13 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank you,

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
17 thanks the Councilwoman. Leave will be granted.

18 The Chair recognizes Councilman Rizzo.

19 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: Madam President, I
20 request a leave of absence for Councilman O'Neill
21 and Longstreth.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank you.
23 Leave will be granted.

24 The Chair will dispense with the regular
25 order of business to recognize the guests and

2 visitors joining us in Chambers this morning. On
3 behalf of all Members of City Council, I welcome you
4 to our Council session. We appreciate your taking
5 the time to join us as we attend to the legislative
6 affairs of our City. We certainly invite you to
7 come again.

8 At this time the Chair recognizes
9 Councilmembers Blackwell and DiCicco who will make a
10 presentation honoring Cisco Systems, Inc.

11 Will Mr. James Burke and those
12 accompanying him please join the Councilmembers at
13 the podium?

14 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Thank you.

15 A resolution honoring Cisco Systems,
16 Inc., for investing in our public school children
17 through the development and implementation of the
18 Cisco Networking Academy Program in Philadelphia.

19 Whereas, Cisco adopted E-Learning in the
20 early 1990s and created a program to design
21 practical, cost-effective networks for public
22 schools throughout the country. At seminars, Cisco
23 taught teachers and staff how to use maintain and
24 upgrade their systems; and

25 Whereas, the success of these seminars

2 lead many schools to request a curriculum from Cisco
3 to use as an elective course in their own schools.
4 The result was that Cisco Networking Academy Program
5 that currently operates 5,700 academies in the
6 United States in over 100 other countries; and

7 Whereas, the Network Academy Program is
8 an e-mail learning model that delivers website
9 education content, on-line testing, student
10 performance tracking, and instructor trainer and
11 support. In our highly technological world,
12 students who participate in the program learn how to
13 build and maintain computer networks and design
14 websites and

15 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Whereas, the
16 Philadelphia School District began using the Network
17 Academy Program during the 1997-98 school year. The
18 first Network Academy class started at University
19 City High School, giving a small group of students a
20 novel career-building experience using the Cisco
21 Certified Networking Associate curriculum; and

22 Whereas, today, the School District has
23 increased its enrollment to 1800 in the Cisco's
24 Network Academy Program at over 30 public schools in
25 the City. Students can also earn college credits

2 for Cisco Networking Academy classes toward their
3 studies at the Community College of Philadelphia;
4 and

5 Whereas, Cisco is committed to seeing
6 students begin a successful career as networking
7 professionals. A growing number of Cisco Networking
8 Academy graduates have worked with Smith Barney, the
9 University of Pennsylvania, and the New York
10 Institute of Technology; and

11 Whereas, Network Academy students and
12 instructors have teamed with Cisco engineers to help
13 design networks free of charge, installed donated
14 state-of-the-art data and telecommunications
15 networking technology to some of Philadelphia's
16 community-based organization; and

17 Whereas, Philadelphia's Children
18 Services and Philly Cares are both community-based
19 organizations that lack the infrastructure to
20 properly serve their clients; and

21 Whereas, Cisco engineers have
22 volunteered on many Saturdays to train Network
23 Academy students and their teachers, assisting with
24 the installation of more than \$100,000 of donated
25 equipment to bridge the technology gap at these

2 community-based organizations and to afford them the
3 use of the industry's latest voice and data
4 integration technology and

5 COUNCILMAN DICICCO: Whereas, Cisco
6 Systems has contributed over \$5 million in the form
7 of laboratory equipment, curricula vendor discounts
8 and instructor training to the City for their
9 implementation of the Cisco Network Academy Program
10 that continues to positively impact the lives of our
11 public school children; and

12 Therefore, resolved by the Council of
13 the City of Philadelphia, we hereby honor Cisco
14 Systems, Inc., for investing in our public school
15 children and our community-based organizations
16 through their tireless development of Network
17 Academy programs in our Philadelphia Public Schools.

18 Be it further resolved that an engrossed
19 copy of this resolution be presented to the
20 representatives of Cisco Systems, Inc., for their
21 efforts in improving the education of our public
22 school children.

23 Introduced by myself, Councilwoman
24 Jannie Blackwell, all Members of City Council
25 cosponsored. Congratulations and thank you.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
4 recognizes Mr. Burke for remarks.

5 MR BURKE: Thank you very much. I'd
6 like to first thank the Council for the kind words
7 in the resolution, especially thanks to Councilman
8 DiCicco and Councilwoman Blackwell. If you would be
9 kind enough to indulge me for less than three
10 minutes, I'd have a few comments.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Please do.

12 MR. BURKE: Cisco Systems is the
13 worldwide leader in networking for the Internet.
14 Cisco's Internet protocol IP networking solutions
15 are the foundation of the Internet for most
16 corporate education and government networks around
17 the world. Governments everywhere are using the
18 Internet and Internet technology such as web and web
19 portals to reduce costs, increase efficiencies,
20 integrate agencies and processes, and better serve
21 the public.

22 As a company, Cisco operates on core
23 values of customer focus and corporate citizenship.
24 The company's philanthropic efforts are committed to
25 helping communities prosper, while also encouraging

2 Cisco employees to learn about the needs of the
3 communities where Cisco operates. Also to help
4 bolster education around the world, the company has
5 founded the Cisco Networking Academy's Program in
6 over 140 countries dedicated to teaching students to
7 design, build, and maintain computer networks.

8 The Networking Academy Program is the
9 world's largest E-learning community and uses a
10 combination of web-based, instructor-led learning,
11 as well as hands-on labs to teach students
12 networking and information technology. In
13 Pennsylvania, the program is being implemented at
14 universities, community colleges, technical schools,
15 vocational schools, non-profit organization and
16 comprehensive high schools. Due to the efforts of
17 many instructors, Pennsylvania is now the sixth
18 largest implementation in the United States.

19 Back in 1998 when we launched this
20 program, there were three states in the union that
21 did not have a single academy. Pennsylvania was one
22 of those three states. Here, in year 2003, we're
23 sixth in the country.

24 In addition, the School District of
25 Philadelphia, one of Pennsylvania's regional academy

2 is numbered among the largest urban implementations
3 in the country. Young women comprise more than 35
4 percent of the School District of Philly's program
5 enrolled, which is much higher the national average.
6 And this program has had the ability to bridge
7 issues of age, gender and culture. Currently, the
8 Philly School District boasts the fact of at least
9 14 other teaches have reached CCNA certifications.
10 Nine of these teachers are female, five of whom
11 African American with an average age of 49. Of the
12 five men, one is Nigerian who periodically teaches
13 in Africa on behalf of Cisco Systems where he
14 prepares french-speaking teachers to sit for their
15 CCNA exam.

16 And if I can summarize a comment from
17 one of the teachers, quoting, "Technology levels the
18 playing field. It has no face, no color; it's all
19 about knowledge," says May Darby, a 26-year teaching
20 veteran in Philadelphia School District who recently
21 earned her CCNA. Darby teaches algebra and Geometry
22 at Bock Technical High Scholl where the population
23 is comprised of African American, Cambodian,
24 Caucasian, Chinese, Italian and Latino students.
25 Historically, Bob prepared students for vocational

2 careers in the field such as cosmetology and auto
3 mechanics. But today, that is history. Bob has
4 dropped those traditional vocations and has focused
5 technology, notes Darby. Technology is the future
6 of our children. Not every child will go on to
7 college and Cisco Networking Academy Program is
8 helping prepare kids for good-paying jobs, family
9 living wage jobs right here in Philadelphia.

10 So the bottom line of this program is
11 about jobs. And these young students coming out of
12 high school are able to go work for some of major
13 corporations in and around Philadelphia who are
14 Cisco customers.

15 Again, I would like to thank the
16 Council. And we earnestly look forward to some day
17 in the future doing business with the City of
18 Philadelphia and the School District of
19 Philadelphia. And again, many thanks.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: Thank you.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: At this time,

5 him please join the Councilwoman at the podium?

6 The Chair recognizes Councilwoman
7 Krajewski.

8 COUNCILWOMAN KRAJEWSKI: Thank you,
9 Madam President.

10 A resolution honoring Rich Costello.

11 Whereas, Rich Costello entered this
12 world on April 6, 1951, as the oldest child of
13 Edward and Dorothy Costello. Born in Mayfair, Rich
14 also has a younger brother, Brian; and sister, Amy.
15 He is a lifelong resident of the great Northeast and
16 a devout Irish Catholic; and

17 Whereas, Rich took advantage of the
18 educational opportunities afforded him by his
19 parents, graduating from Holy Ghost Prep in 1969.
20 He then attended St. Joseph's University, receiving
21 his bachelor degree in political science.

22 COUNCILMAN MARIANO: Whereas, upon his
23 graduation, Rich embarked on a lengthy law
24 enforcement career, joining the Police Department
25 and graduating from the police academy in 1973; and

2 Whereas, in a heinous act of violence,
3 Rich was shot in the face by an unknown assailant
4 while still a rookie stationed in North
5 Philadelphia. He endured months of intensive
6 physical therapy to make a remarkable recovery; and

7 COUNCILMAN GOODE: Whereas, soon after
8 healing, Rich met and eventually married Mary Ellen
9 Burn. Determined to start their own police force,
10 they had five children together, Mike, Mary, Kate,
11 Jack, Jimmy, and Elizabeth; and

12 Whereas, seeking more fulfillment in his
13 law enforcement career, Rich joined the Fraternal
14 Order of Police Lodge 5, in the late 1970s. In
15 addition to his FOP duties, Rich gradually rose
16 through the ranks of the Police Department from
17 officer to detective, becoming lieutenant in 1985
18 and finally earning the rank of captain in 1989; and

19 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: Whereas, Rich was
20 first elected president of the FOP in 1988, a
21 five-term president, Rich held the position until
22 his retirement in October of 2002. Rich has been
23 honored as the person of the year by numerous
24 groups, including the Emerald Society, American
25 Legion Post 937, Shaman Society for his outstanding

2 service to the Citizens of Philadelphia. Now
3 therefore

4 COUNCILWOMAN KRAJEWSKI: Resolved by the
5 Council of the City of Philadelphia that we hereby
6 honor and commend Rich Costello for his hard work,
7 dedication, and distinguished service to the
8 Philadelphia Police Department and the Fraternal
9 Order of the Police.

10 Resolved further that an engrossed copy
11 of this resolution be presented to Rich Costello,
12 further evidencing the grateful appreciation and
13 deep admiration of this legislative body. We wish
14 him tremendous success in all of his future
15 endeavors.

16 Signed by the President of City Council,

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT VERNA: The Chair
21 recognizes Mr. Costello for remarks.

22 MR. COSTELLO: Thank you, Madam
23 President. It's an honor to be here once again. As
24 I look back over many years, I've very often
25 appeared before this body, usually in more

2 controversial circumstances. We've been here on
3 behalf of manpower, on behalf of medical benefits,
4 on behalf of discipline, on behalf of radios and a
5 score of other issues that affect law enforcement
6 officers. And while we didn't always leave with
7 what we came for, we were always granted a hearing,
8 which goes right to the core of this form of
9 democratic government. And for that, I am very
10 deeply grateful to the Members of Council.

11 I've often thought of FOP as sort of the
12 front line of law enforcement. And by that I mean,
13 in football terms, I view our members, the police
14 officers and the deputy sheriffs who are out there
15 doing the job as the back field. It's their job to
16 score the points for the citizens in the field of
17 law enforcement and public safety. It's our job as
18 the front line to protect them while they score
19 those points. And as the football players playing
20 for the Eagles know, the front line's job is to
21 knock down all the big ugly monsters that try and
22 tackle your guys. So that's what we've tried to do
23 at the FOP. It doesn't always make us well liked.
24 It sometimes makes us controversial. But our goal
25 is to ensure that our members are protected while

2 they're out there protecting the citizens of
3 Philadelphia.

4 I promised when I got into it that I
5 would never leave the FOP abandoned, I would never
6 jump ship; and I haven't. As with football, the
7 FOP, too, is a team sport. And it was my privilege
8 to be able to over the reins of the FOP to a team
9 and an Administration that will do every bit what I
10 did and probably far surpass it. And they're here
11 with me today, and I'd like to congratulate them.

12 (Applause.)

13 MR. COSTELLO: Just to mention them,
14 hiding in the back is our new president, Bobby Edis;
15 and two of our vice presidents, Ken Rocks and Jimmy
16 Wheeler. And we have other members in the back that
17 decided to stay in the background, as we all try to
18 do.

19 But I'd like to thank this body. I'd
20 like to offer my continued support. While I've
21 stepped down as president, I have not retired from
22 the Police Department, so I'm not going anywhere;
23 I'll be around if you need me and if I can help you
24 the way you've helped me. Thank you very much.

8 in business administration and began a career path

14 of their clients; and

15 Whereas, Brother Wyatt has lived the law
16 of the Lord in word and in deed, has obeyed the
17 precepts and percepts of masonry, he's a long-time
18 member of the Prince Hall Masons where he has served

19 Members of Council, this is indeed a historic moment
20 for me, and I'd like to take the opportunity to
21 thank all of you for recognizing not only me, but
22 also the deeds of the Prince Hall Masons of
23 Pennsylvania.

24 It was in the year 1797 when Rev. Prince
25 Hall journeyed here to Philadelphia and established

14 proud of this honor. I thank you so much.

16 some of my fraternity brothers who braved the cold,
17 who braved the snow to be out with me this morning.
18 And also, as you know, behind every great man
19 there's also a strong woman, and I'd recognize my
20 Wife May D. Wyatt. Thank you so much.

4 because I believe Bill No. 020579 represents the
5 soundest of the three proposed approaches. I am
6 today signing that bill. Because Bill No. 020577
7 would not be effective without additional
8 legislation from the General Assembly, I can allow
9 that bill to go into law and request that it be
10 considered by the Tax Commission, recently approved
11 by City voters. If appropriate, at a later date,
12 the City can support State legislation that would
13 make it effective. I must disprove Bill No.
14 020537A, however, as it is consistent with the
15 foregoing legislation and is ill-advised.
