24 finally adopt term limits.

3 25 percent of the people vote, but one
4 way to overcome the lack of voter
5 engagement is to encourage turnover and a 00:15:53
6 modern look at fresh candidates on a
7 regular basis.

8 As stated in the Committee of
9 Seventy, a four-term limit strikes an
10 important balance between providing 00:16:03
11 lawmakers the time to tackle several big
12 projects and ensuring that a steady
13 stream of new voices and perspectives
14 enter City Hall. And also I believe
15 eight out of ten of the largest cities in 00:16:16
16 the United States do have term limits for
17 their City Councils.

18 So I urge my colleagues to
19 support and quickly pass this legislation
20 so we can place it on the ballot for the 00:16:24
21 May 2022 primary election, which will
22 allow the citizens of this city to make
23 the final decision.

24 I want to thank my co-sponsors,
