2 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Good
3 afternoon. To begin the public
4 hearing, I will make the following
5 announcement: Due to the continuing
6 threat of public health from COVID-
7 19, City Council Committees are
8 currently meeting remotely. We are
9 using Microsoft Teams to make these
10 remote hearings possible.

11 Instructions for how the
12 public may view and offer public
13 testimony at public hearings of
14 Council Committees are included in
15 the public hearing notices that are
16 published in the Daily News, Inquirer
17 and Legal Intelligencer prior to the
18 hearing and can also be found on
19 PHLCouncil.com. I now note that the
20 hour has come.

21 Mr. Golden, will you please
22 call the roll to take attendance.
23 Members that are in attendance will
24 please indicate that you are present
25 when your name is called. Also,

1 please say a few brief words when
2 responding so that your image will be
3 displayed on screen when you speak.

4 THE CLERK: Councilmember
5 Johnson.

9 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

10 RICHARDSON: Good afternoon,
11 Mr. Chair. Good afternoon,
12 colleagues. I am present.

13 THE CLERK: Councilmember
14 Jones.

15 (No response.)

16 THE CLERK: Councilmember
17 Vaughn.

18 COUNCILWOMAN VAUGHN: Good
19 afternoon, everyone. I am present.
20 Looking forward to starting this
21 hearing.

22 THE CLERK: Vice-Chair
23 Squilla.

24 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Good
25 afternoon, Mr. Chair and colleagues.

1 I'm present.

2 THE CLERK: Chair Driscoll.

3 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Present.

4 Well, thank you all that's on the
5 call for your patience. A quorum for
6 the Committee is present and this
7 hearing is now called to order. This
8 is the public hearing of the
9 Committee on Licenses and Inspection
10 regarding Bill No. 230569 and Bill
11 No. 230647.

12 Mr. Golden, will you please
13 read the titles of these bills.

14 THE CLERK: Bill No. 230569,
15 amending Chapter 9-4400 of The
16 Philadelphia Code, entitled
17 "Responsible Business Operations," to
18 expand the provisions of video
19 monitoring of nuisance businesses and
20 to provide additional enforcement
21 mechanisms in connection with certain
22 nuisance businesses engaged in drug
23 paraphernalia sales, all under
24 certain terms and conditions.

25 And Bill No. 230647, amending

1 Subcode A of The Philadelphia
2 Administrative Code and Subcode PM,
3 the Philadelphia Property Maintenance
4 Code, of Title 4 and Chapter 9-3900,
5 Property Licenses and Owner
6 Accountability of The Philadelphia
7 Code to modify provisions, remedies,
8 including fines, and licensing and
9 certification requirements related to
10 shared retaining walls, all under
11 certain terms and conditions.

12 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Thank
13 you. Before we begin to hear
14 testimony from the witnesses we have
15 for today, everyone who has been
16 invited to the meeting to testify
17 should be aware that this public
18 hearing is being recorded. Because
19 this hearing is public, participants
20 and viewers have no reasonable
21 expectation of privacy. By
22 continuing to be in this meeting, you
23 are consenting to being recorded.

24 Additionally, prior to
25 recognizing Members for the questions

1 or comments they have for the
2 witnesses, I will note for the record
3 at this time that we will use the
4 chat feature available in Microsoft
5 Teams to allow the Members to signify
6 that they wish to be recognized. In
7 order to comply with the Sunshine
8 Act, the chat feature must only be
9 used for this purpose.

10 Mr. Golden, will you please
11 call the first panel we have to
12 testify this morning on Bill
13 No. 230569.

14 THE CLERK: Thank you. And
15 Mr. Chair, Councilwoman Gilmore
16 Richardson would like to be
17 recognized to make comment on Bill
18 No. 230569 before we begin the first
19 panel.

20 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Yes.
21 Councilmember Richardson, please
22 proceed.

23 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE
24 RICHARDSON: Thank you. Thank you so
25 much, Mr. Chair. And thank you

1 colleagues for your attendance at
2 today's hearing on the Committee on
3 Licenses and Inspections.

4 Despite working aggressively
5 as a body to address the
6 proliferation of nuisance businesses
7 impacting our communities, we are
8 still seeing these stores evade our
9 rules and regulations. Throughout
10 the last two years, my office and I
11 have worked diligently with Licenses
12 and Inspections, Health, Law and PPD
13 to try to end the sale of illegal
14 drug paraphernalia in our
15 communities. Yet the problem
16 persists.

17 City Council has passed
18 nuisance pieces of business
19 legislation including our colleague
20 Councilmember Phillips' bill to
21 overhaul the citation process over
22 the last few terms, and it has shown
23 us that we must continue to use every
24 tool in our toolbox to address this
25 behavior. Adding camera monitoring

1 as a part of Nuisance Abatement Plans
2 is one way to help crack down on all
3 of these activities. By
4 strengthening Nuisance Business
5 Abatement Plans, the City will be
6 able to have more leverage to seize
7 business operations in stronger cases
8 if cease operation orders are
9 challenged in court.

10 This legislation, Bill No.
11 230569, will do three important
12 things: One, it clearly establishes
13 minimum requirements for Nuisance
14 Abatement Plans and specifies the way
15 that video monitoring should be
16 implemented as a part of these plans.
17 It also adds a requirement that
18 businesses engaged in nuisance
19 behavior related to unlawful drug
20 paraphernalia sales must sign an
21 acknowledgement that they have
22 violated the City's zoning
23 requirements.

24 And finally, this legislation
25 states that businesses engaged in

1 nuisance behavior related to unlawful
2 drug paraphernalia sales must remove
3 all drug paraphernalia from the
4 premises. There was already video
5 monitoring language in our code
6 that's applicable to all nuisance
7 businesses, but this bill makes the
8 requirements more specific and geared
9 towards addressing the underlying
10 nuisance behavior and as language to
11 create an expectation that when there
12 are unlawful drug paraphernalia
13 sales, language about video
14 monitoring should be in both the
15 notice of intent to seize and the
16 Nuisance Abatement Plan.

17 The amendment adds language
18 around participating in the City's
19 camera program and sharing footage
20 with the Philadelphia Police
21 Department. I want to thank the Law
22 Department, particularly Kristin
23 Bray, the Philadelphia Police
24 Department, DC Dales and Healy and
25 the entire team for all of their hard

1 work with working with my office and
2 all the teams at L&I and Health so
3 that we can improve and strengthen
4 the Nuisance Business Behavior
5 Abatement Plan for the City of
6 Philadelphia.

7 Thank you so much, Mr. Chair.
8 Thank you colleagues. And in
9 advance, I thank all of the witnesses
10 who have signed on to testify in
11 support of this legislation. To that
12 end, colleagues, I humbly request
13 your support for Bill No. 230569 and
14 the corresponding amendment.

15 Thank you, Mr. Chair.

16 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Thank
17 you, Councilmember, and thank you for
18 your leadership for many years on
19 this issue. Thank you.

20 THE CLERK: The first panel on
21 Bill No. 230569 will be Fran Healy,
22 Deputy Commissioner at the
23 Philadelphia Police Department.

24 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL:
25 Afternoon, Commissioner.

1 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER HEALY:

2 Good afternoon. Good afternoon,
3 Chairperson Driscoll, Vice-Chair
4 Squilla and other members of the
5 Committee on Licenses and
6 Inspections. As I mentioned, my name
7 is Fran Healy. I'm the Deputy
8 Commissioner of the Philadelphia
9 Police Department and I'm responsible
10 for the Offices of Legal Affairs and
11 Professional Responsibility.

12 First, on behalf of
13 Commissioner John Stanford, thank you
14 for allowing the police department
15 the opportunity to voice its opinion
16 on Bill No. 230569 amending City Code
17 9-4400. As you know, the
18 Philadelphia Police Department has
19 been closely involved with the
20 development and recent amendments
21 expanding both the scope of the
22 ordinance and the authority of the
23 PPD to intervene with nuisance
24 businesses, which became this past
25 July, I think July 5th, actually when

1 it became effective.

2 As such, the Philadelphia
3 Police Department fully supports the
4 additional amendment set forth in
5 Bill No. 230569.

6 (Background interruption.)

7 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

8 RICHARDSON: Pardon me, Councilmember
9 Phillips. You need to go on mute.
10 Councilmember Phillips?

11 (Background interruption.)

12 COUNCIL TECH SUPPORT: We got
13 him. Thank you.

14 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Thank
15 you.

16 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER HEALY:
17 Okay. Where was I -- I said these
18 amendments relate to the enforcement
19 of nuisance business based all in
20 part on the business's unlawful sale
21 of drug paraphernalia. Additionally,
22 the amendments expand the
23 requirements for any Nuisance
24 Abatement Plans by incorporating
25 surveillance cameras, as

1 Councilperson mentioned, as well as
2 additional requirements for
3 businesses found to be selling
4 illegal drug paraphernalia. The
5 police support all these efforts and
6 have been working with Councilmembers
7 to accomplish as such.

8 It's important to note, and
9 this is very, very important for a
10 lot of folks to realize, it's
11 important to note these amendments
12 came as a direct result of the
13 collaboration and coordination with
14 the City's Nuisance Committee and the
15 leadership of Kristin Bray from the
16 Law Department working with our
17 committed partners on City Council.
18 As a result of this ongoing
19 collaboration, City Council was able
20 to not only be responsive to the
21 Administration but also able to work
22 through multiple versions of this
23 ordinance in advance to develop a
24 final product you see here today and
25 in record time.

1 With this type of
2 collaboration and coordination
3 between the Administration and
4 Council, that will ensure the
5 amendments recently made to 9-4400
6 will have a lasting and positive
7 impact on the communities we serve
8 throughout the City. This concludes
9 my testimony and I'd be happy to
10 answer any questions.

11 But I will say this. I just
12 want to make one quick comment. The
13 9-4400 that was passed in July or
14 actually became effective in July, we
15 have training for all commanders this
16 coming Wednesday at 1:00 p.m. In
17 addition to that, we've actually
18 developed to facilitate exactly what
19 Councilmember Gilmore Richardson
20 mentioned. As a better way of
21 tracking the mechanisms on everything
22 we have to do, we put together a
23 tracking mechanism developed through
24 the PPD, and we'll be doing a
25 demonstration of that at 2:00 p.m.

1 And I welcome any Councilmember who
2 would like to stop up the Police
3 Academy to see what we're doing, to
4 see how we better track everything
5 that we're doing so we can be much
6 more effective.

7 We appreciate the extra
8 authority you gave us in the
9 ordinance, and I just want to show
10 you what that's going to mean in
11 action to the police department, so
12 that offer's out there. That's this
13 Wednesday at 2:00 p.m. at the
14 Philadelphia Police Academy. I'm
15 happy to walk you through the
16 tracking model that we created but we
17 fully support and thank Katherine or
18 Councilmember Gilmore Richardson for
19 her assistance in helping. That
20 concludes my testimony. I'm happy to
21 answer any questions.

22 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Thank
23 you, Commissioner, for your
24 testimony.

25 Are there any questions or

1 comments from the members of the
2 Committee?

3 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

4 RICHARDSON: Mr. Chair, I just wanted
5 to thank DC Healy and the entire
6 Nuisance Committee for all of their
7 work across government. We could not
8 have done this without you, so we are
9 truly very grateful and appreciative
10 of the hard work of the Committee.
11 You've made our job much easier in
12 drafting and crafting this
13 legislation and explaining it to our
14 colleagues and to the broader public,
15 so thank you very much.

16 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Thank
17 you, Councilmember.

18 Are there any other questions
19 or comments from Committee members?

20 (No response.)

21 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Hearing
22 no further questions, Mr. Golden,
23 would you call the next panelist.

24 THE CLERK: The final panel on
25 this bill will be Crystal B. Morris,

1 President of the Wynnefield Residents
2 Association.

3 MS. MORRIS: Good afternoon.

4 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Good
5 afternoon.

6 MS. MORRIS: Chairman
7 Driscoll, Vice-Chair Squilla,
8 Councilmembers and interested
9 parties, good afternoon. Thank you,
10 Councilmember Gilmore Richardson, for
11 your continued advocacy in this
12 matter. As stated, I'm Crystal
13 Morris, President of the Wynnefield
14 Residents Association testifying in
15 support of Bill No. 230569.

16 Many Philadelphia communities
17 are being tormented by nuisance
18 businesses that encourage loitering
19 outside their establishments, keep
20 too late hours and create an
21 environment where our residents, many
22 who are senior, are afraid to leave
23 their homes. We have recently found
24 ourselves with three nuisance
25 businesses on the same block. We

1 remain baffled by how something like
2 this could even happen.

3 One business defiantly
4 displayed their drug paraphernalia in
5 the front window so that our children
6 had to see it as they walked back and
7 forth to school. Communities across
8 Philadelphia are overridden with
9 cash-driven establishments with
10 minimal oversight. There are laws on
11 the books, but it is communities that
12 have to rally to get the existing
13 laws enforced.

14 Posting notices regarding
15 working cameras will put patrons on
16 notice that their elicit behavior is
17 being observed and may have
18 consequences. Perhaps this will
19 encourage them to take their business
20 elsewhere. We understand that
21 businesses will have a reluctance to
22 acknowledge problems occurring on
23 their property for fear of being shut
24 down, but the reality is if you're
25 breaking the law you should be shut

1 down. This bill empowers communities
2 to rid themselves of businesses that
3 encourage deviant behavior. If
4 businesses profit from the problem,
5 we expect them to participate in the
6 solution.

7 This problem will not be
8 resolved without a genuine
9 partnership between business owners,
10 police and community members. We
11 need more weapons in our arsenal so
12 proprietors know that we are serious
13 about maintaining safe and healthy
14 communities. This bill is a welcome
15 step in the right direction. Thank
16 you.

17 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Thank
18 you, Crystal, for your testimony.
19 Thank you very much.

20 Are there any questions or
21 comments from members of this
22 Committee for Crystal?

23 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

24 RICHARDSON: Mr. Chair, I just wanted
25 to say thank you so much to Crystal

1 Morris and the residents of
2 Wynnefield for their steadfast
3 support. We first noticed this issue
4 of the proliferation of nuisance
5 businesses at the start of the
6 pandemic when we had several stores
7 in a two-block radius set up in the
8 Wynnefield community. And Councilman
9 Jones did aptly address that issue
10 with a specific overlay for that
11 area.

12 However, we noticed that this
13 was a citywide issue, but we know
14 that for us the advocacy started in
15 Wynnefield. So I wanted to say thank
16 you to Crystal Morris and to
17 Wynnefield Residents Association and
18 the entire Wynnefield community for
19 your support. Thank you.

20 MS. MORRIS: Thank you.

21 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Any
22 other questions from members?

23 (No response.)

24 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Hearing
25 no further questions from members for

1 this panel and there will be no other
2 panels to testify, we will call
3 witnesses on Bill No. 230647.

4 Mr. Golden, will you call any
5 witnesses?

6 THE CLERK: The first panel
7 for Bill No. 230647 will be Sarah
8 Adamo, Legislative Affairs Manager
9 and Zoning Administrator at the
10 Department of Licenses and
11 Inspections.

12 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Good
13 afternoon, Sarah.

14 MS. ADAMO: Good afternoon.
15 Good afternoon, Chairperson Driscoll
16 and members of the Licenses and
17 Inspections Committee. My name is
18 Sarah Adamo and I am the Legislative
19 Affairs Manager of the Department of
20 Licenses and Inspections. Today I am
21 here to provide testimony on Bill No.
22 230647 introduced by Councilmember
23 Phillips, which if enacted will amend
24 Subcode A, The Philadelphia
25 Administrative Code and Subcode PM,

1 the Philadelphia Property Maintenance
2 Code of Title 4 and Chapter 9-3900,
3 property license and owner
4 accountability of The Philadelphia
5 Code to modify prohibitions,
6 remedies, including fines and
7 licensing and certification
8 requirements related to shared
9 retaining walls, all under certain
10 terms and conditions.

11 Under the current code, if a
12 shared retaining wall were to become
13 unsafe or imminently dangerous or ID,
14 the property would receive a notice
15 of violation or NOV, citing the same
16 code section as any other unsafe or
17 ID building or structure. This means
18 that in the event that one of these
19 cases were to be brought to court, it
20 could result in a fine of \$2,000 per
21 day, a Class III violation.

22 Additionally, if a violation
23 were to be issued to a property, the
24 violation could present -- I'm sorry,
25 could prevent the issuance or renewal

1 of rental licenses, limited lodging
2 operator licenses or the issuance of
3 a certificate of rental suitability.
4 Due to the nature of shared retaining
5 walls, their repairs are not only
6 costly but also require the
7 coordination and cooperation of all
8 owners of the law.

9 As such, these repairs can
10 take longer to complete than other
11 repairs to unsafe or ID structures.
12 Also, in most cases the presence of
13 an unsafe retaining wall would not
14 create a situation that makes the
15 property unsuitable for rental. This
16 bill, if enacted, would create a
17 separate, unique violation for unsafe
18 or ID-shared retaining walls. But
19 violations for unsafe or ID-shared
20 retaining walls would be subject to a
21 basic fine of \$300 per day in the
22 event that a case is referred to
23 court.

24 Lastly, the bill would enable
25 the Department of Licenses and

1 Inspections to promulgate regulations
2 to define conditions where properties
3 could obtain rental licenses,
4 certificates of rental suitability
5 and limited lodging operator
6 licenses. Wall (inaudible) violation
7 for a shared retaining wall was open.
8 The department has no objection to
9 this bill and is prepared to make the
10 necessary updates to our system
11 should it become law. Thank you for
12 the opportunity to provide the
13 testimony of the Department of
14 Licenses and Inspections. I'm happy
15 to answer any questions at this time.

16 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Thank
17 you, Sarah, for your testimony.

18 Are there any questions from
19 our Committee members for this panel?

20 (No response.)

21 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Hearing
22 none from members for this panel and
23 there will be no other panel to
24 testify, we will take a brief break
25 to connect members of the public that

1 wish to testify on the resolution
2 before the Committee today.

3 (No response.)

4 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Darian,
5 are we connected?

6 COUNCIL TECH SUPPORT: I
7 believe there's no public comment
8 today.

9 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Okay.
10 No public comment, move on. So that
11 would conclude the hearing, and I
12 request that we go into the public
13 meeting. There being no further
14 questions from members of the
15 Committee and no other witnesses to
16 testify on Bill No. 230569 or Bill
17 No. 230647, I will ask if there's
18 anyone else present at the hearing
19 whose name we have failed to call?

20 (No response.)

21 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Seeing
22 none, I want to thank the panel and
23 the witnesses for their participation
24 today. We value your opinions. I
25 now invite all panels of witnesses to

1 please disconnect from the hearing
2 before we conclude the business
3 before the Committee today. We will
4 now pause the proceedings briefly as
5 multiple participants leave the
6 hearing.

7 This concludes the public
8 hearing of the Committee. We will
9 now go into a public hearing to
10 consider the action to be taken on
11 the bills before this Committee
12 today. We will now convene the
13 public meeting.

14 Mr. Golden, will you please
15 call the roll to take attendance.
16 Members that are in attendance will
17 please indicate that you are present
18 when your name is called. Also,
19 please say a brief few words so that
20 your image may be displayed on screen
21 when you speak.

22 THE CLERK: Councilmember
23 Johnson.

24 (No response.)

25 THE CLERK: Councilmember

1 Gilmore Richardson.

2 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

3 RICHARDSON: Good afternoon,
4 Mr. Chair and colleagues. I am
5 present.

6 THE CLERK: Councilmember
7 Jones.

8 (No response.)

9 THE CLERK: Councilmember
10 Vaughn.

11 COUNCILWOMAN VAUGHN: Good
12 afternoon, everyone. I am present.

13 THE CLERK: Vice-Chair
14 Squilla.

15 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Good
16 afternoon, Mr. Chair and colleagues.
17 Present.

18 THE CLERK: Chair Driscoll.

19 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Present.

20 The Chair recognizes Councilmember
21 Gilmore Richardson for a motion on
22 the amendment to Bill No. 230569.

23 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

24 RICHARDSON: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

25 I offer an amendment to Bill

1 No. 230569. A copy of the amendment
2 has been circulated to all members of
3 the Committee. I move that the
4 amendment to Bill No. 230569 be
5 approved.

6 COUNCILWOMAN VAUGHN: Second.

7 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Noting
8 the second from Councilmember Vaughn.
9 It has been moved and properly
10 seconded that the amendment to Bill
11 No. 230569 be approved.

12 All those in favor of the
13 motion will signify by saying aye.
14 (Aye.)

15 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Those
16 opposed?

17 (No response.)

18 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: The ayes
19 have it and the motion carries and
20 the amendment to Bill No. 230569 has
21 been approved.

22 Report Bill No. 230569 as
23 amended.

24 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

25 RICHARDSON: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

1 I move that Bill No. 230569 as
2 amended be reported from this
3 Committee with a favorable
4 recommendation and further move that
5 the rules of Council be suspended as
6 to permit first reading of this bill
7 at our next session of Council.

8 COUNCILWOMAN VAUGHN: Second.

9 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Was
10 that -- Councilmember Vaughn seconds
11 the motion. It has been moved and
12 properly seconded that Bill No.
13 230569 as amended be reported from
14 this Committee with a favorable
15 recommendation and further move that
16 the rules of Council be suspended to
17 permit first reading of this bill at
18 the next session of Council.

19 All those in favor of the
20 motion will signify by saying aye.

21 (Aye.)

22 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Those
23 opposed?

24 (No response.)

25 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: The ayes

1 have it and the motion carries.

2 Report Bill No. 230647. The
3 Chair recognizes Councilmember
4 Gilmore Richardson for a motion on
5 Bill No. 230647 as amended.

6 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE

7 RICHARDSON: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

8 I move that Bill No. 230647 be
9 reported from this Committee with a
10 favorable recommendation and further
11 move that the rules of Council be
12 suspended as to permit first reading
13 of this bill at our next session of
14 Council.

15 COUNCILWOMAN VAUGHN: Second.

16 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: The
17 Chair notes for the record that
18 Councilmember Vaughn seconds that
19 motion. It has been moved and
20 properly seconded that Bill No.
21 230647 be reported from the Committee
22 with a favorable recommendation and
23 further move that the rules of
24 Council be suspended to permit first
25 reading of this bill at the next

1 session of Council.

2 All those in favor of the
3 motion will signify by saying aye.

4 (Aye.)

5 COUNCILMAN DRISCOLL: Those

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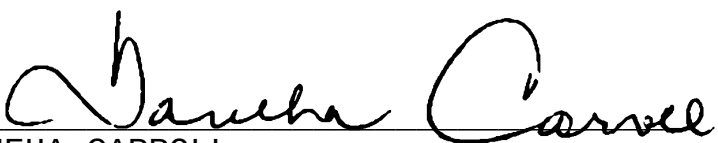
