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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
3 morning, everyone.

4 (Good morning.)

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
6 hour has come. We have established a
7 quorum. I'd ask all guests and visitors
8 to please retire behind the rail.
9 Members will take their seat. We'll get
10 started. Council will be in session.

11 I would like to ask all guests
12 and visitors, if you have a device, be it
13 cell phone or some other type of
14 electronic device, will you please turn
15 it off or place it on silent. Thank you
16 very much for your cooperation.

17 To give our invocation this
18 morning, the Chair recognizes Reverend
19 Gregory Holston, Senior Pastor of New
20 Vision United Methodist Church. He is
21 here today as the guest of Councilman
22 Wilson Goode, Jr.

23 I would ask all members and
24 guests to please rise.

25 (Members and guests rise.)

2 REVEREND HOLSTON: Giving honor
3 to this great Chamber, to Councilman
4 Clarke, Chair of this Council, and all
5 the Councilmembers who are here today.
6 It's a great honor to be before you, and
7 it is good to recognize that this
8 practice of invocation is an honor that
9 is done so that we can acknowledge God's
10 presence in the midst of this great work
11 that we do to build great cities all
12 across this country. And so many people
13 honor this process of invocation. So
14 let's be mindful of that as we pray
15 together today.

16 Dear Heavenly Father, we thank
17 you for your presence with us today. We
18 are praying for this Council and this
19 Council session, God, that you will move
20 in a mighty way here today, for the
21 challenges are great, for we live in a
22 city that has at the same time the best
23 of times and also the worst of times; a
24 city with booming economic opportunity,
25 but at the same time a poverty rate that

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2 is top ten of all -- in the top ten of
3 all top ten cities in the country; a city
4 that boasts some of the greatest
5 education centers in the world, but yet
6 has a public school system that is under
7 attack and underfunded; a city that is
8 booming in its center parts, but
9 nevertheless has many sections that are
10 suffering 40 to 50 percent poverty rates;
11 a city with the greatest healthcare
12 systems like the Temple healthcare system
13 and University of Pennsylvania, but
14 nevertheless we still have an infant
15 mortality rate that is much too high.

16 God, give us the courage today
17 to deal with a city that's making
18 millions for many, but yet 12.9 percent
19 of our population live in deep poverty,
20 only making \$5,500 per year.

21 God, give us the courage to
22 deal with as we celebrate the children
23 like the Taney kids who were in the
24 Little League, but at the same time 40
25 percent of our children go to bed hungry

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2 every night; a city with rich history of
3 union organizing, but where workers at
4 the airport and other places are denied
5 an opportunity to organize and are still
6 not getting a living wage; a city where
7 new development is happening, high rises
8 are occurring, and rehab is going on, but
9 yet homeowners who have lived here for
10 years are being pushed out and even homes
11 are being stolen by unscrupulous
12 developers.

13 We live in this paradox. We
14 live in these two realities. We live in
15 these two cities today, and we pray for
16 this Council, who has the charge today to
17 try to bring together these two realities
18 into one living reality, one living city
19 shining on a hill that can make a
20 difference in the world today.

21 So we call on them to stand up
22 with courage like never before, courage
23 to stand up against the special interests
24 and political interests that divide us
25 and keep us separate; to stand up for

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2 those who are poor and dispossessed and
3 downtrodden, who need a helping hand from
4 those who are in power today; to stand
5 with courage to end the City of despair
6 and to make us a city of hope; to stand
7 and confront those enemies of our
8 children here and statewide who will hold
9 out and hold back financial funding for
10 our schools; to stand up and stand
11 forward and stand against those economic
12 interests, to bring us together, to bring
13 us hope, to bring dignity to our elders,
14 to bring hope again to our children, to
15 really build a city where people of all
16 races and creed and religions can walk
17 together and stand together and be
18 together, to end the plague on mass
19 incarceration and stand for a mass
20 opportunity for all.

21 We come and pray together now,
22 God, that you will touch and heal and
23 deliver and strengthen us so we make us
24 truly a city of opportunity that will
25 work for all.

10 (Council at ease.)

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Thank you very much.

13 The next order of business is
14 the approval of the meeting of Thursday,
15 October 9th, 2014, and the Chair
16 recognizes Councilman Greenlee.

17 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
18 you, Mr. President. I move that the
19 Journal of the meeting of Thursday,
20 October 9th, 2014 be approved.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Can
22 I get a second.

23 (Duly seconded.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

25 Thank you very much. It's been moved and

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2 properly seconded that the Journal of the
3 meeting of Thursday, October 9th, 2014
4 stand approved.

5 All those in favor say aye.

6 (Aye.)

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8 Those opposed?

9 (No response.)

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
11 ayes have it, and the Journal is
12 approved.

13 The next order of business is
14 requests for leaves of absence, and the
15 Chair recognizes Councilman Jones.

16 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
17 Mr. President. On behalf of the
18 majority, there are no requests for
19 leaves of absence today.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
21 Chair thanks the gentleman.

22 The Chair recognizes Councilman
23 O'Neill.

24 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,
25 Mr. President. On behalf of the

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2 republicans, there are no requests for
3 leave of absence.

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
5 Chair thanks the gentleman.

6 At this time, I would like to
7 dispense with the regular order of
8 business and I would like to welcome and
9 thank all of our guests and visitors who
10 have come to City Council today. We
11 really appreciate the fact that you've
12 come down to witness your government in
13 action. We hope that your experience is
14 truly a very, very good one, so much so
15 that you come back again. So, again,
16 thank you very much.

17 At this time, the Chair
18 recognizes Councilman Kenney, who will
19 present a resolution recognizing October
20 2014 as National Bullying Prevention
21 Awareness Month. Would Ms. Kelly
22 Kroehle, Mr. Louie Ortiz and those
23 accompanying them please join the
24 Councilman at the podium.

25 And joining Councilman Kenney,

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2 we have Councilwoman Reynolds Brown and
3 Councilwoman Cindy Bass.

4 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you,
5 Mr. President.

6 This is a resolution
7 recognizing October 2014 as National
8 Bullying Prevention Awareness Month, and
9 acknowledging the many organizations and
10 individuals that work to prevent
11 bullying, raise awareness about its
12 significant lifelong impact and help
13 young victims of bullying.

14 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,
15 the Federal Government has officially
16 recognized bullying prevention with the
17 creation of stopbullying.gov, a website
18 created in partnership between the
19 Department of Education, Department of
20 Health and Human Services and the
21 Department of Justice; and

22 Whereas, a 2011 study by the
23 National Center for Education Statistics
24 and Bureau of Justice Statistics found
25 that 28 percent of students grades 6

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2 through 12 have experienced bullying in
3 some form or another. Another study by
4 the same agency in 2013 found that 20
5 percent of 9th through 12th graders have
6 experienced bullying; and

7 Whereas, the 2011 documentary,
8 Bully, gained national recognition as a
9 powerful tool to show children and
10 teenagers the effects of bullying.
11 Adding personal stories to statistics,
12 this documentary is a positive tale of
13 five students who faced bullying on a
14 daily basis; and

15 Whereas, LGBT young people are
16 often subject to bullying by their peers.
17 The 2011 National School Climate Survey
18 conducted by the Gay, Lesbian and
19 Straight Education Network found that 82
20 percent of LGBT youth had problems during
21 the past school year with bullying about
22 sexual orientation; 64 percent felt
23 unsafe at school due to their LGBT
24 identity;

25 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: And

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2 whereas, The Attic Youth Center is the
3 only organization in Philadelphia
4 exclusively serving lesbian, gay,
5 bisexual, transgender and questioning
6 youth. Since opening in 1993, The Attic
7 has served over 10,000 young people, and
8 their programming aims to build
9 community, reduce isolation, combat
10 homophobia, promote knowledge and life
11 skills and develop future leaders; and

12 Whereas, The Mazzoni Center
13 aims to provide quality comprehensive
14 health and wellness services in an
15 LGBT-focused environment, while
16 preserving the dignity and improving the
17 quality of life of the individuals they
18 serve. In addition to their more
19 well-known services - such as a full
20 array of medical, mental and behavioral
21 health care and LGBT legal services - The
22 Mazzoni Center is the primary coordinator
23 of Gay Straight Alliance student groups
24 citywide, providing empowerment and a
25 critically important safe place within

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2 many of our City's schools; and

3 Whereas, the national

4 organization GLAAD also supports

5 initiatives for LGBT youth, and

6 specifically supports #spiritday on

7 October 16th. Participants in #spiritday

8 are asked to wear the color purple, which

9 symbolizes spirit on the rainbow flag.

10 From its founding in the 1980's, GLAAD

11 has worked diligently to promote

12 understanding, increase acceptance and

13 advance equality; and

14 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Whereas,

15 ending the bullying of all adults, teens

16 and children should be a worldwide

17 initiative, regardless of LGBT status or

18 otherwise. The psychological effects of

19 bullying can last throughout a person's

20 life and in some cases is so severe that

21 the person feels compelled to take their

22 own life; and

23 Whereas, standing up for every

24 member of our society has been a social

25 imperative for the Philadelphia City

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2 Council for many years. With this
3 Resolution, Council once again stands for
4 the vulnerable and the abused to say: we
5 will not stand for this; we will get you
6 the help and support you need; and we
7 will not just stand up to bullies but
8 work to create a world in which bullying
9 does not exist; now, therefore, be it

10 Resolved, by the Council of the
11 City of Philadelphia, that Council does
12 hereby declare October 14th as National
13 Bullying Prevention Awareness Month and
14 acknowledge the many local organizations
15 that work to both prevent bullying and
16 help young people cope with the terrible
17 mental and physical aspects of being
18 bullied.

19 Further resolved, that an
20 engrossed copy of this resolution be
21 presented to The Attic Youth Center, The
22 Mazzoni Center, and all other
23 anti-bullying initiatives as evidence of
24 the sincere sentiments of this
25 legislative body.

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2 Let's work to do the best we
3 can to stamp out bullying in our society.

4 Thank you.

5 (Applause.)

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
7 Chair recognizes Ms. Kroehle and
8 Mr. Ortiz for remarks.

9 MR. ORTIZ: That's me. How is
10 everyone doing? I'm Louie Ortiz,
11 Education Manager from The Mazzoni
12 Center, and thank you for that great
13 introduction of The Mazzoni Center.

14 Today, since it's early in the
15 morning, I want to invite the spirit of
16 resilient youth into this room.
17 Unfortunately, they can't be here because
18 they're learning, but our program exists
19 because youth are resilient. As much as
20 I would love to stand here and celebrate
21 myself and the great work of Mazzoni, the
22 Allied Youth Safe Schools Youth Program
23 would not be possible had it not been for
24 the courageous youth, LGBTQ youth and
25 allies who stand up to create change

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2 within their schools.

3 We worked with one school who

4 tried to start a GSA, but the principal

5 told them that it was not allowed.

6 Unfortunately, he did not know that that

7 was illegal, but before we could even

8 step in, the youth took it upon

9 themselves to have other youth sign a

10 petition. Over 500 other students signed

11 the petition so that the GSA could exist.

12 So when we think about

13 anti-bullying, I also want people to

14 think about the power and the courage

15 that youth have to create change. A lot

16 of times we hear statistics that make us

17 sad, that make us angry, and while they

18 need to be acknowledged and spoken about,

19 we also need to stand, clap, affirm,

20 love, celebrate youth who are creating

21 change in the small ways that they do

22 every day. And I also want to celebrate

23 and acknowledge all the adults, parents

24 who are creating change amongst

25 themselves and creating young leaders,

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2 because obviously young people cannot do
3 this without the love and support of
4 teachers, administration, parents, and
5 the community.

6 And with that, I humbly thank
7 you for this acknowledgment. Thank you.

8 (Applause.)

9 MS. KROEHLE: Hi there. My
10 name is Kelly Kroehle and I'm the
11 Director of The Bryson Institute's Attic
12 Youth Center. I want to thank you all
13 for having us here this today. This
14 means a lot to us.

15 So when we say the word
16 "bullying," it's actually a word that
17 carries about a thousand stories behind
18 it. The most traditional and the one we
19 acknowledge a lot is the story of a youth
20 who assaults another youth while
21 leveraging anti-gay slurs at him. But to
22 us, bullying is also a lot more.
23 Bullying is the story of the gender
24 non-conforming or transgender youth who
25 can't access a safe bathroom at school

2 because they've been denied that by
3 staff. Bullying is the story of the
4 school-to-prison pipeline and how LGBTQ
5 youth are impacted when they act in
6 self-defense. Bullying is the story of
7 the undocumented LGBTQ youth who does not
8 see their story represented in mainstream
9 LGBTQ organizing. Bullying is the story
10 of LGBTQ youth who continue to face
11 silence from their adult supporters
12 because we don't have the resources to
13 listen to their whole stories.

14 So The Attic Youth Center, as
15 said before, is Philly's only agency
16 that's exclusively serving LGBTQ youth.
17 We've been around for about 21 years as a
18 comprehensive multi-service youth
19 organization, and our mission is to
20 create opportunities for LGBTQ youth to
21 grow into healthy, independent, and
22 civic-minded adults within a safe and
23 supportive community, but also to promote
24 the acceptance of them in the communities
25 that impact them the most.

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2 So we've got a host of
3 services. We see about 60 young people
4 come through our doors a day, young
5 people just 14 to 23, and it's everything
6 from after-school groups around slam
7 poetry, LGBTQ history, peer-led HIV
8 prevention, job readiness, case
9 management, mental health for LGBTQ youth
10 and their families, and a host of support
11 groups. Recognizing, though, at the end
12 of the day The Attic is well and good,
13 but young people go home to their
14 families, they go to their schools, they
15 go to the doctor, they go to social
16 service facilities, they go to work. The
17 program that I work for with my
18 colleague, Phantazia, is The Bryson
19 Institute. So we go out to these spaces
20 to expand these support networks by
21 starting dialogue that's not necessarily
22 comfortable for adults to have. We're
23 not necessarily at a space where we know
24 how to talk about sexual orientation,
25 gender identity and young people. So

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2 we've gone out and held these
3 conversations around empathy and
4 education with over 48,000 people in
5 Southeastern PA, really identifying that
6 this has to be a collective effort to
7 hear their stories. We can't just keep
8 small containers for their stories.

9 So that's the context in which
10 we think about bullying. That's the
11 context in which we identify that
12 bullying isn't just the interpersonal
13 antagonizer, but it's the depletion of
14 safe spaces for LGBTQ youth to tell their
15 stories. So when we think about moving
16 forward, we have to do so individually,
17 but we also have to do so
18 organizationally and institutionally to
19 work and to dialogue and to build at all
20 levels so that stories can be told in all
21 spaces.

22 Thanks again for having us
23 today.
