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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
3 morning, everyone. I would ask the
4 members to take their seats and please
5 ask the guests and visitors to retire
6 behind the rail.

7 This morning to give our
8 invocation, the Chair recognizes the
9 Reverend Adan Mairena. Reverend Mairena
10 is the guest of Councilwoman Maria
11 Quinones-Sanchez.

12 I would ask all members and
13 guests to please rise.

14 (Members and guests rise.)

15 REVEREND MAIRENA: Good
16 morning.

17 In Espanol or English?

18 Let us begin in silence.

19 God who governs all of time and
20 space, gathered here is a group of men
21 and women, young and a little seasoned,
22 Latino, African American, Asian, Mango.
23 They come from different socioeconomic
24 backgrounds and who have shaped them with
25 rich life experience and given them

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2 voices and special gifts that has ensured
3 that they be selected to represent our
4 great city.

5 We lift up Mark Squilla,
6 Kenyatta Johnson, Jannie Blackwell,
7 Curtis Jones, Jr., Darrell Clarke, Bobby
8 Henon, Maria Quinones-Sanchez, Cindy
9 Bass, Marian B. Tasco, Brian J. O'Neill,
10 Wilson Goode, Jr., William K. Greenlee,
11 Bill Green, Dennis O'Brien, James Kenney,
12 Blondell Reynolds Brown, David Oh,
13 Michael Decker and Mayor Michael Nutter.

14 We also lift up their staff, who work
15 endless hours and weekends,
16 behind-the-scenes, hands-on work of
17 communicating with and providing services
18 to each of their district's constituents.
19 We implore you, God, to bless each of
20 their offices so that your spirit of
21 diligence and duty of hard work and honor
22 and commitment and compassion be felt.

23 Gracious God, we also pray for
24 the support that each have at their
25 homes, their spouses, life partners,

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2 companions, pets, children, all those who
3 listen and care and love them for who
4 they are and not for what they do.

5 Loving God, at times we fail to
6 recognize the humanity of our elected
7 officials. We see them as characters on
8 billboards and TV and we forget that they
9 are as frail and as insecure as the rest
10 of us. We dismiss that they also have
11 worries and concerns in their personal
12 lives, that they worry about their aging
13 parents, their children, their siblings,
14 family members who need to change their
15 lives. Like the rest of us, God, they
16 have memories from the past that haunt
17 them and, like all of us, there is a
18 heavy burden they carry that they can't
19 seem to let go.

20 We ask for the healing of their
21 minds and hearts and inner self. God, we
22 pray for their physical wellbeing that is
23 there on the go, go, go, they eat right,
24 exercise, and pause to rest and take a
25 breather.

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2 Gracious God, we pray for the
3 most important relationship your servants
4 have. If their relationships are broken,
5 God, we ask that they be mended and
6 restored. If their relationships are
7 weak, we ask that they be strengthened.
8 If they are neglecting people they love,
9 remind them of who is important in their
10 lives, of who is and who has been there
11 in times of difficulty and despair.

12 Gracious God, as these servants
13 work to address issues of public safety,
14 City services, education, the economy, we
15 end this petition by asking you to fill
16 your servants with the courage that is
17 required of them as they work for the
18 common good. When competing factions, be
19 they corporations or non-profit
20 corporations, push for an agenda that
21 widens the gap between the have's and the
22 have not's, that puts profits before
23 people, Lord, give them courage.

24 When Council and committees
25 meet, fill them with the courage to be

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2 humble and cross the aisle in order to
3 reach agreements. As a group, fill them
4 with the courage to prioritize and stick
5 to those priorities even if unpopular.

6 Loving God, the final petition
7 is that they as individuals have the
8 courage to be true to themselves and the
9 voice and the intellect you gave them and
10 never remain silent in the face of what
11 they feel does not seek the welfare of
12 our beloved Philadelphia. May they
13 govern themselves and the City with
14 common sense, compassion, and courage.
15 We commend these servants unto you.

13 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
14 you very much, Mr. President. Today we
15 are happy to welcome Mr. Dwayne A.
16 Drummond. He's our 24th Ward Democratic
17 Executive Committeeman, as well as here
18 with a group from the School District of
19 Philadelphia, Office of Early Childhood
20 Pre-Kindergarten Head Start Policy
21 Council. They work in partnership with
22 the School District and we are very happy
23 to have them here today.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
25 Would you please stand.

4 Welcome. Thank you for your good work.

5 The Chair now recognizes

6 Councilman Henon for the purpose of

7 welcoming some special guests joining us

9 Councilman Henon.

10 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,

11 Mr. President. Mr. President and

12 colleagues, I would like to take a moment

13 recognizing the students joining me here

14 today and joining us from the Maritime

15 Academy Charter School located in my

16 district. They are accompanied today by

17 their Athletic Director, Mr. Andy Clark,

18 for the Maritime Academy.

19 Could they please take a moment

20 to stand so they could be recognized.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

22 Please stand.

23 (Applause.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

25 Thank you so much for coming today.

2 And now the Chair recognizes
3 Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds Brown, who
4 will present a resolution honoring Cheryl
5 McClenney Brooker. Would Ms. Brooker and
6 those accompanying her please join the
7 Councilwoman at the podium.

8 I see we have Councilman
9 Greenlee also joining us. We have
10 Councilwoman Bass and Councilman Squilla
11 also.

12 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: I'd also
13 like to invite up any and everyone
14 connected or affiliated with the
15 Philadelphia Museum of Art, Joe Meade,
16 members of the Board.

17 Mr. President, it's my
18 wonderful pleasure to lead us this
19 morning in celebrating an arts
20 administrative professional whose career
21 spans 40 years of loving and advocating
22 for the arts. Mayor Nutter has said that
23 she has been a cornerstone at the
24 Philadelphia Museum of Art. Gail Harrity
25 said that she has been a major force at

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2 the Philadelphia Museum of Art. I would
3 say that she has been an anchor, an
4 anchor and a steady presence there for
5 the last 25 years. And the good news is
6 that the leadership at the Museum believe
7 in what's called having a bench and there
8 will be a seamless transition in External
9 Affairs with our honoree this morning
10 passing the baton to Joe Meade.

11 So we congratulate you.

12 So I thank my colleagues for
13 joining me in honoring and recognizing
14 Philadelphia's own Cheryl McClenney
15 Brooker on your retirement from the
16 Philadelphia Museum of Art, and for your
17 tireless commitment to the arts, cultural
18 and civic community of our city.

19 Whereas, Cheryl McClenney
20 Brooker hails from Chicago, Illinois
21 where she earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts
22 degree from the School of the Art
23 Institute of Chicago and a Master of
24 Science from the University of
25 Pennsylvania; and

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2 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas,
3 a museum professional and cultural worker
4 who has 40 years of cultural leadership
5 experience in both the public and
6 non-profit sectors, began her career in
7 New York City as first a public school
8 teacher, followed by her roles with the
9 Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum as its
10 Cultural Coordinator and Assistant
11 Director of the Museum's Collaborative
12 Cultural Voucher Program, and thereafter
13 Assistant Commissioner of the New York
14 City Department of Cultural Affairs; and

15 Whereas, from 1978 to 1983
16 Cheryl McClenney Brooker's career
17 ascended in an executive and management
18 capacity as the Director of Humanities
19 Projects in Museums and Historical
20 Organizations at the National Endowment
21 for Humanities, and for the past 28 years
22 as the Director of External Affairs at
23 the Philadelphia Museum of Art; and
24 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Whereas,
25 as the Director of External Affairs of

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2 the Philadelphia Museum of Art, she has
3 facilitated outreach to attract diverse
4 audiences and community and legislative
5 collaborations concerning the Museum's
6 permanent collections and exhibitions
7 including: Rembrandt's Faces of Jesus,
8 Tanner, Independence of India, Degas,
9 African Art, and Arts in Latin America,
10 and Gee's Bend Quilts;

11 Whereas, Cheryl's legacy is
12 implanted through her work on several
13 local and state boards such as: Citizens
14 for Arts of Pennsylvania, African
15 American Museum of Philadelphia,
16 Multicultural Affairs Congress, The
17 Philadelphia Commission of African and
18 Caribbean Immigrant Affairs, and The
19 Jonathan Phillip Ford Foundation, thus
20 making her vision a reality to create a
21 sustainable network of partnerships for
22 community and neighborhood centers
23 throughout Philadelphia to enhance the
24 Museum's presence in the community and
25 the capacity to better serve children,

2 youth and families; and

3 Whereas, Cheryl McClenney

4 Brooker has been the cornerstone of the

5 Citywide Philadelphia World AIDS Day/Day

6 without Arts observance by serving as

7 Co-Founder and Chair from 1990 to 2005;

8 and

9 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas,

10 her honors include: A National

11 Scholastic Art Magazine scholarship to

12 the School of the Art Institute Chicago,

13 Leadership Pennsylvania Certificate,

14 African American Women of Achievement

15 Award from the African American Museum,

16 Individual Achievement Award for Arts

17 Administration and the Share the Heritage

18 Award from the Multicultural Affairs

19 Congress of the Philadelphia Convention

20 and Visitors Bureau; and

21 Whereas, Cheryl McClenney

22 Brooker presently lives and resides in

23 Philadelphia with her husband, Moe

24 Brooker, professional artist and teacher,

25 and is the proud mother to Misha and Musa

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2 Brooker; now, therefore, be it

3 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Be it

4 resolved, by the Council of the City of

5 Philadelphia, that we hereby honor,

6 recognize, commend and congratulate you,

7 Cheryl McClenney Brooker, on the occasion

8 of your retirement for your tireless

9 commitment to the art, cultural and civic

10 community of Philadelphia.

11 Further resolved, that an

12 engrossed copy of this resolution be

13 presented to Cheryl McClenney Brooker as

14 evidence of the sincere sentiments of

15 this legislative body.

16 This resolution was introduced

17 by Blondell Reynolds Brown, co-sponsored

18 by the Councilmembers you see before us,

19 and supported by all the members of the

20 Philadelphia City Council. We

21 congratulate you and wish you continued

22 good health.

3 President Clarke, Councilwoman

4 Reynolds Brown and these other lovely

5 readers and sponsors of this wonderful

7 beautiful resolution. It is hard to

8 believe, very difficult to believe that I

9 have been working at the Philadelphia

10 Museum of Art for 29 years. But for me

11 it has been a wonderful time, a time of

12 openness and encouragement toward

13 diversity in our exhibitions, in our

14 collections, and in the membership of our

15 Board and our staff, as well as with our

16 community engagement.

17 I am proud of our

18 accomplishments, but there's plenty more

19 work to do. So I am especially pleased,

20 and I know that you are, that as

21 Councilwoman Brown said, that the work

22 will be continuing in the able hands of

23 one of your own sons, Joe Meade.

12 support of Resolution 120067 authorizing
13 the Committee on Commerce and Economic
14 Development to hold hearings on the
15 merger of the City's workforce
16 development agencies.

17 Many residents of Philadelphia
18 look to the workforce development
19 agencies for job training and employment
20 services that let them reach
21 self-sufficiency. The decisions of these
22 agencies and of the state agencies to
23 which they report can have a lasting
24 impact on the families that they work to
25 serve.

2 For instance, in November 2011,
3 a decision was made to close three of the
4 City's Employment Advancement Retention
5 Network, or EARN, centers by the end of
6 December of 2011. One thousand four
7 hundred ninety-six individuals using
8 these centers were affected by the
9 closures. As of the end of January 2012,
10 over one-third of those who were
11 transferred to new EARNs had not
12 enrolled. Now, 582 individuals and their
13 families face sanctions that will keep
14 them from important services.

15 As the merger of these agencies
16 take place, it's important to have
17 hearings that bring workforce development
18 success stories to light as well as the
19 difficulties these agencies have faced.
20 This information can help the City, the
21 agencies, and other concerned and
22 interested partners fit best programs to
23 serve families in Philadelphia.

24 Thank you.

10 I'm commenting on Resolution
11 120063, PA Judiciary Committee Bill No.
12 1523, penalties on recalcitrant
13 municipalities, and Resolution 120072,
14 public safety, gun possession.

15 I oppose these resolutions.
16 Mayor Nutter suggests that an illegal gun
17 in one's possession is a violent crime.
18 No one ever bothers to explain what an
19 illegal gun looks like. This is all well
20 in double speak. A crime is only
21 committed when someone's rights were
22 violated with malicious intent.

23 The City is making it hard for
24 anyone to enjoy the right to bear arms,
25 as outlined in the Constitution for the

2 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Article 1,
3 Declaration of Rights. Section 21
4 states, quote, "The right of the citizens
5 to bear arms in defense of themselves in
6 a state shall not be questioned," end
7 quote.

8 Then Mayor Nutter wants to turn
9 these non-violent suspects over to the
10 federal government for harsher sentences.
11 This is outrageous. This is a violation
12 of the Separation of Powers Doctrine
13 outlined -- contained in the federal and
14 state Constitution. One can also look to
15 the Supreme Court cases such as Lopez
16 versus United States 1995.

17 Moreover, this is the same
18 federal government that has been caught
19 running guns in operation fast and
20 furious in attempts to blame the death of
21 border patrol agents on the Second
22 Amendment. Why should we trust the feds
23 to keep us safe? They've passed the
24 National Defense Authorization Act that
25 says the President is free to torture and

2 kill citizens without trial. This is
3 whom we should be afraid of.

4 Finally, it is time that the
5 City trusted we, the good people, to have
6 the tools to protect life and other
7 God-given rights against them, the bad
8 people. It's called a gun.

9 It's time that the City stop
10 trying to disarm victims. For example,
11 the courageous Raina Alfonso, the
12 33-year-old store clerk who wouldn't let
13 drug dealers take over the corners in her
14 neighborhood, she should have been able
15 to save her precious life. Instead, she
16 is dead, another sacrificial lamb to the
17 victim disarmament gangs and drug
18 dealers.

19 The victim always is at the
20 scene of the crime. The police, not so
21 much. If you want less crime, the
22 citizens need more guns. I wish to
23 submit the book, More Guns, Less Crime:
24 Understanding Crime and Gun Control Laws,
25 by John R. Lott. Perhaps this can be put

4 for two years in a row, introduced by
5 Councilwoman Blackwell.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

7 Thank you.

8 The Chair recognizes

5 COUNCILMAN JONES: State-funded
6 programs to the poor, to the elderly, to
7 domestic violence survivors like Kenyatta
8 Johnson is talking about are being
9 dismantled right in front of our eyes,
10 with nearly 25 percent cuts totalling \$56
11 million to human services. You see,
12 those cuts start in Harrisburg, but we
13 feel them here in Philadelphia.

14 (Applause.)

15 COUNCILMAN JONES: With even
16 more cuts to medical assistant, community
17 health centers, prenatal care, burn and
18 trauma centers to the tune of \$35
19 million.

20 We, the City of Philadelphia,
21 attempt to uplift education, to uplift
22 our workforce, with the Governor cutting
23 close to 25 percent of relatives' state
24 universities. He says that he did not
25 cut the school boards, but the truth be

2 told that when you flat-line a budget, it
3 doesn't stop healthcare from increasing,
4 it doesn't stop the fuel costs from
5 increasing, it doesn't stop food from
6 increasing. So a flat-line indeed is a
7 cut.

8 The budget address concerns
9 Philadelphians and others throughout the
10 Commonwealth. But I notice there is good
11 news in the budget address. Prisons
12 aren't being cut, \$1.8 billion budget
13 worth of prisons versus universities.

14 So on behalf of this Council
15 and the City of Philadelphia, I reject
16 your mean-spirited argument as to why you
17 presented this budget, and I do note that
18 the Marcellus Shale extraction tax was
19 indeed passed.

20 Thank you, Mr. President.

21 (Applause.)
