15 This is the public hearing of

16 the Committee on Rules regarding Bill

17 Nos. 210933, 220112, 220113, 220224 and

18 220298.

19 Will the Clerk please read the

20 titles of the bills.

21 THE CLERK: Bill No. 210933, an

22 ordinance to amend the Philadelphia

23 Zoning Maps by changing the zoning

24 designations of certain areas of land

25 located within an area bounded by Snyder

1 Avenue, Weccacoe Avenue, Wolf Street and
2 Swanson Street.

3 Bill No. 220112, adopting an
4 amendment to the Articles of
5 Incorporation of the Manayunk Special
6 Services District of Philadelphia to
7 extend the term of that Authority; all
8 under certain terms and conditions.

9 Bill No. 220113, approving a
10 new plan, estimated costs and proposed
11 method of assessment of Manayunk Special
12 Services District for and concerning
13 business improvements and administrative
14 services of the Manayunk Business
15 District of the City of Philadelphia.

16 Bill No. 220224, an ordinance
17 to amend -- to approve amendments to the
18 Drexel University Master Plan in the
19 area bounded by 34th Street, Cherry
20 Street, 33rd Street, and Powelton
21 Avenue, related to the Kelly Hall
22 Building at 203 North 34th Street.

23 And Bill No. 220298, an
24 ordinance to approve amendments to the
25 Jefferson Torresdale Hospital Master

1 Plan related to the new Proton Therapy
2 Center Building at 10800 Knights Road.

3 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Before we
4 begin to hear testimony from the
5 witnesses we have for today, everyone
6 who has been invited to the meeting to
7 testify should be aware that this public
8 hearing is being recorded. Because the
9 hearing is public, participants and
10 viewers have no reasonable expectation

1 THE CLERK: For our first bill,
2 we have Paula Brumbelow Burns.

3 MS. BRUMBELOW BURNS: Good
4 morning, members of the Rules Committee.
5 I am Paula Brumbelow Burns, Director of
6 Legislation for the Philadelphia City
7 Planning Commission. I am here to
8 testify on Bill No. 210933, which was
9 introduced into City Council on
10 November 18, 2021 by Councilmember
11 Squilla.

12 Bill No. 210933 amends the
13 Philadelphia Zoning Maps by changing the
14 zoning of land within an area bounded by
15 Snyder, Weccacoe Avenues, Wolf and
16 Swanson Streets. This bill will change
17 the zoning of six acres of land located
18 at 16 East Snyder Avenue from I-2,
19 Medium Industrial, to ICMX, Industrial
20 Commercial Mixed-Use, to facilitate the
21 redevelopment of the site, which will
22 feature primarily auto-oriented retail
23 uses. The South District Plan
24 recommended no change to the property
25 which was then an active industrial use.

1 The Commission recognized that
2 surrounding properties were remapped in
3 2013 to ICMX or commercial-auto oriented
4 Zoning districts. The Philadelphia City
5 Planning Commission considered Bill No.
6 210933 at its meeting of December 9,
7 2021, and recommended for approval. I
8 will be happy to answer any questions at
9 this time.

10 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Any
11 questions or comments from members of
12 the Committee?

13 (No response.)

14 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Hearing
15 none, will the Clerk please call the
16 next panel for the next bill.

17 THE CLERK: For Bill No.
18 220112, we have Denis Murphy and Gwen
19 McCauley. They will also be commenting
20 on Bill 220113. So if they're speaking
21 at the same time, that might happen,
22 Mr. Chair.

23 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Sure.
24 Just state your name for the record and
25 please begin.

1 MR. MURPHY: Good morning,
2 Chairman Johnson. My name is Denis
3 Murphy from the Commerce Department.
4 I'm here to testify in support of both
5 bills, Bills 220112 and 220113. These
6 bills will extend the term of the
7 Manayunk Special Services District as a
8 municipal authority and approve their
9 plan for services, including the method
10 of assessing property owners within
11 their boundaries.

12 In 1996, property owners and
13 business people in Manayunk came
14 together to create a Business
15 Improvement District. The MSSD uses
16 assessment funds to provide services
17 such as sidewalk litter removal, capital
18 improvements and beautification. The
19 MSSD works closely with the Manayunk
20 Development Corporation who markets the
21 area and organizes special events. The
22 MSSD and MDC have played a critical role
23 in maintaining and building partnerships
24 with the City and others to help
25 Manayunk adapt and thrive.

1 Most recently, the MSSD was a
2 critical advocate for businesses and
3 property owners navigating the impacts
4 of flooding from Hurricane Ida and the
5 impact of the pandemic. Commerce works
6 closely with the MSSD by assisting
7 businesses within their District and
8 recently provided funding for improved
9 pedestrian lighting and crosswalks along
10 Main Street. This proposed plan
11 continues important activities that are
12 critical to maintain Manayunk's status
13 as a shopping and dining destination for
14 the whole region.

15 BIDs are one of the best
16 examples of collaboration between the
17 City and our commercial areas. This
18 worthwhile effort deserves our support.
19 Thank you for your consideration and
20 I'll be happy to answer any questions
21 you may have.

22 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you.
23 Will the Clerk please call the next
24 witness.

25 THE CLERK: Gwen McCauley.

1 MS. McCAULEY: Yes, I'm right
2 here. Thank you, Denis and the Commerce
3 Department. Good morning,
4 Councilmembers and thank you for your
5 time today. My name is Gwen McCauley
6 and I serve as the Executive Director
7 for Manayunk Development Corporation.
8 I'm here speaking on behalf of the
9 Manayunk Special Services District.

10 MSSD was established in 1997
11 under the Municipal Authorities Act of
12 1945 and reauthorized in 2012 for a
13 10-year period. Today I ask
14 Philadelphia City Council to reauthorize
15 our Business Improvement District for
16 another 10-year period for the period
17 2023 through 2032. From its beginning,
18 the MSSD's mission has been to create a
19 clean, attractive, safe and well-managed
20 business district so that Manayunk can
21 successfully compete in an environment
22 to live, work, shop, dine and visit.

23 Through the establishment and
24 continuation of our BID, Manayunk has
25 flourished for the reputation as a

1 thriving neighborhood for commercial
2 businesses, residents and recreational
3 activities. By partnering with the
4 Manayunk Development Corporation, local
5 property owners, community stakeholders
6 and the City of Philadelphia, the MSSD
7 has initiated a wide range of capital
8 improvement projects to beautify the
9 neighborhood and employ the maintenance
10 crew to oversee the sidewalk cleaning,
11 covering up graffiti and general
12 maintenance of public service areas.

13 As we look ahead at the next 10
14 years, it's imperative that the MSSD is
15 approved by City Council to reauthorize
16 and to continue its crucial work of
17 keeping Manayunk's commercial corridor
18 clean, well-lit, attractive and safe.
19 Our neighborhood has endured a number of
20 hardships resulting from COVID-19
21 pandemic and suffered -- and the
22 unprecedented flooding from Hurricane
23 Ida. Small businesses in our District
24 have suffered a rise in inflation,
25 employee and supply chain shortages and

1 a number have been forced to close their
2 doors and never reopen.

3 By extending the authorization
4 of the Manayunk Special Services
5 District, the MSSD in conjunction with
6 MDC, we will continue to create a clean,
7 vibrant and welcoming community in
8 Manayunk to attract future residents and
9 small businesses. Not included in my
10 above summary but worth mentioning is
11 that we have gone under an extensive
12 process of surveying and informing and
13 notifying stakeholders about this BID
14 renewal and their right to objection.

15 And I think that it is
16 important to mention that although we
17 have received some great suggestions
18 from the stakeholders, we know of no
19 objection from the stakeholders for the
20 BID renewal. So I thank you for your
21 time and consideration, and I'm open to
22 answer any questions you may have about
23 the operations of our Business
24 Improvement District. Thanks.

3 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
4 Mr. Chair.

5 I've often said that if South
6 Street and Chestnut Hill had a baby, it
7 would be Manayunk and Main Street. What
8 they don't have however is the water and
9 the consistent support of the business
10 associations respectfully. During that
11 pandemic, we walked up and down that
12 corridor and businesses fought through
13 that pandemic creating a template on
14 what outdoor eateries should be. That
15 was used by L&I to set the bar for other
16 commercial corridors throughout the City
17 of Philadelphia.

18 Throughout the uprising that
19 happened post-George Floyd, it was the
20 development corporation that worked with
21 law enforcement that prepared and spared
22 Main Street from some of the looting
23 that went on in other places. I just
24 want to say that these kinds of
25 associations and partnerships created in

1 partnership creates a small town in a
2 big city environment.

3 All you have to do is come to
4 the tree lighting and hear Senator
5 Vincent Hughes sing carols and you get a
6 warm fuzzy feeling. So I want to thank
7 the businesses there and state Mad River
8 had to close. They couldn't stand
9 another biblical level tragedy. But
10 through the corporation and
11 partnerships, we were able to keep the
12 vast majority of businesses not only
13 open but thriving.

14 So I just want to go on the
15 record, Mr. Chairman, and thanking them.
16 If I had 10 more of those business
17 associations throughout the City, we
18 would be in a lot better space by way of
19 our vacancies on commercial corridors.
20 Thank you.

8 MS. BRUMBELOW BURNS: Hello.
9 I'm Paula Brumbelow Burns, Director of
10 Legislation for the Philadelphia City
11 Planning Commission. I am here to
12 testify on Bill No. 220224, which was
13 introduced into City Council on March
14 19, 2022 by Councilmember Gauthier.

15 Bill No. 220224 amends the
16 Master Plan for Drexel University for
17 improvements to the existing Kelly Hall
18 that is located at 203 North 34th
19 Street. This bill allows for the plan
20 to be amended by adding in 3,990 square
21 feet of floor area within the Master
22 Plan area.

23 The Drexel University Master
24 Plan will remain in compliance with the
25 zoning code. The building addition will

1 create space for a new entrance, mail
2 lounge and study facilities to the
3 resident hall that was opened in 1967.
4 The Philadelphia City Planning
5 Commission considered Bill No. 220224 at
6 its meeting of March 17, 2022 and
7 recommended for approval. I will be
8 happy to answer any questions at this
9 time.

10 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you.
11 Any questions or comments from members
12 of the Committee?

14 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Hearing

19 MS. BRUMBELOW BURNS: I am
20 Paula Brumbelow Burns, Director of
21 Legislation for the City of
22 Philadelphia. I am here to testify on
23 Bill No. 220298, which was introduced
24 into City Council on March 31, 2022 by
25 Councilmember O'Neill.

1 Bill No. 220298 amends the
2 Master Plan for the Thomas Jefferson
3 Hospital, Torresdale campus located at
4 10800 Knights Road in Northeast
5 Philadelphia. The amendment will allow
6 for the construction of a two-story
7 approximately 42,645 square foot
8 building near the corner of Red Lion and
9 Knights Road for uses of a new Proton
10 Therapy Center. Proton therapy is a new
11 cancer treatment using advanced
12 radiation technology that drastically
13 reduces radiation doses to normal
14 tissues. There are only about 50 proton
15 therapy centers of this kind in the
16 country, and this site was chosen over
17 seven other locations.

18 The center will treat about 680
19 patients a year and because this is an
20 existing hospital facility, there is
21 ample existing parking for patients and
22 staff. The project is expected to have
23 a 30-month construction timeline and
24 efforts will be taken to reduce any
25 impacts on the local neighbors.

1 The Master Plan itself complies
2 with all regulations set forth in the
3 zoning code. The Philadelphia Planning
4 Commission considered Bill No. 220298 at
5 its meeting of April 21, 2022 and
6 recommended approval. I will be happy
7 to answer any questions at this time.
