6 The Chair recognizes Councilwoman
7 Verna.

8 COUNCILWOMAN VERNA: Thank you, Mr.
9 President. On behalf of the Majority, there are
10 no requests for leaves of absence.

11 PRESIDENT STREET: The Chair thanks
12 Councilwoman Verna. The Chair recognizes
13 Councilman Rizzo.

14 COUNCILMAN RIZZO: There are no
15 requests for leaves of absences on behalf of the
16 Minority, Mr. President.

17 PRESIDENT STREET: The Chair thanks
18 Councilman.

20 PRESIDENT STREET: At this time, we
21 will dispense with our regular order of business
22 to recognize visitors.

23 To all of our visitors and guests with
24 us this morning, we welcome you here today and
25 applaud your interest in the civic affairs of our

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2 City, and we invite you to come again.

3 Our first presentation -- is there any
4 Member of Council who wishes to invite -- to
5 recognize a visiting guest?

6 The Chair recognizes Councilman Cohen.

7 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Mr. President --

8 PRESIDENT STREET: Councilman Cohen, I
9 need to you use the microphone.

10 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Mr. President, there
11 are two people here in connection with the
12 resolution, and I'm requesting -- do you want them
13 introduced now? I'm going to be asking to speak
14 on the resolution.

15 PRESIDENT STREET: Uh --

16 COUNCILMAN COHEN: We can do it either
17 way.

18 PRESIDENT STREET: Well, Councilman
19 Cohen, what I'd like you to do is introduce the
20 group now. And then at the appropriate, speak to
21 the substance of the resolution.

22 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Very good. Would
23 the group of former Rohm and Haas employees, stand
24 up, the group from the Service Employees
25 International Union.

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2 (Applause.)

3 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Thank you.

4 PRESIDENT STREET: Our first
5 presentation today honors the Benjamin Franklin
6 Boys Basketball Team. To make this presentation,
7 the Chair appoints Councilwoman Clark. The Chair
8 invites Coach Ken Hamilton and those with him. I
9 think the principal's with them. The Chair
10 invites them all to come up and receive this
11 resolution.

12 (Benjamin Franklin group come forward.)

13 PRESIDENT STREET: If we can get a
14 member of the Sixers organization on the phone to
15 come here.

16 (Laughter.)

17 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: Mr. President, I
18 am so pleased to have the honor to read this
19 resolution in the presence of the principal of the
20 Benjamin Franklin, Dr. Tillman L. Moore.

21 This resolution honoring the Ben
22 Franklin High School Boys Basketball Team.

23 Whereas, on Sunday, March 1, 1998, the
24 Benjamin Franklin High School Boys Basketball Team
25 defeated Franklin Learning Center by a score 61 to

2 56, regaining the Public League Championship for
3 the first time since 1984; and

4 Whereas, the Electrons, with a terrific
5 17-win season behind them trailed by as much as 14
6 points in this final battle and fought back in a
7 courageous, generous, and very physical second
8 half to a late fourth-quarter win, which left
9 families and fans hoarse from cheering and yelling
10 encouragement in the excitement of the final
11 victory; and

12 Whereas Mr. Ken Hamilton is now in his
13 26th year as coach, he savored the victory as much
14 as the players, celebrated his third Public League
15 Title and compared the win to a military victory,
16 reflecting the enthusiasm of his long experience;
17 and

18 Whereas, from the travails of last
19 season to the trials of this season, a great
20 victory emerged, leaving the team energized, the
21 coach encouraged, and the Benjamin Franklin High
22 School family cheering with pride.

23 Now, therefore, resolved by the Council
24 of the City of Philadelphia that we hereby commend
25 and honor Benjamin Franklin High School Basketball

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2 Coach Ken Hamilton and every member of the 1997-98
3 team. They've brought pride to their families and
4 distinction to their school. And we commend them
5 for the dedication, discipline, and effort that
6 made this championship possible.

7 Resolve that engrossed copies of this
8 resolution be presented to the Benjamin Franklin
9 Boys' High School Basketball Team as evidence of
10 the admiration and congratulation of this
11 legislative body.

12 This serves a true and correct copy of
13 original resolution adopted by the Council of the
14 City of Philadelphia, on the 5th day of March,
15 1998, signed by John F. Street, President,
16 introduced by Augusta Clark, and concurred in by
17 every Member of Council.

18 (Applause.)

19 PRESIDENT STREET: At this time, the
20 Chair recognizes Coach Hamilton for remarks after
21 which Councilwoman Clark will introduce the
22 principal for remarks.

23 COACH HAMILTON: First I'd like to
24 applaud Council for recognizing some positive
25 achievements of today's young people.

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2 (Applause.)

3 COACH HAMILTON: Because too often, as
4 we know today, it's the negative things that a few
5 of the young people do that seem to get most of
6 the publicity, so I would like to applaud you.

7 And I would like to introduce first my
8 boss -- and believe me, you don't win things like
9 this unless you have the complete cooperation of
10 your administration, and we're very fortunate at
11 Benjamin Franklin to have that, Dr. Moore.

12 The gentleman behind me who, of course,
13 did this tremendous achievement, Terrence Freeman.

14 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: Hold your hand up.

15 COACH HAMILTON: Who's a senior an
16 Benjamin Franklin.

17 (Applause.)

18 COACH HAMILTON: Kevin Isely, who is a
19 senior at Benjamin Franklin.

20 (Applause.)

21 COACH HAMILTON: One of my assistant
22 coaches, and he is very involved with these young
23 men, both in school, out of school. Sometimes if
24 you want to look for them, they're over his house,
25 Mr. Eddie Hurt.

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2 (Applause.)

3 COACH HAMILTON: Another senior,
4 Braheem Miller.

5 (Applause.)

6 COACH HAMILTON: This next young man is
7 a sophomore so, hopefully, we can come back a
8 couple more times with him. This is Hanee Stiles.

9 (Applause.)

10 COACH HAMILTON: Another senior,
11 Gregory Bowens.

12 (Applause.)

13 COACH HAMILTON: This next young man,
14 if you saw the game, he's the young man who was
15 going down the court at the end when we knew we
16 won, and he was jumping up and down while the
17 game's still going on, Gary Palmer.

18 (Applause.)

19 COACH HAMILTON: A junior, who is very
20 highly recruited and can just about go to any
21 university that he wants to go to, Calvin Johnson.

22 (Applause.)

23 COACH HAMILTON: And the next young man
24 was voted Public League Player of the year along
25 with quite a few other honors. His name is Alex

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2 Wesby.

3 (Applause.)

4 COACH HAMILTON: And we would also like
5 to present Councilperson Clark with one of our
6 Benjamin Franklin hats.

7 (Applause.)

8 COACH HAMILTON: And an invitation to
9 our reception next Wednesday.

10 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: Thank you.

11 COACH HAMILTON: Dr. Moore.

12 (Applause.)

13 DR. MOORE: It's certainly an honor and
14 privilege to be here and to address this
15 legislative body, City Council.

16 It's my lifelong dream, something I've
17 always wanted to do, something I can tell my
18 grandchildren that I stood in front of the City
19 Council and addressed you.

20 And do I thank you for this opportunity
21 and thank you for applauding these young men who
22 did one fantastic job in winning the Public League
23 Championship over insurmountable odds. These
24 young men are good students and good athletes and
25 represent Benjamin Franklin High School and the

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2 School District of Philadelphia very well.

3 And I do thank you.

4 PRESIDENT STREET: Council will stand
5 at ease.

6 - - -

7 PRESIDENT STREET: The Chair recognizes
8 Councilman Nutter at this time.

9 COUNCILMAN NUTTER: Thank you, Mr.
10 President.

11 Mr. President, there are -- there is
12 another group of people who are here. I wasn't
13 sure how they might be introduced, and I don't
14 know all of the groups, but I do know one
15 individual, Mr. C.B. Kimmons.

16 There are a number of anti-drug groups
17 who are here, and I just thought that they should
18 be recognized as the other groups have been
19 recognized, Mr. President.

20 PRESIDENT STREET: Thank you very
21 much. Can we have -- C.B., can we have all of the
22 groups stand, members of the group please stand.

24 PRESIDENT STREET: Thank you very much
25 for being with us.

5 The Chair recognizes the
6 Sergeant-At-Arms for the purposes of delivering
7 the messages from the Mayor to the Chief Clerk.
8 The Chief Clerk will read the messages from the

10 CHIEF CLERK HAUSER: March 24th, to the
11 President and Members of the Council of the City
12 of Philadelphia, I am pleased to advise you that I
13 have today signed Bill No. 970785.

14 And March 20th, Bill No. 970694, which
15 was passed by Council on February 26th.

16 On March 20th, Bill No. 970715, 716,
17 720, 786, 787, 788, 789, 790, 791 and 792, which
18 were passed by Council on February 26.

19 March 20th, I am pleased to advise you
20 that I have signed Bill No. 970820.

21 And to the President and Members of the
22 Council of City of Philadelphia, I am transmitting
23 herewith for the consideration of your honorable
24 body a proposed resolution entitled, Resolution
25 authorizing the Director of Commerce, on behalf of

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2 the City of Philadelphia to file an application,
3 and if the application is accepted, to execute an
4 agreement to obtain a grant from the Department of
5 Community and Economic Development and the
6 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania under act of April
7 12, 1956, P.L. 1449, Section 4, as amended.

8 And an ordinance amending an ordinance
9 approved May 9, 1997, Bill No. 970168, which
10 authorizes the City to sell certain delinquent
11 real estate tax claims identified on Exhibit A to
12 the ordinance to the Philadelphia Authority for
13 Industrial Development ("PAID") by adding to
14 Exhibit A a certain 1997 delinquent real estate
15 tax claim which affects the same properties
16 affected by the tax claim sold to PAID for the
17 sole purpose of allowing the additional claims to
18 be available for substitution for sole claims
19 pursuant to the terms of the June 30, 1997 tax
20 claim purchase and sale agreement between the City
21 and PAID.

22 And an ordinance amending an ordinance
23 approved May 9, 1997, Bill No. 970168, which
24 authorizes the City to sell certain delinquent
25 real estate tax claims identified on Exhibit A to

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2 the ordinance to the Philadelphia Authority for
3 Industrial Development ("PAID") by adding to
4 Exhibit A certain tax claims which were the
5 subject of now-defaulted payment agreements
6 entered into by taxpayers in May and June 1997 for
7 the sole purpose of allowing the additional claims
8 to be available for substitution for sole claims
9 pursuant to the terms of the June 30, 1997 tax
10 claims purchase and sale agreement between the
11 City and PAID.

12 PRESIDENT STREET: The messages will be

14 The Chief Clerk will read any other

16 CHIEF CLERK HAUSER: I have none, Mr.
17 President.

19 PRESIDENT STREET: The next order of
20 business is the introduction of bills and
21 resolutions.

22 The Chair recognizes Councilwoman
23 Augusta Clark.

24 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: Mr. President,
25 today I have one bill and one resolution.

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2 PRESIDENT STREET: The Clerk will
3 please read the title of the bill.

4 CHIEF CLERK HAUSER: An ordinance
5 authorizing the revision of lines and grades on a
6 portion of City Plan No. 119 by striking from the
7 City Plan and vacating a portion of Harper Street
8 from 10th Street to 12th Street and reserving for
9 drainage and water main purposes the stricken
10 portion of Harper Street from 10th Street to a
11 point of possibly 250 feet westwardly, and by
12 relocating certain curved lines on Harper Street
13 from 10th Street to the 12th Street, all under
14 certain terms and conditions.

15 PRESIDENT STREET: The clerk will
16 please read the title of the resolution introduced
17 by Councilwoman Clark.

18 CHIEF CLERK HAUSER: A resolution
19 honoring and commending Stephanie Commish and
20 Kebawn Fitz.

21 PRESIDENT STREET: The Chair recognizes
22 Councilwoman Clark.

23 COUNCILWOMAN CLARK: I move the
24 adoption of the resolution.

25 (Duly seconded.)

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2 PRESIDENT STREET: All those in favor,
3 let it be known by saying aye.

4 All those opposed, say nay.

5 The ayes have it. The
6 resolution is adopted.

7 The Chair recognizes Blackwell.

8 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Mr. President,
9 I have one resolution.

10 PRESIDENT STREET: The Clerk will
11 please read the title of the resolution. CHIEF.

12 CLERK HAUSER: A resolution authorizing
13 Commissioner of Public Property to execute and
14 deliver to the Redevelopment Authority of the City
15 of Philadelphia deeds for property situated in the
16 3rd, 6th, 51st wards of the City of Philadelphia.

17 PRESIDENT STREET: The Chair recognizes
18 Blackwell.

19 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Mr. President,
20 I move the adoption.

21 (Duly seconded.)

22 PRESIDENT STREET: All those in favor,
23 let it be known by saying aye.

24 All those opposed, say nay.

25 The ayes have it. The

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2 resolution is adopted.

3 The Chair recognizes Councilman Cohen.

4 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Mr. President, I
5 offer two resolutions.

6 PRESIDENT STREET: The Clerk will
7 please read the title of the first resolution.

8 CHIEF CLERK HAUSER: A resolution
9 supporting the Service Employees International
10 Union (SEIU) Local 36 in their efforts to win back
11 the jobs of 32 Philadelphia residents terminated
12 by Rohm and Haas.

13 PRESIDENT STREET: The Chair recognizes
14 Councilman Cohen.

15 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Mr. President, this
16 Council works very hard.

17 PRESIDENT STREET: Councilman Cohen, I
18 need you to move the adoption of the resolution.

19 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Oh, I move the
20 adoption of the resolution.

21 PRESIDENT STREET: Is there a second?
22 (Duly seconded.)

23 PRESIDENT STREET: It's been properly
24 moved and seconded.

25 The Chair recognizes Councilman Cohen.

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2 COUNCILMAN COHEN: Mr. President, this
3 body of Council Members works very hard in many
4 different ways to attempt to improve the
5 employment possibilities of Philadelphians.

6 We often spend and appropriate very
7 large sums of money. And in the process, we call
8 upon all Philadelphians to work together to
9 achieve the best results on behalf of
10 Philadelphians.

11 The resolution before us doesn't
12 involve any money. There were 32 employees, all
13 of whom lived in Philadelphia, who worked as
14 janitors for Rohm and Haas in a plant just outside
15 the City. The workers are overwhelming minority,
16 mostly Latino.

17 Rohm and Haas decided to change the
18 company. These employees worked for Aramark,
19 another Philadelphia company. Rohm and Haas
20 decided to employee a separate nonunion
21 organization so they can cut the wages.

22 As a result, these works, who Rohm and
23 Haas said did very good work -- and while they
24 were working, they got health benefits as well as
25 adequate wages -- suddenly found themselves

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2 unemployed because they were replaced by nonunion,
3 very low paid workers who get no benefits
4 whatever.

5 It seems to me in our endeavors to
6 bring together all Philadelphians and to invite
7 the support and cooperation of the Philadelphia
8 companies, a very easy way for us to achieve a
9 better life for a group of Philadelphian would be
10 to support the efforts of their union, the Social
11 Service -- the Service Employees International
12 Union, whose former president happens to be the
13 national president to the AFL-CIO.

14 It seems to me to just make an awful
15 lot of sense for this Council to support the union
16 in its efforts to have Rohm and Haas accept back
17 these employees whose work characteristics are, in
18 the opinion of the company, fine. It's just that
19 it's cheaper to get nonunion, lower paid workers
20 who will work for no benefits.

21 Therefore, this resolution calls upon
22 Rohm and Haas in a cooperative way to rehire these
23 people. As a result, much of our work will be
24 done, it involves no cost whatever, but
25 Philadelphian benefit.

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2 I therefore urge support.

3 (Applause.)

4 PRESIDENT STREET: Thank you very much,
5 Councilman.

6 The Chair recognizes Councilman
7 Longstreth.

8 COUNCILMAN LONGSTRETH: Mr. Chairman
9 I'd like to just speak to this matter briefly.

10 We've had a terrible time in
11 Philadelphia over the last several decades holding
12 on to jobs. As a matter of fact, this last year
13 where there's been a substantial increase, has
14 been the first real step forward in the right
15 direction in terms of job increases that we've had
16 for quite some time.

17 Two of the most employers in town are
18 Aramark and Rohm and Haas. And it seems to me
19 that -- and I would not regard this as the kind of
20 a message that we'd like to send to the people to
21 determine whether or not those companies stay in
22 the City or whether or not they continue to employ
23 thousands of people here in the City.

24 And I would feel that we're getting
25 into a situation here where we take sides and that

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2 that's not the smartest thing in the world to do.

3 I'm, obviously, quite hopeful that the
4 people who will be displaced will be hired by
5 Aramark or will find other ways of returning to
6 the Rohm and Haas payroll.

7 I do not think, however, that this
8 message is one that we care to give to companies
9 who are employers of thousands of people here in
10 the City of Philadelphia.

11 PRESIDENT STREET: Thank you very much.

12 The Chair recognizes Councilman Ortiz.

13 COUNCILMAN ORTIZ: Thank you, Mr.
14 President.

15 As my colleague, Thacher Longstreth,
16 says, we in Philadelphia have had a very tough
17 time holding on to jobs. And, obviously, we have
18 a very good reputation of people who have had a
19 tough time holding on to jobs.

20 They're here, they're Philadelphians,
21 they're residents of this City. All that they
22 have ever asked is that they get paid a living
23 wage for a job that they do very well, not a
24 substandard wage with no benefit and wages that
25 really put somebody below the poverty level.

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2 We're talking about holding jobs here
3 that pay for the job that the people do with the
4 benefits that they accrue over the years. So if
5 we're going to hold on to the jobs, let's hold on
6 to the jobs that bring dignity and give a living
7 system so that they can sustain families and
8 children and send them to schools, not jobs in
9 which pay they cannot afford to do that.

10 Thank you very much, Mr. President.

11 (Applause.)

12 PRESIDENT STREET: Thank you.

13 PRESIDENT STREET: Is there anyone else

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2 CHIEF CLERK HAUSER: A resolution
3 authorizing the Committee on Law and Government to
4 investigate and conduct hearings examining the
5 inadequacy of the system that funds the appointed
6 legal representation of indigent defendants and
7 dependent children as well as a system of funding
8 recommendations by the Criminal Justice Section of
9 the Philadelphia Bar Association designed to
10 remedy said inadequacy and empowering the
