13 today. 210284, Councilman Domb's net
14 profits bill. He will be offering an
15 amendment. 210322, that will be the 10:21:09
16 budget bill; i.e., the operating bill.
17 And Bill No. 210324, as amended, we will
18 be calling for the vote out of Committee,
19 and that's the Philly only wage tax bill.

20 Okay. So we're ready to get 10:21:31
21 started, folks. We can proceed. So the
22 Chair at this time will be recognizing
23 Councilman Domb for a motion on an
24 amendment to Bill No. 210284.

3 at this point?

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

5 Absolutely. 10:21:53

6 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Okay. Thank
7 you.

8 I want to thank everyone. I
9 know it's late. I want to thank you,
10 Council President and colleagues, for the 10:21:59

11 opportunity to speak this evening. I
12 just wanted to share with you that this
13 past year, we've really worked to try to
14 build a case for what we've been doing in
15 Philadelphia. It really hasn't been 10:22:05

16 working great for a lot of
17 Philadelphians. It hasn't produced
18 family-sustaining jobs for our residents,
19 nor has it invited enough people and
20 businesses here to sustain jobs into the 10:22:16
21 future.

22 To start off the budget season
23 with a big and bold approach of the net
24 income taxes to try and focus on how we
25 change our trajectory, and given where 10:22:27

2 this body is today, we circulated an
3 amendment, thanks to Councilmember Derek
4 Green with his guidance and advice, that
5 brings this bold plan down to a one-year 10:22:36
6 reduction of net income taxes, but works
7 to start a conversation about how we put
8 Philadelphia on a new path.

9 A few weekends ago, some of us
10 read a report that noted in 1970, about 10:22:50
11 51 years ago, there were 940,000 jobs in
12 Philadelphia, and today, five decades
13 later, we have about 700,000 jobs,
14 25 percent less jobs, less opportunities
15 for our people. It also means that we've 10:23:05
16 been managing economic decline for the
17 last 50 years.

18 We have an opportunity today.
19 This is a moment in time where we can
20 write a new story going forward. We've 10:23:16
21 never received 1.4 billion from the
22 federal government, and this is a time
23 where we're managing the economic growth
24 for future decades, and we know what we
25 have to do, because it's been studied and 10:23:29

2 discussed repeatedly for decades.

3 We know our tax structure has
4 punished our people and businesses far
5 too long, and instead of relying on 10:23:40
6 Band-Aids we relied on in the past, this
7 is the time to tackle what's holding us
8 back.

9 The current tax structure is
10 failing our city and our residents and 10:23:48
11 our businesses, and the number one
12 problem, to be very clear, is the
13 6.2 percent net income tax. When added
14 to the state income tax, it creates a
15 16.2 percent tax on business income for 10:24:01
16 businesses located in Philadelphia. Only
17 New York City is higher at 17.2. We're
18 at 16.2. All other major U.S. cities and
19 across the country are much lower than
20 us. The third highest is California, 10:24:19
21 which is San Francisco, LA, San Diego.
22 They're at 8.8. We are at 16.2.
23 Washington, DC is 8.25. We're at 16.2.
24 And Chicago is at 7, and we're at 16.2.
25 This is the reason why we're 10:24:39

2 not producing these good,

3 family-sustaining jobs.

4 We're the only city in the

5 country in the last ten years where the 10:24:46

6 greatest number of jobs created were at

7 35,000 or less. In fact, 60 percent of

8 the jobs created in the last ten years

9 were for jobs paying less than 35,000,

10 while the national average was 29 percent 10:24:58

11 of the jobs created were less than

12 35,000.

13 In addition to conducting a

14 study of our tax structure, we've had

15 several discussions with businesses of 10:25:12

16 all sizes in every neighborhood, and

17 through these conversations, it became

18 clear that our net income tax is

19 essentially a tax that penalizes local

20 businesses, and we need to stop punishing 10:25:22

21 local small businesses with a tax their

22 competitors in the City don't have to

23 pay.

24 So take a look at what's

25 happening in the suburbs, and we've 10:25:30

2 talked about this. Companies are
3 locating and expanding outside our city.
4 They are creating family-sustaining jobs
5 that pay over 35,000 to 100,000 and more. 10:25:38
6 King of Prussia has had 4 billion of
7 investment and another billion in the
8 next 12 months. It's growing its
9 residents and jobs, and many of those
10 should have been in Philadelphia. But 10:25:49
11 what King of Prussia doesn't have is a
12 6.2 percent local net income tax and they
13 don't have a 3.87 wage tax.

14 This legislation is about
15 creating good-paying jobs for 10:26:01
16 Philadelphians, period.

17 And like I mentioned before, we
18 can't keep doing what we're doing and
19 expect those who have choices and who
20 will make them, they'll probably not make 10:26:11
21 that choice for Philadelphia. And for
22 anyone who believes this is trickle-down
23 economics, I ask you to take a drive out
24 to the suburbs and just look at what's
25 being built. Look at the corporate 10:26:22

2 campuses that exist. Look at the
3 surrounding row homes, townhouses, and
4 apartment complexes going up. What
5 they're doing is duplicating what we have 10:26:31
6 here, but yet they're creating
7 good-paying jobs while doing it, because
8 they don't have the tax structure.

9 If we don't listen to and
10 understand how businesses are making 10:26:41
11 decisions, we will fail to grow the
12 middle class here in Philadelphia. One
13 mile beyond our border is a thriving
14 economic engine. In fact, you know, when
15 you look at the jobs in Philadelphia, we 10:26:53
16 are 25 percent below the suburbs. We're
17 the only city on the East Coast that is
18 that far below our suburbs in job growth.

19 So I ask you all today to vote
20 for jobs in Philadelphia. This is very 10:27:04
21 important to me. And growing jobs here
22 helps to grow our population and helps us
23 fund our programs for the long term.

24 Right now we have the lowest
25 median household income regionally, lower 10:27:17

2 than Camden County by 20,000. We have
3 the greatest number of low-wage earning
4 jobs of all major cities. We have the
5 lowest formation of Black and Brown 10:27:28
6 businesses on the East Coast, and we have
7 the lowest formation of total businesses.

8 We have ten large employers
9 here. Only two pay business taxes,
10 American Airlines and Comcast. The other 10:27:38
11 eight are educational universities and
12 hospitals.

13 So I encourage my colleagues to
14 support this amendment and take action to
15 create better-paying jobs in our city. 10:27:50
16 This is a moment in time. I'm not sure
17 we'll see this again in my lifetime, but
18 it's an opportunity for us to try to fix
19 what has caused our employment decline in
20 the last 50 years. 10:28:02

4 opportunity to talk about Councilmember
5 Domb's amendment to the business income 10:28:15
6 and receipt tax.

7 In the Mayor's proposal, the
8 Mayor initially proposed a \$157 million
9 cut for the net income portion of the
10 business income and receipt tax. The 10:28:33

11 amendment that's been proposed as part of
12 Councilman Domb's bill is a reduction of
13 that -- of \$100 million, \$101 million, on
14 the net income portion of the business
15 income and receipt tax. And the reason I 10:28:45

16 support this legislation, because as a
17 former small business owner -- and I take
18 a lot of direction from a lot of small
19 business owners, especially in
20 communities of color. In particular, I 10:29:02

21 had a chance to have a very long dialogue
22 with members of the African American
23 Chamber of Commerce, the Hispanic Chamber
24 of Commerce, and the Asian American
25 Chamber of Commerce to get their 10:29:14

2 perspective on tax policy, and in my
3 conversation with them, they did a survey
4 of their members. Over 80 percent of
5 their members supported a reduction of 10:29:25
6 the business income and receipt tax.

7 In addition, in talking with
8 the leadership of those organizations,
9 they commended City Council, and I also
10 can speak to my experience as a Board 10:29:37
11 member of the National League of Cities,
12 President of the Democratic Municipal
13 Officials, as well as the President of
14 Pennsylvania Municipal League. This body
15 probably took the first action to address 10:29:50
16 COVID-19 compared to any other body at
17 the local, state, or federal level to put
18 more dollars into a relief fund for small
19 businesses through the small business
20 loan and grant relief fund that we did in 10:30:06
21 the very beginning of this pandemic when
22 we did the \$85 million transfer
23 ordinance, and when we did that, there
24 was a number of organizations that wanted
25 to participate and receive dollars 10:30:17

2 through that grant process, but they just
3 were not able to participate, even though
4 we did all that we could to get
5 information out to them.

7 organizations specifically what would be
8 a better type of relief for businesses of
9 color, African American businesses,
10 Hispanic businesses, Asian American
11 businesses, they said a grant fund was a
12 good idea, but a better proposal was an
13 across-the-board cut of their taxes, and
14 that's why they supported a reduction of
15 the business income and receipt taxes.

17 through this budget process is how do we
18 allocate resources for a lot of the
19 issues and concerns that we've talked
20 about, specifically last year as we saw
21 the challenges regarding the civil unrest
22 coming out of the tragic killing of
23 George Floyd and then here in the City of
24 Philadelphia Walter Wallace, Jr., and I
25 think the amendments that we're making to

3 issues are very important. That's why I
4 signed on to the letter from
5 Councilmember Johnson and followed his 10:31:28
6 leadership of how we provide additional

9 type of conversation. We need to provide
10 resources to address those issues. I 10:31:40
11 think this body has stepped up in that
12 regard from the numerous hearings we've
13 had regarding gun violence and the
14 additional commitment we're making
15 through this budget process in using the 10:31:52
16 dollars from the American Rescue Plan to
17 address anti-violence issues.

18 But at the same point, we also
19 have to look at the economic conditions
20 that have caused these concerns. And so 10:32:03
21 we've had hearings in this body, bringing
22 together both the anti-violence and
23 economic issues of our city, and we're
24 only going to be able to grow our city by
25 growing wealth in the City for those 10:32:16

3 This year and not that long
4 ago, a number of people talked about the
5 issues, and for some, that was news to 10:32:27

6 them what happened in Tulsa, Oklahoma and
7 what happened in Black Wall Street or the
8 Greenwood section of Oklahoma, but what
9 people don't realize, the reason why

10 there was a Tulsa, Oklahoma was a 10:32:37

11 significant amount of new wealth that
12 came into Oklahoma because of the finding
13 of oil. So you have those from a

14 majority community who found about oil
15 and gas and were able to hire in the 10:32:50

16 Black community of Greenwood, who were
17 able to now have a better quality of
18 life.

19 So similar to companies like
20 Comcast and others who were able to hire 10:32:59

21 people in that area of Greenwood, those
22 communities were able to prosper because
23 of the growth of economic development in
24 that area.

25 Unfortunately, they were not 10:33:09

2 able to spend in majority communities and
3 only could spend in Black Wall Street.
4 And they were also able to grow
5 businesses of color, specifically African 10:33:18
6 American businesses, in that community.

7 So this is not an either/or
8 perspective. We've got to find ways how
9 we grow Black and Brown businesses,
10 especially in the City of Philadelphia, 10:33:29
11 but also businesses as a whole, and I
12 think from the work that this body has
13 been doing through this budget, we're
14 trying to do that. We're trying to
15 address anti-violence issues. We're 10:33:38
16 trying to address a number of quality of
17 life issues in our Council, but at the
18 same point, sending the message that
19 we're trying to have growth in our city,
20 in the community, as well as in our 10:33:50
21 Center City core is very important.

22 So that's why I support this
23 initiative, from my experience not only
24 as a lender working in North Philadelphia
25 over the years as well as being a small 10:34:01

3 to those organizations that represent

10 neighborhoods and our commercial 10:34:23
11 corridors is by reduction of the business
12 income and receipt tax. And I think with
13 the dollars we're receiving from the
14 American Rescue Plan, we can do those
15 initiatives to help those businesses as 10:34:34
16 well as provide the resources that we
17 need to address the anti-violence issues

19 as well as all of the other quality of
20 life and budget restorations we're making 10:34:44

7 around this. When I started this journey

8 13 years ago around revising the tax

9 structure of businesses in the City of

10 Philadelphia, I was met with a lot of 10:35:12

11 cynicism about big business versus small

12 business versus medium business, and what

13 we showed back ten years ago was that

14 there is a fairer way of taxing the City

15 of Philadelphia, a way that we can be 10:35:26

16 intentional and focused about what we

17 want to help.

18 What did we accomplish then?

19 In a fact-based analysis, we knew that

20 the net profits tax, as stipulated by 10:35:35

21 both Councilmember Green and Domb, is the

22 most cost-burdened aspect of the small

23 businesses, and that's why we ultimately

24 at the end in the quest to eliminate the

25 net profits tax, we ended up with the 10:35:51

2 \$100,000 exemption.

3 At that point, we thought we
4 would help about 50,000 businesses. As
5 our Finance Director testified the other 10:36:01

10 also enhanced single sales factor where 10:36:13
11 we helped save over \$60 million a year
12 over the last decade to manufacturers.
13 So manufacturers who are producing
14 products in the City of Philadelphia can
15 be globally competitive, not paying the 10:36:26
16 net profits tax.

17 We also provided a use and
18 occupancy waiver where we got big
19 businesses to subsidize and support small
20 businesses. 10:36:37

21 There is a fairer tax place
22 that we can get as a city, and I agree
23 with my colleagues. Where we are,
24 whether it's the past or the regulatory,
25 as the Chamber of Commerce often 10:36:48

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2 highlights, is absolutely the
3 conversation we should have.

4 What I would say to everyone, I
5 am the first person that wants to be 10:36:56
6 bold, but I also want to be responsible.
7 Making projections with 2019 numbers
8 without seeing the returns of 2020 puts
9 us at a disadvantage about who do we help
10 and who needs -- all choices being equal, 10:37:10
11 which they never are, who can we be more
12 focused on supporting.

13 So I support their general
14 quest for how do we -- and we should be
15 looking at continuing to reduce the net 10:37:24
16 income tax, but as we have proven with
17 data, actions, and then results is that
18 when we make decisions and we pull
19 levers, we need to make sure that we know

19 Less than half of the City jobs

20 that were lost in the pandemic have been 10:44:56

21 restored as of now, and it's projected

22 that we can permanently lose 15 percent

23 of non-resident wage tax payers, a number

24 that could be lower, it could be higher,

25 as Councilmember Quinones-Sanchez has 10:45:08

3 time. And, again, it is difficult, if

9 are Brown (connection issues) we have in
10 our city, because we have a number of 10:56:42
11 entrepreneurs who are solo practitioners,

14 grow those businesses and start to employ
15 more people, especially in our commercial 10:56:51
16 corridors (connection issues)
17 Philadelphia, unfortunately many of them
18 move outside of the City in suburban
19 communities and not in the City of
