2 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
3 morning, everybody. Today is
4 Wednesday, December 7, 2022. And we
5 are now ready to begin our Committee
6 on Streets and Services. I want to
7 start by apologizing to everybody.
8 I'm having a little camera issue, but
9 I'm going try to clear that up and
10 come on camera shortly.

11 Good morning. I understand
12 that state law currently requires that
13 the following announcement will be
14 made at the beginning of every remote
15 public hearing as follows:

16 Due to the current public
17 health emergency, City Council
18 Committees are currently meeting
19 remotely. We are using Microsoft
20 Teams to make these remote hearings
21 possible. Instructions for how the
22 public may view and offer public
23 testimony at public hearings of
24 Council Committees are included in the
25 public hearing notices that are

1 published in the Daily News, Inquirer
2 and Legal Intelligencer prior to the
3 hearings. It could also be found on
4 PHLCouncil.com. I now note that the
5 hour has come.

6 Mr. Maynard, will you please
7 call the roll to take attendance.

8 Members that are in attendance, will
9 you please indicate that you're
10 present when your name is called.

11 Also, please say a few brief words
12 when responding so that your image
13 will be displayed on the screen when
14 you speak.

15 Mr. Maynard.

16 THE CLERK: Vice-Chair
17 Squilla.

18 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Good
19 morning, Mr. Chair and colleagues.
20 Present.

21 THE CLERK: Good morning.
22 Councilmember Bass.

23 (No response.)

24 THE CLERK: Councilmember
25 Bass.

1 (No response.)

2 THE CLERK: Councilmember Oh.

3 COUNCILMAN OH: Good morning,
4 Chair. Good morning, colleagues. I'm
5 present.

6 THE CLERK: Councilmember
7 Johnson.

8 (No response.)

9 THE CLERK: Councilmember
10 Gilmore Richardson.

11 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE
12 RICHARDSON: Good morning, Mr. Chair.
13 Good morning, colleagues. I am
14 present.

15 THE CLERK: And, Chair
16 Thomas.

17 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Present.
18 Okay. There we go. We --

19 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: We have
20 Councilmember Jones. I mean, I don't
21 know if he's --

22 COUNCILMAN JONES: I'm here,
23 Mr. Chairman. I'm present.

24 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank
25 you, Councilmember Jones. And thank

1 you, colleagues. A quorum of the
2 Committee is now present and the
3 hearing is called to order. This is a
4 public hearing of the Committee of
5 Streets and Services regarding Bill
6 Nos. 220118, 220639, 220775, 220832,
7 220844, 220870, 220871, 220904, 220920
8 and 220922.

9 Mr. Maynard, will you please
10 read the titles of the bills.

11 THE CLERK: Yes, Mr. Chair.
12 We have Bill 220118, an ordinance
13 authorizing an encroachment upon East
14 Passyunk Avenue and Moore Street in
15 the vicinity of 1801 East Passyunk
16 Avenue, Philadelphia, PA 19148, under
17 certain terms and conditions.

18 Bill 220639, an ordinance
19 authorizing authorizing the revisions of
20 lines and grades on a portion of City
21 Plan No. 27S, by striking from the
22 City Plan the easterly 20-feet wide
23 portion of Swanson Street from Wolf
24 Street to Snyder Avenue, striking from
25 the City Plan and vacating the legally

1 open portion of Vandalia Street from
2 Wolf Street to Weccacoe Avenue, and
3 reserving and placing on the City Plan
4 a right-of-way for sewer and drainage
5 purposes within the portion of Swanson
6 Street being stricken and authorizing
7 the acceptance of the grant to the
8 City of the said right-of-way, all
9 under certain terms and conditions,
10 including the dedication to the City
11 of the beds of the remaining unopened
12 portions of Swanson Street from Wolf
13 Street to Jackson Street and from
14 Jackson Street to Snyder Avenue.

15 Bill 220775, an ordinance
16 authorizing the revisions of lines and
17 grades on a portion of City Plan No.
18 291 by striking from the City Plan and
19 vacating the legally open portion of
20 Shelmire Avenue from State Road to the
21 centerline of the Philadelphia and
22 Trenton Railroad, under certain terms
23 and conditions.

24 An ordinance authorizing the
25 installation of allway stop signs at

1 the intersection of Larkspur Street
2 and Gifford Street.

3 COUNCILMAN THOMAS:

4 Mr. Clerk, did you read that Bill No.
5 first?

6 THE CLERK: I did not. Thank
7 you, Mr. Chair. That bill is 220844.

8 Bill 220870, an ordinance
9 establishing a no-truck parking
10 regulation on both sides of Malvern
11 Avenue between 63rd Street and
12 Wynnewood Road.

13 Bill 220871, an ordinance
14 authorizing the installation,
15 ownership and maintenance of various
16 encroachments in the vicinity of 435
17 North Broad Street, Philadelphia, PA
18 19123, under certain terms and
19 conditions.

20 Bill 220904, an ordinance
21 authorizing the installation,
22 ownership, replacement and maintenance
23 of various encroachments in the
24 vicinity of 1700 and 1720 Arch Street,
25 Philadelphia, PA 19103, under certain

1 terms and conditions.

2 Bill 220920, an ordinance
3 authorizing and directing the changing
4 of the name of Langley Avenue, from
5 South 26th Street to South Broad
6 Street, to League Island Boulevard,
7 under certain terms and conditions.

8 And Bill 220922, an ordinance
9 amending Section 12-919 of The
10 Philadelphia Code, entitled "Onstreet
11 Parking of Boats, Motor Homes, Truck
12 Campers, Semi-trailers Truck Tractors,
13 and Vending Carts," to provide
14 prohibitions on semi-trailer and truck
15 tractor parking in the 6th District of
16 Council, all under certain terms and
17 conditions.

18 These are the Bills listed
19 for the community today, Mr. Chairman.
20 Bill Nos. 220832 and 220920 are being
21 held at their respective sponsors'
22 requests and the Committee won't hear
23 testimony on those bills or vote on
24 them today.

25 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank

1 you, Mr. Maynard.

2 And before we begin to move
3 forward with our hearing, I would like
4 to take a moment to acknowledge that
5 Councilmember Bass is present for the
6 record.

7 Before we begin to hear
8 testimony from the witnesses we have
9 today, everyone who's been invited to
10 the public meeting to testify should
11 be aware that the public hearing is
12 being recorded. Because the hearing
13 is public, participants and viewers
14 have no reasonable expectation of
15 privacy. By continuing to be in the
16 meeting, you are consenting to being
17 recorded.

18 Additionally, prior to
19 recognizing Members for questions or
20 comments they have for the witnesses,
21 I would like to note for the record at
22 this time that we will use the chat
23 feature if they're available on
24 Microsoft Teams to allow Members to
25 signal that they would like to be

1 recognized. In order to comply with
2 the Sunshine Act, the chat feature
3 must only be used for that purpose.

4 Mr. Maynard, will you please
5 call the first bill and set of
6 witnesses we have to testify this
7 morning.

8 THE CLERK: Yes, Mr. Chair.

9 The first bill we'll hear is Bill
10 220118. Sarah Chiu from City Planning
11 is our sole witness on this bill.

12 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
13 morning. Please state your name for
14 the record and you may begin with your
15 testimony.

16 MS. CHIU: Thank you. Good
17 morning, Chairmember Thomas and
18 members of the Committee on Streets
19 and Services. I'm Sarah Chiu, City
20 Planner with the Philadelphia City
21 Planning Commission. I'm here to
22 testify on Bill No. 220118, which was
23 introduced by Councilmember Squilla on
24 February 10, 2022.

25 Bill No. 220118 will permit

1 an awning and supportive columns
2 located at the southeast corner of
3 East Passyunk Avenue and Moore Street.
4 The awning covers the entirety of the
5 sidewalk at 1801 East Passyunk Avenue,
6 fronting on Passyunk Avenue and Moore
7 Street and encompasses a streetlight
8 and exhaust fan vents.

9 The City Planning Commission
10 reviewed this bill at its meeting on
11 February 17, 2022 with the following
12 concerns: This encroachment is not
13 consistent with the complete Street
14 policy. It sets a bad precedence for
15 development as it was done hastily
16 with a little time for review. The
17 view of the pedestrian crossing light
18 is partially obstructed by the awning.
19 The sidewalk will be dark at night,
20 and the second floor apartment of the
21 building will not be able to open its
22 window on Moore Street due to the
23 commercial kitchen exhaust hood
24 venting through the awning and
25 underneath their windows.

1 Due to the above-cited
2 issues, the City Planning Commission
3 did not recommend approval for Bill
4 No. 220118. I'll be happy to answer
5 questions at this time. Thank you.

6 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you
7 for your testimony.

8 Are there any questions from
9 members of the Committee for this
10 particular witness around this
11 legislation?

12 (No response.)

13 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
14 none, I want to thank you for your
15 testimony. It's very much
16 appreciated.

17 Mr. Maynard, will you please
18 call the next witnesses and next set
19 of bills.

20 THE CLERK: Yes, Mr. Chair.
21 The next set of bills we'll hear are
22 Bills 220904, 220639 and 220775.
23 Noelle Marconi from Streets and Sarah
24 Chiu from Planning are the only
25 witnesses to testify, and they'll

1 testify on each of the bills.

2 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Good
3 morning. Please state your name for
4 the record and you may begin with your
5 testimony.

6 MS. MARCONI: Good morning,
7 Chairperson Thomas and members of the
8 Streets and Services Committee. My
9 name is Noelle Marconi and I'm the
10 Director of Legislative Affairs for
11 the Department of Streets. I'm here
12 today to offer testimony on Bill No.
13 220904 introduced by Councilmember
14 Thomas on behalf of Council President
15 Clarke.

16 This ordinance authorizes
17 Comcast Corporation and Liberty
18 Property Trust, the owners, to
19 install, own and maintain and replace
20 certain encroachments at 1700-1720
21 Arch Street, the encroachments.
22 Bollards will be installed on the
23 footway along John F. Kennedy
24 Boulevard, North 17th Street and North
25 Arch Street.

1 The Department of Streets has
2 no objections to this bill as a 6-foot
3 passable sidewalk space is to remain
4 after its installation. Thank you for
5 the opportunity to appear before you
6 today. I will be happy to answer any
7 questions you may have.

8 Do you want me to keep going
9 with the rest of the testimony that I
10 have first?

11 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: For this
12 bill, yes.

13 MS. MARCONI: Okay. Good
14 morning, Chairperson Thomas and
15 members of the Streets and Services
16 Committee. My name is Noelle Marconi
17 and I'm the Director of Legislative
18 Affairs for the Department of Streets.
19 I'm here to offer testimony on Bill
20 No. 220639 introduced by Councilmember
21 Squilla.

22 This is not an Administration
23 ordinance, but an ordinance requested
24 by Ronald Harrison of Klehr Harrison
25 Harvey Branzburg LLP representing

1 Newman Development Associates, LLC.

2 The purpose of this proposed ordinance
3 is to authorize the striking from the
4 City Plan of easterly 20-feet wide
5 portion of Swanson Street, from Wolf
6 Street to Snyder Avenue and the
7 striking of Vandalia Street from Wolf
8 Street to Weccacoe Avenue, the
9 portions of Swanson Street and
10 Vandalia Street proposed to be
11 stricken are not currently used by
12 public traffic.

13 A right-of-way for sewer and
14 drainage purposes will be reserved
15 within the portion of Swanson Street
16 being stricken to accommodate the
17 existing intercepting sewer running
18 through Swanson.

19 The changes proposed for
20 Swanson Street have been coordinated
21 with the Streets Department Plan,
22 Swanson Street improvement project, to
23 ensure the City's proposed roadway and
24 streetscape improvements are
25 accommodated. As a further condition

1 of this proposed street striking,
2 certain portions of Swanson Street,
3 which are currently shown is not
4 legally open. Per the Streets
5 Department records will be dedicated
6 to the city as a public right-of-way
7 by the abutting property owner.

8 These actions will facilitate
9 the redevelopment of the adjacent
10 former industrial site into a
11 commercial shopping center. The
12 Department of Streets has no
13 objections to this ordinance and
14 recommends it to the Committee for
15 favorable action. Thank you for the
16 opportunity to appear before you today
17 and will be pleased to answer any
18 questions you may have.

19 Good morning, Chairperson
20 Thomas and members of the Streets and
21 Services Committee. My name is Noelle
22 Marconi and I'm the Director of
23 Legislative Affairs for the Department
24 of Streets. I'm here today to offer
25 testimony on Bill No. 220775

1 introduced by Councilmember Driscoll.

2 This is not an Administration
3 ordinance, but an ordinance requested
4 by Ian Smith of Ian Smith Design Group
5 on behalf of Gearing Associates, LLC.

6 The purpose of this proposed ordinance
7 is to authorize the striking from the
8 City Plan and vacating of the legally
9 open portion of Shelmire Avenue from
10 State Road to the centerline of the
11 Philadelphia and Trenton Railroad
12 Amtrak's Northeast Corridor right-of-
13 way.

14 This section of Shelmire
15 Avenue is not paved as a City street
16 and is not in use by public traffic.
17 This action has been requested by the
18 abutting property owner in order to
19 remove this unimproved paper street as
20 an encumbrance on the underlying
21 properties and allow the previously
22 dedicated portion of Shelmire Avenue
23 to revert to private ownership.

24 Department of Streets has no
25 objections to this ordinance and

1 recommends it to the Committee for
2 favorable action. I'd be happy to
3 answer any questions that you may
4 have.

5 MS. CHIU: Good morning,
6 Chairmember Thomas and members of the
7 Committee on Streets and Services.
8 I'm Sarah Chiu, City Planner with the
9 Philadelphia City Planning Commission.
10 I'm here to testify on Bill No.
11 220904, which was introduced by
12 Councilmember Thomas for Council
13 President Clarke on November 3, 2022.

14 Bill No. 220904 will allow
15 for additional security bollards to be
16 constructed on 17th Street and JFK
17 Boulevard as well as to replace all of
18 the existing bollards on 17th Street,
19 Arch Street and JFK Boulevard. All of
20 the bollards will be located within
21 the furnishing zone of these streets
22 except at the intersection of 17th and
23 JFK Boulevard. All of the bollards
24 will be 5 feet apart and will be
25 matching the bollards constructed on

1 the 1800 block of Arch Street.

2 The purpose to construct
3 updated security bollards is to
4 prevent unauthorized motor vehicles
5 intrusion into the unprotected
6 pedestrian plaza and the sidewalks
7 around the Comcast Center buildings.

8 The Planning Commission had
9 previously approved Bill No. 070237,
10 which was to allow for the
11 construction of the current security
12 bollards and planters in the right-of-
13 way. The current bill is consistent
14 with the previous approval. The
15 City's Art Commission has also
16 approved this encroachment and the
17 design of the bollards. Therefore,
18 the Planning Commission at its meeting
19 on November 17, 2022 recommended Bill
20 No. 220904 for approval as item in
21 accord with the previous policy. I'll
22 be happy to answer any questions at
23 this time.

24 Good morning, Chairmember
25 Thomas and members of the Committee on

1 Streets and Services. I'm Sarah Chiu,
2 City Planner with the Philadelphia
3 City Planning Commission. I'm here to
4 testify on Bill No. 220639, which was
5 introduced by Councilmember Squilla on
6 June 23, 2022.

7 Bill No. 220639 will make
8 changes to City Plan by striking the
9 easterly 20-foot portion of Swanson
10 Street, from Wolf to Snyder Avenue and
11 reserving this area as drainage right-
12 of-way. The width of Swanson
13 Avenue -- Swanson Street will be
14 reduced from 100 feet to 80 feet.

15 Additionally, it will strike
16 from the City Plan and vacate the
17 legally open portion of Vandalia
18 Street, from Wolf Street to Weccacoe
19 Avenue. The purpose of this action is
20 to facilitate the redevelopment of the
21 adjacent site formerly occupied by the
22 Inolex Chemical Company into a
23 commercial shopping center.

24 The changes proposed for
25 Swanson Street has been coordinated

1 with the Streets Department Plan,
2 Swanson Street improvement project.
3 The Planning Commission had reviewed
4 and approved rezoning Bill No. 210933
5 in December of 2021 for this site.

6 Therefore, the City Planning
7 Commission at its meeting on July 21,
8 2022 recommended Bill No. 220639 for
9 approval as item in accord with
10 previous policy. I'll be happy to
11 answer any questions for this item.

12 Good morning, Chairmember
13 Thomas and members of the Committee on
14 Streets and Services. I'm Sarah Chiu,
15 City Planner with the Philadelphia
16 City Planning Commission. I'm here to
17 testify on Bill No. 220775, which was
18 introduced by Councilmember Driscoll
19 on September 22, 2022.

20 Bill No. 220775 will
21 authorize striking and vacating the
22 legally portion of Shelmire Avenue
23 from State Road to the centerline of
24 Philadelphia and Trenton Railroad.
25 This portion of Shelmire Avenue is not

1 approved as public street, not open
2 for public traffic.

3 The adjacent owner has
4 requested this action in order to
5 remove it as a legal encumbrance on
6 the underlying property and to clarify
7 the ownership of the affected area.

8 The City Planning Commission at its
9 meeting on October 20, 2022

10 recommended Bill No. 220775 for
11 approval. I'll be happy to answer any
12 questions at this time. Thank you.

13 THE CLERK: Mr. Chairman,
14 that concludes testimony on these
15 three bills.

16 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: I'm here.
17 Thank you for your testimony and very
18 much appreciate it.

19 Does any member of the
20 Committee have any questions for these
21 witnesses for these set of bills?

22 (No response.)

23 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
24 none, I want to thank you for your
25 testimony.

1 Mr. Maynard, will you please
2 read the next set of bills and the
3 next panel of witnesses.

4 THE CLERK: Yes,
5 Mr. Chairman.

6 The next set of bills is
7 Bills 220844, 220870, 220871 and
8 220922. Noelle Marconi from Streets
9 is the only witness to testify on this
10 group of bills.

11 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Please
12 state your name for the record and why
13 don't you just start.

14 MS. MARCONI: Good morning,
15 Chairperson Thomas and members of the
16 Streets and Services Committee. My
17 name is Noelle Marconi and I'm the
18 Director of Legislative Affairs for
19 the Department of Streets. I'm here
20 today to offer testimony on Bill No.
21 220844 introduced by Councilmember
22 Jones.

23 This ordinance establishes a
24 no-truck parking regulation on both
25 sides of Haverford Avenue between

1 North 67th Street and North 68th
2 Street. The Department of Streets has
3 no objections to this bill. The
4 regulation can be posted within 30
5 days of the bill's passage. This
6 concludes my testimony and pleased to
7 answer any questions you may have.

8 Good morning, Chairperson
9 Thomas and members of the Streets and
10 Services Committee. My name is Noelle
11 Marconi and I'm the Director of
12 Legislative Affairs for the Department
13 of Streets. I'm here today to offer
14 testimony on Bill No. 220870
15 introduced by Councilmember Jones.

16 This ordinance establishes a
17 no-truck parking regulation on both
18 sides of Malvern Avenue between 63rd
19 Street and Wynnewood Road. The
20 Department of Streets has no
21 objections to this bill. The
22 regulation can be posted within 30
23 days of the passage of the bill. This
24 concludes my testimony and I'm pleased
25 to answer any questions you may have.

1 Good morning, Chairperson
2 Thomas and members of the Streets and
3 Services Committee. My name is Noelle
4 Marconi and I'm the Director of the
5 Legislative Affairs for the Department
6 of Streets. I'm here today to offer
7 testimony on Bill No. 220871
8 introduced by Councilmember Squilla.

9 This ordinance authorizes 435
10 North Broad Associates, LLC to own and
11 maintain various encroachments at 435
12 North Broad Street. The encroachments
13 allow for proposed planters and a
14 fence along the right of the
15 right-of-way line of Noble Street to
16 the east of North Broad Street.

17 The Department of Streets
18 has no objections to this bill as
19 6-foot passable sidewalk spaces to
20 remain after his installation. Thank
21 you for the opportunity to appear
22 before you today. I would be pleased
23 to answer any questions you may have.

24 Good morning, Chairperson
25 Thomas and members of the Street and

1 Services Committee. My name is Noelle
2 Marconi and I'm the Director of
3 Legislative Affairs for the Department
4 of Streets. I'm here today to offer
5 testimony on Bill No. 220922
6 introduced by Councilmember Driscoll.

7 This ordinance amends Section
8 12-919 of The Philadelphia Code,
9 entitled "Onstreet Parking of Boats,
10 Motor Homes, Truck Campers, Semi-
11 trailers, Truck Tractors and Vending
12 Carts," to provide prohibitions on
13 semi-trailer and truck tractor parking
14 in the 6th Council District.

15 This bill establishes that no
16 person shall park a semi-trailer or
17 truck tractor on any public street in
18 the 6th Council District that has been
19 determined by regulation of the
20 Department of Streets to be a location
21 with respect to which the safe and
22 efficient use of the right-of-way by
23 pedestrian or traffic would be
24 impaired by such parking.

25 The Department of Streets has

1 no objection to this bill. This
2 concludes my testimony and I'm pleased
3 to answer any questions you may have.
4 Thank you for your testimony.

5 Are there any questions from
6 members of this Committee for this
7 witness on this set of bills?

8 (No response.)

9 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
10 none, I want to say thank you for your
11 testimony. It's very much
12 appreciated.

13 Mr. Maynard, will you please
14 read the next panel and the next set
15 of bills.

16 THE CLERK: The only other
17 bills referred to the Committee,
18 Mr. Chair, were Bills 220920 and
19 220832. Both of those bills are being
20 held at their respective sponsors'
21 request, and that concludes the bills
22 to be heard by the Committee today.

23 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank
24 you.

25 Are there any other questions

1 or comments from members of this
2 Committee?

3 (No response.)

4 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: There
5 being no further questions from
6 members of the Committee or anybody
7 else who wants to speak, I will ask
8 that if there is anyone present in
9 this hearing whose name we have failed
10 to call and that wishes to offer
11 testimony of any other bills
12 considered today, please speak up now.

13 (No response.)

14 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Hearing
15 none, I want to thank all the panels
16 and all the witnesses for their
17 participation today. We value your
18 opinions. I now invite all the panels
19 and witnesses to leave, to be
20 disconnected from the hearing before
21 we go into our public meeting. We
22 will now pause the proceedings briefly
23 as multiple participants are leaving.

24 (Brief pause.)

25 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: This

1 concludes the public hearing of the
2 Committee and we will now go into the
3 public meeting to consider the bills
4 being taken today.

5 Mr. Maynard, will you please
6 call the roll to take attendance.
7 Members that are in attendance will
8 please indicate that you're present
9 when your name is called.

10 Mr. Maynard.

11 THE CLERK: Councilmember
12 Jones, did you want to say something?

13 COUNCILMAN JONES: No, just
14 that I'm present.

15 THE CLERK: Okay. I
16 apologize. I thought I saw you raise
17 your hand.

18 Councilmember Squilla.

19 (No response.)

20 THE CLERK: Councilmember
21 Bass.

22 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: I'm
23 sorry. I'm sorry, David. I am
24 present.

25 THE CLERK: No worries,

1 Councilmember.

2 Councilmember Bass.

3 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
4 morning. I'm still present. Thank
5 you.

6 THE CLERK: Thank you,
7 Councilmember.

8 Councilmember Oh.

9 COUNCILMAN OH: Yes, I'm
10 present. Thank you.

11 THE CLERK: Thank you,
12 Councilmember.

13 Councilmember Johnson.

14 (No response.)

15 THE CLERK: And,
16 Councilmember Gilmore Richardson.

17 COUNCILWOMAN GILMORE
18 RICHARDSON: Good morning, Mr. Chair
19 and colleagues. I am present.

20 THE CLERK: Thank you,
21 Councilmember.

22 And finally, Chair Thomas.

23 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Present.
24 Thank you. A quorum of the Committee
25 members are present in a public

1 meeting on Bill Nos. 220118, 220639,
2 220775, 220832, 220844, 220870,
3 220871, 220904, 220920, 220922. We're
4 ready to start.

5 The Chair recognizes
