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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Good

4 and that a quorum of this Council is
5 present.

12 Christine Ritter, Vicar of Saint Mary's
13 Episcopal Church.

14 I would ask all members and
15 guests to please rise.

16 (Members and guests rise.)

17 MOTHER RITTER: I say thank you
18 to President Anna Verna for inviting me
19 here this morning.

20 Let us pray.

21 Lord God, behold and visit we
22 pray all the cities of the earth and
23 especially this our City of Philadelphia
24 here in Pennsylvania. Continually renew
25 the ties of mutual regard which form our

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The
3 Chair thanks Mother Ritter for her
4 invocation.

5 (Council at ease.)

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The
7 next order of business is the approval of
8 the Journal of the meeting of Thursday,
9 June 10th, 2010, and the Chair recognizes
10 Councilwoman Tasco.

11 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Thank you,
12 Madam President. I move that the Journal
13 of the meeting of Thursday, June 10th,
14 2010 stand approved.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Is
16 there a second?

17 (Duly seconded.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: It
19 has been moved and properly seconded that

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Those

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2 opposed?

3 (No response.)

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The

5 ayes have it, and the Journal is

7 The next order of business is

8 requests for leave of absence, and the

9 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Tasco.

10 COUNCILWOMAN TESCO: Thank you,

11 Madam President. On behalf of the

12 majority, there are no requests for leave

13 of absence today.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The

15 Chair thanks the Councilwoman.

16 The Chair recognizes Councilman

17 O'Neill.

18 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Madam

19 President, on behalf of the republicans,

20 there are no requests for leave of

21 absence.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Thank

23 you.

24 The Chair will dispense with

25 the regular order of business to

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2 recognize the guests and visitors joining
3 us in Chambers this morning. On behalf
4 of all members of City Council, I welcome
5 you to our Council session. We
6 appreciate your taking the time to join
7 us as we attend to the legislative
8 affairs of our city. We certainly invite
9 you to come again.

10 At this time, the Chair
11 recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell, who
12 will present a citation honoring Gloria
13 Guard on her retirement from the People's
14 Emergency Center.

15 Will Ms. Guard and those
16 accompanying her please join the
17 Councilwoman at the podium.

18 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
19 you, Madam President. This is a special
20 pleasure for me to be part of honoring a
21 friend for many, many years, and in case
22 many of you did not know, People's
23 Emergency Center in the 3rd District is
24 the oldest shelter in the state.

25 City Council, City of

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2 Philadelphia citation honoring Gloria M.
3 Guard.

4 The Council of the City of
5 Philadelphia is pleased to join the
6 People's Emergency Center in honoring
7 Gloria M. Guard on the occasion of her
8 retirement.

9 Whereas, Gloria Guard is
10 President of the People's Emergency
11 Center, PEC, and recipient of the
12 prestigious Philadelphia Award. She is
13 the social transformation agent par
14 excellence and community-building
15 entrepreneur. Gloria has converted PEC,
16 a start-up homeless service agency
17 originally housed in a church basement,
18 that was 3311 Chestnut Street, into one
19 of the nation's most forward-thinking and
20 comprehensive providers of housing and
21 social services to homeless women and
22 their children. Because of its strong
23 record, PEC has attracted over \$90
24 million in government and foundation
25 support under her and has been recognized

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2 as a national model by the United States
3 Department of Housing and Urban
4 Development.

5 May I add we are very proud of
6 the Bernice Elza Homes named in honor of
7 our mothers.

8 Whereas, when Gloria began her
9 employment with PEC, the shelter rented
10 space on the first floor of a now defunct
11 church, was open only on weekends.
12 Gloria had a staff of seven and a budget
13 of \$194,000. Today, PEC has more than 90
14 employees and an annual operating budget
15 of more than \$6 million. The agency
16 annually provides about 400 homeless
17 women and children with emergency shelter
18 and short-term permanent housing, as well
19 as a full array of services vital for
20 breaking the cycle of family
21 homelessness, including employment
22 training, drug and alcohol counseling,
23 health services, after-school and summer
24 programs for children and teens,
25 parenting skills, and counseling that

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2 links to homeownership; and

3 Whereas, Gloria has a visionary

4 commitment to using the power of

5 technology for helping homeless women and

6 low-income neighborhood residents help

7 themselves. That vision bore fruit in

8 the form of a partnership with One

9 Economy, resulting in computer training

10 programs for teens and adults, computer

11 giveaways to low-income families,

12 technology internships for low-income

13 teens, and creation of Philadelphia's

14 first neighborhood-based wireless

15 hotspot, the first.

16 More recently, she has played a

17 leading role in a burgeoning national

18 movement to provide low-income residents

19 with access to broadband technology. In

20 addition, she started E-Assist, which

21 enables parents to transmit welfare

22 documents, report job hours and resolve

23 problems with their welfare caseworkers

24 through the Internet. The program, one

25 of the first of its kind in the country,

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2 allows parents to meet the requirements
3 of welfare-to-work legislation without
4 taking time away from obligations to work
5 and family; and

6 Whereas, Gloria is well known
7 for her commitment to development efforts
8 and for her leadership in the homeless
9 arena. She led PEC in establishing its
10 own community development corporation,
11 resulting in almost 200 new units of
12 affordable housing in the low-income
13 Mantua/West Powelton neighborhood of West
14 Philadelphia, 25 new neighborhood
15 businesses, the clearing of more than 100
16 abandoned lots and the repairing of
17 dozens of decrepit homes and storefronts;
18 and

19 Whereas, she has also an
20 adjunct professorship at the University
21 of Pennsylvania's Fels School of
22 Government and College General Studies.
23 She chairs the Regional Housing Legal
24 Services Board and co-chairs the Greater
25 Philadelphia Urban Affairs Coalition,

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2 serves on many national, regional and
3 local boards, including One Economy, the
4 Affordable Housing Advisory Council of
5 the Federal Home Loan Bank of Pittsburgh,
6 and the ING Direct Community Advisory
7 Board.

8 In addition to receiving the
9 Philadelphia Award, Gloria Guard has been
10 presented the United Way's Citizen of the
11 Year award, the Philadelphia Bar
12 Foundation's Louis D. Apothaker award,
13 the Philadelphia Eagles and Dunkin'
14 Donuts 75 Greatest Living Philadelphians
15 award, the Professional Women's
16 Roundtable Power award, and Trinity
17 University's Sower's Seed award.

18 Gloria holds two Master's
19 degrees from Bryn Mawr College and
20 received a Fannie Mae fellowship to the
21 Kennedy School of Government at Harvard
22 University in 2001.

23 She lives in Philadelphia and
24 has two children and three grandsons.

25 Therefore, by virtue of this

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2 citation, the Council of the City of
3 Philadelphia is pleased and proud to join
4 People's Emergency Center in honoring
5 Gloria Guard on the occasion of her
6 retirement. We wish her a retirement
7 filled with health, happiness and the
8 joys of family and friends, and extend
9 the sincere respect and admiration of
10 this legislative body.

11 We love you, Gloria.

12 Congratulations.

13 (Applause.)

14 MS. GUARD: Now, as Jannie
15 knows, I'm an advocate, and so I couldn't
16 leave this opportunity alone to address
17 the entire magnificent City Council of
18 Philadelphia.

19 Madam Chairwoman, thank you so
20 much, and Ms. Jannie, whose work on
21 behalf of the homeless and the low-income
22 people in her district is without -- is
23 without par. I mean, I cannot tell you
24 that PEC couldn't have done the work it
25 did without Lucien Blackwell's support,

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2 without Jannie Blackwell's support and
3 without the support we have in Harrisburg
4 and in Washington.

5 I would like to invite each and
6 every member of City Council, especially
7 those of you who have qualms about the
8 homeless, who worry about low-income
9 housing, take a ride out Lancaster
10 Avenue, the nation's oldest turnpike,
11 look around. What you will see is a
12 neighborhood that is absolutely in the
13 middle of a renaissance. It has been
14 revitalized, and that is despite the
15 homeless shelter that's there, homeless
16 people who are living in rental housing
17 and formerly homeless people who are in
18 homeownership.

19 Our neighborhood in Jannie's
20 district is a living example of how
21 low-income people and economic
22 development can live side by side and can
23 thrive, and the entire neighborhood comes
24 up.

25 And so I thank each and every

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2 one of you for looking out for the
3 low-income households in this city the
4 way Jannie has, and so that you can know
5 in your heart that supporting poor people
6 is also supporting business.

7 Thank you.

8 (Applause.)

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank
10 you.

11 Council will be at ease.

12 (Council at ease.)

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
14 Chair now recognizes Councilwoman Tasco,
15 who will present a resolution honoring
16 Tom Pell.

17 Will Mr. Pell and those
18 accompanying him please join the
19 Councilwoman at the podium.

20 The Chair recognizes
21 Councilwoman Tasco.

22 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Thank you,
23 Madam President. It gives me great honor
24 this morning to represent one of our
25 leading businessmen in the 9th

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2 Councilmanic District, and I'm pleased to
3 present this resolution honoring Tom
4 Pell.

5 Whereas, the Council of the
6 City of Philadelphia is pleased and proud
7 to honor Mr. Tom Pell for his several
8 years of service as the President of the
9 Wadsworth Avenue Business Association and
10 service to the citizens and institutions
11 of Northwest Philadelphia and the entire
12 City; and

13 Whereas, Tom Pell has been the
14 owner of Sam's Quality Meat Market,
15 located at 1524 Wadsworth Avenue, for 17
16 years. He began his career in the retail
17 business 34 years ago and worked for
18 almost 20 years in his family's North
19 Philadelphia-based business; and

20 Whereas, Mr. Pell was President
21 of the Wadsworth Avenue Business
22 Association from 1996 to 2007 and
23 returned to his current position as
24 President in 2009, and through his past
25 and current involvement, he has

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2 dramatically increased the participation
3 of merchants and the quality of the
4 Association; and

5 Whereas, Tom Pell has been a
6 steadfast contributor and supporter of
7 various community events, like Wadsworth
8 Day, and has worked with numerous
9 organizations and elected officials to
10 improve the Wadsworth Avenue business
11 corridor and the quality of life for the
12 residents of the community; and

13 Whereas, Mr. Pell has dedicated
14 and devoted Northwest community
15 activist -- is a dedicated and devoted
16 Northwest community activist that
17 consistently advocates for the well-being
18 of his fellow merchants and the community
19 as a whole.

20 Now, therefore, be it resolved,
21 by the Council of the City of
22 Philadelphia, that we hereby recognize
23 and congratulate Mr. Tom Pell for his
24 several years of civic and community
25 service to the citizens and institutions

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2 of the City of Philadelphia through his
3 outstanding service as President of the
4 Wadsworth Avenue Business Association.

5 Further resolved, that an
6 engrossed copy of this resolution be
7 presented to Mr. Tom Pell as evidence of
8 the sincere sentiment of this legislative
9 body.

10 Certification, that this is a
11 true and correct copy of the original
12 resolution, adopted by the Council of the
13 City of Philadelphia on the 3rd day of
14 December 2009. It is signed by all
15 members of City Council, and we thank
16 you, Tom, for your leadership.

17 (Applause.)

18 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: I'd just
19 like to say, before the President calls
20 on Tom, that Wadsworth Avenue has gone
21 through a great change, and it was with
22 his leadership in working with the
23 merchants to understand the importance of
24 improving the facades of their stores and
25 improving the inside of their businesses.

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2 So if you go up and you see the
3 streetscape, working with State Senator
4 LeAnna Washington and the hard work of
5 State Representative Cherelle Parker and
6 yours truly, he has been a leader with
7 the Mount Airy Revitalization Corporation
8 as well as Ogontz Revitalization
9 Corporation to make that and change that
10 neighborhood around, and we're real proud
11 of his leadership, because it was very,
12 very difficult, and I want to say thank
13 you, Tom.

14 (Applause.)

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: The
16 Chair recognizes Mr. Pell for remarks.

17 MR. PELL: Thank you very much,
18 Marian. I'd like to thank all the public
19 officials that have done this for me. I
20 am very deeply honored in the City that I
21 was born and raised and still work here.
22 And, again, I don't know what to say.
23 It's very, very overwhelming. Thanks
24 again.

25 Thank you, Marian Tasco.

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2 (Applause.)

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA:

4 Council will be at ease. Oh, I'm sorry.

5 MR. PELL: I've brought a few
6 friends with me. I have Patrice Edwards,
7 great, great person, works in the
8 corridor, directs things for us. Without
9 Patrice, I could not do it.

10 I have my lovely wife, Judy,
11 with me and John Unger, who used to work
12 for ICDC. I believe I said it correctly.
13 And he's become a very good friend, and
14 he tells me what I need to do and not
15 need to do. Without these people here, I
16 could not do it.

17 Again, thank you very much for
18 your time.

19 (Applause.)

20 (Council at ease.)

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
22 Chair now recognizes Councilmembers
23 Blackwell and Jones, who will present a
24 resolution honoring the African American
25 Museum of Philadelphia.

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2 Will Mr. Elhadji and those
3 accompanying him please join the
4 Councilmembers at the podium.

5 The Chair recognizes
6 Councilwoman Blackwell.

7 COUNCILMAN JONES: I am not
8 Councilwoman Blackwell. However --

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT Verna: Prove
10 it.

11 COUNCILMAN JONES: Oh, boy.
12 This is the last session of the year.

13 We have the honor of
14 recognizing and honoring and celebrating
15 the African American Museum of
16 Philadelphia in recognizing Senegal in
17 this year's annual celebrity --
18 "Celebrating Africa" event.

19 Let me start again. You shook
20 me up with that.

21 Recognizing, honoring and
22 celebrating the African American Museum
23 of Philadelphia in recognizing Senegal in
24 this year's annual "Celebrate Africa"
25 event.

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2 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

3 Whereas, 2010 is the Fifth Anniversary of
4 "Celebrate Africa," as well as the 50th
5 Anniversary of Senegal's independence;
6 and

7 Whereas, the theme of the event
8 will be "Hospitality-Enracinement-
9 Ouverture," to simultaneously celebrate
10 the roots of Senegalese cultural heritage
11 and its outreach to the rest of the
12 world; and

13 Whereas, the local African
14 community and the City of Philadelphia
15 will take this opportunity to make
16 "Celebrate Africa" the highlight of 2010
17 for the African American Museum of
18 Philadelphia.

19 Now, therefore.

20 COUNCILMAN JONES: Resolved,
21 that the Council of the City of
22 Philadelphia, hereby recognizes, honors
23 and celebrates the African American
24 Museum of Philadelphia in recognizing
25 Senegal in this year's annual "Celebrate

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2 Africa" event.

3 Further resolved, that an
4 engrossed copy of this resolution be
5 presented to the organizer of "Celebrate
6 Africa" as evidence of our sincere
7 admiration of this legislative body.

8 I'd like to also say that in
9 the Odunde celebration that annually
10 occurs on South Street, there were a lot
11 of celebrations, but also serious
12 discussions about economics and trade
13 with the continent of Africa. One of the
14 interesting statistics is that \$18
15 billion worth of product, goods and
16 services comes through Philadelphia's
17 port and goes around the world. They're
18 a significant partner both in trade,
19 culture and heritage.

20 (Applause.)

21 MR. ELHADJI: Thank you, Madam
22 President, Councilmembers. First I want
23 to thank Councilman Curtis Jones and
24 Councilwoman Blackwell for this
25 resolution, and, again, thank you. Thank

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2 you so much. Jannie was an
3 (unintelligible) and will be a mother for
4 the African immigrant population in
5 Philadelphia. And I will be remiss if I
6 don't thank also Ramona Riscoe Benson,
7 the President of African American Museum,
8 for initiating this event since five
9 years. And the concept is to showcase
10 and celebrate one African country every
11 year, and this year Senegal will be
12 celebrated. So we will be showcasing our
13 country, the tradition, culture, music,
14 arts, food, and it's going to be held at
15 the African American Museum on July 31st,
16 2010. So we invite everybody to join us.

17 And also, Curtis, I cannot
18 thank you enough.

19 Curtis is a brother for us, and
20 he's been with our family and friends for
21 years now. Thank you. Thank you so
22 much.

23 Thank you for everything.

24 Thank you for the opportunity.

25 (Applause.)

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2 MR. ELHADJI: And also I wanted
3 to say also that I'm here with my family
4 and friends and African -- my friend from
5 the African immigrant population, my
6 wife, my sister Fatu. And thank you.

7 Thank you so much. Thank you
8 for being with me.

9 (Applause.)

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The
11 Chair recognizes at this time Ramona
12 Riscoe Benson, head of the African
13 American Museum, for a few words, please.

14 MS. BENSON: Good morning.

15 (Good morning.)

16 MS. BENSON: Thank you, Madam
17 President. Thank you to Councilman
18 Jones, Councilwoman Blackwell, and good
19 morning to everyone. I do thank you so
20 much for recognizing this very important
21 event for the African American Museum.
22 "Celebrate Africa" is important because
23 as an African American museum, it is
24 essential that we are creating
25 relationships within the African

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2 community and our region, and it is
3 gratifying to know that so many people
4 each year commit so much of their time to
5 develop and coordinate this important
6 event for the Museum. And so we thank
7 Elhadji and all of the members of the
8 working committee of "Celebrate Africa."

9 I also want to recognize the
10 fact that many of our members are also
11 members of the Mayor's Commission on
12 African and Caribbean Affairs. That is
13 very important, a very important engine
14 for us in this community, and we thank
15 Councilwoman Blackwell so much for the
16 guidance that she provides this community
17 as it relates to its critical issues that
18 need to be addressed.

19 And so, finally, I also want to
20 let you know that the African American
21 Museum last night dedicated the front
22 entrance, the new front entrance of the
23 Museum, and I am inviting everyone to
24 come and be our guest and experience the
25 new African American Museum. And so

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2 thank you so much for this honor.

3 (Applause.)

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA:
