6 MR. DeMARCO: Good morning,
7 everyone.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
9 morning.

10 MR. DeMARCO: I'm here today to
11 speak about my brother, Michael Hinson
12 today.

13 I met Michael Hinson maybe two
14 decades ago and I applied for work at a
15 place called Colours, an organization
16 Michael founded, and at that time,
17 Michael stressed to me the importance of
18 Black excellence. In fact, Michael
19 demanded Black excellence, and he wanted
20 that from all of his employees, and I
21 learned that the hard way working with
22 Michael.

23 But I say that to say this is
24 the way Michael Hinson lived his life.
25 Michael was the former GLBT liaison to

2 John Street, and we had many
3 conversations.

4 I'm really sorry. I'm a little
5 nervous.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It's
7 okay.

8 MR. DeMARCO: So anyway,
9 Michael and I would discuss what it was
10 like being born Black into this country.
11 You're born right away into a lot of
12 inequity. You're born right into
13 systemic racism. You're born into
14 interactions with the criminal justice
15 system. All of those things that we as
16 people of color have to deal with in this
17 country, we're born to it. And Michael
18 and I talked about how that impacted us
19 as people and how that -- not only that,
20 it impacted us as queer people on top of
21 that. We had double burdens to bear.

22 And no matter how heavy the
23 burdens became or what happened, Michael
24 was always there, whether it was for
25 homeless people, whether it was for the

2 GLBT community, whether it was for
3 calling out racism in government and
4 homeless shelters and in HIV and AIDS
5 funding. Michael was one of the first
6 people in Philadelphia that brought
7 attention to these inequities.

8 So I'm here today to bring your
9 attention to this and also to remember
10 Michael for the wonderful and good person
11 he was and all of the -- he was a
12 complement to Philadelphia. He really
13 was a complement to Philly. And we
14 wanted to say too Michael deserves a
15 mural in this city, along with Gloria
16 Casarez. They were both GLBT liaisons,
17 and unfortunately they both died very
18 young after making incredible
19 advancements for Philadelphia.

20 Okay. Thank you. And I'm
21 sorry for all the noise.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17 MR. FAIR: Good morning. I am

18 deeply honored to be here today to

19 support the issuance of a proclamation

20 honoring Michael S. Hinson, Jr. My name

21 is David Fair, and I am here today both

22 as a lifetime friend of Michael's as well

23 as Treasurer of Self-Incorporated where

24 Michael served as Chief Executive

25 Officer.

2 Michael came to Philadelphia in
3 his late teens, and while his dream was
4 to become a professional dancer, he got
5 distracted from that goal because of his
6 fear and anger at the lack of efforts to
7 prevent the spread of HIV disease in
8 African American communities in
9 Philadelphia.

10 He was an early volunteer and
11 later a staff member at Bebash, one of
12 the first agencies organized to combat
13 AIDS in communities of color in the
14 nation. He later co-founded the Colours
15 organization specifically to target young
16 gay men and transgendered people of color
17 with the HIV prevention message. He
18 later went on to start or work for a
19 number of organizations aimed at
20 empowering LGBTQ people of color to be
21 full citizens and to determine their own
22 futures.

23 As an Assistant Managing
24 Director in the Street Administration,
25 Michael helped to develop the first

2 transgender medical clinic in
3 Philadelphia and also led the effort to
4 add gender identity to the Fair Practices
5 Act.

6 In addition to his
7 LGBTQ-focused work, he also helped
8 develop a ten-year plan to end
9 homelessness in the City, a plan that is
10 just as relevant today as it was 14 years
11 ago.

12 Five years ago, Michael was
13 appointed to lead Self-Incorporated, the
14 City's largest provider of emergency and
15 transitional housing. In that role, he
16 doubled the agency's budget from 4
17 million to \$11 million, creating a wealth
18 of new approaches to end homelessness in
19 Philadelphia.

20 Michael's work among young
21 people, people with HIV, the addicted and
22 the homeless range from
23 multi-million-dollar projects to just a
24 few months ago quiet effort to find
25 burial plots for those who had died

2 without family or loved ones.

3 Few Philadelphians have led a
4 life of such commitment to people who
5 were young or different or unhoused or
6 feared or hated. Michael organized
7 communities to empower themselves, not to
8 empower himself, and in ways that would
9 make them or keep them healthy and
10 thriving.

11 Michael dedicated every
12 breathing moment to what he felt was his
13 calling in all the environments in which
14 he lived and worked, to leave people
15 better off than he had found them. Who
16 better to honor than this man of courage
17 and vision?

18 Thank you.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20 Thank you so much for your testimony. We

2 MS. TAYLOR: Good morning,
3 everyone. Good morning. My name is
4 Sister Taleah Taylor. I'm President of
5 the City of Dreams Coalition and also
6 Chair of the Social Music Movement, and
7 I'm here to show support for the
8 resolution from Councilman Kenyatta
9 Johnson for PnB Rock.

10 He is momentum to the City, and
11 as I've used music as a therapy and have
12 over 200 artists alone in the City in
13 dealing with those demographics, yes,
14 it's very tiring. Yes, we're tired, but
15 that just shows how much hate all over
16 the world for our young Black men.

17 It doesn't matter. It just
18 seems like we're dying regardless of what
19 we do. But that's what just shows --
20 makes it more important to even show the
21 City of how much he meant to the City, of
22 how much inspiration he gave to the City.

23 So hopefully this will be able
24 to inspire other kids to do more, get
25 better, get out, get out the City, get

2 out the four-block radius, and that to
3 show the empowerment of what he has
4 contributed, not just only to music but
5 to his community, to his family, and to
6 his friends.

7 He is very well loved, very
8 well loved, and he has done a lot at such
9 a young age and for where he came from.
10 But we also have to shed light on the
11 City of the gang issues. Our own gang
12 issues in Germantown, I had to leave my
13 own home because of all the back and
14 forth with PnB and other places.

15 So it's a bittersweet moment,
16 but he has been such an accomplishment
17 for this city. We really need to use it
18 as a platform to show that we can -- our
19 young men can thrive. They can thrive.
20 They can do better. Their dreams can
21 come true. But at the same time, we need
22 to learn how to start having our young
23 men start loving each other, because
24 right now it's just wicked, it's hateful,
25 and they're on demon time.

2 So I support the resolution of
3 Councilman Kenyatta Johnson.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
12 morning.

13 MR. HAGINS: Good morning,
14 everyone. My name is Ogbonna Hagins.
15 I'm a retired teacher. I published a
16 hip-hop magazine called Philly Word
17 Magazine, and it was one of the only
18 hip-hop magazines that focused on the
19 positive that our youth were doing at the
20 time, from like 1999 to about 2007.

21 I'm very saddened to have to
22 support this Resolution 220682 honoring
23 the life and legacy of Philadelphia
24 hip-hop artist Rakim Hasheem Allen, a/k/a
25 PnB Rock. He was a bright and shining

2 example of what one can accomplish when
3 the arts are supported.

4 As a father of three children
5 who are in the arts, two who graduated
6 from Masterman High School, one who is in
7 the virtual academy, I really understand
8 the importance of the arts, and I
9 encourage Council to not only support
10 this resolution but to support the arts,
11 to do all that can be done to financially
12 support the arts, because the arts can
13 certainly help to reduce violence, which
14 is running rampant not only in
15 Philadelphia but in many urban areas in
16 the United States.

17 The issue of gun violence has
18 to be solved. We must provide
19 opportunities for our citizens and
20 promote those opportunities.

21 In the memory of PnB Rock, I
22 encourage the City to promote the
23 positive to the youth especially of
24 Philadelphia on a regular basis to
25 influence their actions, because as the

2 scriptures say, as a man thinks, so is
3 he.

4 So if we promote positive
5 things to our youth, we will have a much
6 better chance of solving this violence
7 issue in Philadelphia.

8 Thank you.

12 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker

16 morning, Mr. Winslow. Good to see you in
17 person.

18 MR. WINSLOW: Nice to see you
19 too, President Clarke.

20 My name is Peter Winslow. I'm
21 a Philadelphia resident. I speak to you
22 today as President of A Smart
23 Collaboration, as a supporter of
24 Toxic-Free Philly, and as a candidate you
25 recommended to Mayor Kenney for

2 appointment to the initial Philadelphia
3 Public Financial Authority Board of
4 Directors. Thank you, President Clarke
5 and members of City Council, for this
6 opportunity to offer public comment in
7 support of Resolution No. 210913 and
8 related matters.

9 I spoke to you last week urging
10 you to preserve, in Councilmember Bass's
11 words, the very essence of democratic
12 governance by passing Resolution No.
13 210913 with respect to implementation of
14 the HOPS bill, Ordinance No. 200425-A,
15 and a similar resolution with respect to
16 implementation of Ordinance No. 210956-A
17 to establish the Philadelphia Public
18 Financial Authority. I repeat those
19 requests.

20 Last week I was critical of
21 Mayor Kenney for breaking his oath of
22 office to execute and enforce the
23 ordinances of the City with fidelity.
24 Aside from being wrong concerning the
25 substance of these issues, he is

2 violating the very essence of democratic
3 governance.

4 This week I address my
5 criticism to you. With Mayor Kenney
6 listening when President Biden spoke to
7 us from Independence Hall about the soul
8 of America and warned us of the threats
9 to democratic governance that we face,
10 were you listening? Is he and you so
11 lacking in self-awareness, so immeshed in
12 business as usual not to recognize this
13 danger to our institutions?

14 As Pogo observed in
15 self-recognition, we have seen the enemy
16 and they is us.

17 As long as the City Council
18 allows the Mayor to ignore without
19 challenge the laws and policies you
20 establish through the exercise of your
21 legislative function, you are complicit
22 in the crisis of democracy facing our
23 city, state, and country.

24 Philadelphia can employ a
25 strong mayor system without empowering an

2 unconstrained mayor through the passivity
3 of the City Council. Part of your job is
4 ensuring that the Mayor does his job. So
5 politely, yet firmly, please assert your
6 prerogatives.

7 Please command Mayor Kenney's
8 attention through subpoena and
9 litigation. Please protect the integrity
10 of the City Council. Preserve our
11 democratic processes.

12 Thank you for your attention to
13 these matters.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
15 Thank you for your testimony. We
16 appreciate it.

17 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker
18 is Kara DeCarlo, commenting on 220682.

19 (Speaker approached podium.)

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
21 morning.

22 MS. DeCARLO: Hi. Good
23 morning, everyone. My name is Kara
24 DeCarlo and I am co-owner of RuffNation
25 Records and Executive Director of City of

2 Dreams Coalition.

3 So I just wanted to speak on
4 PnB Rock for a minute. He was a
5 phenomenal influence on the City and
6 music industry. He had fans ranging from
7 all ages for both of his creativity and
8 talent in music.

9 When I went to his memorial
10 service last Friday, it was sad, but even
11 more, it was amazing to me because the
12 fans and the residents of the
13 neighborhood made it seem like it was
14 just, you know, a fun and positive
15 celebration of his life. You know, I saw
16 nothing but smiles on people's faces,
17 which tells me he did just that. He put
18 nothing but smiles on people's faces, and
19 that's how he would want to be
20 remembered.

21 When I had met him, he was just
22 a pleasure to be around. I knew deep
23 down inside he was genuinely a great
24 person.

25 What happened was a tragedy,

2 especially because where he was in LA, he
3 was there for a celebration for an
4 achievement that, you know, he had
5 reached.

6 He will forever be remembered
7 and missed amongst the community and the
8 music industry.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

10 Thank you. Thank you for your testimony.

11 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker
12 is Chris Bartlett, commenting on 220683.

13 (Speaker approached podium.)

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
15 morning.

16 MR. BARTLETT: Good morning.
17 I'd like to thank Council President
18 Clarke and Councilmember Brooks for the
19 opportunity to speak in honor of Michael
20 S. Hinson, Jr., a dear friend of mine of
21 30 years. I am Chris Bartlett,
22 he/him/his pronouns, Executive Director
23 of the William Way LGBT Community Center.

24 I first met Mike Hinson at the
25 AIDS service organization BeBashi in

2 1990. I just started my job at the
3 SafeGuard Gay Men's Health Project, and
4 when I went to meet Michael, his arms
5 were folded and he was glaring a little
6 bit at me, because I don't think he knew
7 who I was, but by the end of that
8 meeting, we were friends for a lifetime,
9 and I feel a tremendous loss at his
10 passing three week ago, as I know many in
11 this room do, because I know you worked
12 with him, whether that was in Mayor
13 Street's Administration or his work most
14 recently itself.

15 But I just wanted to note some
16 of the huge achievements he made and will
17 continue to make through his legacy. I
18 remember most directly his quote to us,
19 which he repeated frequently, which is
20 that the clearest lesson for us as LGBT
21 communities is to be clear and
22 unapologetic about what we want, that if
23 we believe in what we want and ask for
24 it, we deserve it. And if we keep up on
25 people about their promises, that we can

2 get everything that we need. And I saw
3 him do this many times over the years,
4 and we did in fact get what we as
5 communities needed.

6 In the '90s, he invited me and
7 David Acosta, then Director of the GALAEI
8 Project, to march over to the Health
9 Department. I had never marched anywhere
10 other than ACT UP Philadelphia, but he
11 said, come with me to the Health
12 Department. And we made a claim to the
13 office of the AIDS Activities
14 Coordinating Office for increased funding
15 for AIDS prevention and care, and we
16 received that funding just through the
17 data that he had with him, the case he
18 made for the need for our communities.

19 He also noticed that there were
20 no data on LGBT communities, so under
21 Mayor Street's Administration, he created
22 an LGBTQ census, and we collected data
23 about our communities so we could better
24 make a case for our needs, and that
25 census has been sort of the base for all

2 the work that's followed since then.

3 He believed strongly in
4 leadership development and invested in
5 the Gay Men's Health Leadership Academy,
6 focusing on sending dozens of Black and
7 brown leaders to retreats to expand their
8 leadership opportunities. Many of those
9 leaders are now the generation who
10 fulfill upon Michael's legacy, and that
11 visionary investment in leadership, if
12 there were to be one thing we could do, I
13 would say let's keep that work moving
14 forward.

15 His voice was uncompromising,
16 whether at the Homeless Memorial Day or
17 at a Human Relations Commission meeting
18 on gayborhood racism or here in City
19 Council. His voice was uncompromising,
20 and we continue to hear it today as an
21 ancestor.

22 Over the past year, we've
23 focused on services for homeless LGBTQ
24 people, a partnership between Self and
25 William Way, to make rental assistance

2 possible, and I'll say today we're
3 committed to having that work go forward.

4 To finish up, I just want to
5 say that Michael's primary commitment to
6 our city, to our communities, to his
7 families was one of love, and I hope that

10 commitment to love for those who have the
11 least voice in our city and to maintain
12 that commitment and legacy.

23 trailblazer, a relentless advocate, a
24 fearless voice for those who often were
25 silenced in places of power as a queer

6 As our city has struggled over
7 the past few years to respond to the
8 pandemic in ways that support
9 working-class Black and brown

11 homelessness, queer people, and other
12 marginalized identities, and as we think
13 about those disparities and how we can
14 improve, we should be looking to Mike
15 Hinson's legacy as a path forward.

16 Hinson transformed the way our
17 city addressed the HIV/AIDS crisis,
18 ensuring that queer Black, brown,
19 homeless community members were
20 prioritized and receiving services. He
21 forged creative, bold ways to make the
22 City service and public health supports
23 accessible and safe for those who were
24 often left behind.

25 He was a friend, a caring

2 mentor, and an outspoken truth-teller who
3 wasn't afraid to call racism, homophobia,
4 classism out for what it was.

5 So I just want to take a minute

3 CHIEF CLERK: A resolution
4 recognizing and honoring the life and
5 accomplishments of Charlene Curtis.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
7 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Bass.

10 Charlene Curtis as a real powerhouse here
11 in Philadelphia sports, who really went
12 unrecognized.

13 Ms. Curtis was the first
14 African American female coach of the
15 Temple Owls Women's Basketball team. And
16 so we just recently lost her over the
17 summer, and we wanted to recognize the
18 considerable contributions that she made
19 to women's sports here in Philadelphia
20 and across the nation.

21 So that being said,

20 Deliverance Evangelistic Church, and the
21 economic revitalization of Lehigh Avenue
22 that occurred under his leadership.

24 And Pastor Smith was a great
25 person who was a founder and a visionary

18 hearings on the impact implementation of
19 red flag laws could have on gun violence
20 in Philadelphia, introduced today by
21 Councilman Jones.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
23 Chair recognizes Councilman Jones.

24 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,
25 Mr. President. I'd like to say a few

2 words about this.

3 This Council has taken steps on
4 its own to try to safeguard the citizens
5 in many different ways as it relates to
6 gun violence. All too often other
7 governments, other entities, other
8 departments stifle that progress we
9 attempt to make, sometimes by lawsuits,
10 sometimes by court decisions, sometimes
11 by inaction.

12 We passed the red flag law long
13 before it got on the radar at the federal
14 government, long before sensible
15 advocates for gun control figured it out.

16 What it calls for is if someone
17 on Monday stands up in the schoolyard and
18 says, I don't like this school anymore,
19 I'm going to come back and shoot it up,
20 on Tuesday we should believe him and we
21 should swear out an affidavit before
22 court to remove guns from that premises
23 until that individual can stand before a
24 judge or a competent group of people to
25 determine that they are not a threat to

2 themselves and a threat to others.

3 So when you pass a law,
4 sometimes people just ignore it, and that
5 bothers me. Well, you know, we don't
6 want to overstep our authority. But we
7 do, as my colleague Johnson says, do want
8 to step up to the plate.

9 All you have to do is get on
10 Facebook and you'll see young men and
11 women with guns saying, I'm going to go
12 over to Isaiah Thomas's block and I'm
13 going to shoot up the block.

14 We should believe them, and we
15 should swear out affidavits to remove
16 those firearms from individuals. Not to
17 mention domestic situations where people
18 because of their emotions and feelings
19 decide that not only -- matter of fact,
20 don't we have a plaque in that hallway as
21 it relates to domestic violence.

22 So when we pass sensible gun
23 laws, we will not be ignored. We will
24 hold people accountable for laws we pass
25 to make sure they implement them, and if

2 they need changing, we're grown up, we
3 got our big boy on, we will adjust them
4 accordingly to fit the requirements of
5 the laws. But you will not just say, I
6 don't like City Council's law, I'm going
7 to ignore it.

10 potential to stem some of the gun
11 violence in the City of Philadelphia.

12 Thank you, Mr. President. I

14 That concludes our Calendar for
15 today. We will now move to our speeches.

16 Are there any speeches on
17 behalf of the minority?

18 And the Chair recognizes
19 Councilwoman Brooks.

20 COUNCILWOMAN BROOKS: Thank
21 you, Council President. And I want to
22 thank my colleagues. I want to thank the
23 nearly 150 people who came to City Hall
24 yesterday for my Philly wealth tax, a
25 people's hearing.

2 We saw nearly 150 come out in
3 support of ensuring that the wealthiest
4 residents in Philadelphia pay their fair
5 share for City services, and heard from a
6 wide range of workers, faith leaders,
7 advocates on what a fully funded city
8 would look like and feel like.

9 I want to especially thank my
10 colleague Councilmember Jamie Gauthier
11 for her presence at the hearing and her
12 powerful speech.

13 At the hearing we saw
14 widespread support from our city's labor
15 movement, including speakers from AFSCME
16 DC47, AFSCME DC33, SEIU 32BJ, and the
17 Faculty and Staff Federation of Community
18 College of Philadelphia.

19 Underfunding is always a policy
20 choice, and at a time when our city is
21 struggling against numerous crises, we
22 have an unprecedented opportunity to
23 project triple-down economics, tax the
24 rich, and make deep investments in City
25 services.

2 After yesterday's event, it's
3 clear to me that working-class people in
4 Philadelphia are hungry for policies that
5 put people before profit. So I look
6 forward to working with this robust
7 coalition of Philly residents and my
8 Council colleagues, not just on a wealth
9 tax but a wide range of policies that
10 would generate City revenue and balance
11 the scales of justice to allow future
12 generations to thrive.

13 Thank you, Council President,
14 and thank you, Council colleagues.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
16 Thank you, Councilwoman.

17 Speeches on behalf of the
18 majority?

19 The Chair recognizes Councilman
20 Thomas.

21 COUNCILMAN THOMAS: Thank you,
22 Council President.

23 A number of colleagues today
24 talked about some of the issues that
25 we're facing in the City of Philadelphia

specifically around crime. I heard Councilmember Johnson, Councilmember Bass, as well as Councilmember Jones mention it in the midst of their remarks today.

Earlier today I introduced a bill, which we're calling the Watchdog Bill, and basically the importance of the bill is because we recognize, like Councilmember Jones said, that this legislative body has taken a number of steps to address issues related to crime, and one of those issues is the idea of trash, is the idea of nuisance behavior, that we are limited as it relates to our ability to enforce it.

So the Watchdog Bill is basically designed to hopefully activate constituents across the City of Philadelphia and incentivize them to be a part of the reporting process as it relates to nuisance behavior, like trash and illegal dumping and some of the other issues that we know we face as a

2 municipality.

3 So I look forward to working
4 with the Administration as well as my
5 Council colleagues over the next couple
6 months. We want to take some time to
7 talk to community stakeholders and
8 different organizations across the City
9 of Philadelphia just so we can get their
10 input and make sure that we're moving in
11 the way that's advantageous to the
12 constituents of the City of Philadelphia.

13 So like my colleague said, this
14 is another small step by this legislative
15 body to do something about the nuisance
16 behavior that we're seeing in the City of
17 Philadelphia.

18 Thank you, Council President.
19 Thank you, colleagues.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
21 Thank you, Councilman. We appreciate
22 that one.

23 The Chair recognizes Councilman
24 Johnson.

25 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,

3 First and foremost, I want to
4 echo your sentiments in honoring the life
5 and legacy for Pastor Herb Lusk. I've
6 known Pastor Herb Lusk since I was a
7 young man, not only as it relates to the
8 work that I'm doing as a public servant
9 but just my background as a christian and
10 various churches that I attended in South
11 Philadelphia as well as in North
12 Philadelphia.

13 So he has always been a giant
14 and a man amongst men, always been a man
15 of his word but, most importantly, always
16 encouraging and empowering when it comes
17 to us improving the quality of life of
18 our neighborhoods, for him particularly
19 in North Philadelphia, but he also did a
20 lot of work with some of the pastors I
21 work with in South Philadelphia.

22 So I definitely want to
23 acknowledge his life and his legacy, and
24 just was on the phone with him just last
25 week. He was sending encouraging and

supporting words to me as it relates to the work that I'm doing.

So I wanted to acknowledge his hard work and his dedication.

I also wanted to take a moment to just impress upon as we go through the process of the recent 31 percent property assessment tax increase that the residents and the citizens here in the City of Philadelphia that will be receiving. And so tonight at Saint Monica's Church at 16th and Ritner, we will be having a tax relief workshop to help people sign up for a first level of review, show people how to take advantage of the variety of tax relief measures that we passed, such as LOOP, homestead exemption, senior citizens tax freeze. And, again, that's going to be from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. at Saint Monica's Church, and that's going to be at 2500 South 16th Street, which is actually 16th and Shunk.

So I want as many people as possible to come out to participate to

2 make sure they keep their taxes low.

3 And it looks good to be back in
4 City Council to see all my colleagues
5 live and direct in the flesh. So good to
6 see you too, Council President.

7 Thank you.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: You

10 Councilman, thank you, and
11 thank you for your insistence on us
12 having the resources to be able to do
13 that outreach. We had a meeting over at
14 12th and Susquehanna hosted by former
15 Senator Kitchen, and the people came out,
16 and it was clear that they needed
17 assistance in understanding this whole
18 issue of comp and the assessments and
19 being able to do that.

20 So thank you. Thank you and
21 the colleagues for insisting on that
22 level of support. We should be doing
23 these all over the City of Philadelphia.
24 Thank you again, Councilman.

25 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: You're

4 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Gauthier.

5 COUNCILWOMAN GAUTHIER: Thank
6 you, Council President.

7 I was grateful for the
8 opportunity to bring my Bill 220007 back
9 to this body for a final vote today. The
10 bill amends the Affordable Housing
11 Preservation Overlay by expanding its
12 geographic coverage area, providing
13 increased prioritization of affordable
14 housing, and refining the building
15 requirements and demolition restrictions.

16 I have been and remain
17 committed to continuing to refine the
18 overlay to prioritize the affordable
19 housing needs of the community while not
20 unnecessarily hampering development.

21 I want to ensure that West
22 Philadelphians can live within walking
23 distance of high-quality jobs, education,
24 healthcare, and goods and services.

25 When this Council first passed

1 9/22/22 - STATED - SPEECHES

2 the overlay, we recognized that it was a
3 necessary first step to avoid imminent
4 loss of affordable housing in this
5 critical area of the City, but that it
6 would not be the last step and that
7 further refinement was needed.

8 This bill will expand the
9 overlay to include additional
10 transit-adjacent locations, with a
11 particular focus on residential
12 properties that may otherwise be
13 susceptible in either the near or long
14 term to market pressures encouraging
15 commercial over residential development
16 given the current zoning of the
17 properties.

18 The new building permit
19 requirement in this overlay is a
20 mechanism used elsewhere in the code to
21 combat speculative demolition. It is
22 intended to ensure that sites within the
23 overlay are not left vacant and promptly
24 redeveloped with affordable housing if
25 development occurs.

2 However, we know it isn't a
3 perfect solution and that this
4 requirement may not on its own completely
5 eliminate the risk that sophisticated
6 developers will demolish large properties
7 without immediate plans to rebuild given
8 the unique market forces in this area.

9 For this reason, a temporary
10 demolition moratorium covers all large
11 residential properties within the
12 overlay, those over 19,999 square feet,
13 whether as a single lot or contiguous
14 lots, through March of 2023. This will
15 provide time for this Council to further
16 consider more effective ways to avoid
17 speculative demolition of large
18 residential parcels which would have a
19 negative impact on our community as a
20 whole.

21 The updated overlay will
22 further ensure affordability and balance
23 growth by clarifying and aligning this
24 overlay with the mixed-income
25 neighborhoods overlay and by requiring a

higher percentage of affordable units beyond the requirements of men if developers wish to access density bonuses for other purposes.

Inclusionary zoning is a proven tool used in literally thousands of localities worldwide, as the market can create and sustain more affordable units if the incentives are right.

Our ultimate goal with this legislation is to support the public interest by making sure as much affordable housing remains in amenity-rich neighborhoods which are experiencing immense commercial development pressures as we possibly can.

Thank you so much.

Thank you, Councilwoman.

The Chair recognizes Councilwoman Bass.

COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you, Mr. President.

I just wanted to -- I'm going

3 Councilman Johnson regarding tax
4 assessments. I just wanted to remind
5 everyone that we are doing tax assessment
6 appeals assistance with the Office of
7 Property Assessment and also the BRT in
8 our district offices, and it's something
9 our office organized along with State
10 Representative Darisha Parker, State
11 Senator Sharif Street, and State Senator
12 Art Haywood.

13 So we really want to encourage
14 the listening public or the viewing
