1 *(The following transpired in open*
2 *court, commencing at 11:54 a.m.:)*

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Good
4 morning.

5 I note that the hour has come and
6 that a quorum of this Council is present.
7 Council will come to order. Members will
8 take their seats; and visitors will retire to
9 the seats outside the rails.

10 To give our invocation this
11 morning, the Chair recognizes Pastor Terry M.
12 Davis of Christ Community Church of
13 Philadelphia. He is here today as the guest
14 of Councilwoman Brown.

15 I would ask all members and guests
16 to please rise.

17 *(Members and guests complied.)*

18 PASTOR DAVIS: Let's bow our heads.

19 Oh, Lord, we give you thanks for
20 the United States and its government. We
21 hold up before you our president and the men
22 and women who are in positions of authority
23 all over our land. We pray that your spirit
24 will rest upon all of them.

25 We pray today specifically for the

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1 City of Philadelphia; we pray for our Mayor;
2 and we pray, Lord, for the men and women of
3 our City Council led by President Anna Verna.

4 Thank you, Lord, for their
5 elections and reelections to these offices.
6 We thank you for giving to our City men and
7 women who have hearts to serve. They have
8 made and continued to make personal and
9 family sacrifices as they seek to make our
10 city a great one -- a blessed one.

11 Lord, please give them skillful and
12 Godly wisdom, filled with understanding of
13 how to lead effectively. Give them the kind
14 of fiscal wisdom that will bring financial
15 health and help to this City's communities,
16 businesses, schools and families. Grant them
17 favor, oh, Lord, favor and funding from state
18 and federal government that will aid in our
19 City's most recent crisis of hurricane
20 damage.

21 We come to you, Lord, today
22 asking -- asking for you to bring safety to
23 our City; that under the leadership of this
24 City Council we ask you to bring safety for
25 more than one and a half million lives of the

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1 City of Philadelphia.

2 We are neither afraid nor are we
3 ashamed to ask you to bring the crime rate
4 down; that you would provide a safer city
5 from murder, from rape, robbery and assault.

6 We pray today that as these 17 men
7 and women interact with each other, as they,
8 for the sake of the poor, middle class, the
9 upper class and businesses, as they challenge
10 and confront one another, as they
11 passionately seek for better benefits for the
12 districts that they represent, Lord, let
13 unity prevail among them.

14 May this City Council's oneness
15 achieve greatness.

16 We pray for their lives. We pray
17 for healing of their bodies. Please bless
18 their families and their relationships and
19 fill their lives with peace.

20 Lord, this City Council has a
21 daunting task of providing leadership for
22 this City. But with your great might and
23 your great power, it can be achieved, for you
24 have said we can do all things through
25 Christ, who gives us strength. So please

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1 strengthen them. Give strength to them and
2 to the personnel in their offices.

3 We pray, Lord, that all of our
4 communities will come out and vote regardless
5 of who their choice is. Lord, move on their
6 hearts to show up and to vote.

7 Finally, Father, we thank you. We
8 thank you that we can come to you at any time
9 and find help and strength, comfort and
10 encouragement, wisdom and direction, safety
11 and peace.

12 Thank you for hearing and, in
13 faith, answering -- answering our prayers as
14 we have asked all of these things, in
15 Christ's name.

16 Amen.

1 introducing this legislation to reduce the
2 parking tax and now offering an amendment
3 that we hope Council will approve.

4 In 2008 the parking tax was
5 increased from 15 to 20 percent. We are by
6 far the highest taxed industry in the city.
7 In fact, even at 15 percent we were the
8 highest taxed industry in the city.

9 Since that time, we began visiting
10 many of you individually and collectively
11 here in Council Chambers. All that we have
12 been asking for is tax fairness.

13 I know I speak for my company and
14 for the members of our association when I say
15 we certainly understand it is our obligation
16 to pay our share for the privilege of
17 operating our business in the city.

18 Like all businesses in the city, we
19 pay the business privilege tax which amounts
20 to 14 cents for every hundred dollars in
21 revenue. But in addition, we pay \$20 for
22 every \$100 of gross revenue through the
23 parking tax.

24 And to that extent, we can -- we
25 must build those taxes into what we charge

1 our customers.

2 We would have preferred the
3 original Council Bill that would have rolled
4 the parking tax back to the original
5 15 percent. But the amendment offered today
6 goes more than halfway, with incremental cuts
7 starting in Fiscal 2014. We know the
8 financial challenges of the City. And we
9 appreciate Council's willingness to make the
10 parking tax fairer.

11 The process of trying to make the
12 parking tax fairer has energized our
13 association to show the City ways to collect
14 far more revenues for the City's General Fund
15 than we are requesting in parking tax
16 reductions. We invested hundreds of hours of
17 legwork, and research exposed that 35 percent
18 of the parking operations in the City were
19 not licensed and not paying taxes.

20 The City's Revenue Department and
21 License and Inspection Department continue to
22 use this information, and they are cracking
23 down on these rogue operators, and they are
24 collecting already more for the City.

25 As a result, the parking tax for

1 the month of July is the only Philadelphia
2 tax -- this is from the PICA study -- to show
3 an increase in revenue over the past year and
4 what the City had budgeted for. And that's a
5 direct reflection, we feel, of the attention
6 that we have drawn to this matter.

7 We have been so effective in
8 helping the City crack down on rogue lots
9 that the operators of some of those lots have
10 contacted members of our parking association
11 to ask if we wanted to lease their lots.
12 They would rather lease their lots to us than
13 operate them illegally and pay the parking
14 tax. But others have paid up and now are
15 operating legally as well.

16 What our efforts have shown is that
17 even while reducing the parking tax rate to
18 17 percent over the next five years, revenues
19 of the City will not decrease and, in fact,
20 will increase, as long as the Revenue
21 Department continues enforcement. And we
22 pledge to work with revenue officials for as
23 long as they want our help.

24 Our members have shown consistently
25 that we are good citizens, corporate

13 *(No response.)*

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The ayes
15 have it. The Resolution is adopted.

16 That completes our calendar.

17 No. I'm sorry. Michael.

18 Sorry. We will now go into the
19 special business.

20 The Chair now recognizes
21 Councilwoman Tasco for a motion regarding
22 additional special business.

23 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: I move that

1 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you, Madam
2 President. And to all of my colleagues,
3 welcome back.

4 This week we had an opportunity to
5 welcome back students to the public school
6 system. And no matter where you stand on
7 Dr. Ackerman and her leaving, it was good
8 that 150,000 plus students went back to
9 school.

10 And whether you were at Lamberton
11 High School or newly founded Keith Reed's
12 Academy that caters to the boys that are from
13 a single-parent household, or whether you
14 were at the new West Philadelphia High School
15 in the 3rd District, or even some of the
16 adult classes that have actually started on
17 continuing education partnerships with
18 Calvary Baptist Church in West Philadelphia,
19 and Harcum Junior College in a two-year
20 degree program, or in the 7th Councilmanic
21 District, Congresro -- they also are opening
22 up a satellite shop -- at the end of the day,
23 it is about producing a productive work
24 force. And we're awaiting in the next couple
25 hours to hear from our president to talk

1 about how we can kick start the economy back.

2 But what I'd like to do is what
3 Blondell Reynolds Brown often calls: "Let us
4 have a teaching moment." And we do the A, B,
5 Cs of what we need to be looking for and
6 expecting of the schools' performance this
7 year.

8 "A" would be for attendance,
9 achievement and accountability in the
10 education process.

11 "B" would be back to basics, where
12 we look to find trades -- 17 plus trades that
13 it takes to build a building in the City of
14 Philadelphia.

15 And "C" would be for consolidated
16 effort and cash to run this system and
17 consolidating the buildings that we currently
18 have for 70,000 less students based on the
19 facility's master plan.

20 At the end of the day, I think
21 Frederick Douglass said it best: "It is
22 easier to build a strong child than to repair
23 a broken man or woman."

24 Thank you, Madam President.

2 The Chair recognizes Councilwoman
3 Brown.

4 COUNCILWOMAN REYNOLDS BROWN: Thank
5 you, Madam President.

6 As a former teacher, I would give
7 my colleague, Councilman Jones, an A plus.
8 Very, very well spoken.

9 I rise today as a former teacher,
10 as a parent of a 10th grader, wherein I have
11 36 more months to get her ready, to launch
12 her. But I also like to speak as Vice Chair
13 of City Council's Committee on Education.

14 I, like Councilman Jones, would be
15 remiss not to acknowledge and recognize that
16 this indeed was the first week of back to
17 school for our children.

18 Under the new interim leadership, I
19 would submit that we had a strong first day
20 back to school for our students, parents and
21 care-givers.

22 We all have heard the old adage,
23 and it bears repeating, in the words of
24 Marian Wright Edelman: "If we don't stand up
25 for children, then we certainly don't stand

1 for anything."

2 We also know the reality, and it
3 bears repeating, according to the U.S. Bureau
4 of Labor Statistics, there still remains a
5 clear correlation between an unemployment
6 rate and one's educational level.

7 A few facts: For those Americans
8 age 25 and over, 14.3 percent of them are
9 unemployed.

10 For citizens with just a high
11 school diploma, 9.6 percent of them are
12 unemployed.

13 Those with an associate degree or
14 limited college experience, 8.2 percent are
15 unemployed.

16 And for young people with a
17 bachelor's degree, 4.2 percent are
18 unemployed.

19 I submit that it is certainly our
20 duty to develop and cultivate the 150,000
21 plus students and young people in our charter
22 schools because, Madam President, they are
23 our next generation of leaders. They're
24 going to grow up, move in, and move up to
25 take over our businesses, our universities,

1 our churches and this government.

2 For these reasons and more, I
3 commend my colleagues for the laser beam
4 attention we gave to the School District
5 budget process this past spring and ask that
6 we continue to do what I call pay attention
7 to our City's education system.

8 Therefore, I wish to salute the new
9 Acting Superintendent, Dr. Leroy Nunery, in
10 his new role. And I am pleased to say that
11 Councilman Kenney and I sat down with him in
12 his former role wherein we had extensive
13 conversations around the bullying project
14 that we're currently working on. And we both
15 found him to be, among other things, a
16 listener.

17 I joined with many of you this week
18 and had the honor and privilege to attend the
19 Welcoming Breakfast hosted by Councilwoman
20 Blackwell, Chair of City Council's Committee
21 on Education, welcoming Dr. Nunery in his new
22 role.

23 Dr. Nunery was very clear about his
24 short-term goals and communicated quite
25 effectively his, what I call, "work plan" for

1 this academic year.

2 He made a number of self-imposed
3 assignments. I'll repeat a couple of them.
4 Councilman Jones has already spoken to one.
5 He has a strong interest and intends to make
6 more things happen with regards to career and
7 technical schools.

8 He talked about his interest to
9 improve efficiencies in the existing
10 operations. And he spoke clearly about his
11 interest to ensure that we all honor the
12 School District of Philadelphia and the
13 Mayor's accountability work plan.

14 In closing, our new Acting
15 Superintendent understands many lessons I've
16 learned from geese. One I'd like to share.

17 As each goose flaps its wings, it
18 creates an uplift for birds that follow. By
19 flying in a V formation, the whole flock adds
20 71 percent greater flying range than if each
21 bird flew alone.

22 What is the lesson in that, Madam
23 President, for those of us who sit in this
24 Chamber, parents, stakeholders, including the
25 Philadelphia business community and others?

1 People who share a common direction
2 and sense of community can get where they are
3 going quicker and easier because we are
4 traveling on the thrust of one another.

5 So I join all of us who share
6 Dr. Leroy Nunery's direction and look forward

9 working for him, as he endeavors to fully
10 accomplish his work plan he articulated this
11 week.

12 Thank you, Madam President.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
14 recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell.

15 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank you,
16 Madam Chair.

17 I would like to present to you a
18 young man who's interning on my staff,

21 Professions and Social Work. He will be
22 graduating with his Master's in social work
23 in the spring. And his interests are
24 government and policy.
