13 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Thank you,

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank

3 COUNCILMAN DiCICCO: Thank you,
4 Madam Chair, and good morning.

5 A resolution recognizing the
6 Honorable Louis J. Presenza, President
7 Judge Emeritus, on the occasion of his
8 retirement following 27 years of great
9 intellect, compassion and devotion to our
10 justice system.

11 Whereas, the Honorable Louis J.
12 Presenza is a graduate of St. Joseph's
13 University and Villanova University
14 School of Law. He was first elected
15 Judge of Philadelphia Municipal Court in
16 1982 and subsequently retained to the
17 bench in 1989, 1995, 2001 and 2007. In
18 1996, he was appointed the first
19 Supervising Judge of the Court's Criminal
20 Division where he instructed the first
21 Treatment Court in the Commonwealth of
22 Pennsylvania. In January 1999, he was
23 elected President Judge of Philadelphia
24 Municipal Court by his peers, and
25 reelected to a second five-year term in

2 January 2004; and

3 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Whereas,
4 during Judge Presenza's 27 years on the
5 bench, he has chaired or co-chaired a
6 variety of panels and commissions
7 addressing such diverse issues as
8 preliminary arraignment, statewide
9 automation, the destruction of firearms,
10 pretrial release guidelines, video
11 conferencing, prison population
12 management and alternatives to
13 incarceration. He currently serves on
14 the City's Criminal Justice Coordinating
15 Committee, the Mayor's Task Force to End
16 Homelessness, the Pennsylvania Adult Drug
17 Court Advisory Committee and the
18 Statewide Mental Health Initiatives Task
19 Force. Judge Presenza also serves on the
20 Board of Directors of the National
21 Conference of Metropolitan Courts and is
22 Board Member Emeritus of the National
23 Association of Drug Court Professionals;
24 and

25 Whereas, Judge Presenza has

2 been a panel discussant on Driving Under
3 the Influence, Violation of the Uniform
4 Firearms Act and Domestic Violence. He
5 has lectured at continuing legal
6 education seminars on Municipal Court
7 practices and procedures, spoken at
8 symposiums sponsored by the Las Vegas
9 Metropolitan Police Department and the
10 Office of National Drug Control Policy on
11 methods for expeditious drug case
12 disposition and the planning,
13 implementation and operation of drug
14 courts. He has also addressed the
15 National Association of Pretrial
16 Agencies, the Middle Atlantic States
17 Correctional Association, the
18 Mid-Atlantic Association of Court
19 Management, the Pennsylvania Association
20 on Probation, Parole and Corrections, the
21 Pennsylvania Conference of State Trial
22 Judges, the Pennsylvania Commission on
23 Crime and Delinquency, the Pennsylvania
24 Association of Court Management and the
25 Philadelphia Bar Association Drug

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2 Treatment Court; and

3 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Whereas,

4 Judge Presenza served as Peer Reviewer

5 for the Office of Justice Programs, the

6 United States Department of Justice and

7 Caliber Associations, and as a faculty

8 member for the Justice Management

9 Institute and has provided technical

10 assistance for the American University

11 Clearinghouse and Technical Assistance

12 Project. He is a faculty member for the

13 United States Department of Justice and

14 the National Drug Court Institute for

15 workshops and training programs for drug

16 court professionals. Judge Presenza is

17 past Chair of the Board of Directors of

18 the National Association of Drug Court

19 Professionals and founding member of the

20 Pennsylvania Association of Drug Court

21 Professionals, where he served

22 consecutive two-year terms as its

23 inaugural President; and

24 Whereas, Judge Presenza

25 received awards from the Philadelphia

2 Coalition for Victim Advocacy, the
3 Pennsylvania Conference of State Trial
4 Judges, the Justinian Society, the
5 Lawyers' Club of Philadelphia and the
6 Caron Foundation. He was inducted into
7 the NADCP's Stanley M. Goldstein Drug
8 Court Hall of Fame in recognition of his
9 leadership, service and preeminent
10 contributions to the drug court field and
11 was awarded the Justice William J.
12 Brennan Distinguished Jurist Award by the
13 Philadelphia Bar Association. Lawdragon
14 Magazine named him one of the "500
15 Leading Judges in America."

16 Now, therefore

17 COUNCILMAN DiCICCO: Resolved,
18 by the Council of the City of
19 Philadelphia, that we hereby honor and
20 commend the Honorable Louis J. Presenza
21 on his stellar leadership as President
22 Judge of Philadelphia Municipal Court and
23 on his 27 years of inspiring
24 contributions as a distinguished and
25 caring jurist in our justice system. We

20 with great pleasure that the Chair
21 recognizes Judge Presenza for remarks.

22 JUDGE PRESENZA: Are you sure
23 that was me you were reading about?

24 On a serious note, I want to
25 thank the President, a longtime friend,

2 my friends here in City Council. Some of
3 you were with me when we started in 1982.
4 All of you, whether you were there in '82
5 or subsequently, have been supportive of
6 me in my career, and I personally thank
7 you for the recognition, though it was
8 unexpected and really not necessary, but
9 it is deeply appreciated.

10 More importantly, I want to
11 thank you for the support that this
12 Council has provided to me personally
13 over the 27 years, but also to our
14 Municipal Court, our Treatment Court,
15 which, again, is the first in
16 Pennsylvania and was about the 150th in
17 the United States. There now are well
18 over 2,000 drug courts in the United
19 States and a dozen in foreign countries.

20 I also want to thank you for
21 the support you continue to provide the
22 First Judicial District, particularly
23 under this time right now where budget
24 issues are very serious and we're all
25 deeply concerned.

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2 So with that, again, I thank
3 each and every one of you for this honor.
4 I enjoyed my 27 years on the bench, but
5 it is time to move on. And as Councilman
6 DiCicco asked me, Do you have any
7 grandchildren, and I said, Yes, I have
8 six, and I intend to spend a lot of time
9 with them.

10 So, again, thank you so much
11 from the bottom of my heart. I deeply
12 appreciate it.

24 I see that Councilwoman Tasco
25 is also being accompanied by Councilwoman

3 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Thank you,
4 Madam President.

5 To Council colleagues and
6 guests, one of my early professional
7 experiences was with the City of
8 Philadelphia wherein I served as an
9 evaluation officer for the Evaluation
10 Unit of the City's Youth Services
11 Coordinating Office. The Executive
12 Director and my former boss there was
13 Willie Johnson. On his desk he kept a
14 name plate that did not have his name,
15 but on the name plate, he had two words,
16 and those words were "be thorough."

17 Today I am thrilled to be a
18 part of this proceeding where we will now
19 celebrate my former boss and founder,
20 Chairman of the Board, People Really
21 Working Together, also known as PRWT
22 Services, Inc. This is indeed a very,
23 very special moment for me.

24 COUNCILWOMAN TASC0: So I too
25 join in with those comments, although I

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2 was not an employee. I knew him when. A
3 long time ago. He's been a man of public
4 service in the City of Philadelphia, and
5 I am pleased to join with my colleague
6 and members of Council to present this
7 resolution honoring PRWT Services, Inc.
8 for being named as the 2009 Black
9 Enterprise Industrial/Service Company of
10 the Year.

11 Whereas, PRWT Services, Inc.,
12 ("PRWT") was founded in 1988 by Chairman
13 Willie F. Johnson, Raymond A. Saulino,
14 Paul Dandridge and William Turner to
15 provide and manage back-office clerical
16 support to public and private companies;
17 and

18 Whereas, over 20 years later,
19 PRWT has grown into a diverse enterprise
20 of three companies - PRWT Services, Inc.,
21 U.S. Facilities, Inc. and Cherokee
22 Pharmaceuticals, which provide
23 pharmaceutical manufacturing and
24 distribution, facilities management and
25 maintenance, and business process

3 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,
4 PRWT is dedicated to applying
5 technology-based solutions, the most
6 experienced and talented leadership and
7 sound financial management to drive
8 growth and success of their customers and
9 stakeholders; and

10 Whereas, PRWT, a nationally
11 recognized enterprise, is one of the
12 largest minority-owned businesses
13 headquartered in the Greater Philadelphia
14 region and has been ranked in the top 100
15 minority-owned industry businesses in the
16 United States by Black Enterprise
17 Magazine for the past eight years and is
18 the first minority-owned manufacturer of
19 active pharmaceutical ingredients in the
20 United States; and

21 Whereas, the mission of PRWT is
22 an entrepreneurial, diversified, socially
23 responsible growth company, providing
24 quality value-added products and services
25 to their customers and the company's

3 minority-owned enterprise trusted to
4 provide superior products and services

7 Whereas, throughout its
8 history, PRWT has established itself as

11 contributions and investments are
12 targeted across philanthropic areas,
13 including the arts and culture, children
14 and their families, education, and
15 women's issues and causes.

16 Now, therefore

18 therefore, be it resolved, by the Council
19 of the City of Philadelphia, that we
20 hereby honor and recognize PRWT for being
21 named as the 2009 Black Enterprise
22 Industrial/Service Company of the Year.

23 Further resolved, that an
24 engrossed copy of this resolution be
25 presented to Mr. Willie F. Johnson,

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2 PRWT's Founder and Chairman, as evidence
3 of the sincere sentiments of this
4 legislative body.

17 Chair recognizes Mr. Johnson for remarks.

18 MR. JOHNSON: Councilwoman,
19 thank you. Thank you very much. Thank
20 you very much.

21 We are very proud to be a part
22 of the fabric of Philadelphia. We accept
23 this award and this honor on behalf of
24 our founder, Willie Johnson, our
25 Chairman, and the 1,320 people and

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2 employees that support this city and this

3 state and 11 other states. It's a

4 fast-growing, very exciting company.

5 We're very proud of it. We're very proud

6 to be headquartered here in Philadelphia.

7 Thank you very much.

8 (Applause.)

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Madam

10 President, Councilwoman Tasco,

11 Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds Brown,

12 members of Council, I am also honored,

13 and I asked Jerry to give me a second.

14 This is the first opportunity since

15 serving with many of you in this Council

16 that I've had the opportunity to talk

17 from this side of the microphone.

18 But two things I think that are

19 important. Number one, as a company that

20 does business around the country, the

21 support that we've gotten from Council,

22 the support that we've gotten from the

23 government here and the City of

24 Philadelphia is important, because it's

25 difficult to work in other cities and in

2 other states if you're not supported by
3 your home base. So we appreciate all
4 that has been done over the last 20 years
5 for PRWT here in the City of
6 Philadelphia.

7 But on a personal note, I just
8 want to say that as one who has had the

10 Philadelphia City Council, I have
11 personally not been prouder to have been
12 a member of this institution than to
13 watch the work that you have done over
14 the last several months to, at an arm's
15 length, negotiate a budget that all of
16 the people in this city can be proud of
17 and can support. So congratulations to
18 you all and the great work that you've
19 done, and thank you very much.

20 And let me introduce you to the
21 people who are with us. Sherri
22 Kyle-Jones is our Senior Vice-President
23 for Public Affairs; Roberta Alford, who
24 is our Senior Vice-President for
25 Operations; and Sonia Weigle, who is our

12 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: We
13 congratulate them and thank them for
14 having women as senior vice-presidents.
15 Look at this cabinet. Let's give a big
16 round of applause for that and recognize.

17 (Applause.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA:
19 Council will be at ease.

20 (Council at ease.)

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
22 Chair now recognizes Councilman Kenney,
23 who will present a resolution recognizing
24 Independence Charter School.

25 I see that Councilman Kenney is

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2 being accompanied by Councilwoman
3 Blackwell.

4 I would ask that Ms. Jurate
5 Krokys and those accompanying her please
6 join the Councilman at the podium.

7 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you,
8 Madam President. On your behalf also,
9 you were co-sponsor of this. This school
10 is in your district.

11 This is a resolution
12 recognizing and congratulating
13 Independence Charter School on the
14 occasion of receiving the Goldman Sachs
15 Foundation Prize for Excellence in
16 International Education.

17 Whereas, on March 25th, 2009,
18 the Asia Society announced Independence
19 Charter School as the 2008
20 Elementary/Middle School Category winner
21 of the Goldman Sachs Foundation Prize for
22 Excellence in International Education, a
23 national competition first launched in
24 2003; and

25 Whereas, the competition

2 recognizes and celebrates outstanding
3 achievement in schools and educational
4 organizations that promote cultural
5 awareness, world history and a global
6 curriculum as essentials in the
7 development of the next generation of
8 young Americans; and

9 Whereas, Independence Charter
10 School is an urban public charter school
11 serving a diverse student population of
12 more than 700 K through 8 students; and

13 Whereas, founded in 2001,
14 Independence Charter School combines two
15 second language acquisition programs with
16 an interdisciplinary curriculum
17 integrating world cultures, traditions,
18 literature, geography, economics and
19 history; and

20 Whereas, currently, 60 percent
21 of students are enrolled in the Foreign
22 Language Elementary School Spanish
23 Program where instruction is in English
24 with a daily 30- to 40-minute immersion
25 session in Spanish, while the other 40

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2 percent of students are based in a total
3 Spanish immersion program in which the
4 instruction is completely in Spanish.
5 Sixth graders receive lessons in
6 Japanese, and seventh graders receive
7 Arabic lessons while maintaining their
8 Spanish lessons; and

9 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

10 Whereas, Jurate Krokys, CEO and founding
11 Principal of the School, commented, quote
12 "Our children come from 44 zip codes in
13 Philadelphia through a lottery, and we
14 prove that they not only deserve
15 excellence in education but also that
16 they can accomplish it. This award will
17 help raise awareness about the unique
18 urban education model we've developed and
19 enable us to share our practices with
20 other schools and educators, thereby
21 benefiting even more urban students"; and

22 Whereas, additionally, the
23 school has partnerships with the Greater
24 Philadelphia International Visitors
25 Council, the Painted Bride Arts Center,

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2 the National Resources Centers at the
3 University of Pennsylvania, and are
4 candidates for partnership with the
5 Embassy of Spain to provide additional
6 content, international speakers and to
7 support the training of its teachers; and

8 Whereas, the Goldman Sachs
9 Foundation's mission is to promote
10 excellence and innovation in education
11 worldwide. Since its inception, the
12 Foundation has awarded in excess of \$114
13 million, providing opportunities for
14 young people in more than 20 countries.

15 Now, therefore, be it resolved,
16 by the Council of the City of
17 Philadelphia, that Council does hereby
18 recognize and congratulate Independence
19 Charter School on the occasion of being
20 the first charter school in the nation to
21 receive the Goldman Sachs Foundation
22 Prize for Excellence in International
23 Education.

24 Further resolved, that an
25 engrossed copy of this resolution be

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2 presented to Jurate Krokys as evidence of
3 the sincere sentiments of this
4 legislative body.

5 Certification that this is a
6 true and correct copy of the original
7 resolution, adopted by the Council of the
8 City of Philadelphia on the 2nd day of
9 April 2009. Certainly it's signed by
10 President Anna Verna, President of
11 Council, and introduced by James F.
12 Kenney, Anna C. Verna and Frank DiCicco,
13 and is sponsored by all other members of
14 Council.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
18 Chair recognizes Ms. Krokys for remarks.

19 MS. KROKYS: Thank you to
20 President Verna and the City Council.
21 This is a very great honor. It's our
22 very first time here, and it's a great
23 honor to be recognized for what really is
24 quite an accomplishment. We worked very
25 hard to meet the standards for being

2 chosen for this prize, and the \$25,000
3 prize that comes from Goldman Sachs is
4 all very nice. However, it's the
5 recognition that our children can achieve
6 this, that the children you see before
7 you here, who come from five different
8 zip codes, in total 44, that they can do
9 this, that at least 80 percent of our
10 graduates reenter into the Philadelphia
11 public high schools as well as
12 independence schools at the top
13 performing schools just because they can.
14 And so this prize and your citation is a
15 recognition of the fact that our children
16 can do this, and so we thank you very,
17 very much.
