24 amending Permit Parking District. The
25 Philadelphia Parking Authority has no

1 objection to the ordinance previously
2 read before Council and recommends
3 favorable consideration. Thank you
4 again for your time. I am happy to
5 answer any questions at this time.

6 Good morning, Council. My name
7 is Dionne Bracley, Deputy Manager at the
8 Philadelphia Parking Authority. Thank
9 you for allowing me to testify before
10 Council regarding Ordinance 210929,
11 establishing parking regulations. The
12 Philadelphia Parking Authority has no
13 objection to the ordinance previously
14 read before Council and recommends
15 favorable consideration. Thank you
16 again for your time. I'm happy to
17 answer any questions at this time.

18 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you
19 for your testimony.

20 Are there any questions for
21 members of this Committee or comments
22 from members for this witness on these
23 set of bills?

24 (No response.)

25 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing

1 none, I want to say thank you again for
2 your testimony.

3 Mr. Maynard, will you please
4 call the next set of bills and witnesses
5 we have to testify this morning.

6 THE CLERK: Yes, Mr. Chair.

7 The next bills we'll hear on --
8 we'll hear on actually just one bill.
9 It's Bill 210870. The witness from the
10 Administration that we'll hear from is
11 Francis Healy from the Police
12 Department, and we have public comment
13 from Mark Zachary as well.

14 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
15 morning. Please state your name for the
16 record and you may begin with your
17 testimony.

18 INSPECTOR HEALY: Good morning,
19 Chairman Thomas and other members of the
20 Committee on Streets and Services. My
21 name is Francis Healy and I'm Special
22 Advisor to the Commissioner. On behalf
23 of the Commissioner, thank you for
24 allowing me to provide testimony
25 regarding Bill No. 210870.

1 At the outset, let me please
2 state that the Philadelphia Police
3 Department is well aware of how loud
4 noise emanating from vehicles can impact
5 the quality of life in our
6 neighborhoods, so we appreciate the
7 efforts of this body to address these
8 concerns. Excessive loud sounds,
9 whether it be derived from use of or
10 emanates from parts of a motor vehicle
11 clearly are a quality-of-life issue in
12 our neighborhoods.

13 As you probably know, the PPD
14 is modifying the enforcement of
15 quality-of-life offenses. For this
16 reason, we support the automated
17 enforcement of these violations in a
18 manner similar to red light and speed
19 enforcement cameras in Philadelphia.
20 This bill is consistent with the overall
21 directions being taken by the PPD when
22 enforcing quality-of-life offenses.
23 Specifically, this bill allows for the
24 enforcement without direct police
25 involvement. As a result, we believe

1 that bill strikes the right balance
2 between issuing violations to
3 individuals negatively impacting the
4 quality of life for our City while
5 reducing physical interactions with the
6 motorists. This concludes my testimony.
7 I'll be happy to answer your questions
8 at this time.

9 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you.
10 Before we allow the next witness to
11 testify, I want to take a moment to
12 allow Councilmember Squilla to have the
13 floor.

14 Chair recognizes Councilmember
15 Squilla.

16 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you,
17 Mr. Chair.

18 And thank you, Mr. Healy, for
19 your testimony. A couple of quick
20 questions because we still have some
21 more work to do on the implementation
22 process of this. We were hoping to
23 implement it similar to the red light
24 and/or speed cameras that are now in
25 place here in the City of Philadelphia.

1 But do you believe that these
2 cameras also as issued could be to
3 capture not only noise, but say vehicles
4 that are riding on sidewalks or riding
5 in the wrong direction? Would that also
6 be something that could be a violation
7 that could be written from these type of
8 cameras?

9 INSPECTOR HEALY: Personally,
10 I've never seen it done that way. But
11 as long as the -- this is my own
12 personal opinion. If the cameras can
13 verify the offense, there's no reason
14 why the offense couldn't be issued
15 electronically like they're doing with
16 speed cameras and the red light cameras.

17 The question would be
18 verifiability, which is speed cameras
19 and red light cameras have a whole lot
20 of technology to document the actual
21 violations, meaning the photograph
22 prior, during and after the incident.
23 So I'm not sure how it would work. But
24 feasibility -- I mean, theoretically it
25 would be possible, yes.

1 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Okay. All
2 right. Thank you very much. We're
3 still working with the Parking Authority
4 and the City Administration on
5 implementation of this. We would like
6 to have this testimony on record today.
7 But we're going to hold the bill until
8 we can get how implementation will be
9 set forth.

10 But I just want to say that
11 this could also be done again in the
12 guise of how the City in the direction
13 we're going where we're not engaging,
14 we're not profiling individuals. All
15 we're doing is looking at violations and
16 what vehicles are violating them, and
17 then being able to review them by
18 authorities and then issue tickets if
19 those reviews are warranted. So thank
20 you so much for your testimony and
21 looking forward to continue working with
22 you, the City Administration and the PPA
23 until we have a final conclusion on how
24 this will be implemented and then
25 processed.

1 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you,
2 Councilmember. We appreciate your
3 comments and your questions.

4 We do have one other witness to
5 testify. So if you don't mind,
6 Councilmember Brooks, I'm going to let
7 the next witness testify and then I'll
8 go to Councilmember Brooks for comments.
9 So our next witness for this panel --

10 COUNCILWOMAN BROOKS: I can
11 hold my questions --

12 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: I'm sorry,
13 Councilmem --

14 COUNCILWOMAN BROOKS: I'm going
15 to hold my questions, and I'll talk to
16 the bill's sponsor about the questions
17 that I have currently.

18 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Okay.
19 Thank you, Councilmember Brooks.

20 The next witness for this
21 panel, please state your name for the
22 record and you may begin with your
23 testimony.

24 (No response.)

25 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Mr. Clerk,

1 I thought we had more than one --

2 THE CLERK: We do. We have
3 Mark Zachary.

4 Council Support, can we have
5 Mr. Zachary.

6 MR. ZACHARY: Yes.

7 THE CLERK: Mr. Zachary --

8 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Please
9 state your name for the record and you
10 can begin with your testimony.

11 MR. ZACHARY: Yes. My name is
12 Mark Zachary. I am a resident taxpayer
13 of Philadelphia. I live in the 7th
14 Councilmanic, and I would like to say
15 that I applaud the City's efforts in
16 shifting towards an objective way to
17 enforce traffic laws in this City. I
18 think the previous speaker from the
19 police department hit the nail on the
20 head, that if you're going to move away
21 from subjective enforcement, in other
22 words, stopping people on the street and
23 having a physical interaction with them
24 which is where Council moved to, then
25 you have to move towards an objective

1 way to enforce traffic in this City.

2 And believe me, I feel the
3 breadth of this City on my way to work
4 as a blue collar worker, by the way, for
5 23 years, that the things that I've seen
6 you would not believe. So it's gotten
7 worse. It's gotten incredibly worse in
8 the last few years actually. So I would
9 just say that -- I'll conclude with
10 this, you need to be much more radical
11 in your thinking and your implementation
12 of these types of policies. In other
13 words, there's only a few speed cameras
14 on Roosevelt Boulevard. There needs to
15 be speed cameras throughout the City,
16 not 5 or 10 of them. There needs to be
17 hundreds of them. There needs to be
18 stoplight cameras, hundreds of them.

19 There needs to be cameras that
20 capture extreme and radical and
21 dangerous driving that happens
22 throughout this City. And those cameras
23 need to be used to ticket people and
24 bring people to protect the public. So
25 this is a great day, but you need to be

1 much more radical. And it's
2 disappointing to me that I don't really
3 hear a whole lot of that. I hear kind
4 of a start of that. I think that your
5 constituents will thank you, especially
6 those of us who have to drive in the
7 City. Thank you.

8 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you
9 for your testimony. We appreciate it.

10 Are there any other questions
11 or comments from members of this
12 Committee for this particular panel?

13 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you,
14 Mr. Chair. I just want to say one more
15 thing and --

16 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Chair
17 recognizes Councilmember Squilla.

18 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Yes. We
19 are going to hold this bill and we're
20 willing to work with colleagues and the
21 Administration as we look to how it will
22 be implemented and then set forth. So
23 thank you for your time today and happy
24 to work with everybody who's interested
25 in participating in this process.

1 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you,
2 Councilmember Squilla, and thank you for
3 your leadership on this issue. We know
4 that this is some important work that
5 you're leading, so thank you. Thank you
6 so much.

7 Mr. Clerk, can you please call
8 the next set of bills and witnesses we
9 have to testify this morning.

10 THE CLERK: Yes. The next set
11 of bills is Bills 210918, 210919 and
12 210921. Noelle Marconi from Streets is
13 the sole witness on all three bills.

14 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
15 morning. Please state your name for the
16 record and you can communicate your
17 testimony consecutively for all three
18 bills.

19 MS. MARCONI: Good morning,
20 Chairperson Thomas and members of the
21 Streets and Services Committee. My name
22 is Noelle Marconi and I'm the Director
23 of Legislative Affairs for the
24 Department of Streets. I'm here today
25 to offer testimony on Bill No. 210918

1 introduced by Councilmember Parker.

2 This ordinance regulates the
3 direction of movement of traffic on
4 Camac Street between Wagner Avenue and
5 Fisher Avenue. This regulation was
6 posted on November 18, 2021 as a trial.
7 We have not received any complaints or
8 concerns from residents. As such, the
9 Department of Streets have no objection
10 to this bill. Thank you for the
11 opportunity to appear before you today.
12 I'll be happy to answer any questions
13 you may have.

14 Good morning, Chairperson
15 Thomas and members of the Streets and
16 Services Committee. My name is Noelle
17 Marconi and I'm the Director of
18 Legislative Affairs for the Department
19 of Streets. I'm here today to offer
20 testimony on Bill No. 210919 introduced
21 by Councilmember Parker.

22 This ordinance regulates the
23 direction of movement of traffic on East
24 Godfrey Avenue between Summerdale Avenue
25 and Pratt Street. This one-way change

1 will be made as part of a private
2 development project at 5000 Summerdale
3 Avenue. We expect construction to be
4 completed on the project in 2022. The
5 Streets Department has no objection to
6 this bill. Thank you for the
7 opportunity to appear before you today.
8 I will be happy to answer any questions
9 you may have.

10 Good morning, Chairperson
11 Thomas and members of the Streets and
12 Services Committee. My name is Noelle
13 Marconi and I'm the Director of
14 Legislative Affairs for the Department
15 of Streets. I'm here today to offer
16 testimony on Bill No. 210921 introduced
17 by Councilmember Jones.

18 This bill authorizes the owner
19 to construct, own and maintain an
20 encroachment, which is a (inaudible)
21 located at 3536 Calumet Street, all
22 under certain terms and conditions. The
23 Department of Streets supports this
24 proposed encroachment as it is being
25 placed within the furnishing zone and

1 will maintain the 5 feet passable
2 sidewalk space, which meets the complete
3 streets walking zone minimum width.

4 This concludes my testimony. And I'm
5 pleased to answer any questions you may
6 have.

7 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you
8 for your testimony.

9 Are there any questions from
10 members of this Committee or comments
11 from members of this Committee for this
12 witness on these set of bills?

13 (No response.)

14 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
15 none, I want to thank you for your
16 testimony.

17 Mr. Maynard, will you please
18 call the next set of bills and witnesses
19 we have to testify this morning.

20 THE CLERK: Mr. Chair, that
21 concludes the bills before the Committee
22 to be heard today.

23 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you,
24 Mr. Clerk.

25 Are there any other questions

1 or comments from members of this
2 Committee?

3 (No response.)

4 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: There being
5 none, Mr. Maynard -- sorry. This
6 concludes the hearing, and now we'll go
7 into the public meeting. So there being
8 no further questions from members of the
9 Committee and no other witnesses to
10 testify, I will ask if there is anyone
11 else present in the hearing whose name
12 we have failed to call that wishes to
13 offer testimony on any of the bills
14 being considered today?

15 (No response.)

16 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
17 none, I want to thank all of the panels
18 of witnesses for their participation
19 today. We value your opinions. I now
20 invite all the panels of witnesses to
21 please disconnect from the meeting
22 before we go into our public meeting.
23 We will now pause the proceedings
24 briefly as multiple participants leave
25 the hearing.

1 This concludes the public
2 hearing of the Committee. We will now
3 go into the public meeting to consider
4 the action to be taken on the bills
5 before this Committee today.

6 Mr. Maynard, will you please
7 call the roll to take attendance.
8 Members that are in attendance, will you
9 please indicate that you are present
10 when your name is called. Also, say a
11 few brief words when responding so your
12 image will be displayed on the screen.

13 Mr. Maynard.

14 THE CLERK: Vice-Chair Squilla.

15 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Good
16 morning, Mr. Chair and colleagues.
17 Present.

18 THE CLERK: Thank you,
19 Vice-chair.

20 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Morning.

21 THE CLERK: Councilmember Bass.

22 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
23 morning. I am present. Thank you very
24 much, Mr. Chairman and company.

25 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good

1 morning.

2 THE CLERK: Councilmember Oh.

3 COUNCILMAN OH: I am still
4 here. Thank you.

5 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
6 morning. Thank you.

7 THE CLERK: Councilmember
8 Brooks.

9 COUNCILWOMAN BROOKS: Good
10 morning. I'm present.

11 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
12 morning.

13 THE CLERK: Councilmember
14 Johnson.

15 (No response.)

16 THE CLERK: Councilmember
17 Gilmore Richardson.

18 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

19 RICHARDSON: Good morning, Mr. Chair and
20 colleagues. I'm present.

21 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
22 morning.

23 THE CLERK: And, Chair Thomas.

24 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good

25 morning. Present. Thank you. A quorum

1 of the Committee members is present.

2 The Chair recognizes
3 Councilmember Squilla for a single
4 motion to approve the amendments to the
5 bills that are being considered today.

6 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you,
7 Mr. Chair.

8 I offer an amendment to Bill
9 No. 210899. A copy of the amendment has
10 been circulated to all members of the
11 Committee, and I move for that amendment
12 for Bill No. 2108 --

13 THE CLERK: Mr. Squilla, I
14 apologize. That's an error on my part
15 if that's the number listed.

16 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Okay.

17 THE CLERK: Just give me one
18 moment.

19 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: If you
20 want to send me the new script. Page 5.

21 THE CLERK: I apologize. It's
22 not paging on mine right now but --

23 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: No, I'm
24 sorry. I got it. I had the wrong
25 script.

1 THE CLERK: It happens to me
2 too. I have 210921 and 210932. Do you
3 have that?

4 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: I've got
5 it. I apologize, David and Mr. Chair.
6 I had the wrong script in front of me at
7 that time.

8 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: No problem.

9 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: So thank
10 you, Mr. Chair.

11 I offer an amendment to Bill
12 Nos. 210921 and 210932. A copy of the
13 amendments have been circulated to all
14 members of the Committee and I move for
15 these amendments to be approved.

16 COUNCILMAN OH: Second.

17 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: It's been
18 moved and properly seconded that the
19 amendments to the bills just read by
20 Councilmember Squilla be approved.

21 All those in favor of the
22 motion will signify by saying aye.

23 (Aye.)

24 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Those
25 opposed?

1 (No response.)

2 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: The ayes
3 have it and the motion carries. These
4 amendments have been approved.

5 The Chair recognizes
6 Councilmember Squilla for a single
7 motion for the bills that are being
8 considered today.

9 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Yes,
10 Mr. Chair.

11 I just want for the record
12 210870 be held by the call of the
13 sponsor. And we will move that Bill
14 Nos. 210692, 210867, 210918, 210919,
15 210921, 210929, 21930, 210931 and
16 210932, including any amendments that
17 have just been approved be reported from
18 this Committee with a favorable
19 recommendation and further move that the
20 rules of Council be suspended to permit
21 the first reading of these bills at the
22 next session of Council.

23 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

24 RICHARDSON: Second.

25 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: It's been

1 moved and properly seconded that the
2 bills just read by Councilmember
3 Squilla, including any amendments that's
4 been approved today be reported from
5 this Committee with a favorable
6 recommendation and further move that the
7 rules of Council be suspended to permit
8 the first reading of the bills at the
9 next Council session.

10 All in favor of the motion will
11 signify by saying aye.

12 (Aye.)

13 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Those
14 opposed?

15 (No response.)

16 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: The ayes
17 have it and the motion carries.

18 This concludes the business for
19 the Committee on the Streets and
20 Services today. I do want to say thank
21 you to everybody for your support and
22 your attendance here today. We
23 appreciate it and we appreciate the good
24 work that you all are doing. Have a
