That leads me to my third point, and, that is, to thank her as Appropriations Chair for her work in securing \$500,000, and I know that was with the leadership of our Council President, and I appreciate your taking the time to speak with me as well and your leadership on this.

I just wanted to shout out the great work that the Managing Director's Office has done, in particular how he helped nine mothers. I did highlight one and posted a photograph actually of a bullet hole in her steel lamppost in front of her house, and I'm proud to say that -- I'm relieved and happy to say,

2 but I'm proud to say that Council stepped
3 up. Council has come up with the funds.

4 This woman and her two children
5 were moved. They are moved to safety.
6 And now thanks to funding, this will go

10 that will assure her and others like her
11 that this city does care about them and
12 their lives.

13 The Managing Director's Office
14 and, of course, I want to thank

18 type of things, but to this body,
19 fantastic work, very quick, very quick
20 turnaround time.

13 draw attention to, former member, is
14 Donna Reed Miller. If you have not seen
15 her commercial -- not commercial but
16 newscast where she opened up to the fact

18 passing the ban the box law, after
19 passing many other laws, she struggles to
20 get her insulin on a monthly basis, that
21 the cost of that medication had risen
22 from 300, I believe, to \$3,000 a month.

23 People in their fourth quarter
24 of life should not be counting pills,
25 cutting back on medication in order to

2 have life-sustaining drugs provided to
3 them.

4 We have to on a national level
5 reconcile the negotiations with Big
6 Pharma to be able to make affordable to
7 particularly our seniors life-sustaining

10 healthcare is unacceptable. Some of my
11 younger members may say, well, that
12 doesn't apply to me. I have decades to
13 go before I reach that fourth quarter of
14 life. Let me assure you, it goes by
15 quicker than you think, and as she is,
16 you will be. As you are, she once was.

2 I also, Mr. President, just
3 want to go back to what Councilmember
4 Curtis Jones opened up with as we looked
5 at these election results locally and
6 nationally.

7 People are tired of fancy
8 rhetoric. They want to connect the work
9 that we do to their daily lives. They
10 want to see it, they want to taste it,
11 they want to touch it, they want to feel
12 it. And when they don't, we get what we
13 just got.

14 I'm not sure how many of you
15 just saw the image that our Commissioner
16 Omar Sabir just posted, but he just gave
17 us the results of turnout here in the
18 City of Philadelphia, and we were at
19 about 18.8 percent, 18.9 percent in the
20 City, and it just affirms for us that we
21 have so much more work to do.

22 Thank you so much,
23 Mr. President, and appreciate you, Maria.

3 Before we call for an

6 President, before you -- I wasn't going
7 to say anything, because I didn't want
8 this to become about me, but I want to
9 thank everyone. Councilwoman Bass talked
10 about our conversation, and some of the
11 things you learn through this process, it
12 will be one in eight women who are
13 touched by this, which means that the men
14 in their lives will also be touched by
15 this and their families, and it's so
16 important.

17 But Councilwoman Bass educated
18 me on the lack of access or equity on the
19 research money, right? So many of us
20 raise money for this and the lack of
21 investment and research to Black and
22 Brown women, and when I get on the other
23 side of this, I want to be the fierce
24 advocate that some of the really brave
25 survivors that I met during, you know,

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October. October was a very difficult month for me. As I stated, I really wanted to wait until the end of this to talk about it. I haven't skipped a beat. If anything, you know, I'm going to be stronger because of this and more focused and more committed and more grateful for the time that I have and how I utilize my time.

But, you know, the work around this, there's a lot to be done, and when I saw that report by Donna Reed Miller, who used to be the one that sat next to me before Kenyatta Johnson, I was outraged. As you said, Council President, that in the richest country in the world, people have to make choices around medication.

And so we still have a lot of work to do, as Jones said. The election proves that our messaging is off. We're not listening to people. People are outraged, and unfortunately they're not getting motivated to vote. They're

getting more apathetic, and we have a lot of work to do. 2022 is important, 2023 is important, and 2024 can really change the trajectory of this country. And we were having this wonderful intersection around racial equity and being able to talk about institutional racism and access in a different way, and the election results didn't show that we were all having the same conversation.

So thank you very much, Council President, to all my colleagues, to all the well-wishers, and kudos to the brave survivors. I hope to join the club soon.

Thank you. Thank you, Councilwoman. And to all that know you, we are not surprised how much of a fighter you are. I mean, you fight the party every four years, right? You fight to the political naysayers every four years, and you win, right? You fight the bad actors in your neighborhood around Norris Square, the

2 park, all the things that folks want you
3 and need you to do.

4 I know that you used to fight
5 your brothers growing up, and I heard
6 that you always came out victorious,
7 right? That's just who you are. Behind
8 the scenes, you even fight me, right, as
9 we discuss the various challenges in
10 Council, and it's all good.

11 So I know you will continue to
12 fight, and I just want to say how much I
13 appreciate you, how much the City of
14 Philadelphia should appreciate you, and
15 how much I love you for having known you
16 way beyond us being colleagues, that we
17 used to walk the halls on the fifth floor
18 of City Hall as staffers.

19 So we're with you. God bless
20 you. You're going to continue to do what
21 we got to do for the City. Thank you,
22 Councilwoman.

23 So with that, I'm going to
24 recognize Councilman Jones for a motion
25 to adjourn.
