COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good morning, everyone.

(Good morning.)

COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: We have a quorum. I'd ask all guests and visitors to please take their seats behind the rail and we will get started.

To give our invocation this morning, the Chair recognizes Reverend Gregory Holston of the New Vision United Methodist Church. He is here today as my guest.

I'd ask all visitors and guests to please rise, and members.

(Members and guests rise.)

REVEREND HOLSTON: Council Chairperson, thank you very much again for this invitation.

I was one of the recent -- one of the organizers of the recent Martin Luther King Day of Action, Resistance, and Empowerment where over 7,000 to 10,000 Philadelphians came out to protest on Martin Luther King's birthday. That

2 march was birthed out of what happened in
3 Ferguson last year. And when that
4 decision came down to not indict the
5 police officer, I was walking with young
6 people that night, and many of them, of
7 course, were dismayed, angry, upset, but
8 as I began to talk to them, their
9 disappointment was directed to people of
10 my age, our generation. And they asked
11 the question why hadn't this situation
12 been solved already, why have not we've
13 resolved the issues of police brutality
14 and racial discrimination. And I had no
15 answer to them, because that same
16 frustration I felt, and that led us to
17 the march that we had.

18 And so I'm here to pray for
19 you, this City Council, our leadership of
20 our city, with those thoughts in mind of
21 those young people.

22 Let us bow our heads.

23 Dear Heavenly Father, we thank
24 you and praise you for this City Council,
25 who has taken on so many of the

2 challenges that face our city in this
3 last year, living wage status for our
4 contracted and uncontracted City workers,
5 labor peace for hotel and some airport
6 workers, paid sick leave already twice,
7 looking for one more time. But still,
8 God, you are present as they have taken
9 on these great challenges.

10 So I ask again, God, that you
11 will just strengthen them and encourage
12 them for the challenge ahead; to really
13 take a long look at our Police Department
14 here in the City of Philadelphia; to take
15 on the challenges that these young people
16 have continued to walk the street and
17 continued to protest about; to take a
18 look at our officers, so many, so
19 thousands and thousands of our officers
20 who risk their lives every day, who make
21 the great sacrifice, who give up
22 themselves and have given themselves
23 freely and continually, that they deserve
24 the applause and all the celebration of
25 all those efforts; those police officers

2 who work with citizens and citizens like
3 me to make a difference in our city.

4 We applaud you and thank God
5 for you, but, God, help us be able to
6 look critically at our Police Department.
7 Our Police Department is haunted by its
8 past and scarred by its present, a past
9 that includes even amnesty international
10 and human rights watch saying there are
11 human rights violations here in this
12 city; haunted by a past where our 39th
13 Police District of corruption that
14 occurred 20 years ago; haunted by a past
15 that has our Commissioners, even our
16 Police Commissioner from years ago, was
17 the first one ever to be indicted by a
18 major city; scarred by our continual
19 challenge of our present, that our stops
20 and frisks, that our young people are
21 crying out, saying, Please end them,
22 continue to rise in this city and 43 to
23 47 percent of them are unlawful,
24 unconstitutional and 80 percent of them
25 target our black and brown people.

2 God, help us -- help the
3 challenge that we face today to answer
4 the question these young people continue
5 to raise each and every day. Give us the
6 courage, God, that this body will examine
7 and hear their voices, hear their cry,
8 hear their concerns, so when the cry
9 comes out, Hands up, don't shoot, that we
10 know is a cry for justice. But when a
11 cry goes out and says, I can't breathe,
12 we know it's a cry for justice, that we
13 hear a cry saying that this stops now.
14 It's a cry from our own young people,
15 from our own children, from our own
16 babies are crying out who are saying to
17 this august body, Make a difference, make
18 a change, make something happen. Let's
19 take the responsibility on together.

20 We thank you, God, and we
21 praise you, God, for the courage that
22 you're going to give and the greatness
23 that is ahead for this city, a city that
24 can be a city of opportunity for all.

19 The Chair recognizes Councilman

21 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,

22 Mr. President. On behalf of the

23 republicans, there are no requests for

24 leave of absence.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The

2 Chair thanks the gentleman.

3 At this time, I would like to
4 dispense with the regular order of
5 business and I would like to welcome and
6 thank everyone who has come down today to
7 witness your government in action. We
8 saw a little bit of it earlier in the
9 Caucus Room, a spirited debate about some
10 of the very important legislation. I
11 think we came to a consensus, but that's
12 what we do here, and you'll see a little
13 bit more of it today.

14 So I just want to thank you all
15 for coming, and we hope that your stay
16 here is so pleasurable that you come back
17 again. Again, thank you.

18 At this time, the Chair
19 recognizes Councilwoman Brown, who will
20 present a resolution honoring the African
21 American Children's Book Project. Would
22 Vanesse Lloyd-Sgambati and those
23 accompanying her please join the
24 Councilwoman at the podium.

25 And joining Councilwoman

2 Reynolds Brown, we have Councilman
3 Neilson, Councilwoman Bass, Councilwoman

7 Blackwell. Pretty much everybody.

8 (Councilmembers and guests
9 approached podium.)

10 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Thank you,
11 Mr. President.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
13 You're welcome.

14 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: This
15 experience is absolutely one of my
16 favorite during the year because I love,
17 love, love, love, love, love, love books,
18 and this morning we are celebrating a
19 woman who has made books a centerpiece
20 for our children in the City. And the
21 record should reflect that I will never
22 own a Kindle because I like turning the
23 pages of a book.

24 Toni Morrison, America's first
25 African American woman to win the

2 Pulitzer Prize, said this about
3 literature: If there is a book that you
4 want to read but it hasn't been written
5 yet, then you must write it. Toni
6 Morrison.

7 So it's a wonderful pleasure to
8 once again bring before everyone Vanesse
9 Lloyd-Sgambati as we seek to honor our
10 city's African American Children's Book
11 Project.

12 Councilman Neilson.

13 COUNCILMAN NEILSON: And may I
14 add what a wonderful book. I'm having my
15 first granddaughter in about a month, so
16 I can't wait to share it with her.
17 Coming from five boys, having five boys,
18 and then now blessed with a
19 granddaughter, this is going to be
20 wonderful.

21 But on to the most important
22 part of the day.

23 Honoring the African American
24 Children's Book Project on the occasion
25 of the 23rd Annual African American

Children's Book Fair and that February 7th is the Kick-Off of the National Literacy Initiative - Preserve a Legacy, and Buy a Book;

Whereas

COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas, in 1926, noted historian Carter G. Woodson and the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History announced the second week of February to be "Negro History Week"; and

COUNCILMAN GOODE: Whereas, the 2nd week in February was chosen because of the birthdays of President Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass; and

Whereas, during early American History, African Americans were not allowed to learn to read and have books. In some states the penalty for this infraction was death; and

COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Whereas, the importance of book fairs cannot be understated, and for twenty three years the African American Children's Book Fair

has enhanced multi-culturalism in our
City utilizing the joy of reading as a
tool; and

Whereas, Vanesse Lloyd-Sgambati
created the book fair because she
believes books open up a world of
opportunities for children, and after
twenty three years, the African American
Children's Book Fair is the oldest and
largest single day event for children's
books in the country; and

COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,
one of the most important reasons to
encourage reading in our children is that
studies show that the more our youth
read, the more likely they are to make
positive life decisions as they grow
older; and

Whereas, strictly judging by
attendance, the fair is a tremendous
success as well over 3,500 people
attended the fair in the past years; and

COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Whereas,
rich or poor, no one leaves empty handed

as the books themselves are priced at a level where they are more affordable and posters, bookmarkers and raffle books are distributed free of charge to attendees; and

COUNCILMAN JONES: Whereas, one of the esteemed attendees will be Sharon Dennis Wyeth. Ms. Wyeth has written more than 50 books and is the proud recipient of the Stephen Crane Literary Award, presented by the Newark Public Library and an Education Award from the National Council of Negro Women. Ms. Wyeth's books have been cited for excellence by: The Children's Book Council, Parents Magazine, The New York Public Library and the "Reading Rainbow" television show; and

COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Whereas, another esteemed attendee will be Christopher John Farley, Senior Editorial Director, Features, The Wall Street Journal. Mr. Farley is the author of "Game World", a children's fantasy

2 adventure tale which Kirkus Reviews calls
3 "Exhilarating, thought-provoking and one
4 of a kind." Mr. Farley is one of the
5 authors of two novels for adults, "My
6 Favorite War" and "Kingston by
7 Starlight," and a number of non-fiction
8 books including the national bestseller
9 "Aaliyah: More than a Woman."

10 Mr. Farley has won numerous awards for
11 his work including honors from the
12 National Association of Black Journalists
13 and the Deadline Club of New York, and
14 his biography "Before the Legend: The
15 Rise of Bob Marley" was nominated for an
16 NAACP Image Award; and

17 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas,
18 two of the Literary Angels who have
19 contributed to the success of the event
20 are Community College of Philadelphia
21 Vice President of Marketing and
22 Government Relations, Lynette Brown-Sow,
23 and Erica Harrison, Special Events and
24 Community Relations Manager; and

25 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas,

the fair is also lucky to have terrific sponsors and partners such as NBC 10, PECO, Wells Fargo, I Heart Radio, Health Partners Foundation, Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds Brown, and Councilman Kenyatta Johnson, all of whom have been instrumental in keeping the literary flames ablaze for our children in the City of Philadelphia through tireless contributions to the African American Children's Book Fair. The financial contributions have enabled the book fair to give away thousands of brand new books of the guest authors and illustrators participating in the event. And for many children, it is the first time they will own a book; and

COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

Whereas, the 23rd Annual African American Book Fair will be held free of charge on Saturday, February 7th from one to three p.m. at the gymnasium of Community of College of Philadelphia at 17th and Spring Garden Streets.

2 I go every year, incidentally.

3 Now, therefore, be it resolved,
4 by the Council of the City of
5 Philadelphia, that we hereby honor the
6 African American Children's Book Project
7 on the occasion of the 23rd Annual
8 African American Children's Book Fair and
9 that February 7th is the Kick-Off of the
10 National Literacy Initiative - Preserve a
11 Legacy, Buy a Book.

12 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Further
13 resolved, that an engrossed copy of this
14 resolution will be presented to
15 representatives of the African American
16 Children's Book Project, starred by and
17 founded by Vanesse Lloyd-Sgambati, Sharon
18 Dennis Wyeth, Christopher John Farley,
19 Lynette Brown-Sow and Erica Harrison, for
20 their enormous work and efforts in the
21 promotion of children's literacy, as
22 evidence of the sincere sentiments of
23 this legislative body.

24 This resolution was presented
25 by myself and sponsored, underscored, in

2 bold ink, with three exclamation points,
3 by all the members of the Philadelphia
4 City Council. Let's salute the African
5 American Children's Book Project.

6 (Applause.)

7 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: I might
8 add parenthetically that those children
9 and families start gathering at 9 o'clock
10 a.m. for an effort that opens up at 1:00,
11 and last year in the rain, they stood in
12 line orderly and waited for their turn to
13 get into the gymnasium at Community
14 College of Philadelphia. It truly is --
15 it just moves you to see so many children
16 in our city who don't have the minimum
17 books in their home and wait for hours
18 for an opportunity to get a brand new
19 book, autographed often by the author or
20 illustrator right there at that
21 experience.

22 On Councilmembers' desks are
23 actual gifts written by those that we are
24 saluting this morning.

25 Thank you, Council President.

4 (Applause.)

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
6 the Chair recognizes Ms. Sgambati for
7 remarks.

8 MS. LLOYD-SGAMBATI: Darrell,
9 you be rolling with them S's every year.

10 President Darrell Clarke, thank
11 you so much.

12 Members of Council, I'm
13 overwhelmed this morning because I don't
14 think I've had this many people from City
15 Council in back of me when I've appeared
16 here the first Saturday -- the Thursday
17 before first Saturday in February. And a
18 special thanks to Blondell Reynolds
19 Brown, because she has always put her
20 palm in the world of literacy in this
21 community.

22 And I'm going to miss you,
23 Marian. I definitely will be eternally
24 grateful for all the things that you've
25 done for this city.

2 And Kenyatta, the first year he
3 became a Councilperson, Kenyatta Johnson.

4 If I'm sounding a little bit
5 familiar with these people, because I
6 feel like they're family.

7 But I want to thank each and
8 every one of you who are here this
9 morning also because in some way, you
10 make a contribution to the literary fiber
11 of this community, because I see a lot of
12 faces of people who have gone to the book
13 fair.

14 We are in a crisis in this
15 country because our children don't have
16 access to books, but we also are very,
17 very fortunate that there are lots of
18 African American children's books in the
19 marketplace, and that's why I'm
20 initiating a national campaign - Preserve
21 a Legacy, Buy a Book.

22 This morning I have two of the
23 best and the brightest from the African
24 American literary community, and they
25 will host an additional -- they will hold

2 fort with an additional 22 other
3 nationally known illustrators and authors
4 who are coming as far west as Sacramento,
5 California and as far as south as Dallas,
6 Texas. These are people who win awards.
7 These are people who are writing the
8 books that empower, enrich, and enlighten
9 our children.

10 This past Sunday there was an
11 article in the Philadelphia Inquirer
12 about the lack of libraries in our
13 school. I grew up in Philadelphia. We
14 didn't have a library. We didn't have a
15 school library and we didn't have a
16 community library. A book mobile came
17 around once a week. Our parents had
18 books in the home. It is time for
19 parents to take that responsibility and
20 bring books back into the home.

21 I'm going to pass the mike
22 first to Erica Harrison. Lynette
23 Brown-Sow could not be here. Because I
24 couldn't do this without Community
25 College. They open their doors and they

2 welcome us, and I don't have to chase
3 money to find a venue every year. That
4 gives me money to give away brand new
5 books to the children who attend the
6 event. And then you'll hear from Sharon
7 Dennis Wyeth and also Christopher John
8 Farley.

9 And thank you so very much.

10 (Applause.)

11 MS. HARRISON: Good morning.

12 On behalf of the students, faculty, and
13 administration of Community College of
14 Philadelphia, I would like to thank the
15 entire City Council for this resolution.

16 The College, which is
17 celebrating our 50th anniversary this
18 year, is honored to host the African
19 American Children's Book Fair, an
20 important literary event year after year.
21 Community College of Philadelphia
22 students also have the opportunity to
23 volunteer at the event. Our President,
24 Donald Generals, loves to say that
25 Community College of Philadelphia is a

2 learning community for our students. The
3 college's participation at the African
4 American Children's Book Fair continues
5 that mission.

6 I would also just like to thank
7 my husband who is here today, my number
8 one supporter, Todd Harrison, and my
9 children, Todd and Skyler, who could not
10 be here today. They're in school. But
11 they're one of the reasons why I continue
12 to put so much effort in this event year
13 after year. It is important that my
14 children, your children, all of our
15 children not only understand and know how
16 to read, but understand the fundamentals
17 of reading. It is our job, not just the
18 teachers' job, to make sure that they
19 learn and excel at reading. The
20 intellect of a community has a direct
21 effect on us all.

22 Thank you.

23 (Applause.)

24 MS. WYETH: Good morning. I'm
25 Sharon Dennis Wyeth. Councilmembers have

2 The Granddaughter Necklace on their
3 desks, and that's my book. I'd like to
4 thank, first of all, Councilwoman
5 Blondell Reynolds Brown for putting forth
6 this resolution and all other
7 Councilmembers and Vanesse Lloyd-Sgambati
8 for introducing my work to her. And
9 Vanesse also said that she wanted to make
10 sure that she thanked Jannie Blackwell.

11 My grandfather, Ellsworth
12 Lewis, born in 1911, spent his early
13 childhood in Philadelphia and attended
14 public schools here, and he was one of
15 the people who encouraged me to read,
16 along with my father and my mother and my
17 grandmother also. Books got me through a
18 difficult childhood. My parents were
19 divorced. There was domestic violence in
20 the home. My mother was challenged to
21 raise four children on her own. There
22 was also racial strife in my
23 neighborhood, numerous moves. But
24 whatever the upheaval was in the family,
25 I could always reach for a book for

2 solace. And mainly that was at -- I was
3 lucky. I had a public library, the
4 Anacostia Public Library in Southeast
5 Washington, DC. But I do recall that one
6 time when I was in fifth grade, there was
7 a book fair, the one and only book fair
8 that I ever attended at my elementary
9 school in southeast, Garfield Elementary.
10 I was in fifth grade. It took place on a
11 Saturday. I walked up to the school with
12 a quarter burning in my pocket. I saved
13 it from my allowance. And when I walked
14 into the gymnasium, there were all these
15 books, and I was thrilled. It took me a
16 long time to make my purchase, but the
17 book I bought had a pink cover and on the
18 cover there was a girl who was kneeling
19 next to a brick wall, and she had removed
20 one of the bricks from the wall and was
21 peering through the opening to see what
22 was on the other side. I was so excited
23 about that book, I couldn't wait to get
24 home to read it. In fact, I began to
25 read it as I was walking home. I was

2 turning the pages walking down the hill
3 reading the book.

4 If I had not been an
5 independent reader, I would not have been
6 a writer, simply because I could never
7 have imagined it.

8 Children need books, not just
9 for facts, but to give them hope and to
10 open their eyes to other worlds, books
11 where they can see themselves reflected
12 in a positive light, and that's what this
13 book fair is all about.

14 I'm proud to be here today.
15 I'm proud to be a small part of this
16 work, and I thank you so very much for
17 this great honor.

18 (Applause.)

19 MR. FARLEY: Hi. I'm
20 Christopher John Farley. I'm the author
21 of Game World, and I want to thank the
22 Council for having me here. I want to
23 thank Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds
24 Brown for helping to make this happen. I
25 want to thank Vanesse also and the

2 Children's Book Fair for allowing me to
3 be part of this and be part of this great
4 honor.

5 I want to tell you a little bit
6 about my story. I'm an author, and this
7 is my story. I'm from Rockport, New
8 York, a small town outside of Rochester,
9 and I went from that small town and ended
10 up graduating from Harvard. And I have
11 three brothers. They also lived with me
12 in Rockport, New York and went to public
13 high school just like I did, and they all
14 graduated from Harvard or from Harvard
15 Law School. And how did this happen? It
16 was all about books. We had books around
17 the house. We had books around the car.
18 We had books all throughout our lives,
19 and reading really helped propel us to
20 educational success. And that's one
21 reason I wrote Game World, because fewer
22 than 3 percent of kids' books feature
23 African American protagonists. The
24 number is even worse for Asians, for
25 Native Americans, and for kids of other

2 colors. We need to change that equation
3 around. We need to call attention to
4 books that do feature protagonists of
5 color, so kids can read about themselves
6 and so kids who aren't of color can read
7 about kids of color and experience more
8 of the world. That's what this kids'
9 fair is all about. That's what really
10 helped me in my education and in my life,
11 and I'm so glad to be here to share my
12 book Game World and talk about the
13 importance of books.

14 Again, thank you for having me,
15 and I hope to see you at the fair.
16 Thanks.

17 (Applause.)

18 MS. LLOYD-SGAMBATI: Final
19 note: The book fair is open to everyone.
20 It is not just for African American
21 children. I expect to see everyone here
22 with their grandchildren, their children
23 on Saturday, February the 7th, 1:00 to
24 3:00 p.m.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

There's an incredible body of knowledge within the veterans community across this country working on problems within the veterans community that I believe that this committee would address that easily transfer themselves to not just the veterans community but other pockets in this city as you go forward discussing this.

I would also say this, that one of the lead agenda items that I think needs to be discussed is this economic windfall that's coming to Philadelphia with all this development that so many

6 transmit it in due course to this body.
7 If this bill were to be in effect this
8 year, your deliberations would start on
9 Monday or thereafter and would take, in
10 the robust schedule of this august body,
11 whatever time it takes, and by resolution
12 or ordinance you'd take days or weeks or
13 months to approve our contract and then
14 for us to be paid. Through that time, we
15 have not yet been paid a cent on the
16 services that we've been delivering since
17 July 1st.

18 As well, these contracts stand
19 outside, just like all other contracts in
20 the City, except for these few that we've
21 been talking about, stand outside the
22 review of Council precisely for the
23 expeditious business and conduct of the
24 administration of the business of the
25 City. So it was said that it's for

continuity that this should happen. In point of fact, this is the most discontinuous thing we could create.

The City of Philadelphia creates thousands of vendor contracts of one year every year. None of them come before this body by Charter. The same mechanism was approved, as was stated, by the voters unanimously and previously by this board unanimously so as to keep the business of the City working.

Our Board, our fundraising has been funding this work since July 1 without payment. We hope that it will continue to be able to do this without this form of review. And I say that reluctantly that we would resist transparency because we are as committed to transparency as any organization in the country. We're willing to give you all of our books, all of our papers to demonstrate to you our highest quality case management service, the expertise and credentials of our staff, our 17

2 Master's level social workers, six staff
3 attorneys, and 300 volunteer attorneys.
4 In all modesty, we get recognition and
5 awards for the quality of our service.

6 We appreciate Councilman
7 O'Brien's recognition of our work and
8 those of our colleagues as exemplary.

9 We should not be brought into
10 this fight. It's going to hurt us, and
11 we need you to slow down the train.
12 There is no reason to move forward today
13 in fear of an entity that may be created
14 not earlier than July 1. So please give
15 it the time and deliberation and caution
16 that it needs.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 Thank you for your testimony.

19 MR. CERVONE: Thank you, sir.

20 CHIEF CLERK: James

3 for having me. My name is James
4 Belardinelli. I have a private criminal
5 defense practice here in the City, with
6 the bulk of that work being with court
7 appointments. I've been a lawyer for 22
8 years. I began my career as a clerk for
9 Justice Frank J. Montemuro of the
10 Pennsylvania Supreme Court. I was
11 Assistant District Attorney for 17 years,
12 with the bulk of that time spent in the
13 Family Violence and Sexual Assault Unit
14 and Homicide Unit. The bulk of my
15 practice now is homicides and major
16 felony cases.

17 I don't stand here telling you
18 my resume to puff myself up. I do it to
19 underscore what I think is the -- or
20 rather rebut, I think, sort of the notion
21 that underscores the RFP that's been
22 submitted, that on the criminal side
23 court-appointed attorneys are not
24 adequately qualified or aren't providing
25 adequate representation. My experience

2 is many, many members of the District
3 Attorney's Office as well as the Public
4 Defender's Office, much more talented
5 than me, use court appointments as a
6 route to transition into private criminal
7 practice. That will really be choked off
8 at this point if the RFP goes through as
9 constructed. So I'd ask Council to
10 consider that as they weigh this bill.

11 I think certainly Councilman
12 O'Brien is correct in asking that
13 something with that sort of economic
14 impact certainly should be approved by
15 Council before it's taken.

16 Thank you.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 Thank you for your testimony, sir.

19 CHIEF CLERK: The next four
20 witnesses - Damian Sammons, Vazken
21 Zerounian, Zac Shaffer, Leo Mulvihill,

3 name is Damian M. Sammons. I'm a private
4 criminal defense attorney here and I work
5 at the Criminal Justice Center, and I
6 take court appointments.

7 One of the stories I'd like to
8 tell about being a court-appointed
9 attorney, it's of a man whom I will call
10 Joe, who is a client of mine that I
11 received through court appointment. Joe
12 was an innocent man who sat in jail for
13 two years awaiting trial, and in two
14 years awaiting trial, he was awaiting
15 trial on charges of attempted murder at
16 gunpoint. It was his brother who
17 committed the crime, and he sat awaiting
18 trial.

19 His brother was murdered later
20 on by the same violence that he had
21 incited, and my client was incapable of
22 paying the inordinate bail. His family
23 was incapable of hiring a private
24 attorney, and the Public Defenders had a
25 conflict of interest, and so they

couldn't represent him.

I was appointed to him. And he was facing 20 to 40 years of incarceration for a crime that he did not commit.

When he was found not guilty of all charges, this grown man cried. He cried in relief and he cried for the two years of his life that he had lost that he would never get back.

Our city needs court-appointed attorneys. It needs this system. And for that particular case, I got a little over \$2,000 from the court appointment system, for a case that most attorneys in the private field would value at \$20,000. Most people who do court appointments don't do it to become rich. We do it because they know that there are two systems of justice. There's one for the rich and there's one for the poor. And there are a lot of outstanding attorneys who do court appointments who have saved a lot of lives. This system is in need

2 of them, and our city is in need of them.

3 We have to support every single
4 person fighting on behalf of the
5 indigent, on behalf of the poor and the
6 people that don't have the means to have
7 an excellent defense from a private
8 defense counsel when they could instead
9 get an excellent defense from
10 court-appointed attorneys.

11 Thank you.

12 (Applause.)

13 (Witness approached podium.)

14 MR. ZEROUNIAN: Good morning.

15 My name is Vaz Zerounian. I'd like to
16 thank this august body for the
17 opportunity to speak.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
19 morning.

20 MR. ZEROUNIAN: Although I'm
21 not as eloquent as my colleague, I'd just
22 like to say with the exception of ten
23 years where I was out of state serving my
24 country, I am a lifelong resident of
25 Philadelphia. Born and raised at

Summerdale and Unruh, educated at 17th and Girard, got my street education at 52nd and Kingsessing, and now I live in Councilman Kenyatta Johnson's district down in South Philadelphia. So when I say that Philadelphia is important to me, I want that to be understood of how important it is to me.

I just recently had started my own private criminal practice in Philadelphia. For the last almost four years I worked at the Public Defender's Office where I got to serve the indigent of this community. And, frankly, I left the Public Defender's Office for one purpose and one purpose only, is that unfortunately I could no longer afford to work at the Public Defender's Office. However, that does not mean I do not want to serve the poor of this community, the indigent of this community, the downtrodden and those who need the help. And, frankly, with the conflicts that occur, someone like me is exactly who

2 these people need to represent them. And
3 why? Because it's in me. Philadelphia
4 is in me, and I want to see people get
5 justice. And, frankly, growing up, I saw
6 many of my friends carted away and sent
7 to jail, and luckily I was one of the few
8 that was able to get out of the
9 neighborhood, was able to get out and
10 serve and get education and do what's
11 right. And, frankly, the vertical
12 representation that could be given by
13 private counsel is something that should
14 not be negated.

15 I have a client. I'll call her
16 Ms. Smith, for lack of a better term.
17 I've been with her for about a year now.
18 I left the Public Defender's Office.
19 However, it was so important for her
20 representation to continue by the same
21 attorney that I maintained on it on a pro
22 bono basis. I am now her attorney. And
23 the reason for that is because Ms. Smith
24 has mental health issues. Ms. Smith has
25 issues, and she became accustomed to me

and she knows how I work for her. She knows I work hard for her.

I can make a significant more amount of money, but as a person who just started and as a person who is looking to grow his business, court appointments is what's going to help me grow my business. So I get to serve the indigent of the community doing pro bono work, I get to serve the community by getting paid, and I also get to serve the community by getting appointed. And the appointments are what's going to help me build my business. So let's not only look at it as serving the community in one end. Let's look at it as a person who is going to be creating jobs, job creation. And if I don't have this, I'm going to have to not be able to continue my practice and perhaps go work for someone else and I will not have the opportunity to create those jobs that eventually will come.

I thank you for your time.

14 at the poverty rate? Oftentimes the
15 voice for the poor are court-appointed
16 attorneys.

17 When you have a situation where
18 there's a conspiracy charge or where
19 there's a drug dealer that sells to
20 different people, court-appointed
21 attorneys are the individuals that
22 represent them, and I think it's vital
23 for Council to understand the advantage
24 of having a court-appointed attorney.

25 Right now if you were to have

2 the Public Defender's Office represent
3 you -- and they do a fantastic job. My
4 best friend since middle school is
5 working for the PD because it's the best
6 training in the world. But if you work
7 for the PD, your initial interview will
8 be with someone. Your next interview
9 might be with someone else. Your
10 preliminary hearing, a third person.
11 Your smart room where they give you an
12 offer, a fourth person. Your trial, a
13 fifth person. And then if that gets
14 continued, maybe your next trial will be
15 a sixth attorney.

16 So I ask you, how important is
17 it for City Council to have competent
18 defense attorneys? Would you want to
19 have someone go and do surgery on someone
20 that's important to you, vital, and have
21 it so that you have six different doctors
22 you meet and then the day of surgery it's
23 a seventh person? It's simply not fair.

24 Right now we could take
25 advantage of excellent attorneys that are

2 dedicated to indigent defense. If they
3 were still at the Public Defender's
4 Office or the DA's Office, they'd be
5 supervisors, but they're out in private
6 practice making money, but still giving
7 back to the community.

8 I urge you all to support
9 Councilman O'Brien's bill. It is vital.
10 The poor deserve their voice, and
11 court-appointed counsel is their voice.

12 Thank you.

12 every single one of my clients when I
13 meet them for the first time that I will
14 treat them no differently than a private
15 attorney would.

16 Ladies and gentlemen, just to
17 piggyback off the comments of my esteemed
18 colleagues here, court-appointed counsel
19 is necessary here in the City. As a
20 small business owner, I've been
21 practicing for four years. I've
22 dedicated my career to criminal defense
23 defending the citizens of this city. I
24 ask the City Council members please
25 consider the importance of

6 In November of 2013, I
7 introduced two pieces of legislation that
8 made changes to the Philadelphia Home
9 Rule Charter. Bill No. 130851 was a
10 ballot question and Resolution 130861 was
11 the accompanying resolution. That
12 Charter amendment was approved by a
13 majority of Philadelphia voters in May of
14 2014.

15 Before the amendment to the
16 Charter, Section 2-309 of the Charter,
17 titled "Leases and Contracts," stated the
18 Council may by ordinance authorize the
19 leasing of real estate for more than one
20 year and the contracting of personal
21 property to be supplied or for services
22 to be rendered over a period of more than
23 one year. As a result, City Council had
24 no authority to review contracts that the
25 Administration enters into when the

2 length of the contract is for one year or
3 less. This is the approach to government
4 that I agree with. I do not believe that
5 every contract should require City
6 Council approval. However, I do strongly
7 believe that any contract dealing with an
8 individual's constitutional rights or
9 statutory rights is important enough to
10 require Council approval. Furthermore,
11 these contracts are of such importance
12 that an exception to the Charter was not
13 only required, but was in the best
14 interest of the City.

15 The right to counsel is a
16 constitutionally protected right. The
17 contract the Administration issued an RFP
18 for and plans to eventually sign deals
19 directly with this constitutionally
20 protected right. This Charter amendment
21 did not prohibit the Administration from
22 entering into a contract. It just
23 requires a public forum to be able to
24 review the contract and get answers
25 before the contract is signed. Before

2 the passage of this legislation, there
3 was no allowance for public input.

4 The amendment to the Home Rule
5 Charter requires that all contracts for
6 rendering of services for a year or less
7 that involves the expenditures of more
8 than \$100,000 for the purpose of
9 providing legal representation and
10 related legal services for the indigent
11 may only be made when permitted by
12 ordinance. This provision applies to the
13 contracts, renewals, and extensions.

14 In order to make the amendment
15 as narrow as possible so as not to open
16 the floodgates of City Council approval
17 for every contract, I did the following:
18 put a monetary threshold of over 100,000;
19 two, specifically state that this
20 amendment only applies to contracts
21 dealing with both legal representation of
22 the indigent. The monetary amount is
23 necessary to make sure that only large
24 contracts are considered. As a result,
25 this excludes individual private

2 attorneys who are currently providing
3 legal representation to the indigent by
4 being court-appointed conflict counsel.
5 However, the monetary amount includes the
6 Philadelphia Defender's Association,

10 extraordinary work. Because over the
11 years these organizations have been
12 contracting with the City, they are
13 exempt from the review requirements
14 unless Council provides an ordinance to
15 the contrary.

16 Bill No. 150001, which was
17 co-sponsored by my friend and colleague
18 Councilman Bill Greenlee, revokes the
19 exemption of reviewing contracts entered
20 into with the Philadelphia Defender's
21 Association, the Support Center for Child
22 Advocates, and Community Legal Services
23 to the extent that those contracts, in
24 whole or in part, are related to legal
25 representation of indigent individuals in

4 I believe the Defender's
5 Association, the Support Center for Child

11 representing indigent individuals
12 requiring the services of conflict
13 counsel.

14 I believe in an open and
15 transparent process, including Council
16 input, in a public forum. Council has
17 fully supported my previous legislative
18 package on this issue, and I am grateful
19 for that support, and I ask them once
20 again to be with me here today.

21 It's important to recognize the
22 Justice Department has already funded a
23 study. When the Sixth Amendment Center
24 started their work, they recognized that
25 this is a very complex system we have

commend this body for ensuring that in
Philadelphia we are ensuring that people,
men and women, will be promoted based on
their merit and that we want to have
